BY THE NUMBERS

Already in the first four matches of the season, 10 different Jayhawks have scored at least one goal or tallied an assist. Last season, 11 Javhawks scored or assisted over their 21 matches.

Katie McClure's goal against FAU on Sept. 1 marked the 15th game-winning goal of her career and gave her the program record for game-winners by a Jayhawk.

KU recently completed an opponent scoreless streak of 216 minutes. The Jayhawks are just the third KU team to concede two or fewer goals through their first five matches of a season.

OUICK KICKS

- The No. 11 Jayhawks look to bounce back following their first loss of the season when they take on Purdue in the final match of the Boilermaker Challenge Cup Sunday. Kickoff from Folk Field is set for 1 p.m. (CT).
- · Kansas is coming off its first loss of the young season, a 1-0 result to the DePaul Blue Demons on Sept. 6 in the first match of the Boilermaker Challenge. KU outshot the Blue Demons 20-5 but was shutout for the first time in 2019.
- Since 2015, the Jayhawks are 12-10-6 in matches following a loss, which includes a 3-2-0 mark last season.
- The Jayhawks are looking to become the ninth Kansas squad to earn five victories through the opening six games of the season Sunday. It would mark the fourth time in the last six season KU has claimed five or more wins through its opening six matches.
- KU's defense has conceded just two goals through its first five matches of 2019 and became just the third Jayhawk team to allow two or fewer goals through its first five matches of the season. Last season's KU squad also let two goals in through its first five contests, while the 2004 team didn't concede a goal until its sixth match of the year.
- Katie McClure is out to a quick start to her senior campaign. Her six goals and 14 points lead the Big 12 and rank her in the top-five of the NCAA, while her four game-winning goals lead the nation.
- McClure is tops among active players in the Big 12 in career goals (28), goals per game (0.42), game-winning goals and career points (65).
- Kansas jumped seven spots to No. 11 in the latest Unites Soccer Coaches' top-25 poll. It marked the Jayhawks' highest NCAA ranking since 2014.
- KU is 22-17-8 over the last five seasons in matches played away from Rock Chalk Park. The Jayhawks have posted a winning percentage of .500 or better every year in that span.
- McClure has scored the game-winning goal in each of the Jayhawks' four wins this season. The feat marked a new program record for consecutive matches with a game-winner.

SERIES VS. PURDUE

Kansas and Purdue will meet for the fifth time when the two teams take the pitch Sunday. The Jayhawks lead the all-time series 3-1-0, which includes a win in the most recent meeting in 2013. KU topped the Boilermakers, 4-1, in that match played in Lawrence.

The Jayhawks also claimed a victory in their last meeting with Purdue in West Lafayette. Ingrid Vidal scored the game-winner in the ninth minute of overtime to give KU the 1-0 win

KU is 12-29-4 all-time against current members of the Big Ten conference. The Jayhawks have already tallied a victory over a Big Ten team this season, topping Nebraska 4-0 in the season-opener on Aug. 22.

SCOUTING THE BOILERMAKERS

Purdue enters Sunday's contest with the Jayhawks also coming of its first loss of the season. The Boilermakers fell to No. 7 South Carolina, 2-0, Friday night in West Lafayette.

Offensively, eight different Boilermakers have scored a goal in their first five matches of the season. Sarah Griffith and Leanna Rebimbas lead the team with two each.

On defense, Purdue has conceded just three goal thus far, with sophomore Marisa Bova starting at goalkeeper in each of its first five outings. Bova has collected 12 saves and amassed a goals-against average of 0.60 thus far in 2019.

HOT START HAWKS

The impressive early performance to the 2019 campaign puts this year's Jayhawk squad among just a handful of Kansas teams that have gotten their seasons off to a fast start. This bunch will look to join eight other KU teams that were able to tally five or more victories in the first six games the season. This number includes three teams in the last five years.

The Jayhawks' early success bodes well for the bunch, as six of those past eight KU teams went on to make the NCAA Tournament and posted 11 or more victories. In three of those seasons, Kansas logged top-three finishes in the final Big 12 standings.

ROAD WARRIORS

With the Jayhawks in the midst of their first road trip of the season this weekend, they will look to continue their trend of relatively strong performances in matches away from Rock Chalk Park in the recent years. Kansas can hang its hat on an impressive record in road games over the past five seasons.

KU has played 47 regular-season games away from home since the start of the 2014 season, amassing a record of 22-17-8, which included a 3-3-2 record last year. KU has posted a .500 record or better in regular-season road or neutral matches every year since 2014.

