Karen Mullins Head Coach 27th Season Connecticut '79

Success has become an annual occurrence with UConn softball coach Karen Mullins and is something she has been accustomed as she enters her 27th season with the Huskies.

Establishing a coaching record of 772-494-5, and a record of 762-484-5 in her 26 seasons with the Huskies, Mullins has played a major role in the tradition of excellence celebrated by the Connecticut softball program.

Known as one of the most successful coaches in the nation, Mullins has led Connecticut to eight trips to the NCAA Tournament, one Women's College World Series appearance and to dominance in the Northeast Region and BIG EAST Conference.

In 1999, Mullins was inducted into the Connecticut Scholastic and Collegiate Softball Hall of Fame as its 1999 college coach selection. She was honored for her outstanding contribution to the game of softball in 20 years of collegiate coaching and selected from a wide field of candidates.

Mullins has directed Connecticut to eight NCAA National Championship Tournament appearances in the last 16 years, the only appearances in program history. UConn made five consecutive NCAA National Tournament showings (20-team field) from 1989-1993, and also qualified in 1995, 1996 and 2001.

Her UConn teams have advanced four times to the NCAA regional championship game (1989, 1992, 1993 and 1995), winning the NCAA regional title in 1993 en route to its berth in the Women's College World Series. In a five-year span from 1989-93, Connecticut was one of only nine Division I softball programs to qualify for each of the five NCAA National Tournaments.

UConn has emerged as a perennial power in the BIG EAST Conference. Since BIG EAST softball tournament play began in 1990, the Huskies have won seven of the 15 conference tournament championships and has been the runner-up four times. Since BIG EAST regular season round robin play started in 1992, Connecticut won all four regular season championships from 1992-1995 when the league crowned an overall champion.

After leading her team to a championship in the BIG EAST tournament and an appearance at the NCAA Regionals in 2001, Mullins and her staff were named the 2001 Speedline NFCA Northeast Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

In 1996, the first year of North and South Division play in softball with the expansion of the BIG EAST, UConn clinched the Northern Division title and repeated that feat in 1997.

Connecticut's BIG EAST overall record is an impressive 237-152, for a winning percentage of 61%. Since round robin play began in 1992,

UConn is 212-137 in BIG EAST regular-season action and 24-14 in BIG EAST tournament play.

She celebrated two milestones in the 2007 season. She won her 700th career game as a collegiate coach with a 7-4 win over Santa Clara on March 4 in the Santa Clara Bronco Classic. She followed it up with her 700th career win at Connecticut with a 9-8 win over Villanova in the first game of a doubleheader on April 21. The Huskies have posted a record over .500 or above in all but three seasons of her tenure, with 25-plus wins in 15 of her 24 seasons.

During the 1993 season, Mullins' 10th season as the Huskies' head mentor, she concluded her "Decade of Excellence" at Connecticut on an impressive note by leading the 45-14 Huskies to their first NCAA Tournament regional championship. This took them to the NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla., where UConn finished tied for fifth in the tournament.

During the 1990s, UConn softball posted an overall record of 335-175-2 for a 65.4 winning percentage. UConn also gained its highest NCAA national poll regular season finishes in this span, finishing No. 14 in 1992 and No. 16 in 1990.

For her efforts, Mullins was voted National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Division I Northeast Softball Coach of the Year in 1989, 1990 and 1993. Since voting for BIG EAST Softball Coach of the Year was initiated nine years ago, Mullins has earned that distinction five times, from 1992-95 and again in 1997.

Always stressing the importance of academics with athletics, Mullins has seen 96 percent of her

softball student-athletes earn degrees from the university in her tenure. Of those graduates, nearly half have attained Dean's List status.

Since Mullins' appointment at Connecticut, the Husky softball program has finished first or second in the final NCAA Northeast rankings 10 times and has been ranked No. 1 in the region at season's end three times (1989, 1990 and 1992). In 2001, the Huskies claimed the No. 2 final ranking in the East region.

