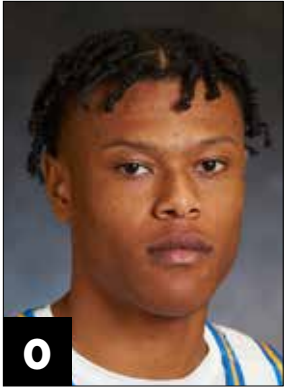

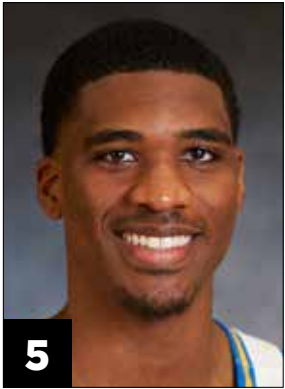

ABOUT THE BRUINS

The Bruins return eight of the team's 10 primary contributors from 2019-20, a season that prematurely concluded with UCLA having won 11 of its last 14 games. UCLA's starting lineup from the second half of that season has returned for the 2020-21 campaign – senior Chris Smith, juniors Jalen Hill and David Singleton, and sophomores Tyger Campbell and Jaime Jaquez Jr.

In addition to those five players, the Bruins have brought back juniors Jules Bernard and Cody Riley, sophomore Jake Kyman and redshirt sophomore Kenneth Nwuba, who enters his third season in Westwood. UCLA has added sophomore Johnny Juzang (transferred from Kentucky and does not have to sit out) and freshman Jaylen Clark.

Under the direction of second-year UCLA head coach Mick Cronin, the Bruins are returning 88.8 percent of its total scoring output from last season and 87.2 percent of its rebounding totals. In addition, 91.3 percent of the Bruins' total assist production from last year has returned.

Smith, a senior 6-foot-9 guard entering his fourth year in Westwood, emerged as the Bruins' most effective scorer last season. He finished the year as a first-team All-Pac-12 performer (13.1 ppg, 5.4 rpg) and was named the Pac-12's Most Improved Player of the Year. Heading into the 2020-21 campaign, Smith has been penciled in on numerous preseason All-Pac-12 teams from a variety of national media outlets. Smith's shooting percentages noticeably improved in 2019-20 – he shot 34 percent from 3-point territory after having made just under 25 percent of his 3-point attempts in his first two seasons (66 games).

UCLA's frontcourt will likely be anchored by veterans Jalen Hill (6-foot-10) and Cody Riley (6-foot-9). The duo of juniors will also rely on Kenneth Nwuba to shoulder the load in the paint. Hill and Riley have played vital roles for UCLA the past two seasons, competing in 63 games and 61 games, respectively. Last season, Hill scored in double figures in 10 contests and registered four double-doubles. Riley played in all 31 games as a sophomore, scoring at least 10 points in 14 games (and in seven of the team's final nine games). As a true freshman in 2018-19, Nwuba saw limited action in 17 games.

Including the versatile Smith, UCLA's backcourt has multiple options. Jaquez Jr. and Kyman, both standing at 6-foot-6, proved themselves as a freshman last season and showed an ability to excel as mid-range scoring options and from 3-point territory. Jaquez Jr. led UCLA's team in minutes per game in 18 Pac-12 games. He finished the year having averaged 8.9 points and 4.8 rebounds per game. Kyman concluded his first college season with the team's highest 3-point percentage (40.3%), connecting on 31 of 77 shots from 3-point range.

Campbell started all 31 games as a redshirt freshman one year ago, recording as many as 14 assists in one game (at home, versus Arizona State) and scoring as many as 22 points in a critical early February win over Utah. In fact, the 5-foot-11 floor general scored in double figures in seven of UCLA's final 10 games. He ranked first in the Pac-12 in assist-turnover ratio (2.8) and was third in the league in assists per game (5.0).

Entering their third season at UCLA, Singleton and Bernard both have made significant contributions the past two years. Last season, Singleton emerged in the team's starting lineup by mid-January and concluded his sophomore season having made a team-high 34 shots from 3-point territory (37.0%). His minutes significantly rose in the second half of the season and he continued to make the most of his opportunities. Bernard became one of UCLA's most effective on-ball defenders and scored in double figures in six games. He helped power UCLA past Utah, 69-58, in a late February road win, scoring 14 of his team-leading 16 points before halftime.

Juzang transferred to UCLA in the spring and secured a waiver from the NCAA, by which he will be able to play immediately. A former standout at nearby Harvard-Westlake School, Juzang played in 28 games (two starts) at the University of Kentucky last season. The 6-foot-6 guard twice scored in double figures as a freshman, with both of those performances coming on the road in SEC action (at Tennessee and at Florida).

Junior Russell Stong, who played at Crespi High School, has begun his third season at UCLA. He saw action in five games last season and could push for more playing time in 2020-21.

Clark and 6-foot-7 forward Logan Cremonesi enter the 2020-21 campaign as UCLA's two incoming freshmen. Clark grew up Riverside, Calif., and spent his senior year at Etiwanda High School (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.). He secured All-CIF Southern Section Open Division honors as a senior at Etiwanda and as a junior at Centennial High School (Corona, Calif.). The 6-foot-5 guard averaged 18.5 points and 6.4 rebounds as a senior. Cremonesi was a varsity letterwinner at Mater Dei High School the past three seasons and will add depth in UCLA's frontcourt.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to Pauley Pavilion's press seating and media room is by credential only. All credential requests should be made through UCLA's credential website at least three days in advance of the game. Credential requests for road games should be made, via email, with Alex Timiraos. Additional information about media policies are available by visiting www.uclabruins.com/media.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP

Credentials can be claimed on the day of the game at Pauley Pavilion. Media members should consult with Alex Timiraos from the Athletic Communications Office in advance, for credential pickup. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, credential pickup logistics have changed from previous men's basketball seasons.