LET'S GET DEFENSIVE

In their first five matches of 2019, the Jayhawks have once again proved to be a stout defensive team, carrying over the trend from their last several seasons. Kansas currently boasts a goals-against average of 0.40 this season, which encompasses three shutouts in its first five outings. The Jayhawks are allowing less than two opponent shots on goal per match.

KU has already put together an impressive shutout streak to start this season. Kansas went 189-straight minutes without conceding a goal to start the year, and just wrapped up a 217-minute opponent scoreless stretch. KU has tallied four opponent scoreless streaks of 300 minutes or more in the last five seasons.

TALKIN' TOP-25

Following the impressive start to the season, the voters for several national polls showed their appreciation for KU's work thus far in 2019, moving them from unranked to No. 11 in the NCAA in after just two weeks of action.

The Jayhawks lept seven spots in the United Soccer Coaches' top-25 this week, it program's highest ranking in the poll in five seasons. KU's highest all-time ranking in that poll (formerly the NSCAA Coaches' poll) was No. 6 during the 2004 season. The Jayhawks also peaked inside the top-10 during their 2014 campaign, climbing as high as No. 9. Last season, Kansas found itself among the top-25 during five weeks, topping out at 16 on Sept. 3. With a spot secured in the rankings the last two weeks, Kansas has made five appearance in six seasons in the Coaches' poll.

KATIE McCLUTCH

Senior Katie McClure has firmly positioned herself as one of the most clutch players in program history. Already this season, the Wichita product has tallied four game-winning goals, including the winner in the final seconds against No. 20 Memphis on Aug. 26. These late-match heroics are nothing new for McClure, who has proved time and time again throughout her career that she performs best when the match is in its final stages.

Her her goal against Florida Atlantic on Sept. 1 marked the 15th game-winner of her career and moved her passed Caroline Smith (2001-04) for the program record.

Of McClure's 28-career goals, 10 of them have come in the final 15 minutes of regulation or overtime, which includes four golden goals last season.

TOP-25 TAKEDOWNS

The Aug. 29 over No. 20 Memphis marked the fourth-consecutive season the Jayhawks have tallied at least one victory over a team ranked among the top-25 in the nation.

Kansas is 8-13-2 against ranked foes since 2016, with six of those losses coming against teams inside the top-10. Prior to this recent run, the Jayhawks managed just six victories over top-25 teams from 2010-15.

AUGUST RUSH

With the final match of the month in the rear view mirror, the Jayhawks once again continued their trend over the last decade of impressive performances in August. The win over Memphis Thursday gave KU its 33rd win in the month of August since 2008.

Since that 2008 campaign, the Jayhawks have dropped no more than one result in August, amassing a record of 33-7-3 (.802 winning percentage) during the season's opening month. The hot start of those Jayhawk teams is made evident by more than just the win-loss column. Including this season, KU has averaged 2.00 goals per game and has amassed a goal differential of +52 in August. The Jayhawks have also posted 21 shutouts in those 43 August outings to go along with a 0.77 goals-against average.

FEEDING ON NONCON

This season, the Jayhawks will look to make it 12-straight seasons with a .500 winning percentage or better against regular-season nonconference foes. Since the start of the 2012 season, Kansas has posted an impressive 47-20-9 mark in its 76 regular-season nonconference matches (67%), which includes a 35-13-6 mark since 2014. In the last six seasons, KU has led KU to a winning record in noncon in 19 of his 20 seasons in Lawrence and is 127-52-13 in regular-season nonconference games.

HOME SWEET HOME

Rock Chalk Park has been a welcome site for the Jayhawks in recent years as KU is enjoying a successful four-year stint playing on its home turf. After their win over Memphis o on Aug. 29, the Jayhawks are 33-14-2 in matches played at home during the regular season since the start of the 2014 campaign. From 2013-14, Kansas also enjoyed an 11-match home winning streak, the longest in program history.

Since moving into Rock Chalk Park, Kansas has built a goal differential of +36 and boasts a goals-against average of 0.88, a number that includes 18 shutouts.

McCLURE MINUTES

Senior Katie McClure is already putting an emphatic stamp on an already outstanding career at KU, having already posted six goals and a pair of assists through her first four outings of the season. Last year saw her make headlines across the state, the region and the nation. She led the Jayhawks with 11 goals, seven game-winning goals, 28 shots on goal and 25 points, figures that ranked the Wichita product among the top-10 in the Big 12 in their respective categories.

Just four matches her career finale, she has already made big jumps on some impressive lists, creeping closer to inserting her name among the top offensive players in Jayhawk history. Her 28 career goals currently rank her second on Kansas' all-time goal scorer chart. McClure's 15 game-winning goals are the most ever for a Jayhawk.

