ON SERVE

UCLA returns home for the first time in nearly a month, winners of five of six matches played during its time away from Los Angeles Tennis Center. The Bruins are set for non-conference tilts on back-to-back days, Thursday, Feb. 28 against UC Santa Barbara and Friday, March 1 against No. 32 USC. Both matches are set for 1:30 p.m. starts. Pac-12 Networks will provide live television coverage of Friday's rivalry match, with J.B. Long and Corina Morariu on the call. Live stats will be available throughout the week at uclalivestats.com.

LAST WEEK

The Bruins hit Northern California for non-conference matches at Saint Mary's and California and left with a 2-0 record. On Friday, Feb. 22, UCLA blanked Saint Mary's in a match that lasted just over an hour at the Timothy Korth Tennis Complex. Doubles tandems Jada Hart-Taylor Johnson and No. 38 Abi Altick-Alaina Miller each posted a 6-0 win to get on the board and Miller, Johnson and Gabby Andrews ran off straight-set singles wins to lock up the overall victory. The next day, Cal secured the doubles point by way of a tiebreaker on the top court to set the tone at the Hellman Tennis Complex. The Golden Bears went on to tally three first-set wins in singles play, ensuing at least one Bruin would have win in three sets. In the end, the day's final contest went the distance and the heroics belonged to Altick. The sophomore, who trailed No. 69 Anna Bright 1-6, 1-4 at one point, took the next five games and momentum into the final frame. The match was fittingly completed with the help of a tiebreaker, which Altick seized 7-5.

UCLA VS. UC SANTA BARBARA, USC

UCLA holds a 33-0 all-time record against UC Santa Barbara. In the teams' 2018 dual-match opener, the Gauchos picked up the doubles point before the Bruins rallied back in singles action. Andrews, Hart, Ayan Broomfield and Terri Fleming turned in straight-set victories in the 4-2 win. The Bruins have faced no opponent more than the Trojans and possess a 53-50 mark against their crosstown rivals. In the last meeting, April 21, 2018 at LATC, UCLA did not drop a set in its completed matches and rolled to a 4-0 win. Hart defeated Rianna Valdes 6-3, 6-2 in a battle of ranked players on Court 2 to clinch the regular season's final match.

BRUIINS IN THE RANKINGS

UCLA remained at No. 5 in in the Oracle ITA team rankings, announced Tuesday. The Bruins were elevated to the top five last week, marking their first appearance since the final installment of the 2015 season. Six UCLA players appeared in the latest individual rankings, announced Wednesday, Feb. 20. Bolton leads the way at No. 11 on the singles list, while Broomfield is No. 112. The pairing of Andrews-Broomfield checks in at No. 14 in the doubles rankings, while Bolton-Hart appear at No. 14 and Altick-Miller No. 38. The team also sits at No. 5 in the Tennis Channel/USTA College Tennis Top 25 Rankings, updated Wednesday, Feb. 20.

STANDOUT SENIORS

Seniors Andrews, Broomfield and Miller constitute the core of the UCLA roster and bring with them different journeys to Westwood. Miller joined the Bruins as a freshman in 2015 and has racked 131 wins across singles and doubles competitions. Andrews achieved All-America status for her singles and doubles accomplishments at Tyler Junior College before transferring to UCLA as a sophomore in 2016. Broomfield was named ACC Freshman of the Year and twice received All-ACC honors before transferring to UCLA as a junior in 2017.

BOLTON NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR JAN. 28-FEB. 3

Bolton was named Pac-12 Player of the Week for the week of Jan. 28-Feb. 3, the conference announced. UCLA improved to 4-0 thanks in large part to Bolton's efforts, as the Cold Spring Harbor, N.Y. native clinched Bruin road wins at Oklahoma State (Feb. 2) and Tulsa (Feb. 3). In addition to Bolton's singles successes, the first-year player teamed with Hart for a pair of doubles triumphs. The first win secured the doubles point, propelling the Bruins to victory over the No. 9 Cowgirls. The award represents the first of Bolton's career and 23rd all time for the UCLA women's tennis program.

2017-18 IN REVIEW

It was a stellar all-around 2017-18 campaign for the Bruins, who went 23-6 and reached the quarterfinal round of the NCAA Championships before seeing their journey come to an end in a 4-3 shootout versus Georgia Tech. UCLA lost just one Pac-12 match during the regular season and won 11 contests in a row before falling to eventual NCAA champion Stanford in a hard-fought title match at the Pac-12 Championships. Ena Shibahara starred individually, earning recognition as ITA

A press pass enables entrance to the patio overlooking court two. Press seating is located at the assigned seat by Andrew Sinatra, delivered upon your arrival to the facility. There will be one seat at a table with power for each media member that requests it (space limited, subject to availability) with overflow seating located in the stadium seats.

