# Director of Tennis

## Glenn Marshall Connecticut '89, '93 18th Season

In his 13th season as the Director of Tennis at the University of Connecticut, Glenn Marshall enters his 18th season working with the tennis programs overall. He has served as the men's tennis team head coach since the 1992 season and took the helm of both the men's and women's programs in 1997.

Throughout his tenure, the women's tennis team has continued to rise within the BIG EAST conference. Last season, he led the squad to a 9-11 record, finishing 12th at the conference championship, marking the third consecutive season that the Huskies have reached the BIG EAST Tournament. Marshall looks to guide the team back to a .500 record as he did in 2006-07 when UConn finished the year with an 11-11 record and a seventh-place finish at the conference tournament.

Men's tennis concluded the year with an above .500 (8-7) record for the first time since the 2000-01 (13-8) and reached the BIG EAST Tournament as well in 2008-09.

Marshall was elected the president of the BIG EAST Tennis Coaches Association by his peers in 2004. In this position, he represents the interests of all of the BIG EAST tennis programs and facilitates the development of new conference rules and all the details pertaining to the conference championships.

In the 2001 fall season, Marshall's men's and women's tennis teams combined for a 27-14 record, for a .659 winning-percentage, the highest for the women's program since he took over in the 1997-98 season. The women's tennis team captured the New England Championships that season. Individually, UConn took championships in five of the six singles brackets and two of the three doubles brackets at the New England Championships.

Prior to that, Marshall led the men's tennis team to a 20-5 season in 1999-2000. Twenty wins set a single-season record for total wins while the Huskies capped off the season with a seventh place finish at the BIG EAST Championships. That year, UConn earned notable wins against Maryland, Georgetown, Seton Hall and Providence.

Marshall has guided the men's tennis team to four championships, including in his first year as head coach. In the spring of 1993, he led the Huskies to the New England Championship with men's tennis capturing the ECAC Championship title that fall (1993). UConn defended each crown the following season, winning the New England Championship and the ECAC titles the following spring and fall of 1994.

Off the court, Marshall has assisted in the research and development of tennis racquets for professional players at Bosworth International in Boca Raton, Fla.

Marshall serves as the Director of Tennis at the Madison Beach Club during the summer months. He and the staff at Madison instruct over 130 juniors and run an extensive adult program that includes USTA league play and lessons.

He attended Keene State College in New Hampshire for a year prior to transferring to the University of Connecticut in the fall of 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner with the men's tennis program at UConn, graduating in 1989 with a bachelor's of fine arts degree in music. Marshall was the top singles and doubles player for the Huskies and was voted the team captain for the 1988-89 season. He completed his master's degree in sport management in 1993.

Marshall resides in his hometown of Glastonbury, Conn., with his wife, Carolyn, and their two children, Carter (14) and Christine (12).

- Earned his 100th career women's tennis victory when the Huskies defeated Villanova, 6-1 on April 6, 2008.
- Led the women's team to a .500 finish in 2006-07 for the first time in four years and its highest finish at the BIG EAST Championship (seventh) with the program under his direction.
- Helped the Huskies to an overall record of 27-14 in 2001-02 and the highest combined winning percentage (.659) in his tenure.
- Led UConn men's team to a single-season school record 20-5 (.800) year in 1999-2000.
- Guided the Husky men to back-to-back New England Championships and ECAC Championships in 1993 and 1994.
- Appointed Director of Tennis in 1997. Recorded his 200th coaching victory, men's and women's combined, in the 2004-05 season.
- Led the men to a second place finish in the ECAC Championship in 1997 and 1998.
- Aided the men's tennis team to two-consecutive BIG EAST Tournament berths in the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons.
- Helped the women's tennis team reach the BIG EAST Tournament for the past three-consecutive seasons.

Michael Louis enters his sixth season as an assistant coach with the University of Connecticut men's tennis team. A native of New York, N.Y., Louis was a four-year letterwinner for the Huskies from 2000-04. A former team captain, Louis compiled an overall record of 35-32 in singles competition at UConn.

He remained with the team during the 2005 season as a student-coach and became an assistant coach with the program the following year.

Prior to his arrival at Connecticut, Louis attended the Humanities High School and was named the New York Public School Athletic League Tennis Player of the Year his senior season. He was also the recipient of the Iron Horse Award for tennis.

Louis received a bachelor's degree in exercise physiology from Connecticut in 2005 and went on to earn his master's degree in sport management in 2007.



