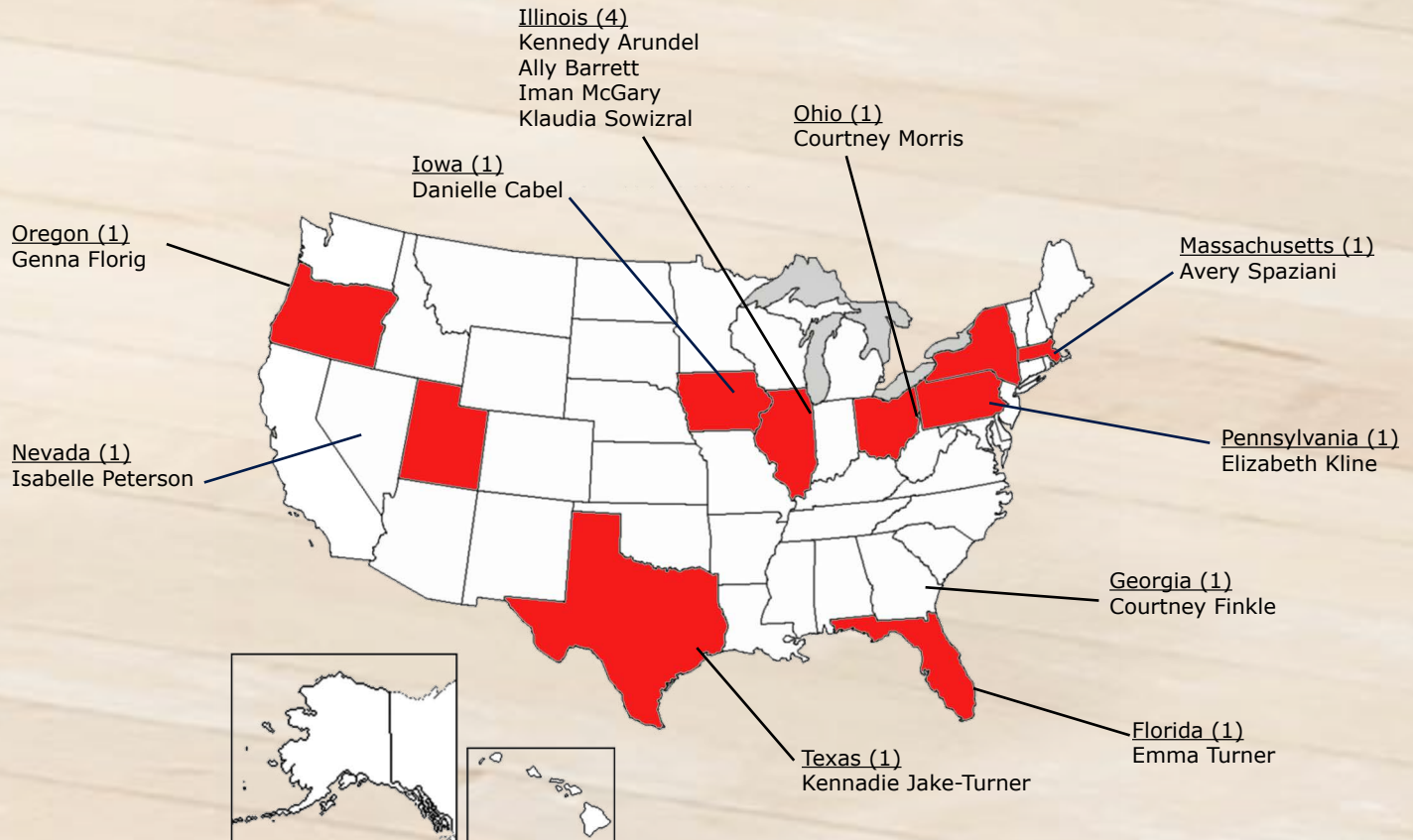

GAMPEL PAVILION

The Huskies return to Gampel Pavilion after playing the 2017 season in the Guyer Gym, located in the UConn Recreation Center, due to a dome reconstruction project on Gampel that lasted until early November.

The 2017 season marks the first season since 1993 that the UConn volleyball team did not play its home matches in Gampel Pavilion. UConn has compiled an overall record of 219-103 since beginning play in the Pavilion in 1993. This season, Connecticut will play at least 16 matches in front of a home crowd in the Guyer Gym.

