# NINTH-RANKED BRUINS AT ARIZONA AND ARIZONA STATE

The ninth-ranked Bruins begin a four-match road trip this weekend, heading to the desert to face Arizona on Friday at 6 p.m. and Arizona State on Saturday at 6 p.m. The UCLA-Arizona match will have free live video on UCLABruins.com, while the UCLA-ASU contest will air on Pac-12 Los Angeles.

#### WHAT'S NEXT

The Bruins travel to the Bay Area next week, facing California on Thursday, Nov. 10 at 8 p.m. and #13 Stanford on Saturday, Nov. 12 at 7 p.m. The UCLA-California contest will air on Pac-12 Los Angeles, while the UCLA-Stanford tilt will feature live video on UCLABruins.com.

#### **BRUINS IN THE POLLS**

The Bruins moved up three spots to ninth in this week's AVCA Top 25 Coaches poll and have gone from #20 to #9 during their six-match winning streak. Eight UCLA opponents are in the Top 25 (#7 San Diego, #8 Washington, #13 Stanford, #15 Hawai'i, #19 Utah, #20 Oregon, #23 Washington State and #25 USC), while Arizona (#29) and Colorado (#30) are both receiving votes.

#### FORMICO NAMED PAC-12 DPOW FOR SECOND TIME

For the second time in three weeks, senior Taylor Formico has been named Pac-12 Conference Defensive Player of the Week, as announced on Monday. Formico helped the Bruins to wins against Colorado and #21 Utah last week, as UCLA ran its winning streak to six matches to move into a tie atop the Pac-12 standings.

Formico posted her ninth match of the season with at least 20 digs on Friday versus the Buffaloes, recording 27 to move into third on UCLA's all-time list. She also had six assists and two service aces. A night later, Formico tallied the second double-double of her Bruin career with 20 digs and a personal-best 11 assists against Utah, adding a dump-kill, her sixth of the season. Formico leads the Bruins with 5.06 digs per set, tying for first among Pac-12 players and 26th nationally. She has double figures in digs in all 22 matches this season, 44 in a row dating back to last year and 110 times in her career. Formico also has a kill in three of her last four matches and at least six assists in four in a row

UCLA won weekly honors for the third week in a row. It is the second DPOW for Formico, who also earned the award on Oct. 17, the same day when freshman Torrey Van Winden picked up Offensive POW accolades. Van Winden was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week last Monday, while senior Jennie Frager was named OPOW on Aug. 29, giving the Bruins five Pac-12 weekly honors this season. Since 2011, when the conference started handing out Offensive, Defensive and Freshman of the Week honors, UCLA has won 11 Offensive, seven Defensive and five Freshman awards (23 total). The Bruins have 84 all-time Pac-12 weekly awards.

# **CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

Senior Taylor Formico moved into third place on UCLA's all-time digs list against Colorado and now has 1,451 for her Bruin career. She trails only Chrissie Zartman (2,064) and Lainey Gera (2,009). Formico's overall career total is now at 2,243 (792 at UCSB in 2012) ... junior Reily Buechler is 20 kills away from becoming the 28th Bruin to reach the 1,000-kill mark ... senior Jordan Anderson's 3.97 kills per set would rank her sixth in Bruin history, while her 4.25 points per set would be 10th ... senior Claire Felix's ..336 hitting percentage currently ranks sixth in school history.

#### **TEAM NOTES**

UCLA started its season at 7-0, its best start since 2006 when it began with 20 consecutive victories. The previous two times the Bruins opened a year with at least six straight wins, they have reached the third weekend of the NCAA Tournament (2006 - National Semifinals; 2011 - National Champions) ... Oct. 9 against Arizona marked the only time this season that the Bruins lost when holding their opponent under a .200 hitting percentage (13-1 record) ... the Arizona loss was also the only time the Bruins were defeated when winning the hitting battle (18-1) ... UCLA is 12-0 when either leading or tying its opponent in blocks ... the Bruins are 17-1 when winning the third set, but 1-3 when losing the stanza after intermission. However, they broke a three-match slide with their five-set victory against Colorado last Friday.

