### BY THE NUMBERS

Senior Katie McClure's five game-winning goals lead the NCAA. The Wichita native now has 16 game-winners in her collegiate career, the most ever by a Jayhawk.

Ten different Jayhawks have netted at least one goal already this season. That number includes five KU players that have tallied multiple goals so far in 2019.

Since 2014, the Jayhawks boast a winning percentage of 97.1 (49-1-1) in matches that the score two or more goals. That includes a 15-0-0 mark since the start of the 2018 season.

### **OUICK KICKS**

- KU's third top-25 tilt of 2019 is set for Thursday, Oct. 3 when the No. 21 Jayhawks travel to take on No. 25 Oklahoma State in Stillwater. Kickoff is set from 7 p.m., on Big 12 Now on ESPN+.
- Kansas is coming off a 4-1 victory over the Baylor Bears on Sunday in Lawrence. Junior Mandi Duggan tallied a brace will Katie McClure added a pair of assists in the win.
- Kansas is 8-14-2 against ranked foes since 2016, with seven of those losses coming against teams inside the top-10. Prior to this recent run, the Jayhawks managed just six victories over top-25 teams from 2010-15.
- Kansas was slotted at No. 13 in the season's second Rating Percentage Index (RPI) released by the NCAA this week. It marked the first times since 2014 that the Jayhawks were slotted in the top-15 of the RPI in back-to-
- The Jayhawks will be searching for their first victory in Stillwater since 2004 on Thursday. The Cowgirls have won seven-straight matches over Kansas on their home pitch dating back to 2006.
- · Kansas fell four spots in the latest United Soccer Coaches' poll. At No. 21, the Jayhawks were slotted in the top-25 for the sixth-straight week, their longest such stint since 2014.
- Since 2014, the Jayhawks are 49-1-1 in matches in which they score two or more goals, this includes a 15-0-0 mark since the start of the 2018 season.
- Ten different Jayhawks have scored a goal this season. McClure leads the team with nine goals, which ranks her 10th in the NCAA.
- McClure's nine goals are the most by a Jayhawk through her first 12 games of a season since 2003, when Caroline Smith netted 11 goals in her first 12 outings en route to posting 19 that season.
- The KU defense has amassed a goals-against average of 0.67 after its first 12 outings, a number that ranks the Jayhawks third in the Big 12.
- Staying on defense, the KU backline has held its first 12 opponents to an average of 9.3 shots per game, which includes five matches when the Jayhawks conceded five or fewer opponent shots.

#### **SERIES VS. OKLAHOMA STATE**

The contest Thursday will mark the 26th between Kansas and Oklahoma State since the series' first match in 1996. OSU leads the match-up 12-9-4 all-time and is unbeaten against the Jayhawks in the most recent four meetings. KU is 2-7-2 against the Cowgirls in Stillwater, with their last win on OSU's home pitch coming in 2004.

#### **SCOUTING THE COWGIRLS**

Oklahoma State enters Thursday's contest coming off a loss and a draw in the first weekend of Big 12 play, falling at No. 20 Texas Tech before pulling out a 1-1 draw at TCU last week. The Cowgirls started the month of September with six-straight victories, however were winless in the three matches to close the month.

Offensively, nine different Cowgirls have scored at least one of OSU's 25 goals on the year, with Jaci Jones leading the squad with six goals and seven assists. The Oklahoma State offense averages 15.2 shots per game and puts 40.7 percent of those shots on frame.

On defense, the Cowgirls have conceded seven goals and picked up six shutouts through their first 11 outings of 2019. Dani Greenlee has started in goal for OSU in nine matches. She boasts a goals-against average of 0.73 and has collected 23 saves.

Oklahoma State is led by Colin Carmichael, who is in his 15th season at the helm in Stillwater. Carmichael has a record of 197-82-41 as the OSU head coach.