In the 1992 season, the Huskies went 23-14 (2-5 Big East) under head coach Ellen Crandall in their most recent year in the Guyer Gym. UConn went 6-3 in home matches that season, while setting a program-record at the time with 23 victories overall.

The UConn volleyball team has access to two different weight rooms in Gampel Pavilion along with the Hugh S. Greer Field House Weight Room for use during their strength and conditioning workouts. The weight rooms feature custom made multi-use racks and platforms, dumbbell racks, cable machines and various Cybex Machines.





2018 SEASON PREVIEW

Five Newcomers to the Team

Kennadie Jake-Turner (Houston, Texas), Anna Petrova (Voronezh, Russia), Courtney Finkle (Johns Creek, Ga.), Caylee Parker (Windsor, Ontario) and Klaudia Sowizral (St. Charles, Ill.) join the UConn program this season, bringing a multitude of experiences and skills to Grundwald's team. The fivesome make-up the Class of 2022 and will look to have an immediate impact on the court.

Back to Work

Senior Iman McGary is coming off a break out season in 2017, posting career highs in kills (244), assists (29), digs (173) and total blocks (31). McGary, an outside hitter from Rockford, Ill., was second on the team in kills and recorded a personal best five double-doubles in 2017. Her career-high of 28 kills came against Temple on Nov. 24, while setting another personal best of 18 digs against Tulsa (Nov. 9).

Tough Road Ahead

Heading into the 2018 slate, the Huskies know they will face still competition – including eight opponents that finished in the NCAA RPI Top 100. UConn will play 11 matches against teams that ended 2017 in the RPI Top 100, with eight of them coming against league opponents. Wichita State, who UConn will play a home-and-home series with, finished in the Top 20 and made a trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Senior Leadership

Danielle Cabel (Bettendorf, Iowa), Elizabeth Kline (Glenshaw, Pa.), Emma Turner (Winter Park, Fla.), Iman McGary (Rockford, Ill.) and Kennedy Arundel (Chicago, Ill.) provide experience to a relatively young roster, which consists of five freshman, one redshirt freshman, two sophomores, and two juniors. The fivesome have been key components in rebuilding the program since Grundwald stepped onto campus and accounted for 30.1% of kills, 46.7% of service aces and 43.3% of blocks in 2017.

KRIS GRUNWALD

HEAD COACH | SIXTH SEASON

George Mason '91, Florida State '93

96-90 Overall Head Coaching Record | 1996 SEC Western Division Champion

Kris Grunwald, who spent 2012 and 2013 as an assistant coach at Auburn and was the Tigers' head coach from 1998-99, completed his fifth season as head volleyball coach at the University of Connecticut in 2017, leading the team to an 11-21 mark.

A native of Germantown, N.Y., Grunwald was an assistant coach at Auburn from 1994-97 then took over the head coaching reigns for two years. As an assistant coach, he led Auburn to an SEC Western Division championship in 1996. In his two years back at Auburn as an assistant coach, the Tigers had a 17-13 mark in '12 and was 19-11 in '13.

UConn completed a 16-15 season under Grunwald in 2016, including a 7-6 home record and 9-2 non-conference mark. The Huskies won seven conference matches, including season-sweeps of Houston and Memphis.

The Huskies posted a 12-19 mark in Grunwald's first season as head man, including five wins in the American Athletic Conference. He followed with an improved mark of 16-15 (10-10 AAC) in the 2015 campaign, putting UConn in a tie for fourth place in the league.

Auburn has had a winning record in all eight years that Grunwald had been on the Tiger staff. "I am incredibly excited to become the head volleyball coach at UConn and I consider it an amazing opportunity," said Grunwald. "I am looking forward to being part of this amazing University with its rich tradition in athletics and such a strong academic reputation. I think we have a very talented roster of current student-athletes in this program already and I look forward to getting to know them and develop their skills. As a native of the Northeast, I think this school and this program is a great fit for me."

"I am very pleased to welcome Kris to our UConn family and am extremely excited about the direction of our volleyball program," said UConn Director of Athletics Warde Manuel. "Kris brings a wide variety of collegiate athletics experience to our program, including many years of coaching the sport at the highest level. I believe that Kris will be an excellent mentor for both the athletic and academic success of our volleyball student-athletes."

