KNIGHT NOTES

STARTING FIVE - QUICK FACTS ABOUT THE KNIGHTS

- Themus Fulks (6.7 app) ranks second in the Big 12 and 11th nationally, accounting for 37.2% of UCF's scoring (965 points responsible for). He's one of two Big 12 players with at least seven 10+ assist games. After an 11 assist outing at BYU, Fulks holds the program's single-season assist record with 184 and counting.
- Jamichael Stillwell has eight double-doubles and ranks third in the Big 12 in offensive rebounds (3.23/g). UCF is 18-1 when winning the rebounding battle.
- UCF is 18-1 when leading with five minutes left, 19-0 when leading with two minutes left, 12-1 when recording 17+ assists, and 16-2 when shooting 45% or better. The Knights are 13-1 when holding opponents under 45% shooting and 14-3 when holding teams under 80 points. Control the glass (11-1 with 40+ rebounds) and share the ball, that's the blueprint.
- UCF earned an AP Top 25 ranking after beating No. 17 Kansas and owns four Quad 1 wins. Currently 52 NET (high of 30) and 54 KenPom, best metrics stretch of the Big 12 era.
- The Knights rank 57th nationally and fourth in the Big 12 at 34.0% from three. Set a program record with 19 threes vs. FGCU and has six 50% shooting games after four all last season. The Black and Gold knocked down a program-record 328 threes last year and are on pace to rival that production again.

GO KNIGHTS, MARCH ON

- The UCF Knights enter the big dance for the first time since the 2018-19 season, entering as the No. 10 seed, set to face No. 7 seed UCLA in Philadelphia. This marks the Black and Gold's second at-large bid in program history.
- UCF is one of only two teams, joined by Miami, to make the tournament without any returning scoring production from last season. Since 2007, UCF is now one of only three teams to make the tournament without bringing back any scoring production (UCF and Miami 2026, and Kentucky 2025).
- The Knights are the #10 seed for the first time in March Madness, previously placed as a 9 seed in the last tournament appearance in 2019. The other seeds were 16 in 1994 and 1996, 14 in 2004, and 15 in 2005.
- Under Head Coach Johnny Dawkins, UCF is 2-4 in the state of Pennsylvania, playing all games against former conference foe, the Temple Owls, losing its previous matchup 57-55 (3/2/23).
- The Big 12 in the first round year-over-year is 6-1 in 2025, 5-3 in 2024, and 5-2 in 2023. Big 12 teams when seeded in double-figures in the NCAA Tournament are 9-14 since 1997. Since 1997, Big 12 teams are 3-7 as a 10 seed, 3-7 as an 11 seed, 2-0 as a 12 seed, and 1-0 as a 13 seed. A Big 12 team hasn't won in the round of 64 as a 10 seed since Iowa State beat Notre Dame in 2013.
- UCF enters the field of 68 as a team with the second-fewest minutes played by freshman players on the team clocking in 13 total minutes (Prairie View A&M had zero all year).

THE KNIGHTS' CHECKMATE

- The Knights' blueprint for success has gone far beyond shooting percentages, driven by their ability to control the game.
- The Black and Gold have been unbeatable during games where they lead with two minutes remaining, sitting at 19-0.
- In games where UCF records 17 or more assists, the Knights post a 12-1 record.
- The Knights are 16-3 when logging a 45% field goal percentage or better. On the defensive-end, UCF is 13-1 when holding opponents below 45% from the field.
- Achieving 40-plus total rebounds in a game leads to success for the Black and Gold, registering a 11-1 record.
- UCF is 9-1 in games where the Knights shoot at or better than the Division 1 game averages for field goals made (27), field goals attempted (59), and field goal percentage (45.3%).
- Defense has been a defining strength for UCF, while holding its opponents under 80 points, with an 14-3 record in those matches.
- The Knights are 18-1 when controlling the glass and out rebounding their opponents.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)
DAWKINS IN THE BIG DANCE

- Johnny Dawkins has led teams to three NCAA Tournament appearances as a head coach (one at Stanford and two at UCF).
- In 2013-14, Dawkins guided Stanford men's basketball to a Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament.
- At UCF, Dawkins led the 2018-19 Knights to the Second Round of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament.
- As an assistant/associate head coach at Duke Blue Devils men's basketball, Dawkins was part of 10 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including one National Championship, one national runner-up finish, one Final Four, and five Sweet 16 appearances.
- As a player at Duke, Dawkins helped lead the program to three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a national title game appearance in 1986.

BACK-TO-BACK 20 WIN SEASONS

- UCF head coach Johnny Dawkins has led the Knights to back-to-back 20 win seasons for the first time since the 2012-13 season; they reached the 20-win milestone against No. 19 BYU inside the Marriott Center.
- Last season the Knights edged out 20 wins including a trip to the championship round at the inaugural College Basketball Crown.
- This season the Black and Gold have upset three ranked teams (#17 Kansas, #11 Texas Tech and #19 BYU) this mark ties for the most in a season, as UCF upset three ranked opponents during the 2023-24 season (No. 3 Kansas, No. 23 Oklahoma, and No. 23 Texas Tech).

KNIGHTS TOP CINCINNATI IN OT THRILLER AT BIG 12 TOURNAMENT

- The Knights bested the Cincinnati Bearcats 66-65 in overtime on Wednesday, after leading for just 5:51, a late surge powered the Knights to the win, sending them to the quarterfinals of the Big 12 Tournament for the first time since joining the conference.
- The win improved the squad to 21-10 on the season, marking the program's highest win total under head coach Johnny Dawkins since the 2018-19 campaign, when the Knights finished 24-9 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.
- Jamichael Stillwell led the way for the Black and Gold with a 17-point, 15-rebound double-double. Marking his eighth double-double of the season, with his rebound tally marking the most by any UCF player in a Big 12 Tournament game.

FULKS CONTROLS THE FLOW

- Milwaukee transfer Themus Fulks has quickly established himself as UCF's floor general, ranking second in the Big 12 and 11th nationally with 6.7 assists per game (214 assists) across 32 games. He delivered his most impressive performance in the Knights' win over Quinnipiac on Nov. 25, dishing out 13 assists, the most by a UCF player in more than a decade. That effort left him just one shy of the program's single-game record of 14, held by Kingsley Edwards and Cory Perry.
- After an 11 assist performance at BYU, Fulks now holds UCF's single-season assist record and will continue to shatter the record with more games to come.
- Fulks is one of only two players in the Big 12 with at least seven games with 10 or more assists, Texas Tech's Christian Anderson has reached the feat eight times this season.
- The Winston-Salem native has directly contributed 451 points himself and another 514 through his assists, giving him responsibility for 965 of UCF's 2,591 total points. That means he has accounted for an impressive 37.2 percent of the Knights' total scoring production this season.
- Fulks has recorded four point-assist double-doubles this season: 11 points and 10 assists against Oakland, an impressive 24 points and 12 assists in the win over FAU, 13 points and 12 assists in a road conference win against Kansas State, and 24 points and 11 assists at BYU. Fulks is the first Knight to ever have three point-assist double-doubles in a single season.
- The fifth year earned All-Big 12 Third Team honors along with All-Newcomer Team.
- Fulks is a finalist for the Riley Wallace Player of the Year Award, presented to the most impactful transfer in Division I College Basketball. The award is in honor of the longtime Hawaii Coach, who welcomed many transfers into the program and became the winningest coach in program history, appearing in the NCAA Tournament three times.

THE 4 FACTOR

- Number four, Jamichael Stillwell, who transferred from Milwaukee alongside Fulks, has become a dominant two-way presence for the Knights, already recording eight double-doubles across 32 games. Unsurprising for the senior who averaged 13 points and 10.7 rebounds last season. He ranks third in the Big 12 and 33rd nationally with 3.23 offensive rebounds per game, highlighted by a career-best 10 in the win over VMI, which ties him for second all-time in program history for offensive boards in a single game.
- Stillwell is on pace to surpass UCF's single-season double-double record of 12, set by Tacko Fall during the 2016-17 season. Notably, Stillwell recorded 16 double-doubles last season at Milwaukee.
- Fall also set UCF's single-season offensive rebounding record in 2016-17 with 129, another benchmark Stillwell could challenge if he maintains his production on the offensive glass throughout the season.
- It is worth noting that Fall was a true center, but no forward has surpassed 100 offensive rebounds in a single season, a benchmark that Stillwell is three away from reaching.
- Stillwell's five double-doubles in non-conference play tied him for fifth-most in the Big 12 at the conclusion of non-conference play, and ranking him third in program history for double-doubles during non-conference competition, trailing only 2012-13 Keith Clanton (7) and 2016-17 Tacko Fall (8).

RIISING THROUGH THE RANKS

- UCF men's basketball debuted at No. 25 in the Week 9 AP Top 25, marking its first appearance in the poll since 2019.
- The ranking came during the best start of head coach Johnny Dawkins' tenure, as the Knights entered Week 9 with a 12-1 record.
- UCF earned the ranking after a statement 81-75 win over then-No. 17 Kansas on Jan. 3.
- The week nine ranking marks the sixth week UCF has appeared in the AP Top 25 since the program began in 1969, and the second time under Dawkins.
- As of Mar. 13, UCF ranks 52nd in the NCAA NET, climbing as high as 30th, its best NET ranking since joining the Big 12. They have shown far more movement than in their first two seasons, when they sat 70th at this point in 2025 and 60th in 2024.
- The Knights are also 54th in KenPom, nearing the program's all-time best of No. 34, last reached in 2019.
- The Knights have five quad 1 wins, having swept Texas A&M in a home-and-home series, beating No. 17 Kansas at home, defeating #11 Texas Tech in the Space Game, winning at Colorado in a shootout, and stunning #19 BYU in Provo, winning 97-84.
- Dawkins' 2018-19 team finished nonconference play ranked 46th in the NCAA NET Rankings, though they climbed as high as 26 before ending their season in the tournament's second round.

BENCH BRIGADE

- Depth has been a defining trait for the 2025-26 roster, with seven different players leading the team in scoring through 32 games. A balance that has translated to one of the Big 12's most productive benches, as the Black and Gold are averaging 22.56 points per game from their reserves, sixth-best in the conference, highlighted by a 51-point bench performance in the win over Florida A&M on Nov. 11.
- The Knights' bench reached a program high in 2010-11, scoring 828 points at an average of 25.5 per game. So far, the 2025-26 reserves have amassed 722 points, hinting that this year's bench could emerge as one of the most efficient in recent history.
- Among the UCF's bench contributors are key sharpshooters like Carmelo Pacheco, who has scored 126 of his 140 points this season from beyond the arc. Pacheco ranked fourth in NCAA Division I in three-point field goal percentage last season at 46.4 percent and is looking to match that again, currently maintaining a strong 39.6 percent.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)

◆ Beyond scoring, the bench has contributed 311 rebounds so far, echoing Coach Dawkins' 2023-24 unit, which set a program record with 475 rebounds, a mark this year's group is over halfway toward.

