QUICK HITS---

- » The UConn Huskies continue their three-game homestand on Saturday afternoon playing host to the Duke Blue Devils at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. Kick-off is slated for 3:30 pm on CBS Sports Network
- » Saturday's match-up marks the fifth meeting between UConn and Duke with the series tied at 2-2. The Blue Devils have taken the last two match-ups, winning at home in 2024 (26-21) and at The Rent in 2023 (41-7). The Huskies took the first two back in 2004 and 2007. UConn is 1-1 against teams from the ACC this season, losing in overtime, 27-20, at Syracuse and winning at Boston College, 38-23.
- » UConn is coming off a 38-19 win over UAB last weekend, remaining unbeaten at home this season (4-0) while also clinching bowl eligibility for the second-straight season. The Huskies haven't been bowl eligible in consecutive campaigns since the 2009 and 2010 season and have now reached bowl eligibility in three of four seasons under head coach Jim Mora.
- » Husky wide receiver Skyler Bell continued to put up big numbers, catching eight passes for 149 yards and three touchdowns in the win. Bell has caught six or more passes in eight of nine games this season and hauled in 10-plus catches in three games. He raised his season total to 11 touchdown grabs, tying the UConn school record.
- » Quarterback Joe Fagnano completed 23 of 30 passes for 267 yards and threw four touchdowns in the win and in doing so eclipsed the 10,000 yards passing mark in his career between UConn and his time at Maine. Fagnano has thrown 22 touchdowns this season and has thrown for three or more touchdowns in three-straight games. He ran his streak to 10-straight games dating back to last season without an interception.
- » UConn Head Coach Mora is in his fourth season leading the Huskies and led the UConn to one of the best seasons in program history in 2024. UConn finished 9-4, the program's first winning season since 2010. Mora got the Huskies to a bowl game for the second time in three seasons, leading UConn to their first bowl win since 2009, 27-14 over UNC in the Wasabi Fenway Bowl. He is 24-23 in his time in Storrs and notched his 100th career head coaching victory with the win over FIU. Mora was hired as the 32nd head coach in program history in November of 2021. He returned to the sidelines for the first time since 2017 after a six-year stint as the head coach at UCLA. Mora led UCLA to a 46-30 record and four bowl appearances. His 31 years of coaching experience also included head coaching stints with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks.
- » THE STADIUM: The Huskies moved into Rentschler Field in East Hartford for the 2003 season and are in their 22nd season of play at their off-campus home in 2025. The stadium officially became known as Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field in 2015. UConn has an all-time record of 81-58 at Rentschler Field and posted a 35-18 mark in non-conference games prior to re-classifying as an independent in 2020. UConn set a new all-time single-game attendance record at Rentschler Field on Sept. 21, 2013 against Michigan with a crowd of 42,704. That capacity was achieved with extra bleachers brought in for that game.

Last Meeting vs. Duke...

Sept. 14, 2024 - Duke 26 UConn 21 - Durham, NC

The UConn Huskies got 106 yards rushing and a touchdown from running back Cam Edwards but saw their second half lead erased in the fourth quarter as the Duke Blue Devils came away with a 26-21 win last season at Wallace Wade Stadium. Duke erased a 21-17 UConn lead in the fourth quarter with a Todde Pelino field goal and quarterback Malik Murphy's third touchdown throw of the night en route to the win. Murphy finished 28-for-43 for 267 yards and three touchdowns and an interception. For UConn, Edwards rumbled to his third career 100-yard game needing 21 carries to hit the century mark while adding a 26-yard catch to his stat line. R-Sophomore Nick Evers was under center to lead the UConn offense and threw his first career touchdown. Evers finished the night 15-of-29 for 135 yards and also ran it 10 times for 60 yards. Duke broke out to a 17-0 lead in the second quarter before the Huskies started to claw their way back. The first score came on a linebacker Langston Hardy 65-yard interception return for six. The Huskies owned the third quarter, putting two scoring drives to take a 21-17 lead. Duke pulled within 21-20 on the first play of the fourth quarter as Pelino hit his second field goal of the night. The Blue Devils created their second turnover on the next UConn drive, Murphy found Que'Sean Brown for the go-ahead score. The Huskies had a chance to cut into the lead but a 48-yard field goal chance with 5:42 left went wide right and the Blue Devils would take over and never give UConn the ball back. Star Thomas ran for 122 yards on 22 carries while Brown caught all 11 passes thrown his way for 87 yards and a score for Duke. The Blue Devils finished with 409 yards of total offense.

Scouting the Blue Devils...

The Duke Blue Devils make their way north fresh off a 46-45 win on the road at Clemson last weekend to improve to 4-1 in the ACC and 5-3 overall. The Blue Devils feature the 4th ranked passing offense in the country (324.3) led by quarterback Darian Mensah. Mensah is among the national leaders in all passing categories, including 2nd in passing yards per game (321.5). He has thrown for 2,572 yards and 22 touchdowns this season. Wideout Cooper Barkate leads the team with 45 catches for 774 yards and five touchdowns. He is averaging 96.8 yards per game and 17.2 yards per catch on the year. In the backfield, Nate Sheppard has carried the ball 84 times for 557 yards and five scores. He averages 6.6 yards per carry. Fellow back Anderson Castle has run for 319 yards (5.5 ypc) and has found the endzone six times on the season. Defensively, safeties Caleb Weaver and Dashawn Stone lead the team with 57 and 52 tackles, respectively.

UConn vs. the ACC...

The Huskies are 9-29 all-time against the ACC. The Huskies are 1-1 against the conference this season, losing a tough 27-20 overtime game at Syracuse and posting a 380-23 win on the road at Boston College. UConn snapped a six-game skid against the conference with a win over North Carolina in the 2025 Wasabi Fenway Bowl to cap last season. UConn is 2-2 against Duke, 2-2 against Virginia and 1-3 against Wake Forest. The Huskies are 2-4 against Boston College since the Eagles joined the league in 2005 and 0-5 vs. Syracuse since the Orange jumped to the ACC in 2013. UConn has also faced Clemson (0-1), Georgia Tech (0-3), North Carolina (1-3) and NC State (0-4). The Huskies were 1-3 against Maryland when the Terrapins were a member of the conference through 2014. The Huskies have also faced Louisville, Miami, Pitt, SMU and Virginia Tech in their history but prior to those teams joining the ACC. The Huskies have never faced Cal, Florida State or Stanford.

Head Coach Jim Mora

Head Coach Jim Mora has transformed the UConn football program since taking the reins after the 2021 season. Mora enters his fourth season on the Huskies' sidelines in 2025 after leading the Huskies to one of the most successful seasons in UConn football history.

Mora led the Huskies to a 9-4 record in 2024, capped by beating UNC in the Wasabi Fenway Bowl, UConn's second trip to a post season bowl game in his three seasons. UConn's nine wins is the most for the program since 2010, also securing the first winning season since that campaign. It marked the third time in program history a UConn team has won nine games or more (2024, 2010, 2007, 2003).