Grunwald returned to Auburn in 2012 after spending the previous four years as an assistant at Arkansas. Under Grunwald's leadership as head coach, Auburn amassed a 41-20 record over two seasons, posting a 22-win campaign in 1998 and 19 wins the following season.

Grunwald was a three-time Honorable Mention All-American and three-time All-East First Team performer for the George Mason volleyball team (1988-91), which reached the national semifinals in 1988. In the George Mason career records book, he is second in kills (1,764), fourth in digs (676) and seventh in blocks (394).

He moved on to Florida State for his graduate work where he served as an assistant coach for three seasons (1991-93). He assumed a larger role as the recruiting coordinator when he joined the Auburn staff as an assistant in 1994.

Grunwald was the compliance service coordinator at Michigan from 2000-02, assisting with student-athlete certification, eligibility and NCAA rules interpretation. He returned to coaching in 2002 as an assistant coach at Mississippi, a position he held through the 2005 season. From his spot with the Rebels, Grunwald became the associate head coach at

Morehead State until accepting the position at Arkansas prior to the 2008 season.

Grunwald is a 1991 graduate of George Mason University with a bachelor's degree in mathematics. He earned his master's degree in mathematics education at Florida State in 1993.

The Toledo, Ohio native most recently played professionally with Sagres NUC, one of the top teams in the LNA, the top professional league in Switzerland. During the 2011-2012 season, she was match MVP three times, and helped them out of Neuchatel, Switzerland club finish second in the league. Sagres also reached the Swiss Cup final and the quarterfinals of the CEV Challenge Cup, a European-wide Championship. Returning to Neuchatel the following season, she was awarded match MVP five times and the team finished third place in the LNA.

In 2010, she competed for VT Aurubis Hamburg, a member of Germany's 14-team premier league, the Bundesliga. During her brief stint in Germany, she received MVP honors during two matches.

Prior to her professional career, Kimball trained with the U.S. National Team during the summer of 2009 and competed with the U.S. National Team on their Tour of China during February of 2010. She also competed with the U.S. A2 Team, earning Most Valuable Player honors at the Adult Open Championship in 2008.

Kimball, a two-time All-American, led the Bobcats to four successful seasons during her collegiate career, including three Mid American Conference regular season championships, three MAC tournament championships and four NCAA tournament berths. She was named the MAC Player of the Year as a junior and senior and also earned MAC Freshman of the Year accolades during her rookie campaign. The four-time first team All-MAC selection left Ohio University as the OU and MAC all-time leader in kills, as well as OU's all-time leader in points and attacks.

Kimball, who earned Academic All-MAC honors three times during her collegiate career, graduated with a bachelor of health administration from Ohio University in June 2010.



MATT SCOTT

ASSISTANT COACH | THIRD SEASON

Louisville '12

Matthew Scott completed his second season at UConn in 2016 after working with Samford University from 2014-2016, following a five-year run at Louisville in multiple capacities.

"We are extremely excited to add Matt to the UConn Husky volleyball family. The foundation of our program is about great people and we have certainly added another great piece to the puzzle," said head coach Kris Grunwald.

Prior to coming to Storrs, Scott helped Samford reach the NCAA Tournament in 2014 following a 20-13 (11-5 Southern Conference) season. The Bulldogs lost to Alabama in the first round.

"He brings a history of championships and NCAA Tournament appearances while at Samford and Louisville, an aspect which will help build the culture and tradition we are establishing within the program," said Grunwald.

Scott worked in numerous roles with the University of Louisville volleyball program since he started as a practice player in 2008. Scott worked his way up to be the assistant to the executive director of volleyball operations in 2010 where he was responsible for the input of entries into the Scoutware program and assisted in the event management of game day operations. In 2010 and 2011 Scott served as the team manager for the Cardinals where he assisted in the organization and coordination of the summer camps hosted by the volleyball program.

After finishing his bachelor's degree Scott took the position of the team's video coordinator where he coordinated the team's video of practices, games and exchanges with other teams through the use of Data Project and eZxchanges. He also assisted with the day-to-day team and staff operations.

With Louisville serving as the host for the 2012 NCAA Championships, Scott was the Assistant to the Assistant Athletic Director for the NCAA Championships, supporting the NCAA in the planning and execution of the event.

