# TEAM NOTABLES

## OPENING TIP

- Indiana University is set to begin its annual west coast road trip against UCLA on Saturday, Jan. 31. Tip is scheduled for 5 p.m. ET at Pauley Pavilion. Guy Huberman (PxP) and Matt Muehlebach (Analyst) will be on the call for the Peacock broadcast.

- UCLA (15-6, 7-3 B1G) is under the direction of seventh-year head coach Mick Cronin. During his 23-year head coaching career, Cronin has posted 15 20-win seasons, which includes four of the last five seasons in Westwood.

- The Bruins provide a balanced offensive attack with five players that averaged north of 10.0 points per game. Senior forward Tyler Bildeau has averaged a team-best 18.2 points and 5.4 rebounds per night.

- Senior guard Skyy Clark has posted 13.5 points per night and made 34 3-pointers in 14 appearances. Preseason All-Big Ten senior guard Donovan Dent has compiled 13.1 points, 6.6 assists, and 1.5 steals per contest.

- Sophomore guard Trent Perry (11.6 points per game) and Junior wing Eric Dailey Jr. (10.8) round out the double-figure scorers.

## SERIES HISTORY

- For the second time as conference foe and 14th time overall, two iconic college basketball brands will meet up on the court. UCLA leads the all-time series against Indiana by a count of 7-6, which includes a 72-68 Bruin win in Bloomington on Feb. 14, 2025.

- The two storied programs have combined for over 4,000 wins, 181 NCAA Tournament wins, 87 NCAA Tournament appearances, 26 Final Fours, and 16 NCAA Championships.

## LAST TIME OUT

- Indiana (14-7, 5-5 B1G) earned the program's first ranked win of the season with a 72-67 result over No. 12/12 Purdue on Tuesday, Jan. 27, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

- Fifth-year senior forward **Lamar Wilkerson** led the Indiana attack with 19 points, seven rebounds, and three assists. The game marked his eighth conference contest with at least 15 points scored.

- Junior guard **Nick Dorn** continued his hot streak with 18 points on 4-of-9 shooting from behind the 3-point line in his second straight start. He has averaged 20.5 points, 5.0 made 3-pointers, and 2.5 steals per game as a starter this season.

- Redshirt senior guard **Conor Enright** played all 40 minutes, drew the primary defensive assignment on All-American guard Braden Smith, and did not commit a foul. Enright finished the game with eight assists, his eighth game with at least five assists this season. He scored five of his eight points in the final 75 seconds of the game to seal the win.

- Indiana dished out 16 assists against just eight turnovers, the ninth game this season with fewer than 10 giveaways.

## BIG TEN BRILLIANCE

- Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** has averaged 21.9 points per night in Big Ten Conference play this season. He has shot 47.2% (75-of-159) from the floor, 40.0% (36-of-90) from the 3-point line, and 89.2% (33-of-37) from the free throw line in league play.

- The Sam Houston State transfer has scored 15-plus points in eight of Indiana's 10 conference games, has scored at least 20 points five times, added a 32-point night against No. 10 Nebraska (Jan. 10), and went for a career-best 44 points against Penn State (Dec. 9).

- Wilkerson is top four among Big Ten players in total points (219), points per game (21.9), made 3-pointers (36), and 3-point shooting percentage (40.0%) in league play.

## LONG-DISTANCE CALLS

- Indiana has averaged 10.6 made 3-pointers per game, which is fourth in the Big Ten and 23rd nationally, and 11.0 triples per league game. The Hoosiers have buried 10 or more triples in 14 games. In those contests, IU holds a record of 10-4 and averaged 86.2 points per game.

- The Hoosiers buried 14 triples in consecutive games against Marquette (Nov. 9) and Milwaukee (Nov. 12), the first time an IU team converted at least 14 3-point field goals in consecutive games since November of 2005.

- Indiana canned 17 3-pointers against Penn State (Dec. 9), the most in a game since 2016 (19). The Hoosiers have made 17-plus triples in five games in program history.