The Huskies enjoyed a six-win turnaround last season while also returning to their winning ways at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field, posting a 6-1 record on their home turf last fall.



For his efforts Mora, was named The Gridiron Club of Greater Boston 2024 Head Coach of the Year. The 2024 season marked the fifth winning campaign for Coach Mora during his collegiate coaching tenure. It was also the sixth post season bowl appearance for a Mora coached team during his nine seasons at UConn and UCLA combined.

Mora was named as the head football coach of the University of Connecticut on Nov. 11, 2021 and is the 32nd head coach in the program's history, which dates back to 1896. In his first season in Storrs in 2022, Mora spearheaded a "Husky Revolution" that saw UConn finish with a 6-6 regular season record and make a return to the college football postseason for the first time since the 2015 campaign. The Huskies finished their season 5-1 on their home field at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field capped by knocking off nationally ranked Liberty to clinch bowl eligibility and set the Huskies up for an appearance in the 2022 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

Following the 2023 season, the Huskies saw the program's first two-time All-American during the FBS era in offensive guard Christian Haynes, who garnered AP and The Sporting News All-American honors for the second consecutive season. Haynes also became the first NFL Draft pick under Mora when he was selected in the third round by the Seattle Seahawks.

Mora, 63, brings 35 years of coaching experience in both the college ranks and the NFL to Storrs. He has 13 years of head coaching experience, including six as the head coach of UCLA where he accumulated a 46-30 overall record and a 29-24 mark in Pac-12 play. Mora led the Bruins to the 2012 Pac-12 South Championship and won the 2013 Sun Bowl and 2014 Alamo Bowl. The Bruins were ranked as high as No. 7 nationally during the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

Under Mora, 30 Bruins were selected in the NFL Draft, including at least one first rounder in every year except one. The 30 NFL Draft selections were the most of any Pac-12 program during that time. A 1983 graduate of the University of Washington, Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game in the playoffs.

In his initial season as the head coach of the Atlanta Falcons in 2004, Mora directed the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a division title. The Falcons captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship Game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was honored as the NFC Coach of the Year following the 2004 season.

Prior to becoming the head coach for the Falcons, Mora served on the San Francisco 49ers coaching staff from 1997-2003. He spent his last five seasons in San Francisco as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as finishing No. 3 in the league in sacks (54).

The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC and No. 4 in the NFL in interceptions, with 21. In the 2002 and 2003 seasons with San Francisco, the defense finished no lower than fourth in the NFL versus the run, and in 2003 produced 42 sacks, to tie for second in the conference. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game and had three defensive players voted to the Pro Bowl, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

From 1992-1996, Mora worked on the staff of his father, James E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. The Saints put together the No. 1 pass defense in the league during Mora's first two years with the team.

In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coaching position to defensive backs coach, while working for head coaches Coryell, Al Saunders and Dan Henning.

NFL Pro Bowlers who have played under coach Mora over the years include -- Julian Peterson, LB-Seattle and San Francisco; Marcus Trufant, DB-Seattle; Allen Rossum, DB-Atlanta; Patrick Kerney, DL-Atlanta; Roderick Coleman, DL-Atlanta; Keith Brooking, LB-Atlanta; DeAngelo Hall, DB-Atlanta; Michael Vick, QB-Atlanta; Alge Crumpler, TE-Atlanta; Warrick Dunn, RB-Atlanta; Bryant Young, DL-San Francisco; Lance Schulters, DB-San Francisco; Merton Hanks, DB-San Francisco; Eric Allen, DB-New Orleans; Tyrone Hughes, DB-New Orleans; Gill Byrd, DB-San Diego, Anthony Barr, LB-Minnesota. Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams as a player (1981-loss to Michigan; 1982-win over Iowa), and helped the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant coach. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 overall record.

WR Skyler Bell Wins Gold Helmet Award & Senior Bowl Honor... Wideout Skyler Bell picked-up another pair of awards this week, taking home the New England Football Writers Association Gold Helmet Award and the Panini Senior Bowl Stock Up Offensive Player of the Week after his performance against UAB. Bell brought in eight passes for 149 yards and three touchdowns to help lead the Huskies to a 38-19 win over UAB. Bell tied his career-high with three TD grabs and raised his season total to 11 touchdown grabs this season, the most by a Husky during the FBS era. Bell hit the 100-yards receiving mark for the third-straight game and sixth time this season.

Huskies Dominant at The Rent... UConn was 6-1 in 2024 and are off to a 4-0 start this season at their East Hartford home, Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. This year, the Huskies have outscored their three opponents at home, 179-67, while averaging 44.8 points at The Rent. During the 10-1 stretch over the last two seasons, UConn has averaged 39.7 ppg and have outscored opponents 437-181 during that stretch.

The Huskies dominated opponents on the offensive side of the ball on their home turf last season, averaging 36.9 ppg while outscoring opponents 258-114 last fall. The 36.9 ppg is the second highest total (2010, 38.5 PPG) in their history of Rentschler Field, which opened in 2003. Their six wins on their home turf marked the fourth time in their time at The Rent winning six (2004, 2007, 2010, 2024).

Taking Care of the Football... The UConn offense went five games before recording their first turnover of the season. The streak ended when they lost a fumble in the win over FIU, but the defense created five Owl turnovers as the Huskies remain one of the best teams in the country in turnover ratio. The Huskies are ranked 7th nationally in turnover ratio (1.11), and first in turnovers lost (1). The are the only team in the nation with just one turnover on the season. The defense has registered eight interceptions and three fumble recoveries on the season.

Skyler Bell Among College Football's Best... Husky wide receiver Skyler Bell is among the nation's leading wide receivers this season, having caught 74 passes for 994 yards and 11 touchdowns. Bell has had three games this season with 10+ catches and has six games with 100 yards receiving. He has 10 100 yard games at UConn. He heads into this weekend having caught a TD in six-straight games. Earlier this season, he caught a career-best 14 passes, one off the UConn school record, for 113 yards and a score against Ball State. He has two 80-yard TD catches this season, against CCSU and last week at Rice, marking the longest receptions of his career.

Among the NCAA leaders this season, Bell ranks first in the country in catches (74), receiving TDs (11), second in receiving yards (994), yards per game (110.4) and receptions per game (8.22) and seventh in total touchdowns (11).

Bell in the UConn Record Book... Skyler Bell is on track to rewrite UConn's receiving records this season. Bell now has 16 career TD catches, the most in the UConn FBS era and tied for fifth all-time. His 1,854 career yards at UConn moves him into 10th all-time. Over his career at both Wisconsin and UConn, Bell has 193 catches for 2,609 yards and 22 TDs.

His 74 catches this season is now the fifth highest in a season and his 11 TD catches is tied for the school record. He is six yards away from becoming the 11th wide receiver in school history to record 1,000 yards receiving in a season and the first to do it since 2016 when Noel Thomas finished with 1,179.