#### **PLAYER NOTES**

Senior Jordan Anderson has double figures in kills in 18 of her last 20, including four in a row, posting a season-best 18 versus Colorado last Friday. She is averaging 4.07 kills per set over the last four contests. Anderson also has at least one block solo in three of her last four, including a career-high three against California (Oct. 23) ... junior Reily Buechler has enjoyed playing against a team from Arizona over the last two seasons. This Oct. 7, she posted the second double-figure kill, error-free match of her career against Arizona State when she had 12 kills in 21 attempts for a .571 hitting percentage. Buechler's first such match came versus Arizona last Oct. 16 when she had 16 kills in 31 swings (.516) ... freshman Torrey Van Winden ran her doublefigure kills streak to seven after recording 17 versus Utah and 13 against Colorado. She had double-doubles in both of those contests thanks to a career-best 16 digs versus the Buffs and 11 against the Utes. Van Winden has hit over .400 in four of her last five matches, including a season-best .526 (12-2-19) versus California ... freshman Kylie Miller notched the fourth double-double of her career with 27 assists and 11 digs against Colorado. Her season high in assists came versus Washington State (Sept. 23) when she had 35, while her best in digs was at Colorado (13) on Oct. 2. Miller also has seven aces, including two against Arizona (Oct. 9) ... sophomore Zana Muno has double figures in digs in seven in a row to give her 14 such matches on the year. She set a new season best with 23 digs at Oregon and is averaging 3.34 dps over her last seven. Muno also has 28 kills and 14 blocks in her last seven contests ... senior Claire Felix went two matches in a row against California (9-for-18) and Colorado (6-for-15) without a hitting error, posting a .455 hitting percentage in those two contests. Seven times this season, she has posted at least four kills and no miscues in a match. Felix has four doublefigure kills matches, including 16 against LBSU and WSU, as well as nine contests with at least four blocks ... senior Jennie Frager recorded a career-best 16 kills against Colorado, her 11th match this season with double figures in kills. She posted just one hitting error in 29 attempts for a .517 percentage after hitting .526 in the previous contest against Cal. Defensively, Frager has at least four blocks on 16 occasions, reaching that total in three matches in a row ... senior Taylor Formico, now two-time Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week, has at least 20 digs in 10 contests to go with double figures in digs in all 22 matches this season, 44 in a row dating back to last year and 110 in her career. Formico hasn't just been chipping in defensively though. She recorded her second double-double with 20 digs and a career-best 11 assists against Utah and has at least six assists in four in a row Formico also posted her sixth kill of the season versus the Utes, having now had a kill in three of her last four ... junior Ryann Chandler posted

her team-best eighth double-double at Oregon with 30 assists and 13 digs. She has at least 20 assists in all but two matches this year. Chandler has also been serving tough lately, tallying six aces in her last four matches, including a career-best three versus Stanford.

#### **BRUINS IN THE NATIONAL AND PAC-12 RANKINGS**

UCLA enters the week as the only team in the nation ranked in the top five in three statistical categories, coming in at third in assists per set (13.71) and fifth in digs per set (18.24) and kills per set (14.58) through Oct. 30 matches. The Bruins are also 37th in opponent hitting percentage (.166). Individually, senior Taylor Formico is tied for 27th in dps (5.06), while senior Jennie Frager is 35th in hitting percentage (.376). As far as conference teams go, the Bruins are first among Pac-12 foes in aps, dps and kps and second in opponent hitting. Formico is tied for first in dps, while Frager and senior Claire Felix (.350) are third and seventh, respectively, in hitting. Junior Ryann Chandler is fifth in aps (8.20), Frager is eighth in bps (1.20) and senior Jordan Anderson is ninth in kps (3.37).

#### SCOUTING THE ARIZONA WILDCATS

Since winning three straight against ranked teams on the road (USC, UCLA, Stanford), Arizona (14-10, 6-6 Pac-12) has lost four of five, including a four-set loss at Oregon State last Sunday. The Wildcats' only win during the stretch was a five-setter at #20 Oregon. Arizona, which hosts USC on Wednesday, is hitting .231 as a team, averaging 13.74 kills, 1.27 aces, 15.71 digs and 2.02 blocks per set. Three players are averaging over 2.00 kps, led by sophomore Kendra Dahlke's 4.10. Senior Kalei Mau is second with 3.77 kps, while senior Katarina Pilepic is third at 2.43 kps. Senior Penina Snuka handles the setting duties and is posting 10.47 assists per set to go with a team-best 25 aces. Senior Laura Larson is tops on the squad with 3.87 dps.

#### THE MATCHUP: BRUINS VS. WILDCATS

UCLA leads the all-time series with Arizona 54-24, but the Wildcats have won two in a row, both in five sets. On Oct. 9 at Pauley Pavilion, Arizona came back from 2-0 down to stun the Bruins. Taylor Formico had 36 digs, while Torrey Van Winden added 16 kills. The Bruins are 22-14 all-time in Tucson, but have dropped four straight at the McKale Center. UCLA's last victory at Arizona was a five-set win in 2010. The Wildcats have won seven of the last 10 in the series.

