KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 19-8 overall.
- Gave Kansas its 20th-straight win against non-conference opponents in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made the Kansas-UTEP series 3-2 in favor of UTEP, including a 1-0 mark in Lawrence, 1-0 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made KU 13-1 in Allen Fieldhouse, 816-115 all-time in the venue, including 277-15 under head coach Bill Self.
- Improved Self to 520-117 while at Kansas, 727-222 all-time and 4-0 against UTEP, 2-0 while at KU.
- Made Kansas 2,321-870 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Being down by 14 at half, Kansas overcame a 14 point deficit, the largest halftime deficit in a win for the Jayhawks this season.
- With David McCormack's double-double on Thursday, at least one Jayhawk has recorded a doubledouble in 14 games this season.
- Trailing 55-54 with five minutes remaining, Kansas recorded its first win of the year when trailing with five minutes left on the clock.
- Kansas improved to 5-7 when trailing at halftime.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Ochai Agbaji scored a team-leading 19 points, recording double digits in scoring for the 22nd time this
- Agbaji recorded three made three-point field goals, moving him into the top-20 in Kansas history for career three-pointers with 138.
- With his 19 points, Agbaji led the team in scoring for the fifth time this season.
- Tonight marked Agbaji's 14th game this season making three or more 3-point field goals and 20th of his career. Including this game, Kansas is 18-4 this season when he makes three or more triples.
- Marcus Garrett recorded four steals, pushing him ahead of both Tyshawn Taylor and Jerod Haase for alltime steals at Kansas, moving him into 12th place in KU history with 175 career steals.
- David McCormack recorded 18 points and 10 rebounds, good for his seventh double-double of the season and 13th of his career.
- With his 11 points, Garrett scored in double figures for the 12th time this season and 36th of his career.
- Dajuan Harris earned 25 minutes of playing time, the second longest performance of his career, behind his 27 minutes played at TCU on January 5.
- Harris went a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line, recording a career-high in free throw attempts and makes.
