## BRUINS TRAVEL NORTH TO MEET CALIFORNIA

— UCLA (0-5, 0-2) heads to Berkeley to take on California (3-2, 0-2) in a Pac-12 Conference matchup on Saturday, Oct. 13 at 4:00 p.m. The game will be televised by the Pac-12 Network. The Bruin IMG Radio Network will broadcast the contest, which will also be aired over Sirius/XM, 97.3 FM THE FAN, uclabruins.com, tunein.com and TuneIn App. UCLA leads the series 23-21 in games played in Berkeley, but has lost eight of the last nine meetings played in Memorial Stadium. In last year's matchup in the Rose Bowl (Nov. 24), JJ Molson connected on a 37-yard field goal attempt with four seconds to play to secure UCLA's first undefeated home campaign in Pasadena since posting a 6-0 mark in 2005. The win was UCLA's sixth of the season, first for interim head coach Jedd Fisch, and set up a bowl berth in the Cactus Bowl. Jordan Lasley caught a career-high 12 passes for 227 yards and one touchdown in the contest, becoming the first Bruin to record back-to-back 200-yard receiving contests. Kenny Young became the final UCLA player to wear the No. 42 in a game (retired jersey for Jackie Robinson) and led the team with a career-best 15 tackles. The teams last played in Berkeley on Nov. 26, 2016, a 36-10 Cal win. QB Davis Webb led the Golden Bears to the win in a game Cal totaled 36 first downs to 10 for the Bruins. UCLA trailed 12-0 at half, but closed to 12-7 early in the second half on a pass from Mike Fafaul to Kenneth Walker. Cal answered with a pair of touchdowns about two minutes apart to move out to a 26-7 advantage. JJ Molson kicked a 28-yard field goal on the Bruins' next possession, but it was the last Bruin points of the game.

First-year head coach Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly compiled a 46-7 record in four seasons as the head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12). During that span, his Duck teams captured first place or a share of first in the North Division of the conference (three outright conference championships 2009-11) and four BCS bowl games. Kelly guided Oregon to appearances in a National Championship Game (2010), two Rose Bowls (after 2011 and 2009 seasons) and the Fiesta Bowl following the 2012 season. He also has served as the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016) and the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15).

