STORYLINES

- This is Buffalo's final non-conference game.
- This is the 23rd meeting between the programs and the 12th since both programs joined the FBS ranks. UConn has won nine of the 11 FBS meetings.
- This is UConn's first trip to UB Stadium since 2013.
- The Bulls are looking for their first win over UConn since defeating the Huskies, 41-12, at UB Stadium in 2013.
- Quarterback **Ta'Quan Roberson** and wide receiver **Jasaiah Gathings** both previously played at UConn. Roberson played for the Huskies in 2022 and 2023, including making 10 starts in 2023. Gathings had 32 catches for 307 yards and three touchdowns in 2024 - his lone season at UConn.
- Buffalo's 16 sacks on the season are tied for tops in the country.
- The Bulls are averaging nine tackles for loss over the last three games.
- Since allowing two sacks in the opener at Minnesota, the Bulls have only allowed one sack since. Their three sacks allowed are the fewest in the Mid-American Conference and rank 17th nationally.
- **Al-Jay Henderson** has scored a rushing touchdown in three straight games.
- The Bulls have forced at least one turnover in all four games this season.

For the past 10 seasons, the number 41 jersey has been worn by a different player each game to honor the legacy of former Bull Solomon Jackson who passed away in 2016.

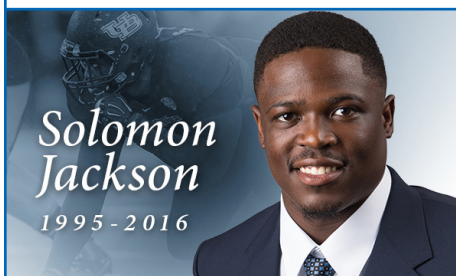

This is the eighth season the coaching staff will rotate #41 on a weekly basis. It is announced the night before each game.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

Bulls Host UConn in Final Non-Conference Game on Saturday

The University at Buffalo football team will close out non-conference play by hosting UConn on Saturday afternoon at UB Stadium.

Buffalo is 2-2 on the season and is coming off a 21-17 loss to Troy last Saturday. The Bulls were led by linebacker **Red Murdock** who had 12 tackles, a sack, 2.5 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles in the game.

UConn is 2-2 on the season and is coming off a 31-25 win over Ball State last Saturday. The Huskies are led by running back Cam Edwards who has rushed for 500 yards and a five touchdowns on the season.

The Huskies lead the all-time series 17-4. UConn won the last meeting, 47-3, at Pratt & Whitney Stadium last season.

Forcing the Issue

Red Murdock had two forced fumbles against Troy to bring his career total to 13. He is currently tied for eighth in NCAA history in career forced fumbles. He is three shy of the all-time NCAA record of 16 career forced fumbles held by former UB great Khalil Mack.

Sack Lunch

The Bulls had a season-high seven sacks against Troy last week. It was the most sacks in a game for UB since posting a program-record 11 sacks at Akron in 2021.

With 16 sacks on the season, the Bulls are tied with Maryland, Oklahoma and USC for the most in the nation.

They are getting contributions from several players. **Kobe Stewart** leads the team with 2.5 sacks, **Red Murdock**, **Dion Crawford**, **SaVeon Brown** and **Junior Poyser** each have two.

Buffalo also leads the MAC and ranks 21st nationally with 30 tackles for loss. They have averaged nine TFLs over the last three games.

Al-Jay All Day

Not only is running back **Al-Jay Henderson** Buffalo's leading rusher, but he is second on the team with 13 receptions through four games. He had a career-best eight receptions against Kent State in the MAC opener. It was the most receptions in a game by a running back since Mike Washington had eight catches against Akron in 2022.

Henderson leads the team in all purpose yards, averaging 97.2 yards per

game.

Murdock Named to Allstate AFCA Good Works Team

Linebacker **Red Murdock** is one of 11 FBS players named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, recognizing college football players from across the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) who exemplify community service, academic excellence and athletic achievement.

