## CURRENT HEAD COACH: DANIEL SMEE



DANIEL SMEE IS ENTERING HIS FOURTH SEASON WITH THE GOLDEN EAGLES AND HIS FIRST AS HEAD COACH. SINCE ARRIVING IN THE FALL OF 2017, SMEE HAS WON TWO NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS, TWO REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS, TWO MOUNTAIN EAST CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIPS, AND THREE MEC REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONSHIPS.

A NATIVE OF NEWCASTLE, ENGLAND, SMEE PLAYED SOCCER PROFESSIONALLY IN THE SCOTTISH PREMIER LEAGUE FOR GREтна FOOTBALL CLUB FROM 2006-2008. FOLLOWING HIS TIME THERE, SMEE WON A NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP WITH TYNE METROPOLITAN COLLEGE IN THE UK BEFORE PURSUING A COLLEGIATE CAREER IN THE USA. HE CHOSE TO ATTEND WVAC CONFERENCE RIVAL, WEST VIRGINIA WESLEYAN COLLEGE, WHERE HE WAS A THREE-YEAR CAPTAIN, EIGHT-TIME REPRESENTATIVE ON THE DEAN'S LIST, AND BOTH AN ATHLETIC AND ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN. HE WAS ALSO NAMED TO THE ALL-CONFERENCE AND ALL-REGION SQUADS IN ALL THREE SEASONS THAT HE PLAYED.

FOLLOWING HIS GRADUATION FROM WVWC, SMEE PURSUED A MASTER'S IN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AT SLIPPERY ROCK UNIVERSITY. WHILE EARNING THIS MASTER'S, SMEE BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER, SERVING AS THE MEN'S SOCCER GRADUATE ASSISTANT FOR THE 2013 AND 2014 FALL SEASONS, AND FILLED IN AS THE INTERIM HEAD COACH FOR THE SPRING SEMESTER IN BETWEEN.

UPON GRADUATION FROM SRU, SMEE MOVED TO THE CHARLESTON AREA TO COACH YOUTH SOCCER. HE GOT BACK INTO COLLEGIATE COACHING SOON AFTERWARDS, LANDING A POSITION AS THE MEN'S SOCCER ASSISTANT COACH AT LEES-MCRAE COLLEGE FOR THE 2015 FALL SEASON. FOLLOWING A SUCCESSFUL SEASON, HE CHOSE TO MOVE ON AND VOLUNTEERED HERE AT UC IN THE SPRING OF 2016, BEFORE HEADING BACK TO WEST VIRGINIA WESLEYAN COLLEGE FOR THE 2016 FALL SEASON.

SMEE IS A QUALIFIED COACH WITH BOTH HIS US SOCCER D AND ENGLISH FA LEVEL TWO LICENSES, AND EVEN HAS AN ENGLISH LEVEL SEVEN REFEREE LICENSE.

**KANSAS CITY, MO** -- IN HIS FIRST YEAR AFTER BEING NAMED HEAD MEN'S SOCCER COACH AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CHARLESTON, DAN STRATFORD THOUGHT LAST SPRING ABOUT PUTTING HIS STAMP ON THE TEAM BY CHANGING UP THE ON-FIELD FORMATION. BUT HENCEFORTH, STRATFORD'S ID WITH GOLDEN EAGLES ATHLETICS WILL HAVE A MUCH BETTER RING TO IT.

AFTER DEFEATING LYNN UNIVERSITY (FLA.) 3-1 IN A SHOOTOUT IN THE DIVISION II MEN'S SOCCER TITLE GAME DURING THE TWILIGHT HOURS SATURDAY AT SWOPE PARK VILLAGE, STRATFORD WILL BE FOREVER KNOWN AS THE COACH WHO GUIDED THE TOP-SEEDED GOLDEN EAGLES (21-1-2) TO THEIR FIRST NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP OF ANY KIND IN UC MEN'S OR WOMEN'S SPORTS. THAT GOES ALL THE WAY BACK TO MORRIS HARVEY COLLEGE ATHLETICS HISTORY IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY.

