UCLA CLOSING REGULAR SEASON SCHEDULE WITH DOUBLE-HEADER

The No. 2 UCLA softball team will play its final two games of the regular season with a double-header on Friday, May 5 at Easton Stadium versus Loyola Marymount at 1 p.m. and San Diego State at 6 p.m. (PT). The two contests can be viewed on the UCLA Live Stream for free. The Bruins (48-4, 21-3) are led in the circle by redshirt senior Megan Faraimo who has picked up a win in each of her last 13 appearances. She leads the nation with 26 victories this season. At the plate, shortstop Maya Brady owns a Pac-12 leading .454 batting average and .875 slugging percentage.

KEY NOTES ABOUT THE BRUINS

- UCLA captured its 17th regular-season conference title and its 12th as a member of the Pac-10/12 Conference last week.
- As a result, the Bruins are the No. 1 seed in the upcoming inaugural Pac-12 Softball Tournament (May 10-13).
- The Bruins have won 21 straight games dating back to March 25.
- UCLA is riding a 17-game conference winning streak heading into the Pac-12 Softball Tournament next week.
- UCLA finished April an undefeated 17-0.
- UCLA enters the week ranking top 10 nationally in both batting average (2nd - .344) and earned run average (7th - 1.56). Oklahoma is the only other Power 5 team in the top 10 statistically for both categories.
- The Bruins' bats lead the Pac-12 in average (.344), slugging percentage (.545) and runs scored (344).
- And the Bruins' arms lead the Pac-12 in shutouts (19), strikeouts (369) and opposing batting average (.187).

SPRING CLEANING & CONFERENCE DOMINATION

UCLA swept five consecutive Pac-12 foes to end its conference slate. The Bruins' 21 Pac-12 wins are their most in a season since 1999. For just the second time in the last 20 years (2021), UCLA has taken the season series against every Pac-12 opponents. The Bruins' 17-game conference winning streak is the longest among all Power 5 programs and is the Bruins' longest in a single season since 2002. UCLA is one of just three teams to not drop a conference series this year (Oklahoma and Florida State).

UCLA POSTSEASON HISTORY

- The Bruins have made 37 total NCAA appearances in the history of the program, including 23 straight since 1999.
- UCLA has appeared in seven consecutive Women's College World Series which is the longest active streak in the NCAA.
- The Bruins' 31 total WCWS berths are also an NCAA record.
- UCLA is the winning program in the history of the sport with 12 NCAA Championships.
- The Bruins hold the distinction as the only program to win a championship in every decade, including their 1978 AIAW title.
- The Bruins also hold the distinction as the only program to ever three-peat NCAA Championships (1988-90).
- UCLA owns an all-time postseason record of 233-64 (.785).

TWO TOP 10 FINALISTS FOR USA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Redshirt junior utility Maya Brady and redshirt senior pitcher Megan Faraimo were named top 10 finalists for USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. Faraimo (26-2, 1.15 ERA, 208 SO) has made the cut for the top 10 for the second time in her career (2021). This is Brady's first acknowledgement of her career. Brady (.454 AVG, 55 RBI, 16 HR) has been the anchor of the Bruins' lineup in the No. 2 spot this season. She leads the team in batting average, home runs, runs batted in and slugging percentage all while undertaking a new position defensively at shortstop. Two Bruins have been honored as USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year a total of three times (Rachel Garcia - 2019, 2018; Stacey Nuveman 2002).

TWO TOP 25 FINALISTS FOR NFCA FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

The Bruins also boast two of the top freshmen in the country in utility Megan Grant and first baseman Jordan Woolery. UCLA is one of just two teams (Duke) to have two players listed as Top 25 Finalists for TUCCI/NFCA Freshman of the Year. Rachel Garcia (2017) is the only Bruin to win the award in its nine-year history. Grant and Woolery are each having two of the most productive seasons ever by a UCLA freshman. They have combined for 98 RBI this season which is the most by a freshman duo in UCLA history, passing the previous mark of 90 RBI set in 1997 by Stacey Nuveman (71) and Courtney Dale (19).

