KANSAS' LOSS...

- Made KU 2-1 in Big 12 play for the third-straight season.
- Ended KU's 28-game homecourt winning streak, including 26 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made the Kansas-Baylor series 32-6 in favor of the Jayhawks.
- Gave Baylor its first win in Lawrence, making the series 17-1 in Lawrence and 16-1 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Dropped Kansas to 14-3 against AP top-10 teams in Allen Fieldhouse under Bill Self. This was Kansas' first loss to an AP top-10 team at home since a 74-63 loss against Texas on Jan. 22, 2011.
- Ended a nine-game KU winning streak against AP top-five teams at Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 6-1 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 256-14 under Bill Self and 794-114 all-time in the venue.
- Made Bill Self 485-109 while at Kansas, 692-214 in his career, 24-6 against Baylor, 24-5 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2.286-862 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Baylor used a late 21-4 run to take a 36-24 lead over KU. The Bears went 7-for-7 in this span.
- Kansas trailed at the half 37-24 marking the fourth time this season the
 Jayhawks have been behind at the break. Kansas is 2-2 in those contests
 with a 73-73 record in the Self era. The 13-point mark was KU's largest
 halftime deficit this season. It was also the largest deficit this season for
 Kansas. It marked the largest halftime deficit at Allen Fieldhouse for the
 Jayhawks since KU trailed Oklahoma State by 13 on Feb. 3, 2018.
- KU shot 36 percent in the first half, its lowest in the first half this season.
- Marked the first time Baylor has led at the half in Allen Fieldhouse since the Bears took a 34-28 lead to the break on Feb. 1, 2017.
- KU's 12-point defeat was its largest in Allen Fieldhouse since Texas Tech topped the Jayhawks 85-73 on Jan. 2, 2018.
- KU's three second half assists were the its fewest in a half since KU was limited to three against Oklahoma in the first half on Mar. 5, 2019.
- Kansas' 55 points marked the fewest by a Jayhawk team in Allen Fieldhouse since KU scored 53 in a victory over Oklahoma on Feb. 20, 2000. The 55-point clip also marked the fewest by a Jayhawk team in a conference game since KU tallied 55 against TCU on Feb. 6, 2013.0
- Baylor's seven free throw attempts marked the fewest by a Jayhawk conference opponent since Baylor shot six on Jan. 7, 2015.

TEAM NOTES (CONT.)

- The Bears committed just five turnovers, the fewest by a Jayhawk opponent since lowa State committed five on Mar. 14, 2014.
- Kansas was held under 60 points for the second time this season. KU is 0-2 in those games with a 9-18 record in the Self era.
- Baylor outshot Kansas from the field, marking the first time this season an opponent has shot better than the Jayhawks. KU is now 33-68 in contests where it's opponent tallies a better mark in the Self era.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Senior Udoka Azubuike

- Blocked a career-high seven shots, the most by a KU player since Joel Embiid blocked eight against Oklahoma State on Jan. 18, 2014. Azubuike tallied five of his seven in the first half. It also marked the most blocks by a Jayhawk senior since Jeff Withey had nine swats against West Virginia on Mar. 2, 2013.
- Azubuike is now 14th all-time in blocked shots with 127, passing Jamari Traylor who tallied 126 from 2013-2016.
- Grabbed a team high 11 rebounds while adding six points.

Senior Isaiah Moss

• Finished with a team-high 15 points on the night, his fifth point of the game gave him 1,000 points in his career. Moss tallied 906 points while at lowa.

Sophomore Devon Dotson

 Was held to nine points ending a streak of 20 games in which the sophomore had scored 10 or more points. The last time Dotson was held under 10 was against Oklahoma on Mar. 5, 2019.
