## NOTES ABOUT THE BRUINS, ENTERING THE 2022-23 SEASON

### KEY RETURNERS IN 2022-23

• The Bruins are set to return two of their five starters from last season in redshirt senior **Tyger Campbell** and senior **Jaime Jaquez Jr.** Both players have been starters for UCLA in 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22. In addition, fifth-year senior **David Singleton**, redshirt senior **Kenneth Nwuba** and junior **Jaylen Clark** are back with UCLA this fall.

• UCLA has added six freshmen in the summer of 2022, including a trio of top-50-rated incoming athletes in guards **Amari Bailey** and **Dylan Andrews** and forward **Adem Bona**. Bailey (ranked No. 5 by ESPN.com) and Bona (ranked No. 16 by ESPN.com) were both honored as 2022 McDonald's All-Americans at the conclusion of their senior years of high school. Andrews was ranked No. 40 by 247Sports.com and No. 44 by ESPN.com. The Bruins signed 6-foot-6, 200-pound swingman **Abramo Canka** from Italy in the summer of 2022. Canka (pronounced ZAHN-kuh) is expected to immediately contribute in the fall. Also returning for UCLA in 2022-23 are a pair of players who missed last season with knee injuries, redshirt freshman **Mac Etienne** (6-foot-10, forward) and redshirt freshman **Will McClendon** (6-foot-3, guard). UCLA's two other incoming freshmen are **Evan Manjikian** (6-foot-8, forward) and **Jack Seidler** (6-foot-4, guard).

• **Tyger Campbell**, a 5-foot-11 redshirt senior, has totaled 469 career assists in three seasons on the court. His career assist total ranks No. 10 in school history. Aaron Holiday currently occupies the No. 9 slot on that list with 477 assists. In addition, Campbell has averaged 4.89 assists in 96 career games, the sixth-highest assists-per-game average in school history (with a minimum of 60 games played to qualify). Campbell was one of five finalists last season for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award. He has twice earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors (2020-21 and 2021-22).

• Campbell averaged 11.9 points, 2.5 rebounds and a team-best 4.3 assists in 33 contests (33 starts) last season. He secured first-team All-Pac-12 honors and second-team NABC All-District 19 acclaim. Campbell had career-best shooting percentages in multiple categories – overall percentage (44.4%), 3-point percentage (41.0%) and at the free throw line (83.8%). He ranked No. 1 in the Pac-12 in assist-turnover ratio (3.2), No. 3 in assists per game (4.3), No. 3 in free throw percentage (83.8%) and No. 5 in 3-point shooting percentage (41.0%). He finished the 2021-22 season ranking No. 6 in the country in assist-turnover ratio (3.2). In each of his three seasons on the court, Campbell has finished the year ranking No. 3 in the Pac-12 in assists per game (5.0 apg in 2019-20, 4.3 apg in 2020-21 and 4.3 apg in 2021-22).

• **Jaime Jaquez Jr.**, a 6-foot-7 senior, has played in 97 of UCLA's 98 games since the start of the 2019-20 season. As a junior in 2021-22, Jaquez Jr. averaged 13.9 points and a team-leading 5.7 rebounds per contest. He secured first-team All-Pac-12 honors and was one of five players named to the Pac-12 Conference's All-Defensive Team (along with teammates Jaylen Clark and Myles Johnson). He has twice been named to the Pac-12's All-Defensive Team (2020-21 and 2021-22). In addition, he captured second-team NABC All-District 19 acclaim last season.

• Through 97 career games at UCLA, Jaquez Jr. has started 89 contests. He has scored at least 10 points in 60 games and has registered at least 10 rebounds in 13 contests. Jaquez Jr. has totaled nine career double-doubles (six as a junior, one as a sophomore and two as a freshman). He has tallied at least one steal in 73 of 97 career games. Jaquez Jr. will enter his senior season having already scored 1,143 career points, which ranks No. 49 on UCLA's all-time scoring list. He finished the Bruins' 2021-22 season having averaged 16.7 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.8 assists through six postseason games (three in the Pac-12 Tournament, three in the NCAA Tournament).

