Fast Facts

The University of Dayton football team closes the month of October at home Saturday when the Flyers host Butler.

The Flyers will look to have a strong finish to the season after dropping back-to-back games for the first time this year. After Butler, UD travels to Stetson and then plays Davidson at home.

UD is 3-4 and 2-3 in the Pioneer Football League. Butler is 2-6 overall and 0-5 in the PFL.

Next week, 14 Flyers will be nominated for the 2021 CoSIDA Academic All-America team. Nominees must be front-line players who carry a 3.30 or better grade point average. Eleven of the nominees are starters and the other three are special teamers.

GOOD NEWS WORTH REPEATING

The Flyers entered the season with the fifth-best winning percentage (.733, 162-59) in FCS football since 2000 AND have produced the most football Academic All-Americans (34) at any level of competition in the same time frame. The top five in winning percentage are North Dakota State (.801), Harvard (.7538), Montana (.7537), San Diego (.741) and Dayton (.733).

STREAKING

UD has not been shut out in a school-record 494 straight games, the best such active string in all of college football. The last team to shut out the Flyers was Marshall, 9-0, on Oct. 16, 1976. That is also the all-time FCS record.

PFL POWER

- The Pioneer Football League is in its 29th season. The original (and now the only) Division I strictly need-based football league began with charter members Butler, Dayton, Drake, Evansville, San Diego and Valparaiso.
- UD's 126-45 record is the best in PFL history.
- The Flyers' 12 league championships are more than any other PFL team. San Diego has 11.

SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

- Butler is second in the PFL in interceptions with eight.
- Defensive back Connor Reid leads the team and is tied for first in the PFL with three picks. He also leads BU in tackles this season with 50.
- Butler is second in the PFL in rushing yards per game (195.1). It's a combined effort, as six different Bulldogs average at least five carries and 25 yards a game.
- Running back AJ Deinhart leads the team with 357 yards on 62 carries (5.8 avg.)
- Quarterback Bret Bushka completes 61% of his passes (92 of 151) and has passed for 1,002 yards, with eight touchdowns and seven interceptions.
- His favorite target is wideout Yogi Flager, who has 35 catches for 561 yards (16.0 avg.). He has five of Butler's 10 touchdown passes this year. Flager was Preseason All-Pioneer Football League.
- Punter Luka Zurak is second in the league in punting average (40.1 yards per punt).

THE MAN AT THE TOP

- Rick Chamberlin is now in his 13th season in charge of Flyer football. His record is 96-44.
- He is third all-time in wins at UD, behind two College Football Hall of Fame members-- Mike Kelly (246 wins) and Harry Baujan (124).
- After coaching the Flyers to the FCS playoffs in 2015, Chamberlin was named the 2015 AFCA District Coach of the Year and the PFL Coach of the Year. He was the school's first AFCA District Coach of the Year, and his PFL honor was the ninth for a Dayton coach.
- Chamberlin is also in his 47th season as part of the Flyer football program. A Flyer All-American linebacker in his playing days, he has been a part of 390 of UD's 690 wins - 26 as a player, 268 as an assistant coach, and 96 as a head coach. He has also been a part of 511 of UD's 1,094 games.
- The Springfield, Ohio native is the 23rd head football coach since the program began in 1905. He is the first of the 11 modern era coaches to have lettered for the Flyers, and the second to be a graduate of the University of Dayton (Pete Ankney was the first alum when he coached in 1963 and 1964).
- Chamberlin, 63, had been on the Flyer coaching staff for 31 seasons before being named head coach. First as linebackers coach and then as defensive coordinator, Chamberlin helped mold the Dayton D's reputation for its preparation and execution.
- A four-year letterwinner (1975-78) for the Flyers, Chamberlin is the Flyer career record holder in tackles with 419.
- He was named to the Football Coaches Association Small College All-America team as a senior. Chamberlin was the third Dayton player to be named a First Team All-American, but the first defensive player. He joined the UD Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989.

THE MAN AT THE TOP IN THE PFL

- Rick Chamberlin is the winningest coach in Pioneer Football League history, with 72 wins.
- No other PFL coach has 60 league wins.

CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

- The Flyer co-captains for the 2021 season are junior running back Jake Chisholm, senior quarterback Jack Cook and senior safety Brandon Easterling.
- Senior safety Joe Bubonics is this year's special teams captain.