JOHNNY DAWKINS' AWARD WATCH

- ◆ Head Coach Johnny Dawkins is one of 25 finalists for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year award. The award is presented annually to a Division I coach who not only shows success on the basketball court, but someone who displays integrity on and off the court too.
- ◆ The Knights have faced two previous winners of the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award in Mark Byington of Vanderbilt (2025) and Pat Skerry of Towson (2023).
- ◆ Dawkins is also one of 25 finalists for the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, presented to the top minority head coach in Division I College Basketball.
- ◆ The Ben Jobe Award is in honor of a legendary coach at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU), coaching at six different HBCUs. Jobe reached the NCAA tournament four times.
- ◆ Dawkins is one of 20 finalists for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award, presented to the top head coach in Division I College Basketball. The award is in honor of the iconic bow-tied head coach, bringing Mount St. Mary's to 16 Division II NCAA Tournaments, winning the National Championship in 1962.

UNC (UNCLE) STATUS

- ◆ Devan Cambridge is the oldest player on the team and just surpassed his 173rd game against Arizona on Mar. 12.
- ◆ The mark now places him tied for fourth in most games played in NCAA history.
- ◆ With at least one game left for the Knights (one postseason) he'd tie for third most at 174.
- ◆ Jordan Bohannon of Iowa holds the record for most games played with 179 from 2017-22.

ON POINT FROM THE LONG RANGE

- ◆ UCF broke a program record with 19 three-pointers in the game against FGCU (12/20), the previous record was 17 against Tulsa (2/11/23)
- ◆ The Knights are currently ranked 54th in the nation and fourth in the Big 12 with a 36.2 three-point percentage.
- ◆ Transfers George Beale Jr. and Carmelo Pacheco shot the three-ball above 40% last season.
- ◆ Both Beale Jr. Pacheco averaged 6.3 three-point attempts per game on their two previous teams, respectively.
- ◆ UCF earned 10 or more three-pointers for the 14th time last season against Oregon State, hitting 10 or more threes in four of its last five games after not doing so for the entire month of February. The streak included tying a season-high 14 made threes vs. Kansas in the second round of the Big 12 Championship. To put in perspective the shooting capability of this year's team, the Knights hit 10 or more three pointers just twice last season. Additionally, UCF has five games where they've shot 50% or better from the floor after doing that four times in the previous campaign.
- ◆ The Black and Gold have knocked down a program record 328 three pointers last season, reaching the milestone during the College Basketball Crown first round. The mark tops the 295 made triples during the 2022-23 season.
- ◆ The Knights averaged 8.9 made three pointers per game, beating the previous record during Dawkins' tenure at 8.8 during the 2021-22 campaign. The high clip has helped UCF to its highest scoring offense under Dawkins as well.

KNIGHTS UPSET NO. 19 BYU ON THE ROAD, 97-84

- ◆ Without Riley Kugel for the second straight game, UCF never trailed in a 97-84 victory over the Cougars, UCF's third AP top 25 win of the season, securing back-to-back 20 win seasons.
- ◆ The Knights put up the best offensive performance against a ranked team in program history, spotlighted by the most field goals made (36), highest field goal percentage (56.3%), tied for most three pointers made (14), highest three point percentage (58.3%), and most assists (25) against a ranked opponent.
- ◆ UCF scored the most points a team has at BYU since 3/15/17 (105 by UT Arlington). This same game was also the last time BYU gave up 25 or more assists at home.

KNIGHTS ESCAPE UTAH WITH 73-71 VICTORY

- ◆ In a contest featuring 16 lead changes and neither team leading by double-digits, it all came down to Themus Fulks knocking down two free throws with 3.7 seconds left to seal the game. Fulks' late-game heroics capped off a game-high 24 points.
- ◆ This year's squad is the fastest UCF team to reach 19 wins in a season since the 2019 tournament run.
- ◆ The Knights generated its advantage through defensive pressure, forcing eight turnovers in the second half that translated to 11 points.
- ◆ With the victory, UCF advances to 8-6 in conference play, the most wins during conference play since joining the Big 12 conference ahead of the 2023-24 season.

FULKS TABBED TO BIG 12 STARTING FIVE - WEEK 11, WEEK 13 AND WEEK 16

- ◆ Themus Fulks was named to the Big 12 starting five in weeks 11, 13, and 16
- ◆ The fifth-year guard earned the first honor after helping UCF secure its first Big 12 road win of the season and scoring a career-best 30 points against No. 1 Arizona. Fulks totaled 13 points and 12 assists in an 82-73 win at Kansas State, becoming the first Knight with five double-digit assist games in a season. Against Arizona, he tallied 30 points, eight assists and five rebounds to become the fourth DI player in the last 30 years to have at least 30 points, five rebounds and five assists against a No. 1 opponent, joining Boston College's Ky Bowman, Oklahoma's Buddy Hield and Clemson's Greg Buckner.
- ◆ He is the first UCF player this century with three point-assist double-doubles in a season and the first in program history with back-to-back games of 10+ assists.
- ◆ The second honor came as Fulks led the Knights to their second ranked victory of the year against #11 Texas Tech. He poured in a team-high 21 points and dished out seven assists against Texas Tech and earlier in the week contributed six assists and 12 points in the Knights comeback win against Arizona State.
- ◆ Fulks' third honor comes after averaging 19 points and 5.5 assists, highlighted by a pair of game-winning free throws to defeat Utah, capping off a 24-point performance to secure a crucial road win late in the season.

KNIGHTS ECLIPSE NO. 11 RED RAIDERS, 88-80

- ◆ UCF led for 36 minutes and six seconds, knocking off 11th ranked Texas Tech for a second ranked win this season.
- ◆ The Black and Gold asserted dominance on the glass with a 35-23 rebound advantage, matching that presence with tight ball security, forcing 13 turnovers while surrendering only six.
- ◆ John Bol's standout performance for a second career double-double with 14 points, 10 rebounds, and 6-8 shooting, rallied UCF to victory.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)

- ◆ The Red Raiders made a final push late to pull within two with 1:55 remaining, but the Knights kicked into full throttle, as a Chris Johnson fastbreak dunk in the final moments put UCF in the front seat of victory, 88-80.
- ◆ The victory lifts the Knights to 17-4 overall, the most wins through the month of January in program history, and 6-3 in Big 12 play. UCF asserted itself on the glass with a double-digit rebounding advantage (35-23) and matched that presence with tight ball security, forcing 13 turnovers while surrendering only six, an effort that underscored their control throughout.

UCF RALLIES FROM 12-POINT DEFICIT, 79-76 OVER ARIZONA STATE

- ◆ In the last six minutes of regulation, the Knights, down 12, came back in miraculous fashion to advance to 16-4, their best mark since the 2018-19 season, and their best Big 12 Conference start.
- ◆ After trailing 12 with 6:09 left, the Knights fired up a 21-6 run until the clock hit zero, punctuated by a Jordan Burks three from the left wing to give the Black and Gold a 78-76 lead with 34 seconds remaining. Burks followed just moments later, stealing the ball with 11 seconds remaining to seal the victory.
- ◆ After shooting 1-10 from downtown in the first half, UCF found their shooter's touch, going 6-12 from behind the arc in the second half.

KNIGHTS EDGE COLORADO, 95-86

- ◆ UCF put on a shooting masterclass in Boulder, shooting 61.1% from the field and 62.5% downtown, a program best during Big 12 conference play.
- ◆ Five players scored in double figures, led by Riley Kugel's 22 points and a career-high six three-pointers made. Themus Fulks scored 19 points of his own, dishing out eight assists.
- ◆ The Knights were 10-13 from long range in the opening period, the second time UCF has made 10 threes in a half this season, and the third time in program history the Knights earned this mark.
- ◆ The Buffalos trimmed the Knights lead down to six with under three minutes remaining in the second period, but a miraculous bank shot three by Kugel with 0.6 left on the shot clock swung momentum UCF's way, with the team making its next nine field goal attempts to seal the 95-86 victory.

BIG 12 ROAD WOES NO MORE | KNIGHTS BEST KANSAS STATE 82-73

- ◆ UCF snapped an eight game Big 12 away game losing streak, getting the Knights' first ever win at Bramlage Coliseum and advancing to 14-2 on the season.
- ◆ Themus Fulks records his fifth 10-plus assist performance of the season with 12 against the Wildcats, and holds the program record for most 10-plus assist games in a single season by an individual player.
- ◆ Riley Kugel led in scoring for the fourth straight game, finishing with 19

KNIGHTS HOLD OFF CINCINNATI AT HOME

- ◆ In the first matchup this season against the Bearcats, neither team led by double digits, then No. 25 UCF men's basketball survived a late surge from Cincinnati to earn a 73-72 victory on Jan. 11 inside Addition Financial Arena.
- ◆ The Black and Gold shot 57.7% from the field, their best mark against a Big 12 opponent since joining the conference ahead of the 2023-24 season.
- ◆ A 6-0 run by the Bearcats put them up by one with less than two minutes remaining, but a Fulks jumper gave UCF the lead with 13 seconds remaining. The Knights held on defensively to secure the one-point victory.
- ◆ Riley Kugel led the game in scoring with 19, with Jamichael Stillwell adding 15 of his own, and Jeremy Fomuna tailed 12 points with a season-high eight rebounds.
- ◆ Themus Fulks' 12 assists is his fourth 10-plus assist performance on the season.

NOW YOU'RE DAWKIN: KNIGHTS START 12-1

- ◆ Since head coach Johnny Dawkins took the helm in 2016, the Knights have never opened a season quite like this, as their electrifying 12-1 start stands as the best of his tenure. Their win over No. 17 Kansas on Jan. 3 also pushed their streak to 11 straight victories, the longest ever by a Dawkins-led team and the longest since the 2010-11 season when the squad opened the season on a 14-0 tear.
- ◆ UCF was one of three teams in the Big 12 with just one loss as they entered conference play, joined by Oklahoma State, No. 8 Houston and No. 19 BYU, while No. 1 Arizona and No. 3 Iowa State stepped into Big 12 play undefeated.
- ◆ Beyond Dawkins' own record-breaking start, his group has already left its mark in the program record book, as the Knights set a new single-game record with 19 made three-pointers in their Dec. 20 win over FGCU, surpassing the previous mark of 17 set against Tulsa on Feb. 11, 2023.
- ◆ Dawkins has his core group locked down early, as the Knights have yet to lose with Riley Kugel, Themus Fulks, Jamichael Stillwell, Jordan Burks, and John Bol in the starting lineup.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)
KNIGHTS TOPPLE NO. 17 KANSAS IN BIG 12 OPENER

- With the game tied at 72 and under a minute remaining, Jordan Burks delivered when it mattered most. UCF and Kansas had battled every second, each team vying to start the Big 12 season 1-0. But Kansas' hopes were dashed as Burks pulled up from the long range in the final moments, sinking a clutch three-pointer to lift the Knights to an 81-75 upset at Addition Financial Arena.
- This is the second consecutive season the Knights have won their conference opener, and the first time they've beaten a ranked opponent since last year's season home opener against then No. 13/15 Texas A&M. Dawkins, as a player and coach, is now a combined 7-3 in meetings against either Kansas or Bill Self, or a combination of both.
- The Knights committed just six turnovers all evening while forcing 12 from the Jayhawks, who normally average 10.8 turnovers per game and force 9.46 themselves.
- A trio of Knights scored in double digits as Riley Kugel led the way with 19 points followed by Themus Fulks with 16 and Burks added in 14.

