## THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 3-0 for the 11th time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU.
- Made Kansas 7-5 in the State Farm Champions Classic, including 3-1 vs. Duke.
- Make Kansas 46-26 against Associated Press top-10 teams in the Bill Self era.
- · Gave Kansas its fourth win against Duke in the last five meetings.
- Made KU 2,360-877 all-time.

#### **TEAM NOTES**

- Kansas finished the game on a 15-5 run.
- Kansas posted a season-high 13 blocks. The 13 blocks were the most in a game since Jan. 5, 2014 vs. #21 San Diego State (13).
- Kansas grabbed 12 offensive rebounds. The Jayhawks have at least 10 offensive rebounds in each of the first three games of the season for the first time since the start of the 2019 season.
- In the first half, Kansas assisted on 11 of 15 made field goals. KU finished the game with 21 assists on 31 made baskets.
- Kansas scored a season-high-tying 48 points in the paint, matching the total scored in the season-opener against Omaha (Nov. 7).

### **INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson recorded his second double-double of the season (18th career) with a career-high 25 points, a season-high-tying 11 rebounds and five assists in 38 minutes. Wilson is the first Jayhawk ever with multiple double-doubles in the Champions Classic (Dec. 1, 2020 vs. Kentucky 23 PTS, 10 REB). Other Jayhawks with double-doubles in the Champions Classic were Dedric Lawson (2018 20 PTS, 14 REB) and Thomas Robinson (2011 11 PTS, 12 REB).
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. finished with 12 points, six rebounds, two assists and two blocks in 29 minutes.
- Freshman Gradey Dick scored 14 points on 6-of-11 (54.5 percent) shooting in 32 minutes on the floor. Dick scored seven points in the final 2:22 of the game.
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. dished out a career-high 10 assists to go along with six points and four rebounds in 35 minutes of action. He is the first Jayhawk with double-digit assists in a game since Devon Dotson on February 8, 2020 at TCU (11).
- Freshman Ernest Udeh Jr. had a career-high four blocks in 13 minutes off the bench.