An All-MAC First Team selection, Murdock has been as impressive off the field as he has been on it. Along with volunteering at numerous community service events, he is the founder and director of the Virginia Homework Helpers branch - a free K-12 tutoring program for students back in his home state of Virginia. He founded this organization after seeing many of his peers struggle in school with no extra help resulting in getting in trouble outside of school or dropping out. He hopes this helps young men and women finish their education under the premise of it being a potential escape from the vicious cycle of becoming a product of high-risk environments.

He is just the second UB player named to the team, joining former wide receiver Fred Lee who earned the honor in 2013.

Let it Snow

Wide receiver **Victor Snow** has picked up where he left off last season. Through four games, Snow has 16 catches for 206 yards and three touchdowns. He had a touchdown catch in each of the first three games of the season to extend his regular season streak to six straight games dating back to last season. His streak was snapped in week four against Troy. He is averaging 15.3 yards per reception.

As a punt returner, Snow ranks second in the MAC with a 10.9 average on nine punt returns.

The Webster, NY native led the Bulls in receiving a season ago with 55 catches for 651 yards and six touchdowns en route to earning All-MAC Third Team honors.

New Dynamic Duo

Last season linebackers Shaun Dolac and **Red Murdock** ranked first and second in the nation in tackles. With the departure of Dolac to graduation, junior linebacker **Dion Crawford** is looking to

Through the first four games, it looks like the Bulls are in good shape. Murdock and Crawford rank first and second in the MAC in tackles, respectively. Murdock has 44 tackles and Crawford has 34.

Roberson Settling In

Quarterback **Ta'Quan Roberson** had the best game of his early UB career to help the Bulls beat Kent State in the MAC opener last week. Roberson finished 28-for-40 for 318 yards and three touchdowns, including the game-winning TD with just over one minute to play.

It was the most passing yards by a UB quarterback since Kyle Vantrease threw for 365 yards against Ball State in the 2020 MAC Championship game. It was the most passing yards on the road by a UB quarterback since Tyree Jackson threw for 350 yards at Ball State in 2017.

Roberson transferred to UB after spending last season at Kansas State. He saw action in six games and went 3-for-7 for 18 yards and added a 7-yard rush.

The New Jersey native spent the previous two seasons at UConn where he started 10 games in 2023. He threw for 2,075 yards and 12 touchdowns and added 120 yards on the ground and two scores. Roberson began his career at Penn State as a reserve quarterback for three seasons. In 2021, he played in four games and threw for 85 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 24 yards.

Gimme That!

The Bulls created at least one turnover in each of the first four games of the season.

Linebacker **Mitchell Gonser** had an interception in the opener at Minnesota. Edge **Kobe Stewart** had a fumble recovery against Saint Francis, cornerback **Keontez Bradley** had a fumble recovery at Kent State and linebacker **Red Murdock** had a fumble recovery and safety **Jalen McNair** had an interception against Troy.

Block Party

The Bulls have blocked a punt in two of the last three games. **Connor Henderson** had a block against Saint Francis and **Miles Greer** had a block at Kent State.

It marked the first time since the 2012 season Buffalo has blocked a punt in consecutive games. Adam Reddon had a blocked punt against UMass and Bowling Green that season.

New York Nik

Nik McMillan was having a promising start to the 2024 campaign before suffering a season-ending injury in week two. Back healthy, McMillan has returned to form and is currently third on the team in receptions with 13.

He had the best game of his career at Kent State last week with seven receptions for 117 yards and a touchdown - all career highs.

Running Down a Dream

Buffalo rushed for 370 yards in its victory over Saint Francis. It was the most rushing yards by a UB team since the Bulls rushed for 515 yards against Kent State in 2020.

Al-Jay Henderson led the way with 98 yards and two touchdowns and **Ta'Quan Roberson** rushed for 88 yards and two scores. Roberson scored on a 40-yard touchdown run in the game, the longest TD run by a UB quarterback since Tyree Jackson scored on a 75-yard run at Kent State in 2017.

All six running backs who saw action in the game rushed for at least 30 yards - **James McNeil, Jr.** (64), **Lamar Sperling** (48), **Messiah Burch** (39), **Terrance Shelton** (33).