Fagnano a Top Signal Caller... Joe Fagnano ranks among the top-quarterbacks in the country this season. Fagnano is among the national leaders in almost every statistical category. He ranks fourth in passing TDs (22), sixth in passing yards (2,529), 10th in passing yards per game (281.0) and points responsible for (144), 12th in completions per game (23.22), 14th in passing efficiency (162.5), 18th in total offense (291.1) and 20th in completion percentage (.688).

More impressive is Fagnano has done it playing mistake free football. He has completed 209 of 304 passes this season without an interception. Fagnano has thrown for more yards (2,529) and had more pass attempts (304) than any quarterback in the country without an interception. He is the only QB with over 300 pass attempts without an interception this season. The next quarterback in the country with most attempts without a pick sits at 72 (two players). He enters Saturday's game with 10-straight games without an interception, dating back to last season.

Fagnano is in his third season with the Huskies after being granted a seventh-year of eligibility by the NCAA after last season. In his 21 career games at UConn, he has thrown for 4,333 yards, completed 63.7 percent of his passes (347-545) and thrown for 42 touchdown against five picks. His 42 TD throws ranks him fourth all-time in the UConn record book. His 42 TDs is second to only Dan Orlovsky (84) during UConn's FBS era. His 4,333 career yards has moved to seventh on the all-time list while his 22 TDs is now tied for fifth for a season.

UConn Passing Attack... The UConn offense is ranked among the best in the country throwing the football. UConn is ranked 11th nationally in passing yards per game (299.3) and first in passes intercepted (0). The last time a UConn offense was ranked as high throwing the ball was in 2003 (281.33) and 2004 (297.92) when they were 10th. The Huskies are ranked 20th in total offense (455.6) and 15th in scoring offense (36.9). Their 36.9 ppg is on pace to be the highest per game total of the FBS era (2002-present)

UConn Sack Masters... The UConn defense comes into this weekend's game ranked third in the nation in sacking the quarterback (3.67 pg). The Huskies posted 7.0 sacks in the win at Boston College, their most in a game since posting 7.0 against Vanderbilt in 2011. UConn has 33 sacks on the season, averaging 3.67 per game with

linebacker Bryun Parham leading the way. Parham had a career-high three sacks against Delaware and posted 2.0 sacks at BC. He leads the team with 9.5 sacks and ranks third in total sacks (9.5) and fourth sacks per game (1.06). Parham is also the Huskies leading tackler with 80 tackles on the year, ranking 14th and 25th in tackles per game (8.9). He ranks eighth in tackles for loss, averaging 1.44 per game. He's also forced a fumble and recovered three this season. Parham had a career-best 15 tackles at Rice and has four games this season with double digit tackles.

Cam Fuels the Running Game... Running back Cam Edwards has three 100-yard rushing efforts this season and is among the top running backs in the national rankings. Edwards ranks 14th in the country in rushing yards (815) and 22nd in rush yards per game (90.6). He is 21st in rushing touchdowns (9) and 20th in total touchdowns (10). Four of his nine rushing touchdowns this season have been on runs of 30-yards or more including a career-long 73-yard touchdown in the season opener vs. CCSU.

Edwards Creeping Up the UConn Rushing Charts... Through nine games this season, Edwards has rushed for 815 yards on 144 carries and nine touchdowns. Edwards has his eyes set on a 1,000 yards rushing and would be the first UConn player to hit the century mark since the 2019 season when Kevin Mensah totalled 1,013 yards on 226 carries. Over his career, Edwards has piled up 2,265 yards on 414 carries with 21 rushing touchdowns in 32 games. He sits at ninth all-time at UConn on the career rushing list.

UConn in ESPN FPI... After last weekend's over UAB, the Huskies moved up a spot to 74 (-2.5) in the ESPN's College Football Power Index (FPI) this week. The Football Power Index (FPI) is a measure of team strength that is meant to be the best predictor of a team's performance going forward for the rest of the season. FPI represents how many points above or below average a team is. Projected results are based on 20,000 simulations of the rest of the season using FPI, results to date, and the remaining schedule. Ratings and projections update daily. FPI data from seasons prior to 2019 may not be complete.

Freeman Sets New School Mark... Kicker Chris Freeman hit a third-quarter 45-yard field goal at Rice to mark his 12th-straight make to set a new career-best mark and a new UConn school record. Freeman made 11-straight last season, tying the previous mark set by Dave Teggart in 2011. Freeman buried both of his field goal attempts at Buffalo including a season-long 44-yard make with :06 seconds left to lift UConn over the Bulls. It marked the first field goal to win a game in the closing seconds since the 2016 season when a Bobby Puyol 37-yard make with :11 seconds left led UConn over Maine at home, 24-21. Freeman ranks sixth in the NCAA in total points (86) and 11th in scoring (9.6). In his 21 games over the last two seasons with the Huskies, Freeman has made 35-of-43 field goals and made a pair of career-long 53-yarders in 2024. He has been perfect on PATs (90-90).

WR Skyler Bell Wins East-West Shrine Bowl Award... Skyler Bell was named the East-West Shrine Bowl Breakout Offensive Player of the Week" after his performance at Rice. Bell had a career high 158 receiving yards on eight catches with a touchdown, an 80-yard score on the first play of the game for the Huskies.

QB Joe Fagnano Wins New England Gold Helmet Award... Joe Fagnano won the New England Football Association Gold Helmet Award after his performance in the win at Boston College. The Gold Helmet Award is presented by the Jack Grinold/Eastern Massachusetts Chapter of the National Football Foundation. Fagnano threw for 362 yards and four touchdowns while also running for 25 yards and a score to lead the Huskies to a 38-23 win at New England rival Boston College. Fagnano completed 23-of-31 passes, finding eight different receivers. He had touchdown throws of 50, 43, 14, and 38 yards on the day. The 362 yards marked his highest total as a UConn Husky.

Fagnano a Two-Time Manning Award Star of the Week this Season... Quarterback Joe Fagnano has twice been recognized as a Manning Award "Stars of the

Week" this season. Fagnano first took home the honor after UConn's win over FIU where he threw for 355 yards and four scores. After his performance against BC where he threw for 362 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Huskies to their fourth-straight win, a 38-23 victory over the Eagles on the road he nabbed the award a second time.

LB Bryun Parham Named Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week... Husky linebacker Bryun Parham earned the Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week award after his stellar performance at Boston College. Parham tied his then career-high with 14 tackles, nine solo. The UConn sack leader, Parham came up with 2.0 of the Huskies seven sacks in the win. Parham is the first Husky to win the weekly honor since former linebacker Sio Moore won it in the 2010 season. This is the 22nd year that the Walter Camp Football Foundation will honor one offensive and one defensive player as its national Football Bowl Subdivision player of the week during the regular season. It is the nation's longest running Player of Week award.