3 EARN PRESEASON NATIONAL HONORS

- Dayton's co-captains have also earned several national accolades in the preseason.
- Jack Cook is on the Stats Perform Walter Payton Award Watch List. The Payton award goes annually to the FCS offensive player of the year. Cook is also on the CFPA Watch List.
- Brandon Easterling is on the Stats Perform Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Buchanan award goes to the FCS defensive player of the year. Easterling is also a HERO Sports Third Team Preseason All-American.
- Easterling and Jake Chisholm are also on the Stats Perform Preseason All-America Third Team.

BEASTERLING

- Dayton senior safety Brandon Easterling is one of 35 players named to the Stats Perform Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Buchanan award goes annually to the FCS defensive player of the year.
- This is Easterling's second time on the Buchanan Watch List. He was a finalist for the award in 2019. He finished eighth in the Buchanan voting and was one of just two defensive backs in the top 10.
- He is the third Dayton player ever named to the Award's preseason watch list. Flyer James Vercammen was named in 2010 and linebacker Chris Beaschler in 2017.
- Easterling was a 2019 FCS All-American by HERO Sports, the Walter Camp Foundation, the Associated Press and STATS FCS.
- Stats Perform and HERO Sports both named him to their 2021 Preseason All-America Third Teams.
- The Fairborn, Ohio native led FCS in solo tackles (7.5) and was second in total tackles (12.7) by 0.058 tackles per game to Montana's Dante Olson.
- Easterling's nine turnovers acquired (six interceptions, three fumbles) were the most in FCS football in 2019. He also tied for second in interceptions per game (0.5) and tied for third in fumbles recovered (3).
- He etched his name in the record books with a 100-yard interception return at Drake on Nov. 16. He tied the UD game record with three interceptions in that game.
- His career-high 19 tackles vs. Duquesne last year were the most by a Dayton player since James Vercammen had 19 at San Diego in 2009.
- Easterling is also Dayton's first two-time semifinalist for the NFF's Campbell Trophy.
- In the season-opening win over Eastern Illinois, he led the Flyers in tackles (8, with 4 solo) and set up UD's last 10 points in the seven-point victory. After UD took a 7-3 lead, he forced a fumble in EIU territory and then returned a punt 29 yards back into EIU territory.
- He was named Pioneer Football League Co-Defensive Player of the Week after Eastern Illinois.
- He led UD with nine tackles (eight solo) in the Presbyterian win.
- He also led with 11 (seven solo) at Morehead.
- He led for the third game in a row with nine (seven solo) at Drake.
- Easterling led at Valpo with 10 hits (7 solo).
- Easterling's punt return average of 12.3 yards per return would lead the PFL and be 13th in FCS, but he is currently two returns short of qualifying.

CHISHOLM TRAIL

- Jack Chisholm is a Stats Perform FCS Preseason Third Team All-American as an all-purpose runner.
- In 2019, he led FCS in all-purpose yardage (204.3 yards a game) after carrying the ball 153 times for 1,129 yards (and eight touchdowns) while also catching 21 passes for 230 yards (and three touchdowns), and returning 29 kickoffs for a 23.6 yard average (with one 97-yard TD vs. Duquesne).
- That year Chisholm was named First Team All-PFL after finishing second in rushing (112.9) by .02 yards a game. He led qualified PFL rushers in yards per carry (.74).
- His 1,129 yards rushing was the seventh-best single-season total at Dayton, and he reached it despite starting just five of the 10 games he played in.
- In those five starts, he averaged 176.8 yards per game.
- He is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-American, and is just the 10th Flyer to be named an Academic All-American at least twice.