RECORD NIGHT VS. FGCU

- A program record night from the three-point range and a balanced scoring effort that saw five Knights reach double figures, as the Knights rolled past FGCU, 102-80, on Saturday, December 20.
- The Knights stayed level from behind the arch, connecting on 19-of-35 throughout the evening, setting a new program benchmark for three-pointers made in a single game, breaking the previous record of 17 set in 2023 vs. Tulsa on Feb. 11.
- The three-point barrage was led by Jordan Burks, who drilled a career-high six triples on his way to a game-high 23 points, also a personal best for the Alabama native.
- Jamichael Stillwell finished the night with 14 points and 13 rebounds to earn his second consecutive double-double and fifth of the season. His 13 rebounds included eight on the offensive glass, pushing his season total to 46 offensive boards, the second most in the Big 12.
- Devan Cambridge finished the night with 16 points, the outing marked his first double-digit scoring performance of the season and highest total as a Knight. The Nashville native was nearly perfect from the field, knocking down 6-of-7 attempts, including a perfect 4-of-4 from the three-point line.
- Chris Johnson (12) and Themus Fulks (21) added to the quintet of double digits scorers. Fulks and Johnson also directed the offense throughout the night, each handing out five assists.
- John Boll made an impact on the glass, pulling down a career-high nine rebounds.

BEATING FLORIDA FOES

- UCF has found success against in-state opponents under head coach Johnny Dawkins, going 31-11 against teams from Florida since his arrival. The Knights swept the Florida foes this season, as they faced Florida A&M, FGCU and Florida Atlantic adding three wins to Dawkin's record against Florida teams.
- UCF added two tallies to the win column last season with the 100-94 win over Florida Atlantic on Nov. 12 and the 86-66 victory over Jacksonville on Dec. 21.
- The Knights have topped Florida, Florida State, Miami, South Florida, Stetson, FIU, Jacksonville, Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M during Johnny Dawkins' tenure as UCF's head coach and added Florida Atlantic to that list last season.

STILLWELL TABBED TO BIG 12 STARTING FIVE

- UCF senior Jamichael Stillwell was named to the Big 12 Starting Five, the first Knight in program history to earn the weekly honor
- The Big 12 Starting Five recognizes five top performers across the league each week
- Logged second double-double of the season in the win over Pittsburgh: 12 points, 11 rebounds, 32 minutes
- Recorded first double-double of the season (and UCF's first of the year) vs. Oakland: 20 points, 14 rebounds, 8-of-13 shooting

KUGEL NAMED BIG 12 STARTING FIVE - WEEK NINE

- Riley Kugel was named to the Big 12 starting five, released on Jan. 5.
- The senior paced the Knights in a statement 81-75 victory over then-No. 17 Kansas on Jan. 3, scoring 19 points on 8-of-17 shooting. His performance was highlighted by a game-sealing and-one in the closing moments.
- Kugel has reached double figures in nine games this year, with his standout outing coming against Vanderbilt. In that contest, he poured in a career-high 25 points on 4-of-5 shooting from beyond the arc, while adding four assists and five rebounds.

LEGENDS CLASSIC SWEEP

- UCF wrapped up the Legends Classic with a 2-0 slate against Pitt and Quinnipiac
- The Knights earned a 77-67 win over Pitt in the Legends Classic at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach
- The Knights outrebounced the Panthers 37-28 and shot 52.5% while holding Pitt to 38.9%
- Riley Kugel was named Legends Classic MVP with 18 points and four assists
- Themus Fulks also scored 18 points and tied his career high by going 3-for-3 from beyond the arc
- Jamichael Stillwell posted a 12-point, 11-rebound double-double
- The Black and Gold came out victorious against Quinnipiac, 102-91, in Addition Financial Arena
- Five players hit double digits in points for the Knights: Jeremy Fournema (18), Kugel (16), Jordan Burks (13), John Boll (13) and Chris Johnson (11)
- UCF went on to hold the Bobcats scoreless for nearly seven minutes, Fournema recorded back-to-back dunks that punctuated the surge and stretched the Knights' lead to 72-66.
- From there, the Black and Gold never looked back, surrendering only 19 points until the final minute. They piled up 15 defensive rebounds and forced five turnovers in the second half to seal a 102-91 victory

1K POINT CLUB

- Riley Kugel recorded his 1,000th career point against Oakland on Nov. 17.
- Kugel tallied 18 points in the game, marking his fifth consecutive game with double digits in points.
- The Orlando native joins fellow teammates: Themus Fulks and Devan Cambridge, as they have both scored over 1,000 points in their career.

COMPLETE SWEEP AGAINST TEXAS A&M

- UCF took down Texas A&M, 86-74, on Nov. 14 at Reed Arena in College and last season opened up the season against then No. 13/15 earning a 64-61 win inside Addition Financial Arena on Nov. 4, 2024.
- The Knights dug their way out of a 14-point hole in the second quarter, mounting a 15-7 run powered by back-to-back threes from Jordan Burks to pull within striking distance at 61-59 with 7:42 remaining. Burks finished the night with a career-high 21 points, shooting 7-of-11 from the field and 5-of-7 from beyond the arc, also a career-best for made three-point shots in a single game.



FEAR THE FRONDS
"The Most Florida Free Throw Distraction"

A storm, in multiple senses of the word, created a new tradition for Knight Nation in attendance at UCF men's basketball games. The legend goes that the night prior to the Black and Gold's first home conference game as a member of the Big 12, a massive storm rolled through campus. The wind blew down plenty of palm fronds across campus, and students picked them up and brought them into the game to use as a free throw distraction. It ended up working, as No. 3 Kansas shot just 6-for-11 from the free throw stripe in the second half in front of the student section. The fronds gave UCF that extra edge to top the Jayhawks 65-60, winning by as many points as Kansas had missed second half free throws.

Now, that's not exactly how one of college basketball's newest traditions was born. UCF's Brand Experience team wanted to create a unique experience for the team's first season in the Big 12. Director of brand experience **Tim Connor (UCF alumna 2017)** and assistant director of brand experience **Lexi Campagna (UCF alumna 2022)** created and executed the idea. Knight Nation immediately took to the new tradition and the country took notice. The pair were named as one of nine finalists in NACMA's "Best Of" Awards in the People's Choice - Student Engagement category.

As the flagship Big 12 institution in The Sunshine State, nothing says Florida like palm trees. Design elements incorporated on social media, uniforms and even the lane on the court, all included palm trees and fronds. Leaning into that element wound up creating the most Florida free throw distraction imaginable.

Not only was the new free throw distraction perfectly on brand, but it actually worked. The palm fronds caused opponents to miss nearly 10% of their second half free throws in Big 12 play and the postseason. Visiting teams made 75% of their first half free throws while making just 66.4% in the second half, accounting for a total of 44 misses.

As the final buzzer sounded on UCF's upset over No. 3 Kansas, the team's first conference win as a Big 12 member, fans stormed the court with palm fronds in hand. The Knights had topped the highest ranked opponent in program history (previously No. 4 UConn, a 68-63 neutral site win on Nov. 25, 2011).

UCF went on to beat a total of three ranked opponents during the 2023-24 Big 12 slate, all at home in front of the frond-waving faithful. The win against No. 3 Kansas was the first, followed by a 74-63 win over No. 23 Oklahoma on Feb. 3 and a 75-61 triumph over No. 23 Texas Tech on Feb. 24.

With two seasons of the "Fear the Fronds" mantra in the students section they are here to stay as a long standing tradition at men's basketball games.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)

- UCF erased an 11-point deficit with seven minutes to go to come from behind to beat No. 13/15 Texas A&M 64-61 last season in the home opener on Nov. 4, 2024.
- Texas A&M was the third ranked opponent UCF has played on opening night in the program's D-I history, joining tilts against No. 16 Florida State (11/25/88) and No. 25 Miami (11/19/99). Neither of those resulted in a win.
- Last year's ranked victory was the 11th in program history and the ninth under head coach Johnny Dawkins.

DOMINANT TEAM VICTORY VS. FLORIDA A&M

- The Knights shined in the first half, as 12 different players scored a bucket. This marks the most players to record a bucket in a game since playing Kansas State Jan. 6, 2024.
- UCF's 24 team assists is the most in a game since recording 23 assists vs. Bethune-Cookman Dec. 29, 2023.
- The Black and Gold were lighting it up from beyond the arc, knocking down 13 three-pointers and shooting 65% from downtown. This marks UCF's best shooting percentage from three with 20-plus attempts in a game since shooting 60% vs. Michigan Dec. 30, 2021.
- Jordan Burks recorded a career-high performance with 17 points and came up with a crucial block and an offensive rebound in the closing second to help lead the team.
- The fronds were in full effect in the in-state battle, as Florida A&M shot 12-22 from the charity stripe. Florida A&M's 55% from the free throw line is the lowest by a team in Addition Financial Arena since Houston's 50% Mar. 6, 2024.

TOP 25 IN HEIGHT

- According to KenPom, the Black and Gold are ranked 23rd nationally with an average height of 6'5".
- There are only three teams that UCF will face that are on-average taller, those being Arizona, Arizona State, and Cincinnati.

DAWKINS' HOMECOMING IN DURHAM

- For the first time in UCF program history, the Knights played in Cameron Indoor against Duke in an exhibition game on Oct. 21.
- The exhibition was part of Duke men's basketball series called the "Brotherhood Run", a tradition in which Duke invites former players who are now collegiate head coaches back to Durham for a matchup.
- Prior to the game, Coach Dawkins was honored at half court by Duke head coach Jon Scheyer and former Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski, they handed him a commemorative basketball.
- Head Coach Johnny Dawkins returned to his alma mater, where he was a two-time consensus All-American and was enshrined in the Duke Hall of Fame in September 1996, when his No. 24 jersey was retired.
- Dawkins stepped back onto the hardwood at Cameron for the first time since 2008, when he was an associate head coach at Duke.
- The last matchup between the two teams took place on March 24, 2019, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at Colonial Life Arena in Columbia, South Carolina, where the Blue Devils advanced following a narrow 77-76 victory.
- Dawkins played at Duke for Coach Mike Krzyzewski from 1982-86. He is regarded as a key early figure in the program's ascent to becoming a national power. Dawkins and company began to build the foundation for Duke basketball after a sub-500 freshman season. The Blue Devils finished 24-10 the following campaign, sparking back-to-back NCAA Tournament Second Round appearances. His senior season culminated with a 37-3 record and a National Championship game appearance.
- Throughout his time at Duke, Dawkins piled up 2,556 points, a mark that stood as the school's scoring record until 2006 and remains second all-time. He was a two-time consensus All-American, a four-time All-ACC selection, four-time team MVP, and was the recipient of the 1986 Naismith National Player of the Year award.