MEGANTRON

Faraimo, who has hauled in four Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week awards this season, has picked up a win in each of her last 13 appearances in the circle. Earlier this season, she set a career-long scoreless inning streak of 35.2 innings that was snapped in game three against Arizona on April 16. The two-time NFCA All-American boasts a miniscule WHIP of 0.78 this season. She is on pace to become first Bruin hurler since Ally Carda in 2015 to win 30 games in a season. The Oceanside, Calif. native picked up her 20th win of the season at Arizona on April 14, achieving the feat a full month earlier than she did in her 2022 campaign. Faraimo now has back-to-back 20-win, 200-strikeout seasons.

BRADY IN THE HUNT FOR THE TRIPLE CROWN

Brady, who leads the Pac-12 in batting average with a .454 clip, is two off the conference in lead in home runs with 16 and three off the lead in runs batted in with 55. She trails Arizona State's Jordyn VanHook in HR (18) and Arizona's Allie Skaggs in RBI (58). There have been only three triple crown winners in conference history: Baylee Klingler (2022), Jenny Dalton (1995) and Stacey Nuveman (1999). The Pac-12 triple crown takes into account stats from the entire season.

BRADY & THE PAC-12 BATTING TITLE

Brady's .454 batting average leads Utah's Aliya Bellarde by a whole 19 points (.425) entering the final weekend of the regular season. The Pac-12 Batting Champion will be crowned after the regular season. UCLA's roster currently totes three former Pac-12 Batting Champions in Janelle Meoño (2021), Kelli Godin (2019) and Aaliyah Jordan (2018). Twelve UCLA players have won the conference batting title a total 15 times. Yvonne Gutierrez won the title twice in 1990 and 1991 and Stacey Nuveman won the title three times in 1999, 2001 and 2002.

OOH, THAT'S A FRESH NOTE

Megan Grant's 55 runs batted in and Jordan Woolery's 44 runs batted in have made UCLA freshman class history. They are the only true freshmen in Bruins' history to each have recorded at least 37+ RBI in a single season. Their 98 combined RBI are the most by a freshman duo in a single season in UCLA history. The 98 RBI are tied with Indiana's Taryn Kern and Avery Parker for the most by a freshman duo this season. Grant's 55 RBI rank second among freshmen in the nation, trailing only Kern (62).

CHEF SERVING APPETIZERS

Last week in game three at Utah, Megan Grant belted her second lead-off home run of the season. The freshman phenom took over lead-off duties on April 2 versus No. 6 Stanford and has stayed in that roll ever since (17 games). Grant leads UCLA with 19 RBI, 44 total bases and 11 extra-base hits in that span.

FRESH FACES IN THE HEART OF THE LINEUP

Grant and Woolery have been mainstays in the top 5 of UCLA's lineup since the beginning of conference play. They have each recorded a grand slam and multi-homer game this season. In 24 conference games, Woolery and Grant rank first and third in the Pac-12 in hits with 32 and 29, respectively. Brady is tied with Woolery for 32 hits as well.

Overall, Woolery's .409 batting average currently ranks fourth in UCLA freshman history, trailing Stacey Nuveman, Natasha Watley and her two teammates Aaliyah Jordan and Kelli Godin.

THREE BRUINS HITTING OVER .400

Joining Brady and Woolery in the above .400 club this season is freshman outfielder Kennedy Powell with a .402 average. UCLA has never had three hitters finish the season hitting .400 or above. Powell, who platoons into left field based on defensive alignments, has seen action in all 52 games this year.

1-THROUGH-9 GETTING IT DONE

One of the biggest reasons for Megan Grant and Maya Brady's production is that the bottom of the lineup has been consistently getting on base. Over UCLA's last 16 games, the Bruins' 7-8-9 batters are hitting a collective .348 batting average (45-for-129) and .472 on-base percentage (16 walks). They have scored 31 runs and knocked in 21 RBI. Anna Vines and Janelle Meoño, two mainstays at the bottom of the lineup, have been on fire as of late. Entering this week, Meoño has hit 13-for-34 over UCLA's last 14 games to boost her season batting average by 48 points up to .327. In conference games, Anna Vines ranks third on the team with a .408 batting average (20-for-49).

