THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 13-1 or better for the eighth time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU.
- Made KU 2-0 in Big 12 play for the third time in the last four years and 16th time in the Bill Self era.
- Gave the Jayhawks their seventh-straight win, its longest winning streak of the season.
- Made Kansas 2-0 in true road games and 5-1 in contests away from Allen Fieldhouse this season.
- Snapped a 29-game home winning streak for Texas Tech, the second longest in college basketball.
- Gave KU its third consecutive win over Texas Tech.
- Made Kansas 2,370-878 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas dished out 22 assists in the contest, its most in a conference road game since Feb. 14, 2007 at Colorado (22).
- Kansas made 11 three-pointers for the second straight game. Kansas has made at least 10 threes in back-to-back games for the first time since Dec. 8-11, 2020 vs. #8 Creighton/vs. Omaha. It's the first time doing it in consecutive games in conference play since Feb. 15-17, 2020 vs. Oklahoma/vs. Iowa State.
- The 11 three-pointers are the most on the road since Jan. 27, 2020 at Oklahoma State (11).
- Kansas shot 45.8 percent (11-of-24) from three-point range. The Jayhawks have shot 40.0 percent or better from beyond the arc in nine games this season.
- Kansas moved to 4-0 in games this season decided by five points or less or overtime. The Jayhawks have won their last nine contests decided by five points or less or overtime dating back to last season.
- Kansas had four players score in double figures (Harris Jr. – 18, Wilson – 16, Adams Jr. – 14, Dick – 11).
- Kansas secured 11 offensive rebounds. The Jayhawks have at least 10 offensive rebounds in 12 of their 14 games this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. shot a perfect 5-of-5 from three-point range to finish with a career-high 18 points, three assists and two steals in 36 minutes. The last time a Jayhawk shot 100.0 percent from beyond the arc (min. 5 attempts) was Lagerald Vick (8-of-8) on Nov. 12, 2018 vs. Vermont.
- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson had 16 points, six rebounds and three assists in 39 minutes. Wilson has scored in double figures every game this season. Wilson now moves into 57th on the all-time scoring list with 1,041 career points, passing Thomas Robinson (1,026), Bill Bridges (1,028), Jerry Gardner (1,030) and Cole Aldrich (1,038).
- Sophomore KJ Adams Jr. tallied 14 points on 7-of-13 (53.8 percent) shooting, five rebounds and two assists in 31 minutes. That marks his seventh-straight double-digit scoring game.
- Freshman Gradey Dick added 11 points, eight rebounds, three assists and three steals in 31 minutes of action. He has finished in double figures in 11 games this season.