#### **NO GAMES OFF**

Before Kansas soccer even hit the pitch for its first match of the season, the Jayhawks knew they would be in for a gauntlet of a schedule in 2019.

The 2019 Jayhawks' slate, which currently sits as the 28th-toughest in all of NCAA DI, features nine teams that competed in the NCAA Tournament a year ago as well as three reigning conference champions. The Jayhawks, sitting at 9-3-0 after their first 12 games of the season, have played or will play six teams that are ranked or receiving votes in the most recent United Soccer Coaches' top-25 poll. That number includes two squads inside the top-10.

The Jayhawks have already played a pair top-25 teams over the first six weeks of the season - No. 20 Memphis (W, 2-1) and No. 7 BYU (L, 0-2) and will take on their third Thursday in No. 25 Oklahoma State.

It appears as though KU will face several more battles with top-25 teams this season with the bulk of Big 12 Conference play still to come. The conference currently features five teams that are ranked or receiving votes in the Coaches' poll and that includes No. 18 Texas Tech and No. 25 Oklahoma State.

#### SPREADING THE WEALTH

The KU offense has shown to be a tough assignment for opposing defenses this year after a host of Jayhawks have made their presence known on the stat sheet. Thirteen different Jayhawks have had their hand in at least one of the team's goals thus far in 2019, either scoring or assisting. A total of seven players have managed to tally double-digit shots.

This is a trend that has been carried over from last year's squad which was also an unselfish bunch, as 11 different Jayhawks tallied at least one goal or assist in 2018.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

Kansas' Mandi Duggan picked a good time for the first brace of her career as the junior forward led the No. 17 Jayhawks to a 4-1 victory over Baylor on Sept. 29 at Rock Chalk Park.

In the 30th minute however, the Jayhawks were finally able to get their first shot of the game where, just off the bench, Duggan delivered. Sophomore Bri Amos sent in a cross from the left side that found Duggan eight yards from the BU frame. She then used her head to find the back of the net off, her first of the season.

Just five minutes into the second period, sophomore Kailey Lane netted her fourth goal of the season off the feed from senior Katie McClure and freshman Ellie Prybylski.

With just 10 minutes remaining in regulation, Duggan used her head again to find the back of the net. It marked the first brace of her career and the third multi-goal match by a Jayhawk this season. McClure tallied her second assist of the afternoon.

Freshman Ebba Costow answered with her first goal as a Jayhawk as time expired, bringing the final score to 4-1, KU's largest margin of victory over Baylor since 2004.

With the release of the season's second official Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report by the NCAA this week, several good signs stick out for the Jayhawks. Kansas checked in at No. 13 on the list that takes numerous factors into account including strength of schedule, record against top-50 teams and home versus road record. In the first report released last week, KU was slotted at No. 8, it's highest to start the year since the weekly RPI report became public in 2011.

This week's report shows that the Big 12 is among the nation's toughest conferences after the conclusion of nonconference play. The league tallied the fourth-highest ranking in the week's RPI and boasts eight of its 10 teams inside the top-65. The conference's high ranking also means the Jayhawks will get plenty of chances to up their national standing as each of their next three contests will be against teams currently ranked inside the top-50 of the RPI.

### **LET'S GET DEFENSIVE**

In the first half of the 2019 season, the Jayhawks have once again proved to be a stout defensive team, carrying over the trend from their last several seasons. Kansas currently boasts a goals-against average of 0.67 this season, which encompasses five shutouts in those first 12 outings. The Jayhawks are allowing only three opponent shots on goal per match.

KU has already put together several impressive shutout streak to start this season. Kansas went 189-straight minutes without conceding a goal to start the year, and recently wrapped up a 295-minute opponent scoreless stretch. KU has tallied four opponent scoreless streaks of 300 minutes or more in the last five seasons.

### **BOUNCING BACK**

The Jayhawks have been good bouncing back when they are coming off a loss, especially when they are playing on their home turf. KU has carried over this trend into this season, claiming wins following each of their three losses so far this season.

