Bruins topped CSUN 4-3 in February to break three-game skid against Matadors

UCLA RETURNS TO JACKIE ROBINSON STADIUM TO HOST CSUN

No. 1 UCLA (20-5) returns to Jackie Robinson Stadium on Tuesday night to host Big West-member CSUN (12-16) for a 6:00 p.m. midweek contest. The Bruins defeated the Matadors 4-3 earlier this season in Northridge. Tuesday's game is the lone home contest for UCLA in a two-week stretch; the Bruins won a series at USC last weekend and are on the road at No. 2 Stanford this upcoming weekend. THE STORY SO FAR

UCLA is 20-5 to start the 2019 campaign, winning all six of its weekend series, taking two of three in the Dodger Stadium College Baseball Classic, and posting midweek wins home-and-away against LMU and on the road at CSUN and Long Beach State. At 20-5, UCLA is off to its second-best 25-game start of the John Savage era (since 2005), trailing only the 2010 club that went 23-2 out of the gate.

BRUINS REMAIN ATOP NATIONAL RANKINGS

After winning the series over crosstown rival USC over the weekend, UCLA remained atop nearly every major national poll for the third consecutive week. On Monday, the Bruins were tabbed No. 1 in the nation by D1Baseball, Baseball America, ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, the NCBWA, and Perfect Game. The only poll that doesn't have the Bruins on top, Collegiate Baseball, has them at No. 3. UCLA jumped to No. 1 in the country two weeks ago after taking two of three from defending national champion Oregon State, the first time the Bruins had been atop the rankings since the final polls of the 2013 season. CSUN is unranked in all polls, though upcoming opponent Stanford is ranked No. 2 in the country.

THE WEEK IN REVIEW

Over the last week, UCLA defeated LMU in a road midweek and then took two of three from crosstown rival USC in a weekend Pac-12 series at Dedeaux Field.

- Last Tuesday night, UCLA used a six-run first inning to defeat LMU by a score of 9-4. Jake Pries had the biggest blow of the rally, hitting a grand slam over the blue monster in left field with nobody out. The Bruins strung together three singles later in the inning to plate another pair. UCLA's bullpen allowed one earned over 4 1/3 innings to help make that cushion hold up. UCLA's six-spot represented the highest-scoring first inning for the program this year and the second-highest scoring inning overall (seven runs, bottom 7 vs. St. John's on Feb. 17).
- UCLA dropped the series opener against USC by a score of 7-2. The Trojans opened up a 5-0 lead by the end of the fifth inning, and went on to score in each of the odd-numbered innings. Michael Togli singled in Chase Strump to break up the shutout in the sixth inning, and then Jack Filby provided an RBI single up the middle in the top of the ninth in his first-ever collegiate plate appearance. Felix Rubi pitched a scoreless eighth in his Division I debut for UCLA.
- The Bruins rebounded for a resounding 7-1 win on Saturday. Jack Ralston was flat-out dominant on the mound for UCLA, holding the Trojans off the board until Jamal O'Guinn hit a solo homer with two outs in the bottom of the ninth. Before that roundtripper, no USC player had advanced past first base all day. Ralston would end up one out short of the complete game, as Kyle Mora came in to finish the job. Jake Pries hit a three-run homer in the top of the first to provide all the offense UCLA would need, but the Bruins put up another three-spot in the third after stringing together four straight hits capped off by a two-run double from Michael Togli.
- UCLA captured the series with a 9-2 rubber match win. After USC tied it 2-2 in the bottom of the second, the Bruins would go on to score seven unanswered runs. Jarron Silva hit his first collegiate home run and had a career-high four RBIs to lead the Bruin offense. Michael Togli also homered and had a season-high three hits. After a shaky first couple innings, Ryan Garcia and the UCLA bullpen shut out USC for seven straight innings to close the game.
- UCLA out-scored USC 16-3 over the final two games of the series and 18-10 overall.

UCLA PITCHING GETTING IT DONE

UCLA's pitching has been on fire in 2019, as the Bruin staff has produced some of the best numbers in the nation. The Bruins are among the NCAA leaders in ERA (2.60, fourth), hits allowed per nine innings (6.20, second), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.07, 11th). UCLA has allowed one earned run or fewer in 12 of its 25 games this season.

