Floyd of King University Chosen Division II Conference Commissioners Association Men's Basketball Ron Lenz National Player of the Year

ABANY, N.Y. – Senior guard Jordan Floyd of King University today was named the Division II Conference Commissioners Association 2020 Men's Basketball Ron Lenz National Player of the Year. Floyd sits atop the D2CCA Men's Basketball All-America Teams that were voted on by the NCAA Division II members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Floyd is joined on the first team by Northwest Missouri State sophomore guard Trevor Hudgins, Daemen junior center Andrew Sischo, West Texas A&M sophomore guard Qua Grant, and Florida Southern senior guard Brett Hanson.

Floyd, the D2CCA Southeast Region and Conference Carolinas Player of the Year, led all of NCAA Division II in scoring at 31.9 points per game. He was the only player in NCAA Divisions I and II that averaged more than 30.0 points per game. Floyd was one of seven NCAA Division II players that shot better than 50.0 percent from the floor, 40.0 percent from three-point range, and 80.0 percent from the free throw line; shooting 50.3 percent from the floor, 42.6 percent from long range and 81.3 percent from the charity stripe. He also averaged 2.7 assists and 4.1 rebounds per game, while leading the Tornado to a 23-7 record.

The MIAA and D2CCA Central Region Player of the Year, Hudgins led the nation with a 53.8 three-point field goal percentage (105-of-197), while averaging 19.6 points, 6.0 assists, and 1.5 steals per game for the 31-1 Bearcats.

Sischo, the D2CCA East Region and East Coast Conference Player of the Year for the second consecutive season, averaged 24.9 points and 11.7 rebounds per game this past season for the 24-8 Wildcats. He also led the nation with 22 "double-doubles" and finished among the top-10 in both scoring and rebounding.

Grant, the D2CCA South Central and Lone Star Conference Player of the Year, produced 20.7 points, 7.5 boards, 3.2 assists, and 2.4 steals on a regular basis for the Buffs, who finished 32-1.

The Sunshine State Player of the Year, Hanson led the league with a 22.4 scoring average, while also recording 6.9 rebounds, 4.8 assists, and 2.0 steals per game for the 29-2 Moccasins.
