

UC San Diego Triton Ballpark Project Fact Sheet

About Triton Ballpark

- UC San Diego broke ground on Triton Ballpark September 25, 2014. The much-needed baseball facility will be built around the current Triton baseball field located in the northeast area of campus.
- The project was made possible with philanthropic donations from community leaders, alumni and faculty including Bill Scripps, Gary Jacobs, '79, John Moores, Malin Burnham and Richard Atkinson.
- Two award-winning architectural firms, Gensler and Populous, worked on the design of Triton Ballpark. Populous, which helped create Petco Park, home to the San Diego Padres, formulated the initial concept, while world-renowned Gensler is executing the project to completion.
- Highlights of Triton Ballpark also include:
 - Sunken team dugouts
 - o Press box
 - Area for food trucks
 - o Permanent spectator seating for 560
 - Restroom facilities for fans
- Triton Ballpark will also feature the Marye Anne Fox Clubhouse, named in honor of UC San Diego's seventh chancellor. During her tenure as chancellor from 2004 to 2012, Marye Anne Fox championed updates to the baseball field—including the installation of electricity and lights—which set the foundation for construction of Triton Ballpark.
- At more than 4,000 square foot, the Marye Anne Fox Clubhouse will feature:
 - Locker rooms
 - Team showers
 - o Coaches' offices
 - Multipurpose room
 - o Hall of fame area
 - Laundry
 - Storage area for athletic equipment
- The upgrades will serve not only the UC San Diego Tritons, but community and youth teams and groups which also use the baseball field.

- The project is anticipated for completion for baseball season in Spring 2015.
