The last Bruin series win came in Rose Bowl in 2008

BRUINS HOST CARDINAL ON SENIOR DAY — UCLA (3-8, 3-5) will meet Stanford (6-4, 4-3) on Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl for a Pac-12 Conference matchup on Saturday, Nov. 24 at Noon PT. The game will be televised by the Pac-12 Network. The Bruin IMG Radio Network will broadcast the contest, which will also be aired over Sirius/XM, 97.3 FM THE FAN, uclabruins.com, tunein.com and TuneIn App. The Cardinal have won the last 10 meetings in the series (0-6 at Stanford and 0-4 at UCLA). The Bruins had captured the previous five meetings in the series.

Last season at Stanford, both teams racked up over 500 yards of offense, but the Cardinal prevailed on the scoreboard 58-34. Josh Rosen passed for 480 yards while Caleb Wilson was on the receiving end of 145 yards worth. Stanford led 23-13 at the half. UCLA cut the deficit to 23-20 early in the third quarter only to see the Cardinal answer with two straight TD drives. UCLA responded with a Rosen scoring pass to Jordan Lasley to make it a 10-point game (37-27) heading to the fourth quarter before the Cardinal put it away.

In the 2016 meeting played at Stanford, the Cardinal moved to a 35-17 halftime lead and used 369 all-purpose yards from Christian McCaffrey to post a 56-35 win. The Bruins put up 506 yards of total offense. Josh Rosen completed 22 of 42 attempts for 325 yards and three touchdowns, including a 70-yard scoring strike to Darren Andrews. Kenny Young had 13 tackles.

UCLA's last win in the series came by a score of 23-20 in a 2008 Homecoming game in the Rose Bowl. Quarterback Kevin Craft completed six straight passing attempts during an 11-play scoring drive which culminated on a 7-yard toss to tight end Cory Harkey with 10 seconds to play.

In 2005, UCLA made one of its greatest comebacks in school history at Stanford after rallying from a 21-point deficit (3-24) in the fourth quarter for an overtime win. When the Cardinal converted a UCLA fumble into a touchdown, it led 24-3 with just 8:26 remaining in the game. The Bruins answered with a 65-yard scoring drive, capped off by a scoring run by Maurice Jones-Drew. The Bruin defense forced a three-and-out, and then quarterback Drew Olson drove the team 72 yards, hitting Joe Cowan for a 31-yard touchdown to make it 24-17 with 4:43 to go. The Bruin defense stiffened and following a Cardinal punt UCLA took over on its own 34-yard line with 2:30 on the clock. Olson moved the team down the field with the help of two pass interference calls. On fourth-and-one, Olson hit Cowan at the one-yard line for a first down, and Jones-Drew took it in from there with 46 seconds to play. Iln overtime, Stanford kicked a field goal. On the second play of UCLA's possession, Olson connected with Brandon Breazell in the corner of the end zone from 23-yards out for the win.

First-year head coach Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly compiled a 46-7 record in four seasons as the head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12), including a 2-2 record vs. Stanford. During that span, his Duck teams captured first place or a share of first in the North Division of the conference (three outright conference championships 2009-11) and four BCS bowl games. Kelly guided Oregon to appearances in a National Championship Game (2010), two Rose Bowls (after 2011 and 2009 seasons) and the Fiesta Bowl following the 2012 season. He also has served as the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016) and the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15).

### THE WATCH LIST—

- UCLA has generated over 400 yards of total offense in five of the past seven games...The Bruins are averaging 419.3 yards of total offense in the last 7 games, after averaging 312.0 yards per game in first four contests of season ... UCLA racked up 479 yards of total offense, including a season-best 313 rushing yards vs. USC .... The Bruins put up a season-high of 335 yards passing and 439 total yards two weeks ago at ASU. Wilton Speight's 335 yards passing at ASU were the most by a Bruin since Josh Rosen threw for 421 last season vs. USC. The previous week, UCLA had rung up a season-best 496 yards of offense at Oregon (199 rush, 297 pass). UCLA's team rushing average is up to 163.3 per game this season from 113.4 per 2017 game.
- RB Joshua Kelley, a transfer from UC Davis, has rushed for a touchdown in each of the last 7 games the last Bruin to tally a rushing TD in 7 straight was Skip Hicks who had rushing TDs in 14 straight games over two seasons [last 8 in 1996 and first 6 in 1997]) ... Kelley has 1,188 yards rushing which is 11th on the Bruin single-season list and just 40 shy of 10th place -- Paul Perkins was the last Bruin 1,000-yard rusher (1,343 in 2015)... Kelley has six 100-yard rushing games in 2018, the most since Perkins had six in 2014...Johnathan Franklin set a school mark with nine 100-yard games in 2012...In the fourth quarter vs. USC. Kelley ran 12 times for 104 yards. His 40 carries vs. USC ties for most by P12 back in '18. Kelley produced a career-high six receptions at Oregon, the fifth time he's grabbed at least three passes in a game in '18 ... Kelley ranks third in P12 in all-purpose yards per game (136.7).
- UCLA has played 20 true freshmen this season to set a new school record the old mark was 18 in 2013...True freshmen played: 2018: 20, 2017: 8, 2016: 11, 2015: 10, 2014: 9, 2013: 18, 2012:12 --- RB Kazmeir Allen, RB Martell Irby, QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson, WR Kyle Philips, QL Christaphany Murray, WR Chase Cota, DL Atonio Mafi, DL Tyler Manoa, DB Stephan Blaylock, DB Rayshad Williams, DL Otito Ogbonnia and DB Elisha Guidry saw action vs. Cincinnati. WR Michael Ezeike at Oklahoma;. WR Delon Hurt and LB Bo Calvert vs. Fresno State. LB Elijah Wade saw his first action at Colorado. DB Alex Johnson saw action at Oregon ... WR Greg Dulcich, TE David Priebe and OL Alec Anderson played at ASU.
- UCLA is plus-eight in turnovers in its three wins (5 Cal-0 UCLA turnovers/3-Arizona-1 UCLA/2-USC UCLA-1) ... UCLA is -6 in turnover margin in losses (Oppt. 7, UCLA 13 turnovers) ... Bruins are T3rd in P12 in turnover margin (0.18) ... The five turnovers at Cal equal most in a game since 2013 (6 at Utah).
- WR Theo Howard has caught a pass in each of his last 27 straight games. With 114 catches, Howard moved up to 17th on the school career receptions list vs. USC ... Against Utah, he became the 25th 100-catch receiver in UCLA history...He hauled in a season-best total of nine catches vs. UW and went over 1.000-vards for his career vs. Arizona.