## THE WATCH LIST—

- Senior safety Adarius Pickett topped the team in tackles for the fourth time this season last week against Washington and has produced four double-digit tackle performances in the process in 2018 (career-high 16 vs. Washington, 13 vs. Fresno St., 12 at Oklahoma, 15 v. Cincinnati) ... He ranks second in Pac-12 in total tackles/g (12.2) and 7th in the NCAA ... Pickett has seven career double-digit tackle games to his credit ... His total of 16 tackles is tied for the second-most by a conference player this season.
- UCLA achieved a season-best 57% 3rd down conversion rate vs. UW (8/14) ... It entered the game having converted 17 of 56 third down attempts (30%).
- Stefan Flintoft leads the Pac-12 in punting average (47.4) and has the most punts of any league performer for 50 or more yards this season (13).
- ILB Krys Barnes is 112th in Pac-12 in tackles/g (7.4) and totaled a career-best 3.0 tackles for loss vs. Washington, a figure which is tied for the second-most by a conference player in a game this season.
- RB Joshua Kelley racked up a career-best 125 yards vs. Washington to post his second straight century game (124 at Colorado) ... The last Bruin to register back-to-back 100-yard efforts was Paul Perkins in 2015 (151 vs. UNLV, 219 vs. BYU) ... The last to record three straight 100-yard games was Jordan James in the 2013 season (155 vs. Nevada, 105 vs. Nebraska, 164 vs. New Mexico State).
- 56 players saw action vs. Washington, including just six seniors and 20 freshmen --13 true freshmen (RB Kazmeir Allen, DB Stephan Blaylock, LB Bo Calvert, WR Chase Cota, WR Michael Ezeike, WR Delon Hurt, RB Martell Irby, DL Atonio Mafi, DL Tyler Manoa, OL Christophany Murray, DL Otito Ogbonnia, QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson, LB Elijah Wade) and seven redshirt freshmen (DB Elijah Gates, DB Jay Shaw, TE Drew Platt, LB Donovan Williams, DB Shea Pitts, OL Sam Marrazzo, OLB Oduia Isibor). (15 sophomores / 15 juniors).
- A 36-34 win at Cal in 2014 is the lone Bruin victory in the Bay Area in its last 13 games played in NorCal (lost @Stanford in 2017, lost @Cal in 2016, lost bowl to Nebraska in 2015 (Santa Clara), lost @Stanford in 2015, won @Cal in 2014, lost @Stanford in 2013, lost @Stanford in 2012 P12 Championship game, lost @Cal in 2012, lost @Stanford in 2011, lost to Illinois in bowl in 2011 (San Francisco), lost @Cal in 2010, lost @Stanford in 2009, lost @Cal in 2008).
- The teams the Bruins have faced in their first five games of the season own a combined 25-3 record going into this week's action --- Cincinnati (6-0), Oklahoma (5-1), Fresno State (3-1), Colorado (4-0), Washington (5-1).
- Through five games, UCLA has started just 11 of its 63 possessions beyond its own 25 yard-line with an average starting field position as follows: Cincinnati U26, Oklahoma U24, Fresno U29, Colorado U 25, Washington U21. Opponents have started: Cincinnati 36, Oklahoma 35, Fresno 33, Colorado 26, UW 28.
- TE Caleb Wilson had his third career 100-yard receiving game (102 yards) against Washington on a season-high eight receptions.
- The Bruins have lost the last 12 true road games and the last 11 conference road contests (2018-at Colorado, at Oklahoma; 2017-at USC, at Utah, at Washington, at Arizona, at Stanford, at Memphis; 2016-at Cal, at Colorado, at Washington St., at Arizona St.; 2015-at USC). The last overall road win was a 17-14 verdict at BYU in third game of the 2016 season. The last conference road victory came on Nov. 21, 2015 at Utah, 17-9 --- only 14 players on the current roster were on that 2015 team.
- Boss Tagaloa, who had started eight games on the defensive line, made his first career start on offense at center at Colorado and has started the last two games -- the Bruins who averaged 3.5 yards per carry through three games (392/111 carries) have rushed for a 5.3 yards per carry in last two (301/56) ... The Bruins surrendered 12 sacks in first three contests and three in last two games.
- According to NCAA stats - UCLA is 2nd in highest winning % of all opponents on '18 schedules: No. 1 South Carolina (.741), No. 2 UCLA (.705), No. 3 Florida St. (.703).
- UCLA's roster has the fifth-highest percentage of underclassmen in the nation according to a pre-season survey of FBS schools: 76.7% Illinois (78/102); 76% Coastal Carolina (92/121); 75.2% Appalachian State (88/117); 72.1% Cincinnati (80/111); 71.7% UCLA (76/106).
- UCLA is 0-5 for the first time since the 1943 season, when it started 0-7 under coach Edwin Horrell ... UCLA lost its first five conference games to begin the 2009 season before rallying to win three of the last four.
- 23 Bruin position players from the 2015, 2016 and 2017 teams have gone on to be listed on opening day NFL rosters (active, reserve list, practice squad) in 2018, including 7 offensive linemen, 6 defensive linemen, 4 receivers, 3 linebackers, 2 defensive backs and 1 quarterback -- 2017 (10): QB Josh Rosen (Cardinals), LB Kenny Young (Ravens), C Scott Quessenberry (Chargers), OG Najee Toran (49ers), OT Kolton Miller (Raiders), WR Jordan Lasley (Ravens), WR Darren Andrews (Patriots), TE Austin Roberts (Chargers), DL Jacob Tuitt-Mariner (Falcons), DL Matt Dickerson (Titans). 2016 (7): LB Jayon Brown (Titans), DL Eddie Vanderdoes (Raiders), DL Takk McKinley (Falcons), DL Eli Ankou (Jaguars), OL Conor McDermott (Bills), DB Marcus Rios (Broncos), DB Fabian Moreau (Redskins). - CB Darnay Holmes tied his career-best with seven tackles vs. Fresno State ... he picked off his fourth career pass at Oklahoma ... Holmes ranks T-8th in Pac-12 in passes defended (1.0) this season.
- WR Theo Howard has caught a pass in each of his last 21 straight games. He hauled in a season-best total of nine catches last week vs. UW... he had a career-high 11 receptions last year vs. USC. Howard's 56 catches last season were the 16th-most in school single-season annals.
- Kicker JJ Molson is 8th on the all-time Bruins made field goal list (34) ... He has converted 13 of his last 15 FGAs over the last two seasons ... Molson is 18th on the all-time school list for career scoring (189 pts); Molson has 13 touchbacks on his 21 kickoff attempts this season.
- Christophany Murray became the first true freshman to start an opener at center for the Bruins since at least 1982 (complete records date to '82) ... the last true freshman to start along the offensive line for the Bruins was Najee Toran (guard) in the 2014 opener at Virginia. All five Bruin offensive line starters are either in their first year starting at UCLA (C/G-Murray, RG/RT Justin Murphy, RT Jake Burton) or have switched position sides of the ball from last year (now LT Andre James, now LG Michael Alves each started on the right side last season).
- True freshman receiver Michael Ezeike caught his second scoring pass of the season at Colorado (the school season record for true freshmen is three, held by Thomas Duarte-2013 and Raymond Burks-1973).
- The Bruins own an October record of 10-13 over past six seasons-2018 (0-1), 2017 (1-2), 2016 (1-3), 2015 (2-2), 2014 (2-2), 2013 (2-2), 2012 (2-1).
- True freshmen Bruins played: 2018: 15, 2017: 8, 2016: 11, 2015: 10, 2014: 9, 2013: 18 (school record total), 2012:12 --- RB Kazmeir Allen, RB Martell Irby, QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson, WR Kyle Phillips, OL Christophany Murray, WR Chase Cota, DL Antonio Mafi, DL Tyler Manoa, DB Stephan Blaylock, DB Rayshad Williams and DL Otito Ogbonna, saw action vs. Cincinnati. WR Michael Ezeike became the 12th freshman to play (at Oklahoma). WR Delon Hurt and LB Bo Calvert saw their first action vs. Fresno State. LB Elijah Wade hit the field at Colorado to bring the total to 15 in 2018.
- The setback to Cincinnati snapped a 10-game win streak vs. non-conf. opponents played in the Rose Bowl and a six-game overall win streak in Pasadena.
- The Bruins were 1-1 on fourth down vs. Washington, 1-2 at Colorado, 2-3 on fourth down vs. Fresno St, 1-2 at Oklahoma and 0-2 on a pair of fourth down attempts vs. Cincinnati -- Coach Kelly's teams at UO converted on 71/118 (.602) 4th down attempts: 15/22 (.682) in 2009, 22/34 (.647) in 2010, 14/31 (.452) in 2011, 20/31(.645) in 2012.

