Southeastern (6-2) vs Houston (2-7)

Sunday December 8, 2024 • 1 p.m. Houston, Tex. • Non-Conference Game

The Southeastern Louisiana University women's basketball team will return on the road to face Houston Sunday afternoon at 1 p.m. for its final non conference game of the season.

The Lady Lions return this upcoming season ranked second in the Southland Conference Preseason Poll after a solid year of production and five added newcomers to bolster this season's roster.

Sunday's game will be televised on ESPN+. Live stats can be accessed on the women's basktball schedule page at http://www.lionsports.net/.

The Lady Lions returned a solid core of 10 returners from last season that finished 19-12 overall and 14-4 in SLC play. Southeastern continues to reload to progress the winning standard of the program as one of the top teams in the Southland Conference.

Southeastern secured a 47-point victory over Spring Hill College at home to improve to 6-2 in non conference play and 3-0 at home. SLU controlled the entire game with a dominant third quarter holding the Badgers scoreless. The Lady Lions gained a season high 47 bench points and 58 points in the paint. Freshman **Tyreona Sibley** led all scorers in diuble figures with 12 points and four assists as a spark off the bench. Seniors **Taylor Bell** and **Kaili Chamberlin** tied to contribute eight points in the commanding win. **Avari Berry** stepped up to lead the team with six assists while **Mackenzie Thomas** lead on the boards with seven rebounds.

SLU is seeking to close its non conference schedule with solid momentum heading into conference play. The Lady Lions are also looking to gain its first win over Houston within its series record led by **Alexius Horne** with 13.5 points per game and 3.5 rebounds. **Bell** (9.8 ppg), **Cheyanne Daniels** (8.4 ppg), **Lexi Alexander** (8.9 ppg) and **Arianna Patton** (7.5 ppg) are also key contributors for Southeastern that leads the Southland Conference in turnover margin (+7.13) and assist/turnover ratio (1.11).

Ayla Guzzardo, continues to push the Lady Lions to repeat last year's success.

Coach Guzzardo, a Hammond, Louisiana native, has built this program from the ground up since the 2017-18 season.

Guzzardo took over a program that was a combined 24-93 in the four seasons preceding her tenure. Her debut season saw the Lady Lions go 8-21 overall and 7-11 in Southland Conference play. SLU finished 9-20 in Guzzardo's second year before reaching its first accomplishment in year three.

The 2019-20 Lady Lions advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament for the first time since the 2011-12 season. SLU was set to face New Orleans in the first round. With both teams on the floor set for tip-off, the tournament was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The 2020-21 season saw Southeastern post its first winning season since 2009-10 and earn a No. 2 seed and a bye into the semifinals, where it lost a 79-77 heartbreaker to Sam Houston State.

Guzzardo's fifth season in Hammond saw the 2021-22 Lady Lions open the SLC Tournament with an 80-66 quarterfinal victory over New Orleans – the program's first conference tournament win since the 2001-02 season.

After earning a spot in the final with a 59-54 overtime win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in the semifinals, SLU fell to UIW, 56-52, in overtime. All the trials and tribulations of the previous five seasons made the break through for this season's squad that much sweeter.

Under Coach Guzzardo, the 2022-23 season made program history for the first time claiming the title of Southland Conference regular season and Tournament champion. The Lady Lions defeated Lamar in the SLC Tournament championship 66-57 to clinch their first NCAA Tournament bid. Southeastern move on to face up against Big Ten Tournament champion lowa at Carver-Hawkeye Arena in lowa City, IA.

The 2023-24 Lady Lions finished out with another successful season under the leadership of Coach Guzzardo to advance to the semifinal of the Southland Conference Tournament. Southeastern gained a record of seven consecutive wins to open conference play and closed out another season above a .500 winning percentage.

Scouting Houston

Southeastern will face the Houston Cougars for its last non conference game of the season. Houston averages 56.0 points per game and 33.7 rebounds. The Cougars have lost their last four games with a 61-57 loss to UT Arlington on the road.

Houston is led by fifth-year senior **Laila Blair** averaging 11.3 points per game and 2.9 rebounds. The Houston, Tex. native has contributed double-digit scoring in five-of-seven games so far this season and finished tied her season-high 18 points in the loss to UT Arlington.

Blair is not the only weapon for the Cougars. Redshirt sophomore **Gigi Cooke** is another key contributor for Houston averaging 11.0 points per game and 2.9 rebounds. Cooke has secured four games in double figures and a season-high 21 points against Rice.

Eylia Love also plays a crucial role for the Cougars, contributing 10.4 points per game and leads the team on the boards with 6.7 rebounds. Love also chips in on the defensive end and earns 2.0 steals per game to gain extra possessions.