- The last four games USC (8/12), at ASU (10/10), at Oregon (12/14) and versus Utah (11/11), the Bruins have begun possessions <u>at or inside</u> their own 25-yard line 41 of 47 times (87%)...In the win at Cal, UCLA started a season-high seven of 13 drives (54%) <u>beyond</u> its 25 ... Through the first five games, UCLA started just 11 of its 63 possessions (17%) beyond its own 25 ... The average UCLA starting field position this season is as follows: Cincinnati U26, Okla. U24, Fresno U29, Colorado U 25, UW U21, Cal U33, Ariz. U23, Utah U24, Oregon U25, ASU U23, UCLA U28. Opponents have started: Cincinnati C36, Okla. O35, Fresno F33, Colorado C26, UW W28, Cal C27, Ariz A32, Utah Ut40, Oregon O36, ASU A25, USC SC20.
- UCLA has coverted 46 of its last 105 third down attempts (44%) in the last 7 games (including a season-best 57% vs. UW --8/14/ and 7/13 vs. USC 54%) ... In the first four contests, the Bruins had converted 17 of 56 third down attempts (30%).
- The Bruin defense gave up an average of 344.5 (5.8 per carry) rushing yds/g last season compared to 206.1/g (4.6) this season. It held USC without a touchdown in the second half last week, the first time a Bruin defense has accomplished that since Game 7 of 2017 season vs. Oregon.
- The Bruins non-conference opponents this season currently own a 28-5 record (85%) [Cincinnati (9-2), Oklahoma (10-1), Fresno St. (9-2)], whereas all teams the Bruins have lost to own a record of 62-26 (71%) [adding in ASU (6-5), Utah (8-3), Colorado (5-6), Washington (8-3), Oregon (7-4)].
- LB Keisean Lucier-South is T5th in the league in tackles for loss/g (1.05) and rates T-14th in the P12 in sacks (0.36/g) ... At Cal, he had a forced fumble, a recovered fumble, which he returned for a touchdown, and an interception to go along with 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sacks.
- Boss Tagaloa, who had started 8 games on the defensive line, made his first career start on offense at center in game 4 at Colorado and has started the
  last 8 (after 3 game suspension) -- the Bruins who averaged 3.5 yards per carry through first three games (392/112 carries), have rushed for 4.6 yards
  per carry mark in last seven (1,380/302) helping produce six 100-yard games by Joshua Kelley, including 1,161 of his season total of 1,188 yards.
- Stefan Flintoft ranks 2nd in P12 (7th in NCAA) in punting average (45.8) and has the most punts of any league performer measuring 50-plus yards this season (18). Since 1957, only 3 Bruin punters (2010 Jeff Locke-45.8, 2008 Aaron Perez-45.2, 1989 Kirk Maggio-45.2) own season averages of more than 45.0 yards.
- Kicker JJ Molson is eighth on all-time Bruin made field goal list (41) ... He has converted 20 of last 25 FGAs over the last two seasons (misses from 44, 56, 52, 47 this season/47 last season) ... Molson is 12th on all-time school career scoring list (230 pts); has 32 touchbacks on his 52 kickoff attempts in 2018.
- Dorian Thompson-Robinson's 13-15 (87%) performance at Cal rates as the third-highest by a Bruin QB since 1980 (Rick Neuheisel:1983 25-27 for .926
   v. Washington / Josh Rosen: 2017 22-25 for .888 vs. Hawaii) with at least 15 passing attempts.
- Darnay Holmes picked off his 6th career pass vs. USC ... He tied his career-best with 7 tackles vs. Fresno State ... He registered his second career return for a touchdown at ASU this season (also Hawai'i 2017). He ranks 6th in P12 in passes defended (0.91) this season and leads the team with 10.
- Christaphany Murray became the first true freshman to start an opener at center for the Bruins since at least 1982 (complete records date to '82) ... the last true freshman to start along the offensive line for the Bruins was Najee Toran (guard) in the 2014 opener at Virginia. All five Bruin offensive line starters are either in their first year starting at UCLA (C/G-Murray, RG/RT Justin Murphy, RT Jake Burton) or have switched position sides of the ball from last year (now LT Andre James, now LG Michael Alves each started on the right side last season).
- True freshman receiver Michael Ezeike, who made his first career start at Cal, caught his second scoring pass of the season at Colorado (the school season record for true freshmen is three, held by Thomas Duarte-2013 and Raymond Burks-1973).
- The Bruins are 11-21 for season on fourth down this season -- Coach Kelly's teams at UO converted on 71/118 (.602) 4th down attempts: 15/22 (.682) in 2009, 22/34 (.647) in 2010, 14/31 (.452) in 2011, 20/31(.645) in 2012.

- The Bruins roster includes 52 freshmen (36 true/16 redshirt), seven seniors, plus two grad transfers. Thirty-seven players (out of 77 overall players who have seen action in 2018-47%) have seen their first game action as Bruins this season.
- The longest starting streak belongs to OL Andre James who has opened the last 31 games, OG Michael Alves is next with 24, followed by S Adarius Pickett at 21.
   Dorian Thompson-Robinson became the 8th Bruin true freshman to start a game at quarterback at Oklahoma and the fourth to open up in a road contest.
- 10 players made their first career starts (6 off., 4 def.) as Bruins in the season-opener vs. Cincinnati ... First career starts as Bruins in 2018 vs. Cincinnati: OT Jake Burton, OG Justin Murphy, C Christaphany Murray, QB Wilton Speight, RB Joshua Kelley, WR Dymond Lee; DL Atonio Mafi, DL Martin Andrus Jr., LB Tyree Thompson, S Quentin Lake (in addition OG Michael Alves and OT Andre James switched from right side to left side starters in the opener)...DL Otito Ogbonnia made first start vs. Oklahoma ... OLB Odua Isibor vs. Fresno State ... TE Devin Asiasi at Colorado (Boss Tagaloa started first game at center, as Murray shifted to right guard) ... DL Osa Odighizuwa made first start vs. UW ... - The 74-yard scoring run by Kazmeir Allen vs. Cincinnati was the third longest by a Bruin true freshman ... Maurice Jones-Drew recorded the top mark with an 83-yard jaunt vs. Arizona State in 2003. Allen's total of 103 yards rushing rates second behind the 120-yard debut effort by Myles Jack in 2013 game at Arizona.
- 23 Bruin position players from the 2015, 2016 and 2017 teams have gone on to be listed on opening day NFL rosters (active, reserve list, practice squad) in 2018, including 7 0-linemen, 6 D-linemen, 6 D-lineme
- WR Christian Pabico's 99-receiving yards effort vs. Oregon in '17 was most productive game by Bruin walk-on receiver since Danny Farmer (148 in 1999 vs. ASU).
- The Bruins have played in a bowl game in 13 of the previous 16 seasons (not after 2008, 2010, 2016 seasons).
- Including this season's win at Cal, UCLA has won 30 straight overall games and 49 straight regular season games in which it has held the opponent to less than 20 points (last loss 17-16 to BYU in 2007 Las Vegas Bowl / last regular season loss 16-14 at Colorado 2003).

### HONORARY CAPTAIN

Dick Vermeil will be Saturday's Honorary Captain. Vermeil served as head coach of the Bruins for two seasons (1974-75) and compiled a 15–5–3 record, including a 9–2–1 ledger in 1975 when he led the Bruins to their first conference championship in 10 years, and a win in the Rose Bowl over an undefeated and No.1-ranked Ohio State team. He was inducted into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2014. Vermeil went on to serve as head coach in the NFL for the Philadelphia Eagles, St. Louis Rams and Kansas City Chiefs. He led both the Rams (win-Super Bowl XXXIV) and the Eagles (loss-Super Bowl XV) to the Super Bowl.