## IN BRIEF

- Position player starts leaders for Bruins: CB Nate Meadors-28, OL Andre James-25, S Adarius Pickett-22, OL Michael Alves-18, DB Darnay Holmes-16, WR Theo Howard-16. The longest starting streak belongs to James who has opened the last 25 games, Alves and Meadors are next with 18 straight starts each. (note on transfers: QB Wilton Speight now has 17 career starts and OG Justin Murphy has 16 career starts)
- UCLA will play seven home games in the Rose Bowl for the first time since 2012.
- The Bruins roster includes 52 freshmen (36 true/16 redshirt), seven seniors, plus two grad transfers. Twenty-nine (out of 66 players who have seen action-44%) players have seen their first game action this season for the Bruins.
- Dorian Thompson-Robinson became the 8th Bruin true freshman to start a game at quarterback at Oklahoma and the fourth to open up in a road contest.
- 10 players made their first career starts (6 off., 4 def.) as Bruins in the season-opener vs. Cincinnati ... First career starts as Bruins in 2018 - vs. Cincinnati: OT Jake Burton, OG Justin Murphy, C Christophany Murray, QB Wilton Speight, RB Joshua Kelley, WR Dymond Lee; DL Antonio Mafi, DL Martin Andrus Jr., LB Tyree Thompson, S Quentin Lake (in addition OG Michael Alves and OT Andre James switched from right side to left side starters in the opener)...DL Otito Ogbonna made his first start vs. Oklahoma ... OLB Oduwa Isibor made his initial start vs. Fresno State ... TE Devin Asiasi started for first time at Colorado (Boss Tagalao started first game at center, as Murray shifted to right guard) ... DL Osa Odighizuwa made his first start vs. UW.

- The 74-yard scoring run by Kazmeir Allen vs. Cincinnati was the third longest by a Bruin true freshman ... Maurice Jones-Drew recorded the top mark with an 83-yard jaunt vs. Arizona State in 2003. Allen's total of 103 yards rushing rates second behind the 120-yard debut effort by Myles Jack in 2013 game at Arizona.
- TE Caleb Wilson's 15 catches in 2017 season-opener vs. A&M (208 yds) established a school record ... Wilson became just the third Bruin receiver (at the time) to go over 200 yards. The final NCAA stats listed only three players who finished with a higher average number of catches per game than his 7.6 mark in '17.
- WR Christian Pabico's 99-receiving yards effort vs. Oregon in '17 was most productive game by Bruin walk-on receiver since Danny Farmer (148 in 1999 vs. ASU).
- UCLA's non-Saturday regular season game record dating thru 2010 is 7-9 --- Thurs.: 4-5, Fri.: 2-4, Sun.:1-0 --- 2018: Friday at Colorado (L); 2017: Sunday vs. Texas A&M (W), Friday at Utah (L), Friday vs. Cal (W); 2016: Thursday at Colorado (L); 2015: Thursday at Stanford (L), Thursday vs. Cal (W); 2014: Thursday at Arizona State (W), Friday vs. Stanford (L); 2013: Thursday at Utah (W), Friday vs. Washington (W), 2012: Thursday at Rice (W); 2011: Thursday at Arizona (L); 2010: Thursday at Oregon (L), Thursday at Washington (L), Friday at Arizona State (L).
- The Bruins have played in a bowl game in 13 of the previous 16 seasons (not after 2008, 2010, 2016 seasons).
- UCLA has had a total of six first-round selections in the past seven NFL drafts (2013-DL Datone Jones, 2014-LB Anthony Barr, 2016-DL Kenny Clark, 2017-DL Takk McKinley, 2018-QB Josh Rosen and OL Kolton Miller) which is tied for the most by a Pac-12 school (Stanford, USC, UW). The Bruins total of 30 draftees (14 def., 15 off., 1 sp. teams) in the last seven NFL Drafts is tied (Stanford) for the most of any Pac-12 school during that stretch.
- The Bruin comeback from 34 points down last season (trailed Texas A&M 10-44 with 4:08 remaining in the 3rd quarter ranks as the second-greatest number of points overcome to win a game between FBS Teams --- Michigan State rallied from a 35-point deficit (3-38 at 9:54 of 3rd quarter) against Northwestern in a 41-38 win during a 2006 game.
- The 2017 Texas A&M game marked the second time in school history UCLA had three 100-yard receivers in same contest --- Caleb Wilson (208), Darren Andrews (142), Jordan Lasley (100). Also 2005 vs. Arizona St. (Chris Markey 120, Joe Cowan 109, Mercedes Lewis 108).
- UCLA has won 29 straight overall games and 48 straight regular season games in which it has held the opponent to less than 20 points (last loss 17-16 to BYU in 2007 Las Vegas Bowl / last regular season loss 16-14 at Colorado 2003).

