### **IEAD COACH RANDY EDSALL**



Randy Edsall enters the third season of his second stint as the UConn head football coach after being with the program for 12 seasons from 1999-2010. He led the program from Division I-AA status in 1999 to an appearance in the Bowl Championship Series and the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl following the 2010 season.

Coach Edsall returns to UConn from the NFL's Detroit Lions where he was

Director of Research -- Special Projects. Prior to that he served as head football coach of the University of Maryland from 2011-2015.

Edsall was named the 27th Head Football Coach at the University of Connecticut on December 21, 1998.

During his first term in Storrs, the program blossomed from a major college football newcomer to a team that made five bowl appearances in seven years and four consecutive. He has recorded the most wins in program history (78) and coached in the most games (168). In addition to being the winningest coach in school history, Edsall's coaching record in the school's first nine

FBS seasons (2002-2010) was 65-46. He enters the 2019 season with an overall record of 100-124.

Despite starting the 2010 season with an 0-2 conference mark and 3-4 overall, the Huskies rebounded and finished the year with five consecutive Big East wins to earn the league championship and a spot in a BCS bowl game. UConn's trip from the FCS (former Division I-AA) to the BCS in 11 seasons was the most rapid in the history of the series. For his efforts and those of the team, he was named the 2010 Big East Coach of the Year.

UConn's trip to the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl marked the fourth consecutive bowl trip for the Huskies and the fifth since 2004. The Huskies defeated South Carolina in the 2010 Papajohns.com Bowl by a 20-7 score. Edsall guided the Huskies to a 38-20 win over Buffalo in the 2009 International Bowl, led the team to a victory in the 2004 Motor City Bowl (39-10 over Toledo) and an appearance in the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl.

UConn joined the Big East Conference in 2004, finishing just one-win shy of tying for the conference championship. The Huskies went 8-4 in their debut season in the conference and defeated Toledo in the Motor City Bowl to cap a historic season.

The Huskies led the conference in total defense each of their first two years in the league and again in 2008. During their debut season in 2004, UConn led the Big East in both total offense and total defense. During this span, UConn finished in the national top

> 20 for total offense (2003, 2004) and total defense (2002, 2005, 2008). The Huskies finished an impressive sixth in the country in total defense in 2008.

> In addition to the great success on the field, UConn performed admirably in the classroom under Edsall. UConn was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its high graduation rate six times, most recently in 2017, during Edsall's career.

> In the October 2009 release of the NCAA Graduation Success Rate, UConn had the highest mark of any Big East team. That season also saw the team post a 951 in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR), which placed the Huskies in the top 30 percent in the country. In 2008, UConn had the highest GSR for African-American student-athletes among all state universities that participated in a bowl game following the 2008 season.

> In 2007, UConn was one of just six schools to play in a bowl game and also post a GSR over 80-percent for both its Caucasian and African-American studentathletes.

> In 2003, UConn was the only public I-A school to graduate at least 90 percent of its football players and in 2005, UConn was one of only eight schools to both graduate 70 percent and win a bowl game.

#### **2019 UCONN FOOTBALL**

After winning the last four games of the 2002 season, including a benchmark victory against Iowa State in the regular-season finale, UConn moved into Rentschler Field and enjoyed the nation's largest attendance increase during the 2003 season.

The 2007 season witnessed a new level of excitement in?Storrs as the Huskies earned their first ever national rankings, peaking at No. 13 in the BCS?standings on Nov. 5. UConn became just the second Big East?team to ever go 7-0 at home and defeated three teams there which were ranked in the Top 10 at some point during the season. The Big East Champion Huskies finished that season at 9-4 with a berth in the Meineke Car Care Bowl, earning Edsall New England Division I Coach of the Year accolades.

Edsall brought 19 years of previous coaching experience to the Husky program, including 15 seasons on the collegiate level and three in the NFL. Edsall joined the Huskies after completing the 1998 season as the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech, where he helped the 14th-ranked Yellow Jackets complete a 9-2 campaign.

Prior to joining the staff at Georgia Tech, Edsall spent three seasons as the secondary coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars of the National Football League. In his three seasons on Tom Coughlin's staff, Edsall was a part of one of the most successful expansion franchises in the history of the NFL. The Jaguars reached the playoffs in 1996 and 1997, including a berth in the AFC Championship Game in 1996.

Edsall began his coaching career in 1980 at his alma mater, Syracuse University. A former quarterback for the Orangemen, Edsall started as a graduate assistant from 1980-1982. In 1983, coach Dick MacPherson named Edsall running backs coach. He coached the running backs for three seasons at Syracuse (1983-84 and 1986) and coached the tight ends in 1985 before making the switch to the defensive side of the ball. He coached the Syracuse defensive backs from 1987-1990 and during that period the Orangemen were ranked amongst the National Division I-A leaders in pass defense.

Edsall was a three-year letterwinner in football, basketball and baseball at Susquehannock High School in Glen Rock, Pa. He was an all-state selection in all three sports in his senior season and has been inducted into the York? Area Sports Hall of Fame. He then went on to Syracuse, where he was a member of the football team and earned one varsity letter as a quarterback for the Orangemen. He was a member of the Syracuse squad that captured the 1979 Independence Bowl title under head coach Frank Maloney.

Edsall is a native of Glen Rock, Penn., and earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Syracuse in 1980 and added a master's degree in health and physical education in 1982 from Syracuse.

He and his wife, Eileen, a former basketball and volleyball letterwinner at Syracuse, have a daughter, Alexi and a son, Corey.

#### **2019 UCONN FOOTBALL**



Frank Giufre begins his second season as the offensive line coach for the UConn football team and was promoted to offensive coordinator on February 8, 2019.

In 2018, Giufre established continuity on the offensive line with the same five starters (Peart, Leone, Crozier, DeGeorge & Van Demark) in all 12 games for UConn. Giufre's line was instrumental in producing a pair of 1,000-yard rushers for the first time since 2009.

Giufre spent the last six seasons as the offensive quality control coach for the Indianapolis Colts. As part of his duties as the offensive quality control coach he served as the assistant tight ends coach during the 2012 season and as the assistant offensive line coach from 2013-17.

In total, Giufre has 17 years of coaching experience, including 11 seasons in college football.

In 2016, Giufre assisted with the development of the offensive line, one of the youngest position groups on the team. The Colts utilized seven different starting offensive line combinations and led

the NFL with 34 rookie starts. Indianapolis was the only team in the league to start four different rookies along the offensive line. The unit paved the way for running back Frank Gore to rush for 1,025 yards and become the first Colt to eclipse 1,000 yards rushing since Joseph Addai in 2007.

"I'm excited to back in the Northeast and thrilled to be a part of Coach Edsall's program at UConn," Giufre said. "I have worked with (defensive line coach) Dennis Dottin-Carter and (director of player personnel) Michael Zyskowski during my time at Maine and have a great relationship with those guys. I can't wait to coach with them and everyone else on staff in Storrs! It is an honor and a privilege to be on Coach Edsall's staff and I am grateful for the opportunity."

In 2014, Giufre assisted an offense that set franchise single-season records in net yards (6,506) and net passing yards (4,894), while recording its second-highest point total (458) for a season. The team finished the regular season ranked first in the NFL in passing yards, third in net yards, fourth in time of possession and sixth in points scored.

In 2013, Giufre helped coach an offense that averaged 341.8 yards per game, including 232.8 passing and 108.9 rushing. The Colts 1,743 total rushing yards were the most for the team since the 2006 campaign. Indianapolis set franchise records for the fewest turnovers (14) and fumbles lost (four) and became the first team in the NFL to finish a season with the least amount of turnovers and penalties since the 2002 Kansas City Chiefs.

In 2012, Giufre assisted with a Colts offensive unit that averaged 362.4 net yards per game. Indianapolis also rushed for 104.4 yards per game, which is the most for the team since the 2007 campaign. Giufre coached a rookie class that generated 3,108 total offensive yards, which is the most by a team's rookie class since the 1970 NFL merger.

Prior to joining the Colts, Giufre spent five seasons as the run game coordinator, offensive line coach and tight ends coach at the University of Maine (2007-2011).

While at Maine, Giufre coached five offensive linemen who earned All-Colonial Athletic Association honors. In each of his first three seasons, the offensive line ranked in the top 18 nationally in fewest sacks allowed. Maine also finished in the CAA top four in rushing in each of Giufre's first two seasons, including paving the way for running back Jhamal Fluellen to rush for 1,052 yards in 2007.

Prior to coaching at Maine, Giufre spent the previous three seasons as the offensive line coach at Sacred Heart University (2004-06). In 2004, Sacred Heart led the Northeast Conference in fewest quarterback sacks allowed with 13.0. Giufre's offensive line cleared the way for running back Ed Pricolo to earn NCAA FCS All-America honors in 2004 and 2005.

Giufre started his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Miami (Fla.) (2001-03), working with the offensive and defensive lines and the tight ends. During his time with Miami, the Hurricanes won the 2001 National Championship with a 37-14 victory over Nebraska in the Rose Bowl and defeated Florida State in the 2004 Orange Bowl.

