ABOUT THE BOBCATS

- LAST TIME OUT:** Frostburg State won their fifth consecutive game, defeating West Virginia Wesleyan 35-13 last week as the Falcons limited Bobcats to just 35 yards rushing.
- ON THE DEFENSIVE SIDE:** Wayne Palmer has led the way for the Bobcats, recording 37 tackles, 6.5 TFL (33 yards), 4.0 sacks for a loss of 27 yards, while forcing two fumbles which were both recovered.
- REGULAR SEASON SUCCESS:** The Bobcats have lost just three regular season games since the beginning of the 2016 season with two of those losses coming against ranked opponents. Since 2016, the Bobcats have compiled a 36-5 record, the best in the MEC over that span of time.

PROGRAM SUCCESS

Since the formation of the Mountain East Conference in 2013, the University of Charleston has posted a 39-30 record, winning 56% of their games as a member of the conference.

In his ninth season at the helm of the Golden Eagles, Head Coach Pat Kirkland has posted a 55-39 record including five winning seasons and program best 10-2 season in 2015. Ten wins marks the most since Charleston announced that football would return to the institution in 2003 for the first time since 1956.

On this date in 2015, Charleston defeated Fairmont State 38-31 on Homecoming, holding off a 4th quarter comeback to move to 6-1 overall. The Golden Eagles played without starting quarterback Jeremy Johnson, but Mason Olszewski stepped in and was 14-of-23 for 263 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. Marvin Elam paced UC on the ground with 14 carries for 106 yards and two scores. Johnathan Pruden had 10 solo tackles and James King added six stops with two TFLs, including a sack. Marcus Porter had nine tackles and two interceptions and Quincy Redmon was in on six tackles and recorded 3.5 for a loss.

Pat Kirkland returns to the University of Charleston as the Head Football Coach for his ninth season at UC. The Golden Eagles continue to be in competition each season for a Mountain East Conference Championship. During Kirkland's previous seasons at UC, they have accumulated over 50 wins and four times have been ranked in the top 25 in the country. Under Kirkland's guidance the UC teams have been ranked in the top 25 in the country, as well as, having the number one ranked offense and the number one ranked defense in the conference. The 2015 season UC finished up 10-1 earning a NCAA playoff berth and finished the regular season 15th in the nation. In 2012, the UC defense finished up its season ranked number two in the country in total defense. That same year saw Pat Kirkland receive the Coach of the Year Award in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

The University of Charleston Football program is based on team, accountability, and work ethic. The Golden Eagles have created a reputation for playing with tremendous effort and physicality. The accolades for those years include over 29 First-Team All-Conference selections, all -Region / all-American selections, as well as, having the Players of the Year in the Conference on Offense, and Defense. Following last season UC had four separate players earn spots in NFL camps, including defensive end John Cominsky who was drafted in the fourth round by the Atlanta Falcons. The University of Charleston currently have eight players playing at the professional level.

Prior to UC, Kirkland was on the coaching staff at West Virginia University for five seasons. Throughout that time WVU won a Conference Championship and four out of five bowl games. The majority of Kirkland's coaching responsibilities were on the defensive side of the ball including the corners in a victory over Oklahoma in the 2007 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl but was on the offensive side in 2010 coaching the Fullbacks / Tight Ends in the Gator Bowl against Florida State. Pat Kirkland spent his last two seasons at WVU as the Director of Recruiting. His time as the Director of Recruiting carried over as the University of Charleston's roster is diverse geographically with over 14 different states represented and three different countries.

Before his stop in Morgantown, Kirkland coached at Glenville State from 2000-2005. He held the title of Assistant Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator. Kirkland's defense was consistently ranked in the tops of the conference and in his final season was ranked number one in the conference and eighth nationally, holding opponents to under 15 points per game.

"Coach Kirkland has excelled as an NCAA Division I coach, but he also has extensive experience coaching in the conference, which will benefit our student athletes, as we continue to compete in the Mountain East Conference."

Kirkland, a native of Akron, Ohio also spent two years as the secondary coach at Muskingum University. He had four all-conference players in the secondary over the two-year stint. He received his bachelor's and master's degrees in education from Muskingum College where he was a First-Team All-Conference defensive back.