Since moving to Rock Chalk Park in 2014, Kansas is 9-3-2 when playing a home match following a loss. That includes a 4-0-0 since the start of the 2018 season.

The KU offense has also proven to be potent in games coming off being shutout. The Jayhawks have not been blanked in consecutive matches since 2015 and are 10-1-4 in matches coming off being shut out in that span.

### **TALKIN' TOP-25**

Following the impressive start to the season, the voters for several national polls showed their appreciation for KU's work thus far in 2019, keeping them ranked inside the top-20 in each of the last six weeks.

The Jayhawks topped out at No. 11 in the second week United Soccer Coaches' poll, it program's highest ranking in the poll in five seasons. KU's highest all-time ranking in that poll (formerly

the NSCAA Coaches' poll) was No. 6 during the 2004 season. The Jayhawks also peaked inside the top-10 during their 2014 campaign, climbing as high as No. 9. Last season, Kansas found itself among the top-25 during five weeks, topping out at 16 on Sept. 3. With a spot secured in the rankings the last two weeks, Kansas has made five appearance in six seasons in the Coaches' poll.

### **KATIE McCLUTCH**

Senior Katie McClure has firmly positioned herself as one of the most clutch players in program history. Already this season, the Wichita product has tallied an NCAA-leading five game-winning goals, including the winner in the final seconds against No. 20 Memphis on Aug. 26. These late-match heroics are nothing new for McClure, who has proved time and time again throughout her career that she performs best when the match is in its final stages.

Her her goal against Kennesaw State on Sept. 22 marked the 16th game-winner of her career and has her at No. 1 on the Kansas all-time list.

Of McClure's 31-career goals, 10 of them have come in the final 15 minutes of regulation or overtime, which includes four golden goals last season.

ranked among the top-25 in the nation.

Kansas is 8-14-2 against ranked foes since 2016, with seven of those losses coming against teams inside the top-10. Prior to this recent run, the Jayhawks managed just six victories over top-25 teams from 2010-15.

### **McCLURE MINUTES**

Senior Katie McClure is putting an emphatic stamp on an already outstanding career at KU, having already posted nine goals (five game-winners) and three assists through her first 12 outings of the season. Last year saw her make headlines across the state, the region and the nation. She led the Jayhawks with 11 goals, seven game-winning goals, 28 shots on goal and 25 points, figures that ranked the Wichita product among the top-10 in the Big 12 in their respective categories.

Twelve matches into her career finale, she has already made big jumps on some impressive lists, creeping closer to inserting her name among the top offensive players in Jayhawk history. Her 31 career goals currently rank her second on Kansas' all-time goal scorer chart. McClure's 16 game-winning goals are the most ever for a Jayhawk.

### LATE MATCH MAGIC

The Jayhawks have been a clutch bunch so far this season, a trend which they have carried over from a year ago. Kansas has netted seven goals in the final 15 minutes of regulation, three of which have been game-winners.

The Jayhawks were also clutch in crunch time during the 2018 campaign. Thirteen of the Jayhawks' 28 goals scored came in the 60th minute or later. That number included 10 goals Kansas tallied in the final 10 minutes of regulation or in overtime.

The Jayhawks came out on top in seven of those matches that saw Kansas score in the 80th minute or later. KU netted five golden goals in 2018, four off the boot of senior forward Katie McClure and one from senior forward Eva Eliasdottir in KU's 2-1 win over TCU (10/12). McClure scored seven game-winners last season. Those seven game-winning strikes ranked her first among Big 12 players and were tied for the most by a Jayhawk in school history.

### A TIP OF THE HAT

Katie McClure began her senior year with a bang on Aug. 22 when she netted her first-career hat trick against Nebraska. The feat is not one that many Jayhawks can say they've achieved as only nine hat tricks have been posted by Jayhawks in the first 24 years of the program.