Giufre started his coaching career at Christian Brothers Academy High School in Syracuse, N.Y., where he coached the offensive line during the 2000 season.

Giufre was a two-year letter winner as a guard and center at Syracuse University. He made five bowl appearances with the Orange, suiting up for the Music City Bowl, Orange Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Liberty Bowl and Gator Bowl. He earned his bachelor's degree in health and exercise science.



### **Defensive Coordinator**

Lou Spanos, a 24-year coaching veteran with experience in the NFL and college, has been hired as the defensive coordinator for the UConn football team as announced by head coach Randy Edsall on Wednesday. Spanos served as the defensive coordinator at UCLA from 2012-13.

"Lou was exactly what I was looking for when I started the search for a new defensive coordinator," Edsall said. "I wanted someone who had NFL and college experience, someone who has coordinated a defense previously with success and someone who knows how to develop players and will be aggressive with the scheme that we will be running.

"When you look at who Lou worked for and with throughout his career, it is very impressive. Talking with the coaches that Lou has worked for and with during his career, it was very apparent to me that we were able to attract an outstanding coach, person and recruiter to our staff and someone that will relate very well with our student athletes and take us to where we want to go defensively."

Most recently, Spanos spent the 2018 season on staff for the Alabama Crimson Tide as an analyst after serving as the linebackers coach for the Tennessee Titans from 2014-18. During his time with the Titans, Spanos oversaw a linebacker unit that posted the second-highest number of sacks in the NFL over the 2016 and 2017

seasons and a Titan linebacker led the squad in tackles in each of his seasons in Nashville.

"I am looking forward to the opportunity to join Coach Edsall's staff at UConn," Spanos said. "I can't wait to get up to Storrs and meet the student-athletes on the team and hit the recruiting trail."

During Spanos' final year on head coach Mike Mularkey's staff, the Titans posted their second-straight winning season and defeated the Kansas City Chiefs in the Wild Card Round of the 2017 playoffs.

Outside linebacker Brian Orakpo earned a spot in the Pro Bowl following the 2016 season and he also earned the honor following the 2010 season during Spanos' stint as the linebackers coach with the Washington Redskins. Outside linebacker Derrick Morgan had one of the finest seasons of his career while working with Spanos in 2016 as the nine-year NFL veteran posted a team-high 56 quarterback pressures and career-high 9.0 sacks in 2016. The 9.0 sacks tied him for ninth highest in the AFC.

Prior to his time with the Titans, Spanos was the defensive coordinator on head coach Jim Mora's staff at UCLA during the 2012 and 2013 seasons. In 2013, the Bruins allowed 23.2 points per game while UCLA totaled 79 sacks and 58 forced turnovers over Spanos' two seasons. Linebacker Eric Kendricks led the Pac-12 Conference and ranked 11th in the nation in tackle average (10.64 per game) in 2013 and his total of 150 tackles was the most by a Bruin since 1978. Additionally Myles Jack, who now plays for the Jacksonville Jaguars, was honored as a Freshman All-American and as the Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year following the 2013 season.

The Bruins finished the 2013 season ranked 17th nationally and defeated Virginia Tech, 42-12, in the Sun Bowl on New Year's Eve.

In 2012, Spanos' first Bruin defense ranked among the nation's best in sacks and was headlined by All-America linebacker Anthony Barr (13.5 sacks / 21.5 tackles for loss) and defensive end Datone Jones (6.5 sacks / 19.0 tackles for loss). Jones went on to be selected in the first round of the 2013 NFL Draft. The team finished the season eighth in the nation in sacks, while Barr also ranked eighth in the country in sack average and second in total sacks.

The 2012 squad finished 9-5 overall and won the Pac-12 South Division. The Bruins dropped a 27-24 decision to No. 8 Stanford in the league championship game and competed in the Holiday Bowl.

In the 2010-11 seasons, Spanos served as the linebackers coach of the Washington Redskins. London Fletcher, who played in the 2011 Pro Bowl, led the NFL in tackles with 166 in 2011 and was added to the 2012 Pro Bowl. The previous 15 seasons, Spanos was a defensive assistant with the Steelers. While in Pittsburgh, he worked closely with the linebackers and the secondary.

Spanos was one of only three assistants on staff to be with the team for its Super Bowl XXX (lost to Dallas), Super Bowl XL (win over Seattle) and Super Bowl XLIII (win over Arizona) appearances. During his 15 seasons working with the Steelers, the defense ranked among the top 10 in the NFL 13 times, including four No. 1 rankings.

Pittsburgh managed to win at least 10 games in 10 of those seasons. Spanos coached nine different Steeler linebackers who combined for 19 Pro Bowl appearances - Kevin Greene (2), Greg Lloyd (2), Chad Brown (1), Levon Kirkland (2), Jason Gildon (3), Kendrell Bell (1), Joey Porter (3), James Farrior (2) and James Harrison (3). Additionally, Harrison earned the Associated Press NFL Defensive Player of the Year Award in 2008, while Bell was the Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year in 2001. Spanos originally joined the Steelers in 1994 as an intern in the scouting department before being promoted to a defensive assistant after one season.

A 1994 graduate of Tulsa, Spanos was a four-year letterman at center. The 1989 and 1991 Golden Hurricane squads played in bowl games. In 1991, Tulsa beat San Diego State in the Freedom Bowl to finish 10-2 on the year and was ranked 21st on the final Associated Press poll. After his playing career ended (1989-92), Spanos remained at Tulsa as a student assistant working with the linebackers.

Spanos and his wife, Timme, have two sons, Zachary and Caleb and one daughter, Gabriella.





### **Special Teams Coordinator**

Eddie Allen begins his second season as the special teams coordinator for the Huskies.

In his first season at UConn in 2018, punter Luke Magliozzi set UConn single-season record with an average of 42.94 yards per game. Magliozzi had 12 punts of over 50 yards and pinned 19 kicks inside the 20.

Allen joined Edsall's coaching staff after serving as the special teams coordinator for the University of Delaware since 2014.

"Eddie's aggressive approach to special teams was exactly what I was looking for in our special teams coordinator," Edsall said. "His teams have shown the ability to block kicks and be very fundamentally sound in the core four units involving special teams. He has delivered very good results as a special teams coordinator in all the places he has worked."

2017 saw Delaware tie for the top spot in the Colonial Athletic Association with a net punting aver-

age of 38.8 yards.

In 2016, Delaware ranked No. 4 in the CAA in kickoff returns (21.5 yards per return) and kickoff coverage (39.1 net average), was No. 6 in net punting (37.0), and did not have a punt blocked while blocking four kicks on the season.

During his time with the Blue Hens, Allen coached two-time All-CAA punter Eric Enderson, who earned third team All-America status during the 2014 season. Additionally, Allen coached punter Nick Pritchard to a spot on the All-CAA Third Team during the 2017 season.

"I am extremely excited to join Coach Edsall's staff," Allen said. "Being from the Northeast, I have followed the program closely through the years and I am looking forward to getting around our players and doing my part in the future of success of the program."

During his first two seasons at Delaware, Allen was also responsible for coaching the tight ends and helped develop All-American Nick Boyle at that position. Boyle was selected by the Baltimore Ravens in the fifth round of the 2015 NFL Draft.

Allen enjoyed great success during a six-year stint at the University of Rhode Island from 2008-13. During his tenure as a member of former head coach Joe Trainer's staff, he helped the Rams lead the CAA in fewest blocked kicks allowed and ranked No. 2 in kickoff return average (22.3) during the 2013 campaign. Rhode Island also ranked No. 3 in the CAA?in kickoff returns (20.9) and allowed the second fewest return yards in the league during the 2012 season.

In 2011, Rhode Island averaged 21.5 yards per kick return while allowing an average of just 18.9 yards per return. In 2010, under the direction of Allen, URI ranked in the CAA's top five in four special teams categories and held the league's top kickoff return average (23.8).

Among the highlights was a blocked punt that was returned for the game-winning score over 2009 defending champion Villanova. In 2009, Rhode Island punter Tim Edger led the CAA?in punting with a 41.5-yard average, and in 2008, the Rams blocked nine kicks on the season.

Prior to arriving at Rhode Island, Allen spent three seasons as a member of Greg Schiano's coaching staff at Rutgers. He joined the Scarlet Knights' football program in 2005 as a player development assistant and worked as a graduate assistant in 2007.

Allen began his collegiate coaching career as the offensive graduate assistant and video coordinator at Hofstra University in 2003. The following season, Allen moved on to Fort Scott Community College in Fort Scott, Kan., where he served as wide receivers coach.

A native of Somerville, N.J., Allen graduated with a bachelor's degree from the University of New Haven in 2003. He was a four-year letterwinner at quarterback for the Chargers.

He and his wife, Kristin have a daughter, Makayla, and two sons, Austin and Jackson.





### **Defensive Line**

Dennis Dottin-Carter begins his third season with the Huskies as the defensive line coach.

Prior to joining UConn, Dottin-Carter worked at the University of Delaware for five seasons.

While at Delaware, he was was named the Blue Hens' defensive line coach in 2013 and was promoted to the position of co-defensive coordinator in 2014.