Under Mullins' guidance, nine UConn players have earned All-America status a total of 10 times over the past 16 years: shortstop Vicki Bartolucci and pitcher Sue Rybczyk in 1990; outfielder Janna Venice and pitcher Kim Mizesko in 1992; Venice, pitcher Pat Conlan and outfielder Andrea D'Innocenzo in 1993; second baseman Shari Blackman in 1994; D'Innocenzo again in 1995; and Micah Truax in 2007. Venice also was selected ECAC Player of the Year in 1992 and 1993, firsts for the program. Six of Mullins' student-athletes, including 1997 graduate Bridgett McCaffery, 1988 graduate Julie Sherman and 1986 graduate Millie Didio, were honored as National Academic All-Americans during their playing careers. She then had an impressive three players receive Academic All-American status from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association. They included 2007 graduate Holly Calcagno and current Husky seniors Allie Gendron and Kristina Tolles.

In the 16 years BIG EAST Player of the Year and Pitcher of the Year honors have been voted on, 11 of the possible 28 awards have gone to Connecticut players, six of the 12 Pitcher of the Year honors and five of the Player of the Year honors. Venice was tabbed Player of the

Year in 1992 and 1993, followed by Blackman in 1994, D'Innocenzo in 1995 and Truax in 2007. Mizesko (1992), Conlan (1993), Kara Chanasnyk (1994) and McCaffery (1995, 1996, and 1997) earned BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year honors.

In addition, 30 of Mullins' standout athletes have been selected to the NCAA All-Northeast Region Team a total of 60 times, and 43 players have earned All-New England status a total of 76 times.

A member of the National Fastpitch Coaches Association and the New England Softball Coaches Association, Mullins served a two-year term on the NFCA All-America Committee. She also is a member of the New England Intercollegiate Coaches Association and chair of the BIG EAST Conference Softball Coaches Association.

Mullins, who resides in Coventry, Conn., is a 1979 graduate of the University of Connecticut, where she earned her bachelor's degree in physical education and also received her master's degree in sport management in 1980. She was a standout basketball and softball player as an undergraduate and was awarded a UConn Senior Athletic Medallion from the University upon graduation.

She is a former nationally-recognized Major League Fastpitch Softball infielder and was the co-founder of the Single A Major Waterford (Conn.) Mariners softball team.



Andrea D'Innocenzo Associate Head Coach Seventh Season Connecticut '95

Andrea D'Innocenzo, a two-time All-American and BIG EAST Conference player of the year for the University of Connecticut softball team, returns for her seventh season and first as associate head coach after joining the coaching staff in 2004.

D'Innocenzo came to UConn from Stony Brook University where she served as an assistant coordinator for alumni relations events for nine months. During 2001-2002, D'Innocenzo was the assistant softball coach at Stony Brook.

Playing for the Huskies from 1992-1995, D'Innocenzo helped lead the team to three BIG EAST conference titles. In 1993, UConn went on to win the NCAA Division I Regional Championship and participated in the Women's College World Series.

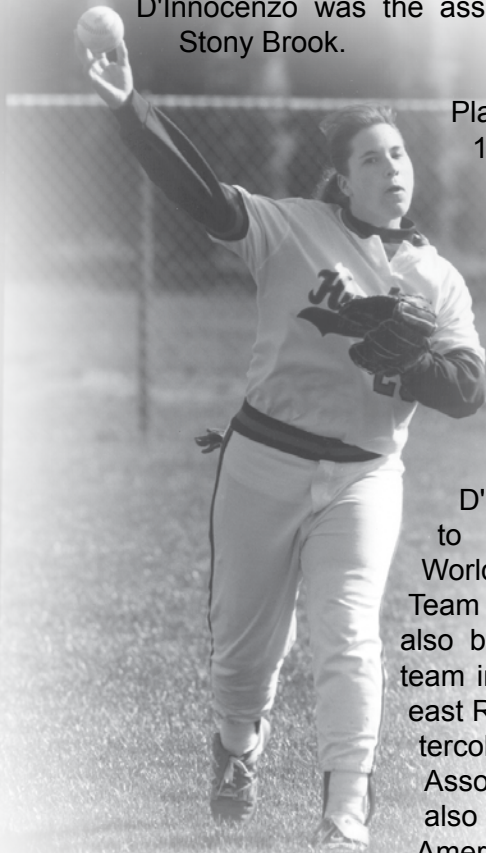
D'Innocenzo was named to the Women's College World Series All-Tournament Team that year, after having also been named to the first team in the BIG EAST, Northeast Region, New England Intercollegiate Softball Coaches Association and ECAC. She also earned third team All-America honors that year and