UNION JAKE

- Even though he only started five times in 2019, Union, Ky. product Jake Chisholm had six games of at least 100 yards rushing.
- He had his first career 100-yard rushing game against Jacksonville with 101 yards on just 10 carries (79 in the second half).
- In his first career start against San Diego, he had then-career highs in yards (117) and carries (17), with four receptions for 65 yards.
- In his second career start, he more than doubled both career bests with 35 carries for 268 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Morehead State.
- That was the second-most in a single game in UD history, behind Connor Kacsor's 301 yards vs. the Georgetown Hoyas in 2014.
- He had 151 yards vs. Marist, 142 vs. Drake and 166 against Butler to close out the year.
- Chisholm was the game's leading rusher (27 carries for 84 yards) and receiver (nine catches for 65 yards) in the Eastern Illinois win.
- He led UD with 66 yards on 19 carries at SIU.
- Chisholm had 52 yards at Morehead.
- He was named the PFL Player of the Week after he carried the ball 34 times for 144 yards and scored two TDs at Drake. He gained 13 yards in the first quarter, 19 in the second, 41 in the third, and 71 in the fourth quarter. He carried the ball 14 of Dayton's final 15 plays, gaining 64 yards and rushing for game-sealing touchdown.
- He ran for 68 yards and caught four passes for 77 yards against Marist.
- Chisholm is now 19th in UD career rushing with 1,710 yards.
- He leads the PFL in carries (154, 31 more than the next player) and all-purpose yardage (125.3). He is second in rushing (75.9).

COOKIN'

- As a redshirt freshman in 2018, Jack Cook was thrust into the lineup when incumbent starter Alex Jeske injured his knee and was out for the year in the first quarter of the first game.
- Cook appeared in all 11 games and started the last 10 in his first year on the field. He completed 170 of 280 passes (60.7%) for a total of 2,421 yards and had 20 touchdown passes while only throwing two interceptions in his first season.
- He was named to the HERO Sports FCS All-America Freshman Team and named PFL Offensive Freshman of the Year in 2018.

JACKED UP

- Jack Cook is currently fifth in active FCS career passing efficiency (153.2).
- He is one of 35 players on the Stats Perform Walter Payton Award Watch List. The Payton award goes annually to the FCS offensive player of the year.
- Cook is the fourth Dayton player ever named to the Award's preseason watch list. Quarterback Steve Valentino was named in 2010, running back Connor Kacsor in 2015 and Cook's favorite target in 2019, tight end Adam Trautman.
- Cook is also on the College Football Performance Award Player of the Year Watch List. He is the only PFL player on either list.
- Cook passed for a Flyer record 33 touchdowns in 2019. He quarterbacked the highest scoring team in FCS football in 2019 (42.6 ppg.) and led FCS in points responsible for per game (24.7).
- Cook completed 192 of 306 passes (.627) for 2,697 yards as a junior. Those 33 touchdowns came against just five interceptions. He was also UD's third-leading rusher (104 att., 470 yds., 4.5 avg., 12 TD) in 2019.
- In the Eastern Illinois win, Cook passed for the first touchdown and ran for the second. Cook was 18 of 32 passing for 134 yards (11-for-15 in the second half, for 85 yards) and also carried the ball 10 times for 46 yards.
- Was 14 of 24 passing (10-15 in the second half) for 131 yards at Southern Illinois.
- Cook accounted for six TD's (three of each) in the Presbyterian win. He was 19 of 35 passing for 262 yards, and carried the ball 10 times for 74 yards.
- He was 23 of 39 for 428 yards at Morehead.
- Cook was 21 of 29 for 183 at Drake.
- Against Marist, Cook was 20 for 28 passing for 250 yards, with a touchdown and an interception.

RECORD COOK

- Jack Cook has his name all over the Flyer football record book.
- He holds the single-game marks for passing yardage in a game (432 at San Diego in 2018) and TD passes (6 vs. Jacksonville in 2019).
- He also threw for a record 33 TDs in 2019.
- He has the second-best single-season marks in yardage, efficiency and total offense.
- On the career pages, Cook has thrown the most TD passes in UD history (61). He is second in efficiency (153.2, behind Kevin Hoyng's 158.1) and third in percentage (.617 to Brian Kadel's .626 and Dan Sharley's .618).
- Cook's 6,753 career yards are third. Next is Will Bardo at 6,803. Cook is also third in completions (493, behind Kevin Hoyng's 530). Cook is third in attempts (795). Hoyng is second (862).
- In total offense, Cook is also third (7,827). Will Bardo is second at 8,560.
- Cook's career highs are: completions 29; passing attempts 57; rushing yards 88; rushing attempts 17; rushing TDs 3; total offense 464; times sacked 4

