## POSTSEASON PARTICIPANTS

With their berth to the 2009 College Basketball Invitational, the Cougars earned their fourth postseason appearance during the last five seasons in 2008-09. It was the first time since 1989-93 that UH accomplished that feat. The Cougars earned back-to-back NIT bids in 2005 and 2006.

## ALL-CONFERENCE ACCOLADES

With steady performances throughout the 2008-09 season, guards **Aubrey Coleman** and **Kelvin Lewis** earned places on the All-Conference USA teams.

Competing in his first season at UH, Coleman was named to the First Team, while Lewis earned a place on the Third Team. The duo rank 3-4 in scoring in the latest C-USA statistical rankings, making the Cougars the only team to have two players rank that high.

It was the first All-Conference USA postseason honor for either player. It also marked the fourth straight season that two Cougars earned All-Conference USA honors.

## ALL-DISTRICT, ALL-AUBREY

Guard **Aubrey Coleman** earned several postseason honors when he was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 11 First Team and the United States Basketball Writers Association All-District VII Team.

He also was recognized as the Conference USA Newcomer of the Year.

With a team-high 19.9 points and 8.5 rebounds per game, Coleman is the only player in Conference USA to rank among the league's top-four leaders in both scoring and rebounding.

This season, Coleman has recorded 15 games with at least 20 points and posted three games with 30 points, including a career-high 38 points at Conference USA-rival Marshall on Feb. 18. He became only the 16th player in school history to score at least 30 points three times in a single season.

In addition to his scoring, he has proven to have a nose for the ball on both ends of the floor. He ranks among the league's top-four leaders in both offensive and defensive rebounding and tops all players in C-USA with 2.41 steals per game.

These were not the first awards that Coleman earned this season. He was twice named C-USA Player of the Week and earned C-USA Rookie of the Week honors five times this season.

## DOWN AND DIRTY

While guard **Kelvin Lewis** ranked among Conference USA's top-five scorers, fans should not overlook the defensive side of his game.

Lewis, who was named to the Conference USA All-Defensive Team for the first time in his career, ranks among the league's top-10 leaders in steals per game and was routinely called upon to defend Cougar opponents' leading back-court player.

Lewis limited UAB guard Robert Vaden – the 2008-09 C-USA Preseason Player of the Year – to only 10 points on 4-of-13 shooting and kept Rice's Rodney Foster to only five points on 1-of-5 shooting in 24 minutes.

## ACADEMIC HONORS

Forward **Sean Coleman** was named to the 2009 Conference USA Men's Basketball All-Academic Team on March 6.

Coleman, who holds a 3.33 grade-point average in sociology, competed in 18 games in 2008-09, garnering starts against Georgia Southern and Iowa State. He tallied a career-high six points against Mississippi Valley State and again against Alcorn State.

The Houston native also pulled down a career-high three rebounds on three occasions this season, most recently against Conference USA-rival UCF.

Coleman became the Cougars' first academic honoree since **Bryan Shelton** was named to the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll for the third straight season in 2004.

## ON FIRE FROM THE LINE

Although guard **Kelvin Lewis** deservedly received a lot of credit for his steady free throw shooting throughout his career, he does not currently stand as the Cougars' hottest player from the free throw line.

Entering the 2009-10 season, center **Nick Mosley** has nailed his last 22 free throw attempts. The streak dates back to the second half of the Cougar' 97-69 win at Conference USA-rival UCF on Feb. 4. Mosley hit his last attempts against the Knights in that game and has been perfect since.

He hit all six attempts against Tulane on Feb. 14 and another six straight in the rematch against UCF in Houston on Feb. 21.

After hitting all three attempts at Rice on Feb. 28, the Bellville native connected on all four attempts against No. 5/3 Memphis on March 4 and hit both attempts against SMU on March 7 for his current streak.

Although he has hit 87.9 percent (29-of-33) of his free throw attempts this season, Mosley has not always been so solid at the charity stripe. Entering this season, he had connected on only 19.0 percent (4-of-21) through his first two seasons. That included a 3-of-13 mark as a freshman in 2006-07 and only 1-of-8 in 2007-08.

Working with assistant coach **Jerry Hobbie**, Mosley has enjoyed one of the biggest improvements at the free throw line among the Cougars this season.

## IT NEVER GETS OLD

With performances at Conference USA-rivals Tulsa and Rice, guard **Aubrey Coleman** was honored March 2 as the league's Rookie of the Week. It was the fifth time he collected that honor from the league office in 2008-09.

Coleman scored 12 points and added a game-high five steals during Wednesday's loss at C-USA rival Tulsa.

He followed that with his team-leading 10th double-double at Conference USA-rival Rice on Saturday. The Houston native recorded 12 points with a game-high 12 rebounds to lead the Cougars

to a 56-51 win against the Owls.

