PASADENA (AP) — Freshman Josh Rosen passed for Bruin true freshman records of 350 yards and three touchdowns in a stellar debut for UCLA, leading the No. 13 Bruins to a victory over Virginia.

Thomas Duarte, Devin Fuller and defensive tackle Kenny Clark caught scoring passes from the 18-year-old Rosen, who went 28

for 35 with several stunning throws and no turnovers in his first game at the Rose Bowl.

Rosen, the first true freshman to ever start a Bruin opener, stepped in for three-year starter Brett Hundley with remarkable poise, and the Bruins racked up 503 total yards to beat Virginia.

Linebacker Myles Jack rushed for a touchdown, and the 310-pound Clark hauled in a TD pass late in the third quarter to cap the Bruins' strong offensive performance. UCLA's first drive fizzled, but Rosen completed seven straight throws to close the first quarter, including a short TD pass to Fuller. Rosen then hit Duarte for a gorgeous 30-yard TD pass midway through the second quarter.

UCLA took control with an 85-yard drive in the third quarter capped by the first two runs from Jack, the linebacker in his third season of moonlighting as a short-yardage running back. Rosen, who completed his final nine passes, marched the Bruins 67 yards moments later, rolling out and hitting Clark in stride for the junior defensive lineman's first career score.

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Redshirt junior running back Paul Perkins ran for 151 yards and two touchdowns, true freshman quarterback Josh Rosen threw for another score and No. 13 UCLA rolled to a 37-3 victory over UNLV.

Rosen completed 22 of 42 passes for 223 yards as the Bruins piled up 526 yards in all, the second consecutive week UNLV's defense allowed more than 500. Perkins

scored on runs of seven and 56 yards in the third quarter as UCLA pulled away after taking a 17-0 lead at halftime. After the first two games of his college career, Rosen is 50 of 77 for 574 yards and four touchdowns. His performance against Virginia last week earned him the Walter Camp National Player of the Week award on offense.

Linebacker Kenny Young's interception return for a score was UCLA's 10th defensive touchdown scored since 2012. Ka'imi Fairbairn tied his career-best with a total of three made field goals in the game. The blocked punt by defensive end Takkarist McKinley was the 14th kick blocked by the Bruins under fourth-year coach Jim Mora. UCLA has won 13 of its last 14 non-conference games — and 10 straight since losing to Baylor in the 2012 Holiday Bowl. The Bruins have won all 11 regular-season non-conference games under Mora.

It was the first game in which UCLA did not surrender a touchdown since a 28-3 win against Washington State in 2008. The Bruins ran 98 plays from scrimmage in the contest and held UNLV to just 56 yards passing and 237 total yards.

PASADENA (AP) — Sophomore running back Nate Starks scored on a 3-yard run with 3:25 remaining, redshirt junior running back Paul Perkins rushed for 219 yards and a touchdown, and No. 10 UCLA rallied to beat No. 19 BYU in the Rose Bowl before over 67,000 fans. With freshman quarterback Josh

Rosen struggling, the Bruins' ground game picked up the slack

to maintain coach Jim Mora's perfect regular-season record against non-conference opponents. After Rosen's 9-yard pass to Jordan Payton to open the drive, the next six plays were all runs by Perkins and Starks to set up the decisive score. Starks ripped off runs of 31 and 22 yards on consecutive carries before scoring two plays later.

Quarterback Tanner Mangum drove the Cougars to the Bruins 42-yard line, but his fourth-down pass was intercepted by Myles Jack, allowing the Rose Bowl crowd to finally celebrate.

Rosen was 11 of 23 for 106 yards with a 19-yard touchdown to Payton early in the fourth quarter, and three interceptions. The Cougars frequently pressured Rosen and he threw all three picks in the first half. Paul Langi picked off Rosen at the 5-yard line to end a promising drive, and Kai Nacua came up with an interception in the end zone in the final minute of the second quarter. The mistakes prompted UCLA to rely on Perkins to save the day. The Pac-12's leading rusher last season established a career high, and had runs of 44 and 33 yards to set up touchdown drives before Starks delivered the final blow. The rally from the fourth quarter double-digit deficit was UCLA's first since 2005.