Code Red

Linebacker **Red Murdock** is coming off one of the most productive seasons in program history. The All-MAC First Team selection ranked second in the nation with 156 tackles which was third in program history for a single season. He added 16.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and an interception. His seven forced fumbles on the year were a school record and ranked first in the nation.

With 11 career forced fumbles, Murdock is five shy of the NCAA record of 16 career forced fumbles held by former Bull Khalil Mack.

Murdock was named a preseason fourth-team All-American by Athlon Sports and ranks 90th on the list of Top 100 players in college football by ESPN.

This season, Murdock leads the MAC

in tackles, averaging 10.7 per game.

OK, Al-Jay

Al-Jay Henderson is coming off a career-best 1,000-yard season for the Bulls. He became the 11th different player to rush for 1,000 yards in a season in program history. His 1,078 rushing yards in 2024 ranks 10th in program history for a single season.

He got stronger down the stretch of the 2024 campaign, averaging 124.6 yards over the final five games of the season.

Over his career, he is averaging 5.1 yards per carry which ranks fifth in program history.

Portal Friendly

The Bulls only lost one starter to the transfer portal following last season. Kicker Upton Bellenfant transferred to Texas Tech. In total, only four players who appeared on the depth chart for the 2024 Bahamas Bowl entered the transfer portal.

New Faces

Despite only losing a few players to the transfer portal, it didn't stop the UB coaching staff from dipping into the portal to strengthen the team. Eleven transfers joined the Bulls prior to the 2025 campaign.

All 11 of the transfers appear on the Bulls' depth chart for week one, including projected starters QB **Ta'Quan Roberson** (Kansas State), C **Jake Timm** (LIU), WR **Jasaiah Gathings** (UConn), CB **Koentez Bradley** (Arizona State), S **Miles Greer** (Shepard) and K **Jack Howes** (Maryland).

Others appearing on the depth chart

include OL **Jake Merritt** (Michigan State), TE **Marcus Velez** (Bethune-Cookman), LB **Mitchell Gonser** (Harvard), LB **Connor Henderson** (North Texas) and P **Ethan Stumpf** (East Carolina).

13 Bulls Named to Athlon Preseason All-MAC Team

Athlon Sports released its preseason All-Mid-American Conference football team and 13 University at Buffalo players were named to the squad. The list was headlined **Red Murdock** who, along with being named to the first team was also selected as a preseason fourth-team All-American.

Joining Murdock on Athlon's Preseason All-MAC First Team were running back **Al-Jay Henderson**, wide receiver **Victor Snow**, offensive linemen **Trevor Brock** and **Tyler Doty**, edge **Kobe Stewart**, defensive tackle **George Wolo** and linebacker **Dion Crawford**.

Offensive lineman **Henry Tabansi**, cornerback **Marquis Cooper** and safety **Solomon Brown** were named to the second team. Snow was also named as a second-team punt returner.

Making the third team were wide receiver **Nik McMillan** and nickel **Jalen McNair**.

Home Sweet Home

For the first time since 2014, the Bulls will host seven home games in 2025. After playing the opener at Minnesota on August 28, their other three non-conference games (Saint Francis, Troy and UConn) will be played at UB Stadium. UB will also host four of its eight Mid-American Conference games at home.

EAST HARTFORD, CT – It was a tough afternoon for the University at Buffalo football team as they dropped a 47-3 road contest at Connecticut on Saturday afternoon at Pratt & Whitney Stadium.

The Huskies, coming off a game in which they rushed for a school-record 421 yards against Florida Atlantic, were able to total over 500 yards of total offense against the usually stout UB defense. The Huskies jumped out to a 23-0 lead and never looked back.

The Bulls points came via a 47-yard field goal by Upton Bellenfant, the longest of his career. The redshirt-sophomore has now made six straight field goals since taking over the starting duties.

The defense was once again led by linebackers Red Murdock and Shaun Dolac. Murdock had a career-high 14 tackles and added two tackles for loss and a sack. Dolac finished with 10 tackles and a sack. Dolac has now had at least 10 tackles and a tackle for loss every game this season.

Offensively, J.J. Jenkins had a career-high five receptions for the Bulls.