Brothers Lokeni (junior born in 12/97) and Leni Toailoa (redshirt sophomore born in 10/98) are linebackers for the Bruins...Osa Odighizuwa's brother, Owa, played football at UCLA (2010-14) ... Safety Quentin Lake is following in the footsteps of his mom (Monica) and dad (Carnell) who each attended UCLA. Carnell played linebacker at UCLA from 1985-88 and went on to earn All-Pro honors in the NFL... Punter Stefan Flintoft's cousin Collin (also a punter) joined the team this season ... Long snapper Johnny Den Bleyker's brother Alex, was the long snapper at Washington State (2011-2014)... WR Chase Cota's dad, Chad, played at Oregon and then in the NFL from 1995-2002 with the Panthers, Colts, Rams and Saints ... DB Elisha Guidry's brother, Javelin, plays defensive back at Utah. ## UCLA HEAD COACH CHIP KELLY



Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly holds 27 seasons of coaching experience at both the professional and collegiate levels, most recently serving as head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016). He also served as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15) following four seasons as head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12) where he posted a record of 46-7.

Kelly's lone season in San Francisco saw the 49ers improve from the league's 21st-ranked rushing attack in 2015 (1,544 yards) to the 4th-best ground game in 2016 (2,019 yards). Running back Carlos Hyde was the biggest beneficiary of the improvement, gaining 988 yards in just 13 contests (76.0 yards per game).

Over Kelly's three seasons in Philadelphia, the Eagles ranked third in the NFL in points per game (26.9) and total offense (392.8 yards per game), as well as fourth in rushing yards per game (131.3). Sixteen Pro Bowlers were selected from his teams, including eight in 2014. The Eagles won 10 games in each of his first two seasons, as his 2014 offense scored a franchise-record 474 points to surpass his 2013 team's previous-record total of 442.

The Eagles showed a marked improvement in Year 1 under Kelly, as their 10 wins followed a four-win 2012. He became just the second head coach in league history to win a division title in his first season in the NFL, as the Eagles captured an NFC East Division Championship. He was also named the Maxwell Club NFL Coach of the Year.

Kelly began his head coaching career at the University of Oregon in 2009, leading the Ducks to a 10-3 record and a trip to the Rose Bowl. He finished his time at Oregon with an overall record of 46-7 as head coach (2009-12), including a 33-3 mark in conference play. In his four seasons in Eugene, the Ducks averaged 44.7 points per game. Kelly became the first coach in school history to guide the program to three consecutive undisputed conference championships (2009-11) and its first three 12-win seasons (2010-12).

Oregon made an appearance in a BCS Bowl game in each of Kelly's four seasons, including a trip to the National Championship game following the 2010 campaign. Kelly was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons in 2009 and 2010, and Associated Press Coach of the Year in 2010.

The 2012 Ducks finished second in the nation in scoring (49.6 points per game) and fifth in total offense (537.4 yards per game) with freshman quarterback Marcus Mariota under center. They would conclude the season with a Fiesta Bowl victory over Kansas State. A January bowl game was also the end result for Oregon the year prior, as the Ducks defeated Wisconsin in a Rose Bowl thriller, 45-38. Kelly's offense notched Top-5 finishes in points per game (46.1, third) and total offense (522.8 yards per game, fourth) in 2011.

In 2010, the Ducks led the nation both points per game (46.1) and total yardage (530.7 per game) en route to a BCS National Championship Game appearance. In addition to his Pac-10 Coach of the Year and Associated Press Coach of the Year awards, Kelly garnered Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, Walter Camp Coach of the Year, The Sporting News Coach of the Year and American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year accolades.