Postgame Procedure

Head coach Stella Sampras Webster and selected players will be available to the media outside UCLA's locker room following the team's meeting and cool down (10 minutes after the conclusion of the game). UCLA's locker room is closed to the media.

Southwest Region Player to Watch, Pac-12 Singles Player of the Year and an All-Pac-12 First-Team member. Shibahara, Hart and Fleming received All-America accolades from the ITA. Hart, Fleming, Altick and Miller joined Shibahara in garnering All-Pac-12 honors.

WHO'S GONE?

Shibahara, who went 27-10 in singles play and 28-4 in doubles action in 2017-18, has departed to pursue a professional career. All 21 of her dual-match singles decisions came on the top court. The steady Fleming has graduated. She went 16-14 in singles play and a team-best 14-8 in dual-match doubles play. Kristin Wiley is gone after a 4-5 singles showing and a 3-3 doubles effort, while Kelly Shaffer rounds out the list of departees.

WHO'S BACK?

All-American and two-time All-Pac-12 Second Teamer Hart is back after filling the No. 2 singles spot for a vast majority of the 2017-18 dual-match season. The redshirt junior was also one half of the top doubles tandem. Seniors Andrews, Broomfield and Miller also bring experience and 2017-18 success. Andrews-Broomfield went 10-4 from the No. 2 doubles slot, while Broomfield went 17-11 across three singles courts. Miller lost just once in her final 19 singles matches and failed to lose any of her final 19 doubles contests. Altick is back after a standout debut season. The Monroe, La. native registered a team-high 30 singles wins. Sophomore Sophie Bendetti is also back.

WHO'S NEW?

Two of the nation's top recruits join the fold in Bolton and Johnson. Bolton, a Blue-Chip prospect according to TennisRecruiting.net, was ranked No. 4 in the nation by the website at the time of her signing. Nationally, the USTA had the right-hander slotted at No. 13 in its Girls' 18 doubles rankings, as well. In September, Bolton made a run to the quarterfinal round at the US Open Junior Tennis Championships in both the singles and doubles competitions. Johnson spent 2017 and 2018 atop the TennisRecruiting.net rankings. In 2017, she teamed with Claire Liu to claim the doubles title at the USTA Girls' 18 National Championships in San Diego. The 5-10 left-hander participated in all four Grand Slam junior tournaments, notching quarterfinal-round berths in each doubles draw. LaFrance is a veteran of the ITF circuit, notching nine doubles championships with five partners across four continents.

KATZ FAMILY SCOREBOARD

UCLA tennis and the UCLA Athletic Department debuted the Katz Family Scoreboard Wednesday, Jan. 9 in front of donors and special invited guests at LATC. The ceremony culminated in a ribbon cutting by the Katz Family, Director of Athletics Dan Guerrero, women's tennis head coach Stella Sampras Webster and men's tennis head coach Billy Martin. Each, along with Sr. Associate Athletic Director, External Relations Josh Rebholz, made remarks highlighting the meaning of the Katz Family's generous donation and the opportunities the scoreboard will provide the tennis programs. The Katz Family Scoreboard's Daktronics display, measuring 18 feet high and 31.2 feet wide, is among the largest LED video screens in collegiate tennis. Stationed at the east end of LATC's main stadium courts, the board has a 13HD pixel pitch capable of switching between content playback mode and video mode using Show Control. RGB LED lights, meanwhile, will allow for a multitude of graphics possibilities. Also new to the match-day experience is a custom JBL speaker system set to improve audio on the front courts while introducing sound to the back courts.

ALUMNAE SPOTLIGHT

Jennifer Brady was part of UCLA's 2014 NCAA championship-winning team and her winning ways have continued into the professional ranks. Brady had a breakout 2017 and showed she was no fluke in 2018, reaching the singles second round of each Grand Slam tournament. She broke onto the pro scene at the 2017 Australian Open, winning all three of her qualifying matches before notching three more victories in the main draw. Brady went on to reach the fourth round at the 2017 US Open, as well. She also had doubles success, advancing to the third round of the 2018 French Open and the semifinal round of the 2019 Australian Open. Brady, a Boca Raton, Fla. native, has been ranked as high as No. 60 (Oct. 16, 2017) in the WTA singles rankings and she recently climbed to a career-best No. 49 (Feb. 18, 2019) on the doubles list.