"Matt is a dedicated person and coach who will pursue his responsibilities and program goals with a great deal of passion and pride. He is a well-respected member of the coaching community which will help supplement our national recruiting efforts," said Grunwald.

Since the 2010 season, he was the head assistant coach of the Union 16 Adidas club team in Louisville, assisting in the coaching and conditioning efforts of the team and also served as an assistant coach of the Union 16 Asics club team.

In 2012 Scott received the American Volleyball Coaches Association Coaches4Coaches Scholarship.

Scott earned his Masters of Arts Degree in Higher Education from Louisville in the spring of 2013 after earning a bachelor of science in sport administration in 2012.



2017 SEASON RECAP

BREAKOUT SEASON

Junior Iman McGary is coming off a career-best season, setting new personal bests in kills (244), assists (29), digs (173) and total blocks (31). McGary saw her hard work in the offseason pay off as her 96 matches played in 2017 doubled her matches played in 2016. Her career-high of 28 kills came against Temple on Nov. 24, while setting another personal best of 18 digs against Tulsa (Nov. 9). The Rockford, Ill. native finished second on the team in kills.

NCAA STATS IN TOP 50

When it came to services aces and points in 2017, Kayla Williams ranked in the top 40 in all of Division I. Williams was 35th in aces per set (.41) and 42nd in points per set (4.51). Williams also cracked the top 50 averaging 11.24 attacks per set.

CRACKING THE RECORD BOOK

Tosin Adeniyi (Springfield, Ill.) will forever be remembered on the court, as her name is now etched in the record book among the UConn volleyball greats. Adeniyi has been a key factor for the Huskies for the past four years and ranks second all-time in career games played with 469. The middle blocker also sits sixth overall in career hitting percentage (.262) and eighth in career total blocks (327). Her .349 hitting percentage in 2016 is good for fourth all-time on the single season list.

EARNING RECOGNITION

Two different players won recognition from the American Conference throughout the season, including Kennedy Arundel's Defensive Player of the Week nod on Aug. 28. Williams was selected twice to the AAC Weekly Honor Roll, leading all UConn players.