Dottin-Carter was selected as Interim Head Coach on Oct. 16, 2016 after head coach Dave Brock was relieved of his duties. He led the Blue Hens for the final five weeks of the season and posted a record of 2-3, posting victories at home over Towson and on the road at Albany.

In 2015, Delaware's defense ranked No. 3 in the CAA in rushing defense (123.5/17th in NCAA), No. 3 in third-down conversion defense (.346/31st), No. 3 in scoring defense (20.5/22nd), and No. 5 in total defense (329.2/24th). Five Delaware defensive players earned All-CAA honors.

During the 2014 season, Delaware ranked No. 4 in the CAA in pass defense (197.2) and sixth in sacks (28). Under his tutelage, redshirt freshman Blaine Woodson was named the CAA Defensive

Rookie of the Year.

Dottin-Carter also played a big role in the development of 2013 All-American defensive tackle Zach Kerr, who closed out his third season with the Indianapolis Colts in 2016.

Dottin-Carter, a native of Cambridge, Mass., earned his degree in kinesiology and physical education from the University of Maine following an outstanding playing career that saw him lead the Black Bears to Atlantic 10 (now CAA) titles in 2001 and 2002. He was a first team All-Atlantic 10 selection as a linebacker in 2002 when he also was named All-New England.

Dottin-Carter began his coaching career with former head coach Jack Cosgrove at Maine in 2008 as tights ends coach and also led the fullbacks, running backs, defensive line, and special teams during his five-year tenure.

He most recently served as Maine's defensive line and special teams coach. During his tenure, he coached five all-conference players, including All-American fullback Jared Turcotte in 2008. Maine led the CAA?in scoring defense (19.5 points per game) and was fourth in sacks (22) in 2012.







Corey Edsall begins his third season as the tight ends coach at UConn.

Tyler Davis tied for second in single-season history with six touchdown catches for a tight end in 2018 while Aaron McLean ranked second on the team with 32 receptions. The duo combined for 54 catches for 633 yards and eight touchdowns. The six touchdown catches for Davis ranked first on the team among all receivers.

Edsall spent two seasons on the Colorado football staff, 2016 was his first as a graduate assistant working with the defense. He joined the program in 2015 and worked as a football intern. In 2016, he was part of the biggest turn around season in PAC-12 history. The Buffaloes went 10-4 (8-1) and won the PAC-12 South Championship and appeared in the 2016 PAC-12 Championship game against the Washington Huskies.

Edsall, 25, has spent two summers as a scouting intern in a pair of National Football League training camps, New England in 2013 and Philadelphia in 2014. He graduated with his bachelor's

degree in family science from the University of Maryland in 2015.

In 2011 he started out as a freshman at Syracuse University, where he played quarterback for coach Doug Marrone, but then transferred to Maryland. At Maryland, he worked three years (2012-14) as a student assistant on the offensive side of the ball, and staffed a pair of bowl games with the Terrapins (2013 Military, 2014 Foster Farms).

Edsall graduated from East Catholic High School in Manchester, Conn., where he lettered four times in football, twice in baseball and once in lacrosse. At Syracuse, he made the Big East All-Academic team for the 2011 season.





### **Assistant Coach / Star, Nickel, Dime**

Jarren Horton has been hired as an assistant coach for the UConn football team, as announced by head coach Randy Edsall on Tuesday, March 19. Horton takes over for Jon Wholley who is leaving UConn to pursue other professional opportunities.

"I'm very excited to have Jarren join our defensive staff as our star, nickel and dime coach," Edsall said. "He has extensive knowledge in our scheme and he will have a smooth transition working with and continuing to teach our players the new system.

"His knowledge and attention to detail and the ability to relate to people really stood out to during the interview process. Jarren will be an outstanding addition as a recruiter as well."

Horton comes to UConn after serving as a defensive assistant and secondary coach with the Atlanta Legends in the Alliance of American Football. Prior to his stint in the AAF, he worked as a graduate assistant at Southeastern Louisiana in 2018.

Horton played defensive back at Portland State University from 2010-12 before graduating from Central Washington University in 2015.

After graduation he worked two stints at Vanderbilt University as a defensive analytics assistant in 2015 and then as a defensive analyst in 2017.

Horton also gained experience in the National Football League with the Cleveland Browns and Pittsburgh Steelers. With the Browns he worked as a coaching assistant primarily working with defensive backs in 2016. He was a summer assistant and worked alongside the Steelers coaching staff in 2017.



### Quarterbacks

Mike Moyseenko who recently completed his first season on the offensive staff at UConn as a quality control coach, has been promoted to quarterbacks coach, as announced by head coach Randy Edsall on February 8, 2019

Moyseenko briefly served as running backs coach following the departure of Terry Richardson in January of 2019.

"I am pleased to promote Mike to running backs coach," Edsall said. "Mike has been a valuable member of the offensive staff over the last year and assumes this position with a full understanding of our offense. He possesses outstanding interpersonal skills and has established positive relationships with the student-athletes on our team. These skills will allow him to excel and represent the University of Connecticut extremely well on the recruiting trail."

Moyseenko came to UConn after spending the previous four seasons as the wide receivers coach at Towson University. Moyseenko served as the offensive quality control coach at Towson

during the 2013 season.

Prior to his time at Towson, Moyseenko served as the wide receivers coach at Shepherd University in Shepherdstown, W.Va.

From 2008-2010, he served as the offensive coordinator for the Baltimore Mariners of the American Indoor Football Association with the Mariners posting a perfect 16-0 record en route to winning the AIFA Championship in 2010.

Following his stint with the Mariners, Moyseenko was the quarterbacks coach for Good Counsel High School in Olney, Md. Good Counsel earned the WCAC Championship and finished the season ranked No. 4 nationally in 2011.

Moyseenko walked on to the University of Maryland football team as a quarterback and worked with the offensive scout team during the 2003 and 2004 seasons. He finished his final two years as an undergrad working as student assistant for the Terps.

Moyseenko earned his bachelor's degree in biology from Maryland in 2007.



## **Defensive Backs**

Darrell Perkins, who served as the defensive backs coach for the UConn football team from 2010-13, has returned to Storrs in the same position as announced by head coach Randy Edsall on January 3, 2019.

Perkins recently completed his third season as the co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at Fordham University.

"It is with great pleasure to announce that Darrell Perkins has rejoined our Football Family here at UConn, said head coach Randy Edsall. "Darrell understands what it takes to win at UConn and has developed some outstanding defensive backs in his previous stint at UConn. To add a coach and person with Darrell's experience and knowledge of the University of Connecticut will make us a better program."

Perkins helped Dylan Mabin earn All-Patriot League honors in each of the last two seasons and the Fordham defense led the Patriot League in tackles for loss with 7.5/game in 2017.

Strong safety Antonio Jackson earned Second Team All-Patriot League honors after leading the team, and finishing second in the league, with four interceptions that season.

In 2016, Perkins guided a Fordham defensive back unit that was tops in the Patriot League, and fifth in the NCAA FCS, in defensive passing efficiency (106.61) and finished third in the league in interceptions with 13. The Rams led the Patriot League and finished 12th nationally in turnovers gained during the 2016 season.

The 2016 Fordham defensive backs were led by Caleb Ham and Jihad Pretlow, who each garnered All-Patriot League honors.

Perkins coached the defensive backs for the University of Maryland in 2015 and spent the 2014 season as cornerbacks coach at Old Dominion University, overseeing a senior-laden group led by Eriq Lewis and Reggie Owens. Lewis led the unit with 47 tackles and a sack, while Owens had 26 tackles and a sack.

Perkins coached at Connecticut for four years (2010-13), working with the secondary. While at Connecticut, Perkins helped develop Blidi Wreh-Wilson and Dwayne Gratz, who were both selected in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft. He also worked with future 2015 first round pick, Byron Jones, while at UConn.

In 2012, UConn's DB's helped the Huskies defense to rank ninth in the country, and first in the BIG EAST, in total defense.

In 2010, the UConn defense was tied for fifth nationally in interceptions and ranked 28th in the nation in pass efficiency defense. The Huskies went 8-5 that year, winning a share of the BIG EAST and earning a trip to the Fiesta Bowl.

"I am so excited to be back at UConn working with Coach Edsall again, said Perkins. "He is a great person, coach and leader. I cannot wait to meet the players and then get to work doing the necessary things to have a great 2019 season."

Perkins served as the defensive backs coach at Louisiana-Monroe in 2008 and 2009. He helped lead the Louisiana-Monroe defense to the top ranking in the Sun Belt Conference in 2009.

Prior to his stint at Monroe, he was the defensive coordinator at Charleston Southern in 2007. He was the linebackers and special teams coach at Northern Colorado in 2006 and was the defensive backs/special teams coordinator at Charleston Southern from 2004-05.

In 2004, Charleston Southern was ranked second in the Football Championship Subdivision in pass defense at 131 yards per game.

Perkins was the defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator at Ferris State from 2002-03 as the Bulldogs finished first in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in pass defense at 161 yards per game.