**PAUL JOHNSON**

Paul Johnson returns to the University of Charleston as the Offensive Line Coach and will begin his third season as Offensive Coordinator. In 2018 the Golden Eagles offense continued to make strides and produced the first thousand yard Wide Receiver in school history.

The offense finished ranked number one in scoring, averaging 41.1 points per game. The rushing offense was ranked number one in the conference and was top 20 in the country. UC completed the regular season with a 10-1 record and qualified for the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in school history. Charleston finished the season ranked top 20 in the country. During his tenure, Johnson has mentored 16 All-Conference selections.

Prior to his career at Charleston, he was an offensive graduate assistant at Marshall University. Johnson also served as a graduate assistant for West Virginia University from 2008-2010 where earned his Masters in Athletic Coaching. While with the Mountaineers, he coached the offensive line with coaching stints in the Meineke Car Care Bowl and the Gator Bowl. Johnson played collegiately at Ohio University from 2003-2008. A three-year starter at left guard, and

helped

lead the Bobcats to their first bowl appearance since 1966 in the 2007 GMAC Bowl. A native of Parkersburg, WV, Johnson began his winning tradition with a 2001 WV State Title while with the Big Reds.

**QUINN SANDERS**

Quinn Sanders returns for his third season with the Golden Eagles. He will continue his role as the Quarterbacks and Running Backs coach.

In his first year back at UC Sanders helped UC's offense to its most prolific passing season in school history breaking the single season mark for Yards and Touchdowns. Under Sanders Joey Augustin broke the single season mark for Yards (900) and TD's (10) in a single season.

At Midwestern State Sanders coached the running back and helped guide them to a top 10 finish in rushing offense in the nation. While at MSU two of his running backs would receive all conference honors. The running backs would account for 2,329 yards and 21 touchdowns during this season. Prior to MSU Sanders interned with the University of Charleston working with the Quarterbacks and the Running Backs. Sanders started his coaching career at South Walton High School in Santa Rosa Beach, FL where he coached Quarterbacks, Wide Receivers and Defensive Backs while also being the Head Coach of the JV and the Head Coach of the Men's and Women's Track & Field teams.

Sanders Played at the University of Charleston. He graduated in 2011 with a degrees in Political Science and History. Sanders was also member of the Track and Field Team.

**ZACK JOHNSON**

Zack Johnson enters his third season at The University of Charleston as the Linebacker Coach. The Golden Eagles defense has finished in the Top 10 in the country in three categories: Total Defense, Third Down defense, and Tackles For Loss the last two years. They have also finished atop the conference in those categories also during that time. He has developed three All Conference Linebackers since his time at Charleston.

Prior to coming to Charleston he spent the 2016 football season at Ohio University where he served as a Defensive Graduate Assistant. Ohio's defense was ranked No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference, and was a top 5 rushing defense in the country. Johnson helped coach the Bobcats to a 8-6 record and a trip to the 2016 Dollar General Bowl.

The Morgantown, West Virginia native graduated from West Virginia University in 2015. While at WVU he served as a student assistant on defense with the linebackers from 2012-2015. During his final season at West Virginia the Mountaineers claimed the 2015 Cactus Bowl championship.

**ZACK SANTOLLA**

Zack Santolla enters his fourth season as the Defensive Line coach for the Golden Eagles. The 2018 season was another successful year up front on defense for Charleston. All three starters on the defensive line were again named All-Mountain East Conference. John Cominsky and Kahzin Daniels were both first-team selections and Kenny Randall was a second-team selection. This is the second consecutive that Santolla has had all three of his starters named All-MEC. Cominsky was also named the Mountain East Conference Defensive Player of the Year while both he and Daniels were named D2Football All-Americans. The defensive front led the way to the No. 1 total defense and the No. 2 rush defense in the MEC, which landed them in the top-ten nationally in both categories.

John Cominsky was selected to compete in the 70th Annual Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile, Alabama, received an invitation to the NFL Scouting Combine, and was also a finalist for the Cliff Harris Award for small college defensive player of the year. Kahzin Daniels was selected to play in the NFL Players Association Collegiate Bowl that took place in Los Angeles in the historic Rose Bowl. Daniels finished his career as the Golden Eagles' career sack leader.