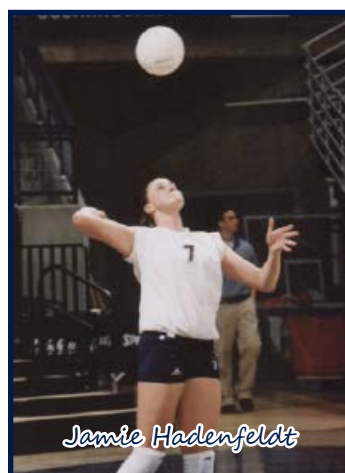

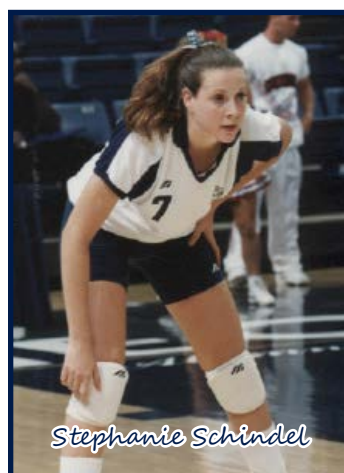

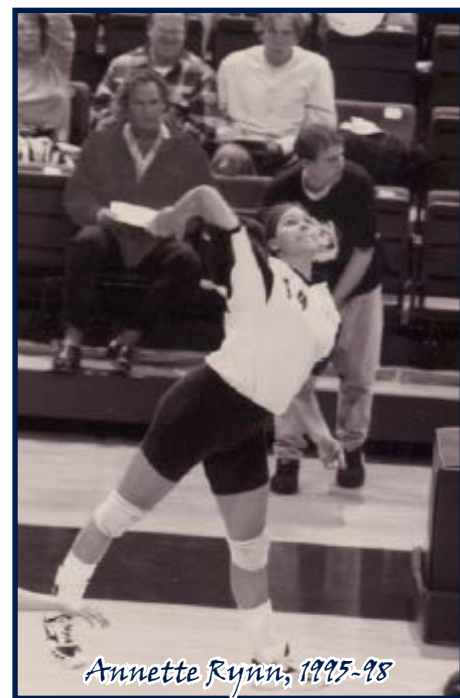

UConn's DOUBLE THOUSANDS

Only seven players in the history of Connecticut volleyball have collected both 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs during their Husky careers, including two members of the class of 1998. **Kim Lobach** was the first to accomplish such a feat when she collected 1,189 kills and 1,332 digs from 1990-93. **Jennifer Halusek** became the second member of the elite group after just three seasons at UConn, and upon finishing her four-year career, she totaled 1,165 kills and 1,393 digs from 1993-96. **Heather Sokol** joined the group in 1996, finishing a stellar career with 1,005 kills and 1,729 digs from 1993-96. **Annette Rynn** (1995-98) became the fourth Husky to reach the milestone, accomplishing the feat as a junior in 1997, and recorded 1,508 kills and 1,722 digs by graduation. **Jenelle Koester** (1995-98) became UConn's all-time career kills leader as a junior, finishing her collegiate career with a total of 1,724, and joined this elite group when she completed her senior season with an even 1,000 digs. Most recently, **Devon Maugle** (2011-14) joined the list her senior season, totaling 1,049 kills and 1,032 digs.

The University of Connecticut

The University of Connecticut is a national leader among public research universities, with students pursuing answers to critical questions in labs, lecture halls, and the community.

UConn's campuses, where more than 30,000 students are enrolled in over 100 undergraduate majors and 83 graduate fields of study, are situated in prime locations between New York and Boston.

In recent years, the University has been busy racking up high-profile nods from organizations like U.S. News & World Report for the quality of its education and initiatives.

UConn's main campus in Storrs is admitting the highest-achieving freshmen in University history. Student diversity continues to increase, as does the number of honors students, valedictorians, and salutatorians who consistently make UConn their top choice.

The rise of the University over the last two decades has been astounding, as UConn achieves new heights of academic success – doubling research grants, attracting top students, and offering programs that continue to grow in prestige. Next Generation Connecticut, an unprecedented investment by the State of Connecticut, demonstrates UConn's commitment to comprehensive research and education and ensures that we

attract internationally renowned faculty and the world's brightest students. These scholars enrich the University's expertise in areas like environmental stability, digital media, science and engineering, language and culture, and health.

With annual research expenditures in excess of \$240 million, collaborative research is carried out within the departments of our 14 schools and colleges and at our more than 100 research centers and institutes.

UConn offers distinct value to industry with an increasing volume of commercially viable innovations as the University transforms itself through research facilities and faculty in the science, technology, engineering, and math fields.

A tradition of coaching winning athletes ensures UConn is a standout in Division I sports and fuels our academic spirit.

As a vibrant, progressive leader, UConn fosters a diverse and dynamic culture that meets the challenges of a changing global society.





PRESIDENT

SUSAN HERBST



Susan Herbst was appointed as the 15th President of the University of Connecticut by its Board of Trustees in December of 2010, and arrived on campus in June of 2011. She is the first female president of the University, which was founded in 1881.

Since that time, she has led multiple initiatives to strengthen teaching, research and service at the University. Chief among them is her four-year plan, approved by the University's Board of Trustees in December 2011, to hire 300 new tenured or tenure-track faculty members at UConn – above and beyond filling vacancies – to significant-

ly enhance course offerings and the University's research capability. The initiative has resulted in new faculty hires across multiple disciplines, including both the sciences and humanities, building on existing faculty strengths as well as investing in emerging fields.

President Herbst has also led the implementation of two recent major state investments in UConn: Next Generation Connecticut and Bioscience Connecticut, both of which were passed by the Connecticut state legislature and signed into law by Governor Dannel P. Malloy in 2013 and 2011, respectively.

Next Generation Connecticut is a more than \$1.5 billion endeavor that will expand educational opportunities, research, and innovation in the science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) disciplines at UConn over the next decade, as well as add new faculty in the humanities.

The cornerstone of this effort is a major increase in the University's enrollment, the expansion of our faculty – in addition to UConn's current faculty hiring initiative – and new and updated facilities to accommodate enhanced STEM research and teaching, as well as UConn's growing population. It also will support the academic missions, and the expansion of critical programs, at UConn's Hartford and Stamford campuses.