THE SHOOTOUT CAME AFTER 110 MINUTES OF SCORELESS PLAY, INCLUDING TWO 10-MINUTE OVERTIMES.

"IT'S BEEN A LONG TIME COMING," SAID STRATFORD. "WE'VE FELT LIKE WE'VE BEEN THE BEST TEAM IN THE COUNTRY FOR FOUR YEARS IN A ROW. THIS IS FOR, NOT ONLY FOR EVERYONE BACK AT THE UNIVERSITY, BUT EVERYONE BACK IN THE COMMUNITY."

IT WAS A REMATCH OF THE 2014 TITLE GAME, WON BY LYNN 2-0 IN LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY. IN ITS THIRD TRIP TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS, UC FINALLY WAS ABLE TO SHED ITS TAG AS A BRIDESMAID.

STRATFORD SERVED AS AN ASSISTANT UNDER CHRIS GRASSIE, WHO MOVED ON TO BE NAMED THE HEAD COACH AT MARSHALL UNIVERSITY, FOR THE GOLDEN EAGLES' TWO PREVIOUS TRIPS TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH.

BY THE TIME THE MATCH FINISHED UNDER A FULL MOON BEHIND THE BENCHES, MOST OF THE STADIUM RECORD CROWD OF 2,349 HAD DISPERSED. MOST OF THE FANS WERE ON HAND FOR THE WOMEN'S SEMIFINAL BETWEEN AREA SCHOOL CENTRAL MISSOURI AND CARSON-NEWMAN (TENN.).

AFTER A GOAL BY JUNIOR MIDFIELDER PATRICK GUIER IN THE SHOOTOUT THAT PUT THE GOLDEN EAGLES IN A POSITION TO SEAL IT, KEEPER PAULO PITA CAME UP WITH THE STOP THAT MARKED THE MATCH WITH AN EXCLAMATION POINT. BOTH WERE NAMED MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER, GUIER ON THE OFFENSIVE SIDE AND PITA ON THE DEFENSIVE SIDE.

"PKS IS SOMETHING I'VE BEEN WORKING WITH," SAID PITA. "EVEN BEFORE I CAME TO THE UNITED STATES. IF YOU STUDY THE OTHER TEAM, THAT CAN BE A HUGE DIFFERENCE."

PITA HAD THE ADVANTAGE OF STUDYING LYNN FROM ITS SHOOTOUT IN THE SEMIFINALS AGAINST ROCKHURST UNIVERSITY TWO DAYS BEFORE.

THE MATCH ENDED SCORELESS IN REGULATION WITH BOTH TEAMS PLAYING DEFENSIVE-MINDED SOCCER. THERE WERE NO SHOTS ON GOAL IN THE MATCH UNTIL THE 32-MINUTE MARK.

IN THE FIRST HALF, THERE WERE ONLY TWO SHOTS ON GOAL. LYNN'S ALUN WEBB TRIED TO LOOP THE BALL OVER GOLDEN EAGLES KEEPER PITA OFF A SET PIECE, BUT PITA WAS IN PLACE FOR THE SAVE. THEN GOLDEN EAGLES FORWARD ETTORE BALLESTRACCI, COMING OFF THE BENCH, GOT OFF UC'S FIRST SHOT ON GOAL FROM THE LEFT SIDE, BUT LYNN KEEPER ALEXANDER ROTH MADE A DIVING STOP FOR THE SAVE.

"I WAS A LITTLE DISAPPOINTED BY THE WAY WE PLAYED IN THE FIRST HALF," SAID FIGHTING KNIGHTS COACH JOHN ROOTES. "WE GOT BULLIED A LITTLE BIT."

LYNN'S BEST CHANCE TO SCORE CAME WHEN ALUN WEBB BROKE THROUGH THE GOLDEN EAGLES LINE OF DEFENSE IN THE 64-MINUTE MARK, BUT PITA CAME OUT TO MEET HIM FOR THE SAVE ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE NET.