- Fifth-year senior **Lamar Wilkerson** is 20th nationally and second in the Big Ten with 3.3 made 3-pointers per game. Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** (2.8) is fourth in the B1G.

- Junior guard **Nick Dorn** (2.2) is 11th in the league. The Elon transfer has made 41-of-91 attempts (45.1%) from long range this season. He has made at least one triple in 14 games.

## TWENTY-POINT TRIO

- In the 82-59 Indiana victory at Rutgers on Friday, Jan. 23, the Hoosier trio of fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** (27 points), junior guard **Nick Dorn** (23), and redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** (22) tallied 72 points on 15-of-33 (45.5%) shooting from the 3-point line.

- The three-headed scoring monster recorded 87.8% of the Hoosier points in the win and became the first set of teammates to each score 20-plus points in four seasons.

- Trayce Jackson-Davis** (31 points), **Miller Kopp** (28), and **Parker Stewart** (20) all reached the 20-point threshold in a double-overtime setback at Syracuse on Nov. 30, 2021.

- Robert Johnson** (28 points), **Juwon Morgan** (20), and **Justin Smith** (20) were the last group to accomplish the feat in a conference game when they combined for 68 points at Minnesota on Jan. 6, 2018.

## LAMAR'S LEGENDARY NIGHT IN THE HALL

- Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** torched the nets for a career-high 44 points, a Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall record, on a program-record 10 made 3-pointers.

- Per OptaSTATS, Wilkerson is the only Division I or NBA player in the last 30 seasons to score 40-plus points and make 10-plus 3-pointers in a game while playing less than 25 minutes.

- His scoring outburst marked the most by a Hoosier against a Big Ten opponent since **Mike Woodson** scored 48 points at Illinois on March 3, 1979, and the most in a Big Ten home game since **Jimmy Rayl** posted 44 points against Wisconsin on Feb. 12, 1962. He is the first Big Ten player since Luka Garza (44 on Dec. 6, 2019) to score at least 44 points in a single game.

- Wilkerson has one of 14 games in which a player scored at least 40 points in a game this season. He is the only one to do so in less than 25 minutes. In the last 30 seasons of Division I men's college basketball only 10 players have scored 40-plus points in under 25 minutes on the court.

- The school-record 10 made 3-pointers were the most by a Big Ten player since Jordan Bohannon (10) against Maryland on Feb. 10, 2022.

## DORN'S EMERGENCE

- Junior guard **Nick Dorn** has averaged 8.8 points per game on 41-of-91 (45.1%) shooting from the 3-point line in 19.5 minutes per game across 19 appearances this season.

- The Elon transfer earned his first start as a Hoosier at Rutgers on Jan. 23. He responded with a season-high 23 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the 3-point line.

- In seven games with 20-plus minutes played, Dorn has averaged 12.5 points and shot 22-of-49 (44.9%) from behind the arc.

- Dorn has made at least three 3-point field goals in seven contests. The Hoosiers are 5-2 and the veteran guard has averaged 15.7 points in those games.

## THAT'S AN OFFENSIVE STAT

- The Hoosiers scored 90-plus points in three-straight contests to open the season for the first time since 2007-08. In total, Indiana has scored 85-plus points seven times.

- IU has averaged 80.7 points per contest and shot 47.3% (77th nationally) from the floor, 35.9% (80th) from the 3-point line, 78.2% (12th) from the free throw line, and an effective field goal percentage of 56.5% (23rd).

- The Hoosiers have averaged 82.5 points per game in six high-major games at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. In those games, IU has shot 169-of-336 (50.3%) from the floor, 68-of-179 (38.0%) from the 3-point line, and 89-of-115 (77.4%) from the free throw line. Indiana is 11-2 in front at home this season.

- Indiana has dished out 20-or-more assists in six games, the most in a single season since 2022-23. IU handed out a season-best 30 dimes against Penn State on Dec. 9, 2025, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The total marked the second-most and program history and the most in a Big Ten game since 1981.

- The Hoosiers average 17.2 helpers per night and have assisted on 63.8% of its made field goals, the 13th-best rate in the country.