### **FAMILY TIES**

Brothers Lokeni (junior born in 12/97) and Leni Toailoa (redshirt sophomore born in 10/98) are linebackers for the Bruins...Osa Odighizuwa's brother, Owa, played football at UCLA (2010-14) ... Safety Quentin Lake is following in the footsteps of his mom (Monica) and dad (Carnell) who each attended UCLA. Carnell played linebacker at UCLA from 1985-88 and went on to earn All-Pro honors in the NFL... Punter Stefan Flintoft's cousin Collin (also a punter) joined the team this season ... Long snapper Johnny Den Bleyker's brother Alex, was the long snapper at Washington State (2011-2014)... WR Chase Cota's dad, Chad, played at Oregon and then in the NFL from 1995-2002 with the Panthers, Colts, Rams and Saints ... DB Elisha Guidry's brother, Javelin, plays defensive back at UCLA (1994-97) as did his uncle, Paul, who played defensive back at UCLA from 1993-96.

### Media Seating

A press pass enables entrance to the Press Box or Field (if photographer). The Press Box entrance is located on the west side of the Rose Bowl where media will pass through security and take the elevators to the Press level (F). For photographers, a workroom is centrally located under the South stands which features seating, tables, food, beverage, power and internet connectivity.

### Postgame Procedure

The head coach and select players will be available to the media in the Rose Bowl media room (designated interview space on road) following a cooling off period. UCLA's locker room is closed to the media. The Rose Bowl media room is centrally located under the South stands. The room can be accessed by walking off the field through the visitor's tunnel. The head coach's post-game availability will be aired over press box television monitors. There are no interviews on the field after a home or road game.

### **UCLA HEAD COACH CHIP KELLY**



Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly holds 27 seasons of coaching experience at both the professional and collegiate levels, most recently serving as head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016). He also served as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15) following four seasons as head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12) where he posted a record of 46-7.

Kelly's lone season in San Francisco saw the 49ers improve from the league's 21st-ranked rushing attack in 2015 (1,544 yards) to the 4th-best ground game in 2016 (2,019 yards). Running back Carlos Hyde was the biggest beneficiary of the improvement, gaining 988 yards in just 13 contests (76.0 yards per game).

Over Kelly's three seasons in Philadelphia, the Eagles ranked third in the NFL in points per game (26.9) and total offense (392.8 yards per game), as well as fourth in rushing yards per game (131.3). Sixteen Pro Bowlers were selected from his teams, including eight in 2014. The Eagles won 10 games in each of his first two seasons, as his

2014 offense scored a franchise-record 474 points to surpass his 2013 team's previous-record total of 442.

The Eagles showed a marked improvement in Year 1 under Kelly, as their 10 wins followed a four-win 2012. He became just the second head coach in league history to win a division title in his first season in the NFL, as the Eagles captured an NFC East Division Championship. He was also named the Maxwell Club NFL Coach of the Year.

Kelly began his head coaching career at the University of Oregon in 2009, leading the Ducks to a 10-3 record and a trip to the Rose KELLY'S COACHING HISTORY Bowl. He finished his time at Oregon with a overall record of 46-7 as head coach (2009-12), including a 33-3 mark in conference play. In his four seasons in Eugene, the Ducks averaged 44.7 points per game. Kelly became the first coach in school history to guide the program to three consecutive undisputed conference championships (2009-11) and its first three 12-win seasons (2010-12).

Oregon made an appearance in a BCS Bowl game in each of Kelly's four seasons, including a trip to the National Championship game following the 2010 campaign. Kelly was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons in 2009 and 2010, and Associated Press Coach of the Year in 2010.

The 2012 Ducks finished second in the nation in scoring (49.6 points per game) and fifth in total offense (537.4 yards per game) with freshman guarterback Marcus Mariota under center. They would conclude the season with a Fiesta Bowl victory over Kansas State. A January bowl game was also the end result for Oregon the year prior, as the Ducks defeated Wisconsin in a Rose Bowl thriller, 45-38. Kelly's offense notched Top-5 finishes in points per game (46.1, third) and total offense (522.8 yards per game, fourth)

In 2010, the Ducks led the nation both points per game (46.1) and total yardage (530.7 per game) en route to a BCS National Championship Game appearance. In addition to his Pac-10 Coach of the Year and Associated Press Coach of the Year awards. Kelly garnered Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, Walter Camp Coach of the Year, The Sporting News Coach of the Year and American Kelly's Head Coaching Record Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year accolades.

Kelly's first season as a head coach (2009) culminated in a Rose Bowl appearance and the Pac-10 Coach of the Year award, as his offense ranked sixth in the country in both points per game (36.1) and rushing yards per game (231.7). He was promoted to the top spot after his offenses led the Pac-10 in a number of categories during his two seasons (2007-08) as offensive coordinator under Mike Rellotti

Kelly had spent the previous 13 years at his alma mater, the University of New Hampshire, before being named offensive coordinator at Oregon. As offensive coordinator at UNH, Kelly protégée Ricky Professional Santos earned the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding player in FCS in 2006. The guarterback previously finished second in 2005. Kelly also coached the Wildcats' offensive line (1997, 1998) and running backs (1992, 1994-96). The New Hampshire offense averaged better than 400 yards of total offense per game in seven of his eight seasons on staff.

He moved to outside linebackers and safeties in 1991 before his first stint at UNH as running backs coach in 1992. He also spent one season at Johns Hopkins University as defensive coordinator in 1993.

The 2018 season is UCLA's 22nd season with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the 12th year for the Bruins to be aired on AM 570 LA Sports (or am 1150 KTLK) in Southern California (97.3 FM The Fan in San Diego). The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder. The broadcast includes a pre- and post-game show. The Bruins' football pregame show will run 90 minutes, while the postgame show will be one hour.

Josh Lewin returns as the voice of the Bruins for a third season. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 22nd year on the broadcast team and his 18th as the analyst in the booth. Another Bruin signal caller, Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 17th season as the sideline reporter.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks. The hour-long Bruin Insider Show returns to the Plateia Restaurant inside the Luskin Conference Center. Each week, it will stream live online on Tuesdays at ucla.leanplayer.com at 5:00 p.m. PT, and air on the radio on either AM 570 or AM 1150, most often at 7:00 p.m. PT.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Partner of UCLA Athletics. Games can also be heard via the internet at uclabruins.com and on tunein.com and the Tuneln App.

### **Bruins on Television**

Following the USC game, 185 of UCLA's last 186 games have been televised live, including 118 in a row. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was on delayed).

# SPIEKER FIELD AT THE ROSE BOWL - HOME OF BRUIN FOOTBALL

The nation's most famous college football stadium — The Rose Bowl — isnow in its 37th season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark. Thanks to a generous donation in 2017 from prominent UCLA alum Tod Spieker and his family, the playing surface will be called Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl for at least the next 25 years.

The Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls — XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2018 and Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. In 2014, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Taylor Swift, Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium is in the process of completing the final touches on a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Grandaddy of Them All"



for the Rose Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and exits, and additional concession stands and restroom facilities.

Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area were included in the upgrades. In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity

to 76,000. Further enlargements took place in 1932 (83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans witnessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest. With the current seating configuration for home games, the capacity is 80,616 for general admission contests and 88,565 for reserved ticket games.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79,156.

The Bruins set a school mark when their 20th true freshman of the season played at ASU. The following 12 players saw action in the 2018 season opener vs. Cincinnati -- WR Kyle Philips, DB Stephan Blaylock, DB Rayshad Williams, QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson, RB Kazmeir Allen, RB Martell Irby, WR Chase Cota, DL Tyler Manoa, DL Atonio Mafi, C Christaphany Murray, DB Elisha Guidry, DL Otito Ogbonnia. WR Michael Ezeike saw his first action at Oklahoma. LB Bo Calvert and WR Delon Hurt saw action vs. Fresno State. LB Elijah Wade played for the first time at Colorado. DB Alex Johnson hit the field at Oregon. WR Greg Dulcich, OL Alec Anderson and TE David Priebe were in action at ASU.

Three true freshmen saw action in the 2017 opener against Texas A&M in the Rose Bowl --- DL Jaelan Phillips, DB Darnay Holmes, DB Mo Osling III. DL Martin Andrus saw action vs. Hawai'i and DB Quentin Lake saw his first action against Colorado and Moses Robinso-Carr took the field for the first time at Arizona. Greg Rogers (no longer on team) came in against Oregon and Rahyme Johnson at Washington.

A total of 11 Bruin true freshmen saw action in 2016 - LB Krys Barnes, DB Brandon Burton, LS Johnny Den Bleyker, WR Ethan Fernea, WR Theo Howard, P Austin Kent, K JJ Molson, RB Jalen Starks, RB Brandon Stephens, DL Boss Tagaloa, LB Lokeni Toailoa.

Eight true freshmen played in the 2016 opener at Texas A&M - Tagaloa, Molson, Den Bleyker, Kent, B. Burton, Lok. Toailoa, Fernea, Stephens. Starks, Barnes and Howard saw their first action against UNLV.

The Bruins played a total of 10 true freshmen in 2015. Five saw action in the 2015 season-opener against Virginia. Nine true frosh took the field in the 2014 season, seven in that season's opener at UVa.

The Bruins established a then school mark in 2013 when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action that season. A school record fifteen true freshman saw action that season in the opener against Nevada along with eight redshirt freshmen. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012, eight in the opener at Rice. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen.

UCLA started a true freshman quarterback (Josh Rosen) in the season opener of 2015 for the first time in school history. In 2017, DL Jaelan Phillips and DB Darnay Holmes became the first true freshmen defensive tandem to start an opener.

### **NON-SATURDAY REGULAR SEASON GAMES**

UCLA tangled with Colorado (road loss) and Utah (home loss) in a pair of Friday night affairs this season. The Bruins had games in 2017 on Sunday (win over Texas A&M) and Friday (loss at Utah, home win vs. Cal). The game vs. A&M was the first college game played on a Sunday in the Rose Bowl.

In 2016, UCLA played a Thursday night affair on Nov. 3 at the University of Colorado (loss). In the 2015 season, in back-to-back weeks, the Bruins took the field on Thursday night at Stanford (loss) and in the Rose Bowl versus California (win). In 2014, on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins.

In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had previously played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday had been against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.

In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona (L) on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games -Oct. 21 at Oregon (Thur.), Nov. 18 at Washington (Thur.) and Nov. 26 at Arizona State (Fri.).

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

### **2018 GAME RECAPS**

### **GAME ONE: Cincinnati 26, UCLA 17**



### Sept. 1 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. – A fourth quarter safety proved decisive in Saturday's football season opener, as UCLA was topped 26-17 by visiting Cincinnati at the Rose Bowl.

Tied 17-17 with less than 10 minutes to go in the fourth quarter, the Bearcats made the pivotal play of the game by stripping the ball from UCLA quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson around the

five yard line. After a couple bounces, the ball was recovered in the Bruin end zone for a safety, giving Cincinnati a decisive edge.

The visitors added on seven insurance points at the 1:44 mark, as running back Michael Warren II converted on fourth and goal for his third score of the day.

"These guys [now] have a game underneath their belt," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "We can go back and teach and show them what we did well. We can continue to build from there, and then what we need to correct. That will be an ongoing process for this group. There were a lot of firsts for everybody."

Thompson-Robinson finished the game as UCLA's top passer, completing 15 of 25 passes for 117 yards. Starting quarterback Wilton Speight was forced out of the game in the second quarter after taking a hard hit while scrambling to the left of the pocket.

Junior wide receiver Theo Howard finished as the Bruins' top pass catcher, totaling five receptions and 52 yards.

UCLA took a 10-0 lead by the end of the first quarter thanks in part to an impressive showing on the defensive side of the ball.

UCLA limited the Bearcats offense to just 21 yards over its first three drives, knocking starting quarterback Hayden Moore out of the game.

Junior defensive lineman Rick Wade made the play of the opening quarter for the Bruins, sacking Moore on the first play of Cincinnati's second drive and knocking the ball loose for a fumble that allowed UCLA to take over on the Bearcats' 13 yard line.

Senior running back Bolu Olorunfunmi took advantage of that short field and found pay dirt for the Bruins, first rushing for four yards to put the home team into a first and goal situation, then punching it in with a one yard run up the middle.

UCLA extended its lead to 10-0 on its final drive of the first quarter. Taking over after a three-and-out at their own 45, the Bruins pushed the ball up 25 yards to set up a long field goal for junior kicker JJ Molson, who knocked down the 47-yard attempt for the second longest conversion of his career (previous: 49 yards).

Cincinnati found its offensive rhythm in the second quarter, putting 17 unanswered points on the board to take the lead heading into halftime. After mustering just 25 yards in the air and 11 on the ground in the first quarter, Desmond Ridder took over at quarterback and went 5-7 for 48 yards while running back Michael Warren II carried 10 times for 49 yards including a pair of one yard touchdown runs. Warren II ended the contest with 141 rushing yards on 35 carries.

Just over a minute into the second half, UCLA freshman running back Kazmeir Allen took a handoff out of the shotgun formation, rushed to his right then found a hole and busted loose for a 74-yard touchdown run that tied it up at 17-17. The sprint was UCLA's longest rush from scrimmage since Paul Perkins on Oct. 31, 2015 (vs. Colorado, 82 yards).

Paired with a first quarter rush that went for 23 yards, Allen ended the day with 103 yards on five carries, giving him the second-most debut rushing yards by a freshman in school history.

The Bruin defense returned to its early-game form in the third quarter, forcing punts on all four Cincinnati drives and holding the Bearcats to just 54 yards.

