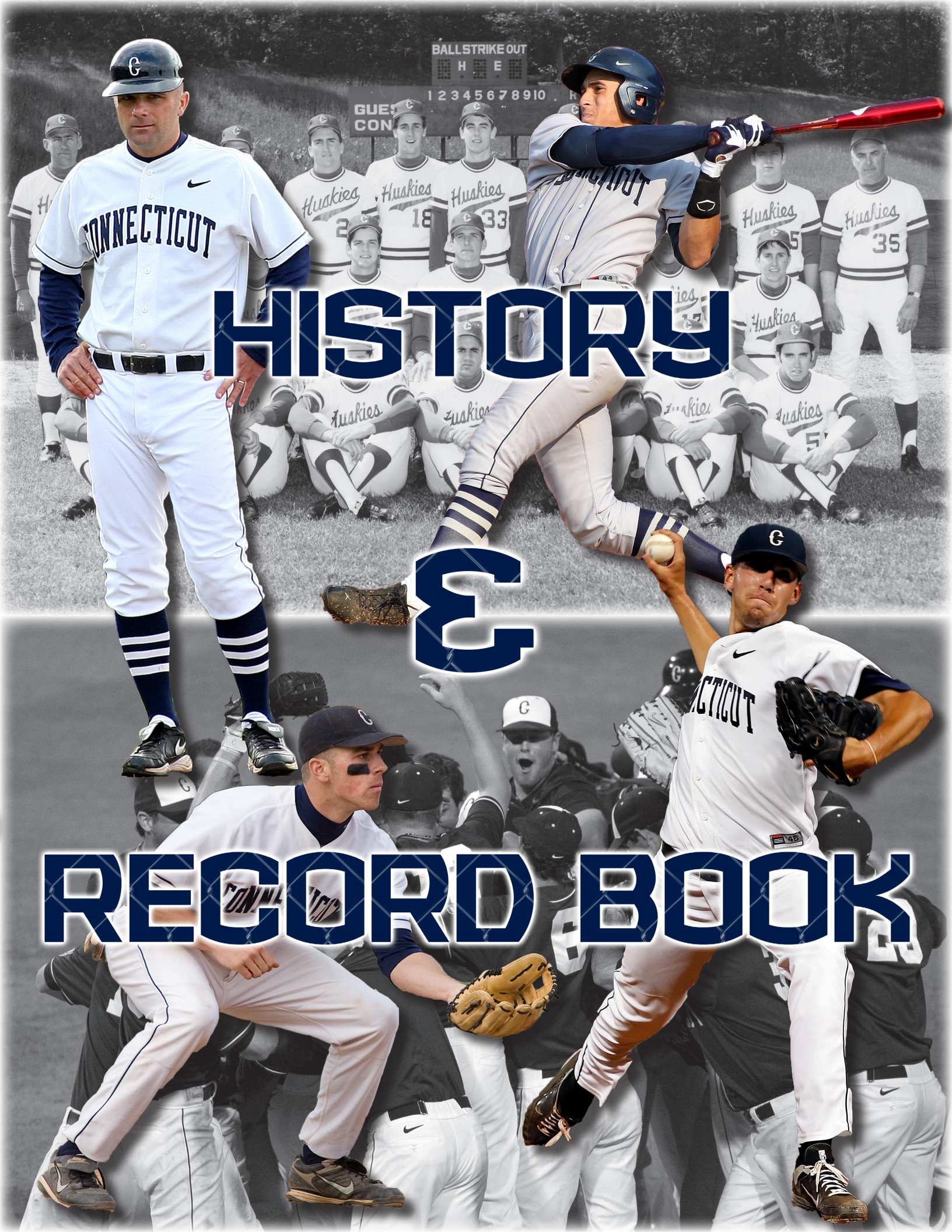

**J.O. Christian**  
1936-61

J.O. Christian began coaching football and baseball at UConn in 1934 following an eight-year term as head coach of all sports at Eveleth (MN) College, where his football team compiled a fantastic record, losing only once from 1929-33. His baseball nines were in the NCAA College World Series in 1957 and 1959; and his 1958 club lost the chance when it bowed out to Holy Cross, 2-1, in 10 innings in a game for the New England representation. The 1959 team (rated by Christian as his best ever) had a 20-1 record, being undefeated in New England competition. He won nine out of 14 Yankee Conference pennants and two New England titles. His baseball teams recorded 258 wins, 170 losses and seven ties. During his 16 years as head football coach, he led his Huskies to 66-51-4 overall record. He served as interim basketball coach for part of the 1936 season.