HEAD COACH PETE LEMBO

Pete Lembo was named the 28th head coach of the University at Buffalo football program on January 21, 2024.

Lembo had the most successful debut season of any head coach in UB Football history in 2024 when he led the Bulls to a 9-4 overall record and 6-2 mark in Mid-American Conference play. The nine wins tied for the second most in school history and were the most by a first-year head coach at UB.

He led Buffalo to its fourth bowl win in program history, defeating Liberty, 26-7, in the Bahamas Bowl. It capped a stellar finish to the season that saw the Bulls win their final five games of the year for the first time since 1959.

UB's six-win improvement from 2023 tied for the fourth best turnaround in the nation.

The signature win for the Bulls in 2024 was a 23-20 overtime victory over 23rd-ranked Northern Illinois. It was Buffalo's second ever win over a nationally ranked team.

Buffalo had 10 players named All-MAC, including 2024 MAC Defensive Player of the Year Shaun Dolac. The standout linebacker was also UB football's first ever Consensus All-American.

Under Lembo, the Bulls had their best semester in the classroom. The team's combined 3.18 grade point average was the highest in program history.

A coaching veteran of over 30 years, Lembo has had successful stints as head coach of three other programs. From 2001-15, he served as head coach at Lehigh, Elon and Ball State. He amassed a 112-65 career record, including a 79-36 record in ten seasons at the FCS level, making him one of the winningest coaches in the history of that classification.

In five years as head coach at Lehigh, Lembo had a record of 44-14. He is the winningest head coach in the program's history with a .759 winning percentage. His conference record of 26-7 (.788) ranks third among all Patriot League coaches in terms of winning percentage. He led the Mountain Hawks to two Patriot League titles and two appearances in the FCS playoffs. He was named the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year and the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 after leading Lehigh to an 11-1 record and as high as No. 2 in the national polls – the highest ranking the program's history.

Beginning in 2006, Lembo spent five seasons as the head coach at Elon. He resurrected a program that went 14-42 in the five seasons prior to his arrival. From 2006-10, the Phoenix had a record of 35-22. He was named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 2007 and in 2009 led Elon to a record of 9-3, including a 7-1 mark in conference play. The Phoenix qualified for the FCS playoffs for the first time in program history that season. Elon enjoyed winning seasons in Southern Conference play all five years he served as head coach, something the program hadn't achieved during an 11-year affiliation with the conference. His Elon teams set over 120 NCAA, Southern Conference and school records.

No stranger to the Mid-American Conference, Lembo served as head coach at Ball State from 2011-15. Like his previous stops, Lembo enjoyed immediate success. He became the first coach in Ball State history to win 30 games over his first four seasons at the helm. The Cardinals went 9-4 (6-2 in the MAC) in 2012 and 10-3 (7-1 in the MAC) in 2013. The combined 19 wins over those two seasons tied the program record for wins over a two-year span. He led Ball State to the 2012 Beef 'O' Brady

Bowl and the 2013 GoDaddy Bowl, marking just the second time in 90 years over Ball State football the program played in bowl games in consecutive years.

Under Lembo's watch, the Cardinals set more than 60 school records, including single-season records for points (501), total offense (6,199 yards), passing yards (4,214), touchdown passes (35) and total touchdowns (64) in 2013.

Since leaving Ball State following the 2015 campaign, Lembo enjoyed significant success as a special teams coordinator at the Power Five level. He spent the past three seasons as associate head coach and special teams coordinator at South Carolina. He was named a Broyles Award Assistant Coach of the Year Semifinalist, a FootballScoop Special Teams Coach of the Year Finalist and earned Phil Steele's Special Teams Coach of the Year accolades in 2022 after the Gamecock special teams had arguably their best season on record.

South Carolina earned the No. 1 spot in ESPN's special teams efficiency ranking after finishing fourth in the country in punt returns (16.6), fifth in kickoff returns (25.1), seventh in net punting (42.8), 23rd in opponent kickoff returns (17.3) and 27th in opponent punt returns (4.6). During his three-year run in Columbia, South Carolina special teams units blocked 14 kicks after recording eight blocks over the previous five years (2016-20) combined.

