

2015 - Played in 24 matches, making 24 starts ... was selected as a First Team All-American and was named the 2015 Division I Player of the Year, the fourth UCLA player to ever earn Player of the Year notice and the first since 2004 ... named First Team All-NCAA Tournament in 2015 after recording a total of 32 saves in the NCAA National Championship tournament ... earned MPSF All-Academic accolades for 2015 ... was the lone goalie named First Team All-MPSF and was also selected as the 2015 MPSF Player of the Year and MPSF/KAP7 Tournament MVP after recording 44 saves through three wins in the MPSF Tournament, including one in the final three seconds to preserve an overtime league championship victory over Cal, the last of his career-high 21 stops in the finals ... in the semifinals of the MPSF tournament against USC, he did not allow a goal through the first three quarters and also shattered UCLA's all-time saves record ... was also the only goalie named to the MPSF/KAP7 All-Tournament team ... he finished the season with 278 saves, placing him atop UCLA's single-season saves charts, and his career total of 773 saves not only placed him at 9th all-time in the MPSF but also prompted a huge jump in the UCLA record books, moving him from fifth in career saves to first all-time ... he led the MPSF for the third straight year in goals-against average (6.05) and was first in saves per game (13.15) ... he was the only player in the MPSF to pick up two MPSF/KAP7 Player of the Week honors in 2015 ... he picked up his first honor on Sept. 21 after leading UCLA to its third consecutive NorCal Invitational title where he accumulated 29 saves in 2.75 games in the cage (10.5 spg) and also averaged 3.6 steals per game ... his second Player of the Week honor came on Nov. 16 after he recorded career-highs of 19 saves and seven steals in a 11-6 win over USC, the Bruins' third victory over the Trojans in 2015 ... that win helped cap a perfect 25-0 regular season record and 9-0 MPSF record ... he tallied 23 assists (6th on the team) and led the team with 66 steals.

2014 — Played in 25 matches, making 25 starts ... was selected as a First Team All-American and was the lone goalie named First Team All-MPSF ... also named First Team All-NCAA Tournament in 2014 ... led the MPSF for the second straight year in goals-against average (5.91) and was fourth in saves per game (10.93) ... combined with his 233 saves in 2014 (ranks fourth on the single season charts), his career total of 495 already ranks fifth on the Bruins' career charts ... was named the MPSF/Kap7 Player of the Week on Sept. 22 after leading the Bruins to the Kap7 NorCal Classic title ... he tallied 14 saves in the Bruins' 9-7 NorCal Semifinal win over No. 3 USC, before a career-high tying 15-save effort in the 9-7 championship win over No. 1 Stanford ... the Trojans and Cardinal were held to a collective 5-for-21 on power plays, in which Danner made 11 stops on those 5-on-6 plays ... for the Kap7 NorCal Classic, Danner averaged 12.54 saves per game (35 saves) and posted a goals against average of 6.44 ... he led UCLA with 10 steals in 2.79 games played at NorCals ... also tallied a season- and career-high-tying 15 saves to capture third at the MPSF Championships with a 10-5 win over USC (Nov. 23) ... he led UCLA with 59 steals.

2013 — Appeared in 29 games at goalkeeper, making 29 starts ... was an honorable mention All-American and an honorable mention All-MPSF selection ... was named UCLA's first-ever MPSF Newcomer of the Year, backed by an MPSF-best 6.32 goals against average in 94.88 quarters (759 minutes) ... collected a season-high 15 saves in the MPSF Guarterfinal win against UC Santa Barbara and broke the school record for saves in a single season with 262 ... also had the third-highest saves per game average in the league at 11.05 ... earned his first career conference player of the week award on September 23, after leading UCLA to the NorCal Tournament title, registering 40 saves in 15 quarters (10.67 SPG) that weekend, topped off by a pair of 12-save outings in the semifinal vs. California and final vs. No. 1 USC ... 


