THE OPENING KICKOFF

TONIGHT'S MEETING

» Friday marks the first meeting between Houston and Texas Tech where both teams are ranked since 1989 when #13 Houston beat #20 Texas Tech inside the Astrodome 40-24. The Cougars have won each of the last five meetings when Houston has been ranked (2009, 1990, 1989, 1988, 1979).

EXPECTATIONS A PLENTY

» Houston is coming off its first 10-win season since 2021 and third since 2015 after the Cougars opened the season winning its first four games and were the only team in the country that went 6-for-6 on the road. Houston has never won 10 games in back-to-back seasons.

» Houston is ranked in the top 25 in both the AP Poll (#22) and the USA Today Coaches Poll (#23) for the third consecutive week.

» Houston and Texas Tech will play each other in a ranked matchup for the first time since 1989.

STARTING STRONG

» Houston's 591 yards of total offense were the most by Houston were the most since posting 710 yards against SMU in 2022 and marked the first time Houston has recorded 500+ yards in consecutive games since Nov. 19 and Nov. 29 against East Carolina and Tulsa in 2022.

» Houston's 533 yards of total offense (228 rush, 305 pass) were the most yards in a season opener at home since compiling 621 yards (266 rush, 355 pass) in a 52-24 win over Tennessee Tech inside TDECU Stadium on Sept. 5, 2015. The 533 yards of total offense was the most by Houston since posting 538 yards (186 rush, 352 pass) in a 38-7 win over Sam Houston on Sept. 23, 2023.

» Six different Cougars recorded rushing touchdowns, and were led by walk-on sophomore running back Zane Smith's 69 rushing yards in the second half. The six different Cougars with rushing touchdowns marked the first time 5+ Cougars scored rushing touchdowns since at least 1995 where data is available.

» Two Houston running backs scored rushing touchdowns, the first game with two Cougar running backs scoring rushing touchdowns in the same game since Nov. 19, 2022 against East Carolina.

HOUSTON 35, ARMY 21

Anthony Evans ran for 282 yards and two touchdowns Saturday night as Houston got two late scores to beat Army 35-21. Evans ran 34 times for 282 yards as the Cougars rushed for 369 yards. Evans was 18 yards shy of the school record, set by Joffrey Reynolds in 2002. Vincent Marshall caught a 44-yard touchdown pass from Kevin Kolb with 6:38 left, then Jackie Battle scored on a 28-yard run three minutes later to put the game out of reach. Kolb completed 20 of 33 passes for 278 yards with a touchdown and an interception for Houston, which had 647 yards of offense.

TEAM NOTES

TIGHT END U(NIVERSITY)
» Houston had arguably the best tight end in the country in 2025 and then went copy-paste with transfer **Patrick Overmyer** in 2026. The 6-5 tight end from Kingwood, Texas hauled in 84 receiving yards in the season opener – third most in the country, second most in the Power 4.

CONTROL THE RUNNING GAME
» Houston has dominated on the ground over the first two games of the season posting 225+ yards of rushing in back-to-back games for the first time since 2019 when Houston rushed for 225+ yards in five consecutive games. Houston rushed for 388 yards against Southern, the most since rushing for 399 against UNLV in 2014.

» Six different Cougars found the endzone on the ground against Southern for six scores, the most rushing touchdowns in a game since Houston rushed for six TDs against Lamar in 2016.

» The Cougars dominated the running game in their opener against Oregon State, outgaining the Beavers on the ground 228-26, the most rushing yards by Houston in a season opener since rushing for 241 against Oklahoma in 2019.

» Houston has rushed for 200+ yards in six consecutive games – the longest active FBS streak. Houston’s streak with 200+ rushing yards is its longest since an 11-game stretch between 2014 and 2015, and one shy of the longest by any Big 12 program over the last decade.

ROAD WARRIORS
» Houston entered the 2026 season with the third-longest road winning streak in the country and the longest streak in the Big 12 after winning six road games in 2025. Following Week 2, Houston’s 6-game winning streak away from Houston leads the nation. The Cougars’ first road test in 2026 will be at defending Big 12 Champion Texas Tech in Week 3.

BATTLE TESTED AWAY FROM HOME
» Over the last five seasons, Houston has been one of the best among Power 4 schools on the road, winning 18 games away from TDECU Stadium – the third-most nationally. The Cougars’ 18-12 road winning percentage (.600) is the 14th best in the country and second best in the Big 12 Conference.

TEAM NOTES

MAKHI HUGHES BOUNCED BACK

» Senior running back **Makhi Hughes**, one of the nation's best running backs heading into 2026, bounced back in a big way in his reunion with head coach Willie Fritz in Week 1, rushing for nearly 100 yards (98) and a touchdown. His 2,991 rushing yards is third-most by active running backs in the country after he rushed for 44 yards in Week 2 against Southern and finished the game nine yards shy of 3,000 career rushing yards.

