All-Time Series: UCLA leads, 68-36

The Bruins swept last year's season series over thenranked No. 9 Washington in Seattle. UCLA is 13-2 over its 15 meetings with the Huskies.

Head coach Kelly Inouye-Perez owns a 31-17 records lifetime versus Washington.

## NO. 3 BRUINS HOST TOP-10 SHOWDOWN

The No. 3 UCLA softball team goes for its second series win to begin Pac-12 play this weekend, hosting No. 10 Washington for a three-game set broadcasted on the Pac-12 Network. The Huskies are the fifth top-10 foe the Bruins (25-2, 2-1 Pac-12) will face this season. UCLA was selected to finish first in the Pac-12 Coaches Preseason Poll with eight first-place votes earlier this year in February. Washington was the only other school to receive a first-place vote.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

UCLA opened Pac-12 play by taking two out of three in its series at California last weekend. The Bruins fell in mercy-rule fashion in game two for just their second loss of the season.

GAME 1 (W, 4-0): Freshmen Megan Grant and Jordan Woolery knocked in all four of UCLA's runs. Grant, in front of her Bay Area friends and family, went 3-for-4 with a double and plated each of the Bruins' first three runs of the games. GAME 2 (L, 8-0): The Golden Bears' offense teed off for three home runs against the Bruins as UCLA's offense was held to just four hits. California won the game in five innings on a mercy-rule, walk-off home run by Kacey Zobac.

GAME 3 (W, 10-1): Maya Brady went 2-for-4 with a homer and four RBI. UCLA responded after being shutout the previous game with 14 hits in the series rubber match. Once again, it was the freshman Megan Grant who sparked the Bruins' offense with a two-run homer to put UCLA on the board in the first inning.

# NO PLACE LIKE EASTON

The Bruins went 23-1 at home last season with their one loss coming to Utah in the series finale on May 1, 2022. UCLA has swept its conference opponent in each of the last five home-opening series to begin Pac-12 play dating back to 2018 (did not play a Pac-12 series in 2020 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic). Since 2018, UCLA is 47-8 in home conference contests.

# A NOTE ON PAC-12 PLAY LAST SEASON

UCLA opened with a 10-0 record in Pac-12 competition in 2022 for its best start to conference play in program history. In that stretch, the Bruins toppled No. 9 Arizona, No. 9 Washington and No. 12 Oregon each three times. UCLA's 25-game winning streak last season, which was tied for the longest of head coach Kelly Inouye-Perez's tenure, was snapped in game two at Stanford on April 9.

# **CONFERENCE WEEKLY AWARDS**

UCLA hauled in two more Pac-12 weekly awards on Monday. Left-handed pitcher Brooke Yanez was named the Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week and utility Megan Grant earned Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors. UCLA is now up to five weekly Pac-12 honors on the season with each being awarded to different members of the team.

YANEZ: Yanez, who has now earned Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week four times in her career, led the Bruins in the circle in both of their wins at California last weekend. Yanez is now tied for fourth in the Pac-12 with nine victories on the season. In game one, Yanez allowed just one baserunner and struck out five in her five shutout innings. She earned the start for the series rubber match two days later and delivered with a complete-game victory. After walking four batters in the first inning, Yanez settled in for five consecutive scoreless frames. She finished the game with seven total punchouts.

GRANT: Grant is tied for the team lead and paces all freshmen in the country in the statistical category. Grant led the Bruin offense in a 3-for-4 performance in game one, scoring each of UCLA's first three runs of the game on a single and two-RBI double. Grant once again sparked UCLA's offense in game three with a two-run home run in the first inning to score the Bruins' first runs of the game, Grant ranks second on the team with 12 extra-base hits, trailing only Maya Brady (17). Through 27 games, Grant is hitting for a .312 batting average and .584 slugging percentage.

# **BRADY: PLAYER OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE**

Maya Brady leads the team and Pac-12 and is tied for sixth in the country with 36 hits entering week five (.481 batting average). Brady is also tops on the team in home runs (8), runs scored (32), slugging percentage (.924) and stolen bases (5). She is tied with Megan Grant for the team lead ranks second in the conference with 32 runs batted in. Brady has two multi-homer games this season (San Diego - Feb. 12; Fresno State - March 3), stretching her career total to four.