# SCOUTING THE ARIZONA STATE SUN DEVILS

Arizona State (9-15, 2-10 Pac-12), which hosts USC on Friday, has won both of its conference matches on the road, winning at Cal on Oct. 14 and Oregon State on Oct. 28, both in four sets. The Sun Devils are hitting .182 as a team, averaging 12.29 kills, 0.90 aces, 12.96 digs and 2.16 blocks per set. Four players are averaging over 2.00 kps. Junior Oluoma Okaro is first with 2.67 kps, 33 aces and 1.10 bps, senior Cassidy Pickrell is second (2.64 kps) and freshman Ivana Jeremic (2.16 kps) is third. Sophomore Kylie Pickrell leads the team with 6.44 assists per set, but freshman Nicole Peterson (5.55) has filled in during the last two matches. Junior Halle Harker is tops on the squad with 3.65 dps.

# THE MATCHUP: BRUINS VS. SUN DEVILS

UCLA leads the all-time series with Arizona State 70-10 and has won three in a row, including a sweep at Pauley Pavilion on Oct. 7. Reily Bucehler was error-free with 12 kills in 21 attempts (.571), while Taylor Formico added 13 digs. The Bruins are 30-7 in Tempe, including a five-set win last Nov. 20. Arizona State claimed a five-setter at home in 2014.

# VAN WINDEN NAMED PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Torrey Van Winden earned her second Pac-12 weekly honor in as many weeks on Oct. 24, receiving league Freshman of the Week accolades. Van Winden recorded 31 kills (3.88 per set), a .455 hitting percentage and 12 digs (1.50 per set) in two Bruin victories last week.

Van Winden tied a season and career best with 19 kills against #14 Stanford on Oct. 21, helping the Bruins to their first victory

over the Cardinal since 2011 (seven matches). She hit .417, adding nine digs and the first service ace of her career. On Oct. 23 versus California, the freshman posted 12 kills and a season-best .526 hitting percentage with just two errors in 19 attempts.

#### VAN WINDEN. FORMICO EARN PAC-12 WEEKLY HONORS

The Bruins picked up a pair of Pac-12 Conference weekly honors on Oct. 17, as freshman Torrey Van Winden was named Offensive Player of the Week, while senior Taylor Formico earned Defensive Player of the Week accolades. The Pac-12 awards are the first for both Van Winden and Formico.

Van Winden led the Bruins in kills in both victories, recording 33 (4.12 per set) to go with 18 digs (2.25 per set) and six blocks in eight sets. At #16 Oregon (Oct. 12), Van Winden had a match- and season-best 19 kills with a .341 hitting percentage. She added a career-high 12 digs for her first double-double, adding three blocks, including two solos. Van Winden came back two days later to again lead the Bruins in kills with 14 versus Oregon State. She produced a .444 percentage with only two miscues in 27 attempts to go with six digs and three blocks.

Formico posted 51 digs (6.38 per set) in eight sets. She had 29 digs against Oregon, adding an ace, while recording 22 at Oregon State. In four of Formico's eight sets, she registered at least eight digs, including eight in the second set in Eugene and 10 in the third, both Bruin set victories. The senior had eight digs in each of the first two sets in Corvallis.

#### SIX STRAIGHT FOR UCLA AFTER SWEEP OF UTAH

Senior Taylor Formico notched the second double-double of her Bruin career with 20 digs and a career-high 11 assists, while freshman Torrey Van Winden also had a double-double with 17 kills and 11 digs, as the 12th-ranked Bruins made it six wins in a row with a sweep of #21 Utah on Saturday at Pauley Pavilion. Set scores were 25-23, 25-17, 29-27.

Van Winden hit .471 for the match with just one error in 34 attempts. Junior Reily Buechler also had 17 kills with a .395 hitting percentage, while senior Jordan Anderson was also in double figures with 13. The Bruins (18-4, 9-3 Pac-12) hit .299 for the match behind the setting of freshman Kylie Miller (25 assists, nine digs) and junior Ryann Chandler (19 assists, nine digs). Sophomore Zana Muno added 11 digs, while senior Jennie Frager recorded five kills and four blocks.