In adding an assist to her three-goal outing, McClure tied the program record for points in a game. She became just the third Jayhawk to score seven points in a match, joining Shannon McCabe (2008) and Caroline Smith (2003).

The hat trick was also just the second in a Kansas seasonopener. In 2003, Smith scored three times in a 4-1 KU win over Northwestern in Lawrence. She went on to score a programrecord 19 goals that season, which led all players in the Big.

### **KU PICKED SIXTH IN BIG 12 PRESEASON COACHES' POLL**

Kansas soccer was predicted to finish sixth in the 2019 league standings according to the Big 12 preseason coaches' poll which was released two weeks ago. The ranking marked the seventh time in the last eight years that KU has been picked sixth or higher in the conference's preseason poll.

Just three points separated the 2018 Big 12 Championship title-winning Mountaineers from the defending regular-season champion Bears at the top of the poll with 75 and 72 points, respectively. The Longhorns were slotted third with 65 total points ahead of TCU in fourth with 57 points. Texas Tech, Kansas and Oklahoma State were next at fifth, sixth and seventh, while Oklahoma, lowa State and Kansas State rounded out the poll in the eighth, ninth and tenth spots.

### FIRST TO SCORE, WINS GALORE

Dating back to the beginning of the 2012 season, now at 156 games, Kansas has developed an interesting trend when it comes to which team tallies the first goal of the match. During that 156-game span, the Jayhawks were on the losing end only four times in contests which they put in the match's first goal. Kansas has amassed a record of 72-4-8 in those games (90.5 winning %), which includes seven of KU's wins this season.

#### UP NEXT

Kansas will continue its road stint next weekend when it heads south for a pair of league contests. The trip will begin with the Oklahoma Sooners in Norman on Thursday, Oct. 10 in a 7 p.m. start. Three days later, the Jayhawks will take on the Texas Tech Red Raiders in Lubbock on Oct. 13. Kickoff from John Walker Soccer Complex is slated for 1 p.m.

Continuity is an essential part of a successful athletic program, and in his first 20 seasons at the helm of Kansas soccer, head coach Mark Francis has brought just that.

After taking over a program just past its infancy, Francis effectively etched his signature on Kansas soccer by becoming not only the winningest coach in its history, but leading his team to eight NCAA Tournaments, 16 Big 12 Championship Tournaments and helping 74 student-athletes garner all-conference accolades, including six that went on to earn All-America status.

Since 1999, Francis has amassed a 219-163-34 record, with 14 seasons of at least 10 victories. He is ranked second among active Big 12 coaches in wins at a single school. He also leads the league among active coaches with his 86 career Big 12 victories.

Francis' résumé is extensive, as he has coached and played at nearly all levels of the game. Francis worked his way up through the head coaching ranks wearing a whistle at the high school, junior college, Division I and professional levels. As a player, Francis was a three-time All-American at SMU and spent 10 seasons playing professionally in the APSL, the NPSL and the USISL.

After moving into its new, state-of-the-art facility at Rock Chalk Park in 2014, Francis' program took another step forward, elevating itself as one of the top teams in the Big 12 and a perennial top-25 NCAA squad. Now as the tenants of one of the top soccer facilities in the U.S., Francis and his staff are attracting some of the top talent from across the globe to Lawrence and the results over the last five seasons can back up the progress being made. Francis saw his Jayhawk team take the program even further in 2018 as he coached Kansas to its eighth NCAA Tournament appearance and their fifth in the second round of the Big Dance.

Francis helped his squad to their highest Big 12 finish in over a decade in 2016 as the Jayhawks posted a second-place finish on the league table, only suffering one loss in the conference season.

It was a season to remember for Francis and the Jayhawks in 2014, as he led his squad to one of the best seasons in program history. He picked up his 200th career coaching victory in KU's 4-1 win over Wake Forest and proceed to see his team reel off eight-straight wins to start the season, the best start in program history. His team ended the year with 15 victories, the third-most ever by a Jayhawk squad and made the program's sixth NCAA tournament appearance. Junior Liana Salazar also had a breakout season in becoming Kansas' sixth All-America honoree after she was named to the Third Team.