Bioscience Connecticut is an \$864 million initiative that is revitalizing the UConn Health enterprise, expanding enrollment in the medical and dental classes, building new business incubators, creating centers of excellence with neighboring institutions, and more. Expansion plans include building a new world-class patient tower, an outpatient ambulatory center, and parking garages. Existing facilities will undergo major renovation, making room for updated infrastructure, state-of-the-art research laboratories, and modern educational spaces. Through Bioscience Connecticut, business incubator space at the University will double.

Additional prominent clinician-scientists will also be recruited to the faculty to contribute toward UConn Health's academic, clinical, and research programs.

Bioscience Connecticut was critical to attracting The Jackson Laboratory to create a new billion-dollar personalized medicine laboratory on the UConn Health campus in Farmington as part of a new partnership with the University.

In addition, President Herbst announced in 2012 that UConn would relocate one of its regional campuses, currently located in suburban West Hartford, back to downtown Hartford, where it was initially located in 1939 before being moved out of the city in the 1970s.

In June 2014, it was announced that the new campus would be located and constructed at the site of the former Hartford Times building on

Prospect Street. The \$115 million project will house 2,300 students and 250 employees, and be designed as a neighborhood campus anchored by a main building in the heart of downtown with other spaces located throughout the area. Classes are expected to begin in fall 2017.

One of President Herbst's other priorities is dramatically increasing the level of philanthropic giving to UConn through the UConn Foundation. Along with Joshua Newton, who began as president of the UConn Foundation in 2013, she has set the goal of eventually raising at least \$100 million in new gifts per year, with a long-term goal of reaching an endowment value of \$1 billion.

Prior to her appointment at UConn, President Herbst served as executive vice chancellor and chief academic officer of the University System of Georgia, where she led 15 university presidents and oversaw the academic missions for all 35 public universities in Georgia. Before arriving in Georgia, she was provost and executive vice president at the University at Albany (SUNY), and also served as officer in charge of the university from 2006 to 2007, upon the death of Kermit L. Hall. She previously served as the dean of the College of Liberal Arts at Temple University.

Born in New York City and raised in Peekskill, N.Y., Herbst received her B.A. in Political Science from Duke University in 1984, and her Ph.D. in communication theory and research from the University of Southern California's Annenberg School for Communication in Los Angeles in 1989.

Herbst spent 14 years at Northwestern University, joining the faculty in 1989 and serving until her departure to Temple in 2003. At Northwestern she held a variety of positions including professor of political science and chair of the department.

She is a scholar of public opinion, media, and American politics, and is author of four books and many articles in these areas, most recently, *Rude Democracy: Civility and Incivility in American Politics* (2010). Along with Benjamin Page, Lawrence Jacobs, and Adam Berinsky, she edits the University of Chicago Press series in American Politics. She serves on the Board of Directors of the American Council on Education.





DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

DAVID BENEDICT



David Benedict became the Director of Athletics at the University of Connecticut in March of 2016 and has had a dynamic impact on Husky athletics.

UConn enjoyed an outstanding year in 2016-17 under Benedict's leadership as both the women's basketball and field hockey teams advanced to

NCAA Final Four competition, while the women's soccer team also played in the NCAA tournament.

Student-athletes had success in the classroom, as well, with 65 percent of them earning a GPA of 3.0 or better in the spring semester and 59 percent doing so in the fall semester. The average cumulative GPA for Husky student-athletes at the end of the 2016-17 academic year was 3.075.

Benedict has introduced several new progressive initiatives to bolster the UConn fan experience.

UConn partnered with The Aspire Group to enhance ticket sales and revenue. Aspire provides the school with innovative ticket marketing, sales and service solutions with an in-house sales staff on campus. In addition, UConn is working with the "Tailgate Guys" to offer premium tailgating opportunities at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field and "Husky Seats" through IMG College Seating, which allows fans to rent a seatback for the entire football season.

In addition, the UConn football team will make its first-ever appearance at Boston's Fenway Park this season against Boston College on Nov. 21, 2017 as part of the Fenway Gridiron Series.

Under Benedict, UConn has extended its exclusive sponsorship agreement with Nike through the 2022-23 academic year. The total value of the contract to the University from 2017-23 in combined product and cash is \$32.45 million.

Benedict is also overseeing plans and fundraising for critical new facilities to house the UConn men's and women's soccer, baseball and softball teams.

In December of 2016, Benedict brought Randy Edsall back home to UConn as head football coach – after Edsall established himself as the winningest-coach in program history from 1999-2010.