» Hughes rushed for 1,300+ yards in each of his first two seasons at Tulane. The Birmingham, Ala., native averages 5.3 rushes per carry and scored 15 touchdowns in 2024 at Tulane. Hughes was an Freshman All-American in 2023 and a two-time All-AAC selection while at Tulane.

» Makhi Hughes is coming off his 23rd career game with at least 60 rushing yards, tied for the most of any active FBS player (Cam Edwards, Ismail Mahdi). Hughes ranks third among active FBS players with 2991 rushing yards.

NEW AND IMPROVED OFFENSIVE LINE

» Two starters return to the offensive line in 2026, an increase from 2025 when Houston replaced four starters. The new additions in 2026 however are all All-Conference selections, including a two Freshmen All-Americans. A former walk-on at Purdue, **Anthony Boswell** (Toledo transfer) will be Houston's starting center. Coach Fritz says Boswell is the best center he has ever had in his 34 years coaching. Left guard **Shadre Hurst** rejoins Coach Fritz and Coach **Eman Naghavi** from Tulane following three seasons, including a Freshman All-America nod in 2023. At right tackle, **Drew Terrill** joins the Cougars from Miami (Ohio) where he, along with Boswell, was an All-MAC honoree.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT IN HOUSTON

» Houston's future at quarterback is very bright with #1 overall high school recruit **Keisean Henderson** waiting patiently for his turn to run the offense. Henderson will be the backup in 2026 but has dazzled in Spring and Fall Camps with his arm strength and athleticism. Henderson was the MVP of the Navy All-American Bowl and enrolled early, even participating in select meetings and practices ahead of Houston's bowl game in December.

TEAM NOTES

YEAR 3 OF WILLIE FRITZ

» **Willie Fritz**, the back-to-back American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year who is in his 34th season of collegiate head coaching experience, and his third year with the Cougars. Fritz was named the 16th head coach in University of Houston football history on Sunday, Dec. 3, 2023.

» The 2025 season, Year 2 of the **Willie Fritz** era, featured one of the greatest turnarounds in program history as the Cougars won 10 games for the first time since 2021 winning six more games than in Coach Fritz's first season, the third largest turnaround in school history and tied for the largest turnaround in the country in 2025. Houston capped its season by winning the Kinder's Texas Bowl against LSU and featured the Cougars highest ranking since 2021, a ranked road win for the first time since 2017 and five late game wins or comebacks that thrilled fans all season long.

» The Shawnee Mission, Kan., native owns nine career 10-plus win seasons and seven conference championships. Fritz's team enters this weekend as one of only five in the FBS that has not had more than 70 penalty yards in at least 22 consecutive games, along with Army (32), Wisconsin (30), Iowa State (29) and Indiana (28).

» Houston added 34 newcomers in the spring, the fewest in the **Willie Fritz** era.

ON AN ISLAND, BUT NOT ALONE

» Houston has quickly established itself as a top secondary in the country after two weeks. Fifth year cornerback Jalen Mayo leads all Power 4 cornerbacks with a 84.2 defense grade (min. 90 snaps). Teammate Javion White, both in their first season at Houston, ranks eighth among Power 4 cornerbacks with a 76.5 defense grade. Opposite Mayo, fellow cornerback Will James ranks 45th in Power 4 with a 67.3 defense grade.

COMEBACK ARTISTS

» Since 2021, only four programs have won when trailing by 7+ entering the fourth quarter than the Cougars. Houston's 20% comeback rate ranks fifth in FBS, even trailing in 25 games. The four schools with better comeback win rates, Georgia (44%, but fewer than 5 games), Oregon (>35%, 12 games), Clemson (>25%, 14 games) and Iowa (>20%, 16 games). Ohio State has a 20% comeback rate but has done so just once in five chances since 2021. One of Houston's four wins when trailing by 7+ entering the fourth quarter since 2021 came at Oregon State in 2025, the Cougars season opening opponent in 2026.

THE HURST LOCKER

» Guard **Shadre Hurst** is arguably Houston's best offensive lineman in the modern era. The lowest-ranked recruit in Willie Fritz's 2022 class at Tulane, has blossomed into an All-American, Lombardi Trophy Watch List and Outland Trophy Watch List selection and potential future NFL Draft Pick.

» Hurst has boasted 1,215 career snaps entering 2026 and has allowed just one sack during his three seasons as a starter (2023-25). During that span, the Cartersville, Ga., native has posted an 80.0 pass block grade – the second-best grade among players with 1,200 snaps and less than 2 sacks allowed.