**Kate Tellers**  
**Assistant Coach Oklahoma '98**  
**Third Season**

Kate Tellers resumes her post as an assistant coach with the University of Connecticut women's tennis team for her third season. Tellers has been a coach with various club and high school teams for eight years prior to becoming the assistant at UConn.

Tellers was a four-year letterwinner at the University of Oklahoma where she earned a pair of Big 12 Champion titles in both singles and doubles play. The two-year captain, was an ITA Academic All-American in 1998 after receiving conference academic accolades in each of her four seasons.

She graduated from Oklahoma in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in health/sports science and social science. Prior to her collegiate playing experience, Tellers was a three-time state champion while attending Heritage Hall High School in Oklahoma City, Okla.

The former Kate Dunlevy, is married to Shawn Tellers and has three children, Jake, Mara Faith and Will.

### Spring Preview

Prior to the team's Spring Break Trip to Orlando, Fla., the Huskies head to West Point, N.Y. for a pair of dual matches against Army and Stony Brook to commence the spring season. UConn hosts UMBC on Feb. 27 for its first home match of the spring.

During the trip to Orlando, Fla., the men's tennis team will face St. Cloud State, Valparaiso and Northern Illinois in preparation for the Huskies' BIG EAST schedule. Following their return, the Huskies head to Brown and Boston University. UConn hosts Marist on March 30 for its second home dual match of the spring and final non-conference contest before taking on St. John's in Queens, N.Y.

The Huskies host intra-state rival Fairfield and travel to Georgetown and Villanova in mid-April. This season's BIG EAST Tournament takes place on April 22-25 in South Bend, Ind. hosted by Notre Dame.

UConn will rely upon the senior leadership of co-captains **Tom Cook** and **Joe Goldstein** as a primarily youthful team sets out to reach the BIG EAST Tournament. The Huskies boast a roster of six sophomores, five of whom will depend heavily upon a year of collegiate experience to increase their impact on the team this season. **Jai Yoon**, the sixth sophomore in his first season at UConn, will add to the depth of both lineups after a successful fall.

### Fall Review

Men's tennis started match play with consecutive 7-0 victories over Hartford and Siena following the Fairfield Doubles Invitational. The season continued at the Northeastern Intercollegiate Invitational with newcomer **Jai Yoon** capturing the Fourth Singles Flight in Providence, R.I. **Scott Warden** and **Joe Goldstein** ended the Northeastern Invite with second and third place finishes, respectively, in the Third Singles Flight.

The Huskies kept the dual match winning streak alive with a 5-2 decision over Bryant near the end of September. A trio of players, Goldstein, Warden and Yoon, all won their respective singles and doubles matches over the Bulldogs. September ended with the Huskies' hosting the UConn Invitational where **Nic Visinski** and **Wei Lin** won the C Doubles Flight.

Co-captain **Tom Cook** earned a pair of titles at the Bucknell Invitational, winning the B Singles Main Draw, in addition to claiming the B Doubles Bracket Title along with **Ricardo Cardona**. The Huskies participated in the Quinnipiac Invitational where Lin and **Matt Burns** captured the D Doubles Title. Cook, Lin and Yoon all advanced to the semifinals as well.

Three players competed at the ITA Regionals in Hanover, N.H. with Yoon advancing to the round of 64 in singles play. He, along with **Dave Adams** advanced past the first round in doubles action.

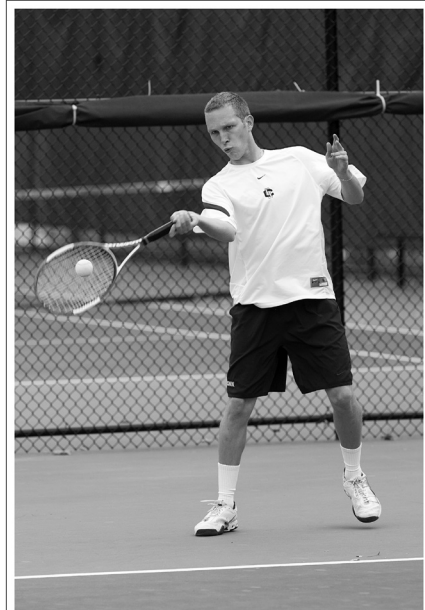
The fall season concluded at the Connecticut State Championships in New Haven, Conn. Cook and Goldstein advanced to the semifinals and Adams and Yoon reached the quarterfinals until their bids ended at the State Championships.

### Spring Preview

UConn opens the spring season with a pair of challenging non-conference matches at West Point, N.Y., taking on both Army and Stony Brook to start the 2010 campaign. The BIG EAST season starts early with matches against West Virginia and Cincinnati near the end of February. Following the conference matches in Cincinnati, the Huskies head south to Orlando, Fla. for their spring break trip.