Penalty Free... The Huskies went with out a penalty in the win over Buffalo. It marked just the third time in the FBS era a UConn team played a penalty-free game. The last time the Huskies went without a flag was their win over South Carolina in the Papa John's Bowl in 2010, and before that a 2005 win over Liberty. On the season, UConn ranks 24th in the country in fewest penalties per game (4.86) and 25th in total penalties (34), and 33rd in both penalty yards (317) and penalty yards per game (45.29).

Record Setting Day vs. CCSU... The Huskies piled up 638 total yards, 250 on the ground and 388 through the air, in a 59-13 over Central Connecticut, setting a new school record for total yards. The Huskies have eclipsed 600 total yards of offense five times in program history and last Saturday's mark breaks the mark of 624 set last fall vs. Merrimack. The 59 points scored tied for the 12th highest point total in school history.

Huskies in the NFL... The NFL season is underway with nine former Huskies represented in the league. Last year's draft pick, tackle Chase Lundt (2021-24) joins former UConn offensive lineman Ryan Van Denmark (2017-21) with the Buffalo Bills. Also on opening day rosters was defensive tackle Folorunso Fatukasi (2014-17) with the Houston Texans, defensive tackle Travis Jones (2018-21) with the Baltimore Ravens, offensive lineman Matt Peart (2016-19) with the Denver Broncos, and running back Nate Carter (2021-22) with the Atlanta Falcons. Former offensive linemen Christian Haynes (2018-23), Seattle Seahawks, and Valentin Senn (2021-24), Arizona Cardinals, open the year on the IR. Former defensive end Eric Watts (2019-23) is a member of the New York Jets practice squad.

Senior Bowl Top 300... Wide receiver Skyler Bell and running back Mel Brown have been named to the 2026 Senior Bowl Top 300 list. The 2026 Panini Senior Bowl will be played on Saturday, January 31, 2026, at 1:30 p.m. CT at South Alabama's Hancock Whitney Stadium in Mobile, Ala. The Senior Bowl scouting department, comprised entirely of former NFL scouts, evaluated over 2,000 prospects from all levels of college football to compile the Senior Bowl Top 300. A total of 86 schools are represented on this year's list. Bell and Brown are two of 19 players selected from the "Group of 5" schools. The participants in this year's game will be announced at the conclusion of the season.

Shrine Bowl 1000... The UConn Huskies placed three players on the East-West Shrine Bowl 1000 watchlist, which consists of the best 1,000 players throughout all of college football who are currently all-star game eligible for the 2026 East-West Shrine Bowl and the 2026 NFL Draft class. Receiver Skyler Bell and running backs Cam Edwards and Mel Brown have been selected to this year's list. The East-West Shrine Bowl will be held at Ford Center at The Star in Frisco, TX on January 27, 2026.

Preseason Watch Lists... UConn had five players earn spots on preseason watch lists for some of college football's biggest awards. R-Senior wide receiver Skyler Bell was one of 47 players nationally named to the 2025 Biletnikoff Award watchlist. R-junior Running back Cam Edwards was named a preseason candidate for the 2025 Doak Walker Award. The PwC SMU Athletic Forum annually presents the award to the nation's most outstanding college running back. Edwards is one of 103 running backs across the country named to this year's watch list. Senior center Wes Hoeh was named to the 2025 Rimington Trophy preseason watchlist. The Rimington Trophy is presented annually to the most outstanding center in NCAA Division I College Football. Mel Brown was named to the 2025 Jet Award Preseason watchlist. The Jet Award, named in honor of 1972 Heisman Trophy winner Johnny "the Jet" Rodgers, is presented annually to the top return specialist in college football. Finally, graduate place kicker Chris Freeman was one of 30 kickers nationally to be named to the 2024 Lou Groza Award watch list this summer.

TE Alex Honig a College Football "Freak"... R-Senior Alex Honig was named to the 2025 College Football Freaks List published by The Athletic's Bruce Feldman. Feldman and The Athletic annually put together the Freak List series, which chronicles the strongest, fastest and most physical players in college football. Honig came in at number 39 out of 101 college football players for 2025. At 6-7, 270 pounds with just 14 percent body fat. He's cleaned 395 pounds - the most UConn strength coach Tyson Brown's ever seen in his 16 years in the business. Honig, who has 11-inch hands, also benched 225 for 30 reps. He vertical jumped 36 inches and broad jumped 10-5.

The UConn Huskies kicked-off the 2025 season with a 59-13 win over in-state foe Central Connecticut in front of 37,594 on Saturday at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. The Huskies controlled the game offensively, setting a new school record with 638 total yards, including 388 passing yards and four touchdowns through the air.

The first quarter got off to a slow start for the Huskies as CCSU took an early lead after a bad snap on a UConn punt gave the Blue Devils the ball on the five-yard line. The drive culminated in a touchdown by Elijah Howard and a 7-0 lead at 12:54. The Huskies responded effectively scoring on four-straight drives starting with Joe Fagnano's 80-yard touchdown pass to Skyler Bell at 10:15, tying the game. Mel Brown's 49-yard rush set up another Fagnano-to-Bell connection for a 12-yard touchdown, giving UConn a 14-7 lead with 1:05 remaining in the quarter.

The second quarter began with a Cam Edwards 73-yard touchdown run at 11:24 and Fagnano added to the momentum with a 4-yard rushing touchdown and a 3-yard touchdown pass to Reymello Murphy put UConn up 35-10.

The Huskies made it 42-10 in the third quarter as a 30-yard pass from Fagnano to Juice Vereen, set up a 20-yard touchdown run by Victor Rosa at 12:33. The momentum continued with a 29-yard field goal by Chris Freeman, extending the lead to 45-13.

UConn went to their reserves in the fourth quarter and quarterback Nick Evers connected with Jackson Harper on a 19-yard touchdown pass at 13:02, increasing the score to 51-13. Evers completed a crucial 18-yard pass to Jackson Harper, and MJ Flowers added a 16-yard rushing touchdown at 2:38, finalizing the scoring at 59-13.

Edwards finished with 115 rushing yards on six attempts and one touchdown. Fagnano led the passing game, completing 18 of 25 passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns, while also contributing a rushing touchdown. Bell was a top target, catching four passes for 135 yards and two touchdowns. On defense, Parham led with seven tackles, including one sack.

Elijah Howard led Central's offense with 59 rushing yards on 11 carries, including one touchdown. Brady Olson contributed from the quarterback position, completing 8 of 19 passes for 118 yards and adding 20 rushing yards on three attempts. David Pardo was the top receiver with two catches for 64 yards. On defense, Eric Jackson stood out with seven tackles, while Christopher Jean added six tackles to the effort.

With the win, the Huskies improved to 1-0 overall. The Huskies are on the road next weekend as they head to Syracuse for a 12 noon match-up on ESPN+.

