KANSAS' WIN...

- Extended its win streak to seven straight games.
- Improved its record to 5-1 all-time on New Year's Day.
- Made Kansas 11-1 or better for the ninth time in head coach Bill Self's 19 seasons at KU.
- Extended its non-conference win streak to 25 straight games in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Kept KU undefeated in Allen Fieldhouse this season (6-0).
- Made Self 740-224 all-time, including 533-119 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2,334-872 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas scored a season-high 38 points off the bench. The Jayhawks bench outscored George Mason's reserves 38-3 (+35).
- Kansas had two players off the bench score in double figures for the first time this season (Jalen Coleman-Lands - 20, Mitch Lightfoot - 14).
- Kansas grabbed 10 offensive rebounds on Saturday. KU has posted 10+ offensive rebounds in seven games this season.
- Kansas held a 48-37 advantage at the half. KU has led at the half in all 12 games this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Super-senior Jalen Coleman-Lands shot 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) from beyond the arc, finishing with a season-high 20 points, two rebounds, three assists and a career-high-tying two blocks in a season-high 25 minutes off the bench.
- Super-senior Mitch Lightfoot had a career-high-tying 14 points on a perfect 7-of-7 shooting and four rebounds in 21 minutes as a reserve. His seven field goals were a career high.
- Lightfoot is the first to shoot a perfect clip (min. 7 FGA) from the field since Udoka Azubuike went 7-of-7 against UW-Milwaukee on Dec. 10, 2019.
- Junior Christian Braun recorded 14 points, three rebounds and a season-high six assists in 36 minutes. Braun has scored in double figures in 11 straight games.
- Senior Ochai Agbaji posted 11 points and a season-high-tying seven rebounds in 37 minutes. Agbaji now has 1,167 career points to move him into 42nd on the all-time KU scoring list, passing Milt Newton.
- Agbaji started his 89th consecutive game on Saturday, moving him into a tie for eighth on the all-time list for consecutive starts at KU with Cedric Hunter.