» Houston leads the Big 12 returned starters with six back on both sides of the ball – the conference returned just six starters on average. Houston's returning starters are: QB **Conner Weigman**, WR **Amare Thomas**, WR **Koby Young**, WR **Harvey Broussard**, OL **Alvin Ebosele**, OL **McKenzie Agnello**, DB **Kentrell Webb**, DB **Jordan Allen**, DB **Will James**, LB **Sione Fotu**, JACK **Brandon Mack II**, and DL **Khalil Laufau**.

TALENT PRODUCING UNIVERSITY

» Houston was one of 26 schools to have a player drafted in both the 2026 NFL Draft and NBA Draft. Houston Football's Tanner Koziol was selected in the Fifth Round by the Jacksonville Jaguars while three Houston Men's Basketball players were selected – Kingston Flemings (1st, 8th overall), Chris Cenac Jr. (1st, 27th overall) and Emanuel Sharp (2nd, 45th overall). WEIGMAN NOTES

QB1 RETURNS

» Quarterback **Conner Weigman** is one of the best signal callers in the Big 12 and nation following a breakout junior season for the Cougars in 2025 where he accounted for 36 total touchdowns – 25 passing and 11 rushing – which led the Big 12 and was seventh-most in the nation. Weigman's 3,405 yards of offense were the 12th most by a Cougar QB since 1996 and the most since 2021 – his 700 rushing yards were the second most by a Houston QB since 1996 and his 36 total touchdowns were the seventh-most since 1996.

» Among returning Big 12 quarterbacks, Weigman's 25 passing touchdowns is second in the league, his 11 rushing touchdowns are tied for the most in the conference, his 2,705 passing yards are third in the Big 12 and his 700 rushing yards leads the league, his 65.2 completion percentage leads returning Big 12 QBs and his 147.1 QB rating ranks second.

BIG WEIG

» Conner Weigman lit up the Houston sky in the season opener with 305 yards through the air. Six of Weigman's 20 completions went for 20+ yards, the second-most in the Big 12 following Week 1 – fourth-most in the nation.

» Half of Weigman's deep passes were to his favorite receiver, Amare Thomas, whom hauled in three 20+ yard receptions, while two went to tight end Patrick Overmyer and the sixth to receiver Koby Young.

GIVE HIM SOME LOVE: HE'S BETTER THAN YOU THOUGHT

» Since 2021, there have been 17 quarterbacks to win 10 games while compiling 3,000 yards, 35 touchdowns and 10 or fewer turnovers. That list includes nine first-round draft picks, 11 Heisman finalists, five QBs who played for a national title and two currently active players: Conner Weigman and Arch Manning.

» Weigman is 20-7 as a starter. Since 2020, the only quarterbacks with 25 or more starts and a better win percentage to not start at least one playoff game: Jordan Travis, Kyle McCord and Spencer Sanders.

» Only two Power 4 quarterbacks had more rushing touchdowns than Weigman in 2025 – neither will play in 2026.

» Conner Weigman has been responsible for multiple TDs (pass+rush+rec) in 14 games since the start of last season, tied with Dari-an Mensah for the most in the FBS. Weigman's 41 total TDs (run+pass) in that time are tied for fifth most among active FBS players.

ADDED WIDEOUT OPTIONS

» Of the 15 receiving touchdowns by Houston wide receivers in 2025, **Amare Thomas** caught 12. In the offseason, Houston added receiver depth to open up the passing game. The additions of senior **Trent Walker** from Oregon State, and sophomore **Muizz Tounkara** from Florida give Houston weapons around Thomas in addition to junior **Koby Young** and senior **Harvey Broussard**.

OFFENSIVE OVERVIEW

Houston's offense will look to expand under second-year offensive coordinator Slade Nagle who helped orchestrate Houston's 10-win season and improvement in nearly every offensive statistical category.

The Cougars return quarterback **Conner Weigman**, who was healthy for the first offseason and spring of his collegiate career, wide receiver Amare Thomas, who was an All-American, along with two additional starting wide receivers and two starters on the offensive line. The returning core, plus the addition of Houston's best recruiting class in school history put Houston in a great position to improve on the 10-win 2025 season.

QUARTERBACK

» Houston has one of the most talented quarterback 2-deep in the country, with two five-star quarterbacks in the room, led by senior **Conner Weigman** and #1 overall high school recruit freshman Keisean Henderson, to go with transfer Luke Carney, Jake Sock and walk-ons Canon Toon and Ryan Smith.