### GAME TWO: Oklahoma 49, UCLA 21



### Sept. 8 - Norman, Okla.

NORMAN, OKLA. - UCLA ran into a voracious Oklahoma defense that recorded six sacks and 12 tackles for loss in a 49-21 Sooner win at Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

The Bruin defense allowed just 179 yards rushing themselves, but the Sooners took advantage of nearly 200 return yards that gave them favorable field position.

UCLA running back Bolu Olorunfunmi rushed for two touchdowns, tight end Caleb Wilson had four catches for 92 yards, and freshman quarter-back Dorian Thompson-Robinson threw for 254 yards and a touchdown for the Bruins. Oklahoma quarterback Kyler Murray threw three touchdowns and rushed for two more while throwing for 306 yards and rushing for 62. Bruin safety Adarius Pickett led all players with 12 tackles.

The Bruins (0-2) struck first, using a big 65-yard reception from Wilson to set up an Olorunfunmi three-yard rushing touchdown that gave UCLA a 7-0 lead.

The No. 6/5 Sooners (2-0) answered right back thanks to an 86-yard kickoff return by Tre Brown that started the Sooner drive at the 12. Three plays later, Rodney Anderson ran it in for a three-yard touchdown

After the Sooner defense forced a three-and-out, Murray hit Marquise Brown for a 58-yard touchdown pass on third and 14, giving Oklahoma the lead, 14-7, with 3:17 to play in the first. Murray increased Oklahoma's lead to 21-7 at the start of the second quarter on a 10-yard touchdown run.

The Bruins gained some momentum at the end of the second quarter when Osa Odighizuwa stopped Trey Sermon for a two-yard loss on fourth and one at the UCLA 23, allowing UCLA to go into halftime down by just 14. But Oklahoma ran off 21-straight points in the second half to take a 42-7 lead before the Bruins got back on the board with an Olorunfunmi two-yard touchdown run with 11:11 to play in the game. Thompson-Robinson added a nine-yard touchdown pass to Michael Ezeike late in the fourth, the first collegiate touchdown for each freshman. The freshman quarterback completed 8 of 10 passing attempts in the fourth quarter for 129 yards.

### **GAME THREE: Fresno St. 38, UCLA 14**



### Sept. 15 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. – Quarterback Marcus McMaryion rushed for four touchdowns and passed for 270 yards to lead Fresno State to a 38-14 win over UCLA on Saturday night at the Rose Bowl.

UCLA (0-3) trailed 16-14 in the second half before the visiting Bulldogs (2-1) surged with 22 unanswered points to close out the contest.

Freshman quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson led the Bruins in both passing (151 yards) and rushing (49 yards). Senior safety Adarius Pickett led the defense with 13 tackles.

Fresno State's offense came out firing in the first quarter, finding the end zone twice on two consecutive lengthy drives to start the game. McMaryion capped off the Bulldogs opening drive with a one-yard touchdown run, finishing off the 13-play, almost five minute drive. On FSU's next possession, McMaryion connected with tight end Jared Rice for a 47-yard completion, setting up tight end Kyle Riddering's 10-yard touchdown catch moments later.

A 28-yard field goal from Asa Fuller made it 16-0 in favor of Fresno 43 seconds into the second quarter, but the Bruins got on a roll after that, outgaining the Bulldogs 122-30 for the remainder of the half and scoring 14 unanswered points to get back into the game.

UCLA broke through and put its first points on the board at the 9:44 mark of the second quarter. Moments after Thompson-Robinson found junior wide receiver Theo Howard for a 6-yard completion to convert on fourth-and-3, the duo connected on a big downfield pass, with How

ard shaking his defender and finding himself wide open for a 45-yard touchdown reception.

Howard ended the night as UCLA's top receiver, totaling 80 yards on four catches.

Howard's score was set up by a clutch defensive play in the previous possession, as UCLA linebacker Keisean Lucier-South was able to get to McMaryion unobstructed on a rush, batting the ball out of his hand for a fumble that was ultimately recovered by UCLA linebacker Odua Isihor

Less than a minute into the second half, FSU's KeeSean Johnson muffed a punt deep in his own territory, allowing the Bruins to take over with an extremely short field. Senior running back Bolu Olorunfunmi capitalized on that field position, punching it in from two yards out for his fourth rushing touchdown of the campaign and cutting the deficit to two.

That was ultimately as close as the Bruins would get, as Fresno State responded with 22 unanswered points to cement the result. McMaryion passed for 147 yards on seven completions in the second half and rushed for another two touchdowns to lead the Bulldogs.

UCLA's Stefan Flintoft uncorked a 70-yard punt in the second quarter, the Bruins' longest punt since the 2011 season.

Colorado receiver Lavis Shenault caught a touchdown pass and rushed for another, accumulating 144 yards of total offense, including 126 rushing yards. Buffaloes quarterback Steven Montez rushed for two touchdowns and completed 22 of 26 passes for 237 yards and one touchdown

UCLA (0-4, 0-1 in the Pac-12) struck first in its second series of the game, which started at the Colorado 47 after a 32-yard punt return by Kyle Philips. A Dorian Thompson-Robinson 17-yard run followed by a 15-yard late hit penalty brought the Bruins up to the 18, and on third and goal on the 11, Michael Ezeike caught a Thompson-Robinson pass in the corner of the end zone to give the Bruins a 7-0 lead.

Colorado (4-0, 1-0 in the Pac-12) answered quickly, tying it up a minute and a half later on a 57-yard touchdown pass from Montez to Shenault. The Bruins drove to the Colorado four on the next drive thanks in part to a 29-yard run by Kelley but could not get into the end zone, settling for a 21-yard field goal by Molson to go up 10-7 with 57 seconds left in the quarter.

The Buffaloes gained the lead for the first time, 14-10, with 6:13 to play in the second quarter after a 12-play drive resulted in a 10-yard touchdown run by Montez. UCLA cut the lead to one on Molson's 50-vard field goal just before halftime.

Molson hit another field goal, a 40-yarder, on the Bruins' first drive of the third quarter to regain the lead, 16-14, but Colorado scored 24un-answered points to finish off the Bruins.

"There are some good things that we can improve upon but the penalties are hurting us, and we can't live with those if we are expecting to beat a really good football team," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "That is what Colorado is right now; Mike (McIntyre) has done such a nice job here. We have to continue to improve, we got knocked down, but we aren't going to stay down, we are going to get back up and get ready for our next opponent."

### **GAME FIVE: Washington 31, UCLA 24**



### Oct. 6 - Rose Bowl

LOS ANGELES – The UCLA football team shook off a 17-point halftime deficit and hung around until the very end of the game, but ultimately fell 31-24 to No. 10 Washington on Saturday evening at the Rose Bowl.

UCLA scored a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter, cutting the deficit to seven each time, but ultimately couldn't knot the scoreline. Washington was led by

running back Myles Gaskin's 116 yards and two touchdowns.

"We knew it was gonna be tough tough sledding against a really tough front," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "They've held some really good teams down, that's why they're the No. 1 defense in the country. I thought we did a really good job of competing, especially in the second half where we had a pair of lengthy drives, but we just fell a little hit short."