NEW KNIGHTS

- UCF lost 100% of its scoring from last season and is one of five Power Four teams to not bring back any returning scoring, joined by Baylor, Miami, Indiana and West Virginia.
- The Knights' newcomers that played last season averaged 86.1 points per game in total at their respective schools, led by Themus Fulks' 14.6 and both George Beale Jr. and Jamichael Stillwell averaging 13.0.
- Devan Cambridge is heading into his sixth year of college basketball, previously playing with Auburn, Arizona State and Texas Tech. In Cambridge's most-recent season with the Red Raiders, he reached the 1,000-point milestone.
- Fulks enters his fifth year of college hoops, previously playing for South Carolina State, Louisiana, and Milwaukee. Fulks ranked 22nd in the NCAA last season with an impressive 5.9 assists per game.
- UCF has three incoming senior transfers in Riley Kugel, Beale Jr. and Stillwell. Kugel posted double figures in 17 games while managing a 43.3 field goal percentage last season at Mississippi State. Beale scored 62 three-pointers in his past season at Hampton, the 12th most in the CAA while maintaining a 39.5 three-point percentage. Stillwell was a double-double magician at Milwaukee, earning 16 double-doubles to tie for 11th-most in the NCAA last season.
- The Knights bring in four incoming Juniors: Jeremy Foumena, Carmelo Pacheco, Chris Johnson and Jordan Burks. Foumena appeared in 28 games off the bench for Rhode Island, averaging 5.3 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. Pacheco was lights-out from the three at Mount St. Mary's, knocking down four or more three-pointers in a game 10 times and averaged 46.8% from downtown last season. Johnson, despite only playing in three games last season, averaged 10.7 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 1.7 assists for Stephen F. Austin. Burks scored double-digits in nine games with Georgetown while maintaining a 52.1 shooting percentage.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)

- ◆ Kris Parker and John Bol are the two incoming sophomore transfers. Parker appeared in 27 games for Villanova and played an average of 10 minutes per game, averaging 2.6 points and 1.4 rebounds per game. Bol was named as a top recruit in the state of Georgia and the eighth best center in the 2024 class by ESPN.
- ◆ UCF brings in freshman Zach Johnson and Tanner Jones. Johnson competed for IV Greatness Academy and averaged 30 points, six rebounds and five assists per game. Jones played 21 games at Campbell Hall, averaging 12.3 points and 6.3 rebounds per game.

MILWAUKEE DUO

- ◆ Themus Fulks and Jamichael Stillwell both had breakout years with Milwaukee in the 2024-2025 season after their first year playing together. Fulks and Stillwell bring their talents to Orlando to continue their duo chemistry.
- ◆ Fulks and Stillwell bring elite scoring, dropping 14.6 points and 13.0 points per game, respectively.
- ◆ Fulks assisted the ball at a high level with the Panthers last season, putting him at ninth nationally for returning assist leaders at 5.9 assists per game.
- ◆ Stillwell recorded 10.7 rebounds per game last season, putting him fifth nationally for returning rebound leaders at 10.7 rebounds per game. Stillwell's 16 double-doubles last season put him at No. 5 nationally for top returning double-double leaders.
- ◆ Stillwell's efforts on the glass for the Panthers put the team at second nationally in rebound margin, fifth in offensive rebounds per game, and 21st in rebounds per game.
- ◆ Milwaukee went 13-5 last season when Fulks and Stillwell each played 25-plus minutes in a game.

YEAR THREE IN THE BIG 12

- ◆ UCF joined the Big 12 conference prior to the 2023-24 season and this season marks its third season in the league.
- ◆ The AP Preseason Poll came out on October 13 and it featured six Big 12 teams ranked in the Top 25.
- ◆ The six teams tie for the most in Big 12 history and has happened in back-to-back years. With three teams in the top 10 it marks the most by any conference this year.
- ◆ The Black and Gold are set to face three of the opponents at home with No. 10 Texas Tech, #13 Arizona and #19 Kansas. The Knights travel to the other three schools starting with No. 2 Houston, #8 BYU and #16 Iowa State.

POSTSEASON PURSUIT

- ◆ Under head coach Johnny Dawkins, the Knights have made a postseason appearance in five of his nine seasons, including three straight postseason appearances.
- ◆ UCF experienced immediate postseason success by making the NIT in the first year under Dawkins' new leadership, reaching the NIT semifinal in Madison Square Garden in 2016-2017.
- ◆ The Black and Gold returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2005 when they earned an at-large bid into the 2019 bracket as a No. 9 seed. Dawkins led the Knights to their first NCAA Tournament victory in program history, beating VCU 73-58 in the first round. The Black and Gold narrowly defeated in the next round, falling to top-seeded Duke 77-76.
- ◆ UCF returned to the postseason by making the NIT in 2022-23 and earning a first round victory over in-state foe Florida. The Knights were the only team to hold Florida below 50 points during 2022-23 while the 49 Gator points were the least they've scored at home since Jan. 13, 1962 when they beat Auburn 43-40.
- ◆ The Black and Gold earned a spot in the 2024 NIT bracket as a No. 4 seed in their second straight trip to the tournament.
- ◆ This past season, the Knights were invited to compete in the inaugural College Basketball Crown in Las Vegas to play for a share of a pool of NIL prize money. After wins against Oregon State and conference-foe Cincinnati, the Knights would find themselves in a thrilling semi-final game against Villanova. UCF won 104-98 in overtime, earning a guaranteed \$100,000 of the NIL prize money pool.
- ◆ The Knights have been to five NCAA DI Tournaments and four NITs, totaling 11 postseason appearances (one CBI and one College Basketball Crown).

DAWKINS' DECADE

- ◆ Johnny Dawkins enters his 10th season with UCF during the 2025-26 season, he has built a particularly glossy college basketball playing and coaching catalogue—most recently including a 2025 induction to the Washington D.C. Hall of Fame and the 2023 induction into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame and selection of a UCF player in the first round of the 2023 NBA Draft.

UCF's first year in the Big 12 Conference saw record attendance for the men's basketball teams, hosting a total of 134,000 fans over the 2023-24 season that saw the Knights host 19 home games, averaging just over 9,000 fans per league home contest. The inaugural Big 12 campaign also saw the introduction of palm fronds as a free throw distraction in the student section. The terms "Fear the Frond" and "Frond Warning" were born as Knight Nation helped cause opponents to make 10% less of their second-half free throws in Big 12 and postseason play.

The venue has sold out twice for UCF men's basketball games, the first being the Black and Gold's 2017 NIT Quarterfinal contest against Illinois, filling the seats with 10,011 fans. The second was the Knights' Big 12 Conference home opener against No. 3 Kansas on Jan. 10, 2024, as 9,469 fans piled through the turnstiles. Most of those fans piled out of the stands as both games ended in court stormings. UCF's 65-60 victory over the Jayhawks was the highest-ranked opponent that the Knights had defeated in program history.

Approximately 7,000 seats make up the lower bowl of Addition Financial Arena, with an additional 3,000 seats situated in the upper level. Club level seating is on the east side of the Arena, with exclusive access to the regal Black and Gold Club before, during and after each game. The addition of a courtside club on one of the baselines subtracted 600 seats from the lower bowl, making the current configuration for men's and women's basketball games a 9,400-fan capacity. The area, located floor-level in front of sections 101-103, offers great views of game action as well as access to top-notch food and beverage options.

The facility features 16 luxury boxes and suites, a club lounge, open concourse areas and numerous concession options. Fans benefit from a state-of-the-art audio and video system. The scoreboard located at center court features four video screens that show replays and player information with an LED ribbon board stretching around the bottom.

Patrons enter the building through a spacious lobby that has conveniently located concession and apparel stands.

Addition Financial Arena sits on the northern side of campus and is nestled in with UCF's other athletics facilities, including FBC Mortgage Stadium, The Venue, John Euliano Park and the UCF Soccer/Track Complex. FBC Mortgage Stadium also opened up during the same September week in 2007.

The arena is the centerpiece of an area that includes apartment-style dormitories with 2,000 total beds and about 100,000-square feet of retail space. Before and after games, fans can dine and shop at establishments like Barnes & Noble Bookstore, Burger U, Gringos Locos, Domino's, The Pop Parlour, Dunkin', Jimmy John's, Subway and Knightro's.

The neighboring retail area has room for 24 shops.

Addition Financial Arena also hosts premiere concerts along with UCF commencement ceremonies. The Central Florida Crusaders, expansion members of the National Indoor Soccer League, began fielding men's and women's teams in the venue for the 2022-23 season. The Orlando Valkyries of the Pro Volleyball Federation began playing their games in the arena in Jan. 2024.

The arena is located directly in front of UCF's old home, The Venue, which re-opened following a year of massive renovations to create a new home for the women's volleyball program as well as dedicated practice facilities for both the men's and women's basketball programs. The Knights played in the former 5,100-seat building from 1991-2007.

Construction on the new facility began in November of 2005. The arena was designed by HOK Sports and constructed by KUD International.

The arena officially opened on Sept. 8, 2007, with a Reba McEntire concert. The first UCF event at the new arena occurred on Sept. 28, 2007, when the UCF volleyball team hosted East Carolina. The first UCF men's basketball game was a 63-60 victory over Nevada on Nov. 11, 2007 while the first women's contest was on Nov. 9, 2007, in 72-57 loss to Texas Tech.

Johnny DAWKINS

Head Coach / 10th Season at UCF

UCF head men's coach Johnny Dawkins has built a particularly glossy college basketball playing and coaching catalogue—most recently including a 2025 induction to the Washington D.C.

Hall of Fame and the 2023 induction into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame and selection of a UCF player in the first round of the 2023 NBA Draft.

Dawkins' resume showcases:

- ◆ 17 seasons as a major-college head coach (the last nine at UCF), including 10 postseason berths and a pair of National Invitation Tournament titles
- ◆ Extensive player development, highlighted by Taylor Hendricks' selection in the first round of the 2023 NBA Draft after only a single season at UCF
- ◆ 10 additional previous seasons of experience as an assistant coach at Duke, including NCAA Championship appearances every year, an NCAA title in 2001 and seven Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament crowns
- ◆ A nine-year NBA career that included a career double-figure scoring average
- ◆ A collegiate playing career at Duke that featured national player-of-the-year recognition as a senior as the school's all-time top career scorer, later culminating with his 2023 National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame selection and 2025 Washington D.C. Sports Hall of Fame induction

In nine seasons at UCF, Dawkins has led the program to unprecedented heights, in the only eight-year stretch with four or more postseason appearances during the Division I era. He led the Knights to their first NCAA Championship victory in 2019. He's also responsible for producing UCF's first lottery pick after Taylor Hendricks was selected by the Utah Jazz with the ninth overall pick in the 2023 NBA Draft. In the deepest, most challenging league in college basketball, Dawkins led the Knights to seven victories in their inaugural season as members of the Big 12 Conference in 2023-24, earning a program record three ranked wins during the campaign.

Dawkins boasts nine wins over ranked opponents in his time at the helm of the Knights, accounting for over 80% of the team's wins over Associated Press top-25 teams in the program's history. The Knights led off the 2024-25 season with a win over #13 Texas A&M, marking the first of three tries in a season opener. UCF made a statement in its inaugural home Big 12 game on Jan. 10, 2024, beating No. 3 Kansas by five after trailing by 16 at one point during the contest. The Knights went on to earn additional ranked wins over No. 23 Oklahoma and No. 23 Texas Tech during the inaugural Big 12 slate, joining the 2018-19 season as the only other campaign with multiple wins over ranked opponents in a single season.