ON THE RECEIVING END

- All but one Dayton receiver caught his first collegiate pass in the opener vs. Eastern Illinois.
- Tyler Mintz had 3, Joey Swanson and Sam Bubonics 2, and Kyle Hazell, Michael Neel and Luke Brenner each had one.
- Andrew Holderer and Mintz led UD with three catches each at Southern Illinois.
- Mintz led eight Flyer pass catchers in the PC win with five catches for 58 yards (46 YAC).
- Mintz also led UD at Morehead with six for 61. Joey Swanson had four for a whopping 151 yards. His 37.8 yards per catch were the third-best single-game mark in UD history.
- Swanson (65 yards) and Bubonics (40) led with five receptions at Drake.
- Bubonics had nine for 107 yards vs. Marist.
- Kyle Hazell led with four for 64 at Valparaiso.

NEW KIDS DOING THE BLOCKS

- Dayton's offensive starters vs. EIU featured nine first-time starters. Every offensive lineman who protected Jack Cook or opened holes for Jake Chisholm (the two returning starters) saw their first college action.
- The opening day starting quintet - tackles Brian Stevens and David Tkatch, guards Dylan DeMaison and Marc Rumpke, and center Mason McLaughlin - played all 75 of UD's snaps.
- A total of seven offensive players had seen college action prior to 2021, none on the line.
- UD has allowed just five sacks in six games.

FOR THE DEFENSE

- The UD defense had four new starters against Eastern Illinois, although one of the returnees, Joe Bubonics, is starting at safety after starting at corner in 2018 (he was injured in 2019).
- The other returning starters in the opener were safety Brandon Easterling, Flyer Zach Rumpke, corner Elijah Smith, corner A.J. Watson, linebacker Grant Dyer and tackle Kyle Finnick.

WHAT A RUSH

- Dayton has 16 sacks and 51 TFL after seven games this season.
- After seven games in 2019, the Flyers only had nine sacks and 26 TFL.
- In fact, UD has already topped its sack and TFL totals from 2019.
- Mike Stodola and Kyle Finnick lead the team with four sacks, while Chris Pepe has three.

JO BU

- Joe Bubonics started the last six games of 2018 at corner, but missed 2019 with an injury.
- The son of a coach, he instead became a mentor to the younger players who took over in his absence.
- He did such a good job of coaching them up that UD coaches were able to move him to safety, a position of need this season.
- Part of the Solon High School pipeline, he has changed his number to 7, worn famously by another Solon product, All-PFL wideout AND quarterback, Steve Valentino.
- Bubonics led the Flyers with 11 tackles (10 solo) with two TFL and a pass break-up.
- In the Presbyterian win, he had three tackles, an interception, three pass break ups and he recovered two of the Blue Hose's onside kicks.
- In the Drake win, he had five hits, a PBU and forced a fumble.

ZACH ATTACK

- Flyer Zach Rumpke is one of five Flyers named First Team Preseason All-PFL.
- Rumpke plays the "Flyer" position, UD's hybrid safety-linebacker position.
- In his very first college game, he was an unexpected hero in UD's win at 14th-ranked Indiana State.
- Subbing for injured captain Andrew Lutgens, Rumpke had eight tackles and the game-clinching interception with 18 seconds left.
- In 2019, he was third on the team in tackles (66). He led Dayton in sacks (3.0) and TFL (6.0). He was one of three players with two interceptions, and one of three with three PBU.
- At SIU, Rumpke had eight tackles and Dayton's only sack.
- He had nine tackles and two PBU vs. PC.
- Rumpke had seven tackles, a pass break up and had a 60-yard "pick-six" at Morehead.
- His second on the team with 53 tackles.

TAKE NOTHING

- Grant Dyer played in 10 games in 2019, with nine starts at linebacker.
- He was second on the team in total tackles (67), solo tackles (38) and TFL (4.5).
- He had a career-best 10 tackles in the win over Marist in 2019.

SCHMEISING, SCHMEISING

- Ohio State transfer Ben Schmeising made his first career start at linebacker at Morehead State, and had eight tackles with a TFL.
- He is tied for third on the team in hits (36).
- A former Buckeye walkon from Piqua, he graduated from OSU in three years and pursuing his MBA at Dayton.

LOGAN'S RUN

- Logan Tate got the first interception of the season (and his career) in the first quarter of the Eastern Illinois win.
- He had five tackles in the game (all solo).
- He had six (four solo) at SIU.

