KANSAS' WIN...

- Made KU 5-1 or better in Big 12 play for the 15th time in Bill Self's 19 seasons at Kansas.
- Made KU's record 202-94 all-time against K-State. The 202 wins are the most victories against a single opponent in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball.
- Extended KU's win streak to six straight games against Kansas State.
- Made Self 745-225 all-time, including 538-120 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2,339-873 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas overcame a 16-point halftime deficit to win the game. That is the largest halftime deficit overcome in a KU victory in program history.
- Kansas finished the game on a 9-0 run over the final 2:59 of the game. KU only led for 1:07 in the contest.
- Kansas held a season-high +22 (45-23) rebound advantage over Kansas State. The +22 rebound advantage is the most since Dec. 11, 2020 vs. Omaha (+23, 54-31) and the most on the road since Jan. 29, 2007 at Nebraska (+26, 47-21).
- Kansas grabbed 18 offensive rebounds on Saturday. That is the most in a conference game on the road since Feb. 10, 2014 at Kansas State. KU has secured 10+ offensive rebounds in 12 games this season, including six of the last seven contests.
- Kansas made 21 free throws at Kansas State, the most in a road game this season. That is the most in a game on the road since Feb. 29, 2020 at Kansas State.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior Ochai Agbaji hit the go-ahead layup with 9.0 seconds remaining to give the Jayhawks a 76-75 lead. Agbaji finished with a career-high-tying 29 points on 10-of-18 (55.6 percent) shooting, a season-high-tying seven rebounds, two assists and a career-high-tying two blocks in 36 minutes. He now has 1,288 career points which puts him at 32nd on the all-time KU scoring list, passing Jo Jo White, Eric Chenowith and Jerod Haase.
- Agbaji started his 95th consecutive game on Saturday. He is eighth on the all-time list for consecutive starts at KU. His 202 career three-point field goals move him solely into eighth on the all-time KU list, passing Terry Brown.
- Redshirt-sophomore Jalen Wilson recorded his first double-double of the season with 16 points on 5-of-9 (55.6 percent) shooting and 10 rebounds in 31 minutes. Wilson has scored in double figures in five games this season, including four of the last five contests.
- Senior David McCormack posted his third double-double of the season with 11 points and a career-high-tying 15 rebounds in 26 minutes. McCormack has finished with a double-double in two of his last three games.
- Junior Christian Braun added 11 points, two rebounds and a team-high five assists 36 minutes.