BRADY JOINS BATES

Brady homered in each of UCLA's three games against Arizona (April 14-16) to stretch her streak to four straight games with a dinger. She is the first Bruin to accomplish that feat since B.B. Bates who homered five games in a row (Feb. 2013).

BIG CAT HUNTER

Brady has dominated in her 10 career games against UCLA rival Arizona. Lifetime against the Wildcats, Brady is batting for a .517 average (15-for-29) and 1.310 slugging percentage with six home runs, five doubles and 12 RBI.

200 CAREER HITS FOR BRADY

Brady became the 35th player in UCLA history to record 200 hits in a career. She reached the milestone with a double to the right-center field wall in her first at-bat at BYU on May 1.

SINGLE-SEASON RECORDS WATCH FOR BRADY

Maya Brady (.875 SLG) is on pace to have the best single-season slugging percentage by a Bruin since Megan Langenfeld when she set the UCLA record with a 1.085 mark in 2010. No Bruin has slugged over .900 since that season. Brady is also on pace for the first 20-homer season by a Bruin since Stephany LaRosa and Delaney Spaulding in 2015.

MORE FEATHERS IN THE HELMET FOR BRADY

Maya Brady is the only player in the country hitting for a .450-plus batting average with at least 55 runs batted in and 15 home runs. Brady has three multi-homer games this season (San Diego - Feb. 12; Fresno State - March 3; Washington - March 19), stretching her career total to five. She joins a pantheon of Bruin sluggers, becoming just the seventh player in program history to record at least five multi-homer games in their career.

APPROACHING 1,000 & 100

Faraimo is 24 strikeouts away from becoming just the third player in UCLA history to record 1,000 strikeouts in a career. In the 1,000 K club are Anjelica Selden (1,441 SO; 2005-08) and Keira Goerl (1,095 SO; 2001-04).

Faraimo is also on a fast track to 100 wins in her storied career, sitting just two away from the milestone with 98. She would become the fourth UCLA pitcher to reach that mark. One more win would surpass her former teammate and two-time Honda Cup winner Rachel Garcia. Among active leaders in the NCAA, Faraimo ranks sixth in strikeouts and second in wins.

BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL

UCLA is one of just two Power 5 teams to rank top 10 in the country in batting average (2nd - .344) and earned run average (7th - 1.56). Oklahoma is the only other team, and it leads the nation in both categories.

THE QUEEN IS BACK

Aaliyah Jordan has not skipped a beat since making her return following a year-long recovery from a torn anterior cruciate ligament. Jordan was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for the second time in her career following her first home games in over a year against Stanford last week. She helped the Bruins to a top 10 sweep with a team-leading .571 batting average, two home runs, 1.429 slugging percentage, 10 total bases and three RBI.

Jordan is a two-time NFCA First Team All-American, three-time All-Pac-12 First Team selection and is one of four remaining members from UCLA's 2019 NCAA Championship squad.

200 CAREER RBI

With her two-run homer in game two against Stanford on April 1, Aaliyah Jordan became the sixth player in UCLA history to record 200 runs batted in for a career. Jordan, who has 208 career RBI, trails Tairia Mims Flowers and Stephany LaRosa for third on the all-time list. Jordan is also three doubles away from tying GiOnna DiSalvatore's program record of 65 career two-baggers.

BACK TO HER ROOTS

Maya Brady has undertaken a new position this season as the Bruins' everyday shortstop following a left shoulder injury sustained by utility Seneca Curo. Brady grew up playing the position with her travel ball team OC Batbusters Stith.

BRADY SHATTERS 24-YEAR-OLD RECORD

Maya Brady broke a 24-year-old record during UCLA's Stacy Winsberg Memorial Tournament. Brady recorded 11 consecutive base hits across four games, breaking the mark of 10 consecutive hits formerly held by UCLA legends Lisa Fernandez (March 1993) and Stacey Nuveman (Feb. 1999). In total, Brady opened the first week of 2023 going 13-for-16 with 13 RBI and four home runs to earn her NFCA Player of the Week honors for the first time in her career.