The Knights also earned a host of other impressive wins against top-25 foes, beating 15th-ranked Florida State in Tallahassee in 2020, the program's first victory over the Seminoles. The Knights recorded consecutive victories over No. 6 Houston and No. 19 Cincinnati during the 2018-19 regular-season run to the NCAA Championship, solidifying themselves in the field of 68. UCF defeated No. 24 Alabama in December 2017, after earning the first ranked win under Dawkins on Feb. 26, 2017, beating No. 15 Cincinnati 53-49. UCF cracked the AP poll on Mar. 4, 2019, for the first time since 2011, earning a ranking of 25th late in the regular season. It was the latest into a season that the Knights had been ranked. The home finale against Cincinnati in 2019 marked the first matchup of ranked teams at Addition Financial Arena.

Dawkins was named UCF's seventh head men's basketball coach on Mar. 23, 2016.

The 2019 NCAA Championship Run

The 2018-19 season was one to remember for Dawkins and the Knights, as he guided UCF to a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Championship, its highest seed in five all-time NCAA Championship appearances, and defeated eighth-seeded VCU 73-58 in first-round action.

UCF then came inches away from upsetting top overall seed Duke in the second round, ultimately falling 77-76 to fellow Hall of Famer and his former college coach Mike Krzyzewski, Zion Williamson and RJ Barrett as BJ Taylor's floater rimmed out and Aubrey Dawkins' tip-in barely missed at the buzzer.

The Knights were stellar down the stretch to secure their at-large NCAA Championship berth, winning on the road at No. 6/8 Houston to snap the Cougars' 33-game home win streak and topping No. 19/20 Cincinnati in Orlando. It marked the first time UCF had earned multiple victories over ranked opponents in the same season, and the Knights did it in back-to-back games.

Dawkins led UCF back to the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2005, and the first time as an at-large selection (with the previous four NCAA Championships as champions of the Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament in 1994, 1996, 2004 and 2005). He helped three individuals earn all-conference accolades from the American Athletic Conference in 2018-19, as UCF led the league with three honorees. BJ Taylor became

the first Knight to earn first-team AAC honors, while Aubrey Dawkins was named second team and Tacko Fall added third-team honors. It marked just the second time that the Knights put multiple student-athletes on the AAC all-conference teams and the ninth time in the program's Division I history that multiple Knights earned all-conference honors in the same season (dating back to the 1993-94 season). With two players on the three all-conference teams, only Houston had more players earn all-conference honors.

Following the end of the 2018-19 regular season, Dawkins was named a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award and the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award.

UCF finished the year 24-9, tied for the fourth most wins in a season in program history. The Knights' 23 regular-season wins marked a record in UCF's Division I era. The team went 13-5 in AAC play, the team's most league wins since joining that conference, and earned the No. 4 seed in the conference tournament for the second time in three seasons.

Dominant Defense

Known for their defense under Dawkins, the Knights ranked 11th in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting in the 2018-19 NCAA Championship run. UCF was also 27th in scoring defense, allowing 64.5 points per game that season.

Defense always has been a priority with UCF teams, as four of Dawkins' nine seasons with the Knights have seen the team finish inside the top 50 nationally in scoring defense, including two top-10 finishes. UCF ranked third in the nation in scoring defense in 2017-18, holding teams to 61.7 points per game and 40.1% shooting, slotting the team at the No. 10 spot in the country. Dawkins' first season with UCF in 2016-17 saw the team finish No. 1 in field-goal percentage defense, limiting foes to 36.5% from the field, and No. 6 in scoring defense, with opponents averaging 61.2 points per contest.

Despite making the jump to one of the nation's toughest leagues in college hoops, UCF held its own on the defensive side of the ball. The Knights led the Big 12 in blocks per game, averaging 5.0 per game, a top 20 mark nationally throughout the year. UCF also ranked in the top 25 in steals per game at 8.7 per contest. Although they finished just outside of the top 50 national rankings for scoring defense, the Knights often held opponents well below their season averages. UCF also posted its second-highest turnovers forced per game clip during the team's first run through the Big 12, finishing in the top 40 with a mark of 14.21.

Highly-Touted Hendricks

Taylor Hendricks qualified as UCF's top recruit in program history upon his arrival prior to the 2022-23 season. He came into college as a top-100 player in two of the three major recruit rankings, as ESPN pinned him No. 54 and Rivals had him at No. 87. Hendricks lived up to the hype on opening night, dropping a team-best 23 points in his collegiate debut and finishing the season with averages of 15.3 points and 6.9 rebounds.

Through plenty of work and coaching throughout the season, Hendricks quietly began to creep into mock drafts across the country. At season's end, Hendricks had achieved two career-high marks of 25 points and recorded five double-doubles. He was the nation's only player to make 60 or more three-pointers, tally 55 or more blocks and record 35 or more dunks. He was honored with a unanimous selection to the American Athletic Conference All-Rookie Team and was named second-team All-AAC.

Hendricks announced his intent to enter the NBA Draft on March 22, 2023, making him UCF's first one-and-done player. The freshman phenom later went on to become the Knights' first lottery pick as well as a first-round selection, going ninth to the Utah Jazz in the 2023 NBA Draft.

Enshrined in the College Basketball Hall of Fame

Dawkins was honored Aug. 30, 2023, as an inductee in the 18th class of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. He was joined by former Duke coach Mike Krzyzewski, who was officially honored in the class of 2023 after initially being among the Hall of Fame's Founding Class in 2006.

Dawkins was inducted for his playing days as a Blue Devil and is one of the most decorated players in Duke history. He is regarded as a key early figure in the program's ascent to becoming a national power. From 1982-86, Dawkins piled up 2,556 points – a mark that stood as the school's scoring record until 2006 and remains second all-time. He was a two-time consensus All-American, a four-time All-ACC selection—and was recipient of the 1986 Naismith National Player of the Year award.

As a senior, Dawkins led Duke to the ACC regular-season and tournament titles, and an appearance in the NCAA National Championship game. The 10th overall pick by the Spurs in the 1986 NBA Draft, Dawkins saw action in nine professional seasons with the Spurs, 76ers and Pistons. He averaged 11.1 points and 5.5 assists through 541 career NBA games.

The Washington D.C. native was selected to be a part of the Washington D.C. Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2025. He was inducted for his playing days at Mackin Catholic High School, Duke and the NBA. He is considered one of the greatest players at the District's Mackin Catholic High School, where he earned All-America recognition before joining Duke.

The Washington D.C. Sports Hall of Fame marked the third Hall of Fame induction for Dawkins. His jersey was retired in 1996 as he was inducted into the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame. In 2023, he was an inductee in the 18th class of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame.

UCF Player Honors

Multiple players have earned conference and national honors under Dawkins' tenure. Tacko Fall earned a spot on the Lefty Driesell Defensive All-America team in 2016-17 and was named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year. B.J. Taylor earned first-team All-AAC and NABC first-team All-District honors in 2018-19.

Seven nods to the All-AAC Team were awarded while the Knights were members of that league. An additional three All-Rookie Team honors were earned, all over the last three seasons. Taylor Hendricks earned second-team All-Conference honors as well as a unanimous nod to the All-Rookie Team in 2022-23, as well as tallying a record nine conference rookie-of-the-week accolades. Darius Johnson and Isaiah Adams preceded Hendricks in earning All-Rookie Team nods in 2021-22 and 2020-21, respectively. Aubrey Dawkins (2018-19) and Taylor (2016-17) are the other Knights who received All-AAC second-team honors, while Darin Green Jr. (2021-22), Brandon Mahan (2020-21), Darius Perry (2020-21) and Fall (2018-19) all were members of an AAC third team.

Johnson added to his decorated career as a Knight with an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honor in UCF's first season in the Big 12 (2023-24). He was joined by fellow junior guard Jaylin Sellers and fifth-year forward Ibrahim Diallo on the honorable mention list.

Keyshawn Hall and Johnson were both honored by the Big 12 Conference at the end of the 2024-25 season. Hall was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team and All-Newcomer Team while Johnson was tabbed as All-Big 12 Honorable Mention for the second consecutive season.

Postseason Pushes

On top of the NCAA Championship run in 2018-19, the Knights have punched three tickets to the NIT under Dawkins' direction, as he has led UCF to the postseason in five of his nine seasons at the helm of the Black and Gold. That number of postseason appearances is more than half of the SEC, ACC and Big Ten combined over that stretch.

The Black and Gold participated in the inaugural College Basketball Crown (2025), a 16-team tournament hosted in Las Vegas for a share of a pool of NIL prize money. Dawkins and company led the Knights to the championship game as they fell just short of earning a title, falling 77-66 to Nebraska.

UCF's most recent NIT bid saw the squad earn a No. 4 seed. In 2023, the Knights traveled to Gainesville, Florida, and handily beat Florida 67-49, UCF's first road victory against the Gators in program history. The Knights were the only team to hold Florida under 50 points all season. It was the sixth time that season UCF limited an opponent to 50 points or fewer. The Knights' run came to an end in their inaugural meeting with top-seeded Oregon in Eugene.

The 2016-17 season took UCF to New York's Madison Square Garden in Dawkins' first year at the helm of the Knights. UCF hosted its first NIT game, defeating Colorado for the program's first postseason win in an NIT or NCAA game. The Knights went on to defeat top-seeded Illinois State on the road, before coming home to the first sellout crowd at Addition Financial Arena and winning 68-58 over Illinois to earn a spot in the NIT semifinals. Under Dawkins' leadership, UCF led all NCAA Division I teams in defensive field-goal percentage, holding opponents to just 36.5 percent from the floor. The Knights were also sixth in the nation, allowing only 61.2 points per game, and gave up 45 or fewer points in four games over the course of the year. Dawkins was a finalist for both the Jim Phelan and Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year awards in his first season at UCF. Matt Williams set UCF records for three-pointers in a career, season and game, before signing a professional contract with the Miami Heat.

Notable Notes

In UCF's Dec. 11, 2021, win over North Carolina A&T, Dawkins picked up his 100th victory with the Knights, becoming the fastest coach in program history and just the third one to do so. He earned his 300th career victory in the Black and Gold's 74-63 win over No. 23 Oklahoma. Following the end of the 2023-24 season, Dawkins stands 148-103 all-time as head coach of the Knights, a winning percentage of .590, currently the second highest in program history and first during the Division I era, trailing only Torchy Clark's .755 mark.

In nine years, Dawkins has done a similarly successful job with his players in the classroom. With Dawkins at the helm, the Knights men's basketball program recorded an average semester team grade-point average over 3.0 for the first time in recorded history in 2018. Then the Knights did it again, setting a program record with an average semester GPA of 3.03 in spring 2019. Under Dawkins' watch, more than 45 nods have been earned by Knights on the AAC All-Academic team.

When Dawkins took over at UCF, the Knights had gone 12-18 the season before and hadn't finished above .500 since 2012-13. He led UCF to a 24-12 record in his first season at the helm, the sixth-best turnaround in the nation. With just seven scholarship players due to transfers and injuries, the Knights earned the fourth seed – their highest ever – in the American Athletic Conference Tournament, eventually falling to league champion SMU in the semifinals.

