KANSAS' WIN...

- Makes Kansas 26-6 on the season
- Makes KU 4-1 in neutral-site games this season
- Makes Kansas 22-3 in Big 12 Championship quarterfinal games
- Advances Kansas to the conference tournament semifinals for the for the 22nd time in Big 12 history and 40th time overall
- Improves Kansas to 78-28 in league tournament play and 48-12 at the Big 12 Championship
- Makes Kansas 44-10 all-time in the T-Mobile Center, including 2-0 this season
- Makes Bill Self 754-229 all-time, 548-124 while at Kansas and 43-13 all-time in league tournaments (34-8 at Kansas)
- Makes Kansas 2,349-877 all-time

TEAM NOTES

- The 24-point margin of victory is the most by the Jayhawks in a Big 12 Tournament game since beating Texas Tech 91-63 in the 2013 quarterfinals in Kansas City.
- Kansas improved to 4-0 all-time in the Big 12 Tournament against West Virginia. The Jayhawks have picked up wins against the Mountaineers in 2016, 2018 and 2019 in addition to this year.
- The Jayhawks improved to 21-3 this season when leading at halftime.
- Kansas led by 22 points at the break, which ties for the largest lead at the half this season for the Jayhawks. Kansas also led by 22 against Missouri, 49-27, on Dec. 11.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior Ochai Agbaji finished with 18 points, giving him 1,532 points for his career. He moved past Drew Gooden for 21st on the all-time Kansas scoring list. With 17 more points, he will pass Calvin Thompson for 20th.
- Junior Christian Braun collected his fourth double-double of the season, with 11 points and 14 rebounds. The 14 rebounds establish a new career-high for Braun, surpassing his previous high of 13, set Dec. 1, 2020 versus Kentucky.
- Sophomore Dajuan Harris Jr., finished with seven assists and no turnovers. It marks the sixth time this season he had at least seven assists and the fourth time in the last six games. It's the second time this season he had at least seven assists and zero turnovers.
- Senior David McCormack connected on his first two free throw attempts, giving him 25 consecutive makes, spanning three games. The 25 straight free throw makes is the fourth-longest streak in Kansas history. Only Sherron Collins (36), Wayne Simien (34 and 27) have made more. McCormack's streak ended at 25, before he made two more.
- Senior Mitch Lightfoot had a season-high five blocks in the win. He now has 147 blocks in his career, which is tied with Donnie Von Moore for 11th all-time at Kansas. Lightfoot's five blocks tie the school record for blocks in a Big 12 Tournament game. Jeff Withey (2012 semifinals) and Nick Collison (2002 semifinals) also had five.