Perkins served as a defensive graduate assistant at Purdue in 2000 and 2001. He started his football coaching career at Gateway High School in Aurora, Colo., where he was an assistant coach from 1997-99 at his alma mater.

He was the head basketball coach at Legacy High School in Fort Collins, Colo., from 1993-96 and led the team to two state playoff appearances.

A 1990 graduate of Wyoming where he earned a degree in business marketing, Perkins was a two-year starter at running back for the Cowboys and a three-year letter winner from 1985-89.

At Wyoming, Perkins played in the 1987 and 1988 Holiday Bowls and with Purdue coached in the 2001 Rose Bowl, following the Boilermakers' 2000 Big Ten championship, and the 2001 Sun Bowl.





## **Wide Receivers**

Aaron Smith, who played for head coach Randy Edsall at UConn from 2004-06, begins his third season as the wide receivers coach/recruiting coordinator for the Huskies.

Smith completed his fourth season on the University at Albany football staff in 2016, serving as recruiting coordinator, pass game coordinator, and wide receivers coach.

Under Smith's direction in 2014, Josh Gontarek was named the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year, boasting the best freshman receiving numbers in program history with 58 receptions, 687 receiving yards, and eight receiving touchdowns.

Smith, a native of West Point, N.Y. and son of an Army colonel, brought seven years of collegiate coaching experience to UAlbany. He spent the 2012 season leading the wide receivers at Boston College where he helped junior Alex Amidon develop into one of the ACC's best. Amidon's 1,210 yards receiving at the end of the regular season ranked second in the ACC, just four yards behind the leader.

Smith spent the five seasons prior (2007-11) as the receivers coach at Columbia University, coaching two All-Ivy League honorees, including Austin Knowlin, Columbia's all-time leader in receptions (210) and receiving yards (2,484). Smith also served as the Lions' recruiting coordinator in 2011.

Smith started his coaching career at the United States Coast Guard Academy in 2006.

As an undergraduate, Smith played football at both the University of Maryland and the University of Connecticut, helping his teams to appearances in the Peach, Orange, and Motor City Bowls. While competing at UConn, he was presented with two Scholar Athlete Awards, and graduated with a degree in political science in 2006.

Smith and his wife, Kristin, reside in the Capital Region with their daughter, Mia, and son, Cash.





# **Running Backs**

Kyle Weiss completed his first season as the defensive quality control coach for the UConn football team in 2018. He was promoted to runnings backs coach on February 8, 2019.

Weiss joined UConn after spending the last three years with the UCLA football team. He served as a graduate assistant on the defensive side of the ball until late in the season when he moved into a linebackers coach role for the 2017 Cactus Bowl.

Weiss spent one season as offensive quality control coach in 2016 after filling the role of recruiting and offensive assistant during the 2015 season.

Prior to working at UCLA, Weiss was an assistant football and baseball coach at Pomona College in Claremont, Calif. Weiss spent three seasons at Pomona working as a quarterbacks coach (2014), director of operations (2014), video coordinator (2014), wide receiver coach (2012-2013) and kicking coach (2012-2013).

Before pursuing a career in coaching, Weiss played four seasons at Wesleyan University in Middletown, Conn. while earning his bachelor's degree in earth and environmental science. Weiss played wide receiver and punter, leading the team in receptions in 2010 and earned Second Team All-Conference honors as a punter.

His grandfather, Bob, was an assistant football coach at UConn from 1969-72. Weiss received his master's degree in education from Arizona State in 2015 and is currently pursuing a master's degree in education and information studies at UCLA.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. – Senior quarterback David Pindell had a career night as the UConn football team fell to No. 21 UCF, 56-17, Thursday evening in the 2018 season opener at Pratt and Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field.

Pindell set a UConn record for quarterback rushing yards in the program's FBS era with 157. He also set a career high with 266 passing yards, going 27-for-41.

The Golden Knights took a 14-0 lead six minutes into the game. Redshirt junior Michael Tarbutt got UConn on the board with a 44-yard field goal. Pindell threw a 5-yard pass to senior Tyler Davis for a touchdown, but UCF took a28-10 lead into halftime.

The Knights scored four touchdowns in the second half. Pindell rushed in for a TD with 3:11 left in the game.

Senior wide receiver Kyle Buss finished with 113 receiving yards to lead the game, his first career 100-yard receiving game in a UConn uniform. Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Keyion Dixon tallied 151 kick return yards, averaging 25.0 yards per return.

UConn moved to 2-4 all-time vs. UCF. The Huskies are now 12-4 in home openers at Rentschler Field.

The Huskies return to action at Boise State next Saturday, Sept. 8 at 10:15 p.m. ET. The game will be broadcast on either ESPN2 or ESPNU.

BOISE, Idaho – The UConn football team fell to 0-2 on the season after a 62-7 loss against No. 20/19 Boise State at Albertsons Stadium.

After a 59-yard punt from Luke Magliozzi, Boise State moved down the field on its first drive of the game and had a 3rd and 9 at the UConn 11-yard line. The Broncos took a shot in the end zone but the pass was broken up by Omar Fortt, forcing the Broncos to kick a field goal.

Boise would find the end zone five times in the first half though and ac-Boise State Individual Leaders cumulated 514-yards of offense in the first stanza

On their second drive of the second half, the Huskies put together a seven-play, 93-yard drive capped by a 15-yard touchdown pass from Pindell to Aaron McLean. After going 1-8 on third down in the first half, Pindell linked up with Tyler Davis to move the chains and Kevin Mensah set up the Huskies in the red zone with a 55-yard scamper.

Mensah finished with 10 carries for 82 yards while defensive back Tyler Coyle registered a career-high 14 tackles.

Magliozzi ended the game with 9 punts for 432 yards and recorded four punts of 50 yards or more.

The Huskies are back in action on Saturday, September 15 when the team welcomes URI to Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. Kick-off is set for 12:07 p.m. and the contest will be televised on SNY.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. --- With the UConn and Rhode Island football offenses combin-ing for 105 points, 659 yards passing, 464 yards rushing, and threatening to score on every possession, it still took a big defensive play to secure the Huskies' first victory of the season.

UConn running back Keyin Mensah had barreled into the end zone on a tough 22-yard run to give the Huskies the 56-49 lead with just 0.57 remaining, but the way the game had been played, that was plenty of time for Khode Island to mount a threat.

The Rams (2-1) drove to a first down on the Husky 16 with 0:11 to go, and after an incomplete pass, had 5 seconds left, and one play, to score the tying TD.

Thomas made sure that didn't happen – producing a huge sigh of relief from the UConn sideline.

"(Defensive end) James Atkins did a real good job all game opening things up for me." Thomas said. "He opened it up and I just did my job and hit the quarterback. The of-fense did a really good job today. As a defense, we had to step up and we did at the end and that's all that matters."

The offense, led by senior quarterback David Pindell, was nothing short of outstanding compiling 308 years passind, 265 yards rushing and scoring the 12th most points in a single game in Uconn history, as well as the sixth-most total yards (573).

Pindell's 445 yards of individual total offense (308 yards passing, 137 yards rushing), is the third-best in UConn history and the most since Bryant Shirreffs in 2015 and his four TD passes fell one short of Dan Orlovsky's school record. The rushing of Pindell and Merisah (144 yards) gave UConn two 100-yard runners in the same game for the first time since Jordan Todman and Robbie Frey accomplished the feat in 2010.

"I thought David played extremely well," UConn coach Randy Edsall said. "In the second half, I thought he got a little tired, but he went on his reserves and found a way to get it done. As much running around as he had to do --- I mean 137 yards rushing and 308 passing and six TDs, he better get and IV or something. If it wasn't for him, I don't know where we'd be. When we needed things to happen, he made them happen."

The game was a shootout from the outset.

UConn on its opening possession to take the lead, but URI came right back to tie and the horserace was on. The Huskies offense was in high gear in the first half, scoring six touchdowns — two by receiver Hergy Mayala, one each by Pindell, Mensah, Hero Mauriseau, and Aaron McLean — to take a 42-28 lead into the locker room.

"The first half, I don't think our offense could have played any better than what we did," Edsall said.

URI scored twice in the third quarter, however, to climb back into a tie, 42-42. Pindell got the Huskies back in front with a six-yard TD run, but again Rhode Island answered with a 14-yard scoring run by Naim Jones with 3:13 remaining in the game.

"We just had to go out there and keep trying to execute the game plan," Pindell said. "We clicked today." I think we found our mistakes from the first two games – taking care of the ball and scoring when we got to the red zone – and that's what we tried to focus on today."

The final drive began with Zavier Scott's kickoff return to the UConn 31 and eight plays later the Huskies faced a second-and-7 on the URI 22. Mensah took the handoff and would not stop until he hit the end zone for the 56-49 lead.

"Before we went out there, we just said, 'Score,' " Mensah said. "If we all do our job, we'll get it done. I just saw the linebacker go over the top and I just took the opposite hole and scored. That was it."

Not quite.

With the ball on the Cincinnati 21, however, UConn quarterback David Pindell found tight end Aaron McLean in the end zone, but the big receiver's foot barely touched the sideline and the pass was ruled incomplete. Two plays later, UConn missed a field goal attempt and instead of tying the Bearcats, or at least closing the gap, still found itself trailing 14-7 with 1:01 remaining in the half. But the momentum margin was a whole lot wider.