MORE ON THE UCLA FRESHMEN, BECAUSE WHY NOT

Megan Grant saw her 24-game reached base streak come to an end last week at BYU. Grant also had a 14-game hitting streak going earlier this season. Both marks are the longest by a Bruin this season.

GRAB SOME PINE

UCLA's pitching staff is dominating the conference once again. The Bruins' hurlers rank first in the conference in the following categories: strikeouts (369), shutouts (19), opposing batting average (.187) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.27). UCLA ranks second behind Stanford in earned run average at 1.56.

UCLA has led the Pac-12 in ERA and wins in each of the last four seasons. In 2022, the Bruins' pitching staff led the Pac-12 in nearly every statistical category: ERA (1.72), strikeouts (486), wins (51), opposing batting average (.180) and saves (12).

ENTER SANDWOMAN

Faraimo has been utilized in a reliever role frequently this season. Ten of her 26 winning decisions have come in relief. The rise-ball pitcher has been nearly automatic with 13 wins in each of her last 13 appearances. Faraimo owns a 0.92 ERA with two shutouts and a 8.26 K/7 rate across that stretch.

Faraimo has thrown two no-hitters this season, improving her career total to seven solo no-hitters. Most recently, Faraimo no-hit No. 3 Florida on Feb. 23, marking the first time a Bruin pitcher no-hit a top 3 opponent since March 28, 2003, when Keira Goerl kept No. 2 Stanford out of the hit column. It was Faraimo's first no-no against a ranked opponent.

SOLID OUTINGS FROM YANEZ

Left-handed pitcher Brooke Yanez has gone at least 4.0 innings in each of her last three starts, picking up the win in each outing. The spinning lefty has thrown 6.0 innings and allowed just one earned run in each of her last two Pac-12 starts.

JUST GET ON THE BOARD

UCLA is 27-0 when scoring in the first inning and is 40-0 when it scores first in games this season.

THREE BRUINS RETURN HOME

This weekend will be a homecoming of sorts when LMU Head Coach Tairia Mims Flowers, San Diego State Head Coach Stacey Nuveman Deniz and San Diego State volunteer Delanie Wisz return to Easton Stadium.

Flowers, one of the most clutch hitters in UCLA history, led the Bruins to four consecutive WCWS appearances from 2000-03, capped with an NCAA title in her senior season. She is in her third year leading the Lions' program.

Nuveman Deniz is one of the greatest hitters in the history of the sport. The 1999 NCAA Champion set the NCAA home run record with her 86th on May 5, 2002 versus Oregon State. Her 90 career home runs are still the most in UCLA's record books. Nuveman Deniz is in her second season as head coach.

BRUIN TRIO NAMED TO WBSC U.S. NATIONAL TEAM ROSTER

UCLA's Maya Brady, Megan Faraimo and Ally Carda will represent Team USA at the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) World Cup in Dublin, Ireland from July 11-15, the U.S. Women's National Team, it was announced last week.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES

UCLA's roster totes three of the last four Pac-12 Batting Champions in Aaliyah Jordan (2018), Kelli Godin (2019) and Janelle Meoño (2021). All three players won the award as freshmen. Jordan won the title with a .444 batting average (72 hits), Godin with a .426 average (46 hits) and Meoño with a .442 average (61 hits).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

UCLA advanced to the WCWS for the seventh year in a row in 2022, extending its longest active streak in the nation. The Bruins have appeared in the NCAA Tournament a record 37 total times, including 23 straight, and have missed out on just three occasions (last in 1998). UCLA is the winningest team in NCAA postseason history with a 233-64 (.785) record. Head coach Kelly Inouye-Perez has made an NCAA Regional appearance in each of her 16 seasons at the helm of the program.