This season, the women's tennis team takes on Illinois State, Bethel and Liberty during the break before returning to the comforts of Connecticut. The Huskies will use the trio to prepare effectively for conference competition. UConn returns to action on March 17 with a 3 p.m. match against intra-state rival Fairfield before hosting Providence, Syracuse and Rutgers for three-consecutive BIG EAST matches in Storrs.

The Huskies hit the road to battle Seton Hall, Georgetown and Villanova in April and host St. John's and Pittsburgh for the final conference matches before the BIG EAST Tournament in South Bend, Ind. Trips to conference matches against Cincinnati, Georgetown and Villanova will adequately prepare the team for its objective of reaching the BIG EAST Tournament once again.

Big things are expected from an outstanding freshman class while the leadership both on and off the court from **Alli Campitiello** and **Kelley LoRusso** looks to increase the team's presence in conference competition. **Julia Allen**, **Abby McKeon**, and **Lauren Wilmarth** will use a solid fall start to their rookie campaign to prepare themselves to the demanding competition in the spring. Among the five student-athletes among an outstanding rookie class, the Huskies will expect great things from **Julia Allen**, **Sarah Griffin**, **Lauren Rothermich** as well. They will look to the experience of **Alexa Gregory** and **Emily Searle** with a year of collegiate tennis behind them able to add tremendous depth to the UConn roster and invaluable leadership this spring.

### Men's Tennis History

The University of Connecticut men's tennis program began in 1932, when coach Marcel Kessel first launched men's tennis at Connecticut.

Through the years, the program has been led by outstanding coaches, including Dr. John Y. Squires, John Chapman and Ben Kirtland. For one year, UConn men's tennis was guided by legendary Husky men's basketball coach Hugh Greer, who in 1953 led Connecticut to its first of three Yankee Conference tennis titles.

Connecticut, which also won Yankee Conference titles in 1954 and 1964, became a member of the BIG EAST Conference in 1980. Guiding the move to the BIG EAST was veteran head coach John Chapman, who directed the men's tennis team for 28 years (1956-1984).

Current UConn head coach and director of tennis operations, Glenn Marshall, has continued the successful tradition of Husky tennis coaches by leading Connecticut to back-to-back New England Championships (1993 and 1994) and ECAC Championships (1993 and 1994), since taking over for Ben Kirtland in November of 1992. The men's tennis team has reached the BIG EAST Tournament for the past two seasons and doubled its total wins from the 2006-07 season to the 2007-08 season.

The Huskies compete each academic year in both a fall and spring season, with the ambitious spring schedule featuring a spring break trip and several non-conference contests in preparation for the BIG EAST Tournament Championships. This season, Notre Dame will host the conference's championship competition in South Bend, Ind.

For the second-consecutive season, both the men's and women's tennis teams will travel to Orlando, Fla. for its spring break competition. In recent years, the UConn men and women have taken annual spring trips to Bermuda, Southern California, Florida, Arizona and South Carolina.

### Women's Tennis History

Women's tennis excellence is an annual occurrence at the University of Connecticut, where current head coach Glenn Marshall is in his 13th year in charge of a program with a long and proud winning tradition dating back to the inaugural 1974-75 season.

Entering the 2009-10 season, the Huskies' overall women's tennis record for 35 years (66 seasons) is at an impressive 378-289-3. Along with annual success in head-to-head matches with various collegiate rivals, the program has also performed well at the New England Championships. The Huskies placed third at the New England Championships in 1992 and 1993, to go along with the consecutive second place finishes in 1990 and 1991.

After founding the UConn women's program in the fall of 1974, former head coach Pat Babcock led the team to winning records each and every fall and spring season. In fact, from 1974-90, a total of 16 years, the Huskies played all 32 consecutive seasons (fall and spring) with winning records.

Connecticut is a charter member of the BIG EAST Conference and the Huskies have competed in the BIG EAST Championship 22 out of 27 years. For the past three-consecutive seasons, women's tennis has competed at the championships, finishing last year in 12th place.

The 1994-95 season marked the first time in which the men's and women's championship were held together during the spring season. The 2009 BIG EAST Championships will be hosted by Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind. in April.