Game Notes:

- Skyler Bell's 80-yard touchdown was the longest reception and TD of his career. Bell's second TD catch marked his 7th TD as a Husky. It was Bell's sixth career 100-yard game.
- Cam Edwards' 73-yard touchdown run was the longest run and TD of his career. Edwards scored his 16th career touchdown and recorded his 5th career 100-yard game.
- Victor Rosa scored his first touchdown since the second game of the 2024 season.
- Reymello Murphy, MJ Flowers and Jackson Harper scored their first UConn touchdowns. For Harper, it was his first career TD catch.
- Saturday's attendance was the largest crowd at a UConn home game since a 2013 match-up against South Florida. It was the 5th largest crowd in a UConn home opener at Rentschler Field.

The UConn Huskies lost an 27-20 overtime decision to the Syracuse Orange Saturday afternoon at the JMA Wireless Dome in front of 39,391.

UConn quarterback Joe Fagnano completed 24 of 43 passes for 259 yards, while wideout Skyler Bell set a new career-high with 11 receptions totaling 105 yards. Eight of Bell's 11 catches came in the second half.

On the ground, Mel Brown provided a spark with 72 rushing yards on five carries, including a touchdown. Cam Edwards carried it 21 times for 75 yards in the loss. Defensively, D'Mon Brinson had seven total tackles and an interception. Linebacker Oumar Diomande led the team with nine tackles including a sack.

UConn's defense twice stopped the Orange on downs inside their own 10-yard line in the first half, and used a strong effort all half to build a 14-3 lead. The Huskies struck first on a trick play in the second quarter as wideout John Neider took a pass behind the line of scrimmage then found tight end Alex Honig all alone in the end zone for a 7-0 second quarter lead.

After a Syracuse field goal, UConn made it 14-3 as Brown burst off right tackle and scampered 45 yards for a score late in the second.

At the start of the third quarter, UConn capitalized on an early drive beginning at their own 10-yard line. Fagnano led the offense efficiently, completing a key 34-yard pass to Cam Edwards on a third down, ultimately setting up a 35-yard field goal by Chris Freeman at 9:55, extending UConn's lead to 17-6.

Syracuse's Angeli led a pair of fourth quarter scoring drives of 90 yards and 80 yards with just over seven minutes left to take a 20-17 lead. UConn move the ball down the field in the last 1:18 and got a Chris Freeman 41 yard field goal to knot the game back up at 20-20 and send it to overtime.

In overtime, quarterback Angeli threw a 10-yard pass to Will Nixon, followed by a 7-yard completion to Johntay Cook II, setting up the decisive play. On third down, Angeli connected with Ross-Simmons for a 6-yard touchdown pass, giving SU a 27-20 lead after Woody's successful extra point. UConn's subsequent drive was thwarted by incomplete passes from Fagnano and a crucial pass breakup by Antoine Deslauriers on fourth down, sealing SU's win. This marked the first overtime game for UConn since a triple OT win at Louisville in 2012.

Syracuse's offensive effort was spearheaded by quarterback Steve Angeli, who completed 33 of 53 passes for 417 yards and two touchdowns, despite throwing one interception. Yasin Willis contributed on the ground with 48 rushing yards on 11 attempts, including a touchdown. Justus Ross-Simmons was a key target, catching five passes for 83 yards and two touchdowns.

The University of Delaware edged out UConn in overtime, prevailing 44-41 at Delaware Stadium in front of 17,862. Both teams combined for over 1,000 yards of total offense on the day.

Running back Cam Edwards led the Huskies' offense with 116 rushing yards on 23 carries and scored two touchdowns. Joe Fagnano completed 28 of 38 passes for 346 yards, a career-high as a Husky, and added two touchdowns, bolstering the team's aerial attack. On defense, Bryun Parham recorded 10 tackles and sacked the quarterback three times, a new career-high.

In the first quarter, the Blue Hens opened the scoring with a methodical drive, culminating in a 3-yard touchdown run by Nick Minicucci at 11:13, followed by Nate Reed's successful extra point. UConn responded with a 75-yard drive, highlighted by a 51-yard touchdown run from Edwards at 8:48, leveling the score after Chris Freeman's PAT. However, Delaware quickly regained the lead with a 70-yard touchdown rush by Jo Silver at 8:06, again capitalized with a Reed extra point, making it 14-7. The Huskies narrowed the gap with a 28-yard field goal by Freeman at 4:48, ending the quarter with Delaware ahead 14-10.

The second quarter began with UD extending their lead to 21-10, as Minicucci's 5-yard touchdown run capped a 12-play, 79-yard drive. The Huskies quickly responded, with Victor Rosa rushing for a 31-yard touchdown at 10:08, narrowing the deficit to 21-17. UConn then took the lead with 7:17 remaining when Edwards rushed for a 2-yard touchdown, making it 24-21. Delaware answered back with a significant 68-yard touchdown pass from Minicucci to Kyre Duplessis at 5:55, regaining the lead at 28-24.

The Huskies capitalized on their first drive of the second half, with a series of penalties against Delaware, ultimately leading to a 10-yard touchdown pass from Fagnano to Reymello Murphy, putting UConn ahead 31-28 with 5:05 left in the period. Delaware responded, culminating in an 18-yard touchdown run by Silver as time expired in the quarter, giving Delaware a 35-31 lead.

In the fourth quarter, UConn's Fagnano's hit a critical 27-yard completion to Murphy to set up a one-yard touchdown pass to Alex Honig at 9:54, giving UConn a 38-35 advantage. Delaware got a late stop on fourth down with just over two minutes to go and as time expired, Delaware's Reed successfully kicked a 43-yard field goal, tying the game at 38-38 and sending the game to OT.

In overtime, UConn took the ball first with Edwards rushing for a 4-yard gain, followed by a 19-yard pass from Fagnano to Louis Hansen, advancing to Delaware's two-yard line. However, after a failed rush and an incomplete pass, Fagnano was sacked for a 4-yard loss by Jack Hall and Ethan Saunders, forcing UConn to settle for a 24-yard field goal by Freeman. Delaware responded effectively, with Silver rushing for 9 yards and Minicucci then sealed the game with a 13-yard touchdown run, propelling Delaware to a 44-41 victory.

Murphy had three catches for 51 yards and a score while Skyler Bell hauled in seven for 92 yards.

UD quarterback Minicucci led UD, completing 23 of 34 passes for 265 yards and one touchdown. Minicucci was also a dual threat, rushing 18 times for 20 yards and securing three rushing touchdowns. Wide receiver Duplessis was a key target, capturing nine receptions for 161 yards and a touchdown. Running back Silver carried the ball 15 times for 179 yards and two touchdowns. On the defensive side, KT Seay anchored the unit with 13 total tackles.

The UConn Huskies held off Ball State University for a 31-25 victory at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field in front of 25,025 fans Saturday afternoon.

Running back Cam Edwards led UConn's offense with a career-high 194 rushing yards on 24 carries, scoring two touchdowns. Wideout Skyler Bell added a career-best 14 receptions for 113 yards and a touchdown. His 14 catches was one shy of the UConn school record.

On defense, the Huskies recorded four sacks or more in their third-straight game with safety Malachi McLean making nine tackles and one sack.