STRATFORD SAID HE WAS MOST NERVOUS THIS SEASON WHEN THE NCAA DIVISION II TOURNAMENT BEGAN BECAUSE THE GOLDEN EAGLES WERE COMING OFF THEIR FIRST AND ONLY LOSS OF THE YEAR AGAINST WEST VIRGINIA WESLEYAN IN THE MOUNTAIN EAST CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH. THE GOLDEN EAGLES THEN HAD TO TURN AROUND AND OPEN AGAINST THE BOBCATS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT AT THE REGIONAL LEVEL.

LEADING UP TO THE NATIONAL TITLE MATCH, HE DIDN'T FEEL THE SAME.

"I FELT REALLY GOOD WITH WHAT WE HAD SEEN [THIS SEASON]," SAID STRATFORD.

THE GOLDEN EAGLES ENDED UP TRAILING IN JUST TWO MATCHES THE WHOLE SEASON. THEY WERE BEHIND AGAINST MERCYHURST IN THE SEASON OPENER, THEN DIDN'T TRAIL AGAIN UNTIL THE MEC TOURNAMENT FINAL.

ON THE ATTACKING SIDE, THE GOLDEN EAGLES, WITH THEIR NEW 3-4-3 FORMATION IN PLACE FROM THE OUTSET OF THE SEASON, CRANKED UP THEIR PRODUCTION WITH A PAIR OF ROAD WINS IN PENNSYLVANIA AT MERCYHURST AND GANNON. FOLLOWING THAT UP WITH A PAIR OF HOME WINS AGAINST TIFFAN (OHIO) AND WHEELING JESUIT, THE GOLDEN EAGLES SCORED A WHOPPING 13 GOALS IN THEIR FIRST FOUR MATCHES OF THE YEAR.

WITH THE SHUTOUT, THE GOLDEN EAGLES EXTENDED THEIR SCHOOL RECORD OF 18 CLEAN SHEETS THIS SEASON. PITA ALSO BROKE THE SCHOOL RECORD PREVIOUSLY HELD BY PHIL ELIAS IN 1999 WITH 15 SOLO SHUTOUTS THIS YEAR.

**KANSAS CITY, MO.** -- THE UNIVERSITY OF CHARLESTON TOOK HOME ITS FIRST NCAA DIVISION II TITLE ON SATURDAY AFTERNOON AS THE GOLDEN EAGLES TOPPED LYNN, 3-1, IN PENALTY KICKS TO WIN THE 2017 TITLE IN MEN'S SOCCER.

THE TWO TEAMS PLAYED TO A 0-0 DRAW AFTER 110 MINUTES TO SEND THE GAME INTO PENALTIES. AFTER THE TEAMS TRADED MAKES IN THE FIRST ROUND, UC KEEPER PAULO PITA CAME UP WITH A SAVE TO START THE SECOND ROUND. ROBIN LAPERT STEPPED TO THE SPOT AND CONVERTED HIS ATTEMPT, AND PITA MADE ANOTHER SAVE TO START THE THIRD ROUND. PATRICK GUIER THEN CONVERTED HIS ATTEMPT FORCING LYNN INTO A MUST-MAKE SITUATION TO START THE FOURTH ROUND. PITA MADE THE SAVE AGAIN WHICH STARTED THE CELEBRATION IN THE CORNER FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF CHARLESTON.

CHARLESTON HAD AN EDGE IN SHOTS, 12-6, BUT BOTH TEAMS HAD SIMILAR SCORING OPPORTUNITIES AS THE FIGHTING KNIGHTS HAD THREE SHOTS ON FRAME AND THE GOLDEN EAGLES HAD FOUR. UC HAD THE ONLY CORNER KICKS IN THE GAME (2-0), AND LYNN WAS CALLED FOR 21 FOULS IN THE GAME COMPARED TO JUST 13.

## COLLEGE SOCCER: CHARLESTON MEN WIN 2ND NATIONAL TITLE IN 3 YEARS

UNIVERSITY OF CHARLESTON PLAYERS CELEBRATE THEIR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.

