THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 4-0 for the second straight year and ninth time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU.
- Made Kansas 9-0 versus the current WAC membership.
- Was the 10th straight KU victory in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 835-116 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 2,361-877 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas shot 50.8 percent (33-of-65) from the field, marking the second time this season that the Jayhawks have shot over 50.0 percent from the floor.
- Kansas scored a season-high 50 points in the paint compared to 34 for Southern Utah.
- The Jayhawks swiped a season-high nine steals.
- Kansas shot a season-high 40.0 percent (6-of-15) from beyond the arc.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson finished with a career-high 33 points on 12-of-22 (54.5 percent) shooting, six rebounds and four assists in 34 minutes. Wilson has set a new career high in points in back-to-back games after scoring 25 against Duke on Nov. 15. He has scored 20+ points for the third consecutive game, the longest stretch of his career. It is the 10th time Wilson has scored 20+ points in his career. His 12 FGM is also a new career high.
- Wilson's 33 points are the most by a junior since Wayne Seldon Jr. scored 33 points in an overtime victory against Kentucky on January 30, 2016.
- Freshman Gradey Dick had 18 points on 7-of-14 from the field (50.0 percent), including 4-of-6 from three-point range (66.7 percent), a career-high six rebounds and three assists in 29 minutes. Dick's four triples were a career high.
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. contributed 14 points on 6-of-11 (54.5 percent) shooting, a career-high-tying five rebounds, two assists and a career-high-tying four steals in 36 minutes. Harris Jr. also tied his career high with six field goals made.
- Sophomore KJ Adams Jr. recorded a career-high three blocks to go along with a career-high-tying eight points, six rebounds and three assists in 33 minutes. Adams Jr. finished the game a perfect 4-of-4 from the field, shooting a perfect clip for the second straight game.