UCLA turned three Arizona turnovers into touchdowns while building a 28-point first half lead. UA got off to a great start against UCLA's depleted defense, which had lost starters Eddie Vanderdoes at defensive line, Myles Jack at linebacker and Fabian

Moreau at defensive back, quick-hitting its way to a 34-yard touchdown pass from Anu Solomon to Nate Phillips. UCLA evened the score cashing in on its first drive of the game on a 35-yard dart from Rosen to Thomas Duarte.

However, Arizona's second series ended quickly when a snap sailed over Solomon's hand and the Bruins recovered. Running back Paul Perkins scored on a 16-yard run the next play. The Wildcats lost another fumble and Rosen found Jordan Payton for a 5-yard touchdown pass that put UCLA up 28-7 early in the second quarter.

UCLA complemented its opportunistic defense with an efficient offense. Rosen was crisp against the Wildcats, picking them apart for 212 yards and two touchdowns on 13-of-17 passing by half.

UA gained a little momentum to open the second half after back-up quarterback Jerarrd Randall scrambled and found David Richards for a 16-yard touchdown. The Wildcats reached UCLA's 3 on the next drive, but settled for a field goal, cutting the deficit to 42-23. The Bruins managed to take control of the game right back, though, moving quickly to set up Rosen's 8-yard touchdown run. Freshman SoSo Jamabo finished off the Bruins' scoring with a 10-yard run.

ASU built a 29-10 lead heading into the fourth quarter before the Bruins rallied. Thomas Duarte caught his second touchdown pass from Josh Rosen with 9:19 left, trimming the Sun Devils' lead to 29-23. But Matt Haack's exceptional punt and a defensive stand forced the Bruins to take a safety with 4:16 left. Arizona State wrapped up

the decision with a late TD run.

The Sun Devils shut down UCLA's running game and consistently tormented Rosen, who completed 22-for-40 for 280 yards with an interception. UCLA tailback Paul Perkins was held to 63 yards rushing and a fourth-quarter touchdown.

Arizona State took the lead in the first quarter when Rosen was called for intentional grounding in the end zone. Tim White followed up the Sun Devils' safety by returning the kickoff 65 yards and then rumbling in with a 14-yard TD catch. Bercovici ran up the middle for a 34-yard score early in the third quarter, and Foster caught a TD pass shortly afterward to extend the ASU advantage. UCLA's offense got rolling in the fourth quarter, with Perkins making a gutsy 29-yard run before a 1-yard TD plunge. Linebacker Isaako Savaiinaea made an interception near midfield moments later, and then UCLA capped off a scoring drive when Duarte caught a 17-yard TD pass.

Arizona State's next drive stalled, but Haack rolled his punt out of bounds right in front of the goal-line pylon, and UCLA snapped its own punt attempt high out of the end zone on purpose but could not stop ASU's next drive.

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) — As well as Stanford played offensively, it might have taken a perfect game to beat the Cardinal who swept past visiting UCLA on Thursday night for their eighth straight win in the series.

An early interception of a Rosen pass was returned for a touchdown, a long kickoff return allowed that set up another score and 10 penalties for 93 yards were far too much for the Bruins to overcome.

Francis Owusu pinned the ball on the back of a Bruin defender in the end zone for a touchdown catch and running back Christian McCaffrey did most of the rest, with a school-record 243 yards rushing and four touchdowns.

"It was a tough loss against a good team," coach Jim Mora said. "The pick 6, the kickoff return, the nine offensive penalties, those are tough things to overcome. We hurt ourselves with missed tackles."

McCaffrey, who finished with 369 all-purpose yards, scored on a 70-yard run out of the wildcat, returned a kick 96 yards to set up another score and ran for three more touchdowns in a performance that set a new school rushing record.

Bruin true freshman quarterback Josh Rosen threw for 325 yards and three touchdowns. It was his second 300-yard effort of the season. Paul Perkins ran for 104 and a score, but the Bruins dropped their second straight Pac-12 contest.