**PITTSBURGH** — FOR THE SECOND TIME IN THREE YEARS, THE UNIVERSITY OF CHARLESTON MEN'S SOCCER TEAM CAPTURED THE NCAA DIVISION II MEN'S SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP, BEATING CALIFORNIA STATE LOS ANGELES 2-0 SATURDAY AT HIGHMARK STADIUM.

SENIOR FORWARD FREDDY TRACEY SCORED TWICE WHILE SENIOR GOALKEEPER ALVARO UNANUA DEAN CAME UP WITH SIX SAVES, BUT IT WAS MOSTLY RESILIENCE THAT PUSHED CHARLESTON OVER THE FINISH LINE AT THE END OF A GRUELING SEASON AND TOURNAMENT TO EARN YET ANOTHER NATIONAL TITLE.

"I DON'T THINK IT'S GOING TO REALLY SINK IN FOR A WHILE," SAID UC HEAD COACH DAN STRATFORD. "IT WAS A STRUGGLE TODAY. AT THIS POINT IN THE TOURNAMENT, YOU DO WHAT YOU HAVE TO DO TO GET OVER THE LINE, AND WE DID THAT. THE COLLECTIVE BOND, ENERGY AND SELFLESSNESS THAT THIS TEAM HAS IS BETTER THAN ANY I'VE EVER COACHED. SOMETIMES, THAT'S ENOUGH, AND WE CAME UP BIG IN KEY MOMENTS OF THE GAME."

CAL STATE STARTED WITH SOME DEEP ADVANCES, BUT STRUGGLED TO CONNECT ANYTHING IN THE FINAL THIRD AS CHARLESTON'S BACK LINE AND DEFENSIVE SHAPE WERE KEEPING THE LANES CLOGGED.

CHARLESTON THEN TOOK ADVANTAGE OF A BALL THAT BOUNCED ITS WAY IN THE 9TH MINUTE.

THE GAME'S FIRST BIG MOMENT INITIATED WITH A LONG, VERTICAL CHARLESTON BALL OVER THE TOP THAT BROUGHT CAL STATE LA'S GOALKEEPER ALEXANDER BREMS OFF HIS LINE TO THE EDGE OF THE BOX. TRACEY WAS RIGHT THERE TO PRESSURE THE GOALKEEPER, GOT TO THE LOOSE BALL, THEN BROKE BEHIND BREMS AND INTO THE BOX FOR AN UNCONTESTED TAP-IN TO GIVE CHARLESTON THE 1-0 LEAD.

"GOING INTO THE MATCH, WE TALKED ABOUT HOW THE FIRST GOAL WAS GOING TO BE THE DEATH," STRATFORD SAID. "WE WATCHED CAL STATE PRIOR TO THIS MATCH AND SAW HOW GOOD THEY ARE DEFENDING WITH A LEAD. THEY'RE INCREDIBLY DIFFICULT TO BREAK DOWN. TO GET ON THEM AND OPEN THINGS UP MORE REALLY ALLOWED US TO BE IN CONTROL."

AFTER THE GOAL, CHARLESTON STARTED TO GET INTO AN EVEN BETTER RHYTHM IN PLAYING THE BALL THROUGH ITS STELLAR MIDFIELD, THEN STARTED TO USE THE SPACE ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE ATTACK THAT CAL STATE LA WAS LEAVING EXPOSED.

"WE SAW THAT, AND THAT'S WHERE WE'VE HAD THE MOST DEPTH, AND QUALITY. WE WANTED TO EXPLOIT THEM," STRATFORD SAID.