In the 2019 NFL Draft, Cominsky was selected with the 135th pick by the Atlanta Falcons. Making him the first player selected in Mountain East Conference history. Daniels signed a Free Agent with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers following the draft.

In his first season with the Golden Eagles, Santolla notched his first All-MEC honoree leading the defensive line in John Cominsky. Prior to arriving in Charleston, Santolla coached the Tight Ends and Fullbacks at Shepherd University in their 13-1 record-breaking season where they ended their season as the National Runner-Up. Santolla spent a year at East Tennessee State University as a football operations and strength and conditioning assistant while working toward his Master's Degree. The Roanoke, Virginia native graduated from Emory & Henry College with a Bachelor's Degree in Sport Management where he was a three-year starter at fullback, and blocked for an All-American and Gagliardi Award finalist tailback.

**CONNER FREELAND**

Freeland graduated from Longwood University with a degree in Kinesiology and completion of 2 internships with the Lancer Strength and Conditioning program and Elkin Sports Performance in Richmond, VA. Prior to Longwood, Freeland played inside linebacker at Christopher Newport University until suffering a career ending injury and transferring to pursue a career in strength and conditioning and coaching. Previously coaching in high school, Freeland assisted his alma-mater Randolph-Henry High School as their Linebackers and Wide Receivers coach from 2012 to 2014.

Conner Freeland enters his fifth season on the Golden Eagles staff as the Spurs and Strength & Conditioning Coach.

This 2015 season, Freeland's Spurs played an integral role in a UC Defense that culminated 61 Tackles for Loss and 23 Forced Turnovers. The defense also had 4 First Team All-MEC Performers, including Spur, Zaire Lewis, who broke the single season interception record (6) this 2015 season. The Golden Eagles team completed the regular season with a 10-1 record and qualified for the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in school history. Charleston was also ranked as high as #15 nationally in Division II.

Freeland graduated from Longwood University with a degree in Kinesiology and completion of 2 internships with the Lancer Strength and Conditioning program and Elkin Sports Performance in Richmond, VA. Prior to Longwood, Freeland played inside linebacker at Christopher Newport University until suffering a career ending injury and transferring to pursue a career in strength and conditioning and coaching. Previously coaching in high school, Freeland assisted his alma-mater Randolph-Henry High School as their Linebackers and Wide Receivers coach from 2012 to 2014.

**NICK VERNA**

Coach Verna is a graduate of The University of Akron where he earned two degrees, Masters of Public Administration 2017, and a Bachelor's of Science in Sport Management 2015. Coach also earned his Associates in Liberal Arts from Erie Community College in 2013 where he was a Quarterback on the football team.

Nick Verna is entering his second year at The University of Charleston coaching the Wide Receivers. In his first year, the Wide Receivers saw success and helped the team to a 6-5 overall record. Verna coached Redshirt Sophomore Michael Strachan, who amassed 1,000 yards and was First Team All-Mountain East. In 2018, Strachan set the single season receiving yards record at Charleston with 1,007 yards.

Coach Verna comes to The University of Charleston, after serving at The University of Akron for four seasons. The roles coach served as were Defensive Graduate Assistant and Defensive Student Assistant Coach.

During his time at Akron, Coach Verna was a part of a program that was on the rise. In 2015, the Akron Zips won the most games in a season in school history (8 games), as well as winning the first bowl game in school history (Idaho Potato Bowl). In 2015, the Akron Zips finished 3rd in all of College Football in Rush Defense, and 1st in the Mid-American Conference in Total Defense. In 2017, the Akron Zips won the Eastern Division of the Mid-American Conference and clinched a bowl berth in the Boca Raton Cheribundi Bowl.

Coach Verna is a graduate of The University of Akron where he earned two degrees, Masters of Public Administration 2017, and a Bachelor's of Science in Sport Management 2015. Coach also earned his Associates in Liberal Arts from Erie Community College in 2013 where he was a Quarterback on the football team.



CHASE BUTLER

Chase Butler returns to Charleston for his second season leading the Tight Ends and Fullbacks. He will also continue his role as the Special Teams Coordinator.

