BY THE NUMBERS

Sixteen of KU's 31 goals this season have come in either the first 15 minutes or the final 15 minutes of regulation and overtime. Last season, the Jayhawks didn't score any goals in the first 15 minutes but netted nine of their 28 goals after the 74th minute.

The KU senior class has combined to score 53 of Kansas' 110 goals since the start of the 2016 season. The seven Jayhawks have also combined for 279 starts over the last four vears

The Jayhawks have held their opponents scoreless for 318-consecutive minutes. The streak currently sits as the 10th-longest in program history.

OUICK KICKS

- The Jayhawks host the West Virginia Mountaineers in the regular-season home finale on Thursday, Oct. 24 at Rock Chalk Park.
- With three matches remaining in league play, the Jayhawks sit in a tie for fourth with 10 points. KU sits behind Oklahoma State, who sits atop the table with 16 points, but the Jayhawks are one of six Big 12 teams within six points of the Cowairls.
- Kansas is 14-8-1 on senior day matches and the Jayhawks are unbeaten in five of their last seven regular-season home finales.
- Kansas was slotted at No. 17 in the season's fifth Rating Percentage Index (RPI) released by the NCAA this week. It marked the first time since 2014 that the Jayhawks were slotted in the top-20 of the RPI in five-straight weeks.
- The Kansas defense hasn't conceded a goal in its last three outings, a streak which now sits at 318-straight minutes. The current stretch ranks as the 10th-longest in program history.
- KU's 31 goals scored this season rank 42nd in the NCAA and third in the conference. The figure has already surpassed the goals scored in each of the last four seasons.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Sarah Peters was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week for the second-consecutive week after posting her third-straight shutouts and seven saves against K-State last week.
- Peters' clean sheet against the Wildcats marked the 16th shutout of her career, a number that moves her to No. 2 on KU's all-time shutouts list.
- Katie McClure recently moved to No. 2 on KU's all-time points list. The senior forward has amassed 80 points via her 33 goals and 14 career assists.
- Since 2014, the Jayhawks are 50-2-1 in matches in which they score two or more goals. This includes a 16-1-0 mark since the start of the 2018 season, with the lone blemish coming in the 5-2 loss to OSU three weeks ago.
- Ten different Jayhawks have scored a goal this season. McClure leads the team with 11 goals, which ranks her ninth in the NCAA.
- The KU defense has amassed a goals-against average of 0.80 after its first 16 outings, a number that ranks the Jayhawks third in the Big 12.

SERIES VS. WEST VIRGINIA

The contest Thursday will mark the ninth between Kansas and West Virginia, with all meetings coming since 2012. The Mountaineers won each of the first eight meetings before the Jayhawks claimed the most recent game, a 1-0 overtime victory last season in Morgantown.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS

West Virginia enters Thursday's match coming off a 1-0 win over Oklahoma in Morgantown on Oct. 20. The win snapped a two-game skid for WVU, both losses coming to ranked squads, then-No. 14 Texas Tech and then-No. 15 Oklahoma State at home.

Offensively, West Virginia is led by Julianne Vallerand, who scored five goals on only 13 shots. Lizzie Mayfield ss tops on her squad with four assists. She is also one of Mountaineers to have tallied double digit shots so far this year.

On defense, WVU has conceded 20 goals and picked up six shutouts through its first 15 outings of 2019. Rylee Foster has started in goal for the Mountaineers in 14 of their 15 matches this season. She boasts a goals-against average of 1.36 and has collected 48 saves.

West Virginia is led by Nikki Izzo-Brown, who is in her 24th season at the helm in Morgantown. Izzo-Brown has a record of 348-117-54 as the West Virginia head coach.

SO LONG, SENIORS!

Thursday's match will mark the final regular-season home game for Jayhawk seniors Eva Eliasdottir, Sophie Maierhofer, Madison Meador, Katie McClure, Addisyn Merrick, Elise Reina, as well as redshirt junior Mandi Duggan. These seven have been a part of 42 KU victories since 2016 and have helped their team to a top-three finish in the Big 12 and a pair of NCAA Tournament berths.

Combined, these seven have accumulated 279 starts and have played over 25,294 minutes during their careers. This class has also combined for 53 goals, 29 assists and 373 shots. The Jayhawks' record on Senior Day matches is 14-8-1 and KU is unbeaten in five of its last seven regular-season home finales.

LET'S GET DEFENSIVE

The Jayhawks have once again proven to be a stout defensive team, carrying over the trend from their last several seasons. Kansas currently boasts a goals-against average of 0.80 this season, which encompasses eight shutouts in those its 16 outings. The Jayhawks are allowing just over three opponent shots on goal per match.