Stanford Stint

Stanford put together four 20-win seasons in Dawkins' tenure as head coach. He is only the second coach in Stanford history with at least four 20-win seasons. Stanford's success on the court came against some of the toughest schedules in the nation. During the 2015-16 season, the Cardinal faced the sixth-most difficult slate in the country—with a nation-leading 17 of Stanford's 30 games against RPI top-50 squads. Stanford's strength of schedule was rated in the top 50 each of his final four seasons, including two in the top 20, with an average rank of 27.75.

The Cardinal basketball program also excelled in the classroom during Dawkins' tenure, earning at least three Pac-12 All-Academic selections for five consecutive seasons and producing back-to-back Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year recipients (2014, 2015). Stanford also received annual national academic recognition, with three players earning National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Honors Court status in 2015. The Cardinal were one of 20 NCAA Division I teams to earn a NABC Team Academic Excellence Award in 2016.

In 2012, Dawkins mentored Chasson Randle to become the consummate student-athlete. Randle finished that season as Stanford's all-time leading scorer and earned the program's initial first-team Academic All-America selection since 2006. Under Dawkins, Stanford recorded back-to-back perfect Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores of 1,000 in both the 2012-13 and 2013-14 reports.

Player development was also markedly improved at Stanford under Dawkins' tutelage. Four Cardinal players were selected in the NBA Draft following their collegiate careers—including 2014 first-round pick Josh Huestis.

Learning from a Legend

The Washington, D.C., native coached for 10 years under the legendary Mike Krzyzewski at Duke. During Dawkins' decade as a coach at Duke, the Blue Devils won a national championship (2001), tallied six ACC regular-season championships, recorded seven ACC Tournament titles and posted a 330-60 (.846) record. In four consecutive seasons from 1999-2002, Duke finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both national polls, a first in college basketball history. Duke reached a No. 1 national ranking in seven of 10 seasons with Dawkins on the coaching staff.

While at Duke, he also served as the player personnel director for the USA Basketball Senior National Team from 2006-08.

Following a prolific high school career at Mackin Catholic High School in Washington, D.C. (McDonald's All-American and third-team Parade All-American), Dawkins made his way to Duke, where he would become one of the most decorated players to set foot in Durham, North Carolina.

He played for the Blue Devils from 1982-83 through 1985-86, earning consensus All-America honors twice (1985, 1986). Dawkins was also voted the 1986 Naismith National Player of the Year and named a Freshman All-American in 1983. During his collegiate career, he helped lead Duke to three NCAA Championship berths, including an NCAA title-game appearance in 1986. He was an All-ACC honoree all four seasons as a Blue Devil. Dawkins helped Duke win the 1986 ACC Tournament title in his senior season, claiming the MVP award in the process.

Dawkins finished his career as the school's all-time leading scorer and held that honor until 2006 when J.J. Redick surpassed his mark of 2,556 points. He recorded double-figure point totals in 129 of 133 collegiate games. Dawkins led the Blue Devils in scoring all four years, recording the fourth-highest season point total in school history with 809 in 1986. Dawkins remains Duke's career record-holder in field goals (1,026) and field goals attempted (2,019) while also setting the school's single-season mark for field goals (331) during the 1986 campaign.

Dawkins was inducted into the Duke Sports Hall of Fame in September 1996. His jersey number 24 was retired by the school.

Anyone who watched five minutes of ESPN, or CBS – or any network talking about basketball on Saturday or Sunday morning – knew the story arcs going into Sunday evening's Second Round NCAA Tournament matchup between UCF and Duke.

It was everywhere. It was legendary Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski against his first big-time recruit and long-time assistant coach Johnny Dawkins.

It was potential number one overall pick in the NBA Draft Zion Williamson vs. 7-foot-6 Tacko Fall, who confidently stated two nights earlier that Williamson wouldn't dunk on him. Fall was right about that one.

But it was more than that. For UCF, Sunday evening was the biggest moment in the history of the basketball program. And that's saying something, given that two days earlier the team won its first-ever game in the NCAA Tournament, defeating VCU to advance to the Second Round.

It was a chance to take down the number one team in the nation. For these Knights this was what they worked all year for. Honestly, it was what they worked the last three years for. Since Johnny Dawkins stepped foot on campus, the program was building towards this.

Dawkins and his staff of Robbie Lating, Vince Taylor and Kevin Norris had a remarkable game plan and their players executed it perfectly.

The Blue Devils are the top overall seed in the tournament and have three top 10 picks in next year's NBA Draft, according to most draft boards. But they're all freshmen.

UCF is a veteran group. Seniors BJ Taylor and Tacko Fall have been leaders for the Knights for seemingly forever. And Aubrey Dawkins, who is in just his first year on the court with UCF, is a fifth-year junior with NCAA tournament experience from his time at Michigan.

Unsurprisingly to fans of the Black and Gold, Taylor, Fall and Dawkins led the way. What may have been surprising to the millions watching at home, however, was that those three gave Williamson, RJ Barrett and Cam Reddish all that they could handle.

The Knights led for nearly all the 10 minutes of the game. And Duke wasn't playing poorly. The Blue Devils made a late run to take the advantage at the break. But the veteran UCF squad didn't waver.

In fact, the Knights came out even better to start the second half. They scored the first seven points out of the locker room, eventually regaining the lead at 57-54 on a three-pointer by Taylor. Nicknamed Big Shot Barry, he came up big again with another three to give UCF a 70-68 lead with just 3:56 to play.

The Knights had Duke. After a layup by Williamson, a jumper by Dawkins and a dunk from Fall made it 74-70 with only 2:08 to play. UCF was in position, in position to take out the top team in the nation in front of a sold out crowd and millions upon millions watching at home.

But then again. It is Duke. The star-studded group made plays. Reddish knocked down a three, Williamson went through contact and finished in the lane. Barrett put back Williamson's missed free throw and all of the sudden the Blue Devils were on top 77-76 with 11 seconds left.

Dawkins calls timeout, draws up the play, and the Knights, again, execute it perfectly. Taylor gets Tre Jones on his left hip, elevates and floats the ball up off the backboard, just as he had thousands of times before. A lot of times for UCF's leading scorer, that ball goes in.

Not this time. Taylor's shot caromed around the rim.

That wasn't it though. In few Dawkins, using seemingly every inch of his 44+ inch vertical. He had been dominant all night. "The best player on the court," Krzyzewski said. He went over Williamson, got his hand on the ball, and tipped it in. But it didn't drop. The ball rolled off in what felt like slow motion for the Knights, the buzzer sounded, and Duke escaped.

The Knights had made history. They earned the first at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament in program history. They didn't stop there. They won UCF's first game in the tournament. That was epic.

On Sunday, though, the Knights captivated America. Everyone was talking about the game. An instant classic.

For Taylor, Fall, Dawkins – both father and son – Terrell Allen, Collin Smith, Chad Brown, Dayon Griffin, Frank Bertz and the rest of the team that wasn't the goal. The goal wasn't to come close. It was to win. It was always to win. UCF knew they could do it. They proved it on Sunday. But in the end, it just didn't roll their way.

For Knight Nation. For UCF. For Orlando. It was magical. The Knights went toe-to-toe with the top team in the country and proved they belonged. A win on Sunday wouldn't have been a fluke. It wouldn't have been because Duke played poorly.

No, according to Krzyzewski, the Knights were at as high of a level as any team Duke played against this year. "They certainly were deserving of winning."

The team was deserving of winning. The players and staff were deserving of all the attention, all the praise, and all the love from old fans and new. It was a moment that Knight Nation – and likely America – will not forget any time soon.

UCF fans had waited 14 years to get back here. They then had to wait six minutes and 23 seconds for their Knights to get on the board in their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2005. It was okay, though. Everything worked out fine.

UCF's stingy defense made it so that when Terrell Allen's jumper in the lane finally put the Black and Gold on the board at the 13:37 mark, they were only trailing 5-2. The rust was off and the Knights got rolling.

Rolling to the tune of an 11-0 run that put UCF up 13-7 midway through the half, a lead the Knights didn't relinquish the rest of the way.

"For us, we had to shake the nerves off and get in the flow of the game, and that's what we did," junior guard Aubrey Dawkins said after the game. "Once we got used to the flow, things started to click for us. We played good basketball, moved the ball, played unselfish, and good things usually happen when you do that."

Things really started going well down the stretch of the first half as the Knights used another 10-0 spurt to take a 34-24 lead into the break.

"Offensively, I thought we made a lot of connecting plays," head coach Johnny Dawkins said. "We shared the basketball. Guys found shots and rhythm shots they would normally take, and they were knocking them down tonight consistently."

That was never more true than the start of the second half, as UCF continued its hot shooting from the end of the first, rattling off another nine straight to extend its run to 19-0 and open up the lead to 43-24 less than five minutes into the period.

"I thought we played some of our best basketball on both ends of the floor," Coach Dawkins said. "I thought defensively, Tacko's presence down there was amazing. I thought we rebounded well."

Tacko Fall's presence most certainly was amazing. The 7-foot-6 center was on display for the entire nation and he didn't disappoint. The Knights, who run their defense around his ability to block and alter shots, held VCU scoreless for over 10 minutes during the 19-0 run with Fall corraling nearly every rebound to end its possession.

"We've been challenging Tacko all season long about really imposing his will on the game," Dawkins said. "I think probably the last six weeks, you started to see a turn in that. I'm just really happy for him. I'm happy he's realizing the type of impact he can have on both ends of the floor."

Fall finished with 18 rebounds, five blocked shots and 13 points. The first two numbers are UCF NCAA Tournament records and he became the first Knight to record a double-double in the tourney.

"We took advantage of [our size advantage], and my teammates trusted me," Fall said. "I was out there being aggressive, just like I'm supposed to do every night and just trying to make plays for us to win the ball game."

Fall made plenty of plays and it was enough to make history. UCF withstood a late VCU run and cruised to the 75-58 victory, advancing in the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever.

"I think when I look back on it, it's going to be meaningful," Dawkins said. "I'm just really proud of our guys. They worked hard to put themselves in this position."

BJ Taylor, who led the Knights with 15 points in the game, knows how big this was for the program and for himself, but he's more interested in what's next.

"It's hard for me to talk about it right now because in the moment, but it's great for the program," he said. "It's a great win, but we'll reflect on that after the season's over. Right now, we're not satisfied. We want to keep this thing going."

Fall echoed his teammates sentiment, knowing there is still more basketball to be played.

"It means a lot to us, to me, to the fans," Fall said. "Finally being able to pull it off after all these years has meant a great deal to us. But we're not satisfied. We want to keep going as far as we can and we're going to bring it every night no matter who we play against."

Senior Gary Johnson scored a career-high 29 points and UCF mounted a furious second half rally, but it was not enough as the Golden Knights fell to Connecticut, 77-71, in first round action at the NCAA Tournament on Friday afternoon at the DCU Center. The 15th-seed Golden Knights conclude their season at 24-9 and second-seeded Connecticut (23-7) moves on to face NC State in the second round of the Syracuse Regional.

Johnson sank seven three-pointers, one shy of a school record, and added six rebounds and five assists.

The Huskies, the defending national champions, led by as many as 19 in the second half, but UCF refused to go down. Johnson sparked the late rally with three free throws to cut the lead to 63-49 with 10:36 to play.

When junior Justin Rose excited the crowd with a dunk over Josh Boone, the Golden Knights trailed by 11 with less than nine minutes on the clock.