Maya Brady leads UCLA in both slugging and stolen bases. The last time a Bruin led the team in both slugging percentage and stolen bases in a single season was Katie Schroeder in 2009 (.684 SLG / 19 SB).

#### **BRADY SHATTERS 24-YEAR-OLD RECORD**

Maya Brady broke a 24-year-old record during UCLA's season-opening Stacy Winsberg Memorial Tournament. The Thousand Oaks native recorded 11 consecutive base hits across four games, breaking the mark of 10 consecutive hits formerly held by UCLA legends Lisa Fernandez (March 1993) and Stacey Nuveman (Feb. 1999). In total, Brady opened the first week of 2023 going 13-for-16 with 13 RBI and four home runs to earn her Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I NFCA Player of the Week honors for the first time in her career. She is the 17th Bruin to receive the award.

#### **CHEF MEGAN COOKIN'**

Megan Grant leads all freshmen in the country with 32 runs batted in this season after knocking in six runs across UCLA's four games last week. She leads UCLA with 10 multi-RBI games this season. The prized 2022 recruit has hit third our fourth in the UCLA batting lineup in 26 of 27 games this season.

#### FRESHMAN SLUGGING DUO

Freshmen Megan Grant and Jordan Woolery have been anchors in the heart of the Bruins' lineup this season. The duo has combined for a .340 batting average and rank t-1st and third on the team in runs batted. Entering week five, Woolery's eight doubles are tied for first in the Pac-12.

**ANOTHER NOTABLE FROSH:** Freshman Kennedy Powell has started 23 of UCLA's last 24 games. Twenty-two of those starts have been in left field. Powell ranks third on the team with a .397 average and .414 on-base percentage. Powell is hitting .464 in her last 12 games

#### **BACK TO HER ROOTS**

Maya Brady has alternated between center field and shortstop this season. Brady is now the Bruins' everyday shortstip due to a left shoulder injury sustained by utility Seneca Curo. Brady grew up playing the position with her travel ball team OC Bathusters Stith.

#### **CONSISTENCY BEHIND THE DISH**

Sharlize Palacios has been an x-factor as UCLA's primary starting catcher. So far this season, the Arizona transfer has thrown out five of seven runners attempting to steal. Palacios has also provided power to the Bruins' lineup, ranking second on the team with five home runs behind only Brady. Last weekend at the Judi Garman Classic, Palacios hit the fifth grand slam of her career in a 3-for-4 day, including a double, against Michigan on March 4. Palacios has recorded a base hit in six of UCLA's last nine games and has nine RBI in that stretch, including a grand slam versus Cal Poly which was the fifth of her career.

#### **POLA SETTING THE TABLE**

Sophomore Savannah Pola has hit leadoff in all but two of UCLA's 27 games this season. An All-Pac-12 Freshman selection last season, Pola ranks second on the squad with a .423 batting average and seven doubles in 2023. When batting leadoff, Pola has reached base on 14 of 25 chances (.520 on-base percentage; reached via error once).

#### **BIG BAD BROOKIE**

The left-handed transfer pitcher from Oregon has dominated in her last ride as a Bruin. Yanez is a flawless 9-0 and ranks second in the Pac-12 with a .145 opposing batting average and third with 0.99 earned run average. Yanez has gone 5.0+ innings in eight consecutive starts.

#### **FARAIMO INFERNO**

Megan Faraimo's 11 wins are tied for sixth in the nation entering week five. Faraimo has been utilized in a reliever role frequently this season. Four of her 11 winning decisions have come in relief. Faraimo has thrown two no-hitters this season, improving her career total to seven solo no-hitters. Most recently, Faraimo no-hit No. 3 Florida on Feb. 23, marking the first time a Bruin pitcher no-hit a top-3 opponent since March 28, 2003, when Keira Goerl kept No. 2 Stanford out of the hit column. It was Faraimo's first no-no against a ranked opponent.

#### **CLIMBING UCLA'S ALL-TIME RANKINGS**

- With her four stolen bases at the Judi Garman Classic, **Kelli Godin** moved into third place on UCLA's all-time **stolen bases** list with 65 on 73 attempts. She passed Allexis Bennett (2013-16) who had 61 stolen bases. Godin needs eight more to tie her former teammate Briana Perez for second on the list (73).
- Megan Faraimo's 11 wins to begin 2023 pushed her career record to 83-14. She is currently ninth on UCLA's career wins list. Faraimo passed Ally Carda (2012-15) and former teammate Rachel Garcia (2017-21) on the Bruins' career strikeouts list earlier this season. Faraimo has now struck out 879 batters and is 73 shy of tying Debbie Doom (1982-85) for third all-time with 952.