Kelly's first season as a head coach (2009) culminated in a Rose Bowl appearance and the Pac-10 Coach of the Year award, as his offense ranked sixth in the country in both points per game (36.1) and rushing yards per game (231.7). He was promoted to the top spot after his offenses led the Pac-10 in a number of categories during his two seasons (2007-08) as offensive coordinator under Mike Bellotti.

Kelly had spent the previous 13 years at his alma mater, the University of New Hampshire, before being named offensive coordinator at Oregon. As offensive coordinator at UNH, Kelly protégée Ricky Santos earned the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding player in FCS in 2006. The quarterback previously finished second in 2005. Kelly also coached the Wildcats' offensive line (1997, 1998) and running backs (1992, 1994-96). The New Hampshire offense averaged better than 400 yards of total offense per game in seven of his eight seasons on staff.

Kelly began his coaching career guiding defensive backs and special teams at Columbia University in 1990. He moved to outside linebackers and safeties in 1991 before his first stint at UNH as running backs coach in 1992. He also spent one season at Johns Hopkins University as defensive coordinator in 1993.

The 2018 season is UCLA's 22nd season with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the 12th year for the Bruins to be aired on AM 570 LA Sports (or am 1150 KTLK) in Southern California (97.3 FM The Fan in San Diego). The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder. The broadcast includes a pre- and post-game show. The Bruins' football pregame show will run 90 minutes, while the postgame show will be one hour.

Josh Lewin returns as the voice of the Bruins for a third season. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 22nd year on the broadcast team and his 18th as the analyst in the booth. Another Bruin signal caller, Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 17th season as the sideline reporter. AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks. The hour-long Bruin Insider Show returns to the Plateia Restaurant inside the Luskin Conference Center. Each week, it will stream live online on Tuesdays at [ucla.leanplayer.com](http://ucla.leanplayer.com) at 5:00 p.m. PT, and air on the radio on either AM 570 or AM 1150, most often at 7:00 p.m. PT.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Partner of UCLA Athletics. Games can also be heard via the internet at [uclabruins.com](http://uclabruins.com) and on [tunein.com](http://tunein.com) and the TuneIn App.

## SPIEKER FIELD AT THE ROSE BOWL - HOME OF BRUIN FOOTBALL

The nation's most famous college football stadium – The Rose Bowl – is now in its 37th season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark. Thanks to a generous donation in 2017 from prominent UCLA alum Tod Spieker and his family, the playing surface will be called Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl for at least the next 25 years.

The Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls – XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2018 and Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. In 2014, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Taylor Swift, Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium is in the process of completing the final touches on a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Granddaddy of Them All"



for the Rose Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and exits, and additional concession stands and restroom facilities.

Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area were included in the upgrades. In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity

to 76,000. Further enlargements took place in 1932 (83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans witnessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest. With the current seating configuration for home games, the capacity is 80,616 for general admission contests and 88,565 for reserved ticket games.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79,156.

Eight true freshmen played in the 2016 opener at Texas A&M - Tagaloa, Molson, Den Bleyker, Kent, B. Burton, Lok. Toailoa, Fernea, Stephens. Starks, Barnes and Howard saw their first action against UNLV. The Bruins played a total of 10 true freshmen in 2015. Five saw action in the 2015 season-opener against Virginia. Nine true frosh took the field in the 2014 season, seven in that season's opener at UVA. The Bruins established a new school mark in 2013 when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action that season. A school record fifteen true freshman saw action that season in the opener against Nevada along with eight redshirt freshmen. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012, eight in the opener at Rice. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen. UCLA started a true freshman quarterback (Josh Rosen) in the season opener of 2015 for the first time in school history. In 2017, DL Jaelan Phillips and DB Darnay Holmes became the first true freshmen defensive tandem to start an opener.

### NON-SATURDAY REGULAR SEASON GAMES

UCLA will tangle with Colorado (road loss) and Utah (home) in a pair of Friday night affairs this season. The Bruins had games in 2017 on Sunday (win over Texas A&M) and Friday (loss at Utah, home win vs. Cal). The game vs. A&M was the first college game played on a Sunday in the Rose Bowl. In 2016, UCLA played a Thursday night affair on Nov. 3 at the University of Colorado (loss). In the 2015 season, in back-to-back weeks, the Bruins took the field on Thursday night at Stanford (loss) and in the Rose Bowl versus California (win). In 2014, on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins. In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had previously played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday had been against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978. In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona (L) on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon (Thur.), Nov. 18 at Washington (Thur.) and Nov. 26 at Arizona State (Fri.). Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

## 2018 GAME RECAPS

### GAME ONE: Cincinnati 26, UCLA 17



#### Sept. 1 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. — A fourth quarter safety proved decisive in Saturday's football season opener, as UCLA was topped 26-17 by visiting Cincinnati at the Rose Bowl.