- Indiana boasts an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.66, the 23rd-best mark in the country. IU has recorded 362 assists (on 567 made field goals) compared to 217 turnovers. Four Hoosiers average at least 2.0 assists per outing, led by 4.3 from redshirt senior guard **Conor Enright**.

- Three Hoosiers average double-figure scoring numbers, led by fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson**. He has averaged 19.4 points per night on 39.7% (69-of-174) shooting from the 3-point line. He has made at least four 3-pointers in nine games.

## THE VOICE OF INDIANA ATHLETICS

Veteran voice of the Hoosiers Don Fischer enters his 53rd season as the play-by-play voice of Indiana Men's Basketball. During that time, he's called more than 2,200 games, four NCAA Men's Basketball Championship games, and a CFP championship run. He's been honored as the National Sports Media Association's Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 32 times, and was awarded the prestigious National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's Chris Schenkel Award. He was also awarded with the Indiana University Bicentennial Award in 2019 in recognition for his enormous contributions to Indiana University and IU Athletics. He was inducted into the IU Athletic Hall of Fame in the fall of 2022.

## HITTING THE CENTURY MARK

• Indiana has scored 100 points or more in four games this season: vs. Marquette (100-77) on Nov. 9, vs. Milwaukee (101-70) on Nov. 19, vs. Bethune-Cookman (100-56) on Nov. 29, and vs. Penn State (113-72) on Dec. 9. The stretch of 100-point games marks the most in a single season since 2016-17 (5 games).

• IU has scored 100-plus points in at least four games during 12 seasons: 1964-65 (7 times), 1990-91 (6), 1974-75 (6), 1963-64 (6), 2016-17 (5), 1992-93 (5), 1970-71 (5), **2025-26 (4)**, 2015-16 (4), 1975-76 (4), 1962-63 (4), and 1961-62 (4).

• The Hoosiers back-to-back triple-digit offensive outputs against Marquette (Nov. 9) and Milwaukee (Nov. 12) marked the first time the program has scored at least 100 points in consecutive regulation games since Nov. 21-26, 2005. IU was the first team to put up 100 points on a Shaka Smart coached program.

• Indiana has put together 10 50-point halves this season, which includes seven first-half 50 pieces. IU put up 52 points in the first half in the victory over Washington (Jan. 4).

## WILKERSON NAMED CO-BIG PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• Indiana fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** was named Co-Big Ten Player of the Week, the conference announced on Dec. 15.

• The Sam Houston State transfer averaged 29.5 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 1.5 steals in just 23.0 minutes per night as the Hoosiers split games against Penn State (113-72 on Dec. 9) and at Kentucky (60-72 on Dec. 13). He shot 63.6% (21-of-33) from the floor, 60.0% (12-of-20) from the 3-point line, and 83.3% (5-of-6) from the free throw line.

• Wilkerson opened the week with a career-high 44 points against Penn State, a Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall record, and a program-record 10 made 3-pointers. He added four rebounds, four assists, and three steals in 24 minutes. He followed the historical outing with 15 points and two rebounds at Kentucky.

## TUCKER DEVRIES HONORED BY BIG TEN CONFERENCE

• Indiana redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** was named Co-Big Ten Player of the Week, the conference announced on Nov. 10.

• In a pair of Hoosier victories to open the season, DeVries averaged 22.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 1.0 steal per game. He shot 57.1% (16-of-28) from the floor and 58.8% (10-of-17) from the 3-point line.

• The two-time Missouri Valley Player of the Year began his Cream 'n Crimson career with an 18-point, 11-rebound double-double in a 98-51 win over Alabama A&M. His encore performance included a game-high 27 points (24 in the first half) to pair with six rebounds in a 100-77 win over Marquette at the United Center in Chicago to earn Most Outstanding Player of the Waterkeeper Alliance Invitational honors.

• DeVries is the first Hoosier to be named Big Ten Player of the Week since **Tracy Jackson-Davis** on March 6, 2023.