"Every loss hurts. We have to execute a lot better than we did tonight," safety Randall Goforth said. "Their quarterback did everything right and they outplayed us. I just have to make sure everybody is staying together and we'll come back and be ready to fight."

PASADENA (AP) - After two straight conference losses, quarterback Josh Rosen produced a passing performance that put the true freshman's name in the Bruins' record book and lifted UCLA past California on a Thursday night. Rosen completed a school-record 34 passes (for 399 yards) and threw two of his three touchdown passes to Devin Fuller.

Junior Thomas Duarte had career highs of 10 catches for 141 yards for the Bruins. UCLA rebounded from

consecutive losses to Arizona State and Stanford, with a 573-yard offensive performance and a stellar effort by its defense, which sacked Cal's Jared Goff five times.

"Every time you win, it's a step forward," said Rosen, who broke the school completions record set by Richard Brehaut and Brett Hundley. "Especially with our bye week, that was three weeks without a win, so it felt great to come out here and put it to them."

Soso Jamabo rushed for a score after star UCLA tailback Paul Perkins left with an injury, and the Bruins' injury-plagued defense limited Goff and Cal's potent offense to 170 yards in the first half.

Debuting their black-and-gold "City" uniforms, UCLA appeared revitalized. Ka'imi Fairbairn made four field goals, including a school-record 60-yarder at the halftime gun, and the UCLA defense caused trouble for Goff throughout. Senior linebacker Aaron Wallace recorded a career-best 2.5 sacks to lead the Bruins defense.

"The key was getting that quarterback on the ground," UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "We struggle with that, and we got it done against a really good player."

"Things that we haven't done all year, we did tonight," Cal coach Sonny Dykes said. "That's not indicative of this football team..."

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) -- Colorado ran 114 plays and held the ball for more than 41 minutes while the latest wave of injuries washed over UCLA's already battered defense. The weary Bruins weathered everything the Buffaloes could manage.

Soso Jamabo rushed for the go-ahead touchdown with 8:28 to play and the Bruins escaped. Josh Rosen passed for 262 yards and a touchdown for the Bruins, who won despite giving up 18 consecutive points in the second

half and yielding 554 total yards. Rosen's 407 yards of total offense ranked as the ninth-best total in UCLA history and the 11th of at least 400 yards.

The Buffaloes dominated possession to an extraordinary degree, forcing UCLA's defense to stay on the field for 55 more snaps than its counterpart, including a 40-4 CU edge in the second quarter.

"That was the longest game I've ever played on defense, ever," said junior linebacker Jayon Brown, who led the Bruins with 18 tackles, the most since Randall Goforth registered 19 in a 2013 game at Stanford. "This was a first, just between the injuries we had, the new injuries we got and all their first downs. Hope we don't ever have another one like this, but if we do, we'll be ready."

Patrick Carr rushed for 110 yards, and his TD run put Colorado into the lead, 31-28, with 12:04 to play. The Bruins answered with Jamabo's score before stopping the Buffaloes twice in UCLA territory on an 87-degree Halloween day in the Arroyo Seco. Junior defensive end Takkari McKinley's pressure forced a poor throw by Sefo Liufau on fourth down with 3:34 to play. Later, freshman backup defensive back Nate Meadors intercepted a pass by Liufau near midfield with 51 seconds left.

"That was about as gritty a win as I've ever been around," UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "To overcome the things that we overcame in terms of personnel, that was staggering. I couldn't tell you who was in there on any given play. From cramps to sprained ankles to hamstrings, and then a true freshman seals it - a safety playing corner. That's a team win."

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP)—True freshman quarterback Josh Rosen helped UCLA keep alive its Pac-12 title hopes, throwing two touchdown passes to Thomas Duarte in cold, rainy conditions in Reser Stadium.

Rosen was 22-for-33 for 333 yards before sitting out the fourth quarter. The Bruins had 676 yards, the third-highest total in school history. UCLA limited Oregon State to 246 yards

and forced four turnovers against redshirt freshman quarterback Nick Mitchell. It was the Bruins' first shutout since a 2007 contest against Oregon and their first on the road since a 1987 game versus Stanford.