A pair of foul shots from junior Will Bakanowsky got UCF within six at the 3:36 mark, but Connecticut responded, getting baskets inside from Boone and Charlie Villanueva to make the score 72-62.

Bakanowsky matched a career-best with 15 points and added a team-high seven boards and three steals. He nailed three triples as UCF made 11-of-28 from behind-the-arc.

The Golden Knights stayed close early and trailed by six after Johnson hit a trey seven minutes into the game. Under the 10-minute mark, the Huskies started to pull away. Baskets in the paint by Boone, Rudy Gay and Hilton Armstrong handed Connecticut a 27-16 advantage.

Villanueva hit a long three at the buzzer to give the Huskies a 47-31 lead at halftime.

A layup from senior Kingsley Edwards cut the deficit to five points with 23 seconds to go in the contest, but UCF was forced to foul and Marcus Williams made three of four down the stretch to secure the victory for Connecticut.

Edwards finished with 10 points, five assists and three steals for the Golden Knights. Rose chipped in with nine points off the bench.

Connecticut shot 50 percent from the field, led by a 9-of-13 effort from Villanueva. He finished with 22 points and seven boards. Gay totaled 17 points while Denham Brown and Boone finished with 11 and 10, respectively.

NOTE: UConn led by as many as 19 in the contest with 14:02 to play in the second half. UCF pieced together a 30-15 run to cut the deficit to four points with 10 seconds left.

Following its tilt with the Knights, UConn was upset in the second round by No. 10 seed NC State in a 65-62 final.

Central Florida's band had the house rocking and Wisconsin fans were jumping on the Golden Knights' bandwagon as fast as they could find a seat, sensing an upset. Only problem was, Central Florida's offense was as dismal as Pittsburgh's.

The Panthers outlasted Central Florida 53-44 in the first round of the NCAA tournament Friday night, getting their school-record 50th win. Fans threw blue-and-yellow confetti as the final buzzer sounded, but this milestone was hardly one to celebrate. The Panthers shot a season-worst 29.5 percent, and had their fewest field goals (13) and assists (seven). Carl Krauser led Pittsburgh with 18 points and Chevon Troutman added 13 on 5-for-5 shooting. The Panthers had 13 turnovers, nine in the first half alone.

"We didn't play as good as we should have, but this is something to build on," said Julius Page, who had 10 points but was just 2-of-12. "We got past. We got the win."

Yes, but if the Golden Knights (25-6) had had any kind of offensive game, the Panthers would likely be heading back to Pittsburgh instead of spending the weekend in Milwaukee. The third-seeded Panthers will play sixth-seeded Wisconsin in the second round of the East Rutherford Regional on Sunday. The Badgers beat Richmond 76-64.

"It's definitely a wakeup call game," said Chris Taft, who had a career-high 16 rebounds, but just six points. "We can't play like that no more."

Much had been made of Pittsburgh, the regular-season Big East champs, only getting a third seed. But they didn't even look as if they deserved that for much of the night. It was bound to be a defensive game with Pittsburgh and Central Florida among the nation's stingiest teams, but this was ridiculous.

While Krauser and Troutman were 9-of-18, the rest of the Pittsburgh squad went 4-of-26. Krauser scored 12 of Pittsburgh's first 13 points in the second half, and the Panthers didn't get a field goal from anyone else until Troutman's driving layup with 5:28 to play.

Central Florida, meanwhile, shot less than 31 percent. Neither team cracked the 40-point mark until Taft's three-point play -- with 4:11 left to play.

"Offensively, both of us were kind of slacking," said Dexter Lyons, who had 12 points for Central Florida. "We couldn't get into a rhythm. Things couldn't get going."

Central Florida has only one victory over a Top 25 team and is 0-for-3 in the NCAA tournament. But it seemed for a bit as if this might be their night, especially with the Wisconsin crowd adopting them.

When Roberto Morentin made a layup with 10:07 left, it gave the Golden Knights a 36-33 lead. But their already spotty offense fell apart from there, as they made just one field goal the rest of the way.

"We couldn't take care of all the details that got us that lead," Lyons said. "We just got away from all of the things that we were doing."

Give Pitt some credit. While the Panthers looked out of sync and disinterested for most of the game, they buckled down when they had to. They outscored Central Florida 20-8 over the final 10 minutes.

Page came through with a big 3 after missing 10 of his first 11 shots, putting Pittsburgh comfortably ahead 43-38. The Golden Knights tried to mount a last comeback, but they didn't have the energy. Or the offense.

"We'd like to make every shot, but sometimes that doesn't happen," Pittsburgh coach Jamie Dixon said. "I'm very happy with how we finished it off. That's always the big part. I guess we just look at how we played the last five minutes of the game."

No need for guilt, no cause for shame. Yes, the Golden Knights of the University of Central Florida lost Thursday to Massachusetts, 92-70, in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, but there was no embarrassment in the outcome.

UMass (32-1), the top-seeded squad in the East Regional, was the blushing team at halftime before 11,951 inside the Providence Civic Center and a CBS television audience. The Minutemen led the 16th-seeded Knights by just four, 45-39. That puny lead was not acceptable for the nation's No. 1-ranked team.

One psychic UCF fan said at the time: "I hope we didn't make them mad." Mad? How about furious?

UMass guard Edgar Padilla put on a defensive clinic, stealing the ball from the Knights five times in the first two minutes of the second half. His sleight of hand ignited a 12-0 run that extended UMass' lead to 16 at 5:59 with 17:41 to play.

Game, set and match. "They (the Knights) were fearless," UMass coach John Calipari said. "They had a great game plan and kept trying to find ways to win."

Actually, the Knights only had one way to even think about winning -- shooting from nearby Connecticut. Guards Harry Kennedy, Eric Riggs and Stacey Castle took 40 of the team's 52 shots. Kennedy finished with 21 points, Riggs with 20 and Castle 11.

Center Chris West took two shots, forward Howard Porter took one and forward Reid Ketteler took none. All three are seniors, who played their final game for UCF.

"Their big men inside kept us from having any balance in our attack," UCF coach Kirk Speraw said. "We're not happy with the outcome, but I'm proud of our kids because they never quit."

UMass center Marcus Camby, considered a prime contender for player of the year, scored just 14 points (7-of-22 shooting) but pulled down 17 rebounds. Camby needed four stitches to close a forehead wound after a second-half collision with Ketteler's elbow.

While Camby and 260-pound forward Tyrone Weeks dominated up front, the Minutemen were led by their underappreciated guards, Carmelo Travieso (21 points) and Padilla (15 points, 8 assists and 7 steals).

"Write about their guards," Castle said. "They were the story."

But not all of the story. Central Florida (11-19) went into the game as the subject of much national curiosity and considerable ridicule. What were they doing here? A 32-point underdog at tipoff, they were expected to take one look at the powerful Minutemen and throw up their hands in despair.

Instead, West threw up his hands and stole a pass from Camby, feeding the ball to Kennedy -- who immediately swished a 3-pointer.

"Bing, bang, boom -- 3," Calipari said about the Knights' quick move. "If we had let them shoot uncontested 3s, they would have made them all day."

The record show the Knights were still tied with UMass, 8-8, after 2:30. But never again.

UMass had a 12-0 run for a 20-8 lead and led, 29-16, midway through the period. But the Knights had a late 7-0 run of their own, stunning the Minutemen by ending the half trailing by just four, 43-39.

"I didn't really scream or yell," Calipari said about his halftime attitude. "But I did say some cutting words."

Whatever Calipari said must have cut Padilla to the quick. He came out and showed the Knights some defensive moves rarely seen in the Trans America Athletic Conference.

"I knew they would step up their intensity," Speraw said of the Minutemen. "They put on the press and bang, bang, bang."

With 8:15 to play, UMass led by 26 at 75-49. But Calipari did not pull his starters, and the Knights refused to fold. Riggs, in particular, kept Camby and his crew on the court by sinking four consecutive 3-pointers.

"You miss some, you make some," Riggs, a freshman, said. The Knights could not make enough to pull off the biggest upset in NCAA Tournament history. But they found a way to compete honestly against the No. 1 team in the country during an afternoon when 16th-seeded San Jose State lost to top-seeded Kentucky by 38 in the Midwest Regional and 14th-seeded Montana State lost to 4th-seeded Syracuse by 33 in the West Regional.

Final Score: 82-73

- ◆ The Knights snapped an eight-game road losing streak in Big 12 play with their victory over the Wildcats, improving to 3-1 in conference, the program's best Big 12 start.
- ◆ The win was fueled by Fulks, who finished with 11 points and 12 assists, but his impact extended well beyond the stat line.
- ◆ Fulks made history for the program, becoming the first Knight with five double-digit assist games in a single season, the first in a Black and Gold uniform this century to post three point-assist double-doubles in a season, and the first in program history to record back-to-back games with at least 10 assists.

- ◆ Despite the absence of leading scorer Kugel from the match-up, the Knights held strong, becoming the fastest UCF team to reach 19 victories since the 2019 tournament run.
- ◆ The win also boosted the Knights 8-6 in conference play, marking UCF's most conference wins since joining the Big 12 ahead of the 2023-24 season.



GAME 27 AT NO. 19 BYU

Final Score: 97-84

- ◆ In a game the No. 19 Cougars were favored to win by double digits, the Knights took a major step toward strengthening their NCAA Tournament résumé, earning a double-digit road victory.
- ◆ The win marked UCF's third ranked victory of the season and the fifth ranked road win of the Dawkins era.
- ◆ The Knights exploded for 52 points in the opening half, their highest-scoring half of the season and just one point shy of the highest-scoring half in the Dawkins era, while holding the Cougs to just 28, forcing them to face their largest deficit of the season, at any point, in any game, going into halftime.

- ◆ The win pushed UCF to 21-10 on the season, giving the program its highest win total under head coach Johnny Dawkins since the 2018-19 campaign, when the Knights finished 24-9 and reached the NCAA Tournament.

His father, Desmond Sr., once an Alabama A&M guard, holds the NCAA record for steals in a single season with 160, while also averaging 20.7 points per game. This athletic prowess clearly runs in the family as his brother Jalon played at the Division I level, and Desmond Jr., another sibling, recently advanced to professional basketball, playing in the NBA Summer League. With two sisters on Ohio State's roster and another having played for Vanderbilt, the household was undoubtedly competitive.

However, Cambridge views his siblings as his strongest supporters, stating, "My biggest supporters are my siblings. We're always competing, pushing each other to be better, but we are our biggest fans."

This strong family support has helped Cambridge build a basketball career that's taken him across the map, from Auburn to Arizona State, to Texas Tech, and now UCF, experiencing nearly every type of program from coast to coast.

Recruited by Auburn out of high school, Cambridge spent three years under a Bruce Pearl-led team, playing a key role in the Tigers' rise to national prominence. His junior year was a high point, playing in 33 games as Auburn climbed to No. 1 in the country, won the SEC regular season championship, and made headlines as a force in college basketball.

There, Cambridge made a name for himself as an athletic, high-flying wing known for explosive dunks and energy plays, earning him the nickname "Bounce Man." But after three years and a successful career at Auburn, family called – literally.