FARAIMO, YANEZ SELECTED IN WOMEN'S PRO FAST PITCH DRAFT

Faraimo and Yanez were selected in Monday's 2023 Women's Professional Fast Pitch Draft in Oklahoma City. Both pitchers were selected by the USSSA Pride with Faraimo being chosen fourth overall in the first round and Yanez 12th overall in the third round. Faraimo and Yanez have the opportunity to join UCLA alumni Delanie Wisz (2020-22) and Delaney Spaulding (2014-17) on the squad. The two selections bring the Bruins' total number of WPF draftees to 35.

FIVE ALL-AMERICANS

UCLA returns three former NFCA All-Americans from last year's squad in Maya Brady, Aaliyah Jordan and Megan Faraimo and added two more through the transfer portal this offseason in Janelle Meoño and Brooke Yanez.

BRADY: Brady was an NFCA First Team All-American in 2021 and is a two-time All-Pac-12 honoree. The redshirt sophomore utility was the Bruins' everyday center fielder a season ago and recorded 13 multi-RBI games.

JORDAN: Jordan is a two-time NFCA First Team All-American (2021, 2018) and is one of four members still remaining from the Bruins' 2019 NCAA Championship squad. Jordan missed the majority of last season due to a torn anterior cruciate ligament suffered at the St. Pete Clearwater Elite Invitational. She is back in Westwood for her seventh year in 2023. She owns a career batting average of .389 and ranks third on UCLA's career doubles list with 60.

FARAIMO: Faraimo is a two-time NFCA All-American after earning second team honors in 2022. She was the Bruins' ace last season with a 24-5 record and averaging a monstrous 10.32 K/7.

MEOÑO: Meoño was honored as an NFCA Third Team All-American in 2021 after claiming the Pac-12 Batting Champion title with a .442 batting average.

YANEZ: Yanez was an NFCA Third Team All-American in her last season of action in 2021. That year, she was a 22-game winner with 268 strikeouts over 182.1 innings pitched as the ace of the Oregon Ducks' staff.

FARAIMO: Competed in the Japan All-Star Series, The World Games in Birmingham, Ala., the Canada Cup and the Pan American Championship with fellow Bruin Rachel Garcia.

PALACIOS: Competed in the Japan All-Star Series and Canada Cup ... in 10 games across both events, she hit .471 (8-for-17) with two home runs, a triple and five RBI ... helped Team USA to a Canada Cup championship (.571 avg.).

BRADY: Went 4-for-8 in the Japan All-Star Series.

OFFSEASON PROMOTIONS

UCLA coaching greats Lisa Fernandez and Kirk Walker each received promotions to associate head coach roles this past offseason. Fernandez, now the Mark Kalmansohn UCLA Associate Head Softball Coach as of August 10, 2022, begins her 25th season on the Bruins' staff in 2023 (1997-99, 2007-Pres.). With Fernandez on the staff, UCLA has posted a 1,117-240-2 (.822) record and won five NCAA Championships. Fernandez has also been honored as a member of the NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year three times and NFCA Regional CSOY seven times. Arguably the greatest pitcher in softball history, Fernandez has coached nine Bruin hurlers to 20 NFCA All-American awards. Fernandez has led the Bruins to a top five nationally-ranked earned run average in every season since taking over as UCLA's pitching coach in 2019. In the Bruins' 2019 NCAA title season, Fernandez's staff dominated with a 1.43 ERA, ranking second in the country.

Walker, who has helped lead UCLA to seven NCAA Championships, was promoted on Aug. 12. Walker has accumulated a coaching record of 780-144-1 (.843) over 21 years in Westwood, separated by two stints from 1984-94 and 2012-Pres. Walker has been a fixture in the third base coaches' box since his return to UCLA in 2012, contributing to the 2019 National Coaching Staff of the Year award and five NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year awards. Walker, who helped establish UCLA softball's early dynasty, was hired as the program's first-ever undergraduate assistant coach in 1985.