» Houston had to replace the offensive production of Dean Connors whose 977 rushing yards were the most by a Cougar since 2015 but returns junior **DJ Butler** who came on strong late in 2025 and adds two stellar backs in senior **Makhi Hughes**, who reunites with head coach **Willie Fritz**, offensive coordinator **Slade Nagle** and running backs coach **Jordy Joseph** from their time at Tulane. The Cougars also added four-star running back John Hebert who rushed for over 8,000 career yards in high school. Hughes was a two-time All-AAC selection and a Freshman All-American at Tulane. Junior **Re'Shaun Sanford II** returns after missing his second season due to injury.

Overmyer was one of 11 tight ends in 2025 with a receiving touchdown and a rushing touchdown.

Thomas is flanked by letter-winning returners **Harvey Broussard**, **Koby Young** and **Jaquise Martin**. The re-turners are supported by plenty of star-powered transfers **Trent Walker** (Oregon State), **Muizz Tounkara** (Florida) and **Tyson Turner** (Texas Tech) along with freshman additions of four-star recruit **Jeremiah Bushnell** and three-star **Keavon Roberts**.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Houston once again rebuilt the offensive line in the offseason, but this season brought in award winning starters to protect potentially the best quarterback in the Big 12. The Cougars added Tulane guard **Shadre Hurst**, who reunites with offensive line coach **Eman Naghavi** and head coach **Willie Fritz**, center **Anthony Boswell** and tackle **Drew Terrill**. All three were all-conference picks at their previous school and Boswell was a Freshman All-American. The three join tackle **Alvin Eboese** and guard **McKenzie Agnello**. The 2026 season is **Austin Armstrong**'s 10th coaching Division I football and sixth as the defensive coordinator. Armstrong returns six starters on defense and added three transfers with College Football Playoff experience to a team that ranked 15th in the country in road defense scoring.

The Cougars were stout in 2025 under defensive coordinator **Austin Armstrong** and with a bulk of the defense returning, Houston and Armstrong hope the team can once again be clinical on third and fourth downs and in the red zone, just like they were a year ago. Houston returns six starters – three in the secondary. The additions of a trio of players with College Football Playoff experience will greatly improve the whole group.

HEAD COACH WILLIE FRITZ

THIRD SEASON AT HOUSTON (16-11) | 34th SEASON OVERALL (263-132-1)

» Willie Fritz, the back-to-back American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year who boasts 33 years of collegiate head coaching experience, was named the 16th head coach in University of Houston football history on Sunday, Dec. 3, 2023. The 2026 season is his third with the Cougars and 34th overall.

» Fritz, who ranks second nationally among active FBS head coaches with 223 victories, helped the Cougars make a major leap in 2025, as Coach Fritz engineered the largest single-season turnaround in the country from 2024 to 2025, winning 10 games in Year 2 after winning four games in his first season at Houston. The season culminated in a #19 AFCA Coaches Poll ranking and a Kinder's Texas Bowl win over LSU.

» Fritz guided the Cougars to its first ranked road win since 2017 when the Cougars scored 24-unanswered points at #25 Arizona State just hours after the death of strength coach Kurt Hester.

» Three Cougars earned All-America honors in 2025, the most in a single season since 2009, with Tanner Koziol (PFSN, Phil Steele), Amare Thomas (Phil Steele) and Jacob Garza (Phil Steele) earning All-America accolades. Koziol and Thomas became the first set of offensive Cougars to earn All-America honors in the same season since 2009 and Garza became Houston's first long snapper to be named an All-American in school history. Koziol led FBS tight ends with 74 receptions and finished second in school history in receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns by a Cougar tight end.

» Coach Fritz had his best first-year quarterback in Conner Weigman since becoming a coach at the NCAA level in 2025 as Weigman threw for 2,705 yards and 25 touchdowns, both single-season records under Coach Fritz as a first-year quarterback in his system. Weigman led Houston on five game-winning fourth quarter or overtime drives or comebacks during 2025 (Oregon State, Arizona, UCF, Baylor, LSU).

• Fritz proved he is a winner as he guided the Cougars to three wins in 2025 after going down 10+ points, and twice when trailing by 14+.

» In his first season at Houston, Fritz led the Cougars to victories in back-to-back weeks against the Big 12's top two preseason favorites during 2024, defeating Utah and #17/15 Kansas State. Houston's victory over the Wildcats marked its highest ranked win in seven seasons.

» Houston's 63 new players in 2024 matched Colorado for the most nationally that season. Despite the new faces, the Cougars boasted one of the Big 12's top defensive and special teams units,

ranking 22nd nationally in first downs defense (214) and sixth in punt return defense (3.50).