• Campbell and Jaquez Jr. secured All-Pac-12 honors the past two years. Campbell was a first-team selection in 2020-21 (sophomore) and 2021-22 (junior), while Jaquez Jr. earned second-team honors in 2020-21 (sophomore) and first-team acclaim in 2021-22 (junior). They are in line to be UCLA's first players since Darren Collison (2006-09) to return to school after having twice earned all-league honors. Collison was an All-Pac-10 selection in 2007 (at that time, there was no first or second-team distinction) and was a second-team All-Pac-10 honoree in 2008 as a junior. Prior to Collison, Jason Kapono had been the last Bruin to return to school after having been selected as an all-league pick multiple times, prior to his senior season (Kapono was a four-time All-Pac-10 selection, 2000-03).

• **David Singleton**, a 6-foot-4 guard, returns for his fifth and final season with the Bruins. Singleton has averaged 4.7 points and 1.5 rebounds in 127 career games, while shooting 43.8 percent from beyond the 3-point arc (146-of-333). He currently has totaled the No. 4-best all-time 3-point percentage in program history. Singleton will take advantage of a one-year waiver and play a fifth season at UCLA (as will fifth-year guard **Russell Stong**), as student-athletes who were part of the 2020-21 season during the COVID-19 pandemic were offered one extra year of eligibility. Singleton has scored in double figures in 15 career games. He has registered 114 assists and 46 turnovers, logging an assist-turnover ratio of 2.5, through his collegiate career. He has played in at least 30 games in each of his four seasons in Westwood.

• **Jaylen Clark**, a 6-foot-5 guard, will enter his third season with UCLA's program in 2022-23. Clark, who hails from the Inland Empire of Southern California (raised in Riverside, Calif.), averaged 6.7 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.0 assists in 29 games last season. He shot 50.6 percent from the field and made nearly 56 percent of his 2-point field goal attempts. Clark

was one of three UCLA players (along with Jaime Jaquez Jr. and Myles Johnson) to be named to the five-person Pac-12 All-Defensive Team at the conclusion of the season. Clark scored in double figures in seven games, totaling a career-best 25 points in a victory at home against Washington (Feb. 19, 2022).

• **Kenneth Nwuba**, a 6-foot-10 redshirt senior, has played in 55 games through three seasons on the court at UCLA. Nwuba played in 20 games last season (1.2 points and 0.9 rebounds per game) and competed in 18 games during the 2020-21 season. He took a redshirt year in 2019-20 after having played in 17 games as a true freshman in 2018-19. Nwuba totaled a career-high 20 minutes in UCLA's 51-49 win over Michigan in the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight on March 30, 2021.

### KEY LOSSES

• Six players from the Bruins' 2021-22 roster will not return in 2022-23 – **Jules Bernard** (35 games, 34 starts), **Myles Johnson** (35 games, 15 starts), **Johnny Juzang** (30 games, 29 starts), **Jake Kyman** (23 games), **Cody Riley** (26 games, 20 starts) and **Peyton Watson** (32 games). Bernard, Juzang and Watson all declared for the NBA Draft (and could have returned to college). Kyman transferred out of the program, while Johnson and Riley were seniors in 2021-22 (with a potential fifth year of eligibility remaining) and pursued their own professional paths. Watson was the No. 30 overall selection (first round) in the NBA Draft by the Oklahoma City Thunder on Thursday, June 23, acquired by the Denver Nuggets in a trade. Watson played for Denver in the NBA Summer League (Las Vegas). Juzang (Utah Jazz) and Bernard (Detroit Pistons) signed as free agents before competing in the NBA Summer League (Las Vegas).

### LOOKING BACK AT LAST SEASON

• UCLA went 27-8 in 2021-22, advancing to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 for the second consecutive year. With the NCAA Final Four appearance in 2021, the Bruins secured their first back-to-back Sweet 16 berths since 2014-15. UCLA's 27 victories were the most by a Bruins' team since finishing 31-5 in 2016-17. The Bruins defeated Akron (57-53) and Saint Mary's (72-56) to reach the Sweet 16.