again in 1995. D'Innocenzo was named the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year in 1992 and went on to be a three-time member of the BIG EAST first team as well as the Northeast Region first team. As a senior, D'Innocenzo was honored as the BIG EAST Player of the Year.

D'Innocenzo also was the assistant coach at UMass-Lowell from 1999 to 2001. She then went on to play overseas professionally for four months for the Crocetta Italian softball team in Parma, Italy. D'Innocenzo also has four years of professional playing experience in the United States, having played from 1997-2000 in the Women's Professional Softball League where she was twice named a league All-Star.

D'Innocenzo holds numerous records for UConn from her playing days. Her 212 games played stand atop the career list, as well as her 20 home runs and 49 doubles. She ranks second in career RBI with 125 and second in total bases with 359. On the single-season record lists, D'Innocenzo ranks first in home runs with nine in 1993, and first in doubles with 18 in 1995. She holds a place in the top 10 for single-season doubles for every year she played. D'Innocenzo's career batting average of .347 stands fourth on the all-time list.

A native of Andover, Mass., D'Innocenzo earned a bachelor's degree in science from UConn in 1995, and went on to receive a master's in professional communication from Clark University in 2001.





Ellen Mahoney
Assistant Coach
14th Season
Connecticut '72

Now in her 14th season, assistant coach Ellen Mahoney has brought an outstanding veteran scholastic and extensive coaching background to the Husky program since her appointment in the fall of 1996.

This past fall, Mahoney was inducted into the Connecticut High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame Class of 2009. In 2001, she was inducted into the Norwich Free Academy's Inaugural Sports Hall of Fame as well as being a member of the 2001 Speedline NFCA Northeast Regional Coaching Staff of the Year.

Prior to Connecticut, Mahoney led the Ledyard (Conn.) High School softball program to seven state championship titles. Mahoney registered an impressive record of 355-84, for an 80.9 winning percentage at Ledyard.

Before she left for the collegiate ranks, her high school team became a four-time defending State Champion, having earned the Class LL state titles in 1995 and 1996 and the Class L Championships in 1993 and 1994. During the 1990s, she compiled an impressive 165-10 overall record.

In June of 1996, Mahoney was one of eight finalists for the 1996 National High School Coaches Association National Softball Coach of the Year award, after earning district honors as the Coach of the Year. A Connecticut Scholastic and Collegiate Softball Hall of Fame inductee, she was also voted the Amateur Baseball Woman of the Year in 1992 by the U.S. Baseball Federation and received Connecticut Special Congressional Recognition three times for her excellence in coaching (1993, 1994 and 1995).

During her 20-year softball tenure at Ledyard, Mahoney led the Colonels to the Connecticut state tournament 19 times, while they advanced to the state championship game on 10 occasions. During her last eight seasons (1989-96), her team advanced to the state finals every year and captured six state championships. Her teams won a share of 10 consecutive Eastern Connecticut Conference Championships (1987-96). Ledyard compiled a 105-game regular season win streak over six seasons.

She also served as head tennis coach for 13 years at Ledyard, as her teams registered a 178-36 overall record en route to eight league championships and one fall state championship. A native of Norwich, Conn., Mahoney is a 1972 graduate of Connecticut where she was a three-sport student-athlete in volleyball, basketball and softball.