UCLA was led on offense by running back Joshua Kelley - who recorded career-highs in both rushing (125) and receiving (39) yards while becoming the first Bruin since Paul Perkins in 2015 to net 100+rushing yards in back-to-back games - and tight end Caleb Wilson, who reached 100 yards receiving for the first time this season (102) while making eight catches to double his previous season-high in receptions.

Freshman quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson, making his fourth straight start, completed 27 of 38 passes for 272 yards. He threw for a pair of scoring touchdowns and was intercepted once.

Safety Adarius Pickett was the leader on the defensive side of the ball, notching a season-high 16 tackles, his fourth double-digit tackle performance of the year. He also intercepted Washington OB Jake Browning in the first quarter. Junior inside linebacker Krys Barnes had a big performance as well, making nine tackles including a career-high three for a loss

Using their longest drive of the year – in duration, yardage, and time used – the Bruins made it a 24-17 game early on the in the fourth quarter.

That drive started on the UCLA 10, but the Bruins steadily made their way up the field, converting on four consecutive third downs before Caleb Wilson contributed three big catches to find the end zone. His first, a 29-yard completion, got the Bruins from the 50-yard line to the edge of the red zone at the Washington 21. Another 11-yard catch from Wilson set up first and goal for UCLA, which converted three plays later — and after the third quarter ended — with a nine-yard catch-and-run from Wilson, who made a grab in the flat, spun off a tackle, and then extended as he was being dragged down at the goal line, just getting the ball over the plane of the end zone for the score. Ultimately, the drive went for 90 yards on 17 plays and took up 6:01 of game time.

However, that was as close as the Bruins would get to tying the game, as Gaskin would find the end zone again with 3:42 on the clock to record the game-winning score.

UCLA made it interesting, driving 75 yards in just over two minutes and finding the end zone on a two-yard Kelley scamper to cut the deficit to seven again with 1:38 remaining, but Washington held on to the ball for the duration of the contest and prevented the Bruins from getting another crack at the end zone.

UCLA ate up over five minutes of the clock in their first drive of the second half, with Kelley rushing five times for 26 yards to put UCLA in field goal range for JJ Molson, who knocked down a 49-yard attempt to make it a two-possession game at 24-10.

Washington opened up a 24-7 lead at halftime thanks to a pair of touchdowns from quarterback Jake Browning – one in the air and one on the ground – and another score from Gaskin.

The Huskies opened the scoring at the 1:37 mark of the first quarter, as Browning hit receiver Aaron Fuller down the right sideline for a 25-yard

touchdown grab.

On the ensuing UCLA drive, Kelley had his longest rush of the day, taking a handoff out of the shotgun and scurrying up the gut for 39 yards, his second-longest rush as a Bruin.

After Browning and Fuller connected again for a 46-yard catch on Washington's first drive of the second half, a strong red zone defensive effort prevented the visitors from doubling their lead. Krys Barnes made the critical play of that stop, dropping Browning for a nine-yard loss and his first career sack to set up 3rd-and-20 for the Huskies, who had to settle for a field goal.

UCLA followed with its crispest offensive drive of the night, needing just seven plays to drive 75 yards for a touchdown. Thompson-Robinson completed four consecutive passes, and five overall, as part of the drive, capping off the possession by finding Theo Howard all alone the right side of the end zone for a touchdown. Big plays during the drive included a 20-yard grab from Wilson on the opening play and a 22-yard completion to Kelley that moved the ball to the Washington 29.

The Huskies went on to add a pair of one-yard rushing touchdowns later in the second, first with Gaskins taking a direct snap running it in before Browning punched it in on their next possession. Gaskins narrowly missed out on a second consecutive touchdown on the latter drive, rushing for 17 yards and diving for the pylon but being ruled out at the 1

### **GAME SIX: UCLA 37, California 7**



### Oct. 13 - Berkeley, Calif.

BERKELEY, CALIF. - Running back Joshua Kelley rushed for a career-high 157 yards and three touchdowns, and the Bruin defense forced five turnovers as UCLA cruised to its first victory of the season.

Kelley became the first UCLA player to rush for 100+ yards in three straight games since Jordon James in 2013, leading the Bruin run game that to-

taled 207 yards to Cal's 117 rushing yards. UCLA quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson completed his first nine passes and finished the game 13-of-15 for 141 yards. Caleb Wilson led all receivers with five catches for 92 yards. Keisean Lucier-South led the Bruin defensive effort with an interception, a scoop and score, and a strip sack, finishing with six tackles

The Bruins (1-5, 1-2 in the Pac-12) led from start to finish, scoring on a five-yard Kelley touchdown late in the first quarter nine plays after Adarius Pickett recovered a Cal fumble forced by Darnay Holmes at the LICI A 41

A 46-yard reception by Wilson helped the Bruins drive to another score, a 25-yard field goal by JJ Molson to go ahead 10-0 at the 10:32 mark in the second quarter.

UCLA got itself in good field possession on the next drive, utilizing a 40-yard punt return by Pickett to start on the Cal 38, and added another three points on a 29-yard field goal by Molson.

California (3-3, 0-3) had an opportunity to prevent a first-half shutout with a 32-yard field goal attempt with seven seconds remaining, but after two UCLA time outs to ice the kicker, Greg Thomas' attempt hit the right upright and missed to give UCLA a 13-0 lead at the half.

The Bears scored a touchdown on their first possession of the second half to trim UCLA's lead to 13-7, but the Bruins quickly moved into Cal territory thanks to a penalty and a 24-yard reception by Theo Howard. Kelley concluded the drive with his second touchdown of the game, a one-yarder with 6:03 to play in the quarter.

After UCLA's defense stopped Cal on 4th and 1 at their 48 to regain possession, the Bruins found themselves in a 4th and 2 position but had the opposite result, with Thompson-Robinson hitting Kelley for a seven-yard gain to extend the drive. Five plays later, Kelley scored on a one-yard run, his third touchdown of the game, increasing UCLA's lead to 27-7.

The Bruin defense took over from there, intercepting Cal on two consecutive possessions. Lucier-South and Krys Barnes each picked up their first career interceptions. Lucier-South later added a touchdown on a scoop and score, running 38 yards to the house after a sack and forced fumble by Odua Isibor.

### **GAME SEVEN: UCLA 31, Arizona 30**



### Oct. 20 - Rose Bowl

PASADENA, Calif. – UCLA running back Joshua Kelley rushed for 136 yards and a go-ahead, 28-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter to lead the Bruins past Arizona, 31-30, in a Pac-12 game at the Rose Bowl on Saturday evening.

After the Bruins (2-5, 2-2 Pac-12) controlled the first half, Saturday night's contest turned into a back-and-forth affair after halftime. The second half of the

see-saw battle featured four lead changes before UCLA sealed its sixth win against Arizona in the two schools' last seven meetings.

UCLA, which registered a season-high of 460 total offensive yards, took the lead for good early in the fourth quarter. After Arizona had claimed a 27-24 lead on an eight-play, 72-yard drive, the Bruins answered with a 28-yard touchdown run from Kelley. In just four plays, UCLA had secured a 31-27 lead with 11:33 to play.