Desmond Cambridge Jr. asked him to spend one last season together on the court, and together, the pair transferred to Arizona State for Cambridge Jr.'s final collegiate season.

And out west, the pair created something special, ending the Sun Devils' three-year tournament drought. Cambridge's individual performance didn't suffer in the process either, as he shot 50.4% from the field, grabbed 193 rebounds, and recorded 28 blocks, making his brother's farewell season one of the most memorable yet.

"That was probably one of my favorite years, just playing with him. It's a special opportunity getting to be on the court with your sibling at that level."

With his brother moving on and uncertainty surrounding Arizona State's upcoming season, Cambridge made the decision to transfer to Texas Tech, intent on closing out his college career with a bang.

Early on, it looked like he was well on his way, averaging a career-high 10.5 points, along with 4.5 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game. But just eight games in, a devastating ACL tear brought everything to a sudden halt.

"I'd never been hurt like that in my life, nothing that ever kept me out that long. So it was definitely hard, long nights, crying, days and days of painful rehabbing. It made me miss basketball... I had a hunger to get back to doing what I love to do."

Having never faced an injury that took him out for this long, Cambridge was suddenly in uncharted territory. The tear forced him to confront more than just physical limitations; it became a mental and emotional battle that reshaped his outlook and deepened his appreciation for the game.

Rehabbing three times a day and rebuilding his mental tenacity, Cambridge spent over a year preparing for his return. But the process wasn't just about getting back on the court; it was about deciding who he wanted to be when he got back there.

With just a year of eligibility left, Cambridge chose to part ways with Texas Tech, entering the transfer portal one last time, looking to find a place he could really make the impact he wanted. And that's when head coach Johnny Dawkins came calling.



"I never had a coach lay out his vision for me like Dawkins did. He told me about what he thought I could bring to the team, as far as being a leader, being versatile, being a dog on the court. I just knew I could see myself here."

But it wasn't just the plan, it was also the person; Coach Dawkins is Cambridge's first Black collegiate head coach, and that mattered, Cambridge stating, "He's somebody I can relate to, have those conversations with. And he just lets you be yourself."

UCF also offered a return to the Big 12, Cambridge's old stomping ground with Texas Tech and a chance to match up with Arizona State once more. But this time, it's different. This time, he's a veteran leader ready to take on whatever gets thrown his way.

The challenge? Being a leader, defensive anchor, and, for the first time, a shooter. Dawkins has allowed Cambridge to play with more freedom than he's ever been allowed before, asking him to be a player who can fill gaps on the court, a player who dives for the ball, a player who plays hard, a player who does it all. A role Cambridge has eagerly embraced.

At the helm of their third season in the Big 12, the Knights are well aware of the challenges that come with competing in one of the nation's toughest conferences. With seven teams coming off NCAA tournament appearances, including last season's national runners-up, the road ahead is as demanding as ever.

And Cambridge knows that finding success this season with a completely overhauled roster won't come easy—but he's never been one to back down from a challenge.

JOHN BOL / SOPHOMORE / CENTER

With the season just weeks away and zero points returning from last year's roster, head coach Johnny Dawkins and the UCF men's basketball team are embracing a season headlined by opportunity. Towering above the fresh-faced roster stands 7-foot-2 center John Bol, whose raw talent, massive upside and relentless work ethic embody the energy and potential of this revamped squad.

Bol, a sophomore transfer from Ole Miss, made waves in the basketball world long before he stepped onto the court in a Rebels uniform for the 2024-25 season. Ranked as the eighth-best center in the 2024 class, he was on the radar of recruiters and college programs nationwide, all anticipating his future impact. But what makes Bol's rise truly remarkable is that he hadn't even picked up a basketball until 2021.

Born in South Sudan and raised partly in Kenya, he moved to the United States at age 16—reluctantly at that. At the time, he had no interest in basketball, growing up in a household where soccer reigned supreme. Bol was more inspired by Cristiano Ronaldo rather than the typical LeBron James or Steph Curry. But all that would change with a push from his mom.

"I didn't go out, I'd just be in the house... My mom got mad one time, and she was like, you've got to go outside, do something, something constructive."

That "something" turned out to be a pickup basketball game on a neighborhood court in Georgia. A game which he played barefoot, with no knowledge of the sport, and no real desire to be there, preferring video games and avoiding the outdoors altogether. But in that game, Bol found something that drew him in: camaraderie and belonging.



"Everybody was trying to pick me, because I'm so tall, but that was the first time in my life I felt like people wanted me to be included in some stuff. So I came back the next day, and then kept coming back."

And the more he came back to those neighborhood courts, the faster he fell in love with the game. He taught himself how to play via YouTube, practiced for hours, and within a year, coaches started to notice. His height gave him a head start, but it was his work ethic that set him apart.

By the time Bol was a senior in high school, he had climbed the national rankings: a consensus four-star recruit by On3, 247Sports, Rivals, and ESPN. He was named the No. 1 player in Georgia, ranked as high as No. 54 in the country, and became one of the top centers in the 2024 class.

Then came the ultimate recognition: being named to the 2024 McDonald's All-American Game, the first player in UCF program history to earn that honor. Although having already put his name in the Knights' history books with this accomplishment, Bol is eager to make an impact both defensively and as a leader on a young, hungry squad.

"I'm trying to get All-Big 12 defensive team. And I'm trying to help lead this team to the NCAA tournament. The last time we did that, it was Tacko Fall time. But I'm trying to do it in John Bol time."

The comparisons are inevitable. And while Fall and Bol both arrived at UCF as dominant defensive prospects with hopes of putting the program on the national map, Bol is focused on carving his own legacy. And in many ways, UCF is doing the same, shifting from what was to what could be.

As he enters his 10th season at the helm, Dawkins once again finds himself tasked with shaping a roster full of new faces. It's a challenge Bol has fully embraced and a big reason he chose to come to The Sunshine State in the first place.

"Coach Dawkins has really inspired me a lot since coming here. Day one, when I first came here on my visit, we had set a goal, we set a plan for the summer, and he's been true to it all the way. I know that he's a dude that I can really, really trust."

That mindset fits perfectly with a UCF team still discovering its identity. With a roster built largely through transfers, the Knights are in the midst of a transformation. And Bol's own journey, from picking up a basketball for the first time in 2021 to becoming a nationally ranked recruit, mirrors exactly what UCF is hoping to achieve this season: turning unfamiliar parts into something cohesive, competitive, and dangerous.

When UCF men's basketball takes the floor Monday night to open the 2025-26 season, the roster will be nearly unrecognizable. No returning starters and no returning points.

But amid the new-look Knights, two players already move in rhythm – Themus Fulks and Jamichael Stillwell, two former Milwaukee standouts ready to make their mark on one of the toughest conferences in the country, the Big 12.

When Fulks and Stillwell first arrived at the University of Wisconsin–Milwaukee, few expected them to make much of an impact. The Panthers already had key returners ready to anchor the lineup, along with a handful of highly touted transfers the coaching staff planned to build the offense around.


“We looked bad at the beginning, and I was like, dang, maybe this wasn’t the right move. But I had some good teammates around me, so we got locked in, we dug in and we played.”

But then came the turning point. Four games into the season, the Panthers faced Duquesne, a matchup ESPN gave them just an 18-percent chance to win. Defying the odds, Milwaukee pulled off an 80–76 victory, powered by the emerging dominance of what would become the team’s offensive cornerstone duo: Fulks and Stillwell. From that point on, they steered the Panthers’ season.

Stillwell made program history, becoming the first Milwaukee player ever to average a double-double. He closed the season with 13.0 points and a program-record 10.7 rebounds per game, earning First Team All-Horizon League and Newcomer of the Year honors.

Fulks, meanwhile, became the heartbeat of the offense, bringing speed, poise, and leadership from the point guard spot. One of only two players to start all 32 games, he led both the Panthers and the Horizon League in assists while also finishing as the team’s leading scorer.



But what blossomed wasn’t just performance on the court, but a personal connection built in the cold campus dorms, cafeteria, and one-on-one battles.

“When we first became teammates, we played a lot of one-on-one, and I used to kill him. I helped him become a better defender, ‘cause he struggled at first to guard me, but now, he’s a really good defender.”

Stillwell won’t let that story go unchecked, though. As he remembers those early one-on-ones differently.

“He’s just talking, he never beat me, except when I let him win. You know, I had to keep his confidence up.”

As close as the two were once they arrived in Milwaukee, their journey to the Division I level couldn’t have been more different.

Fulks, a Winston-Salem native, had been playing basketball since he was five. By high school, he had become one of the best players in the school’s history, holding the school record in career points with 1,857. By the time he arrived in Milwaukee, he had already accumulated 731 career points and made a trip to the NCAA tournament. As a Panther, Fulks found a team that matched his outgoing personality and allowed his leadership to shine as he adapted to their fast, free-flowing style of play.

Stillwell’s journey, on the other hand, was far from linear. The East Atlanta native didn’t pick up the game until his freshman year of high school, looking for both an outlet and a way to put his height to good use. For two years, Stillwell fought hard in JUCO to rise through the ranks and make a name for himself, until a bout of illness derailed his momentum in his sophomore season.

“I had like over 20 offers out of JUCO, but then I got sick. Lost energy, lost weight. There was a game that coaches came to see me, and I had three points, zero rebounds. I lost like ten offers right there. Milwaukee was one of the few that still believed in me.”

And Milwaukee’s belief paid off. That season, Stillwell rewrote the Panthers’ record books, shattering nearly every rebounding record in program history. His relentless work on the glass ranked him fifth nationally in offensive rebounds, and his scoring punch made him one of 30 finalists for the 2024–25 Riley Wallace Award, honoring the most impactful transfer in Division I basketball.

But when the season ended, new opportunities emerged. Especially from programs the dynamic duo had already faced.



Early in the 2024–25 season, Milwaukee faced UCF in a Thanksgiving week matchup. A game Fulks can recall like it was yesterday.

The Panthers may have fallen to the Knights 84–76, but head coach Johnny Dawkins couldn’t ignore the impact of the point guard–forward duo, who poured in 27 points and stifled some of the best offensive weapons his team had that season. So when the transfer portal opened, he knew who to call.

Fulks didn’t hesitate with his decision, recalling how at home he’d felt in Addition Financial Arena, even as an opponent. He visited, committed, and then made a call of his own—to Stillwell.

“I committed on my first visit, I knew. And once I committed, I signed, I told him, ‘This place is great, you should come down here and do the same thing!’ And he took a bit longer, but what did he do? Come down, do the same thing.”

Although having his old teammate on the roster was a comfort in coming to Orlando, it was Coach Dawkins’ vision for Stillwell and belief in what he could help build that ultimately brought him to UCF.

True to his word, Coach Dawkins has crafted roles that mirror each player’s growth and path to this point. Fulks isn’t merely the ball-handler; he’s a captain and veteran presence, relied on to score, defend, and command the floor. Stillwell shares that captaincy, bringing a strong physical presence and the versatility to dominate both inside and out.

Fulks and Stillwell now stand as anchors on a team that many will overlook, a squad written off before the first tip.

But Fulks and Stillwell don’t mind; they’re ready to remind everyone that greatness is earned, not given, and that the journey to the top often begins where the crowd least expects it.