Quarterback Joe Fagnano completed 20 of 30 passes for 181 yards, including a touchdown in the win as the Husky offense went without a turnover for the fourth-straight game to start the season.

In the first quarter, opened the scoring with a 30-yard field goal by Chris Freeman at 9:48, giving them an early 3-0 lead over the Cardinals. After a defensive stand, UConn capitalized on a short field, with Fagnano connecting with Bell for a touchdown pass from two-yards out at the 2:30 mark, extending their advantage to 10-0.

At the start of the second quarter, the Cardinals quickly narrowed the gap with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Qian Magwood to quarterback Kiae Kelly at 14:53 on a trick play, making the score 10-7. Neither team could crack the scoreboard the rest of the first half.

UConn capitalized on their first possession of the second half, mounting a 14 play drive for a touchdown. Fagnano connected on a crucial 33-yard pass to Shamar Porter, setting up a 1-yard touchdown run by Terrence Smith with 6:04 remaining for a 17-7 lead. Ball State responded with a solid drive, highlighted by Eric Weatherly's 22-yard run and a 22-yard pass from Kelly to Hamilton, ultimately leading to a Holmer 23-yard field goal with 37 seconds left, narrowing the score to 17-10.

In the fourth quarter, UConn opened with a strong offensive drive, culminating in a 32-yard touchdown run by Edwards at 10:24, extending their lead to 24-10. Ball State quickly responded, with Qua Ashley scoring on a 1-yard rush at 3:28, narrowing the gap to 24-17. UConn's Edwards broke away for a dramatic 67-yard touchdown run with 1:50 left, pushing the lead to 31-17. Ball State's final push saw Kelly connect with Dahya Patel for an 11-yard touchdown with just 9 seconds remaining, but the Huskies held on for a 31-25 victory.

For Edwards, it was his second-straight game finding the endzone twice for the Huskies. Bell recorded his third 100-yard game of the season and his second game with 10-plus catches.

Kelly led the Cardinals with 209 passing yards and one touchdown on 17-of-24 completions, adding 27 rushing yards on 12 attempts. Ashley contributed significantly to the ground game with 86 rushing yards and a touchdown on 18 carries, while also catching three passes for 14 yards. Hamilton was a key target through the air, securing seven receptions for 61 yards. Defensively, Alfred Chea topped the team with eight total tackles.

The Huskies return to action next Saturday, September 27 when they travel to the University at Buffalo for a 3:30 pm match-up on ESPN+.

Game Notes:

- The Huskies earned their first win over Ball State in the all-time series, snapping an 0-4 mark that dates back to the 2000 season.

- UConn improved to 22-11 all-time against the Mid-American Conference with a match-up at Buffalo on deck next weekend.

- Bell recorded his eighth career 100-yard receiving day, and his seventh as a Husky.

- Edwards had his seventh career 100-yard rushing day and third in four games this season. His 194 yards rushing was the most by a UConn running back since the 2010 season when Jordan Todman had 222 yards against Pitt. It was the highest rushing total by a Husky since quarterback David Pindell had 197 yards rushing against USF in 2018.

- R-Freshman Terrence Smith recorded his first career touchdown in the win.

UConn's Chris Freeman buried a 44-yard field goal with six seconds left to give the Huskies a 20-17 victory over the University at Buffalo at UB Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Running back Cam Edwards scored a touchdown while rushing for 57 yards on 15 carries for the Huskies. Skyler Bell caught six receptions for 54 yards, including one touchdown. Joe Fagnano completed 19 of 31 passes for 155 yards and added a passing touchdown. Oumar Diomande led the defense with 10 tackles.

UConn took the lead over UB with a 25-yard touchdown pass from Fagnano to Bell at 8:36 in the second quarter. The Bulls quickly responded on their ensuing drive with a 63-yard touchdown run by Lamar Sperling at 6:21, leveling the score at 7-7 going into halftime.

The Huskies extended their lead with a scoring drive to open the third quarter, capped by an 8-yard touchdown run from Edwards at 11:16 to make it 14-7. Buffalo responded with a 39-yard field goal by Jack Howes at 4:58, narrowing the gap to 14-10. UConn's Freeman then added a 40-yard field goal of his own with 1:31 remaining, bringing the score to 17-10 to end the quarter.

Buffalo mounted a crucial drive in the waning minutes of the fourth quarter, with Gunnar Gray finding AJ Henderson for a 5-yard touchdown pass on fourth down with 59 seconds left, tying the score at 17-17. Fagnano quickly moved UConn into range on a 10-play drive, setting up the 44-yard chance. Freeman delivered, securing the win with a 44-yard field goal, clinching a 20-17 victory for the Huskies.

Buffalo's offense was bolstered by the efforts of Henderson, who carried the ball 24 times for 63 yards and added a receiving touchdown on three catches for 18 yards. Junior running back Lamar Sperling made a significant impact with 106 rushing yards on just nine carries, finding the end zone once. Senior quarterback Gunnar Gray completed 17 of 29 passes for 125 yards, throwing one touchdown without an interception.

On defense, senior linebacker Red Murdock was a standout, leading the team with nine total tackles and forcing a fumble. Defensive back Solomon Brown contributed solidly with six tackles, adding to the defensive effort.

The Huskies are back at home in Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field next Saturday, October 4 when the FIU Panthers come to town. Kick-off is scheduled for 3:30 pm on CBS Sports Network.

Game Notes:

The Huskies extend their lead to 18-5 in the all-time series with Buffalo. First win at UB Stadium since 2011. UConn is now 2-0 against the Mid-American Conference this season and improve to 23-11 all-time against the league.

Huskies first scoring drive covered 93 yards and ended with Bell's 4th touchdown catch of the season. It marked the longest scoring drive of the season.

Cam Edwards third quarter touchdown run was his sixth of the season and his third-straight game with a touchdown. He has found the end zone in four of five games this season.

Running back Oliver Lundberg Coleman finished with career highs in carries, 5, and yards, 31, in the win.

Quarterback Joe Fagnano had the longest run of his career, a 38-yard jaunt in the third quarter. He finished with 64 yards on six carries, his highest total as a Husky.

Kicker Chris Freeman connected on a pair of field goals to make it seven-straight makes dating back to the Syracuse game.

The UConn Huskies picked-up their third-straight win thanks to a decisive 51-10 victory over FIU Saturday afternoon in front of 27,310 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field.

UConn's defense turned in their best outing of the season, intercepting three passes, forcing a pair of fumbles and recording five sacks. Linebacker Amir Renwick led the way with 10 tackles, tying a career-high, a sack and an interception. Fellow linebacker Bryun Parham made nine tackles, had 1.5 sacks and forced two fumbles in the win.

Quarterback Joe Fagnano led the offensive charge for the Huskies, completing 22 of 28 passes for 355 yards and four touchdowns. Skyler Bell caught six passes for 63 yards and two touchdowns while Reymello Murphy hauled in three balls including a 61 yard touchdown. On the ground, Cam Edwards rushed for 80 yards on 12 carries and found the end zone once.