Prior to UConn, Benedict served as the Chief Operating Officer for the athletics department at Auburn University for two years. Benedict is a highly-experienced athletic administrator who served as the Deputy Athletic Director at Minnesota (2012-14) and in leadership positions at Virginia Commonwealth (2010-12), Long Beach State (2007-10) and Arizona State (1996-2006).

Benedict directed all the day-to-day operations of the Auburn ath-

letic department, with particular emphasis in operational planning, resource allocation, budget development and strong financial management. He led the department in developing strategic long-range plans for a \$120-plus million budget, facilities, staffing and accomplishing strategic goals.

He coordinated a five-year strategic plan for Auburn athletics, which featured initiatives for strategic priorities and goals. Benedict directed a team of staff members and coaches in creating a facility master plan and the initiation of a game-day master plan.

Benedict led a feasibility study to make renovations to Auburn's Jordan-Hare Stadium that initiated a \$150-\$180 million project. He negotiated a unique nine-year extension with Under Armour that included both product, cash and \$10 million worth of stock.

Benedict provided ongoing support for the administration of the Auburn football program and was the men's basketball sport administrator.

At Minnesota, Benedict held a similar position as he identified areas to increase external support and provided stewardship for sponsors and major donors. He worked with the University of Minnesota Foundation to create the largest athletics campaign in school history. Benedict directed a number of contracts and relationships that helped increase the Gophers' revenue intake.

Benedict was the Executive Associate Athletic Director at VCU during his time there and also served as Interim Athletic Director for several months. At VCU, he increased annual giving, tickets sales and sponsorship revenues each year. While serving as Interim AD, Benedict led the school's transition from the Colonial Athletic Association to the Atlantic 10.

In his role at Long Beach, he administrated all external areas of the department and restructured the entire fundraising process. Benedict was also the baseball sports administrator. He was the Associate Athletic Director for Development at Arizona State and streamlined all areas of external relations.

A native of Tempe, Ariz., Benedict is a 1995 graduate of Southern Utah, where he was a linebacker on the football team. He earned a master's degree from New Mexico Highlands in 1996, where he served as a graduate assistant football coach.

Benedict and his wife, the former Lisa Zeis, have twin boys -- Jake and Sam. Lisa was a four-time gymnastics All-American and two-time NCAA champion at Arizona State.

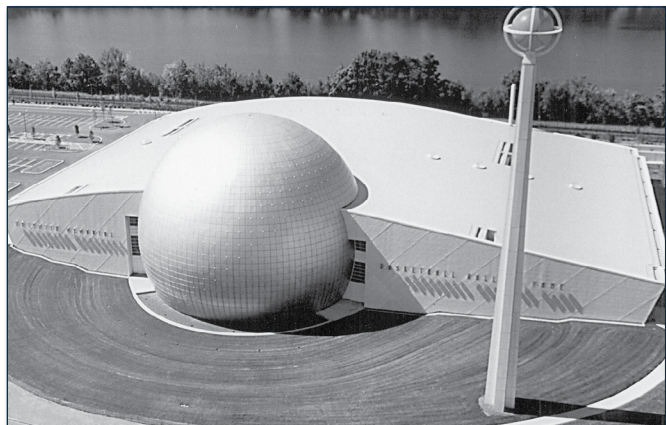

In addition to all that the city of Hartford and the state of Connecticut has to offer, the region within two hours of Storrs is ripe with cultural and entertainment possibilities.



SPRINGFIELD (47 miles)

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame is located less than an hour from Storrs in Springfield, Mass., just minutes from the YMCA where Dr. James Naismith invented the game in 1891. A must-see for any fan of the hardwood, the Hall of Fame reopened in the fall of 2002 in a \$45 million home just off of Interstate 91 in Springfield. The pinnacle of any basketball career, the Hall's long list of inductees includes former UConn men's basketball coach Jim Calhoun, a 2005 inductee, and women's basketball coach Geno Auriemma, a 2006 inductee. Once you finish your tour of the Hall of Fame, Springfield's neighboring suburb of Agawam is the home of Six Flags New England, the region's largest amusement park.