MEDIA PARKING

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, UCLA's campus is closed to the general public. A limited number of parking passes will be available (sent to individuals digitally) for parking Lot 7 and Lot 8. Lot 7 is located underground, north of Pauley Pavilion. Lot 8 sits just south of Pauley Pavilion and adjacent Spaulding Field. Both structures can be accessed off the 405 freeway - Lot 7, use the Sunset Blvd. exit (and continue east), and Lot 8, use the Wilshire Blvd. exit (and proceed east). For Lot 8, take Wilshire Blvd. and turn left to Westwood Blvd. toward UCLA's campus.

MEDIA ENTRANCE/SEATING

A press pass enables entrance at Pauley Pavilion's Northwest section, located across from the intramural field. Seats for the media are located in the upper level in Section 215 (along the arena's south side). Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, members of the media are encouraged to remain in Section 215 to work. The Dick Enberg Media Room will not be serving as a regular media hospitality location in 2020-21.

MEDIA SERVICES

Media are encouraged to access all in-game statistics online. UCLA's Athletic Communications Office and the Pac-12 Conference utilizes the StatBroadcast.com website (available by visiting uclabruins.com). For special arrangements regarding an Ethernet connection or phone line, media members should contact Alex Timiraos in advance (email, atimiraos@athletics.ucla.edu).

PHOTOGRAPHY

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Athletic Communications Office is unable to accommodate as many photographers as in past seasons. Priority will be granted to media outlets working on assignment for a major news-gathering organization or wire service. UCLA will also help supply photos with one pool photographer. Photo credentials should be ordered in the same manner as media credentials. Freelance photographers will not be credentialed. Photos of UCLA Athletics events and of student-athletes may not be sold or used for personal promotion. Photographers must work from designated locations in the arena. Photo passes (and arm bands) should be worn in plain sight at all times.

POST-GAME PROCEDURE

Following a cooling-off period, head coach Mick Cronin and UCLA student-athletes will be available for interviews via Zoom. UCLA's locker room is closed to the media. The visiting team will conduct a separate postgame press conference via Zoom.

WEEKDAY INTERVIEWS

Requests for coach and player interviews should be made to Alex Timiraos in the Athletic Communications Office. Please give at least 48 hours notice. During the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, all interviews are being conducted either via

Zoom or over the phone. Due to physical distancing policies, in-person interviews are currently on pause. Contact Alex Timiraos in the Athletic Communications Office for the team's weekly "Zoom" media availability schedule.

PRACTICE

The team typically practices in the Mo Ostin Basketball Center. UCLA's practices are closed to the media and public.

DIRECTIONS

Directions to UCLA and Pauley Pavilion: From Los Angeles International Airport, take Century Blvd. east to the San Diego Freeway (405). Take the 405 north to Wilshire Blvd. (approx. 12 miles). Continue east on Wilshire, make a left on Westwood Blvd. Continue north along Westwood toward campus. Parking passes can only be obtained through the UCLA Athletic Communications office (digital format).

UCLA BASKETBALL ON TELEVISION, RADIO

For the 13th straight season, UCLA men's basketball games will be produced by the UCLA Sports Network from Learfield IMG College, with AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Los Angeles serving as the flagship station for the network.

The 2020-21 campaign will mark the 24th year of UCLA's partnership with AM 570 Fox Sports LA owner iHeartMedia (formerly Clear Channel Communications). All men's basketball games will be broadcast on KLAC (AM 570) or one of its sister iHeartMedia stations. UCLA and Learfield IMG College have agreed to simulcast a significant number of men's basketball games on 97.3 THE FAN in San Diego. The primary sister station in the greater Los Angeles area is AM 1150 (KEIB).

UCLA's 2020-21 schedule will be televised live on a variety of broadcast networks. While the team's schedule remains in flux, the Bruins anticipate having their basketball games televised on the ESPN family of networks, FOX Sports, CBS and Pac-12 Networks. CBS will televise the Bruins' matchup against Kentucky in Cleveland, slated for Saturday, Dec. 19 (as part of the CBS Sports Classic).

Josh Lewin enters his fifth season as the play-by-play voice for the UCLA men's basketball and football teams. In addition to calling UCLA games, he recently handled broadcasting duties for a select number of Boston Red Sox games. Prior to his work with Boston, Lewin spent seven seasons as a play-by-play voice for the New York Mets. He served as the voice of the San Diego Chargers for 12 seasons (2005-17), before the team relocated to Los Angeles. Lewin has over two decades of experience calling NFL, MLB, NHL and NCAA football and basketball contests.

Tracy Murray begins his 12th season as a radio analyst. Murray, who played at UCLA (1990-92) before enjoying a 12-year NBA career, spent the 2015-16 season as a shooting coach for the Los Angeles Lakers. Previously, he served as a radio analyst with UCLA from 2008-15. Murray ranks 10th on UCLA's all-time scoring list with 1,792 career points in 98 games.