WHIP IT GOOD

At 1.06, UCLA enters the weekend with the lowest WHIP (walks and hits per inning pitched) of any team in the country. The Bruins have posted a sub-1.00 WHIP 13 times in 25 games, including in 10 of the first 11 games of the year. Nate Hadley (0.86) and Ryan Garcia (0.95) have the two-lowest individual WHIPs on the club.

- This offseason, UCLA alums Dave Roberts (Los Angeles Dodgers) and Torey Lovullo (Arizona Diamondbacks) both inked extensions to remain the managers of their respective clubs. Roberts has led the Dodgers to the NL pennant in each of the past two seasons.
- Trevor Bauer struck out nine and allowed just one hit over seven innings in his first start of the 2019 season, helping Cleveland to a 2-1 win at Minnesota.
- Four Bruins made Opening Day rosters in 2019: Bauer, Gerrit Cole (Houston), Brandon Crawford (San Francisco), and Matt Grace (Washington). Pat Valaika was called up by the Rockies shortly after Opening Day.
- Former Bruin infielder Chase Utley announced his retirement from baseball after the 2018 MLB season. He finished with a .275/.358/.465 slash line, 259 home runs, and 1,885 hits in a 16-year career with the Philadelphia Phillies and Los Angeles Dodgers.

SAVAGE WINS 500TH AT UCLA

UCLA's victory over Oregon State on Mar. 15 represented the 500th as head coach at UCLA for John Savage, making him just the third bench boss in program history to reach that milestone. He is within striking distance of another milestone, as he needs just five more wins to reach 600 overall in his career.

RUN PRODUCERS

After going 21 straight games without an individual four-RBI performance to start the year, UCLA received two last week. First, Jake Pries hit a first-inning grand slam to help UCLA to a 9-4 win over Loyola Marymount. Then on Sunday, Jarron Silva doubled his previous career-best with a four-RBI day, hitting a two-run homer in the second and then lining a bases-loaded double to bring in another pair in the ninth.

TOGLIA TEEING OFF

After a bit of a slow start to the season - he was batting .207 through the team's first 15 games - junior first baseman Michael Toglia is starting to heat up with the bat, collecting hits in six straight and nine of his last 10 games. That stretch includes a season-high three-hit performance on Sunday against USC featuring a home run over the right field scoreboard at Dedeaux Field. In his current six-game hitting streak, he's 10-24 (.417) with four extra-base hits and nine RBIs. Toglia currently leads the Bruins in RBIs (21) and is second in extra-base hits (11).

SHUTTING THEM OUT

The 8-0 blanking of Oregon State on Mar. 15 was UCLA's sixth shutout of the season, moving them into a tie for the national lead (Tennessee, Auburn). UCLA recorded a shutout in its first four weekend series - once in the opener, twice in the middle game, and once in the finale. The Bruins also have shutouts in two of their four midweek games.

MAKING THE NECESSARY SACRIFICES

Small ball has treated the Bruins well so far in 2019, as UCLA ranks 11th in the country with 22 sac bunts. Will McInerney has laid it down nine times, pacing the league and ranking second nationally.

GRAB SOME PINE

The UCLA pitching staff has proven adept at punching out batters this year, leading the Pac-12 and ranking 11th in the nation with 10.3 strikeouts per nine innings. Last weekend was a rarity for the Bruins, who picked up just 15 strikeouts against the Trojans. UCLA had at least 28 strikeouts in each prior weekend this year and as many as 41 (against St. John's). UCLA has three of the top-10 leaders in strikeouts in the Pac-12, including Zach Pettway (51, second), Kyle Mora (35, T-10th), and Jack Ralston (35, T-10th).

STRONACH MAKING THE MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY

Junior Jack Stronach has been taking advantage of an uptick in playing time. Over the last 10 games, all in the cleanup or No. 5 spot in the lineup, Stronach has crafted a 16-36 line (.444) with two home runs, 10 RBIs, and seven runs scored. He drove in the game-winning run in two of three games in the Arizona series, doubling in a pair in the fourth inning on Friday and hitting a two-run homer off the right field foul pole in the eighth to break a 1-1 tie on Sunday. He was a Pac-12 Player of the Week nominee after both the Oregon State and Arizona series.