Cincinnati (5-0) used the final 1:01 to tack on another score, then blanked the Huskies 28-0 in the second half to hang a 49-7 American Athletic Conference loss on UConn (1-4) at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field.

"If we could have gotten that touchdown, it would have helped us," UConn coach Randy Edsall said. "But we didn't, and we missed the field goal and that hurt us a little bit. But we let them go down and score and we lost some of the aggressiveness there. McLean, who had four catches for 97 yards, was a big target for the Huskies until Cincinnati made adjustments to close him down. Still, he thought he had scored the tying TD just before the half.

"I thought I did," he said. "I just didn't get up high enough. Looking back on it, I just didn't jump high enough. That hurt us, but either way, we can't let that bring us down like it did today and affect us for the rest of the game. We have to keep our heads up and keep playing."

The UConn offense couldn't have started the game on a better note. It took Pindell just five plays to drive the team 75 yards – including a 41-yard pass to McLean – before he hit Kyle Buss in the end zone for a 7-0 lead.

Cincinnati retaliated with a 1-yard TD run by quarterback Desmond Ridder and started the second quarter with a 2-yard TD plunge by Michael Warren for the 14-7 lead.

The two teams battled evenly throughout the second quarter, until UConn began **Field Goal Attempts** its drive with 4:12 remaining in the half and looked to be headed for a 14-14 deadlock. But the barely-missed TD and the missed field goal clearly changed the momentum.

The rest of the contest belonged to the Bearcats, who finished the game with 659 total yards – 320 on the ground and 345 in the air. UConn had 266 yards, as it equaled its lowest-scoring output of the season.

"The missed field goal kind of killed us because it seemed like a lot of us got down." Pindell said. "Then we let them have the touchdown down the middle. It's something we have to fix."

UConn safety Tyler Cole was surprised at how quickly the game went from close to a lopsided score.

"That was just horrible how the momentum of the game just shifted," Cole said. 
"When we missed the field goal, the whole energy of our team deflated. Last week, I thought we took a couple of steps forward. This week, five steps back. 
This was embarrassing."

UConn knew the Bearcats had a physical team and thought they had prepared for it.

"Obviously, we got physically handed today and didn't do the things we needed to do," Edsall said. We could get off people and couldn't move people. We got blown off the ball. I think we lost confidence in ourselves and didn't believe in themselves enough to go play."

The game was UConn's last at Rentschler Field for nearly a month. The Huskies continue their AAC schedule Saturday at Memphis, then will have a bye week before traveling to Tampa to meet USF on Oct. 20. UConn returns to the Rent on Oct. 27 for a Homecoming date against UMass.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. – The UConn football team traveled to Memphis and lost 55-14 on Saturday night at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. UConn is 1-5 and 0-3 in The American this season.

UConn got off to a great start offensively by scoring a touch-down on its opening drive of the game. David Pindell capped a 17-play, 75-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown run. His fifth rushing touchdown of the season.

The drive last 7:32 and was the longest touchdown drive of the season for UConn. The Huskies had a 7:32 scoring drive vs. UCF (Aug. 30) that resulted in a field goal. The 17-plays is tied for second in UConn history.

The UConn defense could not hold the Memphis offense down, allowing 378 rushing yards and 634 yards total. It is the fourth time UConn has allowed 50 points or more in a game this year.

Keyion Dixon hauled in the other UConn touchdown with a 14 yard reception in the second quarter. It was the first touchdown reception for Dixon this season. Pindell has thrown touchdown passes to seven different players this season.

Wide receiver Cameron Hairston and tight end Jay Rose both secured milestones by snagging their first career catches.

Omar Fortt led the Huskies on the defensive side of the ball with 13 tackles. Ian Swenson had the lone sack of the night for UConn.

The Huskies will have a bye week this week and gear up for a Saturday, Oct. 20 contest at USF.

TAMPA, Fla. – The UConn football team put forth a spirited effort at No. 20/21 USF that resulted in a 38-30 loss at Raymond James Stadium on Saturday night

The Huskies led throughout the majority of the first half with a great defensive effort that limited the Bull's offense to just seven points.

UConn received two takeaways on its first two defensive possessions. Santana Sterling and Omar Fortt grabbed interceptions to set the tone in the early going.

The Huskies took advantage of Sterling's interception by rolling down the field and scoring on a 10-yard Kevin Mensah touchdown run. The Huskies totaled 60 yards on the ground on its 64-yard touchdown drive.

The defense secured the two takeaways and forced the USF defense to punt on three occasions in the first half.

UConn led 7-0 until 0:43 left in the first half. The Bulls rattled off a seven-play, 80-yard drive to even the score, 7-7.

The Bulls carried that momentum into the second half and took its first lead of the game on the first offensive play of the third quarter. Blake Barnett found St. Felix for a 75-yard touchdown pass to make it 14-7 Bulls.

The Bulls tried to distance themselves at the end of the third quarter with a 30-yard field goal to make it 17-7 but UConn immediately responded. David Pindell capped a seven-play, 80-yard drive with a 10-yard rushing touchdown

Mensah rushed for his second touchdown of the night from four yards out midway through the fourth quarter to make it 31-20 Bulls.

After the Mensah touchdown, the UConn defense earned another takeaway, its third of the night, to set up the offense in great position. The Huskies could not capitalize with a touchdown but Clayton Harris kicked his first career field goal, a 38-yarder, to make it a one-score game at 31-23.

David Pindell rushed for a career-high 195 rushing yards and scored a pair of touchdowns including a 12-yard run with 2:24 left in the fourth quarter to make it 38-30, USF.

UConn attempted an onside kick and recovered but an offsides penalty negated the recovery. USF recovered the re-kick and the Bulls ran out the clock to secure their seventh win of the season.

David Pindell (197) and Kevin Mensah (120) both eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the second time this season (9/15, URI). The duo each totaled two rushing touchdowns on the night.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. - With a consistent rain falling at Pratt and Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field, the UConn football team lost to UMass 22-17 to fall to 1-7 on the season.

UConn got off to a great start by scoring a touchdown on the opening drive of the game. Kevin Mensah capped a seven-play, 82-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run.

The UConn defense played extremely well in the first half by only allowing three points to the Minutemen. The 7-3 lead at halftime for the Huskies was the second time this season UConn led at the half.

UConn started fast in the second half with a 25-yard touchdown run from David Pindell to extend the UConn lead to 14-7. Pindell finished the game with 120 yards rushing, eclipsing the 100-yard mark for the fourth time this season.

Pindell broke the single-season rushing mark for a UConn quarterback by passing Pete Petrillo (676 yards) in 1967. The senior quarterback has totaled 784 yards on the ground this season.

With the Huskies leading 14-3 late in the third quarter, defensive lineman Kevin Murphy recorded his first career interception to keep the Minutemen off the

Next up, the Huskies head on the road to Tulsa to play the Golden Hurricane at 7 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 3.

UConn (1-8, 0-5) built a 10-0 lead at the end of the first quarter after an 80-yard touchdown pass from senior quarterback David Pindell to senior wideout Kyle Buss. The Huskies capitalized on the touchdown after Tyler Coyle recovered a fumble in the end zone as the Golden Hurricane were primed to get on the scoreboard.

The Huskies tacked onto their only lead on a 44-yard field goal from Michael Tarbutt to create the double-digit advantage. Tarbutt added a 50-yard field goal in the second quarter for the

Tulsa scored touchdowns on its next seven possessions to blow the game open in the third quarter, 49-13.

Kyle Buss hauled in a career-high 129 yards on six receptions while David Pindell rushed for 100 yards or more for the fifth time this season. The quarterback finished the game with 150 yards on the ground.

The Huskies scored a touchdown late in the fourth quarter on a three-yard pass from Pindell to tight end Tyler Davis.

UConn returns to Pratt and Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field next Saturday, Nov. 10 against SMU at noon on ESPN3/WatchESPN.

Mensah, however, more than matched up. Just as Edsall said, as the game slows down for him, his effectiveness goes up.

In a game that featured a combined 112 points and 1,174 yards of total offense by both teams, SMU outlasted UConn, 62-50, on Saturday at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field, the Huskies' second-highest scoring game of the

"We tried to make it a shootout and outscore `em if we could, but we weren't able to do that," UConn coach Randy Edsall said.

UConn senior quarterback David Pindell was outstanding, passing for 215 yards and four touchdowns and rushing for 181 yards and two more scores. Sophomore running back Kevin Mensah led the UConn ground game with 184 yards and a TD as the Huskies (1-9, 0-6) piled up 365 rushing yards to add to the 215 through the air. Hergy Mayala caught two TD passes from Pindell, while Kyle Buss and Tyler Davis each gathered in one.

"I thought David Pindell played extremely well and Kevin Mensah did a nice job,' Edsall said. "I thought our offensive line did a good job – you don't usually rush for that many yards unless they're opening some holes."

