KANSAS' LOSS...

- Made Kansas 8-2 for the first time since an 8-2 mark in the 2017-18 season.
- Ended a Kansas three-game winning streak against Texas, making the series 35-10 in favor of KU.
- Ended a Kansas 13-game home court winning streak.
- Stopped a Kansas 17-game winning streak against Big 12 foes.
- Made Kansas 5-1 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 807-115 all-time in the venue, including 269-15 under head coach Bill Self.
- Made Self 509-111 while at Kansas, 716-216 all-time and 25-10 against Texas, 25-8 while at KU.
- Made Kansas 2,310-864 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas was led in scoring by Jalen Wilson with 20 points. He and Ochai Agbaji (11 points) were the only double-figure scorers for Kansas.
- Kansas' 29 first half points ties its season low for points in a half, previously set against Texas Tech in December of 2020.
- Going into the second half, the Jayhawks trailed by eight points, tying their season high halftime deficit. This was the second-straight game KU trailed at the break, and was just the third time this year the Jayhawks did not have the advantage at halftime.
- The 25 point defeat is the largest margin of defeat at Allen Fieldhouse in the Bill Self era and largest since 1989.
- Kansas forced 16 Texas turnovers tying a season high previously set twice, most recently against Texas Tech.
- This is the first time that Texas has won in Lawrence since 2011, when they won 63-74.

OPPONENT NOTES

- Texas had five players score in double-figures: Kai Jones with 12 points, Courtney Ramey with 18 points, Matt Coleman III with 13 points, Jericho Sims with 11 points and Andrew Jones with 14 points.
- Sims recorded a double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds, good for his first double-double of the season and fifth of his career. His 12 rebounds are also a season high.
- A. Jones' seven rebounds tied his season high, previously set against Oklahoma State.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Marcus Garrett surpassed 150 career steals on Saturday, recording three steals to increase his career total to 151 steals. He entered Saturday's game with 148 career steals.
- Garrett tied his season high in steals with three steals in the first half. Garrett has recorded one or more steals in every game this season.
- With his 11 points, Ochai Agbaji has scored in double-figures in 9-of-10 games this season.
- With his seven rebounds on Saturday, Jalen Wilson has pulled down five or more rebounds eight times

this season, including two-straight games and eight of his last nine.

- Wilson scored 20 points, his third-career game with 20+ points, while marking his eighth game in doublefigures this season.
- Christian Braun recorded two steals, making this the second-straight game that he has recorded a steal.
- With his two blocks on Saturday, Mitch Lightfoot now has 107 blocks. He is tied with Drew Gooden at 18th on the Kansas all-time career blocked shots list.
- David McCormack set a career high in free throws made and attempted going a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line.
