READY for 2025-26

In 2025-26, Houston returns three starters and nine student-athletes from its team which advanced to the NCAA Tournament National Championship Game, competed in the NCAA Sweet 16 for the sixth straight season (the nation's longest active streak) or farther, set a school record with a 35-5 overall record and swept both the Big 12 Conference regular-season and tournament championships in only its second year in the league.

Head Coach **Kelvin Sampson**, who received two National Coach of the Year honors in 2024-25, enters his 12th season at the head of the Houston bench.

CAP and GOWN

- One member of the 2025-26 Houston Cougars Men's Basketball roster has already received his bachelor's degree
- Guard and four-year letterman **Ramon Walker Jr.** received his bachelor's degree in health in May 2025.
- He will do post-baccalaureate work in health in 2025-26.

BACK to 18 in the BIG 12

- After setting an NCAA Division I record with a 19-1 Big 12 Conference record a year ago, Houston and the league will return to an 18-game schedule in 2025-26.
- The Cougars joined Duke as the only school in NCAA Division I history to win 19 conference games in a single season.

LOOKING for EIGHT STRAIGHT

- Houston looks to extend its record-setting NCAA Tournament streak in 2025-26.
- Entering the 2025-26 season, the Cougars have competed in seven consecutive NCAA Tournaments (2025 National Championship Game, 2024 Sweet 16, 2023 Sweet 16, 2022 Elite Eight, 2021 Final Four, 2019 Sweet 16, 2018 Second Round) (The 2020 Tournament was not held due to the COVID pandemic).
- In a program history which features 26 NCAA Tournament berths and seven NCAA Final Four appearances, Houston has never competed in eight straight NCAA Tournaments.
- The Cougars have competed in 4+ straight NCAA Tournaments five times during the program's history: 2018 to present; 1981 to 1984; 1970 to 1973 and 1965 to 1968).

HOME SWEET HOME

- For the eighth straight season, the beautiful Fertitta Center will be the Cougars' home.
- A year ago, the Cougars posted a 16-1 record inside the Fertitta Center.
- Houston has won 38 of its last 39 home games. Only an 82-81 loss in overtime to #22/19 Texas prevents a longer Cougar winning streak.
- Since 2015-16, Houston has posted a 155-15 home record, including a 109-7 mark inside the Fertitta Center.
- Houston sold out all 17 home games in 2024-25, averaging 7,084 fans in the 7,035-seat Fertitta Center. The Cougars have sold out their last 33 home games and 54 of the last 55 entering the 2025-26 season.

NUMBERS NOTES

- The Cougars have one jersey number changes in 2025-26.
- After wearing #2 during his first two seasons, junior center **Cedric Lath** will #8 this season. He will become the second Cougar to wear that number, joining guard **Mylik Wilson**, who wore #8 in each of the previous two seasons.
- Among the 2025-26 newcomers, freshman guard **Isiah Harwell** will wear #1 while freshman point guard **Kingston Flemings** will don #4. Freshman forward/center **Chris Cenac Jr.** will wear #5 while freshman guard **Bryce Jackson** will become the first Cougar in school history to sport #6. Senior center **Kalifa Sakho** will wear #14 this season.

PLAYERS ERA FESTIVAL

- For the second straight season, Houston will compete in the innovative Players Era during Thanksgiving week in Las Vegas.
- The complete 2025 Players Era schedule, venue and broadcast information will be announced soon.

- Houston will face Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado, Kansas State, UCF and West Virginia once each in the Fertitta Center and will hit the road to take on BYU, Iowa State, Kansas, Oklahoma State, TCU and Utah
- A full Big 12 schedule with game dates, times and broadcasting networks will be released soon.

HEAD COACH KELVIN SAMPSON

- Head Coach **Kelvin Sampson** begins his 12th season at the head of the Houston bench in 2025-26.
- In 11 seasons with the Cougars, Sampson has transformed Houston into one of the nation's elite programs.
- Sampson stands as Houston's second-winningest coach in program history (trailing only Hall of Fame **Coach Guy V. Lewis**) and enters the 2025-26 campaign with a 299-84 record with the Cougars and a 799-354 overall mark. He also ranks as the second most-tenured coach in program history, trailing only Lewis.
- After leading the Cougars to a 35-5 record and a sweep of the Big 12 regular-season and tournament championships in 2025-26 for the program's school-record fourth straight 30-win season, Sampson was named the National Coach of the Year by CBS Sports and *The Sporting News*.
- Sampson also was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year by the league and the Associated Press for the second straight season.
- It was his 12th Conference Coach of the Year recognition from his fifth different league.