The first set featured 12 ties and three lead changes. The teams were even at 11 when the Bruins scored four in a row on kills by Muno and Anderson and two Utah attack errors. The Utes (16-7, 7-5 Pac-12) closed to within one at 17-16, but the Bruins again got their lead to four on a Buechler kill, a Muno/Frager block and a Utah attack error. UCLA's largest lead would be four as late as 22-18, but Utah evened things at 23. However, back-to-back kills by Van Winden wrapped up the 25-23 win in the opener. Buechler was error-free and 5-for-9 in kill attempts, while Van Winden was also spotless with five kills in 11 swings. Anderson added four kills, Formico posted seven digs and Chandler had four digs, as the Bruins out-hit the Utes .293 to .191.

After falling behind 4-2 in set two, the Bruins went on a 9-3 run to go up 11-7 and never looked back. Anderson had three kills during the run, Van Winden added two and a block with Frager, who also had a kill. The Bruins got the lead to five at 14-9, but Utah went on a 7-2 run to even things at 16. But the Utes were unable to grab the lead back. Following the tie, the Bruins scored nine of the last 10 of the set. The first seven points came on two kills by Buechler and five Utah errors. After a sideout, back-to-back Buechler kills finished up a 25-17 win. Buechler recorded seven of the Bruins' 14 kills, while Anderson added three. Formico had six digs and Miller and Van Winden both had four. The Bruins out-hit the Utes .209 to .071.

Set three had nine ties and seven lead changes. The Bruins jumped out to an early 6-2 lead thanks to two Buechler kills, one each by Frager and Van Winden, an Anderson/Frager block and a Utah error. After Utah reclaimed the lead at 10-9, the Bruins scored five of six on three Van Winden kills and one apiece by Formico and Buechler to go up 14-11. UCLA's largest lead of the set was four on a few occasions and as late as 22-18. A Buechler kill put the home team up 24-21, but Utah not only saved all three match points, but scored another to earn a set point of its own. Utah had a second set point at 26-25 only to see UCLA score

the next two on Anderson kills to pick up a fourth match point. That attempt was saved, but a kill by Van Winden gave UCLA a fifth match point and it was the charm, as a Buechler kill closed out the 29-27 win. Van Winden was error-free in the third with 10 kills in 16 swings to go with four digs. Anderson added six kills, Buechler posted five and Frager had three. Formico posted seven digs, Muno had six and Miller added four. The Bruins out-hit the Utes. 367 to .327.

# **BRUINS OUTLAST COLORADO IN FIVE SETS**

The 12th-ranked Bruins won the first two sets, both by scores of 25-16, while Colorado won the next two sets, each by scores of 25-19. However, UCLA would finish what it started, posting a 15-9 victory in set five to win its fifth match in a row on Friday night at the John Wooden Center.

Senior Jordan Anderson paced the offensive attack for the Bruins (17-4, 8-3 Pac-12) with a season-best 18 kills, while senior Jennie Frager added a career-high 16 kills, recording just one hitting error in 29 attempts for a .517 percentage to go with eight blocks. Freshman Torrey Van Winden notched a double-double with 13 kills and a career-best 16 digs plus a personal-high five blocks, junior Reily Buechler posted 13 kills and senior Claire Felix had six kills and four blocks.

Defensively, senior Taylor Formico moved into third-place on UCLA's all-time digs list thanks to a 27-dig effort on Friday, adding two aces, while sophomore Zana Muno tallied 17 digs. The Bruins hit .247 for the match behind the setting of freshman Kylie Miller (27 assists, 11 digs, one ace) and junior Ryann Chandler (29 assists, six digs, one ace).

The Bruins never trailed in taking the opening set. Even at six, UCLA scored five straight on two Van Winden kills, one apiece by Anderson and Felix and a Formico ace. Another 5-0 run at 12-8 extended the advantage to nine, as Buechler and Frager each had two kills and Colorado (12-9, 4-7 Pac-12) committed a hitting error. UCLA's lead reached double figures for the first time at 19-9, with 10 being its largest margin of the set. On their second set point, a Frager kill, her fifth in as many attempts in the opener, finished up a 25-16 win for the Bruins. Anderson also had five kills in the first, while Buechler and Van Winden each added three, as

the Bruins out-hit the Buffaloes .472 to .189. Formico notched nine digs in the opener.