INAUGURAL PAC-12 SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT

Arizona's Hillenbrand Stadium will serve as the host site for the inaugural Pac-12 Softball Tournament, which is set to make its debut from May 10-13, 2023. The four-day event will begin with a play-in game between the eighth and ninth-place teams in the regular-season standings on Wednesday. That winner will advance to an eight-team, single-elimination bracket with the quarterfinals, semifinals and championship being contested on the following three days. The winner of the Pac-12 Softball Tournament will receive the Conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Limited tickets are still available by visiting pac12.me/SBTix.

WELCOME TO THE HALL, COACH !

Head coach Kelly Inouye-Perez became the 20th member of the UCLA softball program to be inducted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame last fall. She joins her associate head coach and lifelong Lisa Fernandez. The only person ever to win a NCAA Softball Championship as both a player and coach, Inouye-Perez has been affiliated with eight of UCLA softball's 12 NCAA championships – two as head coach (2010, 2019), three as an assistant coach (1999, 2003, 2004) and three as a player (1989, 1990, 1992). The Bruins are the all-time winningest program at the Women's College World Series with 107 wins in the tournament's 40-year history, and UCLA has journeyed to Oklahoma City in seven straight postseasons for the longest active streak in softball. Inouye-Perez leads all active Pac-12 softball coaches with 723 overall victories and 238 conference victories, securing three regular season Pac-12 titles in her tenure as head coach.

Entering her 17th season and 35th straight year in Westwood, The Shelly Carlin UCLA Head Softball Coach Kelly Inoue-Perez comes off her ninth appearance in the Women's College World Series in 2022, finishing in a tie for third. Inoue-Perez has further cemented UCLA as the greatest program in the history of the sport with a pair of national championships in 2010 and 2019. She is the only person to ever win an NCAA Championship as both a coach and player.

Inoue-Perez has contributed to eight of UCLA softball's 12 NCAA championships – three as a player, two as head coach and three as an assistant coach under NFCA Hall of Fame coach Sue Enquist from 1994-2006. UCLA leads all of college softball with 12 NCAA championships and 31 Women's College World Series appearances. The Bruins are the all-time winningest program at the Women's College World Series with 103 wins in the tournament's 40-year history. UCLA has journeyed to Oklahoma City in seven straight postseasons for the longest active streak in softball.

As of May 2, 2023, she leads all active Pac-12 coaches with 767 overall victories and 259 conference victories, securing four regular season Pac-12 titles in her tenure as head coach. The Bruins have claimed a conference-best 12 Pac-10/12 titles since joining the league in 1987.

Numerous Bruin players have prospered under Inoue-Perez's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. Rachel Garcia was a three-time winner of the Honda Award for Softball (2018, 2019, 2021) and the first two-time winner of the Honda Cup (2019, 2021) which is given to the best female athlete in any collegiate sport. Garcia also was a three-time USA Softball Player of the Year. Inoue-Perez has directed 37 NFCA All-Americans, 75 NFCA All-Region plaudits and 97 All-Pac-10/12 accolades.

Four players who have competed in the Inoue-Perez era of UCLA softball have gone on to represent Team USA in the Olympics. Most recently, four Bruins – Rachel Garcia, Bubba Nickles, Delaney Spaulding and Ally Carda – donned the Red, White and Blue at the 2020 Tokyo Summer Olympics and brought home the silver medal.

UCLA has hauled in six Pac-10/12 Player of the Year awards since Inoue-Perez took the reigns of the program, beginning with Megan Langenfeld in 2010. Ally Carda was a two-time winner in 2014 and 2015 and Rachel Garcia received the award three times (2018, 2019 and 2021), tying Lisa Fernandez's record.

Inoue-Perez and her staff have been consistently recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded NFCA West Regional Coaching Staff of the Year six times and received the national honor three times in 2010, 2019 and 2021. Inoue-Perez was an assistant coach on the 2000 and 2004 staffs under Enquist that won the NFCA West Regional award. Inoue-Perez has also been named Pac-12 Coach of the Year twice in 2010 and 2021.