Peter Looney
Assistant Coach
27th Season
Murray State '66

Peter Looney, a noted softball clinician and a former highly successful high school coach, will be celebrating his 27th season as a Connecticut softball volunteer pitching coach in 2008.

In 2001, he was a member of the Speedline NFCA Northeast Regional Coaching Staff of the Year. While at UConn, Looney has helped develop seven pitchers who have gained All-Region and All-BIG EAST honors a total of 40 times, including three who earned All-American pitching honors: Pat Conlan (1993), Kim Mizesko (1992) and Sue Rybczyk (1990).

The part-time Husky pitching mentor is the former Director of Health, Physical Education and Athletics at Stoughton High School in Stoughton, Mass.

Prior to his duties at Stoughton, Looney served as the girls' head softball coach and Director of Physical Education for 13 years (1975-87) at Apponequet (Mass.) Regional High School. A two-time Massachusetts High School Coach of the Year and the 1981 National High School Coach of the Year, Looney led Apponequet to 13 league championships, five South Region titles and five Massachusetts State Finals, as Apponequet won the Massachusetts Class L (large school) State Softball Championships in 1979, 1982, 1986 and 1987.

He is a 1966 graduate of Murray State, where he received a bachelor's degree in physical education and social sciences and was a four-year letterwinner in cross country and track. Prior to that, he received an associate's degree from North Carolina State in Recreation, Maintenance and Management. He later received his master's equivalency in athletic administration from Bridgewater (Mass.) State College.

A four year letterwinner for UConn from 2005-09, Jillian Ortega joins the Husky coaching staff this season as a student assistant coach while finishing her undergraduate degree. A career .323 hitter for the Huskies, you can find Ortega's name all over the Husky record books. Her 191 total hits, which ranks 12th all-time, brought in 105 RBIs – fifth on the record book. She totaled 19 home runs (fifth), 38 doubles (third), 298 total bases (sixth), 110 runs scored (ninth), and 55 walks (fifth).

A three-time All-BIG EAST performer, Ortega is well known in the softball community as one of UConn's marquee

players. A passionate student of the game she is a wonderful role model and great ambassador for the program.

Ortega will graduate in May with a bachelor's degree in coaching and administration.

The University of Connecticut softball team begins its 2010 season with the youngest team it's had in the past four years as seven veteran performers who graced the starting line-up the past three years graduated in the spring. Gone are two-time All-American and BIG EAST Player of the Year Micah Truax, All-BIG EAST performers Jillian Ortega and Rachael Crossin, starting outfielders Sarah Neuschwander and Megan Tierney, utility player Erin Burtner and 2008 All-BIG EAST Tournament catcher Danielle Del Ponte. The new look line-up features a group of players striving to find new leadership and their own identity. The team showed a lot of promise this fall and plenty of potential in both the returnees and underclassmen.

Pitching

The Husky pitching staff will be led by senior hurler **Tricia Sullivan** (New Bedford, Mass.). Sullivan is coming off a season ending shoulder injury and looking stronger than ever. She has been through the battles, the tough games and the pressure situations and is now poised to have a phenomenal season. Her supporting cast will feature sophomore **Ali Adelman**, (San Diego, Calif.) who has worked diligently on her movement and control in the off-season. With her rookie year under her belt, Adelman's determined to step up and deliver some quality innings this season.

Rounding out the staff are newcomers freshman **Kiki Saveriano** (Lexington, Mass.) and junior **Kathy Brenneman** (Cheshire, Conn.). Saveriano is a hard-throwing rookie with all the tools to develop into a dominant pitcher in the college game. Brenneman brings a different look to the mound attacking with a tough drop ball creating a lot of groundball outs.

Catching

With the graduation of Del Ponte and Burtner, the Huskies have big shoes to fill behind the plate. The top candidate for the job is sophomore **Amy Vaughan** (Somerset, Mass.). Vaughan has worked hard both in practice and the off-season transitioning to the catching position. What she lacks in size, she makes up for in heart and competitive attitude. Also poised to spend time behind the plate is fifth-year player **Amanda Martin** (Rowley, Mass.). Martin is working overtime to catch-up from her time away from the diamond as she competed the past four years in track and field as a javelin thrower. She brings a rocket arm and has developed quickly in the few months she has been with the program. Adding depth to the catching position is freshman **Megan Apper** (Commack, N.Y.), who will gain experience as she transitions from high school to college.