HOT AT HOME

UCLA has won 12 of 15 home games so far this year, right in line with the program's .716 winning percentage (53-21) at Jackie Robinson Stadium since the start of the 2017 season. The Bruins have won 13 consecutive series - including seven Pac-12 sets - on their home field dating back to April 21-23, 2017 (Oregon State).

MIDWEEK NOTES

UCLA is 4-0 in midweeks this year, including a 3-0 mark on the road. Garrett Mitchell (.412/.474/.588), Noah Cardenas (.400/.556/.400), and Ryan Kreidler (.313/.556/.500) have been especially hot at the plate against midweek opponents. UCLA has shown up on the mound for its Tuesday games, recording a team 1.75 ERA compared to a 4.37 clip from its opponents. The Bruins are staying local for their entire midweek slate in 2019, as their furthest opponent is UC Irvine (52 miles).

PUTTING DOWN ROOTS

UCLA didn't leave Los Angeles County for the entire month of March, as the team's only road games were at LBSU, LMU, and USC. After traveling to Palo Alto this weekend, the Bruins stay in Southern California for the rest of April, traveling for just two road contests (at Cal State Fullerton and at Pepperdine).

MITCHELL STEPPING UP

One of UCLA's more consistent hitters early on in the year, sophomore right fielder Garrett Mitchell has stepped it up another level since moving to the leadoff spot. In 12 games since going atop the lineup, he's gone 17-50 (.340) while reaching base safely in all but one contest. His nine doubles and 12 extra-base hits this season are both team highs.

SEEING TRIPLE

The Bruins have legged out 12 triples already this season, a figure which ranks 12th nationally and second in the Pac-12. Five separate Bruins have multiple three-baggers, led by Matt McLain's three.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

UCLA has proven itself undeterred when facing a deficit, as the Bruins are 9-3 this year in games where the opponent scores first. Of those 12 games, the Bruins fought back to tie or take the lead in all but two.

SCOUTING THE MATADORS

CSUN is 12-16 overall this season and 0-3 in Big West play, most recently coming off a sweep at Cal Poly. The Matadors rank in the bottom half of their league in scoring (5.0 runs per game) while they are fifth in Team ERA (4.41). Kyle Barret (.333/.429/.537) has been their top hitter. CSUN has clubbed 25 home runs as a team, good for top-50 in the nation. Projected starter Cassius Hamm is 2-1 on the year with a 5.73 ERA. He's making just his second start of the year, both against the Bruins.

LAST TIME OUT AGAINST CSUN

UCLA eked out a 4-3 win against CSUN at Matador Field on Feb. 26 of this year, taking advantage of a late throwing error to plate the game-winning run as Matt McLain scored all the way from second, moving up 90 feet on a wild pitch and then advancing home on the same play after a throw down to second base caromed off Garrett Mitchell and into center field. With a one-run lead, Kyle Mora and Holden Powell shut the door to preserve the 4-3 win. Nick Nastrini allowed three hits over five shutout innings for UCLA, while McLain (2-4, two RBIs) and Ryan Kreidler (2-4, RBI) had solid days with the bat.

DON'T MESS WITH THE BULL(PEN)

UCLA's bullpen has been one of the team's strongest assets all season. Through 86.2 innings, Bruin relievers have combined to record a 2.28 ERA with strong peripherals including 12.0 K/9 and 5.9 hits per nine innings ratios. Junior Kyle Mora leads the nation in appearances with 21, and he has struck out 35 batters to this point in the season, good for 10th in the Pac-12. Closer Holden Powell is pacing the Pac-12 in both saves (seven) and games finished (16). Nate Hadley (4-0, 1.93 ERA) and Jack Filby (2-0, 0.93 ERA) have been excellent out of the pen as well.

TAKE ME OUT TO THE BALLGAME

Something about the seventh inning gives the Bruins an extra pep in their step. They are outscoring their opponents 34-6 in the seventh inning for the season, a plus-28 run differential, over half of the team's plus-48 overall differential. The Bruins have scored in the seventh inning in 13 of their 25 games, more than any other single inning.