Head Coach Ayla Guzzardo

Ayla Guzzardo was named the seventh head women's basketball coach in Southeastern Louisiana history on April 3, 2017. Guzzardo took over the helm of the program after spending the 2016-17 season as the lead assistant on the Lady Lion staff.

In her first season as the head coach at Southeastern, the Lady Lions posted their highest win total in both overall games and conference games since the 2013-14 season. Under Guzzardo's tutelage, senior guard Taylin Underwood was named to the All-Southland Conference, All-Louisiana and Southland All-Academic teams.

The Lady Lions topped their overall win total again in 2018-19. Guzzardo's second SLU roster was led by All-Southland and All-Louisiana selection **Celica Sterling**.

In 2019-20, Guzzardo led her squad back to the Southland Conference Tournament for the first time since the 2011-12 season. Sterling repeated as an All-Southland and All-Louisiana selection, while Alexius Horne became the first Lady Lion to be named Southland Conference Freshman of the Year.

The 2020-21 Lady Lions enjoyed their best season to date under Guzzardo, posting an 11-8 overall record and a 10-5 mark in Southland Conference play - the program's best marks in both overall and in league action since 2008-09. SLU earned a best-ever second-place finish in the Southland standings and earned a berth in the Southland Conference Tournament semifinals. Under Guzzardo's tutelage, **Morgan Carrier** and **Hailey Giaratano** both earned All-Southland Conference notice. Carrier was also named All-Louisiana, while Giaratano represented Southeastern on the Southland All-Academic team. The 2021-22 Southeastern squad took a further step forward, finishing 16-11 overall and 10-4 in conference play. SLU picked up their first two wins in Southland Conference Tournament play since the 2001-02 season and advanced to the SLC Tournament championship game for the first time in school

history. Senior forward **Caitlyn Williams** was the first Lady Lion to earn first team All-Southland honors since 2008-09 and was joined on the all-conference team by Carrier and Giaratano. Williams and Giaratano also earned All-Louisiana notice, while Giaratano repeated as a Southland All-Academic selection.

The 2022-23 Lady Lions won the first Southland Conference championship in program history under Guzzardo and finished out its best season yet 21-10 on the season and 14-4 in league play. Giaratano and **Alexius Horne** were named to the All-Southland Conference team, while **Natalie Kelly** and **Jen Pierre** were named to the SLC All-Defensive team.

In 2023-24, Southeastern enjoyed yet another incredible season with Guzzardo at the helm, posting a 19-12 overall record and a 14-4 mark in Southland Conference play for the second consecutive year. SLU finished third in the Southland standings and finished in the Southland Conference Tournament semifinals. **Giaratano** and **Pierre** repeated as All-Conference selections, Giaratano earned All-Conference First Team while Pierre became the first Lady Lion to earn SLC Defensive Player of the Year under Guzzardo. Giaratano and **Kennedy Paul** also earned 1,000 career points, the first time in program history two players have accomplished that feat in the same season.

The Hammond, Louisiana native began representing her hometown university after spending four seasons on the staff at Akron. During her time with the Zips, Guzzardo worked with the point guards and coached **Kasie Cassell**, who led the nation with 7.8 assists per game in 2012-13. Guzzardo also worked with four 1,000-point career scorers during her time in Akron.

In her last season with Akron, Guzzardo was a member of head coach Jodi Kest's staff that helped the team to its first-ever MAC Tournament championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. The 2013-14 Zips ranked among the national leaders in scoring offense (13th) and assists (7th), while **Hanna Luburgh** (22.2 ppg) and **Rachel Tecca** (22.1 ppg) was the nation's top scoring tandem.

Prior to joining the Akron coaching staff, she played two years for the Zips. As a senior, she was ranked among the MAC leaders in assists (4.2 apg, 3rd), assist/turnover ratio (1.3, 5th) and steals per game (1.7 spg, 15th). Her 133 assists in 2009-19 were the fifth-highest single-season total in school history and she is ninth in Akron history with 238 career assists.

Guzzardo began her collegiate playing career at Shelton State Community College. She helped her team to a pair of conference championships and a 62-9 record in her two seasons.

A graduate of Hammond's St. Thomas Aquinas High School, Guzzardo spent the 2014-15 season on the staff of her high school alma mater, helping the Lady Falcons to an appearance in the Top 28.

A 2010 graduate of Akron, she earned her bachelor's degree in business organization, before going on to earn her master's degree in 2012 in sport science and coaching. Guzzardo and her daughter, Cameron, reside in Hammond.