Lembo had similar success as assistant head coach and special teams coordinator at Memphis in 2019 and 2020. He helped lead the Tigers to a 12-win season in 2019 and a berth in the Cotton Bowl. His unit finished second in ESPN's Special Teams Efficiency Rankings in 2019 and sixth in the FBS in the overall special teams rankings compiled by the data analysts at Football Outsiders.

Prior to Memphis, Lembo served as assistant head coach and special teams coordinator at Rice (2018) and Maryland (2016-17). Both programs excelled in special teams under Lembo's tutelage. In his two seasons at Maryland, the Terps tied for fifth nationally with nine blocked kicks. While at Rice, the Owls ranked fifth in the FBS with just 16.12 kick-off return yards allowed.

A native of Staten Island, NY, Lembo began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Albany in 1992. He went on to coach tight ends at Dartmouth from 1994-96 and serve as offensive coordinator at Hampden-Sydney in 1997.

Lembo, a 1992 graduate of Georgetown University, was a four-year starter on the Hoyas' offensive line and served as team captain in 1991. He is married to the former Jenifer Kochis. The couple has three children – Sophia, A.J. and Victoria.

MINNEAPOLIS, MN – The University at Buffalo football team dropped their season opener at Minnesota, 23-10, on Thursday night at Huntington Bank Stadium. The Bulls trailed by only three early in the fourth quarter, before the Gophers were able to pull away.

The defense kept the Bulls in the game until the offense got its footing. Trailing, 7-0, linebacker Mitchell Gonser, playing in his first game with the Bulls, intercepted a tipped pass and returned it 54 yards to the Minnesota 18-yard line. It set up a 36-yard field goal by Jack Howes to cut the lead to 7-3.

Trailing 13-3 midway through the third quarter, Victor Snow caught a 40-yard touchdown pass from Ta'Quan Roberson to cut the Minnesota advantage to just three points.

The Gophers tacked on a field goal and a touchdown in the fourth quarter to hold off a game UB squad.

Despite the loss, it was a strong effort by the defense, led by preseason All-American Red Murdock who finished with a game-high 16 tackles and a sack. Fellow linebacker Dion Crawford added a career-high 14 tackles.

Poor field position early in the game hampered the UB offense. Roberson, making his first start for the Bulls at quarterback, settled in as the game progressed and finished 12-of-20 for 107 yards and a touchdown. Snow was the Bulls leading receiver with five catches for 67 yards and a touchdown.

BUFFALO, NY – The University at Buffalo football team cruised past Saint Francis, 45-6, in the home opener at UB Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was a workmanlike effort for the Bulls who rushed for 370 yards – their highest rushing total since 2020.

Buffalo's defense held the Red Flash to just 11 yards rushing and 126 yards of total offense.

The Bulls did not attempt a punt in the game and scored on seven of their ten possessions.

While UB did much of its damage on the ground, the Bulls scored their first touchdown of the game through the air. Ta'Quan Roberson connected with Victor Snow for a 17-yard touchdown in the back corner of the endzone to open the scoring. The drive started on the Saint Francis 27-yard line thanks to a blocked punt by Connor Henderson.

Following a short field goal by Jack Howes, Al-Jay Henderson scored his first of two touchdowns on the day on a one-yard run to put the Bulls ahead, 17-0, after the first quarter.

Henderson scored on a 10-yard run, with five minutes to go in the half, to extend the UB lead to 24-0 at the break.

Roberson scored two rushing touchdowns in the third quarter, including a 40-yard dash to put UB up, 38-0.

The Bulls final score came courtesy of James McNeil, Jr. who rumbled in from 26 yards out for his first career touchdown.

Roberson threw for 133 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 88 yards and two scores to pace the offense. Henderson rushed for a game-high 98 yards and two touchdowns.

The defense was led by linebacker Red Murdock who had six tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss. Fellow linebacker Mitchell Gonser and edge Malin White each added five tackles and a TFL. Edge Kobe Stewart had two tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery.

KENT, OH – Victor Snow caught a 22-yard touchdown pass from Taquan Roberson with 1:03 left in the game to help the University at Buffalo football team defeat Kent State, 31-28, in the Mid-American Conference opener at Dix Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The Bulls trailed, 28-24, with 2:38 left, before marching down the field for the winning score.