KU has already put together several impressive shutout streaks to start this season. The Jayhawks are currently in the midst of their longest shutout streak of the season, a 318-minute stretch. KU has now tallied five opponent scoreless streaks of 300 minutes or more in the last five seasons.

PETERS REPEATS AS DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

2019 (Oct. 3-present)

For the second-straight week goalkeeper Sarah Peters was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week, the league office announced Tuesday. The sophomore earned the honor after claiming her third-straight shutout in the Jayhawks' 3-0 win over Kansas State on Oct. 18. The announcement marked the fourth time a Jayhawk has been named the conference's player of the week this

Peters, who hails from Lee's Summit, Missouri, recorded her third-straight shutout as the Jayhawks topped in-state rival Kansas State, 3-0, at Rock Chalk Park Thursday. The sophomore goalkeeper tallied seven saves in helping her team extend the Jayhawks' current opponent scoreless streak to 318 minutes. Peters' seven shutouts on the year are the most in the league and her 0.76 goals-against average is second among Big 12 keepers who have played at least 800 minutes.

Tuesday's announcement marked the first time since 2011 that a Jayhawk has claimed back-to-back Big 12 weekly awards and the first time since 2007 that a Jayhawk has earned defensive player of the week honors in consecutive weeks.

NO GAMES OFF

Before Kansas soccer even hit the pitch for its first match of the season, the Jayhawks knew they would be in for a quantlet of a schedule in 2019.

The 2019 Jayhawks' slate, which currently sits as the eighth-toughest in all of NCAA DI, features nine teams that competed in the NCAA Tournament a year ago as well as three reigning conference champions. The Jayhawks, sitting at 10-4-1 after their first 15 games of the season, have played or will play five teams that are ranked or receiving votes in the most recent United Soccer Coaches' top-25 poll. That number includes two squads inside the top-10.

The Jayhawks have already played four top-25 teams over the first two months of the season - No. 20 Memphis (W, 2-1), No. 7 BYU (L, 0-2), No. 25 Oklahoma State (L, 2-5) and No. 14 Texas

It appears as though KU could face several more battles with top-25 teams this season with the second half of Big 12 Conference play and the league tournament still to come. The conference currently features four teams that are ranked or receiving votes in the Coaches' poll and that includes No. 13 Texas Tech, No. 15 Oklahoma State and the 23rd-ranked Jayhawks.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

The KU offense has shown to be a tough assignment for opposing defenses this year after a host of Jayhawks have made their presence known on the stat sheet. Thirteen different Jayhawks have had their hand in at least one of the team's goals thus far in 2019, either scoring or assisting. A total of eight players have managed to tally double-digit shots.

This is a trend that has been carried over from last year's squad which was also an unselfish bunch, as 11 different Jayhawks tallied at least one goal or assist in 2018.

HOME SWEET HOME

Rock Chalk Park has been a welcome site for the Jayhawks in recent years as KU is enjoying a successful four-year stint playing on its home turf. The Javhawks are 37-16-2 (.691) in matches played at home during the regular season since the start of the 2014 campaign. From 2013-14, Kansas also enjoyed an 11-match home winning streak, the longest in program history.

Since moving into Rock Chalk Park, Kansas has built a goal differential of +42 and boasts a goals-against average of 0.90, a number that includes 20 shutouts.

IRON JAYHAWK

Senior Katie McClure has continued an impressive streak into her final year in Lawrence as she has started each of the Jayhawks' last 73 matches of the Jayhawks' matches dating back to her

freshman year in 2016. McClure's mark is already among the longest in program history as it sits sixth on the all-time list among field players.

RPI REVIEW

With the release of the season's fifth official Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report by the NCAA this week, several good signs stick out for the Jayhawks. Kansas checked in at No. 17 on the list that takes numerous factors into account including strength of schedule, record against top-50 teams and home versus road record. In the first report released on Sept. 24, KU was slotted at No. 8, it's highest to start the year since the weekly RPI report became public in 2011.

This week's report shows that the Big 12 is among the nation's toughest conferences after the conclusion of nonconference play. The league tallied the fourth-highest ranking in the week's RPI and boasts eight of its 10 teams inside the top-70. The conference's high ranking also means the Jayhawks will get plenty of chances to up their national standing as two of their final three contests will be against teams currently ranked inside the top-70 of the RPI.

BOUNCING BACK

The Jayhawks have been good bouncing back when they are coming off a loss, especially when they are playing on their home turf. KU has carried over this trend into this season, claiming wins following each of their three losses so far this season.

Since moving to Rock Chalk Park in 2014, Kansas is 9-3-2 when playing a home match following a loss. That includes a 4-0-0 since the start of the 2018 season.