UCLA softball's coaching core has remained intact since the inception of the program in 1975. The nexus of the Bruin coaching tree includes Sharron Backus, Sue Enquist, Kelly Inouye-Perez, Lisa Fernandez and Kirk Walker. With Enquist, Inouye-Perez and Fernandez all playing under Backus, and Walker getting his start as a graduate assistant under Backus in 1984, all five coaches are inextricably connected to the program's beginning. This is one of the reasons for UCLA's renown strength in culture and alumni network.



LISA FERNANDEZ

The Mark Kalmansohn UCLA Associate Head Softball Coach, 25th season
Alma Mater: UCLA '95

- Considered one of the greatest players in the history of the sport ... begins her 25th season on the Bruin coaching staff in 2023 ... primary coaching responsibilities are in the Bruin bullpen ... elevated to Associate Head Coach this past offseason.

- In addition to overseeing UCLA's pitching staff, Fernandez also manages the Bruins' recruiting efforts.

- UCLA has finished top five nationally and first in the Pac-12 in earned run average in all four seasons since Fernandez over the role at the end of 2018.

- This is Fernandez's second stint as a full-time assistant coach for UCLA (1997-99, 2007-present), also serving as a volunteer assistant from 2000-04 ... has coached the Bruins to five NCAA Championships in 1999, 2003, 2004, 2010 and 2019 ... also on the staff for four Pac-10/12 Championships in 1999, 2002, 2009, 2019 and 2021.

- A three-time member of the NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year in 2004, 2010 and 2019.

- Has coached nine Bruin hurlers to 20 NFCA All-American awards ... under her tutelage, Rachel Garcia won two Honda Broderick Cups, three Honda Sport Awards, one NFCA National Player of the Year, one NFCA Pitcher of the Year, two Pac-12 Player of the Years, one Pac-12 Pitcher of the year and two of her three NFCA First Team All-American honors.

- Megan Faraimo has won two NFCA All-America awards and was honored as Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year in 2022 with the help of Fernandez.

- Inducted into the ASA/USA Softball National Hall of Fame in 2013, joining Sharron Backus, Gina Vecchione, Sheila Cornell, Dot Richardson and Sue Enquist ... a decade prior, she was inducted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003.

- Fernandez is a three-time Olympic Gold Medalist, having helped Team USA to victories in the 1996, 2000 and 2004 Olympic Games.

- Played at UCLA from 1990-93 and completed her psychology degree in 1995 ... a three-time winner of the sport's Honda Award, Fernandez became the first softball player to win the prestigious Honda-Broderick Cup in 1993, given to the most outstanding collegiate female athlete in all sports ... a four-time, First Team All-American, Fernandez led the Bruins to two national championships (1990 & 1992) and two runner-up finishes (1991 & 1993) ... was also named All-Region and All-Pac-10 First Team each season and Pac-10 Player of the Year her final three years.

- Previously was a member of the Bruin staff from 1984-94, beginning as a graduate assistant for UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame Coaches Sharron Backus and Sue Enquist.

- Formerly the head softball coach at Oregon State from 1995-12 where he is the all-time winningest coach in program history and the fifth-winningest in Oregon State history regardless of sport ... posted a 594-490-3 record (.548 winning percentage) ... led the Beavers to 10 times postseason appearances, including their first-ever WCWS berth in 2006 ... under Walker's tutelage, the Beavers earned 79 All-Pac-10/12 honors and 10 All-American awards.

- A visible and vocal advocate for diversity and inclusion in sports across the country, he is one of the founders of the Equality Coaching Alliance and the LGBT Sports Coalition. Walker also serves as a founding board member for the non-profit Sports Equality Foundation along with being the chair of the UCLA Athlete Allies committee for UCLA Athletics.

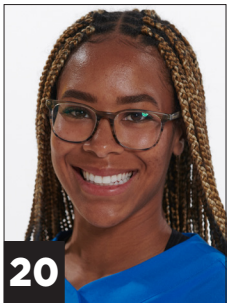

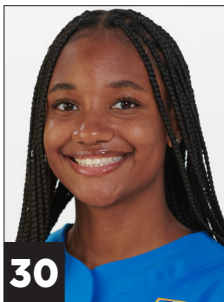