Arizona pulled to within one point, at 31-30, after Josh Pollack connected on a 29-yard field goal with 6:28 left in the contest.

Kelley finished the evening with a career-high 31 carries, logging his fourth consecutive game with at least 100 rushing yards.

UCLA quarterback Wilton Speight completed 17 of 27 passes for 204 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Arizona overcame a 17-7 deficit in the third quarter and took a 20-17 lead before the Bruins responded late in the period.

UCLA regained the lead, at 24-20, with 3:08 left in the third quarter thanks to a six-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by a 25-yard touchdown pass from Speight to Demetric Felton.

After the Bruins fumbled the ball in their own territory with just over 10 minutes remaining in the third quarter, Arizona's Rhett Rodriguez fired an 11-yard touchdown pass to Shawn Poindexter for the game-tying score (17-17).

UCLA opened by scoring the game's first 10 points. The Bruins drove 62 yards on their first offensive possession, closing the drive with a 16-yard pass from quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson to Kazmeir Allen at the 9:51 mark. The Bruins claimed a 10-0 cushion with a 40-yard field goal by J.J. Molson at the 14:56 mark in the second quarter.

One of the key defensive plays for UCLA, which forced three turnovers, came with the Bruins up by 10 in the second quarter. With the ball at the Arizona 44-yard line, J.J. Taylor broke away from the defense and raced for the end zone, but Darnay Holmes tracked him down and forced a fumble at the 1-yard line, recovering the ball in the end zone for a buichback

Arizona reduced the Bruins' cushion to 10-7 on the Wildcats' seventh drive of the game. Rodriguez connected on a 24-yard pass to Poindexter with 6:38 remaining in the first half.

UCLA added to its lead with a touchdown just before halftime. Speight

connected on a 24-yard touchdown pass to Devin Asiasi at the 1:34 mark in the second quarter, putting the Bruins ahead 17-7.

### **GAME EIGHT: Utah 41, UCLA 10**



### Oct. 26 - Rose Bowl

LOS ANGELES – The UCLA football team snapped a two-game winning streak in Friday night's Pac-12 matchup at the Rose Bowl, dropping a 41-10 decision to Utah.

The Bruins (2-6, 2-3 Pac-12 South) led Friday night's contest after the first quarter, but the Utes (6-2, 4-2) rebounded to outscore the home team 38-3 the rest of the way.

Redshirt junior running back Joshua Kelley came up with the big play of UCLA's first scoring drive, taking a handoff on fourth and one, finding a gap to the right, and then taking off for a 25-yard score against the No. 1-ranked run defense in the country.

That play capped off an 11-play, 75-yard drive that knocked off over five minutes of the clock and featured several big throws from senior quarterback Wilton Speight, who completed his first five passes including a pair of first down completions during the scoring drive.

The ensuing possession for Utah resulted in UCLA's lone takeaway of the game, as free safety Quentin Lake picked off an end zone-bound pass from Utah QB Tyler Huntley to negate a 60-yard run from Zack Moss earlier in the drive. It was the second consecutive week that Lake logged an interception.

The first quarter ended with the Bruins ahead 7-3, but the Utes scored on their first two possessions of the second quarter to take a 17-7 lead heading into the locker room. Moss was the decisive factor in the opening half, rushing 16 times for 145 yards and one touchdown.

Utah stepped on the gas pedal at the start of the third quarter, driving 75 yards over 3:15 in the half's first possession to stretch its lead to 24-7. The Utes parlayed an interception into a short field for their next possession, scoring again to make it 31-7.

Speight ended the game with 164 yards on 20-40 passing. Kelley, who had just eight touches after the first quarter, saw his span of 100-yard rushing games come to an end, finishing with 90 yards on 16 carries. Caleb Wilson (five catches, 62 yards) and Theo Howard (six catches, 51 yards) were both busy in the pass-catching department. Howard recorded his 100th career reception with a grab late in the first half.

On defense, Tyree Thomson set a new career high and led the team with 11 total tackles. Osa Odighizuwa had a strip sack and three tackles.

For Utah, Moss followed up his standout first half with another solid effort in the latter half, finishing the game with 211 yards rushing and three touchdowns on 26 carries.

### **GAME NINE: Oregon 42, UCLA 21**



### Nov. 3 - Eugene, Ore.

EUGENE, Ore. - UCLA compiled a season-high 496 total yards, but untimely penalties and turnovers were costly in a 42-21 loss.

The Bruins had 11 penalties, plus three turnovers that led to 21 points, while the Ducks had zero turnovers and just one penalty.

Wilton Speight and Dorian Thompson-

Robinson combined for 297 yards passing and each threw one touchdown. UCLA running back Joshua Kelley recorded his fifth 100-yard game of the season, totaling a career-high 161 yards rushing with one touchdown

Down 7-0 after an Ugochukwu Amadi 56-yard punt return for a touchdown, the Bruins quickly answered, driving down the field to the Oregon 14 on the next drive. However, Thompson-Robinson was picked off in the end zone to end the threat, and Oregon scored on its next drive on a one-yard run by CJ Verdell.

UCLA's defense made a quick stop on Oregon's next drive, but a fumble on the punt return gave the Ducks the ball again, and they scored three plays later on a four-yard pass from Justin Herbert to Dillon Mitchell to increase their lead to 21-0 with 13:10 to play in the second.

The Bruins got on the board with a 63-yard touchdown pass from Thompson-Robinson to Caleb Wilson, trimming the lead to 21-7, and the Ducks missed a 21-yard field goal with 1:15 left in the half. Thompson-Robinson efficiently led UCLA down the field in the final minute and got the Bruins in field goal range with seconds remaining. With JJ Molson in line to attempt at 51 yard field goal, the Bruins were penalized for a false start, pushing Molson back five yards. His 56-yard attempt was on line but short.

In the third quarter, Oregon took back momentum on a strip sack by Justin Hollins, who took the ball to the UCLA seven. The Ducks scored three plays later to go up 28-7. Speight then replaced Thompson-Robinson and led the Bruins down the field, culminating in a 25-yard touchdown run by Kelley to trim the lead to 28-14.

Oregon's good fortunes appeared to turn on its next drive with a costly penalty. The Ducks had what looked to be a 31-yard touchdown run by Jaylon Redd on a reverse, but the score was nullified due to a targeting call. The Ducks were unable to score but caught a break when the Bruins snapped high on a field goal attempt. The Ducks pounced on the Bruins' misfortune, scoring on a 67-yard touchdown reception by Mitchell on the second play of the following drive to go up 35-14.

UCLA refused to give up, however, answering quickly with an 11-yard touchdown pass from Speight to Theo Howard to again make it a two-possession game. But a 54-yard touchdown dash by Tony Brooks-James with 5:56 remaining proved to be the dagger for the Bruins.

### **GAME 10: Arizona State 31, UCLA 28**



### Nov. 10 - Tempe, Ariz.

UCLA battled until the end against Arizona State, but the Bruins' comeback attempt in the final minute and a half fell short in a 31-28 loss in Tempe.