» At Tulane, Fritz led the Green Wave to consecutive American Athletic Conference Championship games between 2022-23. The Green Wave's 23 wins between 2022-23 ranked fourth nationally while the program's 15 conference wins were fifth in the country in that timeframe.

» The Shawnee Mission, Kan., native owns eight career 10-plus win seasons and seven conference championships, including the 2022 American Athletic Conference title. The 2023 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award Watch List honoree led Tulane to consecutive American Athletic Conference Championship games before arriving in Houston.

» Fritz's Tulane teams spent 19 weeks ranked inside the AP Top 25 in 2022-23, including topping out at #9 following a thrilling 46-45 Cotton Bowl victory against #8 USC on Jan. 10, 2023. The Green Wave appeared in the CFP Top 25 rankings in 11 of 12 polls (91.6%) between the 2022-23 seasons. Tulane's 11 weeks in the rankings in that time frame ranked as the 10th most nationally.

» Fritz has spent each of the last 32 seasons as a head coach at Blinn College (1993-96), Central Missouri (2007-09), Sam Houston (2010-13), Georgia Southern (2014-15) and Tulane (2016-23). During that stretch, he coached 73 players who were either NFL Draft selections or NFL free-agent signees.

» In 2022, Fritz led the Green Wave to complete the biggest turnaround season in FBS history, improving to 12-2 and a No. 9 final AP Poll ranking after finishing just 2-10 the previous season. The No. 9 finish was the highest final ranking since the program's undefeated 1998 season.

» As a result of his leadership during the storied 2022 season, Fritz was awarded both the Dodd Trophy and the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award. The Green Wave's appearance in the 2023 Goodyear Cotton Bowl marked the 16th bowl appearance in the 128-year history of the program.

» In the 2021 regular season, Fritz guided the Green Wave to a 2-10 record after Hurricane Ida forced the team to evacuate for a month. Five of the team's 10 losses came by one score or less.

» In 2019, Fritz led the Green Wave to the best start to a season in over 20 years and came within one spot of cracking the top 25 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll for the first time over 20 years. The Green Wave also established a strong home

field advantage under Fritz's direction in 2019, as they posted a 5-1 record inside Yulman Stadium. Tulane's 2019 unit featured an impressive rushing attack, which ranked 13th in the country, averaging 249.8 yards per game.

» In 2018, Fritz guided Tulane to its first bowl trip since 2013, a share of the American Athletic Conference title and just its sixth winning season in the last 37 years while facing the second toughest schedule among teams from the conference.

» The 2017 campaign saw Tulane finish the year with its highest win total since 2013 despite facing one of the nation's toughest schedules, as nine of its opponents earned invitations to bowl games. In addition, four of the Green Wave's losses came by six points or fewer. The 2017 season also served as a milestone season for Fritz as he earned his 200th victory as a head coach and in the process became just the fourth active Football Bowl Subdivision head coach with 200 wins.

» Fritz was twice named the National Coach of the Year, including the American Football Coaches Association FCS Coach of the Year in 2011 and the Liberty Mutual FCS Coach of the Year in 2012. In his two seasons at Georgia Southern, he led the Eagles to a combined record of 17-7, a 2014 Sun Belt Conference title and the school's first NCAA postseason bowl game with a berth in the 2015 GoDaddy.com Bowl.

» Georgia Southern concluded the 2015 regular season with an 8-4 overall record including a mark of 6-2 in conference play.

» Fritz led the Eagles to a 9-3 overall record and a perfect mark of 8-0 in conference play during his first season at Georgia Southern in 2014, and was named the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. However, the school's waiver claim to allow Georgia Southern to play in a bowl despite being in the second year of the NCAA's transition period was denied. Georgia Southern was the first team in NCAA history to post an undefeated conference season in its first season at the Division I FBS level.

» Fritz served as head coach at Sam Houston from 2010-13, leading the Bearkats to back-to-back Southland Conference titles, NCAA Division I Championship game appearances in 2011 and 2012 and a third straight NCAA playoff berth in 2013. In 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston posted the two highest single-season win totals in program history with marks of 14-1 (2011) and 11-4 (2012) while more than 50 Bearkats student-athletes earned All-Southland Conference honors in his last four years, not including additional Player of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year awards. All-America status from national coaching and media outlets were bestowed on 11 Sam Houston State players during his tenure.

» Fritz revitalized Central Missouri and guided the Mules to 11 winning seasons in 13 years. The NCAA Division II program's ledger included two 10-win seasons with the 2001 Mule squad earning its first

postseason trip in more than 30 years. A 97-47 mark in 13 seasons ranked Fritz as the winningest coach in the program's history. He was the only coach to win seven or more games in eight consecutive seasons, and his victory total ranked him 15th among active Division II coaches at the time.