LATE MATCH MAGIC

The Jayhawks were clutch in crunch time during the 2018 campaign. Thirteen of the Jayhawks' 28 goals scored came in the 60th minute or later. That number included 10 goals Kansas tallied in the final 10 minutes of regulation or in overtime.

The Jayhawks came out on top in seven of those matches that saw Kansas score in the 80th minute or later. KU netted five golden goals in 2018, four off the boot of senior forward Katie McClure and one from senior forward Eva Eliasdottir in KU's 2-1 win over TCU (10/12). McClure scored seven game-winners last season. Those seven game-winning strikes ranked her first among Big 12 players and were tied for the most by a Jayhawk in school history.

McClure and Eliasdottir's golden goals gave Kansas five victories that have came by way of an overtime last season, which marked the most in school history. The the extra time win over Saint Louis on Nov. 9, the 2018 squad passed the group from 2015 for the program record for overtime wins in a season with five

A TIP OF THE HAT

Katie McClure began her senior year with a bang on Aug. 22 when she netted her first-career hat trick against Nebraska. The feat is not one that many Jayhawks can say they've achieved as only nine hat tricks have been posted by Jayhawks in the first 24 years of the program.

In adding an assist to her three-goal outing, McClure tied the program record for points in a game. She became just the third Jayhawk to score seven points in a match, joining Shannon McCabe (2008) and Caroline Smith (2003).

The hat trick was also just the second in a Kansas seasonopener. In 2003, Smith scored three times in a 4-1 KU win over Northwestern in Lawrence. She went on to score a programrecord 19 goals that season, which led all players in the Big.

KU PICKED SIXTH IN BIG 12 PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

Kansas soccer was predicted to finish sixth in the 2019 league standings according to the Big 12 preseason coaches' poll which was released two weeks ago. The ranking marked the seventh time in the last eight years that KU has been picked sixth or higher in the conference's preseason poll.

West Virginia was picked to finish at the top of the standings for the seventh consecutive year in the preseason poll. The five-time Big 12 regular-season champion received four of the nine first-place votes, while Baylor and Texas, picked second and third respectively, each received three first-place votes.

Just three points separated the 2018 Big 12 Championship title-winning Mountaineers from the defending regular-season champion Bears at the top of the poll with 75 and 72 points, respectively. The Longhorns were slotted third with 65 total points ahead of TCU in fourth with 57 points. Texas Tech, Kansas and Oklahoma State were next at fifth, sixth and seventh, while Oklahoma, Iowa State and Kansas State rounded out the poll in the eighth, ninth and tenth spots.

FIRST TO SCORE. WINS GALORE

Dating back to the beginning of the 2012 season, now at 149 games, Kansas has developed an interesting trend when it comes to which team tallies the first goal of the match. During that 149-game span, the Jayhawks were on the losing end only four times in contests which they put in the match's first goal. Kansas has amassed a record of 68-4-8 in those games (89.9 winning %), which includes three of KU's wins this season.

On the flip side, KU wasn't quite as fortunate when its opponents have gotten on the board first. Kansas' win over Memphis on Aug. 29 marked just the ninth victory for the Jayhawks in that same 149-game span when finding itself trailing 1-0 at any point in a match. Kansas is 9-51-4 in those games over the last five seasons, which includes its lone loss of 2019, a 1-0 result to DePaul.

UP NEXT

The Jayhawks will be back on road for the second-straight week. The weekend will begin in Chicago when KU meets Northwestern on Friday, Sept. 13. Start time from Evanston is set for 7 p.m. Two days later, the Jayhawks will head north to Kalamazoo, Michigan to take on Western Michigan. KU will kick off against the Broncos at 1 p.m.

Continuity is an essential part of a successful athletic program, and in his first 20 seasons at the helm of Kansas soccer, head coach Mark Francis has brought just that.

After taking over a program just past its infancy, Francis effectively etched his signature on Kansas soccer by becoming not only the winningest coach in its history, but leading his team to eight NCAA Tournaments, 16 Big 12 Championship Tournaments and helping 74 student-athletes garner all-conference accolades, including six that went on to earn All-America status.

Since 1999, Francis has amassed a 219-163-34 record, with 14 seasons of at least 10 victories. He is ranked second among active Big 12 coaches in wins at a single school. He also leads the league among active coaches with his 86 career Big 12 victories.

Francis' résumé is extensive, as he has coached and played at nearly all levels of the game. Francis worked his way up through the head coaching ranks wearing a whistle at the high school, junior college, Division I and professional levels. As a player, Francis was a three-time All-American at SMU and spent 10 seasons playing professionally in the APSL, the NPSL and the USISL.

