POSTGAME NOTES

Kansas Captains: Jalon Daniels, Rich Miller, Sam Burt, Mike Novitsky

Team Notes

- TCU won the coin toss and elected to receive the opening kickoff.
- · Kansas trailed at halftime, 10-3 for just the second time this season. Kansas is now 1-0 this season and 1-7 when trailing at halftime under Leipold.
- After being held to three points in the first half, Kansas scored 21 points in the third quarter. The 21 points in a single quarter matches a season-best for KU, a mark previously set during the first quarter of the Jayhawks season opener against Tennessee Tech.
- · Kansas trailed at the end of the third quarter, 24-31, marking the first time this season Kansas trailed entering the fourth quarter.
- Kansas falls to 5-1 on the season, marking Kansas' first 5-1 start since 2009.

Offensive Notes

- Kansas outgained 540 yards to TCU's 452. Kansas' 540 total yards were a season high and marked the third time this season KU has posted 500-plus yards total offense (528 vs. Duke, 502 vs. Tennessee Tech). Kansas' 540 yards were the most since going for 569 at Texas in 2019, it was the most yards of offense at home since 2018 vs. Rutgers.
- Redshirt freshman Ky Thomas broke off a 16-yard rush in the second quarter, marking a new season long. Thomas entered Saturday's game with a long of seven yards and 25 yards on 11 carries.
- Junior Jalon Daniels connected with senior Mason Fairchild on a 48-yard pass in the second quarter, marking a new career-long reception for Fairchild. His previous long of 10 yards came at West Virginia earlier this year.
- Redshirt-sophomore Sevion Morriison's 40-yard rush in the second quarter was his longest rush of the season.
- Redshirt-sophomore Tanaka Scott received a 52 pass from redshirt-senior quarterback Jason Bean in the third quarter, the longest reception of Scott's career. Scott entered Saturday's contest with four receptions for 36 yards in his career.
- In the third quarter, Bean connected with Fairchild for a 12-yard touchdown. The touchdown pass was Bean's first of the season and seventh of his career, while it was the third touchdown of the season for Fairchild and the fourth of his career. Fairchild now has three touchdown catches on seven receptions this season.
- Fairchild ended the game with three receptions for a career-high 80 yards. His previous career high was 58 vs. South Dakota last season (9-3-21).
- Bean connected on his second passing touchdown of the game, this time to junior Luke Grimm, on an eight-yard touchdown. The touchdown reception was the third of the season for Grimm and the eighth of his career.
- Kansas evened up the score at 24-24, on a 38-yard touchdown pass from Bean to redshirt sophomore Quentin Skinner. The touchdown reception was the second of Skinner's career, all of which have come this season.
- · Skinner finished with a career-high two touchdowns and four receptions for 98-yards. His four receptions for 98-yards is also a career-best.
- Grimm ended the game with a team-high six receptions marking his third game with five or more catches this season. Grimm has 15 catches in his last three games and 25 for the season
- Bean threw for a career-high four touchdowns on 16-of-24 passing for 262 yards. His 262 yards were his second most at Kansas (323 at Duke last season, 9-25-21).

Defensive Notes

- In the first quarter, Kansas held TCU to a failed fourth down conversion on 4th-and-1, Kansas' first stop on a fourth down conversion in the first quarter this season. The stop puts Kansas at 10-15 (66.7%) on fourth down conversion defense this season.
- Redshirt-junior Lonnie Phelps recorded his sixth sack of the season in the first quarter, marking sacks in three consecutive games. Phelps entered Saturday's game ranked seventh in the country in sacks.
- Kansas ended the game with one sack and has 16 sacks for the season. KU entered the game ranked first in the Big 12 with 15 sacks in 2022.
- Sophomore safety OJ Burroughs recorded his second career interception. Burroughs' first career interception came at Texas in 2021. His interception was the fifth of the season for the laybawks.
- In the third quarter, super-senior defensive lineman Caleb Sampson posted his first pass deflection of the season and the fifth of his career.
- Kansas forced its second turnover of the game in the third quarter, when senior Kenny Logan Jr., forced and recovered the fumble marked which was his first of the season for each statistic. Logan has now forced four fumbles in his career and recovered two.
- · Logan finished the game with a team-high 12 tackles, marking his seventh career game with 10+ tackles, including his first this season.
- Senior linebacker Rich Miller had nine tackles. He has three games with nine or more stops this season 12 at West Virginia (9-10-22) and nine at Houston (9-17-22).

Special Teams Notes

• Jacob Borcila connected on a 40-yard field goal in the second quarter, scoring the Jayhawks first points of the game. The 40-yard is the longest of the season for Borcila, who is now 3-for-5 on field goal attempts in 2022.