## A NEW PRINCE OF BLOOMINGTON

- Four-star combo guard **Prince-Alexander Moody** signed his letter of intent to continue his basketball career at Indiana University under head men's basketball coach Darian DeVries.
- A three-year letterwinner for head coach Jay Gavin at Bishop McNamara. Moody has compiled 1,075 career points, 119 made 3-pointers through 85 career games in high school
- He was named a 2025 Peach Jam Standout player, one of the 2025 EYBL Best Performers, and averaged 14.3 points, 3.1 rebounds, and 1.8 assists per game for Team Takeover during the EBYL season.
- **DeVries on Moody:** Prince is the ultimate team guy and competitor. He has a great feel for the game and will fit in perfectly with what we do at both ends of the floor.

## VAUGHN OF A KIND

- Four-star wing **Vaughn Karvala** signed his letter of intent to continue his basketball career at Indiana University under head men's basketball coach Darian DeVries.
- A three-year letterwinner for head coach Chris Siebert at Oregon High School in Wisconsin before transferring to Bella Vista Prep, a preseason top 10 team, prior to his senior season.
- He averaged 26.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, 3.8 assists, and 1.6 steals per game as a junior and shot 53.5% from the floor and 41.9% from the 3-point line.

**DeVries on Karvala:** Vaughn has very good size, skill, and athleticism that makes him a highlight reel waiting to happen in the open floor. When you combine that with his ability to shoot the ball, he has a very bright future here.

## PORTAL COMBAT

- The Hoosiers underwent a complete overhaul of the roster during the offseason with 10 transfer additions. The class ranked third in the Big Ten Conference and 10th nationally according to 247Sports.
- The class is headlined by top-125 national portal acquisitions in redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** (West Virginia), fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** (Sam Houston), senior forward **Reed Bailey** (Davidson), junior guard **Nick Dorn** (Elon), sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway** (Troy), and junior guard **Jasai Miles** (North Florida).
- The 10-man portal class made 554 starts in NCAA Division I basketball prior to joining the Hoosiers. IU is the only program to bring in at least 10 transfers with 30-plus collegiate starts.
- Indiana joins Baylor, Memphis, Miami (Fla.), UCF, West Virginia, and Xavier as the only high-major programs to return zero points from the 2024-25 roster.
- Head Strength and Conditioning Coach **Ryan Horn** worked with DeVries in a similar capacity at both Drake (2023-24) and West Virginia (2024-25).
- Athletic Trainer **Andrew Vereen** spent the last three years with Drake and was part of three-straight Missouri Valley Conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Director of Player Personnel **Justin Bailey** spent the last four seasons at Sam Houston. He helped mentor the breakout 2024-25 season from current Hoosier **Lamar Wilkerson**.
- Director of Operations **Garrett Sturtz**, Video and Player Development Analyst **Jalen Cannady**, Graduate Manager **Jackson Creel**, and Graduate Manager **ShanQuan Hemphill** round out the support staff.

## DARIAN DEVRIES DEEP DIVE

• Indiana head men's basketball coach **Darian DeVries** was announced as the 31st head coach in program history on March 18, 2025.

• Prior to Indiana, DeVries spent one season in Morgantown as the head coach of West Virginia. He inherited a roster that returned only two players and 2.8 percent of its scoring from a 2023-24 roster that finished 9-23. The Mountaineers more than doubled its previous season's win total, going 19-13 overall and 10-10 in the Big 12. WVU earned a series of signature victories this season, including three wins over top-10 teams (No. 2 Iowa State, No. 3 Gonzaga, and No. 7 Kansas).

• His first head coaching stint began in 2018-19 at Drake, a program that had been to one NCAA Tournament in the previous 47 years, had five 20-win seasons in its 112-year history, and was a combined 40-87 (31.5%) in the six years prior to his arrival. His Drake teams won at least 20 games each year, including 25 or more in each of his final four seasons. During those final four seasons at Drake the Bulldogs were one of only three Division I programs (Gonzaga and Houston) to win at least 25 games each season. His teams won MVC postseason tournament championships in his final two seasons, led the league in scoring offense twice, and he finished his Drake career with a 150-55 record.