• The Bruins advanced to the Sweet 16 for the fifth time in nine seasons, with the four previous appearances taking place in 2014, 2015, 2017 and 2021. UCLA earned its 22nd trip to the Sweet 16 since the NCAA Tournament expanded its field to 32 teams in 1975. No. 4-seed UCLA lost to No. 8-seed North Carolina, 73-66, in the regional semifinals in Philadelphia (Wells Fargo Arena). North Carolina lost to Kansas in the NCAA title contest.

• UCLA concluded the 2021-22 season having ranked among the top two teams in the Pac-12 in scoring offense and scoring defense. The Bruins led all Pac-12 teams in defense, holding the opposition to 64.5 points per game (UCLA's lowest such average since the 2011-12 season). The Bruins ranked No. 2 in the conference in scoring offense, having registered 75.4 points per game in 35 contests.

• The Bruins went 15-5 in Pac-12 play, finishing in second place for the second time in three seasons (also in 2019-20). UCLA secured the No. 2 seed at the Pac-12 Tournament in Las Vegas in March of 2022, defeating No. 7-seed Washington State (75-65) and No. 3-seed USC (75-68) on back-to-back nights. The Bruins lost to No. 1-seed Arizona, 84-76, in the Pac-12 Tournament's title game on Saturday, March 12.

• Four UCLA players finished the season having averaged at least 10 points per game – Johnny Juzang (15.6 ppg), Jaime Jaquez Jr. (13.9 ppg), Jules Bernard (12.8 ppg) and Tyger Campbell (11.9 ppg). Juzang ranked No. 3 in the Pac-12 in scoring, behind Washington guard Terrell Brown Jr. (21.7 ppg) and Arizona guard Bennedict Mathurin (17.7 ppg).

• UCLA lost consecutive games just once all season (in early February) and closed the 2021-22 campaign having won 10 of its final 13 games. The Bruins compiled a season-high six game winning streak in mid-to-late January and endured a three-week long hiatus in late December and early January due to COVID-19 issues.

• The Bruins ranked second in the Pac-12 in scoring margin (+10.9 ppg), trailing Arizona (+15.9) in that category. UCLA also finished the year ranked No. 4 in the league in field goal percentage (45.0%), free throw percentage (74.1%) and field goal percentage defense (41.5%). UCLA was third among all Pac-12 teams in 3-point field goal percentage (35.3%).

• UCLA led all Pac-12 programs in assist-turnover ratio (1.55) and turnover margin (+4.2). Tyger Campbell ranked No. 6 in the nation and No. 1 in the Pac-12 in assist-turnover ratio (3.2). Eight of UCLA's 10 primary rotation players finished the 2021-22 season with more assists than turnovers. As a team, UCLA ranked No. 8 in the nation in assist-turnover ratio.

• Through the past three seasons (2019-20 to 2021-22), UCLA ranks third in the Pac-12 in combined victories (68) and overall winning percentage (.694). UCLA, USC, Oregon and Colorado are the only Pac-12 programs to have won at least 20 games in each of the 2020-21 and 2021-22 men's basketball seasons.

## NOTES ABOUT THE BRUINS, ENTERING THE 2022-23 SEASON

### UCLA'S HEAD COACH

• **Mick Cronin** enters his fourth season as UCLA's head coach in 2022-23. He has compiled a 68-30 record through three seasons at UCLA (40-17 mark in Pac-12 play). Cronin's teams have delivered late in the season. In 2019-20, the Bruins won 11 of their final 14 games. In 2020-21, the Bruins won five of six games in the NCAA Tournament as a "First Four" team, advancing to the Final Four. In 2021-22, the Bruins won 10 of their final 13 contests, culminating in a Sweet 16 appearance. Over the past two seasons, UCLA has gone 7-2 in nine NCAA Tournament contests.