UCLA pulled away in the second to take a 2-0 lead to intermission. Trailing by as many as three early on at 4-1, the Bruins made a run before the score got to double figures and took that lead to the break. At 5-3 Colorado, a 7-2 run on three Anderson kills, two by Van Winden, a Felix block solo and a Formico ace made it 10-7 Bruins. Colorado closed to within one on a few occasions, but was unable to even the score. At 18-15, UCLA finished the set on a 7-1 run to win the second by a familiar 25-16 total. Buechler had two kills during the final run, Anderson and Felix one apiece, Felix and Van Winden combined on a block and Chandler serve an ace on set point. It was Anderson's turn to go 5-for-5 on kills, with Van Winden adding four and Buechler and Frager three each. Muno totaled five digs. The Bruins out-hit the Buffaloes .467 to .333.

Set three featured seven ties and five lead changes, but the Bruins' largest lead was just one on a few occasions. At 8-all, four in a row for the Buffaloes gave the visitors a lead they would not relinquish for the rest of the set. Colorado's advantage reached as high as six, which would also be the final margin of set three in the 25-19 win. Formico recorded nine digs in the third, while Van Winden had three kills and four digs, as the Bruins were out-hit .213 to .098.

Once again, the Bruins' largest lead in set four was one at 1-0 and 2-1. At 3-all, an 8-2 run catapulted Colorado to an 11-5 advantage. The Buffs' largest lead was nine at 21-12, as they would go on to win the fourth 25-19. Buechler posted four kills in the set, while Anderson added three. Formico and Muno both had five digs, Van Winden totaled four digs and Frager made four blocks, as the Bruins were out-hit .220 to .068.

With all the momentum, Colorado took an early 3-1 lead in the deciding set, but it was all Bruins after that, scoring the next five on two kills and a solo block by Anderson, a Frager kill and a combo block by Frager and senior Haley Lawless to go up 6-3. On top 12-9, the Bruins scored the last three points of the match on a Van Winden kill, a Buechler/Frager block and a Frager kill to wrap up a 15-9 victory. Frager was 4-for-7 with no errors in the fifth, Anderson added three kills and Van Winden notched seven digs, as the Bruins out-hit the Buffaloes .276 to .071.



Michael Sealy begins his seventh season as the head coach of the UCLA women's volleyball team in 2016.

Last season, the Bruins posted a record of 25-8 and a second-straight trip to the Regional Semifinals of the NCAA Tournament. UCLA placed fourth in the Pac-12 Conference with a 14-6 league mark. Three Bruins were named AVCA All-Americans, tying for the most awards in a single season in school history. Taylor Formico earned Third Team honors, while Jordan Anderson and Claire Felix picked up Honorable Mention nods. All three players were also named AVCA Pacific South All-Region First Team, and a total of six Bruins were on the All-Pac-12 squads. Formico was the league Libero of the Year and All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention, Anderson was named First Team and Felix, Reily Buechler, Jennie Frager and Zana Muno each notched Honorable Mention plaudits.

UCLA ranked 28th in the country in assists per set (13.22), 37th in digs per set (16.71) and 45th in kills per set (13.93). The Bruins were also second among Pac-12 teams in dps. In the summer of 2016, Sealy was the head coach of the Pac-12 All-Star volleyball team which traveled to China in June.

In 2014, the Bruins finished 22-12 and in a tie for fourth in the Pac-12 (11-9), reaching the NCAA Regional Semifinals. Five Bruins were named to the All-Pac-12 Teams, as Karsta Lowe earned All-Pac-12, All-Region and AVCA All-America First Team accolades, while Buechler, Formico and Julie Consani were All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention. UCLA led the country in kills (15.10) and assists (14.26) per set in 2014, the first time the Bruins led the nation in a

stat category since 1997, while Lowe was tops in the country in kills and points per set.

A trio of Bruins were named to the All-Pac-12 Teams in 2013, as Lowe earned First Team to go with her AVCA All-Region First Team and All-America Honorable Mention accolades. Kelly Reeves was named All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention and Claire Felix was recognized on the Pac-12 All-Freshman Team. UCLA went 15-15, recording a 6-14 mark in Pac-12 play. The Bruins were fifth in the league in hitting percentage and kills per set and sixth in assists per set.

In 2012, the Bruins posted a 23-8 record, finishing in a tie for fourth in the Pac-12 with a 14-6 mark and advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament. Two Bruins, Rachael Kidder and Tabi Love, were named All-American, All-Region and All-Pac-12, while Zoë Nightingale earned All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention accolades. UCLA was second in the nation in kills per set (14.76) in 2012, third in assists per set (13.84) and fifth in hitting percentage (.295), which was also the second-best, single-season total in program history. The Bruins led all Pac-12 teams in hitting and were second in kps and aps.