• DeVries began his coaching career at Creighton, where he spent 20 years (17 as an assistant coach) as a member of the Bluejays' staff under Dana Altman and Greg McDermott. The program went a combined 460-211 during his 20 seasons and earned 19 postseason berths, including 12 NCAA trips.

## DEVRIES ANNOUNCES ASSISTANTS, SUPPORT STAFF

- In his debut season, Indiana head men's basketball coach **Darian DeVries** announced four assistant coaches and eight members of his support staff.
  - Assistant coach **Kenny Johnson** returned to IU after one season at Georgetown. KJ's first stint with the Hoosiers came from 2012-14 and featured an outright Big Ten Championship. He coached numerous NBA players including NBA All-Stars **Victor Oladipo** and Donovan Mitchell.
  - Assistant coach **Rod Clark** spent the last four seasons at Tennessee. The Vols, appeared in every AP Top 25 poll, earned wins over 30 AP top 25 programs, and claimed two SEC Championships during his Knoxville tenure.
  - Assistant coach **Drew Adams**, a Bloomington South alum, returned to his hometown after two seasons at Cincinnati. During his time with the Bearcats, the program won 41 games and made a pair of postseason tournaments.
  - Assistant coach **Nick Norton** moved to Bloomington after one season at West Virginia. He played a big role in the development of Javon Small, the fourth WVU player in program history to be named to the All-Big 12 First Team.
  - Special Assistant to the Head Coach **Mike Bargen** joined the Hoosiers after 10 highly successful seasons at Bradley. He also overlapped with DeVries at Creighton as a graduate manager from 2001-04.
  - Head Strength and Conditioning Coach **Ryan Horn** worked with DeVries in a similar capacity at both Drake (2023-24) and West Virginia (2024-25).
  - Athletic Trainer **Andrew Vereen** spent the last three years with Drake and was part of three-straight Missouri Valley Conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances.

## GAME-BY-GAME NOTABLES

### INDIANA 72, PURDUE 67 (GAME 21)

• Indiana (14-7, 5-5 B1G) earned the program's first ranked win of the season with a 72-67 result over No. 12/12 Purdue on Tuesday, Jan. 27, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• Fifth-year senior forward **Lamar Wilkerson** led the Indiana attack with 19 points, seven rebounds, and three assists. The game marked his eighth conference contest with at least 15 points scored.

• Junior guard **Nick Dorn** continued his hot shooting with 18 points on 4-of-9 shooting from behind the 3-point line in his second straight start. He has averaged 20.5 points, 5.0 made 3-pointers, and 2.5 steals per game as a starter this season.

• Redshirt senior guard **Conor Enright** played all 40 minutes, drew the primary defensive assignment on All-American guard Braden Smith, and did not commit a foul. Enright finished the game with eight assists, his eighth game with at least five assists this season. He scored five of his eight points in the final 75 seconds of the game to seal the win.

### INDIANA 82, RUTGERS 59 (GAME 20)

• Indiana (13-7, 5-5 B1G) went wire-to-wire in an 82-59 victory at Rutgers on Friday, Jan. 23, at Jersey Mike's Arena.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** posted 22 points, 10 rebounds, and six assists in his 125th career collegiate start. He is the seventh Hoosier in the last 30 seasons to post a 20-10-5 game.

• Junior guard **Nick Dorn** tallied a season-best 23 points on 6-of-10 shooting from behind the arc in his first start with the Cream and Crimson.

• Fifth-year senior forward **Lamar Wilkerson** added a team-best 27 points, his ninth 20-point outing of the season.

• The trio of DeVries, Dorn, and Wilkerson recorded 72 of the 82 Indiana points and became the first set of IU teammates to score 20-plus points each in a Big Ten game since Jan. 6, 2018, when **Robert Johnson** (28 points), **Juwon Morgan** (20), and **Justin Smith** (20) accomplished the feat.