Roberson had the best game of his early UB career, throwing for 318 yards and three touchdowns. He engineered an offense that rolled up 467 yards of total offense.

The Bulls fell behind 14-0 with just 2:33 left in the second quarter, before rallying for 10 unanswered points at the end of the half. Roberson connected with Nik McMillan for a 38-yard touchdown to cut the lead to 14-7. After the UB defense forced a three-and-out to get the ball back, Jack Howes drilled a 28-yard field goal as the second quarter expired.

McMillan finished with six catches for 111 yards, both career highs.

The Bulls scored 14 unanswered points to start the second half. Chance Morrow caught a 21-yard strike from Roberson to give the Bulls the lead, 17-14. It was Morrow's best career game as a Bull, finishing with six receptions for 99 yards.

On the ensuing UB possession, Al-Jay Henderson ripped off a 38-yard touchdown run to extend the lead to 24-14. Henderson finished with 75 yards rushing and added a career-best eight receptions for 38 yards.

Kent State scored the game's next two touchdowns, including the go-ahead score with 2:38 remaining. However, the Bulls needed only 1:28 to march down the field for the winning touchdown.

Long pass plays to Morrow and McMillan, along with a pair of grabs by Henderson, set up the Bulls at the Kent State 22-yard line. Roberson then found Snow, just shy of the endzone, and the redshirt-junior extended the ball over the pylon for the winning score.

Mitchell Gonser had 11 tackles, a sack and three tackles for loss to pace the defense. Fellow linebacker Red Murdock had 10 tackles in the game. Miles Greer tied his best effort as a Bull with nine tackles and added a blocked punt.

The Bulls tacked on a 39-yard field goal by Jack Howes to take a 17-0 lead. However, during that scoring drive, starting quarterback Tai'Quan Roberson left the game with an injury and was replaced by Gunnar Gray.

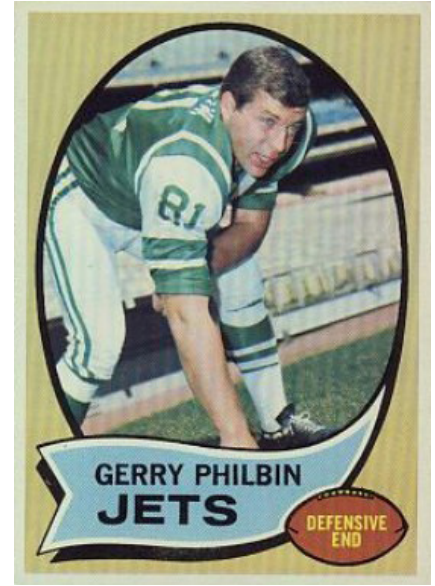

UB Football to Wear Helmet Stickers to Honor the Late Gerry Philbin

University at Buffalo football will wear special helmet stickers this season to honor the late Gerry Philbin who passed away on June 25, 2025. Following a standout career as a defensive tackle for the Bulls, Philbin was an All-Pro defensive end for the New York Jets.

Philbin was a three-year starter for the Bulls from 1960-63. A team captain, he was named to the All-East Team and played in the North-South and Coaches All-American post season games. He was the program's first Academic All-American in 1963.

A native of Pawtucket, RI, Philbin was selected in the third round (33rd overall) of the 1964 NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions and the third round (19th overall) of the 1964 AFL Draft by the New York Jets. He chose to play for the Jets and helped lead the team to the 1968 AFL Championship and a victory in Super Bowl III. Following a nine-year career in New York, he spent the 1973 season with the Philadelphia Eagles.

Philbin played in 123 career games and made 112 starts over his professional career. He recorded 66.5 career sacks, including 64.5 sacks as a Jet which ranks fourth in the franchise's history. He was a two-time first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowl selection and was named to the AFL All-60s Team.

He was inducted into the Dr. and Mrs. Edmond J. Gicewicz Family UB Athletics Hall of Fame in 1970 and was added to the New York Jets Ring of Honor in 2011.