BRUINS PICKED TO WIN PAC-12 IN PRESEASON COACHES POLL

In a vote of all 11 Pac-12 coaches, the Bruins were picked as the favorites to win the league in 2019. UCLA received eight of 11 first place votes and a league-high 97 points. 2015 was the last time that UCLA was picked to finish first in the Preseason Coaches Poll, which was also the last time that UCLA won the league. Stanford (two first place votes, 90 points) and Oregon St. (one first place vote, 85 points) also received first place votes. They were followed in succession by Arizona (67), Washington (60), Arizona State (59), Oregon (49), California (37), USC (32), Washington State (15), and Utah (14).

STRUMPF NAMED A UNANIMOUS FIRST TEAM PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

UCLA junior Chase Strumpf was the First Team second baseman on every Preseason All-America team released this offseason, as he was honored by Baseball America, D1Baseball, Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA, and Perfect Game. He was one of just four players nationwide to gain consensus First Team status, joining catcher Adley Rutschman (Oregon State), first baseman Andrew Vaughn (Cal), and third baseman Josh Jung (Texas Tech). Strumpf slashed .363/.475/.633 last year with 12 home runs and 53 RBIs en route to All-America and Dick Howser Award semifinalist honors.

TOGLIA, YDENS ALSO PICK UP ALL-AMERICAN ACCLAIM

Strumpf wasn't the only Bruin to get preseason publicity, as both Michael Togli and Jeremy Ydens were named Preseason All-Americans. Togli was a Second Teamer in D1Baseball and a Third Team choice in Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA, and Perfect Game, while Ydens was a Second Team outfielder per Collegiate Baseball. Togli (.336 average, 11 home runs) and Ydens (.350 average, 28 extra-base hits) were key middle-of-the-order bats for the Bruins last year.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN

UCLA's newest class of newcomers was ranked as high as No. 4 in the country (D1Baseball). The Bruins' new class was the highest-ranked in the Pac-12 and in the western half of the country. UCLA has turned in a top-25 recruiting class for five consecutive seasons, while the Bruins' No. 4 ranking is the highest for the program since 2015. A trio of frosh players were selected to D1Baseball's Top-100 Impact Freshmen List, including list-topper Matt McLain, catcher Noah Cardenas (No. 81), and right-handed pitcher Sean Mullen (No. 89).

MCLAIN CHOOSES UCLA

The Bruins' freshman class is highlighted by Tustin, Calif. native Matt McLain, who opted to attend UCLA after being drafted in the first round (25th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Arizona Diamondbacks. McLain is the second first-round draft pick out of high school to attend UCLA, following in the footsteps of Gerrit Cole (2008). Other high draft choices to turn down MLB overtures include Troy Glaus (37th overall, 1994) and Chase Utley (76th overall, 1997).

UCLA IN THE POSITIONAL POWER RANKINGS

UCLA was well-represented in the D1Baseball.com positional power rankings, published just before the start of the season. Chase Strumpf was the Bruins' top player, taking the No. 1 spot at second base. The Bruins' other starting infielders all made it as well: Michael Togli was the No. 3 first baseman, Kevin Kendall was the No. 21 shortstop, and Ryan Kreidler was No. 29 at third base. All three of the Bruins' starting outfielders made the power rankings too: Jeremy Ydens (No. 15), Matt McLain (No. 37), and Garrett Mitchell (No. 62). A pair of Bruin starting pitchers were recognized (Ryan Garcia, No. 20 and Zach Pettway, No. 100) while Holden Powell (No. 35) made the relievers list.

DYNAMIC DUO NAMED TO GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD WATCH LIST

UCLA's Chase Strumpf and Michael Togli were both named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List prior to the new season. In 2018, Strumpf and Togli were the most prolific Bruin teammates of the last 20 years. The right-side of the UCLA infield became the first Bruin duo since 2007 to hit double-digit home runs in the same season when Cody Decker (14) and Gabe Cohen (10) accomplished the feat. Strumpf and Togli are just the fourth and fifth Bruins since 2001 with 50-plus RBIs and 10-plus home runs in the same season. The pair also became the first UCLA teammates since 2008 to each drive in over 50 runs in the same season (Casey Haerther, 52 and Brandon Crawford, 51).

POWELL NAMED TO STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

UCLA sophomore righty Holden Powell was named to the 75-man Stopper of the Year Watch List by the NCBWA. First awarded in 2005, the Stopper of the Year is handed out to college baseball's top reliever annually. Former Bruin closer David Berg is the lone pitcher ever to win the award multiple times.