HEAD COACH STELLA SAMPRAS WEBSTER

Head coach Stella Sampras Webster is in her 23rd season at the helm of the UCLA women's tennis program, holding an impressive overall record of 425-159 (.728). Sampras Webster has guided the Bruins to NCAA team championships in 2008 and 2014, the first two in program history. The 2012 ITA National Coach of the Year, Stella Sampras Webster is also responsible for helping the Bruins to their first Pac-10 Championship in 2008. For her efforts, she was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year at the end of the season. In all, Sampras Webster's teams have finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships in 19 of her 22 seasons in Westwood. UCLA has also finished in the top five nationally on 13 occasions. The 2000 ITA West Region Coach of the Year, Sampras Webster has recruited and coached some of the top players in collegiate tennis.

STELLA SAMPRAS WEBSTER

Head Coach
23rd Season
UCLA '91

Head coach Stella Sampras Webster enters her 23rd season at the helm of the UCLA women's tennis program in 2018, compiling an impressive overall record of 420-158 (.727). Sampras Webster is only the third head coach in UCLA women's tennis history, following legendary coaches Bill Zaima (1972-76 & 1986-96) and Gayle Godwin (1977-86).

Sampras Webster and the Bruins captured the 2014 NCAA title in Athens, Georgia with a thrilling 4-3 victory over North Carolina in the final. It marked the 111th NCAA Championship for UCLA, as the Bruins finished the 2014 campaign with a 27-2 overall record, which included a 9-1 mark in the highly-competitive Pac-12 Conference. UCLA did not surrender the doubles point in any match that year, going a perfect 29-0 in doubles play. The 2014 season marked the second NCAA Championship for Sampras Webster, as she also led UCLA to the title in 2008. UCLA's 2008 title was the first NCAA Championship for the program, following up on the team's 1981 AIAW national crown.

The 2012 ITA National Coach of the Year, Stella Sampras Webster is also responsible for helping the Bruins to their first Pac-10 Championship in 2008, as UCLA ended the conference season with a 7-1 record that year. For her efforts, she was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year at the end of the season.

Few college coaches can match Sampras Webster's ability to continually put their teams in the title hunt year in and year out. Prior to her first title in 2008, she also had a pair of second-place finishes at the NAAs in 2004 and 2007. In all, Sampras Webster's teams have finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships in 19 of her 22 seasons in Westwood. UCLA has also finished in the top five nationally on 13 occasions (1997, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2018).

The 2000 ITA West Region Coach of the Year, Sampras Webster has recruited and coached some of the top players in collegiate tennis. Under her tutelage, a total of 28 players have achieved All-America status. Two of the most notable during Sampras Webster's tenure are Riza Zalameda and Robin Anderson. Zalameda was a four-time All-American and the Most Outstanding Player at the 2008 NCAA Championships. She and partner Tracy Lin captured the NCAA doubles title in 2008, marking the second UCLA team to capture the doubles title under Sampras Webster's tenure. Lauren Fisher and Daniela Bercek also won the title in 2004. Anderson, who like Zalameda was named the Most Outstanding Player at the NAAs in 2014, also achieved All-America status each of her four years.

A 1991 graduate of UCLA with a degree in Psychology, Sampras Webster enjoyed a successful four-year career as a Bruin player from 1987-1991 and competed on the pro circuit for a season prior to joining Zaima's staff. An NCAA doubles champion as a freshman in 1988 with Allyson Cooper, Sampras Webster was also the NCAA doubles runner-up as a senior in 1991 with Kimberly Po. A four-time All-American, Sampras Webster was only the second player in UCLA history to obtain this status. She also won the 1989 and 1991 Pac-10 doubles championship and the 1990 Rolex Regional doubles title. Sampras Webster completed her UCLA career ranked No. 3 nationally in doubles and No. 42 in singles. Team accomplishments were most important to Sampras Webster, who helped lead the Bruins to four straight NCAA top-three finishes.

As a professional, Sampras Webster's highest international singles ranking was No. 248, and her best in doubles was No. 142. Her professional highlights include competing in both singles and doubles at the U.S. Open and Lipton Championships. She advanced to the U.S. Open second round in doubles and also competed in doubles at Wimbledon. She also won three satellite tournament titles and competed in Team Tennis for the Wichita Advantage in 1992.

Lauded for her "achievements and contributions to the game of tennis across Southern California," Sampras Webster was inducted into the Southern California Tennis Association

Hall of Fame in 2017. Then, on Oct. 5, 2018, she became just the fourth active head coach to gain entry into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame.

