THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 11-1 or better for the second straight season, the third time in the last five years and 10th time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons.
- Made the KU-Harvard series 2-0 in favor of Kansas.
- Marked the 13th straight victory for Kansas in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 17-0 all-time versus the Ivy League
- Made Kansas 837-116 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 2,368-878 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas shot a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line, marking the Jayhawks' second-straight game with a perfect free throw percentage. That marks the first time since at least the 1996-97 season that Kansas has a shot 100 percent from the free throw line in back-to-back games.
- Kansas has had its three best free throw shooting games this season by percentage in the past four games, making 48-of-59 free throws (81.4 percent) in that time frame.
- Kansas finished with 11 steals against Harvard and the Jayhawks now have recorded at least 10 steals in four straight games for the first time since the 2007-08 season (Dec. 22, 2007 – Jan. 8, 2008).
- The 54 points scored by Harvard is the fewest allowed by the Jayhawks in a game this season. Kansas has held three opponents to fewer than 60 points this season, with Harvard joining Texas Southern (55) and North Dakota State (59).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt-junior guard Jalen Wilson became the 66th player in Kansas history to reach the 1,000-point scoring mark for his career with a tip-in with 3:01 remaining in the game. Wilson, the Big 12's leading scorer, finished with 21 points and six rebounds, giving him 1,005 career points (65th all-time in KU history). He's the 21st Kansas player in the Bill Self era to reach 1,000 career points. Wilson has scored in double figures in every game this season, scored 20 or more points seven times and grabbed at least five rebounds in every game but one.
- Redshirt senior guard Kevin McCullar Jr. recorded his second straight double-double, third in the past four games and fourth of the season (7th career), finishing with 14 points and 11 rebounds. McCullar Jr. also surpassed the 800-point mark for his career and he has now scored 807 points. McCullar Jr. has pulled down five or more rebounds in nine games this season, with four games of 10+ rebounds.
- Freshman guard Gradey Dick has hit at least one three-pointer in each game this season after going 3-of-7 from downtown against Harvard. Dick finished with 11 points career-high-tying 7 rebounds. He has now scored in double figures in five straight games and 10 times this season.
- Sophomore guard Bobby Pettiford Jr. dished out four assists for the second consecutive game. Pettiford Jr. has at least three assists in three games this season.
- Sophomore forward KJ Adams Jr. reached double figures in scoring for the fifth straight game, totaling 10 points and 7 rebounds. He also set a new career-high with 4 steals.
- Redshirt-junior guard Dajuan Harris Jr. has dished out at least two assists in every game after finishing with four assists. Harris had a streak of eight consecutive games with multiple steals snapped in the game. His nine games with multiple steals this season leads the Big 12.