Butler joined the Golden Eagles staff in the fall of 2016. Prior to arriving in Charleston, Butler served as the Quality Control staff member for Running Backs at Ohio University. During the 2014-2015 academic year, he served as the Quality Control coach at West Liberty University while earning one of two Master's degrees, receiving his second from OU in 2017.

Butler served as the Offensive and Defensive Line coach for Burgettstown High School from 2014 to 2015. During the 2008-2009 school year, he also served as the Offensive and Defensive line coach for Burgettstown Middle School as well as the Running Backs and Linebackers coach for the High School.

Butler received his Bachelor's Degree from Bethany College in 2009.



MICHAEL NYQUIST

Michael joined the University of Charleston Athletic Training staff in March of 2012 as the Coordinator of Clinical services, Head Athletic Trainer, and Instructor. He received a Bachelor of Science in Biology with a Sports Medicine concentration from Lees-McRae College and a Master of Arts in Physical Education-Sport Management from East Tennessee State University.

Prior to arriving at the University of Charleston, Michael served as an Assistant Athletic Trainer and Head Athletic Trainer at Lees-McRae College. He is a NATA certified athletic trainer as well as a North Carolina and Tennessee Licensed athletic trainer.

GOLDEN EAGLES DOWN FALCONS IN 2019 SEASON OPENER

CHARLESTON, W. Va. – The Pat Kirkland led Golden Eagles outlasted the 25th ranked Fairmont State Falcons 42-39 to open the 2019 season on Thursday night at University of Charleston Stadium. The Falcons battled back from a 32-point deficit to bring the score within three points in the fourth quarter, but it was not enough to overcome the Golden Eagles.

The Golden Eagles move to 1-0 to start the season, as the produced 580 yards of total offense led by senior quarterback Brant Grisel. This is the highest score posted by the Golden Eagles since taking on Concord in Athens in 2018.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Golden Eagles offense surged in the first half, heading into the break with a 35-3 lead over FSU. The Golden Eagles earned 371 yards of total offense in the first half, and out gunned the Falcons in the air 282-115, scoring on their first four possessions.

Grisel connected with Mike Strachan on a seven-yard ball to put the Golden Eagles up 7-0 just four minutes in to the first quarter. On the next possession, Tyreek McAllister took the ball 11 yards for the 14-0 advantage. Deshawn Ruffin, Xzavion Gordon, and McAllister combined for three scores to give UC their 32-point lead.

The Falcons lone first half score came from Colin Horvath's 31-yard field goal with two minutes to play in the first quarter.

Coming out of the break Tyree Randolph scored the first touchdown for the Falcons bringing the score to 35-10 with 11:58 to play in the third. The Golden Eagles answered as Grisel hit Mike Strachan with a 39-yard pass to put UC up 42-10.

Fairmont went on to outscore the Golden Eagles 36-7 in the second half, but it would not be enough to overcome Charleston who came away with the 42-39 victory.

The Falcons ended the game with 580 yards of total offense to UC's 542. Grisel went 19-27 for 367 yards, breaking the Charleston single game pass record.

The Golden Eagles offense once again surged in the first half, leading as big as 20-7 with just over 14 minutes remaining in the 2nd quarter. After Tremaine Ross caught his first of two touchdowns from UC Quarterback Brant Grisel to put the Golden Eagles on the board, Urbana Running Back W.R. Sanders Jr. rushed for his first of four touchdowns to even the score at 7-7. Grisel would then connect with Ross again, this time for 29 yards to give UC a 13-7 lead.

Just moments into the 2nd quarter, Grisel found his biggest target in Mike Strachan for the 28-yard score to cap off a three play, 51-yard drive. For the second straight week, Strachan set a career-high in receptions as he notched thirteen against the Knights. The ball would spend the majority of the 2nd quarter in the UC defensive end as Urbana scored with just 26 seconds remaining after Sanders Jr. rushed for his second touchdown of the game, cutting the Golden Eagle lead to six.

Sanders would lead the Urbana offense in the second half, rushing for a five-yard score just five minute into the half to cap off a nine play, 67-yard drive for the Knights to take a 21-20 lead.