• Coach Cronin is one of four active college coaches who has led his teams to the past 11 NCAA Tournaments. He joins Mark Few (Gonzaga), Tom Izzo (Michigan State) and Bill Self (Kansas) in that category. He has guided his teams to 13 NCAA Tournament berths. He steered UCLA's program to the past two NCAA Tournaments, after the 2020 tournament was canceled due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic. He led Cincinnati to the NCAA Tournament in his final nine seasons as that program's head coach (2012-2019). He arrived at UCLA in April of 2019 after 13 seasons as the head coach at his alma mater, the University of Cincinnati (2006-19), and three seasons at Murray State (2003-06).

• Coach Cronin enters his 20th overall year as a college head coach in 2022-23. Over the past 12 seasons (nine at Cincinnati, three at UCLA), he has won 303 games. That ranks as the sixth-most victories among any head coach in the nation during that span (record of 303-109, last 12 years). Since his Cincinnati team went 26-9 in 2010-11, Coach Cronin's teams have averaged 25.3 wins over the past 12 seasons (2010-11 through 2021-22). He led Cincinnati to 30 wins in 2016-17 and 31 wins in 2017-18. His teams have gone 126-39 in conference games over the past nine seasons (six years at Cincinnati, three years at UCLA).

• Through his three seasons at UCLA, Coach Cronin has led the Bruins to a 23-11 record in contests decided by five points or fewer (includes games that extended into overtime). In 2021-22, UCLA posted a 3-4 record in such situations. In 2020-21, UCLA had a 13-4 record. In 2019-20, the Bruins went 7-3 in those contests. Through Coach Cronin's final three seasons at Cincinnati (2016-17 through 2018-19), his teams went 18-7 in those situations. From 2016-17 through the 2021-22 season, Coach Cronin's teams compiled a record of 41-18 in such contests

• Over the past two seasons (2020-21 and 2021-22), the Bruins have gone 39-4 when limiting the opposition to 70 or fewer points (19-3 in 2020-21, and 20-1 in 2021-22). Coach Cronin has led UCLA to a 57-5 record when limiting the opposition to 70 or fewer points. In 2019-20, UCLA went 18-1 in such situations. Through his final three seasons as Cincinnati's head coach (2016-17 through 2018-19), his teams posted a 79-10 record (opposition having scored 70 or fewer points). Since the start of the 2016-17 season, his teams have gone 133-15 when limiting the opponent to 70 or fewer points (that total is through 205 games).

### THE BRUINS' ASSISTANT COACHES

• **Darren Savino** will enter his fourth season as the Bruins' associate head coach in 2022-23. He has helped UCLA compile a 68-30 record through three seasons in Westwood. He arrived at UCLA in April of 2019 after having spent the previous nine seasons on the coaching staff at the University of Cincinnati. The 2022-23 season will mark his 15th year working alongside head coach Mick Cronin. Coach Savino worked with Coach Cronin for three years at UCLA, for nine seasons while at Cincinnati (2011-19) and for two years at Murray State (2005-06).

• **Rod Palmer** will begin his fourth year as an assistant coach on UCLA's staff in 2022-23. He joined the Bruins' program as an assistant coach in May of 2019, having spent the previous 12 seasons on coaching staffs at Long Beach State and San Diego State. Palmer has coached in the Southern California region for the past 29 years, both at the high school and college levels. He has spent the past three seasons at UCLA and the 2018-19 season at San Diego State. Prior to those four seasons, he spent 11 years as an assistant coach at Long Beach State.

• **Ivo Simovic** begins his first season on UCLA's coaching staff in 2022-23. He spent the previous four years as an assistant coach at Loyola University Maryland. His previous coaching stints along the East Coast included the University of North Carolina at Charlotte (2017-18) and two seasons at Hartford (2015-17). Simovic (pronounced *sim-oh-VITCH*) arrived in the United States with notable international experience in both Spain and his native country of Serbia. While in Spain, he served as head coach and sports director for CB Espacio Torreledones, near Madrid.