BOOK OF ELIJAH

- Elijah Smith had a career-high seven tackles (six solo) vs. EIU.
- He has started the last 10 games.
- He had his first career interception vs. PC.

PEPE PERFORMANCE

- Flyer defensive end Chris Pepe was named the PFL Defensive Player of the Week after getting seven tackles, three TFL, 2.5 sacks, a fumble recovery and a pass batted down.

SLAMMIN' SAMMY

- Placekicker Sam Webster was named First Team Preseason All-PFL, after a stellar season as a true freshman in 2019.
- He was named UD's top freshman in 2019, and earned Second Team All-PFL honors.
- For the season, Webster was 8-for-9 in field goals and 58 of 60 on PATs.
- Twenty-four of his 35 kickoffs were touchbacks.
- He was 6-for-6 in PAT's in his college debut at 14th-ranked Indiana State.
- His very first field goal was a 53-yarder at Robert Morris that helped earn him his first of two PFL Player of the Week honors.
- In the PFL in 2019, he was second in kick scoring (7.5 points per game) and he was the highest-scoring freshman in the league.
- This season, he is tied for third in kick scoring (6.0) and tied for second in field goals (1.0) in the PFL.

WELCOME MAT

- UD moved to Welcome Stadium in 1974.
- The word "Welcome" implies hospitality, but UD has been anything but to its opponents at home, where it is 235-54-2 (.811).
- The "Welcome" is not a greeting, but an honor to the late Percival Welcome, longtime AD for the Dayton Public Schools.

FLYER FAMILY

- Seven current Flyers have a direct relative who played for UD in the past (or are currently playing). They are Joe and Sam Bubonics, Niko DiGirolamo (dad Paul Kasprzycki), Tyler Mintz (uncle Judd), Marc Rumpke (dad Rob), John Sciaretti (uncle Matt and cousin Dominic) and Tyler Stylski (dad Mike)
- Current Flyers Marc and Zach Rumpke are distantly related, but Marc Rumpke and Mason Henry are first cousins.

LET'S TALK ABOUT THE NEW GUYS

- UD has 26 true freshman on the 2021 roster.
- 21 earned all-conference honors in high school
- 11 were all-district or all-region
- 10 were all-state

THERE ARE SOME OTHER "NEW" GUYS

- The 2021 season is the long-awaited Flyer game coaching debut for three assistant coaches. Offensive coordinator Jim Collins, offensive line coach Josh Hendershot and Flyers coach Jake Vellucci joined the program during the spring of 2020, but had yet to coach a game that "counts" until Eastern Illinois.
- Three staff members are also in the first year at UD - wide receivers coach Jordan Overton, Director of Football Operations Brooks Andersson and graduate assistant Mike Glass.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

- In the last 20 years, the University of Dayton football program has produced 34 Academic All-Americans, the most of any college team.
- UD has had at least one Academic All-American for the last six years. In 2020-21, Jake Chisholm was named to the first team, after being named to the second team in 2019. He is one of just nine football players to be Academic All-Americans in the last two years.
- Chisholm is also just the 10th Flyer to be named an Academic All-American at least twice
- He is a pre-med major with minors in Biology, Chemistry and Medicine In Society.
- Dayton has 64 football Academic All-Americans since the first one in 1970.
- Among schools playing Division I football, only Nebraska (107) and Penn State (66) have had more Academic All-Americans than Dayton's 64. Notre Dame (61), Ohio State (56) and Oklahoma (54) are next.

HITTING THE BOOKS

- The Flyers had 81 players on the 2020-21 PFL Academic Honor Roll, the most in the PFL for the 26th time in the 28-year history of the league. It was the 14th straight season UD had the most players on the honor roll.
- Dayton's current 991 APR score is the best in the PFL (for the seventh consecutive year), the best in Ohio and 11th in the nation.
- UD's GSR score of 97 is also the best in the PFL, the best in Ohio and is tied for 10th nationally.

3 AMONG 3,284 GRADS IN COLLEGE FB

- Linebacker Ben Schmiesing, Flyer Owen Smith and cornerback A.J. Watson are three of the 3,284 football playing student-athletes (out of approximately 70,000 players) who have already earned their undergraduate degrees.
- Smith and Schmiesing are pursuing MBAs, while Watson's degree is in Counseling.
- It's worth noting that Smith graduated Cum Laude with his Finance degree in three years.