Trailing 31-10 at halftime, UConn made a valiant effort in the second half – outscoring SMU 40-31 -- but could not get enough defensive stops to catch the Mustangs (5-5, 4-2). SMU's impressive numbers included 315 rushing yards and 279 through the air.

"Defensively, it's the same thing," Edsall said. "We have one guy breaking down and then it's a big play. That's kind of been the story of the year for us. I thought the first half, physically, we had it handed to us defensively. Then I thought we at least picked it up a little bit physically, but then we missed some assignments. When we had a chance to make a tackle, we just didn't make it. Those are all the things we have to work on."

Despite SMU's potent offensive attack, UConn refused to give up. Trailing 52-31 early in the fourth quarter, the Huskies rallied to within 52-44 with 10:18 remaining. But the Mustangs tacked on a touchdown and a field goal over the next seven minutes to extend the margin to 62-44 and virtually put the game out of

"Coach Edsall just talked to us at halftime and told us they wanted it more than us," said Pindell, who was 25-of-38 with 1 interception. "I think our mindset in the second half was to want it more than them. I'm proud of the team because they didn't give up and gave us a chance to win. Obviously we didn't, but going into next week, it gives us more confidence that we can stay in games."

Pindell has been a shining light for the Huskies this season, rushing for 1,115 yards and passing for 1,706, one of the finest seasons of total offense in UConn history.

"The guy's a competitor," Edsall said. "He loves to play the game, loves football. He's giving everything he has and being very productive doing it. But he works at it. He has very good ability, but he takes that ability and tries to make it batter. He's really had a good year, giving us everything he can."

The Huskies have two games remaining on the schedule – next Saturday at ECU

Senior Night fort the final game of the 2018 season with a final score of 57-7.

On the opening drive of the second half, sophomore running back Kevin Mensah reached 1,000 yards joining his quarterback David Pindell who reached the mark earlier in the season. Mensah and Pindell are the first duo since the 2009 season to do this.

UConn scored on their first opportunity after winning the toss and deferring. Setting up shop on their own 25, Pindell completed his first pass of the evening to Keyion Dixon. He followed it up with another this time to Tyler Davis, that would pick up the first down and then some for the Huskies. A targeting penalty called on Temple's Shaun Bradley would not only dismiss him for the remainder of the competition but would give UConn an additional 15 yards. Mensah strung together several good runs to move the chains and his team up the field. Pindell's four-yard completion to a wide-open Dixon put the Huskies back in contention with the Owls at seven all.

Later in the second quarter, an Oneil Robinson interception wrapped up a Temple Rushing drive in its infancy with only three plays, 20 yards, at 1:08.

To conclude the first half, Temple's diversified scoring put them in the end zone on several occasions. The Owls posted six touchdowns, scoring one of those by way of a 99-yard kickoff return.

Pindell led the passing attack for UConn at 12-23 before the quick change placed Steven Krajewski in at quarterback. Hergy Mayala's 32-yards would be the longest for the Huskes on the night as Mensah finsihed the game at 94 yards on 24 attempts. Luke Magliozzi saw action six times with his longest at 55-yards.

Senior night festivities took place before the kick, as UConn celebrated their 20 seniors.

#### 1896

The history of intercollegiate football at the University of Connecticut begins with the formation of the Athletic League of New England State Colleges. Connecticut, Massachusetts and Rhode Island join for the purpose of scheduling regular meetings in football and baseball. Connecticut is known as Storrs Agricultural College.

#### 1897

A year of firsts, all in one game; first game against Rhode Island, first game against a collegiate opponent and first game in the newly formed conference. S.A.C. wins 22-8.

#### 1899

Storrs Agricultural College changes its name to Connecticut Agricultural College.

#### 1901

The 1901 squad finished 8-2 and registered six shutouts on the season, including five straight in one stretch. Rhode Island was the only intercollegiate opponent on the schedule and was one of the shutout victims, falling to the "Aggies" of Connecticut Agricultural College by a count of 27-0.

#### 1919

Gardner Dow, a native of New Haven, dies on September 20, 1919, after making a spectacular flying tackle in a game at New Hampshire. Dow suffered a concussion of the brain. The athletic fields behind Hawley Armory were named

after him and served as the site of home games for football, baseball, soccer, lacrosse and track meets.



#### 1923

Connecticut enters the New England Conference, which includes all New England state schools except for the University of Vermont.

#### 1924

This squad is down in the annals as one of the school's finest, finishing 6-0-2 and winning the New England Conference Championship. The Aggies are said by the New York Times to be among the best teams in the country and the team defense finishes first in the nation. The team gave up only 13 points all season and only three in the final seven games.

Senior team captain Martin "Red" O'Neill is the school's first All-America candidate, leading the 1923 and 1924 teams. As legend has it, his career started in 1922 during a loss to Springfield College. A Connecticut Agricultural College (now UConn) player was injured and the coaches could find no one to replace him among the reserves. Someone spotted O'Neill

watching the game from the stands and called to him to join in the game. He threw on a uniform and stepped into the line-up, where he would remain for three seasons.

#### 1934

First season for head coach J.O. Christian. The school receives big press coverage at the end of the 1-7 campaign for stealing the Rhody Ram mascot before the game with Rhode Island (pictured above).

#### 1935

First football team to come in early for preseason camp at the expense of the school.

#### 1939

First season as the University of Connecticut; team defeats Coast Guard, 14-0, in the first game ever played under flood lights at Gardner Dow Field.

#### 1942, 1944-1945

During the war years, head coach J.O. Christian and the Huskies put together a three-year stretch like none other in school history. In that three-season span (with no football being played in 1943), Connecticut won 20 of 24 contests. The Huskies registered separate winning streaks of six, eight and five games and shutout their opponents in 13 of the 20 wins.

#### 1945

UConn tailback Walt Trojanowski shares the NCAA scoring title with Doc Blanchard of Army. Both men scored 132 points on the season.

#### 1947

UConn becomes a charter member of the Yankee Conference.

#### 1953

Memorial Stadium opens with a 26-6 Connecticut win over St. Lawrence on October 10, 1953. The 1953 season also marked the first appearance at a football game for the marching band.

#### 1956-1960

UConn captures five straight Yankee Conference Championships, a leaguerecord for consecutive titles won or shared. During that span, the Huskies compile a 17-1-2 record in Yankee Conference play and go 18 league contests before their lone loss in the stretch, to New Hampshire.

#### 1965

UConn beats Yale for the first time ever (pictured above), on September 25, 1965, 13-6. UConn becomes the first school from within the state of Connecticut to ever beat Yale

#### 1969

UConn joins the NCAA in celebrating the 100th anniversary of college football by selecting an 11-member All-Time UConn team. More than 130 UConn football players receive votes in the balloting of fans, alumni and former players.

#### 1967-73

Connecticut captures four Yankee Conference championships in a sevenseason span, going 27-6-3 in league play during that stretch.

#### 1983

Linebackers John Dorsey and Vernon Hargreaves become the first teammates in UConn football history to earn All-America honors in the same season. The duo combined for more than 300 tackles and helped UConn to a share of the Yankee Conference Championship.

#### 1989

UConn plays the first night game in the history of Memorial Stadium on September 23, 1989, and defeats New Hampshire, 20-10.

#### 1990

Matt DeGennaro finishes his Husky career as the leading passer in the history of the Yankee Conference, totaling 9,288 yards and 73 touchdowns.

#### 199

UConn matches the most successful start in school history by winning its first six games of the year. Senior captain Wilbur Gilliard becomes the all-time leading rusher in school history. Gilliard finishes his career with 2,624 rushing yards. The 1995 team finishes 8-3 and ties the school record for wins in a season. The squad finished the year ranked No. 23 in the national I-AA top 25.

#### 1998

UConn football celebrates its 100th season with a school-record 10 wins and advances to the NCAA I-AA football playoffs for the first time. UConn defeats Hampton, 42-34, in its first playoff game and advances to the NCAA Quarterfinals. The Huskies finish the season ranked No. 7 in the national I-AA rankings. Senior quarterback Shane Stafford is the only active player named to the UConn Football 100th Anniversary All-Time Team and finishes his career in the top two of every quarterbacking category in school history.

#### 1999

Randy Edsall becomes UConn's 27th head coach and leads the Huskies through their final season in Division I-AA. UConn finishes 4-7, but wins its first ever game against a Division I-A opponent, beating Buffalo 23-0 on September 16.

#### 2000

UConn begins play as a Division I-A Independent. The team earns two wins over Division I-A opponents and sets a single-season record for average home attendance (14,166), playing before the three largest crowds in school history (all advance sellouts) in their first three home games.

#### 2001

UConn earned its first-ever victory over a BIG EAST opponent as Marc Hickok nailed a career-long 47-yard field goal with 3:04 remaining in the game to lift the Huskies to a 20-19 win over Rutgers.

#### 2002

UConn has a breakthrough season, posting a 6-6 record, including a win at Big 12 member lowa State, which would advance to a bowl game. For the first time, the NCAA included UConn in the Division I-A statistics and the Huskies placed in the national top five in passing defense and ranked 19th in total defense. Terry Caulley was the nation's leading freshman rusher with 1,247 yards on the year. The Huskies closed a 50-year run at Memorial Stadium with a 63-21 win over Kent State in which Caulley tied an NCAA record by scoring four touchdowns in one quarter.