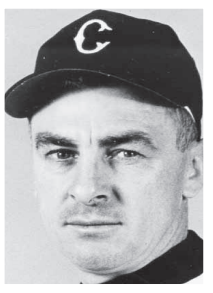
The Connecticut Alumni Association's Outstanding Service Award "as the man who has done the most for the University" was presented to him in 1945 and again in 1959. He also received the "Gold Key", given by the Connecticut Sportswriters Alliance (1959) for outstanding contribution in Connecticut state sports. On April 29, 1960, the UConn Club presented "Christy" its annual outstanding contribution award. He was president of the American Association of College Baseball Coaches in 1960; and chairman of the NCAA District One Baseball Selection Committee, completing his term in 1958. He is in the ABCA Hall of Fame.

His active coaching career began in 1926 at Eveleth and included 28 years at the University of Connecticut, all as head baseball coach. A native of Roland, Iowa, he was educated in Wilmar, Minn., schools, and attended Hamline University and the University of Minnesota. Christian passed away on October 21, 1979, at the age of 81. He and his wife Corinne had three daughters, Marion, Anne, and Claire.

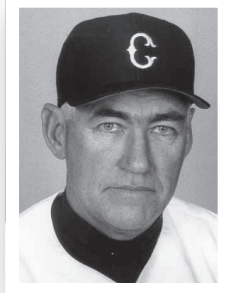
**Larry PANCIERA**

Larry Panciera was a member of the UConn athletics staff for 30 years. Panciera served as head coach of baseball at Connecticut for 18 years (1962-1979). He compiled a 297-160-5 record as head coach, was named NCAA New England Coach-of-the-Year six times and led Connecticut to the College World Series three times (1965, 1972, 1979). In 1979, his final Husky team recorded 31 wins as the Huskies won both the ECAC Division I New England Championship and the NCAA Northeast Region title to advance to the College World Series for the fifth time in school history. In his final year of coaching, Panciera was honored as the 1979 NCAA Northeast Regional Coach of the Year.

At Connecticut, Panciera was part of all five of UConn's trips to the NCAA College World Series, twice as an assistant in 1957 and 1959, and three times as head coach in 1965, 1972 and 1979. During his tenure as head coach, 40 student-athletes who played for Panciera at Connecticut went on to sign professional baseball contracts.

He spent his retirement years at his home in the Weekapaug section of Westerly, R.I., before passing away on September 8, 1998, at the age of 76. He was survived by his two sons, David and Michael.

Andy Baylock retired in 2003 after 24 years at the helm of the baseball program. In January of 1996, Baylock was honored with induction into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame at the national convention in Nashville, Tenn. Baylock's tenure was the winningest period in the illustrious history of Connecticut Baseball, leading the UConn program to 556 wins over his 24 seasons, averaging over 23 wins per season during his tenure.

Baylock's 24th season as the head coach of the Huskies was his 39th year of consecutive service to the Husky baseball program. Prior to the start of his head coaching career, Baylock spent 15 years as the top assistant coach to then-head coach Larry Panciera and also served as head freshman football coach. When Baylock's assistant coaching tenure is taken into account, he has been part of an overall UConn record of 812-614-11 during the past 39 seasons. The New Britain, Conn., native has personally coached 1,447 of the 2,327 games (62 percent) that have ever been played involving the University of Connecticut baseball program.

In the summers of 1985 and 1989, Baylock was the pitching coach for the U.S. Senior National Team that competed against other national teams in the United States, Cuba, Puerto Rico, Japan, Korea and Canada. He also was pitching coach for the U.S. squad that finished second in the International Harbor Tournament in Taiwan in the fall of 1988.

A graduate of Central Connecticut State University, Baylock and his wife, Barbara, reside in Mansfield Center and have three children, all of whom attended the University of Connecticut - Jennifer, Jeffrey and Andrea. He remains at UConn as the Director of Alumni and Community Relations for the UConn football program.

