Former UCLA All-American Jorge Salcedo is in his 15th season as head coach for the Bruins, making him the second-longest tenured men's soccer head coach in UCLA history. In 14 previous seasons, Salcedo has led the Bruins to an overall record of 172-80-42.

A product of UCLA's strong soccer tradition, Salcedo has maintained the Bruins' standard for success, winning six conference titles and guiding his team to NCAA Tournament appearances in 13 of the last 14 seasons. Salcedo has signed the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation seven times (2017, 2015, 2014, 2013, 2010, 2006 and 2004), and those players have produced results, advancing all the way to the NCAA Championship game in the 2006 and 2014 seasons, to the College Cup Semifinals in 2011 and to the quarterfinals in 2009 and 2010. Over the last 10 seasons, Salcedo's teams have earned four Pac-12 titles and lost just 23 conference games (63-23-14 record). Salcedo's teams have also lost only 21 games away from home in the last seven seasons, going 37-21-10 in their last 68 road or neutral site matches.

Since taking over the program in 2004, Salcedo has produced 38 Major League Soccer Draft Picks, including 19 first-round selections. Of those 19 first-round selections, 12 were taken within the top-10 picks, including Marvell Wynne (2006), Chance Myers (2008) and Abu Danladi (2017) who were each selected first overall. Overall, Salcedo has tutored 14 players who are currently playing in the professional ranks as of 2018.

The 2014 Bruins posted a 14-5-5 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Championship game for the ninth time in school history, eventually falling in penalty kicks to Virginia. Senior Leo Stolz led UCLA in 2014, racking up a team-high 24 points en route to earning the MAC Hermann Player of the Year Trophy and consensus first team All-America honors. Overall, nine Bruins earned All-Pac-12 honors, including three first team selections.

In 2013, the Bruins finished with an 12-3-5 record overall and was awarded the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003. For the third straight year, a member of the UCLA men's soccer team took home conference Player of the Year honors, as Leo Stolz was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year. The Bruins also had six all-conference selections in 2013. The 2012 squad secured UCLA's second consecutive Pac-12 title and reached the NCAA Tournament for the 30th consecutive year. The Bruins also landed a conference-best four players on the first-team All-Pac-12 squad while Salcedo took home his second straight Pac-12 Coach of the Year award. Under Salcedo's leadership, senior Ryan Hollingshead won the Pac-12 Player of the Year, marking the fourth player Salcedo has coached to Conference Player of the Year honors (Patrick Ianni, 2004; Michael Stephens, 2008; Kelyn Rowe, 2011).

The 2011 Bruins ran the table in conference play, going 10-0-0 and allowing just two goals. Salcedo, who earned his 100th career victory when UCLA clinched the conference title on Nov. 4, was named the Pac-12's Coach of the Year. The Bruins then capped off the 2011 season with a long run in the NCAA Tournament that culminated in the school's 13th berth in the NCAA College Cup. The 2010 Bruins won 16 games and advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals for the second consecutive

year. In 2009, Salcedo's Bruins won their second-straight Pac-10 Championship, and placed two players on the All-America team. Additionally, a school record-tying five players were selected in the MLS SuperDraft at the conclusion of the season. In 2008, Salcedo guided UCLA to the Pac-10 Championship and was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year for the second time in his tenure.

The 2006 Bruins faced an uphill battle with injuries to several starters throughout the season, but they fought through the adversity and ended a successful post-season run in the title game with a final season record of 14-6-4. In 2005, Salcedo's Bruins recorded a 12-5-3 record and ranked amongst the best in the nation in team defense, allowing just 14 goals and posting a team goals against average of 0.67. The Bruins also captured the Pac-10 title for the fourth year in a row and earned a No. 5 seeding in the NCAA Tournament.

During his first season, Salcedo earned Pac-10 Co-Coach of the Year honors after leading UCLA to its third-straight conference title. His Bruins



ended the regular season ranked No. 3 by Soccer America and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, where they finished the year with a 14-4-2 record.

Salcedo was UCLA's assistant coach from 2001-03 and helped lead the Bruins to the 2002 NCAA Championship and to two Pac-10 team championships. In 2002, he served as acting head coach in a crucial road victory at Stanford in November that helped the Bruins capture their first-ever Pac-10 title. He also served as acting head coach in the spring of 2002 in the coaching transition between Todd Saldaña and Tom Fitzgerald and had served in a similar capacity after Fitzgerald announced his resignation.

Salcedo, who is a scout for the U.S. National Team, was the head coach of the 2002 U-16 SoCal ODP State team and was also the assistant coach of the U-17 team in 2001.

The Cerritos, Calif. native had an illustrious career at UCLA from 1990-93. Salcedo was a four-year starter, playing 74 games and tallying six goals and seven assists for 19 points. As a freshman, he scored the decisive penalty kick in the shootout during the 1990 NCAA Championship game to give UCLA its second national title. In 1993 as a senior, he earned NSCAA first-team All-America honors. He prepped at Cerritos HS, where he earned two Parade All-America honors. Salcedo played for five years in Major League Soccer (MLS). In his first season in the league, he was a starter for the Los Angeles Galaxy and helped take his team to the MLS Championship game. He also played for Chicago, where he served as team co-captain, Columbus and Tampa Bay before returning to the Galaxy in 1999. Prior to his MLS career, he played with the LA Salsa in the APSL and then for F.C. Morelia of the Mexican First Division. Salcedo was also a member of the U.S. National Team program, earning three caps with the full national team and captaining the U-17 team at the 1989 World Youth Championships and the U-20 team at the 1990 CONCACAF Tournament.