#### 2003

UConn made its debut at Rentschler Field, playing to 93% capacity (37,059). The large home crowds helped push the Huskies to a 9-3 record, including a 34-10 win over Big Ten member Indiana on opening day.

#### 2004

UConn made its debut as a member of the BIG EAST Conference in style as the Huskies finished one game back of the leaders and earned a berth in the Motor City Bowl. The Huskies led the conference in both total offense and total defense while Cornell Brockington led the BIG EAST with 1,218 rushing yards. The season ended with a win over Toledo in the Motor City Bowl as quarterback Dan Orlovsky was named MVP.

#### 2007

UConn captured its first-ever BIG EAST Championship and appeared in the Meineke Car Care Bowl, selling out its allotment of 12,500 tickets for the game in Charlotte, N.C. During the season, UConn earned its first-ever national rankings, peaking at No. 16 in the AP Poll and No. 13 in the BCS.

#### 2008

UConn advanced to a bowl in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history and defeated Buffalo in the 2009 International Bowl in Toronto. Running back Donald Brown led the country in rushing with 2,083 yards and became UConn's first All-American since the program moved to the FBS. Brown was also named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year – UConn's first-ever BIG EAST individual award winner. Following the season, the Huskies had four players taken in the first two rounds of the NFL Draft.

#### 2009

Connecticut advances to a bowl game for the third-straight season and posts a 20-7 win over South Carolina. The Huskies endured an emotional season with the death of teammate Jasper Howard on Oct. 19, but came back to win its final four games, including a 33-30 double overtime win at Notre Dame.

#### 2010

UConn appears in a Bowl Championship series game for the first time as it plays Oklahoma in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. The Huskies won five consecutive games to close the regular season and claim the BIG EAST Championship and a trip to the BCS. Running back Jordan Todman was unanimously named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year and was an All-American pick. Todman was also the second-leading rusher in the country. Nick Williams led the country in kickoff return average.

#### 2012

Following the 2012 season, a record five Huskies are selected in the 2013 NFL Draft. Dwayne Gratz, Sio Moore and Blidi Wreh-Wilson are all taken in the third round while Trevardo Williams goes in the fourth and Ryan Griffin in the sixth.

#### 2013

An all-time record crowd of 42,704 pack Rentschler Field as the Huskies took on Michigan on Sept. 21. Following the season, former Notre Dame defensive coordinator Bob Diaco was named the head coach of the Huskies.

#### 2015

Diaco led UConn to an appearance in the St. Petersburg Bowl against Marshall in just his second year as Husky coach. The Huskies posted a 20-17 win over No. 13 Houston on November 21 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field.

an Orlovsky earned Most Valuable Player honors after going 20 of 41 in the air for 239 yards and two touchdowns as UConn defeated MAC Champion Toledo by a 39-10 score in the 2004 Motor City Bowl, UConn's first ever bowl appearance.

In addition to Orlovsky's honor, Tyler King was named the United Auto Workers Lineman of the Game.

The Huskies were led in rushing by Cornell Brockington, who had 15 carries for 72 yards. The leading receiver on the day for UConn was Keron Henry with nine catches for 239 yards.

UConn got out of the gates early, and set a Motor City Bowl record, by scoring 17 points in the first quarter while shutting the Rockets out. The Huskies took the opening drive 41 yards on eight plays to set up a 35-yard field goal by Matt Nuzie. Nuzie went

on to kick three more field goals, for a total of four, to set a new Motor City Bowl record and tie a UConn single-

The Huskies scored the first touchdown of the contest as Orlovsky, after eluding a blitzing Rocket, hit Jason Williams in the corner of the end zone for a dazzling 32-yard TD pass on a fourth and six play.

The final points of the first quarter came as Larry Taylor returned a punt 68 yards for a score.



Toledo scored its first points of the game as it grinded out a 13-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a one-yard touchdown run by quarterback Bruce Gradowski.

The Huskies scored 13 more points in the second guarter to take a 30-7 lead at the half. Orlovsky threw a seven-yard TD pass to Brian Sparks, whose sliding catch with 7:42 left in the half capped an eight-play, 41-yard drive. That touchdown was set up by a 54-yard kickoff return by Taylor.

Nuzie kicked a pair of field goals in the final 1:24 of the half - a 37-yarder and a 25-yarder on the final play of the half.

The teams traded a pair of field goals for the only scoring of the third quarter as Jason Robbins hit a 27-yard field goal for Toledo 3:13 into the half while Nuzie hit a 36-yarder with 1:53 left to play in

The only scoring of the fourth quarter came with 25 seconds remaining as sophomore Matt Lawrence scored a touchdown on an 11-yard run.


The two halves were mirror images of each other as UConn shutout Wake Forest in the first half and the Demon Deacons held the Huskies scoreless in the second.

Wake Forest took the opening possession of the second half and marched for a touchdown on a six-play, 66-yard drive. Josh Adams scored the touchdown on a 38-yard run 2:16 into the half.

The Demon Deacons took the lead for good on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Skinner to John Tereshinski on a third-and-14 play. Wake Forest made it 17-10 on a 43-yard field goal 3:07 into the final quarter by Sam Swank. The Demon Deacons sealed the win with a TD run by Micah Andrews in the final minute.

UConn was severely limited in the second half on offense as the Huskies had just 73 total yards of offense while the Deacons had 275.

UConn's Tyler Lorenzen was 13-of-26 in the air for 98 yards. Donald Brown led UConn in rushing with 13 carries for 72 yards. Brad Kanuch was the leading Husky receiver with three receptions for 36 yards.

Wake Forest senior wide receiver Kenny Moore was named the game's MVP as he made 11 receptions for 112 yards.

UConn scored all 10 of its points in the first half. Larry Taylor scored the only touchdown of the first half when he returned a punt 68 yards for a touchdown with 2:38 left in the first quarter. Ironically, Taylor had a 68-yard punt return for a TD in UConn's only other bowl game – a win over Toledo in the 2004 Motor City Bowl – which came with 2:31 left in the first quarter down the near (UConn) sideline running to the camera's right.

The only other first half points came with 5:00 left in the second quarter as Tony Ciaravino connected on a 29-yard field goal that finished an eight-play, 80-yard drive. That drive was highlighted by a 58-yard run by Brown on the first play of the drive.



onald Brown rushed for 261 yards on 29 carries and one TD to lead the University of Connecticut to a 38-20 victory over Buffalo in the 2009 International Bowl. The game was played before a crowd of 40,184 at the Rogers Centre in Toronto. The crowd was the highest in the three-year old history of the event.

Brown was named the Most Valuable Player of the Game. UConn tailback Jordan Todman also enjoyed a fine day with seven carries for 62 yards.

The Husky defense was outstanding as it limited the Bulls to 237 yards of total offense and just 24 net yards of rushing. Buffalo had a total of 16 drives in the game and the Bulls only gained more than 30 yards on one of them. Buffalo had nine drives of ten yards or less.

Buffalo led 20-17 at halftime after a haphazard second quarter that saw the Huskies commit four turnovers that resulted in 17 points for the Bulls.

UConn scored the only points of the third quarter to take the lead for good in the game on a four-yard TD pass from quarterback Tyler Lorenzen to tight end Steve Brouse.

Dahna Deleston rounded out the scoring with a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown, making the score 38-20 with 2:15 to play.

In the second quarter, UConn kicker Dave Teggart connected on a 32-yard field goal 49 seconds into the period to give the Huskies a 10-3 lead.



The Husky defense then stopped the Bulls on three plays, but UConn then fumbled a punt return as the Bulls recovered the ball in the endzone for a touchdown to tie the game.

UConn then fumbled the ball on the second play of its next possession to give the Bulls the ball at the Husky 18. The UConn defense was valiant again and held Buffalo to six yards as A.J. Principe kicked a 29-yard FG for a 13-10 Bull lead with 8:22 to go. On the ensuing kickoff, UConn fumbled that return to give Buffalo the ball at the Husky four and the Bulls scored on first down on a rush by James Starks to make it 20-10 Bulls.

Lorenzen scored the final TD of the first half on a 13-yard run that was set up by a career-long 75 yard rush by Brown.

The Huskies outgained Buffalo 225-94 in the first half as the Huskies had just one pass attempt in the half. Brown had 207 yards of rushing in the first half.

UConn limited the Bulls to 40 yards of total offense in the first quarter and two first downs while the Huskies had 112 yards.



In a defensively-minded game, the University of Connecticut football team nearly shutout South Carolina in the Papajohns.com Bowl to earn the school's first win over a Southeastern Conference opponent. The game was played in front of a crowd of 45,254 at Legion Field, a Papajohns.com Bowl record attendance. UConn finished with the 20-7 victory earning their second-straight and third overall bowl victory.

The Huskies shut out South Carolina in the first three quarters of the game and have shut out their bowl opponents in nine of 16 quarters played.