**Jim PENDERS**



**Jim Penders**

Jim Penders is in his 10th season as head baseball coach after taking over for longtime Husky coach Andy Baylock in 2004. Penders, a 1994 graduate of the University of Connecticut, was a member of Baylock's most successful teams. Penders' teams qualified for three BIG EAST Tournaments (1992-94) with all three teams advancing to the BIG EAST Tournament Final. Penders captained the 1994 squad that captured the BIG EAST Tournament Championship. The 1993 and 1994 teams advanced to the NCAA Regional with the 1993 team earning only the second at-large berth in the history of the BIG EAST Conference. In Penders' four-year playing career, his teams tallied a record of 99-76-2.

After graduating, Penders moved to Washington D.C. where he was a fundraiser for Senator Tom Harkin of Iowa. Penders returned to UConn in 1997 to become an assistant coach and take over the Husky recruiting efforts. Since he took over as head coach at UConn, Penders has compiled an overall record of 320-211-4.

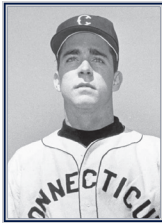


UConn makes five consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including a 17-win season in 1959 and a second CWS appearance.

The UConn baseball program has had several players, as well as former head coach Andy Baylock, involved with Team USA and USA Baseball.

Most recently, current second baseman LJ Mazzilli served as an alternate on the USA Collegiate National Team. George Springer and Matt Barnes played for the USA Collegiate Baseball Team during the 2010 summer. Barnes was 3-0 and held an ERA of 1.42. In 19 innings of work, he allowed three earned runs, while striking out 26 batters, which was second-best on the team. Springer led Team USA with seven doubles and 18 RBI. He batted .292 in 18 games and his grand slam against Japan lifted USA to a 4-2 win to advance to the gold medal game of the V FISU World University Baseball Championship.

In the winter of 1999, former Husky and 1988 Olympic Gold Medalist Charles Nagy was named to the 15-member All-Time USA Baseball team. Among other players named to the same team were former major leaguers Nomar Garciaparra, Mark McGwire, Robin Ventura and Will Clark. Husky catcher Brian Esposito trained with the United States Baseball program, joining the squad for USA Baseball tryouts in June of 1999.

Former Husky standout Jason Grabowski made two appearances at USA Baseball Camps in 1995, joining the program for USA Baseball tryouts in June and then attending the 1995 Fall Baseball Trials in November in Homestead, Fla.

In November of 1994, Grabowski and pitcher Mike Galati joined the long line of Huskies to train or compete with the United States National Baseball program. The pair joined a select group of 72 players invited to participate in the USA Baseball National Fall Trials in Homestead, Fla., from November 2-6, 1994. Connecticut was the only school from the Northeast represented and was one of only 16 Division I schools across the nation to be represented by two or more players.

In 1993, former Husky John Kelly was a member of the USA Baseball squad that represented the U.S. in Nicaragua at the Pan-American Qualifier for the 1994 World Championships. Kelly finished his stint with the team with a record of 2-0 and a 2.81 ERA.



The University of Connecticut baseball program has sent many players on to the professional ranks. In all, a total of 152 players have been drafted by professional clubs or signed free agent contracts.

With his Major League debut on August 2, Mike Olt became the 12th Husky to reach the big leagues and continue a streak of 23 straight seasons of having a former UConn player in MLB. Three more Huskies were drafted in 2012, adding to the program's total of 76 players taken since the draft's inception in 1965. Right-handed pitcher Scott Oberg and David Fischer were both drafted and signed, while LJ Mazzilli was taken in the ninth round, but opted to return for his senior season in 2012.

In the 2011 MLB Amateur Draft, a program-best 10 Huskies were taken, including George Springer and Matt Barnes in the first round, marking the first time that two UConn players were selected in the first round.

Former Husky All-American and 1988 United States Olympic gold medalist Charles Nagy completed 14 full seasons as a starting pitcher with the Cleveland Indians and in 2010 was named the pitching coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks. In 1992, Nagy emerged as one of the bright new pitchers in all of the major leagues.