### MICHIGAN 86, INDIANA 72 (GAME 19)

• Indiana (12-7, 3-5 B1G) fell in an 86-72 ballgame at No. 3/2 on Tuesday, Jan. 20, at Crisler Arena. The Hoosiers scored 43 points on 14-of-30 (46.7%) shooting from the floor, 7-of-17 (41.2%) shooting from the 3-point line, and 8-of-10 (80.0%) from the free throw line in the second half.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** scored all of his team-high 15 points in the second half. He made 4-of-9 attempts from behind the 3-point line to pair with three rebounds and three assists.

• Junior guard **Nick Dorn** tallied 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting from behind the arc. He added four rebounds in 29 minutes.

### IOWA 74, INDIANA 57 (GAME 18)

• Indiana (12-6, 3-4 B1G) fell in a 74-57 contest against Iowa on Saturday, Jan. 17, at Simon Skjodt Assmbley Hall.

• Sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway** led the Hoosier offense with 16 points, his eighth game with 15-plus points this season, on 8-of-12 shooting from the floor. He added four assists, two rebounds, and two steals in 31 minutes.

• Senior forward **Sam Alexis** provided his best statisical game of the Big Ten slate to date with 13 points on 5-of-7 shooting from the floor and eight rebounds. He grabbed three of the 12 Indiana offensive boards in the game.

### MICHIGAN STATE 81, INDIANA 60 (GAME 17)

• Indiana (12-5, 3-3 B1G) was tied at 53-53 with 11:19 to play in the second half at No. 12/12 Michigan State. The Spartans rattled off a 28-2 run over the next nine minutes of play to hand the Hoosiers an 81-60 setback at the Breslin Center on Tuesday, Jan. 13.

• Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** was the lone Hoosier in double figures with 19 points on 5-of-11 shooting from the 3-point line.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** added nine points and three assists. Senior forward **Reed Bailey** put up five points and a team-high seven rebounds.

### NEBRASKA 83, INDIANA 77 (GAME 16)

• Indiana (12-4, 3-2 B1G) fell late to No. 10/11 Nebraska by a score of 83-77 on Saturday, Jan. 10, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The Hoosiers led by as many as 16 points with nearly 18 minutes to play.

• Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** posted his fifth-straight 20-point game with a game-high 32 points, four rebounds, and four assists.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** added 17 points, six rebounds, and three assists. Senior forward **Reed Bailey** put up 10 points and a game-best nine rebounds.

### INDIANA 84, MARYLAND 66 (GAME 15)

• Indiana (12-3, 3-1 B1G) secured the program's first true road win of the season with an 84-66 result against Maryland on Wednesday, Jan. 7, at the XFINITY Center in College Park.

• Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** posted his fourth-straight 20-point game with a game-high 24 points and six rebounds. Senior forward **Reed Bailey** put up 15 points, six rebounds, and two assists in 28 bench minutes.

• All eight players that played pulled down at least one offensive rebound. The Hoosier bench grabbed seven offensive rebounds, led by three from freshman forward **Trent Sisley**.

### INDIANA 90, WASHINGTON 80 (GAME 14)

• Indiana (11-3, 2-1 B1G) scored 1.48 points per possession, shot 51.7% (31-of-60) from the floor, made 12 3-pointers, and turned the ball over just four times in a 90-80 victory over Washington on Sunday, Jan. 4, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• Redshirt senior guard **Conor Enright** turned in his best offensive performance to date with season highs in points (12) and assists (9). Sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway** produced 20 points (18 in the first half) on 4-of-4 shooting from distance.

• Freshman forward **Trent Sisley** added 10 second-half points to lead the IU bench that recorded a 26-11 advantage over the visiting Huskies.

### INDIANA 81, SIENA 60 (GAME 13)

• Indiana (10-3, 1-1 B1G) converted 26-of-30 attempts from the free throw line to topple Siena by a score of 81-60 on Monday, Dec. 22, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** finished with a game-high 23 points on 7-of-15 shooting from the floor to go along with seven rebounds and four assists. He has averaged 26.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 4.3 assists, and 4.8 made 3-pointers per outing in his last four home games.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** and sixth-year senior guard Tayton Conerway each contributed 16 points. Junior guard **Nick Dorn** led the IU bench with 11 points, his fourth straight home game with 10-plus points.