The KU offense has also proven to be potent in games coming off being shutout. The Jayhawks have not been blanked in consecutive matches since 2015 and are 10-1-4 in matches coming off being shut out in that span.

KATIE McCLUTCH

Senior Katie McClure has firmly positioned herself as one of the most clutch players in program history. Already this season, the Wichita product has tallied five game-winning goals, including the winner in the final seconds against No. 20 Memphis on Aug. 26. These late-match heroics are nothing new for McClure, who has proved time and time again throughout her career that she performs best when the match is in its final stages.

Her her goal against Kennesaw State on Sept. 22 marked the 16th game-winner of her career and has her at No. 1 on the Kansas all-time list

Of McClure's 31-career goals, 10 of them have come in the final 15 minutes of regulation or overtime, which includes four golden goals last season.

McCLURE MINUTES

Senior Katie McClure is putting an emphatic stamp on an already outstanding career at KU, having posted 11 goals (five gamewinners) and seven assists through her first 16 outings this season. Last year saw her make headlines across the state, the region and the nation. She led the Jayhawks with 11 goals, seven game-winning goals, 28 shots on goal and 25 points, figures that ranked the Wichita product among the top-10 in the Big 12 in their respective categories.

Sixteen matches into her career finale, she has already made big jumps on some impressive lists, creeping closer to inserting her name among the top offensive players in Jayhawk history. Her 33 career goals currently rank her second on Kansas' all-time goal scorer chart. McClure's 16 game-winning goals are the most ever for a Jayhawk.

LATE MATCH MAGIC

The Jayhawks have been a clutch bunch so far this season, a trend which they have carried over from a year ago. Kansas has netted 10 goals in the final 15 minutes of regulation or overtime, four of which have been game-winners.

The Jayhawks were also clutch in crunch time during the 2018 campaign. Thirteen of the Jayhawks' 28 goals scored came in

the 60th minute or later. That number included 10 goals Kansas tallied in the final 10 minutes of regulation or in overtime.

The Jayhawks came out on top in seven of those matches that saw Kansas score in the 80th minute or later. KU netted five golden goals in 2018, four off the boot of senior forward Katie McClure and one from senior forward Eva Eliasdottir in KU's 2-1 win over TCU (10/12). McClure scored seven game-winners last season. Those seven game-winning strikes ranked her first among Big 12 players and were tied for the most by a Jayhawk in school history.

KU PICKED SIXTH IN BIG 12 PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

Kansas soccer was predicted to finish sixth in the 2019 league standings according to the Big 12 preseason coaches' poll which was released two weeks ago. The ranking marked the seventh time in the last eight years that KU has been picked sixth or higher in the conference's preseason poll.

Just three points separated the 2018 Big 12 Championship title-winning Mountaineers from the defending regular-season champion Bears at the top of the poll with 75 and 72 points, respectively. The Longhorns were slotted third with 65 total points ahead of TCU in fourth with 57 points. Texas Tech, Kansas and Oklahoma State were next at fifth, sixth and seventh, while Oklahoma, Iowa State and Kansas State rounded out the poll in the eighth, ninth and tenth spots.

FIRST TO SCORE, WINS GALORE

Dating back to the beginning of the 2012 season, now at 160 games, Kansas has developed an interesting trend when it comes to which team tallies the first goal of the match. During that 160-game span, the Jayhawks were on the losing end only four times in contests which they put in the match's first goal. Kansas has amassed a record of 74-4-8 in those games (90.7 winning %), which includes nine of KU's wins this season.

Continuity is an essential part of a successful athletic program, and in his first 20 seasons at the helm of Kansas soccer, head coach Mark Francis has brought just that.

After taking over a program just past its infancy, Francis effectively etched his signature on Kansas soccer by becoming not only the winningest coach in its history, but leading his team to eight NCAA Tournaments, 16 Big 12 Championship Tournaments and helping 74 student-athletes garner all-conference accolades, including six that went on to earn All-America status.

Since 1999, Francis has amassed a 219-163-34 record, with 14 seasons of at least 10 victories. He is ranked second among active Big 12 coaches in wins at a single school. He also leads the league among active coaches with his 86 career Big 12 victories.

Francis' résumé is extensive, as he has coached and played at nearly all levels of the game. Francis worked his way up through the head coaching ranks wearing a whistle at the high school, junior college, Division I and professional levels. As a player, Francis was a three-time All-American at SMU and spent 10 seasons playing professionally in the APSL, the NPSL and the USISL.

