THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 5-0 for the eighth time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU, and the first since 2019.
- Extended Kansas' win streak to 16 games, tying for the fifth longest winning streak in the Bill Self era.
- Made Kansas 3-1 all-time in the Battle 4 Atlantis.
- Made Kansas 2.362-877 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas held NC State to 38.7 percent (24-of-62) shooting from the field. Kansas has kept all five of its opponents under 40.0 percent shooting, marking the longest stretch to start a season since the beginning of the 2009-10 season (first seven games).
- Kansas had four players score in double figures (Dick 25, Wilson 19, Harris Jr. 14, McCullar 10).
- Kansas connected on a season-high 10 three-point field goals. The Jayhawks also shot a season-high 47.6 percent (10-of-21) from beyond the arc.
- The Jayhawks made a season-high 22 free throws. The 75.9 percent mark from the free throw line was also a season high.
- Kansas grabbed 10 offensive rebounds. The Jayhawks have at least 10 offensive rebounds in four of their five games this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Freshman Gradey Dick poured in a career-high 25 points, including 6-of-12 from three-point range (50.0 percent) and three rebounds in 35 minutes. Dick's six triples were a career high and it was the second time this season he had 20+ points. His six three-pointers were tied for the second-most by a Kansas freshman since the 1996-97 season (7 by J.R. Giddens on Feb. 21, 2004 vs. lowa State).
- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson recorded his third double-double of the season (19th career) with 19 points, 11 rebounds and two assists in 25 minutes. Wilson also made a career-high-tying eight free throws.
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. had his first career double-double as a Jayhawk (fifth career) with 10 points, a career-high-tying 11 rebounds, three assists and two steals in 34 minutes. McCullar Jr. has at least seven rebounds in three games this season.
- Wilson and McCullar Jr. are the first Kansas duo to have a double-double in the same game this season.
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. contributed 14 points on 4-of-7 (57.1 percent) shooting, two rebounds, six assists and three steals in 35 minutes.