UConn established an early lead over the Panthers in the first quarter, scoring twice to secure a 14-0 advantage. The Huskies scored on their first drive of the game, a 69-yard drive culminating in a Fagnano 18-yard touchdown pass to Bell at the 7:38 mark. Later in the quarter, Edwards expanded UConn's lead with a 1-yard rushing touchdown, finishing off a 65-yard drive with 2:08 remaining.

The second quarter saw UConn extend their lead over the Panthers with key plays on both sides of the ball. Early in the period, the Huskies capitalized on a fumble recovery by Parham with a 43-yard field goal from Chris Freeman at 10:55, bringing the score to 17-0. FIU responded with a 26-yard field goal by Noah Grant at 6:05, after a promising drive was halted by Renwick's sack on Keyone Jenkins. UConn's Fagnano then connected with Reymello Murphy for a 61-yard touchdown pass at 00:55. A interception by Cam Chadwick was followed by Freeman's 36-yard field goal at 00:21, closing the half with a 27-3 lead.

The second half started much like the game for UConn, as Fagnano completed a 65-yard touchdown pass to Victor Rosa at 13:22 on the opening drive to push the score to 34-3. UConn continued to capitalize, with Fagnano finding Bell for an 8-yard touchdown at 2:56, making it 44-3 with 2:56 left in the third.

Parham set the tone for UConn at the start of the fourth quarter by sacking FIU's Joe Pesansky for a 13-yard loss. The momentum continued as Renwick intercepted a pass from Pesansky, returning it to the FIU 2-yard line, setting the stage for Oliver Lundberg Coleman's first career touchdown, a 1-yard run at 9:48 for a 51-3 lead.

Kejon Owens led the Panthers' offense with 67 rushing yards on 16 carries, scoring the team's only rushing touchdown. Quarterback Keyone Jenkins completed 15 of 24 passes for 74 yards but was intercepted once. On the defensive side, Keegan Davis was a standout performer, recording two sacks and forcing a fumble among his five total tackles.

GAME NOTES:

UConn is now 2-1 all-time against FIU and improve to 2-5 all-time against teams from Conference-USA

Saturday's win marks the 100th career head coaching victory for Jim Mora. Mora has 22 wins at UConn and 68 NCAA wins over his 10 seasons total. He posted 32 wins in his NFL career with the Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks

QB Joe Fagnano finished with 355 yards passing, his highest career total in a Husky uniform.

WR Skyler Bell finished with a pair of touchdown catches giving him six TDs on the year. It was his third-straight game with a TD catch. He has three career multi-score games and two this season.

RB Cam Edwards first quarter touchdown run is his seventh TD this season and his fourth-straight game finding the endzone.

RB Victor Rosa's 65-yard catch and run for a touchdown marked the longest reception of his career.

Kicker Chris Freeman had three field goal makes and has run his streak to 10-straight makes dating back to the Central Connecticut game in week one.

The Huskies scored 51 points in the win. It was the second time this season UConn hit the 50-point mark at home and the third time in the last two seasons.

The UConn Huskies took down New England rival Boston College, 38-23 at Alumni Stadium in front of 38,717, with Joe Fagnano passing for four touchdowns and 362 yards to lead the Huskies to their fourth-straight win.

Joe Fagnano completed 23 of 31 passes for 362 yards and four touchdowns, adding a rushing touchdown on 25 yards from six rushes. Fagnano eclipsed his UConn career high for the second-straight week.

UConn's Skyler Bell led the receiving corps with ten receptions for 125 yards and one touchdown. Tight end Juice Vereen chipped in with four catches totaling 82 yards and two touchdowns. On defense, Bryun Parham recorded 14 tackles and two sacks, while Devin Pringle added seven tackles and one sack.

After an opening BC drive resulted in a field goal, UConn responded quickly with Joe Fagnano completing a 50-yard touchdown pass to Juice Vereen at 6:06. Boston College managed to close the quarter with another field goal by Lombardo from 22 yards out, narrowing the margin to 7-6 with 35 seconds remaining.

In the second quarter, Fagnano's 2-yard touchdown run at 11:41 extended the Huskies' lead to 14-6. BC responded again with a 9-yard touchdown pass from Grayson James to Kaelan Chudzinski, narrowing the margin to 14-13 after a successful PAT by Luca Lombardo. UConn's Chris Freeman kicked a 40-yard field goal for UConn, his 11th-straight make, putting them ahead 17-13. As the quarter neared its conclusion, Reed Harris caught a 39-yard touchdown pass from James, giving the Eagles a 20-17 lead in the closing minutes.

The second half was all UConn, outscoring the Eagles 21-3. UConn used a methodical drive to open the third, concluding in a 43-yard touchdown pass from Joe Fagnano to John Neider at 11:51, putting them ahead 24-20 and they never looked back. The Huskies made it 31-20 at the end of the quarter with a 14-yard touchdown reception by Juice Vereen.

In the fourth quarter, BC's Lombardo capped a drive with his third field goal of the day, a successful 25-yard field goal at 10:40, narrowing the gap to 31-23. The Huskies responded with Fagnano connecting with Bell on a 38-yard touchdown pass at 5:04, extending their lead to 38-23. Defensive efforts from the Huskies, including sacks by Bryun Parham and Oumar Diomande, stifled the Eagles' subsequent attempts, sealing the win.

Game Notes:

The Huskies earn their second win against BC in the all-time series between the two schools and their first-ever win on the road against the Eagles.

The win marks the program's first road win over a power conference program since a win at Louisville and at Maryland during the 2024 season. The Huskies improved to 9-29 against teams from the ACC all-time. It was their second win against an ACC opponent in Boston over the last two seasons, including a win over North Carolina in last year's Fenway Bowl.

WR Skyler Bell had his fourth 100-yard receiving effort this season and his third game with 10+ catches.

TE Juice Vereen caught a pair of touchdowns in the win, the first touchdowns of his career. His 82 yards was a career-high.

Kicker Chris Freeman hit a 40-yard field goal in the second quarter, marking his 11th-straight make that dates back to the season-opening win over CCSU. That ties the school record that Freeman shares with former Husky Dave Teggart (2011).

WR John Neider hauled in a 43-yard touchdown on UConn's opening drive of the second half to mark his first career touchdown. His 69 yards marks a new career-high for the r-sophomore.

LB Bryun Parham finished with 14 tackles, his high as a Husky and tying his all-time career-high (14 for San Jose State vs. Utah State). The Huskies finished with a season-high seven sacks in the win, 2.0 by Parham.

The UConn Huskies suffered their third defeat in overtime this season, falling on the road at Rice, 37-34, in double overtime in front of 21,122 at Rice Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The Huskies saw their four-game win streak come to an end and are 5-3 on the season with all three losses coming on the road in overtime.

UConn quarterback Joe Fagnano completed 32 of 48 passes for 344 yards and threw three touchdown passes in the loss. Cam Edwards contributed with 59 rushing yards on 16 carries, an overtime touchdown and added a touchdown reception with 24 receiving yards on three catches.