During the Cougars' 15-2 run in the final 5:22, Coleman added four points to help UH rally from an 8-point deficit and earn their sixth straight win against the Owls.

### IRON MAN

Guard **Kelvin Lewis** has been a regular in the lineup throughout his Cougar career. Entering the 2009-10 season, the Fort Worth native has competed in each of the last 63 games with starts in each of the last 36 contests. Both streaks are the longest among current Cougar players.

However, Lewis does much more than just compete in those games; he finished them. In 2008-09, Lewis led all players in Conference USA, competing an average of 36.91 minutes per game.

### LETHAL WEAPONS I & II

With 35 points at Conference USA-rival No. 18/19 Memphis on Jan. 31, guard **Aubrey Coleman** tied the Cougar scoring season high. Fellow guard **Kelvin Lewis** set his career high with 35 points at Arizona on Jan. 24.

This marked the first time since the 1968-69 season that the Cougars could boast of two players who scored at least 35 points in a game in one season.

**Theodis Lee** and **Ollie Taylor** were the last teammates to score at least 35 points in a game. Amazingly, that latter Cougar duo accomplished the feat in the same game. Lee led the Cougars with 40 points, while Taylor chipped in with 35 points in a 118-97 win against UNLV on Feb. 6, 1969, in Hofheinz Pavilion.

### THE TRIFECTA

With a career-high 38 points at Conference USA-rival Marshall on Feb. 18, guard **Aubrey Coleman** enjoyed his third 30-point game in 2008-09. The Houston native connected on 16-of-30 shots from the field to set single-game highs in both categories and grabbed six rebounds with four steals while playing all 40 minutes.

He became only the 16th player in school history to record three 30-point games in a single season and just the 20th player to accomplish that feat three times during his career.

Coleman continues to lead the Cougars and ranks third in C-USA with 19.7 points per game.

### AT THE TOP OF THE LIST

With 19.4 and 18.0 points per game, junior guards **Aubrey Coleman** and **Kelvin Lewis** ranked third and fourth in scoring, respectively, in the final Conference USA individual statistical rankings.

The Cougars were the only team to have two players ranked in the top four in scoring. UTEP was the only team to be close to that distinction. Miner guard Stefon Jackson (24.5 ppg) ranked second, and guard Randy Culpepper (17.5 ppg) stood sixth in the league.

### BACK-TO-BACK FOR 30

With 30 points at Conference USA-rival UCF on Feb. 4, guard **Aubrey Coleman** recorded his second straight 30-point game (35, at No. 18/19 Memphis, Jan. 31). The Houston native also joined an exclusive group, becoming only the 10th player to accomplish that feat.

Coleman joined **Greg Anderson**, **Otis Birdsong**, **Don Boldebeck**, **Lyle Harger**, **Elvin Hayes**, **Sam Mack**, **Robert**

on Dec. 31, 1984.

In addition, his made total tied for the third-highest mark in UH single-game history. He equaled the 17 made by **George Walker** against Rice on Jan. 20, 1979 and trailed only the 18 made by **Dominic Smith** against Southern Miss on Jan. 23, 2002, and by **Ollie Taylor** against UC Santa Barbara on Dec. 30, 1969.

### TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS

Always a trademark of **head coach Tom Penders'** teams, the Cougars ranked among the nation's best in fewest turnovers per game.

In 2008-09, UH finished second among all NCAA Division I teams with only 9.8 giveaways per game and was one of only two teams (Notre Dame, 9.59) to average fewer than 9.85 turnovers per contest.

The Cougars have lowered their turnovers per game average in each of the last five seasons and etched their names in the UH records book. In fact, the team's 2008-09 turnover average and those of each of the previous three seasons ranked among the top-seven marks in UH single-season history.

While the Cougars average 17.9 points off turnovers per game, the team's lack of giveaways limit opponents to only 9.9 points off turnovers per game this season.

### (FAST)BREAKING IT DOWN

With the loss of five seniors from a year ago, **head coach Tom Penders** expected changes during the 2008-09 season. The fifth-year coach planned for a significant increase in fast-break points this season, and the Cougars lived up to those expectations.

Through 33 games, the Cougars have scored 314 points – or 9.5 points per game – on the fast break. UH has posted double-digits on the fastbreak in 14 games in 2008-09, including a season-high 30 points against Alcorn State on Nov. 18, 2008.

That total is a significant increase from 2007-08 when the team finished with only 5.6 fastbreak points per game.

### NO DIFFERENCE

Whether on the offensive or on the defensive side, guard **Aubrey Coleman** established himself as one of Conference USA's premier rebounders.

The guard ranked third in the league with 8.2 rebounds per game and placed among the C-USA top-seven leaders in both offensive and defensive rebounding.

He is the only player in Conference USA to rank that highly in both rebounding categories.