DAYTON AND THE HAMPSHIRE SOCIETY

- The National Football Foundation has an initiative that honors seniors who complete their college careers with a minimum GPA of 3.2. It is known as the Hampshire Society.
- Dayton had nine players named last spring to the Hampshire Society.
- The Flyers are one of just 17 Division I institutions (and 26 overall) to have at least one senior qualify for membership in all 15 classes of the Hampshire Society. Dayton is also the only PFL member.

MAJOR FACTOR

• Of the 119 UD football players on the team, 73 are in the School of Business, 24 are in Engineering and nine are on a medical track.

DAYTON AND THE CAMPBELL TROPHY

- Among D-I schools, UD is one of just two institutions with a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, the major award of the NFF's Scholar-Athlete Award program (aka, the Academic Heisman) in the last 16 years. The other school is Bucknell.
- Safety Brandon Easterling was last year's Flyer semifinalist for Campbell Trophy, and he is also this year's semifinalist.
- In 2016, Flyer linebacker Christopher Beaschler was a national finalist for the Campbell Trophy.
- Beaschler and the 11 other finalists were honored at the NFF awards banquet at New York's Waldorf Astoria on Dec. 6, 2016.
- In 2007, safety Brandon Cramer was one of 15 finalists for the trophy.
- As finalists, Beaschler and Cramer earned an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship.
- Cramer was also the 2007 Division I football Academic All-American of the Year.

EYE ON THE NFL

- Adam Trautman is the starter at tight end for the New Orleans Saints.
- Brandon Staley is in his first year as the head coach of the Chargers.
- An interesting note is that the first NFL game was played between the Dayton Triangles and the Columbus Panhandles at Triangle Park, just four miles from the UD campus.
- Two UD football alums (Norm Skasteder and Red Werder) played in that game.

SUPER STAT

- When Jon Gruden coached the Tampa Bay Bucs to the 2003 Super Bowl win, he became the second UD grad to coach a Super Bowl winner. Former UD co-captain Chuck Noll won four as coach of the Steelers.
- UD became only the third school (now there are four) to have two alumni coach Super Bowl winners. The others are San Jose State (Bill Walsh and Dick Vermeil), Arkansas (Jimmy Johnson and Barry Switzer), and Eastern Illinois (Mike Shanahan and Sean Payton).
- UD has ties to 24 Super Bowl rings. In addition to Chuck Noll's four with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Jon Gruden's one with the Tampa Buccaneers, seven former members of Dayton coaching staff own a total of 18 Super Bowl rings between them. They are the late Len Fontes (New York Giants, Super Bowl XXI), Jon's father Jim Gruden (San Francisco 49ers, Super Bowls XXII & XXIV), John McVay (49ers, XVI, XIX, XXII, & XXIV), Tom Moore (Pittsburgh Steelers, XIII & XIV, Indianapolis Colts, XLI and Tampa Bay Buccaneers, LV), George Perles (Steelers, IX, X, XII & XIV), Joe Lombardi (New Orleans Saints, XLIV) and Scott Boyer (New England Patriots, XLIX, LI, LIII). McVay was the Flyers' head coach from 1965-72.

600 CLUB

- The Flyers were the 11th NCAA FCS team (and the first west of the Alleghenies) to win 600 games in its football history when they reached that milestone in 2008.
- The 24 members of the club, going into the 2021 season are: Yale (916), Harvard (879), Penn (861), Princeton (840), North Dakota State (748), Dartmouth (715), Delaware (708), Lehigh (700), Dayton (687), Lafayette (684), Northern Iowa (683), North Dakota (662), Colgate (660), Cornell (648), Holy Cross (642), Villanova (633), Drake (629), St. Thomas (623), Furman (619), South Dakota State (617) Brown (615), Eastern Kentucky (612), Montana (606) and Bucknell (606).
- Of the Top Ten 600 Club members, UD has played the fewest seasons (112, 12 fewer than North Dakota State).
- Dayton is one of five schools to be ranked in the top 10 in wins and winning percentage.

STATS DON'T LIE

- UD has won 20 of the last 22 games it has also won the turnover battle with its opponent.
- Dayton has scored at least 30 points in 16 of its last 17 wins.