Infield

Every team has a core of key players who will ultimately help decide the fate of the team. Returning infielders **Justyne Roy** (North Dighton, Mass.), **Julianne Towers** (Goodlettsville, Tenn.), and **Jessica Arremony** (Griswold, Conn.) are three of those athletes.

Roy is a talented first baseman and clutch hitter who has really stepped up this fall to help lead the way both on the field and in the weight room. Juniors Arremony and Towers provide a lethal double-play combination. Arremony is a gifted defender with a shot gun arm at shortstop, while Towers is a gutsy competitor that leads the way offensively showing power and consistency at the plate. Adding depth at the middle infield positions are sophomore **Jen Ward** (Waterford, Conn.) and freshman **Brittany Duclos** (Mystic, Conn.). Both Ward and Duclos are capable of contributing in either infield or outfield positions. Poised to spend time at the hot corner are sophomore **Amy DeLuca** (Bordentown, N.J.) and freshman **Kim Silva** (Cheshire, Conn.). DeLuca has already shown that she can hit for power and consistency and this fall worked hard on improving her defensive skills at third base. Outfield

The Husky outfield will have a new look this spring with the graduation of Truax, a two-time All-American and BIG EAST Player of the Year and four year starters Neuschwander and Tierney. Battling for centerfield are two of Connecticut's finest in Ward (Waterford High School) and Duclos (Fitch High School). Ward's speed and quickness make her a dangerous player both in the field and on the base paths. Duclos has great game sense, is a smooth defender and capable offensive threat. Penciled in right field is transfer freshman **Marissa Guches** (Sammamish, Wash.). Guches has made the transition from first base to outfield this season. Her upbeat attitude and easy going demeanor make her a pleasure to coach and her powerful swing won't go unnoticed this spring. Vying for a spot in left field are a trio of freshmen in **Jessica McDermott** (Clarksburg, N.J.), Duclos and Silva. McDermott showed plenty of promise this fall playing a solid outfield and delivering some key hits. Each of these players brings unique assets to the outfield and the coaching staff is confident that one of them will step up and handle the position.

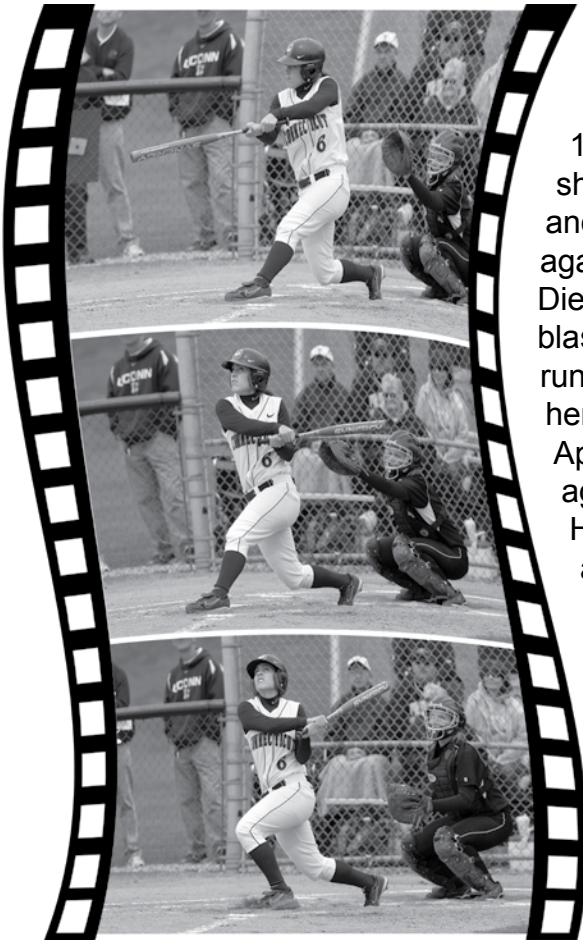

The 2009 season for the University of Connecticut Softball team opened up against some tough competition at the Mardi Gras Classic in Lafayette, La. where it took on the likes of San Diego State, then-#20 Louisiana-Lafayette and Kentucky. The Huskies finished with a 1-3 record in their season opening weekend splitting with Kentucky and falling to ULL and San Diego State.