» In addition to his impressive 67.4 winning percentage with the Mules, Fritz coached his student-athletes to achieve their potential on the field and in the classroom. More than 150 Mules were recognized with All-MIAA honors with 41 First-Team selections and 24 All-Americans.

» Under Fritz, Central Missouri recorded a graduation rate of 84 percent with 144 MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll recipients, 14 Academic All-Region and three Academic All-Americans. For all of his accomplishments guiding Central Missouri, Fritz was honored by the school with induction into its Athletics Hall of Fame on Feb. 11, 2017.

» He returned to Sam Houston State a second time in 1991 after spending four years at Coffeyville Community College in Kansas under legendary coach Dick Foster, earning a promotion to defensive coordinator after one year. He stayed another two years to work for Coach Foster's son Skip and the Red Ravens. During the 1990 season, Fritz served as the defensive coordinator where he helped guide the Red Ravens to a national title.

» Fritz departed Huntsville for a second time prior to the 1993 season for an opportunity to be the head coach at Blinn College, where he would turn around a program that had only five wins in its previous three seasons.

» From 1993-96, Fritz and the Buccaneers racked up 39 victories against only five losses with a tie and claimed two national junior college championships. He was inducted into the NJCAA Football Hall of Fame for the environment of success he created at Blinn.

» One of seven children, Fritz is the son of the late Harry Fritz, who coached the Central Missouri football team in 1952 before continuing his career as the Executive Director at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) in Kansas City. The elder Fritz also served at several colleges and universities in administration as an athletics director.

» Fritz played on two conference title teams and was a four-year starter at defensive back at Pittsburg State where he earned a bachelor's degree in 1983. While working as a graduate assistant during his first stint with Sam Houston from 1984-85, he earned his Master of Kinesiology in 1986.

» He and his wife Susan have three children, Wes, Lainie and Brooke and two grandsons, Grant and Enzo and granddaughter Mia.

BERT F. WINSTON BAND COMPLEX
A 39,089-square foot building on the east end of TDECU Stadium housing the Spirit of Houston Band Recital Halls and classroom spaces, Coach Bill Yeoman Hall and the UH Athletics Ticket Office.

COACH BILL YEOMAN HALL
A 2,000-square foot tribute area to University of Houston history located on the northeast corner of TDECU Stadium. Serves as a gameday club for ticket holders in section 129 and north side loge boxes.

DORIS NANTZ PRESS BOX
The Doris Nantz Press Box contains seats for 70 working media along with a press dining area and a wired photographer work room.

FIELD SURFACE
The synthetic surface installed at TDECU Stadium is the S5-M manufactured by UBU. S5-M, a Speed Series product, is a slit-film turf blade with a sand/rubber combination for infill. It is the same surface installed at the Houston Football practice facility. The turf is designed to host a multitude of events, including but not limited to, high school football games, band practice, specific UH intramural events, etc.

LEGENDS PLAZA
A plaza area recognizing the proud tradition of Houston Football at the northeast corner of TDECU Stadium.

LOCKER ROOM (HOME)
Located in the newly minted Memorial Hermann Operations Center, Houston's new locker room for the 2025 season features a hype tunnel in addition to the Cougars' everyday locker room and game day locker room.

LOCKER ROOM (VISITOR)
5,000-square foot home locker room located at the southeast corner of TDECU Stadium. Houston's former home locker room, now provides visitors with arguably the nicest visiting locker room in college football.

ORIENTATION OF STADIUM
East-to-west giving fans and television audiences a spectacular view of the downtown Houston skyline while also keeping in line with the University's grid system and creating more efficient parking. Sun and shade studies were also conducted to improve the best level of comfort for Houston fans and not affect student-athletes.

PARTY PATIOS
Four (4) open-air lower bowl party decks with 24 armchairs (20 inches wide). Both the east and west lower bowl end zones contain a party deck with two located on the north lower bowl sideline.

PREMIUM SEATING
Consists of over 6,000 of the 40,000 seats in the TDECU Stadium.

Club Area - The stylish club area is the ultimate Houston Football experience. With 12,400 square feet of multi-purpose club area overlooking the field of play, fans with access to the club area enjoy upscale food and drinks while receiving first-class hospitality on game days. The climate-controlled area also feature high-definition televisions and private restrooms. The area is also available to host special events, meetings and classes.

Suites - Spanning from end zone to end zone on the south side of TDECU Stadium with a view of downtown Houston, 49 premium suites with inside bar stools and entertainment area. Houston fans enjoy comfort and style in these approximately 325-square foot suites with individual upscale service and amenities.

Loge Boxes - 42 loge boxes each containing four seats and high-definition monitors located throughout the stadium.