Tied 17-17 with less than 10 minutes to go in the fourth quarter, the Bearcats made the pivotal play of the game by stripping the ball from UCLA quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson around the

five yard line. After a couple bounces, the ball was recovered in the Bruin end zone for a safety, giving Cincinnati a decisive edge.

The visitors added on seven insurance points at the 1:44 mark, as running back Michael Warren II converted on fourth and goal for his third score of the day.

"These guys [now] have a game underneath their belt," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "We can go back and teach and show them what we did well. We can continue to build from there, and then what we need to correct. That will be an ongoing process for this group. There were a lot of firsts for everybody."

Thompson-Robinson finished the game as UCLA's top passer, completing 15 of 25 passes for 117 yards. Starting quarterback Wilton Speight was forced out of the game in the second quarter after taking a hard hit while scrambling to the left of the pocket.

Junior wide receiver Theo Howard finished as the Bruins' top pass catcher, totaling five receptions and 52 yards.

UCLA took a 10-0 lead by the end of the first quarter thanks in part to an impressive showing on the defensive side of the ball.

UCLA limited the Bearcats offense to just 21 yards over its first three drives, knocking starting quarterback Hayden Moore out of the game.

Junior defensive lineman Rick Wade made the play of the opening quarter for the Bruins, sacking Moore on the first play of Cincinnati's second drive and knocking the ball loose for a fumble that allowed UCLA to take over on the Bearcats' 13 yard line.

Senior running back Bolu Olorunfunmi took advantage of that short field and found pay dirt for the Bruins, first rushing for four yards to put the home team into a first and goal situation, then punching it in with a one yard run up the middle.

UCLA extended its lead to 10-0 on its final drive of the first quarter. Taking over after a three-and-out at their own 45, the Bruins pushed the ball up 25 yards to set up a long field goal for junior kicker JJ Molson, who knocked down the 47-yard attempt for the second longest conversion of his career (previous: 49 yards).

Cincinnati found its offensive rhythm in the second quarter, putting 17 unanswered points on the board to take the lead heading into halftime. After mustering just 25 yards in the air and 11 on the ground in the first quarter, Desmond Ridder took over at quarterback and went 5-7 for 48 yards while running back Michael Warren II carried 10 times for 49 yards including a pair of one yard touchdown runs. Warren II ended the contest with 141 rushing yards on 35 carries.

Just over a minute into the second half, UCLA freshman running back Kazmeir Allen took a handoff out of the shotgun formation, rushed to his right then found a hole and busted loose for a 74-yard touchdown run that tied it up at 17-17. The sprint was UCLA's longest rush from scrimmage since Paul Perkins on Oct. 31, 2015 (vs. Colorado, 82 yards).

Paired with a first quarter rush that went for 23 yards, Allen ended the day with 103 yards on five carries, giving him the second-most debut rushing yards by a freshman in school history.

The Bruin defense returned to its early-game form in the third quarter, forcing punts on all four Cincinnati drives and holding the Bearcats to just 54 yards.

### GAME TWO: Oklahoma 49, UCLA 21



#### Sept. 8 - Norman, Okla.

NORMAN, OKLA. - UCLA ran into a voracious Oklahoma defense that recorded six sacks and 12 tackles for loss in a 49-21 Sooners win at Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

The Bruin defense allowed just 179 yards rushing themselves, but the Sooners took advantage of nearly 200 return yards that gave them favorable field position.

UCLA running back Bolu Olorunfunmi rushed for two touchdowns, tight end Caleb Wilson had four catches for 92 yards, and freshman quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson threw for 254 yards and a touchdown for the Bruins. Oklahoma quarterback Kyler Murray threw three touchdowns and rushed for two more while throwing for 306 yards and rushing for 62. Bruin safety Adarius Pickett led all players with 12 tackles.

The Bruins (0-2) struck first, using a big 65-yard reception from Wilson to set up an Olorunfunmi three-yard rushing touchdown that gave UCLA a 7-0 lead.

The No. 6/5 Sooners (2-0) answered right back thanks to an 86-yard kickoff return by Tre Brown that started the Sooner drive at the 12. Three plays later, Rodney Anderson ran it in for a three-yard touchdown to tie.

After the Sooner defense forced a three-and-out, Murray hit Marquise Brown for a 58-yard touchdown pass on third and 14, giving Oklahoma the lead, 14-7, with 3:17 to play in the first. Murray increased Oklahoma's lead to 21-7 at the start of the second quarter on a 10-yard touchdown run.

The Bruins gained some momentum at the end of the second quarter when Osa Odighizuwa stopped Trey Sermon for a two-yard loss on fourth and one at the UCLA 23, allowing UCLA to go into halftime down by just 14. But Oklahoma ran off 21-straight points in the second half to take a 42-7 lead before the Bruins got back on the board with an Olorunfunmi two-yard touchdown run with 11:11 to play in the game. Thompson-Robinson added a nine-yard touchdown pass to Michael Ezeike late in the fourth, the first collegiate touchdown for each freshman. The freshman quarterback completed 8 of 10 passing attempts in the fourth quarter for 129 yards.