- UCLA has totaled 117 no-hitters, including 22 perfect games, in program history.
- Taylor Tinsley (1) and Megan Faraimo (2) have already thrown a combined three no-hitters this season.

#### **BACK-TO-BACK NO-HITTERS**

Taylor Tinsley and Megan Faraimo tossed back-to-back no-hitters in week one of the season. Tinsley no-hit CSU Bakersfield in her first career start on Friday, Feb. 11. Tinsley joins Amanda Freed (1999-2002) as the only Bruins to throw a no-hitter in their first career appearance in the circle. Freed no-hit Santa Clara in her pitching debut on Feb. 5, 1999. Tinsley's performance marked the 115th no-hitter in UCLA history. Her final line included four strikeouts and no walks nor any errors. The Roadrunners' first and only baserunner came in the fifth inning via catcher's interference.

The very next day, Faraimo threw the sixth solo no-hitter of her career. The Bruins last threw no-hitters in back-to-back games in 2022. Faraimo and Lauren Shaw combined for a perfect game versus Pennsylvania on March 10 and Faraimo struck out 15 consecutive Roadrunners in her perfecto against CSU Bakersfield on March 11.

#### **USA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST**

Senior Megan Faraimo and juniors Maya Brady and Sharlize Palacios were selected to the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List. Brady, a utility out of Thousand Oaks, Calif., was second on the squad with 15 home runs in 2022, two of which came on June 6 versus No. 1 Oklahoma at the Women's College World Series. Reigning Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year Megan Faraimo tossed two solo perfect games (and one combined with Lauren Shaw) and led the conference in strikeouts (292) in 2022. Palacios helped Arizona to the WCWS as the team's starting catcher with 20 homers last season.

#### PRESEASON ALL-PAC-12 TEAM

Five UCLA players were named to the 2023 Preseason All-Pac-12 Team on Feb. 1: Maya Brady, Megan Faraimo, Aaliyah Jordan, Sharlize Palacios and Brooke Yanez. UCLA paced the conference with five of the 19 named to the team with the next-closest school being Washington with four selections.

#### **PAC-12 FAVORITES**

The Bruins were picked to finish first in the annual Pac-12 Softball Coaches' Preseason Poll. UCLA received eight of nine possible first-place votes in the preseason poll. Washington was the only other institution to receive a first-place vote. UCLA garnered a total of 64 points to secure its spot atop the preseason coaches poll for the third consecutive season and league-record 13th time overall (since 1999). The Bruins have not finished below third in the conference since 2013 (t-5th).

#### **GOLDEN EAGLE BRUINS**

Faraimo, Brady and Palacios each represented Team USA on the U.S. Women's National Team over the offseason.

**FARAIMO:** Competed in the Japan All-Star Series, The World Games in Birmingham, Ala., the Canada Cup and the Pan American Championship with fellow Bruin Rachel Garcia.

**PALACIOS:** Competed in the Japan All-Star Series and Canada Cup ... in 10 games across both events, she hit .471 (8-for-17) with two home runs, a triple and five RBI ... helped Team USA to a Canada Cup championship (.571 avg.).

**BRADY:** Went 4-for-8 in the Japan All-Star Series.

#### **GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES**

UCLA's roster totes three of the last four Pac-12 Batting Champions in **Aaliyah Jordan (2018)**, **Kelli Godin (2019)** and **Janelle Meoño (2021)**. All three players won the award as freshmen. Jordan won the title with a .429 batting average (84 hits), Godin with a .418 average (56 hits) and Meoño with a .439 average (72 hits). Jordan's 84 hits in 2018 rank t-8th for a single season in UCLA history.

## **POSTSEASON SUCCESS**

UCLA advanced to the WCWS for the seventh year in a row in 2022, extending its longest active streak in the nation. The Bruins have appeared in the NCAA Tournament a record 37 total times, including 23 straight, and have missed out on just three occasions (last in 1998). UCLA is the winningest team in NCAA postseason history with a 233-64 (.785) record. Head coach Kelly Inouve-Perez has made an NCAA Regional appearance in each of her 16 seasons at the helm of the program.

