SERIES HISTORY: Kansas leads, 1-0

KANSAS' WIN:

- Ended the Javhawks season with a record of 21-10.
- Was KU's first exit from the NCAA Tournament in the second round since 1999.
- Snapped a two-game winning streak for the Jayhawks in second-round NCAA Tournament games.
- Made the Jayhawks record 14-14 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and 4-6 in the second round.
- Made Stanford 1-0 all-time against the Jayhawks.
- Dropped KU to 1-2 against Pac-12 foes in the Big Dance.

TEAM NOTES:

- The starting combo of Julie Brosseau, Zakiyah Franklin, Holly Kersgieter, Ioanna Chatzileonti and Taiyanna Jackson have now started 11 games this season, which are consecutive. Kansas is now 7-4 in games with this starting combo.
- Kansas falls to 1-2 in tournament games played in California, with Kansas' first round win over Georgia Tech the first.
- Kansas trailed at halftime, 33-31, the 11th time the Jayhawks trailed at half this season. Kansas falls to 5-8 in games they trailed at the break.
- The Jayhawks were outscored 32-15 in the third quarter, the most points allowed in the third quarter this season. SIU Edwardsville previously scored 31 on Nov. 10, 2021.
- Stanford's Lexie Hull scored 36 points on 14-of-21 shooting, the most points scored against the Jayhawks this season.
- Stanford's 91 points are the most scored against the Jayhawks this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES:

- Junior Taiyanna Jackson recorded 3 blocks on Sunday, marking her fourth-straight game with at least two blocks. Jackson's 95 blocks this season are the most in single-season school history.
- Sophomore Ioanna Chatzileonti scored 11 points on 4-of-8 from the field on Sunday marking her 15th game in double-digits scoring this season. Chatzileonti has scored in double-figures in seven of the last eight games, including both games in the tournament.
- Junior Zakiyah Franklin registered 13 points on 6-of-16 from the field, marking her 21st double-digit scoring game this season.
- With 7 points on Sunday, junior Holly Kersgieter surpassed 1,100 career points, finishing her junior campaign with 1,103 points. Her 1,103 points moves her into 24th in KU school history, surpassing Brooke Reves, who scored 1,101 points from 1998-2001.