### GAME THREE: Fresno St. 38, UCLA 14



#### Sept. 15 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. - Quarterback Marcus McMaryion rushed for four touchdowns and passed for 270 yards to lead Fresno State to a 38-14 win over UCLA on Saturday night at the Rose Bowl.

UCLA (0-3) trailed 16-14 in the second half before the visiting Bulldogs (2-1) surged with 22 unanswered points to close out the contest.

Freshman quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson led the Bruins in both passing (151 yards) and rushing (49 yards). Senior safety Adarius Pickett led the defense with 13 tackles.

Fresno State's offense came out firing in the first quarter, finding the end zone twice on two consecutive lengthy drives to start the game. McMaryion capped off the Bulldogs opening drive with a one-yard touchdown run, finishing off the 13-play, almost five minute drive. On FSU's next possession, McMaryion connected with tight end Jared Rice for a 47-yard completion, setting up tight end Kyle Riddering's 10-yard touchdown catch moments later.

A 28-yard field goal from Asa Fuller made it 16-0 in favor of Fresno 43 seconds into the second quarter, but the Bruins got on a roll after that, outgaining the Bulldogs 122-30 for the remainder of the half and scoring 14 unanswered points to get back into the game.

UCLA broke through and put its first points on the board at the 9:44 mark of the second quarter. Moments after Thompson-Robinson found junior wide receiver Theo Howard for a 6-yard completion to convert on fourth-and-3, the duo connected on a big downfield pass, with How

ard shaking his defender and finding himself wide open for a 45-yard touchdown reception.

Howard ended the night as UCLA's top receiver, totaling 80 yards on four catches.

Howard's score was set up by a clutch defensive play in the previous possession, as UCLA linebacker Keisean Lucier-South was able to get to McMaryion unobstructed on a rush, batting the ball out of his hand for a fumble that was ultimately recovered by UCLA linebacker Odua Isibor.

Less than a minute into the second half, FSU's KeeSean Johnson muffed a punt deep in his own territory, allowing the Bruins to take over with an extremely short field. Senior running back Bolu Olorunfunmi capitalized on that field position, punching it in from two yards out for his fourth rushing touchdown of the campaign and cutting the deficit to two.

That was ultimately as close as the Bruins would get, as Fresno State responded with 22 unanswered points to cement the result. McMaryion passed for 147 yards on seven completions in the second half and rushed for another two touchdowns to lead the Bulldogs.

UCLA's Stefan Flintoft uncorked a 70-yard punt in the second quarter, the Bruins' longest punt since the 2011 season.

## GAME FOUR: Colorado 38, UCLA 16

### Sept. 28 - Boulder, Colo.

BOULDER, COLO. - UCLA went toe-to-toe with unbeaten Colorado for two and a half quarters, taking a 16-14 lead halfway through the third quarter before the Buffaloes ran off 24 unanswered points to defeat the Bruins, 38-16.

The Bruins were led by redshirt junior running back Joshua Kelley, who had a breakthrough performance with 124 yards rushing, a team season-high. Kicker JJ Molson made three of three field goals, including a career-long 50-yarder.

Colorado receiver Lavis Shenault caught a touchdown pass and rushed for another, accumulating 144 yards of total offense, including 126 rushing yards. Buffaloes quarterback Steven Montez rushed for two touchdowns and completed 22 of 26 passes for 237 yards and one touchdown.

UCLA (0-4, 0-1 in the Pac-12) struck first in its second series of the game, which started at the Colorado 47 after a 32-yard punt return by Kyle Phillips. A Dorian Thompson-Robinson 17-yard run followed by a 15-yard late hit penalty brought the Bruins up to the 18, and on third and goal on the 11, Michael Ezeike caught a Thompson-Robinson pass in the corner of the end zone to give the Bruins a 7-0 lead.

Colorado (4-0, 1-0 in the Pac-12) answered quickly, tying it up a minute and a half later on a 57-yard touchdown pass from Montez to Shenault. The Bruins drove to the Colorado four on the next drive thanks in part to a 29-yard run by Kelley but could not get into the end zone, settling for a 21-yard field goal by Molson to go up 10-7 with 57 seconds left in the quarter.

The Buffaloes gained the lead for the first time, 14-10, with 6:13 to play in the second quarter after a 12-play drive resulted in a 10-yard touchdown run by Montez. UCLA cut the lead to one on Molson's 50-yard field goal just before halftime.

Molson hit another field goal, a 40-yarder, on the Bruins' first drive of the third quarter to regain the lead, 16-14, but Colorado scored 24 unanswered points to finish off the Bruins.