### INDIANA 78, CHICAGO STATE 58 (GAME 12)

• Indiana (9-3, 1-1 B1G) knocked down 14 first-half 3-pointers to down Chicago State by a score of 78-58 on Saturday, Dec. 20, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** finished with a game-high 21 points on 5-of-12 shooting from the 3-point line to go along with four rebounds, six assists, and one steal.

• Senior forward **Reed Bailey** posted 17 points and a season-high eight rebounds in 22 minutes off the bench. Junior guard **Nick Dorn** drilled 5-of-11 shots from distance to finish with 15 points and two rebounds.

### KENTUCKY 72, INDIANA 60 (GAME 11)

• Indiana (8-3, 1-1 B1G) went on the road and dropped a hard-fought contest at Kentucky by a score of 72-60 on Saturday, Dec. 13, at Rupp Arena.

• IU held a 49-42 lead with a 14:18 to play in the second half before border rival UK rattled off a 30-11 run to close the game.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** tallied 15 points, seven rebounds, and three assists. Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson**, who played through significant foul trouble, also produced 15 points. Sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway** added 11 points.

### INDIANA 113, PENN STATE 72 (GAME 10)

• Indiana (8-2, 1-1 B1G) put on an offensive clinic against Penn State in a 113-72 victory at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall on Tuesday, Dec. 9. The 113 points were the most scored against a B1G foe since dropping 118 in a win over Iowa on Feb. 17, 1990.

• The margin of victory (41 points) marked the largest for an Indiana team in Big Ten play since defeating Penn State by 48 points on Jan. 9, 1993.

• IU scored 1.57 points per possession, hit 42-of-61 (68.9%) from the floor, 17-of-31 (54.8%) from behind the arc, and 12-of-15 (80.0%) from the free throw line.

• Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** provided a night for the ages with a career-high 44 points, a Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall single-game record. He knocked down a program-record 10-of-15 3-pointers.

### LOUISVILLE 87, INDIANA 78 (GAME 9)

• Indiana (7-2, 0-1 B1G) dropped its second straight game against No. 6/6 Louisville by a score of 87-78 on Saturday, Dec. 6, at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Indianapolis. The game was the third annual CareSource Invitational.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** posted a game-best 26 points on 12-of-13 shooting from the free throw line. The game marked the fourth 20-point outing of the season for DeVries and the 45th of his career.

• Junior guard **Nick Dorn** scored 15 second-half points on 5-of-7 shooting from the 3-point line. Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** added 12 points, his fifth straight game with at least 10 points scored.

### MINNESOTA 73, INDIANA 64 (GAME 8)

• Indiana suffered its first setback of the season with a 73-64 result at Minnesota on Wednesday, Dec. 3.

- Indiana rattled off a 100-56 win over Bethune-Cookman on Saturday, Nov. 29, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

Darian DeVries was named Indiana Men's Basketball's 31st head coach on March 19, 2025. The Aplington, Iowa, native arrived in Bloomington with nearly 25 years of Division I coaching experience, including seven years as a head coach of Drake (2018-24) and West Virginia (2024-25). He advanced to the NCAA Tournament three of his final four seasons with Drake.

In his lone season at West Virginia the Mountaineers improved its previous season's win total by 10 games to an overall record of 19-13 and a 10-10 mark in Big XII games. WVU earned six Quad 1 victories, 13 wins over NET Top 100 programs, and four triumphs over ranked opponents.

West Virginia played the final 24 games of the season without two-time Larry Bird Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year, Tucker DeVries, who was lost for the season with an injury. The Mountaineers held a record of 6-2 with wins over No. 3 Gonzaga and No. 24 Arizona in the Battle 4 Atlantis at the time of the injury. WVU climbed as high as No. 21 in the Associated Press Top 25 (Week 10).

Under his guidance, senior guard Javon Small became the fourth Mountaineer in program history to be named to the All-Big 12 First Team. The Fort Wayne, Ind., native tied for the league lead with 18.5 points per game, was third in free throw percentage (88.1%), third in assists per game (5.6), fourth in 3-point percentage (35.3%), fourth in 3-point field goals per game (2.5), ninth in assist-to-turnover ratio (+2.1), and 12th in steals per game (1.6).