Rosen now has 131 attempts without an interception since the third quarter of the Stanford game. It was the second time this season the Bruins have held an opponent out of the end zone.

The Bruins capitalized on turnovers to score 24 points in the second quarter. Oregon State had a drive going late in the first quarter, but Mitchell fumbled at the UCLA 34 and the Bruins recovered. UCLA's drive stalled and Ka'imi Fairbairn converted a 38-yard field goal to open the scoring.

On Oregon State's next possession, Randall Goforth picked off Mitchell's pass at the Beavers 42. Rosen threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Duarte, capping a seven-play drive. Later in the half, Rosen showed off his arm on a 63-yard pass to Kenneth Walker. A few plays later, the Bruins capped the 96-yard drive with another touchdown pass to Duarte. Mitchell threw his second interception on Oregon State's subsequent drive, leading to Paul Perkins' touchdown run that made it 24-0.

UCLA got the ball to open the second half and scored on Nate Starks' 11-yard run. Fairbairn made another field goal, and Soso Jamabo added a 30-yard touchdown run at the end of the third quarter to cap off the scoring.

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) -- Gabe Marks caught a 21-yard touchdown pass from Luke Falk with 3 seconds to play, sending Washington State to victory. WSU had an improbable addendum to what seemed to be a storybook ending. True freshman quarterback Josh Rosen capped a desperate 80-yard drive by scrambling 37 yards and diving for the go-ahead touchdown

with 1:09 to play. Falk answered with his own 75-yard drive ending with a catch by Marks, who became the Cougars' career receptions leader earlier in the game.

Rosen went 33 for 57 for 340 yards, and the freshman appeared to clinch the win after Jaleel Wadood's end-zone interception with 3:13 left gave a last chance to the Bruins, who racked up 554 yards. "I don't think I've ever scored that many points on offense with only two touchdowns," Rosen said. "We've got to convert... we just didn't hold up our end of the bargain on offense."

UCLA lost after leading at halftime for the first time in 32 games under coach Jim Mora. The Bruins also lost despite holding WSU's prolific Air Raid offense to 288 yards in the first three quarters. Sophomore running back Nate Starks had an early TD run for the Bruins, who still control their fate in the Pac-12 South. UCLA would win the division with season-ending road victories at Utah and Southern California.

"It's something we have to get over quickly," Mora said. "As crazy as it is, we're still right in the hunt for what our goal was all along." The Bruins allowed WSU to stay close by hurting themselves: a short punt, a fumbled punt return and a defensive holding call which wiped out a sack on third down, each provide WSU with scoring chances.

UCLA kicker Ka'imi Fairbairn became the leading scorer in Pac-12 history with his 392nd career point when the Bruins' opening drive ended with a 22-yard field goal. UCLA center Jake Brendel set a school record on the same drive with his 49th career start, surpassing linebacker Spencer Hagner's 10-year-old mark.

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) -- UCLA is now officially one victory from playing in its first Pac-12 championship game since 2012 after beating No. 18 Utah. True freshman quarterback Josh Rosen threw for 220 yards and a touchdown as UCLA ended the Utes' Pac-12 title hopes.

"That is what we expect," Mora said.

"That is the kind of kids we have.

They're from diverse backgrounds. A lot of these young men could have given up in life a long time ago. But, that's not their character."

The Bruins scored touchdowns on two long drives to start the first and third quarters. Rosen, UCLA's freshman star, completed 15 of 30 passes and had a 122.6 quarterback rating. He's now thrown a school-record 218 consecutive passes without an interception. Paul Perkins added 98 rushing yards and a touchdown while Jordan Payton had a game-high 105 receiving yards for the Bruins and his fourth quarter catch gave him the UCLA career record for receptions with 194.

Utah's Travis Wilson threw for 110 yards and rushed for 67 while Joe Williams, who took over for an injured Devontae Booker, ran for 121 yards.