He finished the year with a 17-10 record and a 2.96 ERA. For his efforts, he was named to the American League All-Star team. He pitched one perfect inning in the All-Star game and also collected a hit. He also threw a one-hitter on August 8, 1992, against the Baltimore Orioles at Camden Yards. After suffering a shoulder injury in 1993, Nagy made a successful return to the Indians rotation in 1994 and was a major component in the team's AL Pennant and a visit to the World Series in 1995. The following year, Nagy earned his second trip to the Major League All-Star game and was the starting pitcher for the American League. In 1997, Nagy contributed to the Cleveland Indians' second visit in three years to the World Series and made an appearance in Game 7 of the series against the Florida Marlins. In 1999, Nagy was selected to his third American League All-Star game and helped pitch Cleveland to another Central Division title.

After eight major league seasons primarily as a relief pitcher, Pete Walker began coaching at the minor league level. In the fall of 2011, he was promoted within the Toronto organization and again in 2013 to be the pitching coach for the 2013 Toronto Blue Jays. As a player, Walker spent three and a half seasons in Toronto where he won 10 games in 2002. For his career, he held a 20-14 record and 4.48 ERA in 144 games.

One of the most prominent Husky major leaguers was the late Walt Dropo, who played 13 seasons in the majors and was the American League Rookie of the Year in 1950 with the Boston Red Sox. He still holds the major league record for consecutive hits with 12, set during the 1952 season with the Detroit Tigers.

Rollie Sheldon was the second Husky to debut in the majors in 1961. He won 11 games as a rookie for the World Series Champion New York Yankees and appeared in two games for the Yankees in the 1964 World Series.

Former Husky Bob Schaefer is also a well-known name in major league circles. As a Husky, Schaefer led the nation in home runs in 1966, with seven homers in only 18 games. In 2007, he served as the bench coach for the Oakland Athletics. From 2008 through 2010 he has sat beside Joe Torre as the bench coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers. Currently he is the special assistant to the General Manager with the Washington Nationals.

He previously served as a Major League scout with the Baltimore Orioles, as a special adviser to Atlanta Braves General Manager,

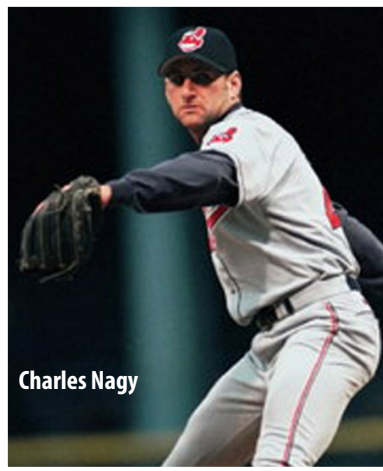

John Schuerholz, as the Director of Player Development for the Boston Red Sox and as a coach with the Kansas City Royals, as he served two stints as interim manager with the club. George Greer was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals after he graduated in 1968 and went on and played in the minors at Single-A Modesto (Calif.) for five years until 1973.

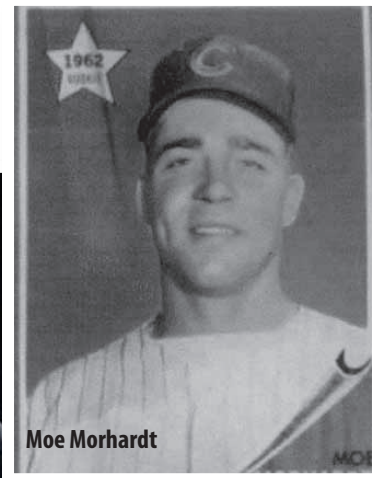
Jason Grabowski made his major league debut in 2002 with the Oakland Athletics. Grabowski spent part of the 2004 and 2005 seasons with the Los Angeles Dodgers. In 2006, Grabowski played for the Orix Buffaloes of Japan.

Former Huskies that are in the minor leagues include former major leaguer Brian Esposito (Chicago Cubs), Erik Turgeon (Pittsburgh Pirates), Mike Tarsi (Atlanta Braves), Dan Mahoney (New York Yankees), Nick Ahmed (Arizona Diamondbacks), John Andreoli (Chicago Cubs), Matt Barnes (Boston Red Sox), Elliot Glynn (Milwaukee Brewers), Greg Nappo (Miami Marlins), George Springer (Houston Astros), Kevin Vance (Chicago White Sox), David Fischer (Washington Nationals) and Scott Oberg (Colorado Rockies).

Two former Huskies are also playing in the independent leagues. Peter Fatse and Matt McDonald play for ball clubs in the independent leagues.