Club Seats - 766 armchair style padded club seats that are 22 inches wide and located in the lower bowl of TDECU Stadium.

Additional Premium Seating - 2,778 armchair seats that are 20 inches wide and 1,210 benches with backs with the majority located in the lower bowl of TDECU Stadium.

SUITE DECKS
Two (2) open-air party suites located on the suite level positioned at each end (east and west end) of the suites. Each open-air suite contains 60 padded armchairs (21 inches wide).

TICKET OFFICE
The University of Houston Athletics Ticket Office is located on the northeast corner of TDECU Stadium facing Cullen Blvd. The facility has eight exterior ticket-selling windows along with two interior windows in the ticket office lobby in close proximity to the stadium parking garage.

VIDEO BOARD
State-of-the-art HD-video board located on the west end of TDECU Stadium. Measuring 45 feet tall by 160 feet wide, the new video board is nearly triple the size of the previous video board (2,584 square feet) and ranks 11th nationally among all Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools. Installed by Piros with Daktronics handling the commissioning and integration, the new board is capable of generating more than 68 billion colors with a viewing angle of 170 degrees.

The \$130 million **MEMORIAL HERMANN FOOTBALL OPERATIONS CENTER** features amenities including state-of-the-art sports performance centers, an academic support services suite, a leading-edge locker room facility, student-athlete flex space and office space to house the Houston Football coaching and support staff. The Memorial Hermann Football Operations Center also provides additional premium seating to TDECU Stadium with 14 suites, a 450-seat club section with access to an 11,000-square-foot club and 300-seat roof terrace facing inward to John M. O'Quinn Field. The FOC was completed in August 2025.

YOKUBAITIS HALL

The official entryway into the Memorial Hermann Football Operations Center, Yokubaitis Hall showcases the rich history of Houston Cougar Football and greets guests and spectators visiting the building or attending a game in the Touchdown Club.

TOUCHDOWN CLUB

Located in the west endzone of TDECU Stadium, the 11,000-square foot Touchdown Club puts you up close to the action while offering extra-wide, comfortable seating. This premium area also includes an indoor, air-conditioned club space featuring full-service bars, lounge furniture, and TVs. Amenities include unlimited complimentary buffet, cash bars, private restrooms and TVs featuring Hulu and Live TV.

QUEENIE'S PARTY PATIO

Plaza area on top of the Touchdown Club connecting the north and south 300-level concourses with an awning providing shade. Located in the west endzone of TDECU Stadium, Queenie O'Rourke's Party Patio is part of the Memorial Hermann Football Operations Center and offers expansive views of the field. Guests will enjoy wide chairback seats, with convenient access to concessions and restrooms.

LOCKER ROOM

State of the art locker room features individual lockers with digital board name plates, a relaxation room, a movie theater and much more. A car-wash like shower system to eliminate dirt, grass, turf and sweat to keep the locker room clean and a down-and-back cold plunge pool helps the athletes cool their bodies and speed up the recovery process after competing in the Houston weather.

AUDITORIUM

A 156 seat team room with movie-theater like chairs allows every member of the Houston Football program to meet daily with a floor to ceiling projector wall where details, schemes, and other information can be displayed to ensure the entire team has everything they need to be successful.

MEDICAL CLINIC

Brand new athletic training room that is 2.5x the square footage as the previous athletic training room in the Athletic Center and is a football-only training room. The clinic includes two doctors offices, three staff offices with c-arm, hydrotherapy room, rehabilitation section and a 12 table treatment area.

SPORTS PERFORMANCE CENTER

Located on the second floor and measuring approximately 21,000 square feet, Houston's weight room provides everything for the student-athletes to compete at the highest level including varied step height stair cases and a ramp for exercises.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT SUITE

The academic suite in the Memorial Hermann Football Operations Center features eight learning rooms a computer lab and houses Houston's football-specific academics team of counselors, learning specialists and tutors.

HOUSTON – University of Houston fifth-year quarterback Conner Weigman threw for 305 yards and a touchdown and rushed for another, and senior wide receiver Amare Thomas hauled in eight catches for 133 yards and a score to lead the #23/24 Cougars to a 33-20 win over Oregon State inside TDECU Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Scoring on their first drive of the season, the Cougars built a 26-7 lead and held off a Beaver rally in the second half to win their fifth straight season opener. Houston also has won six of its last seven openers. Only a 38-21 loss to Texas Tech on Sept. 4, 2021, during the Good Sam Texas Kickoff in NRG Stadium prevents a longer streak.

Thomas led the Cougars with his receiving totals and posted the fourth 100-yard game of his career. His 133 receiving yards trailed only his 157 yards at Oklahoma State on Oct. 11, 2025. Saturday also marked his 14th consecutive game with at least one reception.

