### KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 15-7 overall and 9-5 in Big 12 play.
- Gave Kansas its fourth-straight win against Iowa State and made the series 186-66 in favor of the Jayhawks.
- Improved Bill Self to 516-116 while at Kansas, 723-221 all-time and 31-10 against Iowa State, including 30-10 while at KU.
- Made Kansas 2,317-869 all-time.

### TEAM NOTES

- Kansas' 50 points ties the fewest points the Jayhawks have allowed this season. KU also held Omaha to 50 points on December 11. The 50 points were also the fewest Iowa State has scored all season.
- Kansas forced Iowa State into 23 turnovers, the third most the Jayhawks have forced this season and the most since forcing 26 at West Virginia on February 6.
- The Jayhawks were knotted, 24-24, with the Cyclones at halftime, the first time this season KU was tied going into the break.
- Kansas' nine steals were one shy from tying a season-high of 10, set three times this season.

### INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Junior Ochai Agbaji started his 69th-consecutive game on Saturday, including his 22nd this season.
- Senior Mitch Lightfoot drew two charges on Saturday and now has a team-high 10 drawn charges this season.
- Ochai Agbaji registered two blocks on Saturday, his first game with multiple blocks this season, including the third of his career.
- Redshirt freshman Jalen Wilson scored 22 points on 7-of-15 from the field and 4-of-8 from beyond the arc, marking his sixth-straight game with 10+ points, including the 16th of his career.
- With his 22 points and 10 rebounds, Wilson marked his fourth-straight game with a double-double, including a team-leading seventh double-double this season.
- Wilson's 22 points marks his fourth 20+ point game of the season, with his career high of 23 points coming against Creighton and Kentucky earlier this year.
- Junior David McCormack scored 13 points, marking his seventh-straight game scoring in double-figures and his 14th this season.
- Senior Marcus Garrett swiped a season-high five steals on Saturday, the most since stealing six against West Virginia on January 19, 2019.