After moving into its new, state-of-the-art facility at Rock Chalk Park in 2014, Francis' program took another step forward, elevating itself as one of the top teams in the Big 12 and a perennial top-25 NCAA squad. Now as the tenants of one of the top soccer facilities in the U.S., Francis and his staff are attracting some of the top talent from across the globe to Lawrence and the results over the last five seasons can back up the progress being made. Francis saw his Jayhawk team take the program even further in 2018 as he coached Kansas to its eighth NCAA Tournament appearance and their fifth in the second round of the Big Dance.

Francis helped his squad to their highest Big 12 finish in over a decade in 2016 as the Jayhawks posted a second-place finish on the league table, only suffering one loss in the conference season.

It was a season to remember for Francis and the Jayhawks in 2014, as he led his squad to one of the best seasons in program history. He picked up his 200th career coaching victory in KU's 4-1 win over Wake Forest and proceed to see his team reel off eight-straight wins to start the season, the best start in program history. His team ended the year with 15 victories, the third-most ever by a Jayhawk squad and made the program's sixth NCAA tournament appearance. Junior Liana Salazar also had a breakout season in becoming Kansas' sixth All-America honoree after she was named to the Third Team.

Francis tallied his 150th KU coaching victory in 2012 and led his squad to its 10th 10-win season during his tenure in Lawrence. Senior Whitney Berry became KU's all-time assists leader (32) and the program's 11th player to be named to the All-Big 12 First Team.

The 2008 season was one for the record books as Kansas recorded 13 wins and returned to the NCAA Tournament. The Jayhawks knocked off four nationally-ranked teams en route to their tournament berth, including a pair of wins over long-time nemesis Texas A&M. KU became the first team in three years to defeat the Aggies twice in the

The Jayhawks topped four other ranked teams during the season and capped their remarkable run with a 2-1 triumph over Denver in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Several players received accolades throughout and following the season. Freshman Emily Cressy was

named a Freshman All-American by Soccer Buzz as well as Soccer America, while teammates Monica Dolinsky and Johnson joined her on the All-Central Region Team. Dolinsky was also named All-Big 12 First Team, while Cressy became KU's first Big 12 Rookie of the Year.

The 2004 season was a year filled with program firsts as numerous records were broken. The Jayhawks compiled a program-best record of 18-5 on their way to the Big 12 Championship. It was the first for the soccer team and second among KU women's sports, the first going to basketball in 1997. Francis earned Big 12 Coach of the Year as well as the Central Region Coach of the Year honors. He also won his 100th overall match with a victory against Texas Tech on Oct. 1.

In 2003, Kansas soccer reached new heights under Francis' leadership. The Jayhawks posted an 18-6-1 mark and advanced to the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA Tournament. With a 6-3-1 record in the Big 12, KU finished third. Along with the team accomplishments, several players were honored for their efforts during the 2003 campaign, including Caroline Smith being named to several All-America teams as well as Holly Gault being selected as a Freshman All-American by Soccer Buzz. With Francis' help, KU's players etched their names in the record book, as Smith became the program's all-time leader in goals, points and game-winning goals and Miller set the school mark in career shutouts and career GAA.

In 2002, Francis led Kansas to an overall record of 11-7-2, including a then-school record six-straight wins and a seven-game unbeaten streak during the first half of the season. The Jayhawks opened the season 6-1-1, marking their best start ever. Francis' team ranked in the Central Region's Top 10 for 10 consecutive weeks.

In 2001, Francis guided the Jayhawks to a 13-7-0 overall record and a 7-3-0 Big 12 mark. For his efforts, Soccer Buzz named Francis the 2001 Central Region Coach of the Year, as he led his Jayhawks into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Kansas finished the season ranked sixth in the Central Region, marking the ninth-best turnaround in the nation, improving five games from the previous season

A standout player in his own right, Francis is a 1987 graduate of Southern Methodist University where he was a three-time All-America selection for the Mustangs. As a senior, he was named SMU's Male Athlete of the Year, the Dallas All-Sports Association College Athlete of the Year and was selected to Soccer America's All-College MVP Team. In addition, he was a two-time nominee for the Hermann Trophy, given to the nation's most outstanding soccer player.

Professionally, Francis played 10 seasons as a member of the Dayton Dynamos (NPSL), Mobile Revelers, Dallas Rockets (USISL) and the Orlando Lions (APSL).

After being hired at South Alabama just a few weeks prior to the start of the 1996 season, Francis inherited a depleted roster and finished his first season with a 2-17 record. The following year, he led the Jaguars to an 18-3-1 mark, including an unbeaten regular season in Big South Conference play. The 16-win turnaround is still the biggest in NCAA Division I soccer history.

A native of London, England, Francis resides in Lawrence and has three children: Carlin (26), Hayley (24) and Caleb (22).



KANSAS GOAL CHART