With his 126 yards on the day, senior tailback and Fred Sington Most Vaulable Player Andre Dixon reached the 1,000-yard mark for the season becoming the 12th running back in UConn history to reach the mark and joining teammate Jordan Todman, who accomplished the feat earlier in the season. Todman finished the day with 36 yards.




Junior quarterback Zach Frazer was nine of 21 in the air for 106 yards and connected with sophomore Kashif Moore two times for 40 yards and a touchdown.

Stephen Garcia led South Carolina by passing for 129 yards on a 16 for 38 effort also rushing for 56 yards on the day. Alshon Jeffery grabbed three passes for 28 yards for the Gamecocks.

The Huskies were the first to get on the board after an unbelievable one-handed 37-yard grab by Moore, who tiptoed along the sidelines and extended into the endzone to put the Huskies up with 6:31 remaining in the first quarter.

South Carolina decided to attempt a fourth and short at its own 32-yard line but senior Lindsey Witten stepped up and



Teggart boosted the lead to 13-0 in the second quarter with 8:26 remaining in the game connecting on his second field goal of the game, a 44-yard boot, setting a new Papajohns.com Bowl record. Later in the quarter, South Carolina earned their first first down of the game with 7:37 left in the half. They only managed four first downs in the entire first half for a net of 84 yards.

After SC fumbled at their own 35-yard line, Dixon used the opportunity to record his first touchdown of the day, a 10-yard run to boost the Huskies lead to 20 with 13:12 remaining in the fourth quarter. Dixon's TD capped a 3:53 minute, nine play 35-yard drive.

The Gamecocks got on the board with 3:24 remaining in the game capitalizing on a blocked punt and scoring on a two-play 40-yard drive. Alex Molina recovered an onside kick for the Huskies as UConn ran out the clock.

TEAM STATISTICS he University of Connecticut played in its first-ever Bowl Championship Game and CONN OU dropped a 48-20 decision to seventh-ranked Oklahoma in the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl 27 before a crowd of 67,232 at the University of Phoenix Stadium. 30-95 41-112 429

UConn junior tailback Jordan Todman carried the ball 32 times for 121 yards and Husky senior quarterback Zach Frazer was 19 of 39 in the air for 223 yards.

Oklahoma sophomore quarterback Landry Jones was 34 of 49 in the air for 429 yards while senior DeMarco Murray rushed 25 times for 93 yards.

Oklahoma scored touchdowns on both of its first quarter possessions. After UConn began the game with a three-and-out, the Sooners marched 70 yards on nine plays for an eight-yard TD pass from Jones to junior James Hanna. The scoring play came on the only third down play the Sooners had on the drive.

UConn moved 55 yards on its next possession, but failed on a fourth-and-one play that gave the Sooners the ball at their own 19. The Sooners then moved the ball 81 yards on nine plays and scored on a three-yard rush by Murray. Oklahoma gained 63 yards on five first down plays during the drive.

The Huskies broke into the scoring column when redshirt sophomore Dwayne Gratz picked off a Jones pass and returned it 46 yards for a touchdown. The interception return for a TD was the fifth of the year for the Huskies tying a school record from 2007.

Oklahoma came right back and moved the ball from its own 20 to the Husky 20, but UConn's defense held strong and limited OU to a 41-yard field goal to make it 17-7 with 9:57 to go.



The teams then traded field goals the rest of the first half as junior kicker Dave Teggart hit a 37-yard field goal with 26 seconds left in the first half to make it 20-10 at the break.

The Sooners exploded for two quick TDs to start the second half as they took their second possession of the half a quick four plays in 80 yards as Jones hit senior Cameron Kenny on a 59-yard touchdown pass.

Oklahoma then made it 34-10 as Frazer threw an interception picked off by junior Jamell Fleming.

UConn junior Robbie Frey kept the pesky Huskies going as he returned the ensuing kickoff 95 yards for a score to cut the lead to 34-17. Junior kicker Dave Teggart hit on a 38-yard field goal with 5:04 left in the third to make it 34-20. The field goal marked the tenth-straight for Teggart, as he ended the season making 15 of his past 16 attempts.



Marshall quarterback Chase Litton went 23 for 34 for 218 yards and one touchdown as the Thundering Herd defeated the UConn football team by a 16-10 score in the 2015 St. Petersburg Bowl at Tropicana Field.

The Huskies, who were back in bowl play for the first time since the 2010 season, finish the year at 6-7 while Marshall was 10-3.

The Huskies played stingy defense as Marshall was limited to three field goals following a first quarter TD. Nick Smith had three FGs for Marshall, including a 32-yarder with 1:44 to play that was part of a 13-play, 80-yard march that lasted 6:35.

UConn redshirt quarterback Bryant Shirreffs completed 10 of 17 passes for 86 yards and gained 75 yards on 19 carries for UConn.

The Huskies stopped Marshall on fourth-and-two at the UConn 17 on the initial drive of the second half after the Thundering Herd opted to skip a field goal try. The Thundering Herd also failed to increase a 13-7 lead on their next possession when Smith missed a 43-yard field goal attempt with less than three minutes left in the third.

The Huskies got within 13-10 on a 52-yard field goal by redshirt junior Bobby Puyol with two seconds left in the third. The 52-yarder was tied as the sixth-longest in school history and tied as the third-longest in UConn's FBS history. It was also a career-long for Puyol and the longest in UConn bowl and St. Petersburg Bowl history. Puyol was named UConn's Game MVP by the bowl.

Marshall took a 7-0 lead seven minutes into the game when Litton threw a 16-yard TD pass to Ryan Yurachek. Deandre Reaves' 26-yard punt return set up Marshall at the UConn 20. Reaves also had nine receptions for 88 yards.


UConn tied it at 7-7- late in the first on an eight-yard run by sophomore tailback Ron Johnson that completed a 13-play, 75-yard drive.

Marshall responded with a 13-play, 65-yard drive that concluded with Smith's 21-yard field goal that gave the Thundering Herd a 10-7 advantage eight minutes before halftime. Smith made it 13-7 with a 29-yard field goal on the final play of the first half that finished off a 15-play, 85-yard drive.

UConn sophomore cornerback Jamar Summers got his eighth interception of the season, including six in the last five games, early in the fourth quarter. Summers' eight interceptions is tied for second in UConn single-season history and first in the Husky FRS era

Husky sophomore tailback Arkeel Newsome had five receptions for 33 yards for the Huskies. Senior safety Andrew Adams led the UConn defense with 14 tackles.




# **ALL-AMERICANS**





## **UCONN'S SUPER BOWL HISTORY**

ormer UConn cornerback Robert McClain played in Super Bowl 50 for the Carolina Panthers in February 2016. He started all three of Carolina's postseason games at cornerback and had 18 tackles in those games.

McClain led the Panthers with five solo tackles on and had six total tackles in the NFC Championship game vs. Arizona. He had four tackles in the Super Bowl vs. Denver.


The 2015 season was McClain's sixth in the NFL. He played for Carolina in 2010 before returning to the team in December 2015. McClain played in 46 games for UConn from 2006-09 and had 129 career tackles and ten interceptions. He was a second team All-Big East pick as a senior.


#### UCONN'S OTHER SUPER BOWL HISTORY INCLUDES:

Former Husky All-American running back Donald Brown became the third UConn alumnus to play in the Super Bowl XLIV in February of 2010 when the rookie helped the Indianapolis Colts win the AFC championship.

 In addition, former Husky quarterback Tyler Lorenzen was on the practice squad for the Super Bowl champion New Orleans Saints that year.

- Brian Kozlowski became the second Husky to play in a Super Bowl with the Atlanta Falcons in January of 1999 for Super Bowl XXXIII.
   Kozlowski was the starting fullback for the AFC Champions.
- Nick Giaquinto, who played at UConn from 1975-76, participated in two Super Bowls with the Washington Redskins. He played in Super Bowl XVII in 1982 which the Redskins won and Super Bowl XVIII.
- In Super Bowl XLVI in February of 2012, Donald Thomas was on the New England Patriots active roster but did not dress for the game and Williams Beatty was on the New York Giants roster but was not active because of an injury.



he University of Connecticut has a long tradition of sending players to the Canadian Football League – both Canadian natives as "non-import" players and natives of the United States.

UConn center Alex Mateas, a native of Ottawa, was selected as the top overall pick in the 2015 CFL

Draft by the Ottawa REDBLACKS. In his rookie year of 2015, he and his Ottawa teammates advanced to the Grey Cup championship game. Their team then won the 2016 Grey Cup over Calgary, 39-33.

Former Husky tight end Martin Bedard has won Grey Cup Championships with the Montreal Alouettes in 2009 and '11 and also played in the 2012 Grey Cup final. He played his seventh year with the team in 2015.

Two former Huskies – Jordan Younger and Danny Desriveaux – played for the 2012 Grey Cup Champion Toronto Argonauts. Younger had a nine-year CFL career and is now an assistant coach for Toronto.

Larry Taylor was a nine-year veteran of the league with Montreal , Calgary and Toronto. He was with Montreal from 2008-10 and won a pair of Grey Cup titles. He was the 2009 CFL Special Teams Player of the Year. As a rookie in 2008, he returned two punts for a touchdown in the East Division final games vs. Edmonton.