Francis tallied his 150th KU coaching victory in 2012 and led his squad to its 10th 10-win season during his tenure in Lawrence. Senior Whitney Berry became KU's all-time assists leader (32) and the program's 11th player to be named to the All-Big 12 First Team.

The 2008 season was one for the record books as Kansas recorded 13 wins and returned to the NCAA Tournament. The Jayhawks knocked off four nationally-ranked teams en route to their tournament berth, including a pair of wins over long-time nemesis Texas A&M. KU became the first team in three years to defeat the Aggies twice in the same season.

The Jayhawks topped four other ranked teams during the season and capped their remarkable run with a 2-1 triumph over Denver in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Several players received accolades throughout and following the season. Freshman Emily Cressy was

named a Freshman All-American by Soccer Buzz as well as Soccer America, while teammates Monica Dolinsky and Johnson joined her on the All-Central Region Team. Dolinsky was also named All-Big 12 First Team, while Cressy became KU's first Big 12 Rookie of the Year.

The 2004 season was a year filled with program firsts as numerous records were broken. The Jayhawks compiled a program-best record of 18-5 on their way to the Big 12 Championship. It was the first for the soccer team and second among KU women's sports, the first going to basketball in 1997. Francis earned Big 12 Coach of the Year as well as the Central Region Coach of the Year honors. He also won his 100th overall match with a victory against Texas Tech on Oct. 1.

In 2003, Kansas soccer reached new heights under Francis' leadership. The Jayhawks posted an 18-6-1 mark and advanced to the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA Tournament. With a 6-3-1 record in the Big 12, KU finished third. Along with the team accomplishments, several players were honored for their efforts during the 2003 campaign, including Caroline Smith being named to several All-America teams as well as Holly Gault being selected as a Freshman All-American by Soccer Buzz. With Francis' help, KU's players etched their names in the record book, as Smith became the program's all-time leader in goals, points and game-winning goals and Miller set the school mark in career shutouts and career GAA.

In 2002, Francis led Kansas to an overall record of 11-7-2, including a then-school record six-straight wins and a seven-game unbeaten streak during the first half of the season. The Jayhawks opened the season 6-1-1, marking their best start ever. Francis' team ranked in the Central Region's Top 10 for 10 consecutive weeks.

In 2001, Francis guided the Jayhawks to a 13-7-0 overall record and a 7-3-0 Big 12 mark. For his efforts, Soccer Buzz named Francis the 2001 Central Region Coach of the Year, as he led his Jayhawks into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Kansas finished the season ranked sixth in the Central Region, marking the ninth-best turnaround in the nation, improving five games from the previous season

A standout player in his own right, Francis is a 1987 graduate of Southern Methodist University where he was a three-time All-America selection for the Mustangs. As a senior, he was named SMU's Male Athlete of the Year, the Dallas All-Sports Association College Athlete of the Year and was selected to Soccer America's All-College MVP Team. In addition, he was a two-time nominee for the Hermann Trophy, given to the nation's most outstanding soccer player.

Professionally, Francis played 10 seasons as a member of the Dayton Dynamos (NPSL), Mobile Revelers, Dallas Rockets (USISL) and the Orlando Lions (APSL).

After being hired at South Alabama just a few weeks prior to the start of the 1996 season, Francis inherited a depleted roster and finished his first season with a 2-17 record. The following year, he led the Jaguars to an 18-3-1 mark, including an unbeaten regular season in Big South Conference play. The 16-win turnaround is still the biggest in NCAA Division I soccer history.

A native of London, England, Francis resides in Lawrence and has three children: Carlin (26), Hayley (24) and Caleb (22).



### **KANSAS GOAL CHART**