Coleman ranked seventh in the league with 2.61 offensive boards and was fourth with 5.76 defensive rebounds per game.

### ONE OF A KIND

Guard **Aubrey Coleman** was the only player in Conference USA to rank among the league's top-four leaders in both scoring and rebounding.

Coleman led the Cougars with 19.4 points and 8.2 rebounds per game. His totals put him fourth in the league in both categories.

### DOING IT ALL

With a team-high 19.7 points per game, three 30-point games and a 35-point effort at No. 18/19 Memphis on Jan.

**McKiver**, **Ollie Taylor** and **Rob Williams** as the only players to score at least 30 points in back-to-back games.

### TAKING ADVANTAGE AT THE LINE

It's called the FREE throw line for a reason, and the Cougars took advantage of their attempts from the charity stripe during their 94-86 win at Conference USA rival UTEP on Jan. 14.

The Cougars connected on 34-of-41 attempts from the free throw line against the Miners. It was a season high in both categories and the most free throws made and attempted since UH went 35-of-44 against C-USA rival Southern Miss on Jan. 23, 2002.

After freshman point guard **Desmond Wade** hit a jumper with 1:23 left in the game, the Cougars scored their last 14 points from the free throw line to ice the win. At one point in the second half, the Cougars drilled 22 consecutive free throws as a team and finished 25-of-31 from the line in the final period alone.

### CALM AND COOL

Guard **Kelvin Lewis** enjoyed a career day at Conference USA rival UTEP on Jan. 14... and that was just from the free throw line.

Lewis connected on 17-of-18 free throws against the Miners to set career highs in both categories. The Fort Worth native nailed each of his first 17 attempts before missing his final attempt with only 12 seconds remaining in the game. Fortunately, the Cougars had built a 93-86 lead by that time.

That miss snapped a streak of 22 consecutive free throws by Lewis dating back to the first half against C-USA rival UAB on Jan. 10.

Lewis' total set a Don Haskins Center record by an opponent, topping the previous record of 15 by Southern's Byron Gabriel



31, guard **Aubrey Coleman** earned a reputation with his offensive prowess.

However, there is much more to the Houston native's game than that. Although he regularly plays in the Cougar backcourt, Coleman ranked second on the team and among the Conference USA top-four leaders with 8.2 rebounds per game. In addition, he led the Cougars and all C-USA players with 2.34 steals per game.

In the Cougars' 71-63 win at Toledo on Dec. 20, Coleman recorded his first career double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds and added a game-high seven steals. In addition to his point total against Iowa State, Coleman pulled down seven rebounds with five steals to lead the Cougars in the loss.

In 2008-09, he led the team with 14 double-doubles after scoring a game-high 24 points with 12 rebounds against Conference USA-rival UTEP on March 12 during the C-USA Tournament quarterfinals.

**THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE**

Center **Marcus Cousin** continued to make his presence felt in 2008-09. The Baltimore native ranked fourth in Conference USA with 8.4 rebounds per game and finished third among the Cougars with 10.9 points per game.

Cousin also was one of only three Cougars (**Aubrey Coleman** and **Qa'raan Calhoun**) to enjoy a double-double in 2008-09, adding his eighth double-double with 14 points and a career-high 14 rebounds at C-USA rival SMU on Feb. 11.

However, his double-double total could have been much higher. He finished with nine points and 10 rebounds in the Cougars' 77-72 win against Conference USA-rival UCF on Feb. 21.

It was the fifth time this season that Cousin fell just one rebound OR one point shy of recording a double-double.

**TRIPLE DIGITS**

With 110 points against Alcorn State on Nov. 18, the Cougars enjoyed their first 100-point game since a 101-54 win over Prairie View A&M on Nov. 29, 2006.

The Cougars started the game with a 59-point first half, the most points the team scored in the opening stanza since putting 59 points on the scoreboard at Conference USA rival Tulane on Jan. 25, 2006.

With that, UH improved to 167-4 (.977) all-time during games in which they reach triple digits and won their 16th-straight 100-point game dating back to 1987-88 season.

**A CHIP OFF THE OLD BLOCK**

Guard **Kelvin Lewis** never needs to look into the stands to find his father during games; he only needs to check the Cougar bench.

**Kevin Lewis** is in his third season at Houston in 2008-09 as the senior associate coach. The elder Lewis works closely with the Cougar post players and assists in all recruiting.

He was a four-year letterman at SMU from 1982 to 1986, earning All-Southwest Conference honors as a senior.

**TO THE POINT**

Point guard **Desmond Wade** has been impressive early in his collegiate career.

In all but nine games this season, Wade dished out at least twice as many assists as turnovers. He also has recorded at least four assists in 15 games.

In the Cougars' win over Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 13, Wade posted a game-high eight assists with an uncharacteristic season-high four turnovers. However, he also tied his career high with 15 points against the Delta Devils.