In their second tournament of the season, the Huskies took part in the South Florida Tournament in Tampa. UConn went 3-2 in the tournament while outscoring their opponents 25-3 in their victories over St. Bonaventure, Evansville and Hofstra.

The Huskies continued in Tampa after the tournament when they were the first BIG EAST team to open conference play with a doubleheader at South Florida. UConn dropped both of their games, 2-0 and 5-0.

The following weekend, UConn finished out their tournament play with a successful weekend in San Diego. The Huskies earned four-straight victories over the host team, San Diego, New Mexico State, Northern Colorado and Texas Tech before falling in their final game of the weekend to Oklahoma State. During the tournament UConn outscored their opponents by a 13-9 margin and Head Coach Karen Mullins recorded her 750th victory as a coach with a 4-1 win over Texas Tech.

After returning home, the Huskies embarked on a six-game win streak with all of their victories coming on the road. UConn took on Quinnipiac in their first northeast game of the season defeating the Bobcats 5-2. The QU victory was followed up by a couple of wins at Seton Hall to even the Huskies' record at 2-2 in BIG EAST play. A doubleheader at Sacred Heart extended their win streak to five games and the Huskies finished their road trek with an extra-inning victory over Boston College, the first win over the Eagles since 2001.

UConn opened up their season at home with some tough competition in DePaul and Syracuse, the Blue Demons would go on to make the NCAA Tournament. The Huskies dropped both of their games to DePaul and split with Syracuse, earning their first home victory over the Orange in their weekend finale which would spur a nine-game win streak.

On April 1, UConn headed back out on the road for a doubleheader with Pittsburgh. The Huskies swept the Panthers and in doing so, Mullins recorded her 750th win as the head coach of the Huskies in a 9-3 victory.

The Huskies returned home for a few games taking wins from Boston University and Central Connecticut earning a 2-1 extra inning victory over the Terriers and shutting out the Blue Devils with a combined score of 19-0. UConn headed to Bryant where they defeated the Bulldogs 2-1 in their first ever meeting before returning home for a doubleheader with Rutgers that the Huskies easily won, 6-5 and 2-0.

The following day, UConn faced off against eventual BIG EAST Tournament Champion Notre Dame. The Fighting Irish took game one 12-4 before the second game was cancelled due to rain. UConn bounced back with a game at Hofstra where they earned their second victory over the Pride in 2009, this time with a 1-0 extra inning victory in the rain.

The Huskies earned a win over Dartmouth at home before heading out on a four-game road trip that took them to Louisville and Georgetown. The Huskies dropped all four contests battling Georgetown in both games to a 1-0 eight inning loss and a 3-2 11-inning loss.

The Huskies dropped their next two games to UMass and St. John's, in their longest losing-streak of the season, but rebounded with a win in the second game of the doubleheader with the Red Storm earning a 14-2 victory. The Huskies took two wins from Villanova, fell to Bryant at home and dropped a 9-0 decision on the road at UMass before ending their regular season at home against Providence.

On senior day, the Huskies celebrated seven athletes who were all four-year letterwinners for the team who contributed in many ways. Fittingly senior **Rachael Crossin** recorded the first no-hitter of her career and the first no-hitter for a Husky since 2003 in a 4-0 game one victory. The Huskies dropped their final regular season game 10-4 finishing the year in sixth place in the BIG EAST.