DeVries posted a record of 150-55 (73.2 winning percentage) at Drake. His final four seasons with the Bulldogs saw the program secure 108 wins (27 wins per season) to pair with three NCAA Tournament trips. He won 70.5% (79-33) of his Missouri Valley Conference games and claimed three MVC titles. He led Drake to six of the program's 11 20-wins in program history before leaving for West Virginia.

He inherited a program that had been to one NCAA Tournament in the previous 47 years, had five 20-win seasons in its 112-year history, and was a combined 40-87 (31.5%) in the six years prior to his arrival. He immediately turned the Missouri Valley Conference program's fortunes around, going 24-10 overall in year one and tying for the Missouri Valley Conference regular season championship. He won 20-plus games in all six seasons in Des Moines, including 25-plus victories in each of his final four seasons with the Bulldogs.

In 2023-24, DeVries led Drake to a 28-7 record, capping the season with a MVC Tournament title and the Bulldogs' third NCAA Tournament appearance in the last four years. Drake's 28 victories were its most since recording 28 in 2008.

DeVries, a two-time MVC Coach of the Year (2019 and 2021), was a finalist for the 2023-24 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, given annually to the top mid-major head coach in college basketball.

He led the Bulldogs back to the NCAA Tournament in 2022-23 and finished with a 27-8 record. Drake captured the 2023 MVC Tournament title for the first time under DeVries.

In his third year, DeVries led Drake to an 18-0 start and an AP Top 25 appearance. Despite losing two of his top players to injury, he led Drake to its first NCAA Tournament bid in 13 years, and its first NCAA Tournament win in 50 years over Wichita State. He was named MVC Coach of the Year for the second time in three years. Drake finished the season with a 26-5 record.

DeVries made history in his second season at Drake, becoming the first coach to lead an eight seed to a win over the top seed in the MVC Tournament, downing Northern Iowa, 77-56. The 2020 postseason was canceled after the UNI victory due to COVID-19. His Bulldogs won 20 games, marking the first time since 1971 the program had won 20-or-more games in consecutive seasons.

In his first season as head coach at Drake, DeVries led the Bulldogs to a 24-10 record after inheriting a team with the second-fewest returning letterwinners in the nation. He led the Bulldogs to their first regular season MVC title since 2008 and the program's 12th all-time postseason appearance, despite losing a potential MVC Player of the Year candidate to a season-ending knee injury in the first game of conference play. In his first season as a head coach, he was named MVC Coach of the Year and received the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award.

Prior to Drake, DeVries was an assistant coach at Creighton for 17 years under Greg McDermott and Dana Altman. He joined Creighton as a graduate manager and spent 20 years at Creighton. During his time there, he was part of 19 postseason appearances and 12 NCAA Tournament bids. Creighton was 460-211 overall and 231-129 in conference games during DeVries' tenure at Creighton.

DeVries is a 1998 graduate of Northern Iowa, where he played for coach Eldon Miller and ranks 31st all-time in career scoring with 1,084 points. He was a two-time MVC Scholar-Athlete Team selection and two-time team captain. DeVries led the Panthers in 3-point shooting for three seasons and converted on 44 percent of his attempts as a senior with 3.1 assists per game.

A native of Aplington, Iowa, DeVries attended Aplington-Parkersburg High and was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association (IHSAA) Hall of Fame in 2015.

He is the oldest of five siblings. His brother, Jared, was an All-American on the Iowa football team and played for the Detroit Lions for 12 seasons. Another brother, Dusty, also played football at Iowa, while his youngest brother, Jay, played football at Wartburg College. His sister, Jodi, was an All-MVC Second-Team selection in volleyball at Northern Iowa.

DeVries and his wife, Ashley, have a son, Tucker, and a daughter, Tatum. Tucker recently became the ninth-ever player and first since Doug McDermott to win the Larry Bird MVC Player of the Year trophy in back-to-back seasons while playing at Drake. He was also named an Associated Press All-America Honorable Mention selection in 2023-24.