Wideout Skyler Bell led the receiving corps with eight receptions for a career-high 158 yards, including a touchdown. On defense, Bryun Parham recorded a career-high 15 tackles to anchor the team.

In overtime, Rice had the ball first and Quinton Jackson's 6-yard touchdown run put Rice ahead 31-24 after Enock Gota's extra point. UConn responded swiftly as Cam Edwards scored a 5-yard rushing touchdown, tying the score at 31-31. UConn's Freeman later nailed a 41-yard field goal, giving UConn a 34-31 lead but Rice's Jackson answered with a decisive 23-yard touchdown run, securing a 37-34 victory for Rice.

The Huskies opened the game scoring on their very first play from scrimmage, a Fagnano to Bell 80-yard catch and run for six. In a dynamic second quarter, the Owls took their first lead as Jackson broke free for a 73-yard touchdown run at the 11:08 mark, to make it 10-7.

The Huskies responded with a drive, culminating in a 12-yard touchdown reception by Edwards from Fagnano, putting UConn ahead 14-10 after Chris Freeman's successful PAT. The Owls quickly countered with a 75-yard touchdown pass from Chase Jenkins to Jackson, reclaiming a 17-14 lead. UConn had the final word before halftime, as Juice Vereen caught a 34-yard touchdown pass from Fagnano with just 49 seconds left, and Freeman's extra point set the halftime score at 21-17 in favor of UConn.

In the third quarter, UConn maintained a lead over Rice with the only points of the quarter, a 45-yard field goal by Chris Freeman at 6:06. In the fourth quarter, Rice's D'Andre Hardemann fueled their scoring drive with a 17-yard rush to the UConn 38-yard line, setting the stage as Hardemann later capped the drive with a 10-yard touchdown run, leveling the score at 24-24 at 11:46. UConn's ensuing possession saw Fagnano lead the Huskies in to scoring position, completing a 17-yard pass to Oliver Lundberg Coleman, but the drive stalled and Freeman's 46-yard field goal attempt missed after the kicker slipped on the wet turf. As time wound down, neither team could break the deadlock, resulting in a final score of 24-24.

Quinton Jackson led the offensive charge for Rice, rushing 21 times for 168 yards and three touchdowns. He also contributed in the passing game with three receptions for 80 yards and a receiving touchdown. Chase Jenkins was efficient through the air, completing 17 of 22 passes for 191 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing 17 times for 57 yards.

Game Notes:

The Huskies are now 2-1 all-time against Rice and are 5-4 against teams from the American Athletic Conference since the Huskies left the conference in 2020.

UConn scored on their first play from scrimmage, a Joe Fagnano to Syler Bell 80-yard hook-up. The last time UConn scored on their first play of the game was last season at UMass, a Fagnano to tight end Louis Hansen 55-yard score.

For Bell, it matches his career-long of 80 yards for a catch, set in the season opener this year against Central Connecticut. It is Bell's eighth TD this season and the fifth-straight game catching a touchdown.

Bell hit the 100-yard mark for the fifth time this season and the ninth time in his career at UConn.

RB Cam Edwards caught his first touchdown of the season and scored on the ground as well, giving him nine total TDs on the year.

QB Joe Fagnano finished the game without an interception, extending his streak to 9-straight games without a pick dating back to last season. His three touchdown throws on Saturday marks his fourth game this season with three-plus TD throws. His 344 yards makes it three-straight games and four this season going over 300-plus yards passing.

PK Chris Freeman's third quarter 45-yard field goal make was his 12th-straight make, setting a new UConn school record.

The UConn Huskies posted a 38-19 victory over UAB on Saturday afternoon in front of 23,170 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field to become bowl eligible thanks to their sixth win on the season.

UConn, bowl eligible for the second-straight year and third time in four seasons under head coach Jim Mora, improved to 6-3 on the year.

Wide receiver Skyler Bell recorded a standout performance with eight receptions for 149 yards and three touchdowns. Bell tied the school mark for touchdown catches in a season (11) with his three scoring grabs on Saturday.

Quarterback Joe Fagnano completed 23 of 30 passes for 267 yards and threw four touchdowns. Fagnano has eclipsed the 10,000 yards passing mark in his career between UConn and his time at Maine.

On defense, corner Cam Chadwick intercepted three passes and registered seven tackles, including one sack. His three picks ties the school record.

The Huskies never trailed on Saturday and built a 24-0 lead into halftime. After stalling on on their first drive, Fagnano took the team down the field on an 83-yard drive and connected with Bell for a 26-yard touchdown pass at 1:04, giving UConn a 7-0 lead.

UConn extended their lead in the second quarter, starting with a Cam Edwards' 1-yard touchdown run at 10:45, making it 14-0. An interception by Chadwick at the UAB 37 set up a UConn drive that concluded with a 50-yard field goal by Freeman at 8:44, his longest of the season. The Huskies continued their dominance as Fagnano connected with Bell for a nine-yard touchdown pass at 3:56, to head to the locker room up 24-0.

UConn made it 31-0 in the third quarter as Fagnano connected with Juice Vereen for a six-yard touchdown pass at 8:02. The Blazers responded quickly with a Ryder Burton 68-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Hawkins Jr. at 7:18, for their first points of the day. UConn continued to dominate offensively, as Fagnano found Bell for a 39-yard touchdown pass at 5:18, to push the score to 38-6. UAB would tack on a pair of fourth quarter scores to produce the 38-19 final.

UConn back Cam Edwards led the ground game with 15 carries for 62 yards and a score. The UConn defense created three turnovers on the day and sacked the quarterback five times. Linebacker Oumar Diomande finished with a career-high 14 tackles and a sack. Defensive lineman Antonio Harris Jr. had a pair of sacks in the win.

The Huskies stay at home and will take on the Duke Blue Devils next Saturday, November 8 at 3:30 pm at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field.

Game Notes:

UConn is 2-0 all-time against UAB and is now 6-4 against teams from the American Athletic Conference since leaving the league in 2020.

The Huskies are 4-0 at home this season and are averaging 44.8 points per game on their home turf. UConn is 9-1 over the last two seasons at The Rent.

Skyler Bell hit the 100-yards receiving mark for the third-straight game and sixth time this season. It was his 10th 100-yard game at UConn. He has caught a touchdown in six-straight games and has three games this season with two or more scores.

His 11 touchdowns this season ties the school record held by Carl Bond in 1998. Bell has the most by a Husky in the FBS era. His 16 career TD grabs at UConn is now tied for fifth in the record book.

TE Juice Vereen has caught a touchdown in three-straight games and has four TDs in his last three.

QB Joe Fagnano has thrown for three or more touchdowns in three-straight games. He ran his streak to 10-straight games dating back to last season without an interception. His 42 career touchdowns at UConn is second only to Dan Orlovsky in the FBS era and fourth on the all-time list.
