Game Summary

Eastern Washington's season came to a close with a 66-53 loss to Northern Arizona in the first round of the Big Sky Tournament. Mason Williams led the Eagles with 20 points, while Emmett Marquardt and Nic McClain each pulled down six rebounds. Despite shooting 42% from three, Eastern couldn't overcome NAU's rebounding advantage and timely scoring runs. Head coach Dan Monson reflected on the loss, noting the team's struggle to find consistency and capitalize on momentum throughout the season.

The Eagles opened strong with early threes from Andrew Cook and Williams, but scoring droughts proved costly as Northern Arizona built and maintained their lead. Even with late efforts from Williams and Marquardt, a second-half 10-0 run by NAU created a gap Eastern couldn't close. The Eagles finished the year 10-22 overall and 6-12 in Big Sky play.

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TALKING POINTS

Season Two in Cheney: Monson's Blueprint

Back in April 2024 Eastern Washington University named Dan Monson as the 20th head men's basketball coach in program history.

In his first season as Head Coach, Monson led the Eagles to a double-digit win season. Under his leadership, several Eagles had career seasons, with Emmett Marquardt, Nic McClain, and Mason Williams being notable standouts. Monson also led the team to several marquee road wins against Sacramento State and Weber State, the Weber win being a notable dominant performance 72-49.

Over his career, Monson has led his programs to 13 postseason appearances, including four NCAA Tournament bids (1999, 2005, 2012, 2024) and nine NIT appearances, winning seven games. Over his career, Monson led his programs to nine conference championships and earned five Coach of the Year awards.

Monson is no stranger to Spokane County after coaching Gonzaga in the 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons where he played a pivotal role in the start of the program's current success. Led by Monson, the 'Zags advanced to the 1999 Elite Eight, winning both the WCC regular season and conference tournament championships that season. Monson went 24-10 in his first season with the Bulldogs, advancing to the second round of the NIT after winning the regular season title. He was named WCC Coach of the Year in '98.

Recently, Monson was the head coach at Long Beach State, leaving as the program's all-time winningest coach (275). In 2024, he led the team to the NCAA Tournament after winning the Big West Tournament as the No. 4 seed. He also led the Dirtbags to the 2011-12 NCAA Tournament, along with four NIT appearances during his tenure. In his 17 seasons at Long Beach, Monson coached four Big West Player of the Year winners and 18 First-Team All-Big West honorees.

Prior to Long Beach, Monson spent eight seasons as the head coach at Minnesota. In the 2004-05 season, the Gophers won 21 games and went to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in six seasons. He advanced to the Big Ten tournament five times and made four appearances in the NIT with six wins.

Along with coaching at the collegiate level, Monson was on the staff for two USA Basketball teams. He served on the 20-and-Under World Championships in 2004 and the 1999 Men's World University Games, winning gold medals at both events.

Monson started his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach for the University of Ala-

bama-Birmingham, where he spent two seasons with the Blazers. He earned his master's degree in education, emphasizing athletic administration from UAB in 1988. Monson earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics from Idaho in 1985.

Monson's dad, Don, was the head coach for Idaho and led the Vandals to the Sweet 16 in the 1982 tournament. Idaho also qualified for the 1981 NCAA Tournament after winning the Big Sky championship. Don started his coaching career at Cheney High School in the 1950s.

Core Returners

The Eagles return seven key players from last season Angelo Winkel, Tyler Powell, Elijah Thomas, Andrew Cook, Maddox Monson, Emmett Marquardt, and Shaumba Ngoyi who bring valuable experience and leadership as they take the court for the Eagles this year

Transfer Arrivals

The Eagles have bolstered their roster with a significant group of transfers this season, as Isaiah Moses, Straton Rogers, Alton Hamilton IV, Kiree Huie, Johnny Radford, and Jojo Anderson suit up in Eagle red for the first time in their collegiate careers. These newcomers bring experience from programs such as Miami, UC Riverside, Whitworth, the College of Idaho, and Lewis-Clark State, adding depth and talent to a competitive lineup.

Freshman Faces

The Eagles welcome two freshmen to the roster this season, Cole Scherer from Littleton, Colorado, and Alan Gballou from Layton, Utah. The pair represent the underclassmen for the Eagles this year, bringing fresh energy to a veteran dominated lineup and promise to the program's future.

Gauntlet Non-Conference

Coach Monson has forged a challenging non-conference schedule testing the Eagles early and preparing them for Big Sky play. The season opens in Los Angeles, where Eastern will take on nationally ranked No. 12 UCLA. The Eagles will also hit the road for matchups against LMU, Colorado, and Seattle U before returning home to host Eastern Oregon.

Non-conference action concludes with a tough stretch, as the Eagles face Washington State, Utah, and nationally ranked No. 8 BYU in three consecutive games, a demanding slate that promises to sharpen the team against elite competition.

Academic Excellence

Eastern had nine named to the Winter All-Academic Team for the 2024-25 season. Andrew Cook, Pavlo Dziuba, Sebastian Hartmann, Emmett Marquardt, Tyler Powell, Jackson Seale, Sam Stockton, Elijah Thomas, and Angelo Winkel were all recognized.

DAN MONSON

Head Coach (2nd season)

Dan Monson was hired as the 20th head coach in Eastern Washington men's basketball history on April 12, 2024. Monson has 27 years of Division I head coaching experience, with 445 wins, four NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2005, 2012, 2024), nine conference championships and four Coach of the Year awards. He has nine National Invitational appearances, winning seven games.