UConn was matched up with Louisville in the Quarterfinal Round of the BIG EAST Tournament which was held in Louisville. In the final game of the day, the Huskies dropped a 4-0 decision to the Cardinals to end their season with a 29-22 record.

Micah Truax and **Julianne Towers** earned All-BIG EAST Second Team honors while Crossin was named to the Third Team after their successful 2009 season. Truax also was named to the NFCA All-Mideast First Team earning the third NFCA post-season award of her career.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

JEFFREY HATHAWAY

Jeffrey A. Hathaway has played a vital role in the success story of athletics at the University of Connecticut for 18 of the past 20 years.

Hathaway is in his seventh year as Director of Athletics at UConn and he was the Executive Associate Director of Athletics at the school from 1990-2001.

In his only two years away from the Storrs campus, Hathaway enjoyed a successful tenure as the Director of Athletics at Colorado State University from 2001-03.

His first six years as UConn's Director of Athletics have arguably been the most successful in school history.

During the 2008-09 academic year, the women's basketball team won the NCAA Championship with a spotless 39-0 record, the men's basketball team advanced to the NCAA Final Four and the football team won the International Bowl as the team made its first-ever consecutive bowl appearance. The field hockey team won the BIG EAST Championship and advanced to the NCAA tournament and the men's soccer team also made NCAA play while the men's and women's indoor track and field teams each won BIG EAST Championships.

Hathaway also directed UConn to reach an agreement with IMG College, a division of IMG Worldwide, during the 2008-09 academic year. This 10-year athletics multi-media rights partnership is worth more than \$80 million in guaranteed payments to the University.

In 2007-08, UConn successfully completed the NCAA certification process. The institution was previously certified, once every 10 years as set forth by the NCAA, in 1998. Hathaway provided leadership for a comprehensive, year-long self study of the operations in the Division of Athletics, a site visit by a peer review team, a NCAA

certification committee's review of the self-study and a report by the peer review team.

The Division also reached new long-term agreements with two of its media partners in recent years – Connecticut Public Television for women's basketball and WTIC radio for football and men's and women's basketball. UConn also completed a landmark ten-year, \$46 million corporate partnership agreement with Nike, Inc. to exclusively provide footwear, apparel and equipment for Husky athletics.

In addition to his leadership role at UConn, Hathaway began a five-year term in 2007-08 on the prestigious NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee representing the BIG EAST Conference. As a member of the ten-person committee, Hathaway takes part in the selection and administration of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship and the administration of the CBS television contract. He is only the fourth individual in the history of the BIG EAST Conference to serve on the committee, joining Dave Gavitt, Jake Crouthamel and Mike Tranghese.

Hathaway is a member of the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association Board of Trustees and on the Executive Committee of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA).

Private fundraising for UConn athletics continues to provide exceptional academic and athletic opportunities for student-athletes as more than \$85 million has been raised during Hathaway's tenure as Director.

Hathaway leads a head coaching staff that is one of the most experienced in the country. UConn has 13 head coaches that have been in their current position 10 or more years as of the 2009-10 academic year, including women's basketball coach Geno Auriemma (25th year in 2009-10), men's basketball coach Jim Calhoun (24th) and football coach Randy Edsall (11th). The

University recently completed long term contract extensions with Auriemma and Edsall. UConn has the distinction of being the only school in the nation with two active Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame coaches in Calhoun (Class of 2005 inductee) and Auriemma (Class of 2006 inductee).

During Hathaway's career, he has always made the student-athlete the top priority.

In the spring and fall semesters of the 2008 calendar year, UConn's student-athletes excelled in the classroom as nearly 50% of the 650 student-athletes achieved a 3.0 "B-or better" semester grade point average. In addition, the Division of Athletics has consistently maintained a 99 percent retention rate among its student-athletes.

"My focus is on the student-athlete," says Hathaway. "That's the most important part of our program. Our primary mission is the continued academic success of our student-athletes. The challenge is to identify people early in the process and assist them in charting a career path. In addition, we want to provide a quality experience in intercollegiate athletics for our student-athletes."