NOTES ON UCLA HEAD COACH JOHN SAVAGE

• Savage helped UCLA reach college baseball's pinnacle in 2013, as the Bruins won their first-ever NCAA baseball title. Under his guidance, UCLA has advanced to the postseason in nine of the last 13 seasons, hosting an NCAA Regional in five of the last eight, including four-straight from 2010 through 2013.

• In the summer of 2017, Savage was the manager of the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team after being an assistant coach in 2000. He led the U.S. to a 15-5 record over the summer, including 11-4 during international play. The United States won all three international series it competed in, including going 4-0 against Chinese Taipei and 3-2 versus both Cuba and Japan. The win over Cuba marked the third-straight series win, while also improving to 23-18 in 41 all-time series against Japan.

• 12 of his 14 recruiting classes have been nationally ranked in the top-25 by Baseball America. UCLA's incoming class in the fall of 2012 was rated No. 2, nationally, by Baseball America, the highest-such ranking of any of Savage's classes. UCLA's incoming group in the fall of 2006 was ranked No. 5, followed by No. 13 (fall 2007), No. 7 (fall 2008), No. 7 (fall 2009), No. 19 (fall 2010), No. 3 (fall 2011), No. 2 (fall 2012), No. 7 (fall 2014), No. 3 (fall 2015), No. 16 (fall 2016) No. 16 (fall 2017), and No. 4 (fall 2018).

• Savage was named the 2013 National Coach of the Year by Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) and Perfect Game USA. His work with UCLA's pitching staff that season was no more evident than with the success of starting pitchers Adam Plutko, Nick Vander Tuig and Grant Watson. Plutko and Vander Tuig capped their UCLA careers in 2013 as the winningest pitching tandem in school history (56 total wins in three seasons).

• Under Savage's guidance, UC Irvine posted a 88-84-1 overall record and the Anteaters broke through with an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2004. That season, UC Irvine went 34-23-1 and competed at the NCAA Notre Dame Regional. The Anteaters earned their highest national ranking at the time, climbing to the No. 7 spot in Collegiate Baseball's weekly rankings in April 2004. At season's end, Savage was tabbed a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors by CollegeBaseballInsider.com.

• As pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at USC from 1997-2000, Savage helped the Trojans produce consecutive Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year selections in Seth Etherton, Rik Currier and eventual American League Cy Young Award winner Barry Zito. Also under Savage's mentorship was former Chicago Cubs right-hander Mark Prior. As the Trojans' recruiting coordinator, Savage helped facilitate the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1999-2000, as ranked by Collegiate Baseball. He was honored as Collegiate Baseball's Assistant Coach of the Year in 1998, following the Trojans' run to the College World Series title. USC advanced to the NCAA Super Regional in 1999 and back to the College World Series in 2000.

John Savage is in his 18th season as a head coach in 2019. He has guided UCLA to three College World Series appearances, including winning the program's first national championship in 2013.

ELITE COMPANY

John Savage is one of just six head coaches in college baseball history to have guided his team to a College World Series title, produced the first overall pick in the MLB Draft (Gerrit Cole, 2011), and coached at least one Golden Spikes Award winner (Trevor Bauer, 2011). Also included in that illustrious group are former head coaches Skip Bertman (LSU) and Jim Brock (Arizona State) and Augie Garrido (Cal State Fullerton, Texas) and current head coaches Tim Corbin (Vanderbilt) and Jim Morris (Miami).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

In 10 previous trips to the postseason at UCLA, Savage has compiled a 37-20 record (.649 winning percentage), recording the most postseason victories of any head coach in program history.

With Savage at the program's helm, UCLA advanced to the College World Series in 2010, 2012, and 2013, and reached the best-of-three championship series in 2010 and 2013. UCLA defeated Mississippi State, two games to none, at the 2013 College World Series. In 2010, the Bruins advanced to the championship series for the first time in school history, falling two games to none to South Carolina.

BRUIINS IN THE PROS

Savage's strong work with UCLA's program has been equally evident in player development and the MLB Draft. Over his 14 seasons in Westwood, UCLA has produced 92 draft selections with 33 players being drafted within the first 10 rounds. In addition, he has coached 18 players at UCLA that have competed in the major leagues.