"There are some good things that we can improve upon but the penalties are hurting us, and we can't live with those if we are expecting to beat a really good football team," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "That is what Colorado is right now; Mike (McIntyre) has done such a nice job here. We have to continue to improve, we got knocked down, but we aren't going to stay down, we are going to get back up and get ready for our next opponent."

UCLA is back in action on Saturday, Oct. 6 against No. 11 Washington at the Rose Bowl. Kickoff will be at either 4:30 or 7:30 pm.

## GAME FIVE: Washington 31, UCLA 24

### Oct. 6 - Rose Bowl



LOS ANGELES – The UCLA football team shook off a 17-point halftime deficit and hung around until the very end of the game, but ultimately fell 31-24 to No. 10 Washington on Saturday evening at the Rose Bowl.

UCLA scored a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter, cutting the deficit to seven each time, but ultimately couldn't knot the scoreline. Washington was led by running back Myles Gaskin's 116 yards and two touchdowns.

"We knew it was gonna be tough sledding against a really tough front," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "They've held some really good teams down, that's why they're the No. 1 defense in the country. I thought we did a really good job of competing, especially in the second half where we had a pair of lengthy drives, but we just fell a little bit short."

UCLA was led on offense by running back Joshua Kelley - who recorded career-highs in both rushing (125) and receiving (39) yards while becoming the first Bruin since Paul Perkins in 2015 to net 100+ rushing yards in back-to-back games - and tight end Caleb Wilson, who reached 100 yards receiving for the first time this season (102) while making eight catches to double his previous season-high in receptions.

Freshman quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson, making his fourth straight start, completed 27 of 38 passes for 272 yards. He threw for a pair of scoring touchdowns and was intercepted once.

Safety Adarius Pickett was the leader on the defensive side of the ball, notching a season-high 16 tackles, his fourth double-digit tackle performance of the year. He also intercepted Washington QB Jake Browning in the first quarter. Junior inside linebacker Krys Barnes had a big performance as well, making nine tackles including a career-high three for a loss.

Using their longest drive of the year - in duration, yardage, and time used - the Bruins made it a 24-17 game early on in the fourth quarter.

That drive started on the UCLA 10, but the Bruins steadily made their way up the field, converting on four consecutive third downs before Caleb Wilson contributed three big catches to find the end zone. His first, a 29-yard completion, got the Bruins from the 50-yard line to the edge of the red zone at the Washington 21. Another 11-yard catch from Wilson set up first and goal for UCLA, which converted three plays later - and after the third quarter ended - with a nine-yard catch-and-run from Wilson, who made a grab in the flat, spun off a tackle, and then extended as he was being dragged down at the goal line, just getting the ball over the plane of the end zone for the score. Ultimately, the drive went for 90 yards on 17 plays and took up 6:01 of game time.

However, that was as close as the Bruins would get to tying the game, as Gaskin would find the end zone again with 3:42 on the clock to record the game-winning score.

UCLA made it interesting, driving 75 yards in just over two minutes and finding the end zone on a two-yard Kelley scamper to cut the deficit to seven again with 1:38 remaining, but Washington held on to the ball for the duration of the contest and prevented the Bruins from getting another crack at the end zone.

UCLA ate up over five minutes of the clock in their first drive of the second half, with Kelley rushing five times for 26 yards to put UCLA in field goal range for JJ Molson, who knocked down a 49-yard attempt to make it a two-possession game at 24-10.

Washington opened up a 24-7 lead at halftime thanks to a pair of touchdowns from quarterback Jake Browning - one in the air and one on the ground - and another score from Gaskin.

The Huskies opened the scoring at the 1:37 mark of the first quarter, as Browning hit receiver Aaron Fuller down the right sideline for a 25-yard

touchdown grab.

On the ensuing UCLA drive, Kelley had his longest rush of the day, taking a handoff out of the shotgun and scurrying up the gut for 39 yards, his second-longest rush as a Bruin.

After Browning and Fuller connected again for a 46-yard catch on Washington's first drive of the second half, a strong red zone defensive effort prevented the visitors from doubling their lead. Krys Barnes made the critical play of that stop, dropping Browning for a nine-yard loss and his first career sack to set up 3rd-and-20 for the Huskies, who had to settle for a field goal.

UCLA followed with its crispest offensive drive of the night, needing just seven plays to drive 75 yards for a touchdown. Thompson-Robinson completed four consecutive passes, and five overall, as part of the drive, capping off the possession by finding Theo Howard all alone the right side of the end zone for a touchdown. Big plays during the drive included a 20-yard grab from Wilson on the opening play and a 22-yard completion to Kelley that moved the ball to the Washington 29.

The Huskies went on to add a pair of one-yard rushing touchdowns later in the second, first with Gaskins taking a direct snap running it in before Browning punched it in on their next possession. Gaskins narrowly missed out on a second consecutive touchdown on the latter drive, rushing for 17 yards and diving for the pylon but being ruled out at the 1.
