## KANSAS' LOSS...

- Dropped its record to 10-5 in games not played in Allen Fieldhouse this season.
- Made Self 752-229 all-time, including 545-124 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2,346-877 all-time.

### **TEAM NOTES**

- Kansas held TCU to 3-for-15 shooting from 3-point range and has held its last two opponents --Baylor and TCU -- to a combined 6-for-29 from deep.
- Kansas grabbed 12 offensive rebounds on Tuesday. KU has secured 10+ offensive rebounds in 18 games this season.
- The 64 points Kansas scored marked the first time the Jayhawks didn't top the 70-point mark in a conference game since Jan. 18 at Oklahoma, a span of 11 games.

#### **INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- Senior Ochai Agbaji finished with 13 points in 37 minutes. He now has 1,484 career points which puts him at 25th on the all-time KU scoring list. With four more points, he will pass Tony Guy for 24th. His 231 career three-point field goals have him at seventh on the all-time KU list, just one behind Sherron Collins for sixth.
- Agbaji has scored in double figures in 28 straight games this season, which is now the fourthlongest streak in the Bill Self era. He was tied for fourth with Marcus Morris and Thomas Robinson entering the game. Agbaji now has 74 career double-digit scoring games.
- Senior David McCormack was 7-for-9 from the free throw line. The seven makes tied his season high, set twice before. The nine attempts established a new season-high for the senior.
- Redshirt sophomore guard Dajuan Harris Jr., had a team-high seven assists, giving him exactly seven assists in each of his last three games. It marks the first time in his career Harris has totaled at least seven straight assists in three straight games.
- Agbaji has now started the last 105 games he has played in.
- Super-Senior Mitch Lightfoot played in his 157th game all-time at Kansas, which is No. 1 at Kansas. Danny Manning -- at 147 -- is No. 2.
- Super-Senior Jalen Coleman-Lands played in the 161st game of his career, which is tied for fourth on the NCAA all-time games played list.