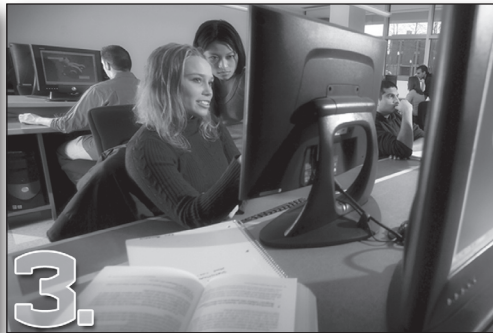

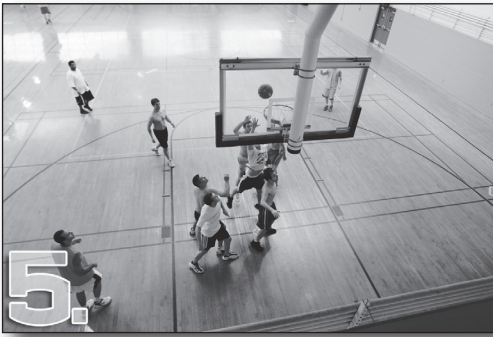

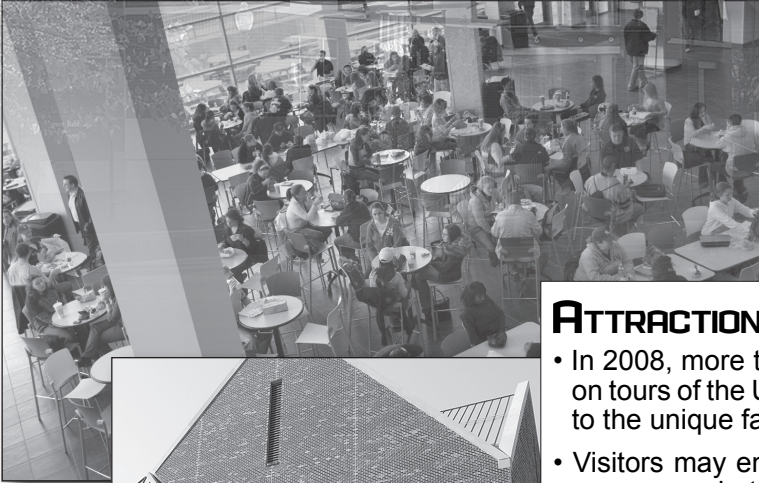
## HUSKYMANIA

Since 1995, UConn athletic teams have captured nine NCAA national championships, including unprecedented dual men's and women's basketball championships in 2004 — the first University to do so in NCAA Division I history. UConn's standard of athletic excellence extends to the gridiron, where the Huskies — 2007 BIG EAST Champions — play for sell-out crowds of 40,000 roaring football fans at the ultra-modern Rentschler Field.

## STUDENT QUALITY

- More than 29,000 students enrolled, representing nearly every state in the nation and more than 100 countries.
- Average SAT scores for incoming freshmen at Storrs are up 87 points since 1996 and are now 1200.
- The 355 students UConn welcomed into its Honors Program in 2008 had an average SAT score of 1390.
- Minority freshman enrollment at Storrs and the regional campuses has more than doubled since 1995.

- Nearly 50 percent of student-athletes earned a 3.0 or better grade point average last year, and 17 student-athletes had a 4.0 grade point average in the fall and/or spring semesters.

- UConn offers more than 400 student clubs and organizations.
- Students can choose from more than 200 Study Abroad programs in 65 countries.
- Cooperative education programs and internships integrate classroom learning and work experience in business, industry, and public service.

## ATTRACTIONS

- In 2008, more than 45,000 prospective students and their families embarked on tours of the UConn campus from the Lodewick Visitors Center, the gateway to the unique facilities that define the University's 4,000-acre main campus.
- Visitors may enjoy lodging, dining, and relaxing in the Nathan Hale Inn, our on-campus hotel and conference facility.
- With more than 3 million volumes, the Homer Babbidge Library is the intellectual hub of the Storrs campus. In fact, the Association of Research Libraries ranks UConn's library system the top public research library in New England.
- UConn's Jorgensen Center for the Performing Arts showcases the region's most noteworthy dramatic events. It stages professional touring attractions that range from Broadway musicals to intimate cabarets.



- The collections of the William Benton Museum of Art include more than 5,500 pieces; the museum features a gallery exclusively dedicated to presenting human rights-oriented visual arts, as well as an outdoor meditation sculpture garden.
- Housed in UConn's Museum of Natural History, the Connecticut Archaeology Center explores the natural and cultural history of southern New England.
- The J. Robert Donnelly Husky Heritage Sports Museum features photos, videos, plaques, banners, uniforms, and NCAA National Championship trophies.