Salcedo has had extensive ties to the Bruin program for many years. He graduated from UCLA with a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science and was part of three of the Bruins' four NCAA Championship teams. He was a ball boy for UCLA during its first championship year in 1985, scored the game-winning penalty kick in the 1990 Championship game and was an assistant coach for the 2002 squad. In addition, his father Hugo was a UCLA assistant coach from 1978-79 and member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic team, and he also served as the FIFA Chairman of the 2014 World Cup. Jorge's brother Eddie was a UCLA letterwinner in 1995.

Salcedo and his wife Rebecca have been married for 14 years, and they have four children, Matteo (11), Malea (9), Marco (7) and Macsen (3).

Phil Marfuggi is in his fifth season coaching at UCLA and second as full-time assistant coach. Marfuggi previously served as the team's volunteer assistant coach, coaching the goalkeepers and assisting with strength and conditioning.

In this third season with the Bruins in 2016, Marfuggi aided the Bruins to the NCAA Tournament for the 34th consecutive year. UCLA ranked third in the Pac-12 with five shutouts including Kevin Silva recorded back-to-back clean sheets in his collegiate debut. Silva also ranked 12th in the NCAA and tops in the Pac-12 in saves per game at 5.00.

In his first season with the Bruins in 2014, Marfuggi helped lead UCLA to a 14-5-5 overall record and a College Cup Championship game appearance. His work with the goalkeepers was paramount in the team tallying a Pac-12-high eight shutouts. Under Marfuggi's tutelage, goalkeeper Earl Edwards Jr. posted a career-best 0.89 goals against average, and he was selected in the third round of the MLS SuperDraft by Orlando City SC.

Following a decorated collegiate career at Clemson University, Marfuggi was drafted in the first round (12th overall selection) of the 2007 MLS Supplemental Draft by the New England Revolution. The New Jersey native played two seasons professionally for the Revolution, Miami FC and the Pittsburgh Riverhounds.

At Clemson, Marfuggi started all four years (2004-07), earning All-American, All-South Region, and All-ACC Honors in 2005 and 2006. He was goalkeeper for the Tigers squad that allowed zero goals en route to the 2005 Final Four in North Carolina and was also a 2006 Hermann Trophy candidate.

Prior to his collegiate career, Marfuggi earned the starting goalkeeper position for the U-17 National Team that took fifth in the World Cup in 2003. He attended the U.S Soccer Residency Program at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida for two years, where he earned honors as a McDonalds All-American and Parade All-American. In 2003, Marfuggi was ranked the 11th best recruit in the country.

In addition to soccer, Marfuggi also played football professionally for four seasons in the Arena Football League.



Matt Taylor

UCLA alumnus Matt Taylor returned to Westwood before the 2018 season as an assistant coach for the men's soccer team. Taylor was a member of the 2002 NCAA National Championship team and was named the Pac-10 Player of the Year in 2003.

Taylor earned All-NCAA Tournament honors in 2002 after leading the team in scoring with five goals en route to the national title. During his senior year campaign in 2003, the Irvine, Calif. native was named a Second Team All-American and MAC Hermann Award Semifinalist on top of his conference player of the year honors. That season, he led the Bruins in scoring for the second consecutive year with 14 goals and 36 points.

Taylor remains the program leader in hat tricks with three while also top-5 in game-winning goals (12), multiple goal games (7) and consecutive games with a goal (4). He played in 87 games for UCLA making 55 starts and totaled 86 points with 33 goals.

He began his professional career being drafted fourth overall in the 2004 MLS SuperDraft to Kansas City followed by being taken eighth overall by Chivas USA in the 2004 MLS Expansion Draft. In 2008, he left to play professionally in Germany where he played professionally for nine seasons.

Since retiring in 2017, Taylor has attained a UEFA "B" Coaching License.



Jose Lopez

Volunteer Assistant Coach
UCLA '73

UCLA Hall of Famer Jose Lopez returns to the men's soccer staff as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2018 season, having previously served in the same role from 1995-2007.

In 1993, Lopez became the first-ever soccer player to be inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame.

He was a four-year letterwinner from 1970-73 and two-time team captain who led his teams to NCAA Championship games in 1970, 1972, and 1973 and to the NCAA Quarterfinals in 1971. His 1970 and 1973 teams held undefeated regular season records, and his teams never lost a home game in his four years as a Bruin.

After earning two all-conference honors and being selected to play in the 1973 Senior Bowl, Lopez became the No. 1 draft pick in professional soccer by the Los Angeles Aztecs of the North American Soccer League in 1974. In his rookie season, he helped the Aztecs win the NASL title, and in his second year he was selected Aztecs' Midfielder of the Year. Lopez has played with and against soccer legends like Pele, Franz Beckenbauer, and George Best.

Lopez also played three years on the Bruin baseball team and was a placekicker on the 1969 freshman football team.

A 1973 graduate (B.A. in Spanish) of UCLA, Lopez previously served as a volunteer assistant for the Bruins from 1995-2007 and aided the program with video from 1987-1994. He taught AP Spanish Language and Literature at Santa Monica High School for many years after his playing days.