In his first season as Head Coach, Monson led the Eagles to a double-digit win season. Under his leadership, several Eagles had career seasons, with Emmett Marquardt, Nic McClain, and Mason Williams being notable standouts. Monson also led the team to several marquee road wins against Sacramento State and Weber State, the Weber win being a notable dominant performance 72-49.

Monson arrives in Cheney after serving as the head coach at Long Beach State, leaving as the program's all-time winningest coach with 275 wins. He led the team to the '24 NCAA Tournament after winning the Big West Tournament as the No. 4 seed. In his 17 seasons at Long Beach, Monson coached four Big West Player of Year winners and 18 First-Team All-Big West honorees. He led the Dirtbags to the 2011-12 NCAA Tournament and had four NIT appearances during his tenure.

Prior to Long Beach, Monson spent eight seasons as the head coach at Minnesota. In the 2004-05 season, the Gophers won 21 games and went to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in six seasons. Prior to Carroll, Lundgren was the associate head coach at the College of Southern Idaho from 2019 to 2023. In the 2022-23 season, Southern Idaho went undefeated (29-0) and finished as the No. 1 team in the NJCAA Rankings. The team won the regular season titles in 2023 and 2021, with the tournament title in '23. CSI qualified for the NJCAA national tournament in 2021 and '22 as well.

Lundgren's first head coaching job was at Vallivue High School from 2015 to 2019. He earned Idaho Press Tribune Boy's Athletics Coach of the year for the 2016-17 season after leading Vallivue to the Idaho 4A state title game. Vallivue also won the 2018-19 Southern IDaho Conference regular season title.

Lundgren began his coaching career at Boise State University as the Director of Player Development from 2011 to 2015. He graduated from Boise State with his Bachelor's Degree in Mass Communication/Journalism in 2012 and earned his Masters Degree in Educational Leadership in 2015.

LARRY ANDERSON

Assistant Coach (2nd season)

Larry Anderson follows Monson from Long Beach to Eastern after working as an assistant coach for the 2023-24 season. This past season, Anderson was key in helping LBSU's run to the Big West Tournament Championship and NCAA Tournament berth. With Anderson's guidance, LBSU ranked first in the Big West in scoring offense (77.4), offensive rebounds (12.5), blocked shots (4.2) and steals (7.9).

LBSU finished the season with a 21-15 overall record and 10-10 in the Big West. The team was the only school in the country to have a win over a Big 10 (Michigan), Big East (DePaul) and a Pac-12 school (USC). In the classroom, LBSU earned a 3.2 team GPA, the highest mark in program history.

Anderson also worked directly to develop three All-Big West players in forward Aboubacar Traore (First Team), forward Lassina Traore (Second Team) and guard Marcus Tshonis (Honorable mention).

Before working at LBSU, Anderson was an assistant coach at Cerritos College (Norwalk, Calif.) in the 2022-23 season. Anderson helped mentor student-athletes on the court and in the classroom to help them to pursue a degree at a four-year university.

Anderson is an alumni of LBSU, playing from 2008 to 2012 with the program. In 2012, Anderson was named Big West Defensive Player of the Year as the team won the conference and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Anderson ranks seventh in LBSU history with 1,538 points, while ranking eighth in assists (362) and ninth in rebounds (591). He was just the second player to have 1500 points, 500 rebounds and 300 assists.

Anderson played in the NBA G League from 2013 to 2014 with the Springfield Armor, now know as the Grand Rapids Gold. He also played overseas with Okapi Aalstar (Belgium), Leputan Korikobrat (Finland), Maccabi Raanana (Israel) and BC Nokia (Finland).

Eastern Washington University head men's basketball coach Dan Monson announced the addition of Chris Martin to the Eagles' coaching staff on Monday. Martin joins EWU after a highly successful tenure at Eastern Arizona College, where he played a pivotal role in elevating the program to national prominence.

Martin spent the last three seasons at Eastern Arizona College (2022–25), helping guide the program to back-to-back ACCAC Conference and NJCAA Region I Championships in 2024 and 2025 — the program's first titles since the mid-1990s. Under head coach Cameron Turner, Martin helped the Gila Monsters compile an impressive 76-20 record (.791), including a 29-4 campaign in 2025 that featured a No. 16 national ranking, the third-best net efficiency mark in the country, and a runner-up finish in the NJCAA West District.

Known for his commitment to player development, Martin coached multiple student-athletes to All-ACCAC and All-Region honors, including standouts Armari Carraway and Raysean Seamster, who both earned Region I MVP recognition and NJCAA All-American honors. His influence also extended to the classroom, where Eastern Arizona posted three straight years with team GPAs above 3.30, produced eight Academic All-Americans, and achieved a 100% graduation and scholarship placement rate for sophomores.

Prior to Eastern Arizona, Martin spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Corban University (NAIA) in Salem, Oregon, focusing on recruiting, guard development, scouting, and game strategy. He helped lead the Warriors to the CCC Spring Championship in 2020 with a 15-3 record.

As a player, Martin began his career at NCAA Division II Cal State Los Angeles before transferring to Corban, where he played a key role in the program's 2017 CCC Tournament Championship run. In the title game, he hit 10 three-pointers in the second half to help secure a berth in the NAIA National Tournament.

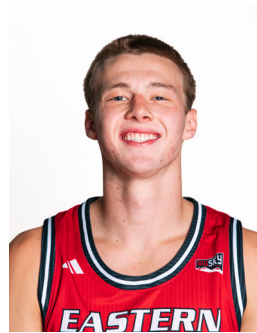