In 2011, Sealy led the Bruins to the program's fourth NCAA title and seventh National Championship. The Bruins posted a 30-6 record and defeated four-time defending champion Penn State, #1-overall seed Texas, Florida State and Illinois en route to the championship.

Sealy was named the AVCA National Coach of the Year. The Bruins finished second in the Pac-12 with a 17-5 record. Six players were honored on the All-Conference teams, while Kidder, the Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Tournament, was a First Team All-American and All-Region selection.

UCLA finished fifth in the nation in assists per set (13.71) and eighth in kills per set (14.52). Among Pac-12 teams, the Bruins ranked first in aps, second in kps and opponent hitting percentage (.160) and third in digs per set (15.95).

In his first campaign, Sealy guided the Bruins to a 22-9 record, a fourth-place finish in the Pacific-10 Conference (11-7) and a Second Round appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Three Bruins were named to the All-Pac-10 team in 2010, Dicey McGraw (First Team), Lainey Gera (Honorable Mention) and Kidder (Honorable Mention), while McGraw also earned AVCA All-Pacific Region Honorable Mention accolades, UCLA finished in the top half of the Pac-10 in digs (2nd, 15.41), assists (4th, 13.46), kills (4th, 14.26) and aces (5th, 1.20) per set along with opponent hitting percentage (4th, .187).

Sealy spent part of the summer of 2012 in London at the Olympic Games, serving as a scout coach for the U.S. men's volleyball team.

UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero announced on Feb. 10, 2010 the hiring of Sealy as head coach of the Bruin women's volleyball program. Sealy returned to his alma mater after spending four seasons (2006-09) as an associate head coach at the University of Hawai'i. He was a three-time All-American and an assistant coach for four years with the UCLA men's volleyball team and was an assistant with the Bruin women's volleyball program in 2005.

"We are excited to welcome back Michael Sealy to lead the women's volleyball program," Guerrero said. "Michael clearly possesses the necessary credentials to allow UCLA to compete at the highest level. He is well-respected in the volleyball community and has an enthusiastic and passionate approach towards the game. Furthermore, as a former Bruin player and coach, he understands the tradition of excellence that has defined the volleyball programs at UCLA and I am confident that he will continue that legacy of success with ambition and integrity."

"I am very excited and inspired to be back at UCLA," said Sealy. "I feel very fortunate and humbled to take over a program with such a storied history. I would like to thank Dan Guerrero and (Senior Associate Athletic Director/Senior Women's Administrator) Petrina Long for giving me this opportunity and for supporting my vision for the future of the program."

Sealy helped Hawai'i to a berth in the National Semifinals in 2009. The Rainbow Wahine recorded their second-straight, 30-win season last year, going 32-3 overall. They also posted a 16-0 mark in conference play to earn their 14th-straight Western Athletic Conference title and went on to claim their 10th-consecutive WAC Tournament championship. Sealy's record during his tenure at Hawai'i was 119-19 (.862 winning percentage).

Prior to his stint at Hawai'i, Sealy coached for four seasons at UCLA, where he was an assistant on the men's side from 2003-2006 and an assistant for the women's volleyball team in 2005. In his lone season on the women's side, the Bruins posted a 20-11 record and advanced to the Regional Semifinals. With the UCLA men, Sealy was 91-38 (.705) during his four campaigns, helping the Bruins to an NCAA Championship in 2006 and an NCAA Runner-Up finish in 2005. Sealy was also a volunteer assistant with the CSUN men's volleyball team in 2000 before working in the same capacity with the UCLA men in 2001.

One of the top setters in UCLA history, Sealy was a four-year letterwinner with the Bruins from 1990-93 and ranks fourth in Bruin annals in assists (4,749). In his senior season, Sealy and the Bruins won the program's 14th National Championship, going 24-3. The team captain was named the co-Most Outstanding Player of the 1993 NCAA Tournament and also earned ASICS/Volleyball Monthly Player of the Year and AVCA All-American first-team honors. In addition, Sealy was named an All-American in 1991 (first-team) and 1992 (third-team), as well as All-Conference three times. The Bruins won three conference titles during Sealy's playing days, going 80-24 (.769) during his four years.

Following his playing career in Westwood, Sealy went on to play professionally in Switzerland, Belgium, Holland and Puerto Rico. He also played with the U.S. National Team in 1994 and 1997.

Sealy graduated from UCLA in 1993 with a degree in physiological science.