THROUGHOUT THE FIRST HALF, THIS WOULD BE THE PRIMARY CHANNEL THE GOLDEN EAGLES' EXPLOITED IN THE CAL STATE FORMATION, CONTINUING TO SEND NUMEROUS CROSSES, A HANDFUL COMING FROM THE LEFT FOOT OF JESUS CABANAS. STILL, AS STRATFORD APTLY POINTED OUT, CABANAS' CROSSES WERE PROBABLY COMING A LITTLE TOO SOON IN EACH PROGRESSION, AND DESPITE A HALF DOZEN SERVICES INTO THE BOX, CHARLESTON COULDN'T CREATE ANOTHER SHOT ON GOAL FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE FIRST HALF. CAL STATE LA NEARLY FOUND THE EQUALIZER IN THE 36TH MINUTE, COMING ON ANOTHER SEQUENCE FROM A LONG, VERTICAL BOUNCING BALL INTO THE BOX.

CAL STATE LA'S CARL SOLLI BOLTED TOWARD THE BALL AFTER GETTING BEHIND WILLIAMS N'DAH, BUT AS THE UC DEFENDER CLOSED IN ON HIM, THE FORWARD MADE A FEW NIFTY MOVES, CREATING A SHOT INSIDE NEAR POST THAT WAS SAVED BY A DIVING DEAN.

"[CAL STATE LA] ENDED THE FIRST HALF ON THE FRONT FOOT, AND HAD BELIEF," STRATFORD EXPLAINED. "THE THEME AT HALFTIME WAS YOU STILL HAVE A CHANCE TO LEAVE HERE WITH NO REGRETS, EVEN THOUGH WE DIDN'T PLAY OUR BEST THAT HALF."

CHARLESTON CONTINUED TO CONTROL POSSESSION IN THE SECOND HALF BUT HAD A HARD TIME PUTTING AWAY CAL STATE LA, WHICH CREATED A FEW MORE FAIRLY DECENT CHANCES TO BREAK THROUGH FOR THE EQUALIZER. THERE WAS A RARE GIVEAWAY IN THE MIDFIELD IN THE 58TH MINUTE, AS CAL STATE'S MORTEN BJERSTHOL ADVANCED AND FOUND ROOM FOR A BOUNCING SHOT ATTEMPT FROM 22 YARDS THAT TRICKED UP DEAN FOR A QUICK SECOND, BUT THE UC KEEPER RECOVERED TO POUNCE ON THE BALL.

DEAN FINISHED THE MATCH WITH SIX SAVES AND CAME THROUGH IN HIS TEAM'S TWO BIGGEST MATCHES IN YET ANOTHER CLEAN SHEET FOR HIS GOLDEN EAGLES SIDE.

"[DEAN] WASN'T TESTED A LOT THIS YEAR, BECAUSE OUR DEFENSE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING," STRATFORD SAID. "IN THESE LAST TWO GAMES, HE'S SAVED HIS BEST FOR LAST, IN THE BIGGEST MOMENTS."

FINALLY, UC PUT TOGETHER A VINTAGE SPECIAL ATTACKING MOMENT IN THE 74TH MINUTE. TAKING ADVANTAGE OF A CAL STATE TURNOVER AT MIDFIELD, CHARLESTON CONNECTED SEVEN PASSES FROM THE CENTER OF THE FIELD THROUGH THAT SAME LEFT CHANNEL THE GOLDEN EAGLES WERE EXPLOITING ALL MATCH LONG.

AND THIS TIME, CABANAS WAS A BIT MORE PATIENT, TAKING A FEW TOUCHES UP THE END LINE, THEN EXERCISED PRECISION WITH A HARD, LINING BALL TOWARD THE NEAR POST.

TRACEY MADE SURE HIS TEAMMATES EFFORT TO BUILD UP A QUALITY RUN INTO THE BOX WAS REWARDED AS HE BEAT HIS MAN AND BREMS TO THE BALL TO REDIRECT IT INTO THE BACK OF THE NET. THAT SECOND GOAL BY TRACEY BROUGHT HIS TEAM LEADING TOTAL TO 13 FOR THE SEASON. CHARLESTON'S SECOND GOAL WITH A LITTLE MORE THAN 15 MINUTES REMAINING SLAMMED THE DOOR ON CAL STATE LA'S CHANCES.