#### **FIVE ALL-AMERICANS**

UCLA returns three former NFCA All-Americans from last year's squad in **Maya Brady**, **Aaliyah Jordan** and **Megan Faraimo** and added two more through the transfer portal this offseason in **Janelle Meoño** and **Brooke Yanez**.

**BRADY:** Brady was an NFCA First Team All-American in 2021 and is a two-time All-Pac-12 honoree. The redshirt sophomore utility was the Bruins' everyday center fielder a season ago and recorded 13 multi-RBI games.

**JORDAN:** Jordan is a two-time NFCA First Team All-American (2021, 2018) and is one of four members still remaining from the Bruins' 2019 NCAA Championship squad. Jordan missed the majority of last season due to a torn anterior cruciate ligament suffered at the St. Pete Clearwater Elite Invitational. She is back in Westwood for her seventh year in 2023. She owns a career batting average of .389 and ranks third on UCLA's career doubles list with 60.

**FARAIMO:** Faraimo is a two-time NFCA All-American after earning second team honors in 2022. She was the Bruins' ace last season with a 24-5 record and averaging a monstrous 10.32 K/7.

**MEOÑO:** Meoño was honored as an NFCA Third Team All-American in 2021 after claiming the Pac-12 Batting Champion title with a .442 batting average.

**YANEZ:** Yanez was an NFCA Third Team All-American in her last season of action in 2021. That year, she was a 22-game winner with 268 strikeouts over 182.1 innings pitched as the ace of the Oregon Ducks' staff.

### **NEW BRUINS**

- UCLA reloaded via recruiting and the transfer portal in 2023. Highlighting the Bruins' class of freshmen are utility Megan Grant, infielder Jordan Woolery and pitcher Taylor Tinsley.
- Megan Grant was ranked as the No. 2 overall recruit in the country by Extra Inning Softball after starring four years at Aragon High School. She was named to the San Francisco Chronicle's 2022 All-Metro First Team and Mercury News' All-Bay Area Softball First Team her senior season. In 2021, Grant helped United States U18 Women's National Team win gold at both the WBSC U18 World Cup in Lima, Peru, and Junior Pan American Games in Barranquilla, Colombia.
- The Bruins beefed up their rotation with the addition of **Taylor Tinsley**, who was ranked as the No. 1 pitcher and No. 2 overall recruit by Softball America. Tinsley was awarded First Team All-State each year of her high school career a George Walton Academy. She is UCLA's first player out of the state of Georgia (Lawrenceville).

- Transferring to Westwood from Arizona are outfielder **Janelle Meoño** and catcher **Sharlize Palacios**. Palacios was a member of two WCWS squads for the Wildcats as their everyday designated player in 2021 and everyday catcher in 2022. In three seasons, she totaled 122 hits, 128 RBI and 39 home runs, including three grand slams as a freshman in 2020. Palacios collected All-Pac-12 First Team plaudits in 2022 and 2021. Meoño, a rangy and speedy outfielder, bat leadoff in 34 of her 35 games played last season. In her Pac-12 Batting Champion 2021 season, Meoño had a 27-game hitting streak.
- Also coming via the portal from Oregon are left-handed pitcher **Brooke Yanez** and infielder **Rachel Cid**. Yanez is back to full health after missing the 2022 season due to injury. Yanez had impressive showings against the Bruins in the past. In 2021, she defeated UCLA twice when it was ranked No. 1 and 2, respectively. Yanez struck out 10 Bruins in a 3-1 win on Feb. 28 and threw a two-hit shutout with eight strikeouts on April 9.

#### PITCHING DOMINANCE

UCLA has led the Pac-12 in ERA and wins in each of the last four seasons. In 2022, the Bruins' pitching staff led the Pac-12 in nearly every statistical category: ERA (1.72), strikeouts (486), wins (51), opposing batting average (.180) and saves (12).