Down by just three with a minute and a half to play, UCLA quarterback Wilton Speight had a chance to lead the Bruins to a game-tying or game-winning drive. It started out promising with two quick

passes to Chase Cota to move the ball up to the UCLA 41, but a sack and fumble on the next play dropped the Bruins back to the 33, and back-to-back false starts took yardage back and time off the clock to dash UCLA's comeback hopes.

"You've got to execute," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "They executed better than we executed, and that's what the bottom line is. I think our guys played with great effort, but if we're going to hurt ourselves, then we're not going to win football games in this conference."

Speight threw for a UCLA-best 335 yards on 26-of-35 passing and two touchdowns. Tight end Caleb Wilson made 11 receptions for a season-high 164 yards and two touchdowns. Arizona State quarterback Manny Wilkins rushed for two touchdowns and threw for another, while running back Eno Benjamin rushed for 182 yards and one touchdown.

After Arizona State opened the game with a field goal, the Bruins clinically answered with a seven-play touchdown drive on their first possession, topped by a two-yard rushing touchdown by Kelley, his sixth-straight game with a touchdown.

The Bruins had a drive stall early in the second quarter when they were stopped on fourth and one on the ASU 14, and the Sun Devils took advantage, driving 85 yards down the field and regaining the lead with a 13-yard touchdown run by Manny Wilkins. Two plays after the Bruins missed a 44-yard field goal, the momentum quickly shifted back to UCLA when Darnay Holmes scored on a pick-six, returning an interception for a 31-yard touchdown to give UCLA a 14-10 lead with 4:36 to

Arizona State scored a touchdown with just under a minute left in the second quarter to take a 17-14 lead into halftime

The Sun Devils capitalized on an interception off a tipped pass at the ASU 22 halfway through the third quarter, using a 41-yard run by Benjamin to drive down the field. The Bruins stopped ASU on third and goal on the three, but Benjamin ran it in on fourth and one at the one-yard line to increase the Sun Devils' lead to 24-14.

Speight brought UCLA right back in it with a six-play, 75-yard drive culminating in a 33-yard touchdown pass to Caleb Wilson that trimmed the lead to just three, 24-21. The Bruin defense came up with a big stop on the next drive, aided by a 10-yard sack by Lokenia Toailoa at the UCLA 22 at the end of the third quarter, to help keep the Sun Devils off the board.

ASU used a 15-play, 80-yard touchdown drive that ate up a whopping eight minutes of the clock to take a double-digit lead (31-21) into the final four minutes of the game, but Speight quickly marched the Bruins down the field, taking under two minutes to lead UCLA to a score on a

10-yard touchdown pass to Wilson.

Down just 31-28 with under two minutes to play, the Bruins tried an onside kick and nearly recovered, but the Sun Devils fell on it at the UCLA 45. UCLA's defense stepped up, forcing ASU into a three-andout, taking just 22 seconds off the clock. The Bruins regained the ball at their 20 with 1:33 to play, but a sack and two consecutive false starts killed time and yardage, and with no time outs remaining, UCLA faced 3rd and 23 at the Bruin 19 with under 10 seconds left, and Speight's pass fell incomplete as time expired.

### **GAME 11: UCLA 34, USC 27**



### Nov. 17 - Rose Bowl

LOS ANGELES – Redshirt junior running back Joshua Kelley turned in the magnum opus of his breakout 2018 season in Saturday afternoon's rivalry game at the Rose Bowl, rushing for 289 yards and two touchdowns to lead the UCLA football team to a 34-27 win over USC.

It was the first win for the Bruins (3-8, 3-5 Pac-12 South) over the Trojans (5-6, 4-5) since the 2014 season.

Kelley's 289 rushing yards are the third-most in single-game program history and the most by a Bruin since Maurice Jones-Drew had a school-record 322 rushing yards in 2004. The UC Davis transfer also eclipsed the 1,000 yards rushing mark for the season, ending the day at 1,189. That mark is No. 11 all-time in UCLA history and the most since Paul Perkins had 1,343 in 2015.

Kelley was at the center of the biggest swing of the game for UCLA.

Trailing by six in the fourth quarter, Kelley broke through the line untouched and sprinted down the left side for a 55-yard touchdown that tied the game up and capped off a season-long 97-yard drive. Mo-

ments later, JJ Molson knocked down the extra point to make it 28-27 and give UCLA its first lead since the second quarter.

On the first play of USC's ensuing possession, freshman quarterback JT Daniels had a miscommunication with his receivers and threw an interception right into the arms of UCLA's Darnay Holmes at the Bruin 45. UCLA converted its next two possessions into field goals to make it a seven-point game, then saw its defense hold the Trojans off the board during their final drive to pull out the win.

Krys Barnes broke up a short-range Daniels pass on 4th-and-3 to seal the win for the Bruins.

"We've got to play to our strengths, and Josh [Kelley] is a strength for us right now," said UCLA head coach Chip Kelly. "We needed to run the ball, control it. They're just so explosive on the offensive side of the ball. We tried to keep them away from it a little bit. It's a great experience, and I'm just happy for the kids and what they have put in all year long to win this right now. This gives them an understanding of what we have asked them to do and it pays off. For a 24-hour span, we can feel OK about ourselves. And then we've got to get ready to play Stanford."

UCLA quarterback Wilton Speight ended the game with 166 yards on 13-22 passing. He threw for one touchdown, rushed for another, and had one interception. Theo Howard was the team's leader in pass-catching, making five grabs for 76 yards including a touchdown. Caleb Wilson added four receptions for 63 yards.

USC was led by Daniels, who had 337 yards on 20-34 passing. The Trojans narrowly missed out on having a pair of 100-yard receivers, as Michael Pittman had seven catches for 106 yards while Amon St. Brown had 98 yards receiving on six catches. Vavae Malepeai was the team's leading rusher with 77 yards.

UCLA built a 14-10 lead early in the first quarter after finding the end zone in each of the team's first two drives.

The Bruins' first scoring drive was highlighted by a pair of big throws from Speight. First, he evaded pressure and hit Caleb Wilson downfield for a 29-yard completion to convert on 3rd-and-8. The Bruins faced another third down situation in their next series, but Speight came up again by lofting a jump ball in the end zone to Theo Howard, who reeled it in for a 33-yard touchdown grab.

UCLA's next possession saw Kelley take a handoff out of the shotgun and scurry down the left sideline for a career-long 61-yard gain, setting up a 1st-and-goal for the Bruins at the 8. Two plays later, Speight kept it and rushed into the end zone for a 4-yard touchdown run.

USC opened the second quarter by sacking Speight on third down, then blocked the ensuing punt deep in Bruin territory and ran it five yards into the end zone for a go-ahead touchdown that made it 17-14 for USC.

That three-point lead for the Trojans held up at the halftime whistle as the two teams traded touchdowns — Kelley briefly put the Bruins back up with a one-yard touchdown run before USC answered with a 45-yard touchdown pass to Velus Jones — before heading into their locker rooms

USC kicked a field goal in the third quarter – the Bruins came up with a big defensive stop after the Trojans had first and goal at the UCLA 5 – to carve out a six-point lead, the largest of the day for the visitors.
