KANSAS' WIN...

- Makes Kansas 1-0 for the 16th time in head coach Bill Self's 19 seasons at KU.
- Improved Kansas to 6-5 all-time in the Champions Classic, including 2-2 against Michigan State in the event. The Jayhawks have won five of their last six appearances in the event.
- Gives KU a three-game winning streak against Michigan State and makes the series 8-7 in favor of the Jayhawks.
- Made Bill Self 523-118 while at Kansas, and 730-223 overall.
- Made Kansas 2,324-871 all-time.
- Made Kansas 5-0 all-time on Nov. 9.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas forced Michigan State into 16 turnovers, including 11 in the first half. KU scored 16 points off the turnovers.
- The Jayhawks shot 79.2% (19-of-24) from the free throw line. That is the highest free throw percentage in a season opener since they shot 85.7% (24-of-28) from the charity stripe on Nov. 9, 2012 vs. Southeast Missouri.
- Kansas scored 44 points in the paint, just over half of its 87 for the night.
- KU finished the contest with a 20-11 edge over Michigan State in fast break points.
- Kansas held the lead for 30:53 of the game.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Junior Ochai Agbaji scored a career-high 29 points on 52.9% (9-of-17) shooting, including a perfect 8-of-8 at the free throw line in 36 minutes. It was Agbaji's eighth career game scoring at least 20 points.
- Super-senior Remy Martin made his Kansas debut, finishing with 15 points on 55.6 (5-of-9) shooting and six rebounds in 27 minutes.
- Junior Christian Braun grabbed a game-high eight rebounds, while adding six points in 34 minutes of action.
- Senior David McCormack contributed 10 points and two blocks in 22 minutes of play.