#### **OFFSEASON PROMOTIONS**

UCLA coaching greats Lisa Fernandez and Kirk Walker each received promotions to associate head coach roles this past offseason. Fernandez, now the Mark Kalmansohn UCLA Associate Head Softball Coach as of August 10, 2022, begins her 25th season on the Bruins' staff in 2023 (1997-99, 2007-Pres.). With Fernandez on the staff, UCLA has posted a 1,117-240-2 (.822) record and won five NCAA Championships. Fernandez has also been honored as a member of the NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year three times and NFCA Regional CSOY seven times. Arguably the greatest pitcher in softball history, Fernandez has coached nine Bruin hurlers to 20 NFCA All-American awards. Fernandez has led the Bruins to a top five nationally-ranked earned run average in every season since taking over as UCLA's pitching coach in 2019. In the Bruins' 2019 NCAA title season, Fernandez's staff dominated with a 1.43 ERA, ranking second in the country.

Walker, who has helped lead UCLA to seven NCAA Championships, was promoted on Aug. 12. Walker has accumulated a coaching record of 780-144-1 (.843) over 21 years in Westwood, separated by two stints from 1984-94 and 2012-Pres. Walker has been a fixture in the third base coaches' box since his return to UCLA in 2012, contributing to the 2019 National Coaching Staff of the Year award and five NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year awards. Walker, who helped establish UCLA softball's early dynasty, was hired as the program's first-ever undergraduate assistant coach in 1985.

#### **MEGANTRON**

Megan Faraimo earned the first Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year award of her career and was named to her third All-Pac-12 First Team in 2022. Faraimo was also a USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 25 Finalist for the second season in a row after boasting the her first 20-win season (24-5 record). Faraimo's 1.98 ERA and Pac-12-leading 292 strikeouts (8th in the country) earned her NFCA Second Team All-American honors. She also set a UCLA single-season record in saves (7).

Entering her 17th season and 35th straight year in Westwood, The Shelly Carlin UCLA Head Softball Coach Kelly Inouye-Perez comes off her ninth appearance in the Women's College World Series in 2022, finishing in a tie for third. Inouye-Perez has further cemented UCLA as the greatest program in the history of the sport with a pair of national championships in 2010 and 2019. She is the only person to ever win an NCAA Championship as both a coach and player.

Inouye-Perez has contributed to eight of UCLA softball's 12 NCAA championships — three as a player, two as head coach and three as an assistant coach under NFCA Hall of Fame coach Sue Enquist from 1994-2006. UCLA leads all of college softball with 12 NCAA championships and 31 Women's College World Series appearances. The Bruins are the all-time winningest program at the Women's College World Series with 103 wins in the tournament's 40-year history. UCLA has journeyed to Oklahoma City in seven straight postseasons for the longest active streak in softball.

She leads all active Pac-12 coaches with 672 overall victories and 219 conference victories, securing three regular season Pac-12 titles in her tenure as head coach. The Bruins have claimed a conference-best 11 Pac-10/12 titles since joining the league in 1987.

Numerous Bruin players have prospered under Inouye-Perez's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. Rachel Garcia was a three-time winner of the Honda Award for Softball (2018, 2019, 2021) and the first two-time winner of the Honda Cup (2019, 2021) which is given to the best female athlete in any collegiate sport. Garcia also was a three-time USA Softball Player of the Year. Inouye-Perez has directed 37 NFCA All-Americans, 75 NFCA All-Region plaudits and 97 All-Pac-10/12 accolades.

Four players who have competed in the Inouye-Perez era of UCLA softball have gone on to represent Team USA in the Olympics. Most recently, four Bruins — Rachel Garcia, Bubba Nickles, Delaney Spaulding and Ally Carda — donned the Red, White and Blue at the 2020 Tokyo Summer Olympics and brought home the silver medal.

UCLA has hauled in six Pac-10/12 Player of the Year awards since Inouye-Perez took the reigns of the program, beginning with Megan Langenfeld in 2010. Ally Carda was a two-time winner in 2014 and 2015 and Rachel Garcia received the award three times (2018, 2019 and 2021), tying Lisa Fernandez's record.

Inouye-Perez and her staff have been consistently recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded NFCA West Regional Coaching Staff of the Year six times and received the national honor three times in 2010, 2019 and 2021. Inouye-Perez was an assistant coach on the 2000 and 2004 staffs under Enquist that won the NFCA West Regional award. Inouye-Perez has also been named Pac-12 Coach of the Year twice in 2010 and 2021.