With just two minutes remaining in the third quarter, Sanders would take a 68-yard run all the way for his fourth touchdown of the game to cap the Urbana scoring and put the Knights ahead 28-20.

Charleston will return home next Saturday, September 21st to host the Bobcats of West Virginia Wesleyan with kickoff scheduled for 12:00 p.m.

CHARLESTON HOLDS ON TO DEFEAT WESLEYAN 34-29

The UC Golden Eagles football team defeated West Virginia Wesleyan 34-29 after a 29-point second-half comeback was cut short by the Charleston defense with less than two minutes remaining in the game.

Charleston was led by Senior Quarterback Brant Grisel who tossed for 442 yards on 24-of-43 passing with three touchdowns. Grisel, who set the UC single game passing record with 367 yards two weeks ago against Fairmont State, surpassed the mark by 75 yards against the Bobcat defense.

On the defensive side of the ball, Charleston put pressure on Wesleyan QB Jarrett Northrop as they combined for total of five sacks. Kal-EI Williams notched seven tackles (six solo), while Kenny Randall tallied eight tackles and 2.0 sacks.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After a scoreless first quarter, UC opened the scoring in the second as Grisel found Mike Strachan for a 64-yard touchdown to cap off a three play, 74-yard drive. After a 3-yard run from Jay Palmer with 5:29 remaining in the half made it 14-0, a long Charleston punt return with just 22 seconds left followed by a pair of nice throws from Grisel allowed for Freshman kicker Tim McCutchen to give UC a 17-0 lead as time expired. Palmer carried the ball 13 times, good enough for 42 yards and a touchdown.

It didn't take Golden Eagles long to add to their lead in the second half as Grisel found Strachan just a minute and a half into the third quarter for second touchdown of the game, this time for 60 yards. Strachan finished with eight receptions and 180 yards to go along with two touchdowns. With Charleston leading 24-0, Wesleyan began to move the ball as a pair of touchdowns cut the UC lead to 27-15. Charleston added to their lead after Grisel tossed a 74-yard bomb to Tremaine Ross in the third quarter for the Golden Eagles to make it 34-15.

Wesleyan would score another pair of touchdowns on passes from Northrop to bring the score to 34-29 but a stop on defense with less than two minutes remaining allowed the Golden Eagles to halt the Bobcat comeback.

UC DEFEATS DIVISION I FCS OPPONENT VALPARAISO 19-13

VALPARAISO, Ind. – Early scoring including touchdowns by each team within the first ten minutes of the game led the scoring, but it was field goals that proved to be the difference in Charleston's 19-13 victory over Valpo on Saturday afternoon at Brown Field. Despite three first-half turnovers for Charleston, the Golden Eagles improved to 3-1 (2-1 MEC) on the season in a win that marks the first time a MEC team has defeated an FCS opponent.

Despite four field goals from Freshman Kicker Tim McCutchen, Charleston's defense proved worthy, holding the Crusaders to just 121 yards of total offense, 72 on the ground and 49 in the air. On the defensive side of the ball, Kal-EI Williams led the Golden Eagle defense with 12 tackles while Senior Jeremy Bell recorded two interceptions. In addition, Reggie Collins recorded nine tackles while Kenny Randall recorded six tackles (3.5 TFL) and a sack.

Offensively, UC was led by McCutchen who accounted for 13 of the 19 UC points as he went 4-for-4 on field goals including one from 41 yards out. Senior Quarterback Brant Grisel finished the day 30-for-45 with 333 yards and a touchdown including two interceptions. Tremaine Ross recorded 118 receiving yards on seven catches with a touchdown while Xzavion Gordon recorded eight catches for 102 yards.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After a Charleston fumble allowed for Valpo to recover and begin their first scoring drive with 10:14 left in the first quarter on the 15-yard line, Alex Kluck was able to score on a 3-yard pass from Crusader Quarterback Jimmy Seewald to put Valparaiso ahead 7-0. Charleston was able to strike right back as Grisel found Ross for a 10-yard score to cap off a seven-play, 75-yard drive to tie the game at 7-7.