Hathaway earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Administration from the University of Maryland in 1981. He later received a Master's Degree in General Administration (1991) from the University of Maryland and is currently continuing work on a PhD in Educational Leadership from the University of Connecticut.

He attended The Sports Management Institute at the Universities of Notre Dame and Southern California. Hathaway also completed the Management Development Program at Harvard University.

Born June 20, 1959, in Cheverly, Md., Hathaway and his wife Paula have two children: Meghan (October 15, 1991) and Michael (June 11, 1995).



COUNSELING PROGRAM FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETES

The University of Connecticut is committed to each of its student-athletes as a total person. Participation in athletics is important, but it represents only one aspect of the players college experience. At the University of Connecticut, academic achievement is the primary concern. Impressively, for the past four years the Connecticut student-athlete retention rate has been 99.0 percent.

The University's commitment to the student-athlete is a dual one. Participation in athletics is not viewed as an obstacle to the attainment of one's educational goals, rather it is seen as a complementary activity. Each supports the other. Athletic excellence is stressed, but academic achievement is never compromised - indeed, it is given the utmost priority.

The University realizes that all student-athletes are required to commit a large percentage of their personal time to University sponsored athletic activities. For this reason, the University recognizes the need for a support program for its intercollegiate athletes. The Counseling Program for Intercollegiate Athletes (CPIA) constantly assists all student-athletes in achieving their academic goals. The CPIA staff serves as a liaison to the academic faculty, the Division of Athletics, and the student-athlete.

In serving as a liaison between the Connecticut student-athletes and University faculty and staff, the CPIA counselors also provide assistance in securing appropriate support services available with the University. These include orientation for student-athletes, supervised study halls, individual tutors and tutorial centers (an English/Writing Center, Math Center and Reading Center), and learning skills seminars.

For the past three years, the writing lab and computers have been networked to a national database which allow all student-athletes to do research at their actual computer stations.

A counselor is assigned to work with each intercollegiate team, and working directly with the UConn softball program is Alana Linick. Linick monitors all aspects of each athlete's academic life, including class schedule, arranging for tutors and progress toward a degree. The goal for each Husky student-athlete is to earn a degree so they can become a success in whatever field they choose.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

The strength and conditioning program for the University of Connecticut is under the supervision of UConn Strength and Conditioning Coordinator Jerry Martin. The Strength and Conditioning staff services all 24 of Connecticut's intercollegiate teams.

UConn athletes have the use of two different weight rooms in the Harry A. Gampel Pavilion and the newly remodeled Hugh S. Greer Field House. In all, there are over 8,000 square feet of weight training facilities available for all UConn student-athletes.

The weight room in the Harry A. Gampel Pavilion is a free weight facility and supplies the Husky student-athletes areas in which to perform their power and Olympic lifts. The facility in the Greer Field House is fitted with more free weights in which the UConn athletes can incorporate circuit training, speed training and heavy negative workouts into their total strength-training program.

Martin and his staff supervise a strength and conditioning program for each individual athlete for training all year long. Each program can be manipulated in order to fulfill the specific needs of the individual. Specific testing is done to each softball player to monitor progress in strength, power, body composition, anaerobic conditioning and flexibility. These tests provide the coaches and medical staff with an accurate athletic profile on each softball athlete.

Amanda Kimball oversees the day-to-day needs of the UConn softball team.

TEAM MANAGER

Lauren Cecchi began her career at the University of Connecticut in 2007 as a third baseman and outfielder. In her freshman year, Cecchi made 41 appearances and 35 starts finishing with a .253 batting average on 25 hits. She collected 20 RBI's while scoring 12 runs of her own and recorded a home run in each of her first two collegiate games. A 2006 Gatorade State Player of the Year at Simsbury High, Lauren's collegiate career came to a halt after suffering a debilitating back injury her sophomore year. In spite of her medical disqualification, Lauren remains a key person in the Husky program as a manager and statistician. Her love of the game and dedication to us are invaluable.