UCLA scored its lone touchdown of the first half on the opening possession of the game. Rosen hit receiver Thomas Duarte for 33 yards on the first play and 28 yards for a touchdown five snaps later.

Ka'imi Fairbairn put the Bruins up 10-0 with a 33-yard field goal with 4:01 left in the quarter, a score set up by Randall Goforth's recovery of Williams' fumble that ended the Utes' first possession. The Utes put together clock-eating drives in the second quarter, holding the ball for nine more minutes than UCLA. But Utah's four first-half drives produced just two 39-yard field goals. The Utes added a 21-yard field goal in the third quarter to cut the Bruins' lead to 10-9. But UCLA's Perkins scored on a two-yard run with 5:17 left in the third quarter to put Utah in a hole that it never recovered from.

LOS ANGELES (AP) -- USC scored 20 straight second-half points while clinching the Pac-12 South title with a win over UCLA in the 85th edition of their crosstown showdown.

While the Trojans' offense held the ball for 40 minutes, USC got its game-changing plays on defense and special teams. Adoree Jackson returned a punt 42 yards for a touchdown shortly before halftime, and Rasheem Green

put the Trojans ahead to stay in the third quarter when the freshman defensive lineman returned Josh Rosen's fumble for a 31-yard touchdown.

Paul Perkins rushed for two touchdowns for the Bruins, who lost to USC for the first time in coach Jim Mora's tenure. "It's a new feeling for us here," Mora said. "The game turned, obviously, on the punt return there right before the half and the turnovers in the second half. We couldn't get any, and they did, and they capitalized."

Rosen passed for 227 yards and hit Thomas Duarte for an early TD, but the freshman also threw two second-half interceptions. "I just felt like we made that defense look a lot better than they necessarily were," Rosen said. "No shots at them at all, we just didn't execute like we should have."

Kessler sneaked into the end zone to cap an 85-yard USC drive early in the second. Rosen looked sharp until USC's defense finally got pressure on him on consecutive plays deep in UCLA's end late in the first half. Jackson took the ensuing short punt all the way back to put the Trojans ahead 20-14.

Perkins' second TD run capped a 78-yard drive shortly after halftime, and UCLA appeared to be taking control until USC's Claude Pelon jarred the ball loose from Rosen, allowing freshman Green to take it to the house untouched. Moments later, Iman Marshall picked off a short throw for Rosen's first interception in 245 passes since the Stanford game, the longest interception-free streak in the FBS.

SANTA CLARA, Calif. — Tommy Armstrong Jr. threw a touch-down pass and ran for another score to help Nebraska cap off its season by beating UCLA 37-29 in the Foster Farms Bowl on Saturday night.

The Cornhuskers (6-7) scored 30 straight points after falling behind 21-7 early to rally past the Bruins and provide a happy ending to coach Mike Riley's

first season.

Stanley Morgan Jr. gave Nebraska the lead for good with a one-handed, 22-yard catch in the third quarter and Imani Cross, Terrell Newby and Andy Janovich all ran for scores for the Cornhuskers.

Armstrong completed 12 of 19 passes for 174 yards and ran for 76 more to lead the way for Nebraska, which had a season high with 326 yards rushing on 62 carries to become the fifth UCLA opponent to surpass 200 rushing yards this season. Josh Rosen threw for 319 yards and two touchdowns for the Bruins.

Nebraska only got the chance to play in a bowl because there were not enough six-victory teams to fill all 80 slots — and the Cornhuskers made the most of the opportunity by taking the game over in the third quarter.

After tying the score with two late touchdowns in the second quarter, Nebraska outgained UCLA 196 to 1 in the third quarter behind a dominant running game.

The Cornhuskers gained 151 yards on the ground alone in the third quarter, with the run game setting up Morgan's touchdown catch that made the score 27-21 and then leading the way on drives that ended in a field goal and Armstrong's 3-yard run in the opening minute of the fourth quarter to make the score 37-21.

UCLA came back to make it a one score game on a scoring pass from Rosen to Jordan Payton with 11:29 to play. Two subsequent Bruin possessions came up empty after a missed field goal and an interception.