With just under 13 minutes to play in the first half, Jamari Booker was able to pick off Grisel and bring the ball to the Charleston 30-yard line before converting a field goal to put the Crusaders ahead 10-7. After another Valpo field goal brought the game to 13-7, Booker once again intercepted Grisel in the end-zone to end the Charleston threat with under two minutes in the half. The Golden Eagles cut the Valpo lead to just three as for the second consecutive week, McCutchen was able to hit a field goal on the final play of the half, this time from 28-yards, to bring the score to 13-10.

UC's defense forced Valpo to punt on their first two drives of the second half and McCutchen was able to capitalize on a pair of three-pointers, a 39 yarder to tie the game and a 20-yarder to give the Golden Eagles a 16-13 lead with 3:00 remaining in the third quarter. McCutchen concluded the Charleston scoring as he pushed a 41-yard attempt through the uprights with 14:42 remaining in the game to give UC a 19-13 lead.

Potentially the biggest play of the game came on a punt from Junior Kicker Oscar Gonzalez, who was able to pin the Valpo offense to their 1-yard line on a 46-yard punt with 4:38 remaining in the game. The Crusaders were able to move the ball 46 yards before being halted by the UC defense to end the game and end an 11 play, 52-yard drive.

Charleston will hit the road again this week as they head to Wheeling University (0-4, 0-4 MEC) to face off against the Cardinals with kickoff scheduled for 1:00 p.m. on Saturday.

It was the fast-paced throwing game of the Golden Eagles against the surging ground game of the Falcons that combined for 116 points in the contest.

After an offsides call gave the Golden Eagles a first down, on drive number one of the game, it was Joe Street who got the nod, and took the ball three yards to open up scoring for the day.

Immediately after Charleston's kickoff it was Marvelle Ross who took the ball 80 yards to even the score with 12:50 to go in the first quarter.

In classic Golden Eagle fashion, Charleston came out fast as they struck back on their very next drive as Senior Quarterback Brant Grisel hit Mike Strachan with a 75-yard ball for the Golden Eagles second score of the game.

Jaleel McLaughlin found the endzone for the first time with just over six minutes remaining in the first quarter. A quick 35-yard ball from Chris Brim to Zaire Mitchell put the Falcons inside the Golden Eagles 20-yard line, setting up McLaughlin's first scoring opportunity to tie the game up at 14.

The Golden Eagles drove the field their next time out, ending the drive on a field goal from Freshman kicker, Tim McCutchen.

The first quarter came to a close with the Golden Eagles holding a 17-14 advantage over the No. 5 Falcons. Notre Dame took the lead for the first time in the second quarter on a run by McLaughlin bringing the score to 21-17.

With seven minutes to play in the first half, Ladennyawn Green carried the ball 41 yards during the Falcon Drive for the 28-17 lead with five minutes to play. NDC was had one more score in them before the half came to a close as McLaughlin notched his third touchdown of the day, bringing the score to 35-17.

Before the close of the second quarter, Charleston clawed their way to the endzone with less than a minute to go as Joe Street punched the ball in bringing the score to 35-24 before intermission.

The Golden Eagles tallied over 300 yards of offense in the first half, to the Falcons 225, as the two teams would continue to go tick-for-tack in the second half.

Notre Dame went to the air for their next two touchdowns, connecting with Jeremy Hamilton and McLaughlin to increase their lead to 49-24 with just over five minutes remaining in the third quarter.

After a muffed punt from the visitors the Golden Eagles recovered the ball on the Notre Dame 20-yard line setting up a quick two-pass drive that ended with a Charleston touchdown as Grisel found Strachan on the 16-yard pass to the end zone.

The Golden Eagles defense kept attacking as D'Vaughn Whitt stripped McLaughlin on the Falcons 20-yard line, running the ball in to set the score at 49-38.

On the next drive Tyreik McAllister took the ball 56-yards, followed by a successful two-point conversion to bring the Golden Eagles within three points of the Falcons.

With 9:40 to play in the fourth quarter, Grisel connected with Tremaine Ross on an 88-yard bomb to give the Golden Eagles their first lead since the first quarter as the score was 53-59.

McLaughlin took the ball 67-yards on Notre Dame's next drive to put the Falcons back up 56-53 at the 9:30 mark.

Finally, with just under eight minutes to go in the final stanza, Nik Cotton scored on a fumble recovery to bring the score to 63-53.