Born in Potomac, Md., Sampras Webster moved to the Los Angeles area as a child and graduated from Palos Verdes High School. A top-three player in Southern California and among the top 10 in the country as a junior, Sampras Webster claimed the CIF doubles title as a freshman and the singles title as a senior in 1987. She capped her high school career by being named her school's Athlete of the Year.

The second-oldest of four children of Sam and Georgia Sampras, Stella considers the support of her entire family most significant. Younger brother Pete demonstrated his level of support for Stella and the Bruin program when he personally endowed a scholarship and assisted with the important fund-raising effort in Stella's first fall at the helm. Pete won a record 14 Grand Slam singles titles during his playing days, including seven Wimbledon championships.

Sampras Webster and her husband, Steve, were married on January 3, 2002 in Dana Point, Calif. They are the proud parents of twin girls Sophia and Savannah.

RANCE BROWN

Associate Head Coach
21st Season

Associate Head Coach Rance Brown is in his 21st season on the UCLA women's tennis coaching staff. He served as an assistant to Bill Zaima during the 1996 season, and has been Stella Sampras Webster's top assistant for 20 seasons. The 2000 and 2012 ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year, Brown was promoted to the position of associate head coach effective at the beginning of the 2008-09 season.

During Brown's tenure in Westwood, UCLA has continually been among the top teams in the nation. In addition to NCAA titles in 2008 and 2014, the Bruins have finished runner-up at the NCAA Championships four times (2004, 2007, 2012 and 2015). The Bruins have made the NCAA Tournament in each of his 20 seasons as an assistant. Brown has especially excelled in the area of recruiting, bringing in a number of highly-ranked junior players to the program over the years. He was also instrumental in the success of NCAA singles champion Keri Phebus, who became the first women's tennis player inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007. Brown has been named the ITA Southwest Region Assistant Coach of the Year on five occasions (1999, 2000, 2007, 2010 and 2012). A total of 25 All-American Bruins have been named over the course of his tenure.

Brown spent the summer of 2008 as the coach of the USTA Summer Collegiate Team, traveling to professional tournaments with some of the top women's college players in the nation. He also guided USA Team's quartet of Bruins at the 2015 Summer Universiade (World University Games) in Gwangju, South Korea.

In addition to his efforts with the UCLA program, Brown was among the first graduating classes of the USTA High Performance Coaches' Program. He also worked at the Riviera Country Club, heading up the club's Elite Junior Tennis Program along with professional coach Erik Kortland. Prior to his appointment at Riviera, Brown headed up one of the most successful junior tennis programs in the country, serving as Director of Tennis at the Newport Beach Marriott Hotel and Tennis Club in Orange County for more than 20 years.

Brown received his Associate of Arts degree from Golden West Junior College, where he played for two years. He helped lead the team to two conference team titles and notched one conference doubles title. He played the 1981 season at Long Beach State and competed professionally at Challenger Level tournaments before devoting his time to coaching.



GIANCARLO "GC" CAVA

Volunteer Assistant Coach
Fifth Season

Giancarlo "GC" Cava is in his fifth season as volunteer assistant coach for UCLA women's tennis. Cava replaced alumna Laura Gordon in 2014 and the Bruins have reached the second round of the NCAA Championships each year since.

Cava's first dual-match season came in 2015 and his appointment paid immediate dividends. Coming off its 2014 NCAA title, UCLA again reached the championship match in 2015 before falling short. Over his time on staff, the Bruins have put together a 75-27 (.735) overall record and a 30-9 (.769) conference mark. Honda Award winner Robin Anderson and Jennifer Brady each played one year under Cava, while Catherine Harrison and Kyle McPhillips are among others who have thrived under his tutelage.

Immediately after his own collegiate career ended, Cava became a teaching professional at Riviera Country Club, a role that lasted until 2018—a span of 12 years. From 2008-2012, he also served as the head pro of Riviera's junior program, leading summer camps and supervising the junior program during the school year.

Cava played collegiately from 2003-06 at UC Riverside, where he manned Court 6 to the tune of three singles wins and also came out on top of four doubles decisions in his debut season. It was in the 2005-06 campaign that his tennis career took a turn. Cava assumed a role of player-coach, oftentimes guiding his teammates in singles play after participating in doubles. The Highlanders saw dramatic improvement to their team's on-court performance during Cava's time on campus, winning eight more matches in 2005-06 than they did in 2003-04.

A Southern California native, Cava is an avid CrossFit athlete and trainer.