This season, Wade is sixth on the team with 4.8 points per game but led the Cougars with 3.5 assists per contest – to rank 11th in Conference USA – and only 41 turnovers total.

In addition, he ranked second among all C-USA players with 2.76 assists per turnover, a total that stood fifth nationally in the latest NCAA rankings.

**DON'T OVERLOOK DESMOND**

At 5-8, point guard **Desmond Wade** easily was the shortest member of the 2008-09 Cougars team, standing four inches shorter than the next tallest player on the squad.

However, he is more than the smallest player on the 2008-09 team. He ranks as one of the shortest players to play in UH history.

Guard **Herbert Johnson** was the shortest player in UH history, competing at 5-5 on the 1963-64 team.

At 5-8, Wade joins a group of players, including **Calvin Murphy, Jr.** (1999-01), guard **Vinnie Caruso** (1972-73), guard **Denny Bishop** (1959-62), guard **Bryan Schisler** (1957-60), guard **Sam Sells** (1956-58) and guard **Bennie McMorrough** (1956-57).

However, of that group, only Murphy, Bishop, Schisler and Sells competed in games during their collegiate careers. In addition, Schisler was listed at 5-9 for his final two seasons in a Cougar uniform.

**LIGHTS... CAMERA... ACTION!**

For the 29th consecutive season, the Cougars appeared on television at least once during the 2008-09 campaign. This also marked the 11th straight season that at least three Cougar Basketball games will be televised.

In 2008-09, the Cougars posted a 2-5 (.286) record in televised games after falling 74-49 at No. 4/3 Memphis on CBS College Sports on March 13 during the Conference USA Tournament semifinals.

On March 12, CBS College Sports viewers were treated to the Cougars' 89-85 overtime win against No. 4 seed UTEP.

The Cougars earned first televised win with a 97-69 decision at Conference USA-rival UCF on Feb. 4 on CBS College Sports,

UH dropped an 83-68 decision at No. 18/19 Memphis on Jan. 31 in a game carried on CBS College Sports and fell 82-65 at Mississippi State in a game that was televised on CSS on Jan. 3.

The Cougars have been regulars on television during their all-time history, posting a 193-156 (.553) all-time record. In addition, UH has won at least two televised games in each of

the last seven years.

**TIPPING IT OFF FOR THE NATION**

The Cougars' first-round showdown against Georgia Southern during the 2K Sports Classic Benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer was more than UH's or GSU's season opener.

It also was the first NCAA Division I game of the 2008-09 season.

**TEAM CAPTAINS NAMED**

Guards **DaShaun Williams**, **Kelvin Lewis** and **Aubrey Coleman** were named team captains for the 2008-09 season.

**Head coach Tom Penders** and his staff selected the captains before the season opener against Georgia Southern.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

With 15 regular-season home games in 2008-09, the Cougars continued their recent success inside Hofheinz Pavilion, one of the nation's best home-court advantages.

In 2008-09, the Cougars won 12 of 15 home games. Those wins were not close with UH winning by an average of 21.3 points per victory (255 pts. in 12 games).

In 2007-08, the Cougars posted a 17-2 (.895) record on their home floor with only losses to No. 24 Arizona and No. 1 Memphis.

That loss to Arizona on Jan. 12 snapped a 17-game home winning streak dating back to Jan. 13, 2007. Included in that streak was an impressive 76-65 win over Southeastern Conference power Kentucky.

UH set a school single-season record with 19 home games in 2007-08, topping the previous high of 18 set by the 1972-73 and 1974-75 teams.

The team's 17 home wins was the second-highest total in UH single-season history, trailing only the 1972-73 team, which posted a perfect 18-0 mark.

In nearly 40 seasons at Hofheinz Pavilion, the Cougars have tallied a 442-129 (.774) all-time record.


**KEEPING THE FANS HAPPY**

With their 83-64 win against Conference USA-rival Tulane on Feb. 14, the Cougars improved to 10-2 (.833) during home games this season.

That marked the fifth straight season that the Cougars recorded double-digit home wins. It was the first time since 1988-93 that the Cougars reached double-digit wins in five straight seasons.

The Cougars have won posted at least 10 wins in six straight seasons since 1972-78.

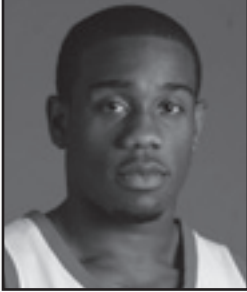

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### DIRECTIONS DAY CAMPS

From I-45 North and South exit Cullen proceed south entering into the campus. Pass through Elgin and the Athletics Complex is located on your right. The Athletics/Alumni Center is located inside entrance number 15G along with the Visitor Information Center.

#### OVERNIGHT CAMPS