• With his first win during the 2025-26 season, **Head Coach Kelvin Sampson** will reach a significant milestone in his award-winning career.

• With that first victory, Sampson will reach 800 wins in his career. He will become the 17th coach in NCAA history (among coaches with 10+ years at Division I level) to reach that total.

• With that initial season win, Sampson also reach 300 wins during his Houston career. Only Hall of Fame **Coach Guy V. Lewis** (592 wins, 1956-86) led his teams to more victories as a Cougar.

• Sampson is the only coach in program history to lead the Cougars to five, six, seven, eight, nine and 10 consecutive 20-win seasons as well as five 30-win seasons (including each of the last four) during his career.

• With 30 wins in 2025-26, Sampson will join Gonzaga's Mark Few as the only coaches in NCAA Division I history to lead their teams to five straight 30-wins campaigns.

STAFF CHANGES

• As the Cougars prepare for the 2025-26 season, fans will see one change on the bench.

• **Assistant Coach Mike Ekanem** joined **Head Coach Kelvin Sampson's** staff during the summer after spending the previous season at Oklahoma State.

Ekanem – whose last name is pronounced E-Kon-Um – has previous stops at George Mason (2023-24), Sam Houston (2022-23), Arkansas (2021-22), Texas A&M (2019-21), Nevada (2018-19), Memphis (2014-18) and Louisiana Tech (2013-14 as assistant coach with Women's team).

• He will work closely with the Houston front-court this season.

• Ekanem follows **Quannas White**, who left the program in April to become head coach at Louisiana.

THREE-MAN RETURNS

• Senior guard **Emanuel Sharp** returns for this senior season with the Cougars during the 2025-26 season.

• A year ago, Sharp averaged 12.6 points per game to rank second among the Cougars and finished among the Big 12 leaders with 2.6 3-pointers and a .407 3-point field goal percentage.

• The Tampa, Fla., native raised his play in the postseason as the Cougars advanced to the NCAA National Championship Game for the first time since 1984.

• Averaging 20.7 points, 4.0 3-point field goals, 4.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals per game, Sharp helped lead Houston to wins over (16) Colorado, #17/18 (4) BYU and rv/#24 (3) Arizona to capture the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship title, the first in Houston Athletics history.

• Sharp also joined Houston Men's Basketball's 1,000-Point Club and enters the 2025-26 season ranked 40th in school history with 1,130 points.

HOME SWEET HOME

Since 2015-16, the Cougars have posted a 155-15 (.912) record while competing in three different home venues, including a 128-7 (.948) mark in the last 7+ seasons.

• Sharp also has played in 107 games during his Houston career to tie for 28th in school history and looks to rise higher in that category.

MILOS is the MAN

• Senior point guard **Milos Uzan** electrified Cougar fans with his decision in late May to withdraw from the NBA Draft and return for his senior season in 2025-26.

• Competing in his first season with the Cougars a year ago, Uzan averaged 11.4 points per game to rank third on the team and posted a team-high 4.3 assists per game to rank among the Big 12 leaders.

• He was one of only two Cougars to start all 40 games to set a school single-season record and ranked 11th nationally with a 2.98 assist-turnover ratio.

• Uzan was named to the All-Big 12 Conference Second Team and earned a place on the Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team as the Cougars claimed their first Big 12 tournament title in school history.

• Emerging as one of the nation's top defensive players a year ago, forward **Joseph Tugler** returns for his junior season in 2025-26.

• A year ago, Tugler was one of five Cougars to compete in all 40 games, setting a school single-season record.

• The Monroe, La., native proved to be a defensive force throughout the year, leading the Cougars with 77 blocked shots and grabbed 5.9 rebounds per game, the second-highest total on the team.

• He swatted multiple shots in 23 games with a career-high eight blocked shots against #9/9 Alabama during the first day of the Players Era Festival in Las Vegas on Nov. 26.

• He became only the sixth different Cougar to block 8+ shots in a game, joining **Hakeem Olajuwon, Dwight Jones, Bo Outlaw, Emmanuel Adeife and Anwar Ferguson.**

- Center **Jacob McFarland** will be a sophomore for the Cougars when the 2025-26 season tips off.
- After sitting out the 2023-24 season as a redshirt, McFarland was preparing for the 2024-25 campaign when he suffered a broken right leg during preseason practice in late October 2024.
- Following surgery and a successful rehabilitation, McFarland joined his teammates for summer workouts in June.
- At 6-foot-10, McFarland is tied with senior center **Kalifa Sakho** as the tallest student-athlete on the Cougars' 2025-26 roster.