While Weigman and Thomas were leading the aerial attack, junior running back Re'Shaun Sanford II and senior running back Makhi Hughes took care of the ground assault as each rushed for at least 75 yards with Sanford's 98 yards leading all players.

Sanford used a 56-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter to give the Cougars a 16-7 lead, and Hughes 1-yard plunge midway through the third period gave Houston a 26-7 advantage.

The Cougars rolled to 533 of total offense with 305 through the air. It was the program's most yards of total offense since posting 538 yards (186 rush, 352 pass) in a 38-7 win over TDECU Stadium inside TDECU Stadium on Sept. 23, 2023.

The Beavers made it a one-possession game midway through the fourth quarter, but the Cougars embarked on a nine-play, 75-yard drive that took four minutes off the clock and was capped by Weigman's 1-yard touchdown with five minutes left.

Oregon State quarterback Braden Atkinson threw for 376 yards and a touchdown while receiver Jesse Legree led the Beavers with five catches for 136 yards and a touchdown.

Following a missed Oregon State field goal try, the Cougars pushed their advantage on 19-7 on Dimas' 32-yard field goal with 35 seconds left in the half.

After a 30-minute weather delay to start the second half, Houston traded possessions before Hughes 1-yard plunge into the end zone gave Houston a 26-7 lead with 6:40 remaining in the period.

Oregon State cut the lead to 26-13 on Atkinson's 7-yard touchdown pass to Jesse Legree with 44 second left in the third quarter.

The Beavers took advantage of a Houston turnover and pulled to within 26-20 on AJ Newberry's 4-yard touchdown run up the middle midway through the final period.

The Cougars took over on the next possession and faced third-and-6 on the Oregon State 42 with 6:21 left. Weigman hit Thomas on a 37-yard strike to extend the drive and rushed up the middle from one yard out two plays later for the final margin of victory.

HOUSTON – University of Houston senior quarterback Conner Weigman threw for three touchdowns, and freshman reserve Keisean Henderson added two touchdown passes and a 54-yard touchdown run to lead the #22/22 Cougars to a 77-6 win over Southern inside TDECU Stadium on Saturday night.

The Cougars (2-0) raced out to a 28-0 lead after the first quarter and scored touchdowns on each of their first 11 possessions. Houston collected 591 yards of total offense, including 388 on the ground with six different Cougars scoring a rushing touchdown and six rushing for at least 40 yards.

Houston forced three Southern turnovers and converted them into 21 points. The Cougar defense also limited the Jaguars to only 121 yards of total offense, including -6 rushing yards.

Weigman threw for 120 yards and three touchdowns on 9-of-12 passing and was lifted from the game early in the second quarter with the Cougars holding a 35-0 lead.

When Henderson entered the game, the Cougar offense continued its pace as the Houston native added 83 yards and a pair of scores on 6-of-7 passing.

Junior wide receiver Koby Young hauled in three catches for 54 yards with two touchdowns while sophomore running back Zane Smith added 69 rushing yards on 10 carries.

Junior kicker Jonathan Dimas booted all 11 extra-point tries, the third-highest total in Houston single-season history. It was the most PATs in a game since Roman Anderson nailed 12 tries in a 95-21 win over SMU on Oct. 21, 1989. Terry Leiweke set the school record with 13 PATs in a 100-6 win over Tulsa on Nov. 23, 1968.

After forcing Southern to punt on its first possession, the Cougars marched down the field and took a 7-0 lead when Weigman hit senior tight end Patrick Overmeyer on a 9-yard touchdown strike with 9:04 left in the opening period.

With Southern facing third-and-3 on the ensuing possession, fifth-year defensive back Jalen Mayo sacked and forced Southern quarterback Christian Johnson to fumble, which was recovered by sophomore defensive lineman DK Mays.

Two plays later, junior running back Re'Shaun Sanford's 9-yard touchdown run up the middle gave Houston a 14-0 lead with 6:57 remaining.

Houston forced another Southern fumble, which was recovered by Sione Fotu, on the next possession. That set the stage for senior running back Makhi Hughes' 1-yard touchdown plunge for a 21-0 Cougar lead with 4:14 remaining.

Late in the first quarter, Weigman hit senior wide receiver Amare Thomas on an 8-yard touchdown pass with 31 seconds remaining in the first quarter for a 28-0 Houston lead.

In the second quarter, Weigman connected with Young on a 43-yard touchdown with 11:04 left in the first half for a 35-0 Cougar advantage.

Six different Cougars scored rushing touchdowns and the Cougars' 71-point win was the largest since 1989.