After moving into its new, state-of-the-art facility at Rock Chalk Park in 2014, Francis' program took another step forward, elevating itself as one of the top teams in the Big 12 and a perennial top-25 NCAA squad. Now as the tenants of one of the top soccer facilities in the U.S., Francis and his staff are attracting some of the top talent from across the globe to Lawrence and the results over the last five seasons can back up the progress being made. Francis saw his Jayhawk team take the program even further in 2018 as he coached Kansas to its eighth NCAA Tournament appearance and their fifth in the second round of the Big Dance.

Francis helped his squad to their highest Big 12 finish in over a decade in 2016 as the Jayhawks posted a second-place finish on the league table, only suffering one loss in the conference season.

It was a season to remember for Francis and the Jayhawks in 2014, as he led his squad to one of the best seasons in program history. He picked up his 200th career coaching victory in KU's 4-1 win over Wake Forest and proceed to see his team reel off eight-straight wins to start the season, the best start in program history. His team ended the year with 15 victories, the third-most ever by a Jayhawk squad and made the program's sixth NCAA tournament appearance. Junior Liana Salazar also had a breakout season in becoming Kansas' sixth All-America honoree after she was named to the Third Team.

Francis tallied his 150th KU coaching victory in 2012 and led his squad to its 10th 10-win season during his tenure in Lawrence. Senior Whitney Berry became KU's all-time assists leader (32) and the program's 11th player to be named to the All-Big 12 First Team.

The 2008 season was one for the record books as Kansas recorded 13 wins and returned to the NCAA Tournament. The Jayhawks knocked off four nationally-ranked teams en route to their tournament berth, including a pair of wins over long-time nemesis Texas A&M. KU became the first team in three years to defeat the Aggies twice in the same season.

The Jayhawks topped four other ranked teams during the season and capped their remarkable run with a 2-1 triumph over Denver in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Several players received accolades throughout and following the season. Freshman Emily Cressy was

named a Freshman All-American by Soccer Buzz as well as Soccer America, while teammates Monica Dolinsky and Johnson joined her on the All-Central Region Team. Dolinsky was also named All-Big 12 First Team, while Cressy became KU's first Big 12 Rookie of the Year.

The 2004 season was a year filled with program firsts as numerous records were broken. The Jayhawks compiled a program-best record of 18-5 on their way to the Big 12 Championship. It was the first for the soccer team and second among KU women's sports, the first going to basketball in 1997. Francis earned Big 12 Coach of the Year as well as the Central Region Coach of the Year honors. He also won his 100th overall match with a victory against Texas Tech on Oct. 1.

In 2003, Kansas soccer reached new heights under Francis' leadership. The Jayhawks posted an 18-6-1 mark and advanced to the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA Tournament. With a 6-3-1 record in the Big 12, KU finished third. Along with the team accomplishments, several players were honored for their efforts during the 2003 campaign, including Caroline Smith being named to several All-America teams as well as Holly Gault being selected as a Freshman All-American by Soccer Buzz. With Francis' help, KU's players etched their names in the record book, as Smith became the program's all-time leader in goals, points and game-winning goals and Miller set the school mark in career shutouts and career GAA.

In 2002, Francis led Kansas to an overall record of 11-7-2, including a then-school record six-straight wins and a seven-game unbeaten streak during the first half of the season. The Jayhawks opened the season 6-1-1, marking their best start ever. Francis' team ranked in the Central Region's Top 10 for 10 consecutive weeks.

In 2001, Francis guided the Jayhawks to a 13-7-0 overall record and a 7-3-0 Big 12 mark. For his efforts, Soccer Buzz named Francis the 2001 Central Region Coach of the Year, as he led his Jayhawks into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Kansas finished the season ranked sixth in the Central Region, marking the ninth-best turnaround in the nation, improving five games from the previous season.

A standout player in his own right, Francis is a 1987 graduate of Southern Methodist University where he was a three-time All-America selection for the Mustangs. As a senior, he was named SMU's Male Athlete of the Year, the Dallas All-Sports Association College Athlete of the Year and was selected to Soccer America's All-College MVP Team. In addition, he was a two-time nominee for the Hermann Trophy, given to the nation's most outstanding soccer player.

Professionally, Francis played 10 seasons as a member of the Dayton Dynamos (NPSL), Mobile Revelers, Dallas Rockets (USISL) and the Orlando Lions (APSL).

After being hired at South Alabama just a few weeks prior to the start of the 1996 season, Francis inherited a depleted roster and finished his first season with a 2-17 record. The following year, he led the Jaguars to an 18-3-1 mark, including an unbeaten regular season in Big South Conference play. The 16-win turnaround is still the biggest in NCAA Division I soccer history.

A native of London, England, Francis resides in Lawrence and has three children: Carlin (26), Hayley (24) and Caleb (22).



KANSAS GOAL CHART