NEW YORK CITY (142 miles)

The largest city in the country and the "media capital of the world" is a UConn city. New York City is located approximately two hours from Storrs and when the Huskies are in town, they make their presence known. The UConn men's basketball team returns to Madison Square Garden this December to play Syracuse and won the 2014 NCAA East Regional in the World's Most Famous Arena on their way to the national championship. The UConn women's basketball team has played in MSG seven times as it attracts the largest crowds for the sport in the Metropolitan area. The Husky football team made its Big Apple debut in 2014 when it played at Yankee Stadium and the men's ice hockey team played last year in Brooklyn at the Barclays Center.





BOSTON (86 miles)

The birthplace of the American Revolution, Boston's historic Freedom Trail is a living history textbook, covering everything from the Battle of Bunker Hill to the midnight ride of Paul Revere. Meanwhile, the city blends its old world charm with a cosmopolitan new world attitude that is evidenced by some of the trendier shops and restaurants that line both historic Faneuil Hall Marketplace and the Back Bay's Newbury Street. One of the world's foremost centers of education, Boston is home to over 50 colleges and universities; perhaps the entire world's most concentrated collection of colleges. The greater Boston area also includes the summer beach resorts on Cape Cod and the islands of Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard. A hub of sporting activity, the 2004, 2007 and 2013 World Series Champion Boston Red Sox have called fabled Fenway Park home since 1912. A hub of sporting activity, the Boston Red Sox have called fabled Fenway Park home since 1912 while other offerings include the Celtics of the NBA and the Bruins of the NFL and the NFL's New England Patriots in nearby Foxboro.

PROVIDENCE (51 miles)

Rhode Island's capital city shows that one of the nation's smallest states also has plenty to offer its visitors. The multi-cultural capital city, which dates back to 1636, is the Ocean State's centerpiece. The best known hamlet on the Rhode Island shore, the ocean town of Newport is world famous for its mansions and is a popular vacation destination for those seeking aquatic activities. Newport's renowned music festival is also a well-attended annual event.

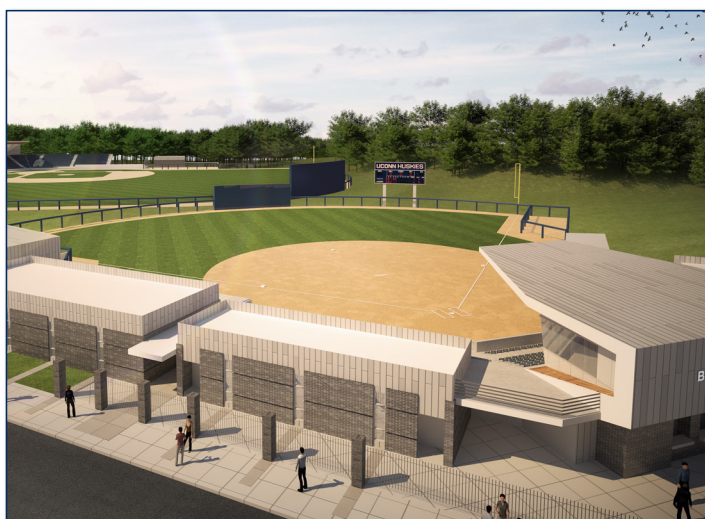

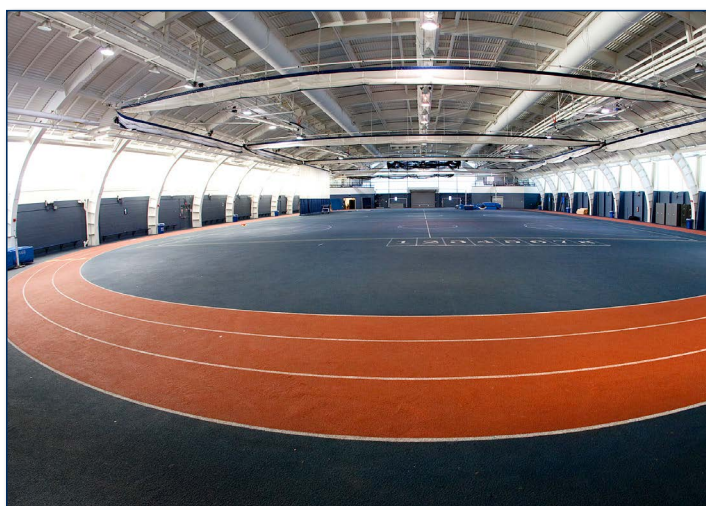
